## Nazi Race Laws Put Jews in Negro Class

than any of the others proposed by various Nazi theorists, and which will destroy the freedom and equality enjoyed by the German Jews for years. Ever since the adoption of the Hitler government, German Jewry has been awaiting the new law. The Nazis made no secret that they intended to place the Jews in a special inferior classification. This was a cardinal point in the Nazi program and the only one they have not attempted to carry out. A number of plans have been advanced by various Nazi leaders ranging from the expulsion of the Jews to the adoption of plans for reducing them to a sort of "untouchable caste." In any event, the proposed law will place the Jews in a class which has been employed against the Jews in Germany during the year the Nazis have held power. The law is particularly new, the proposals of Nicolai, most of the measures he advocates being already in practice in all the German states.

However, if adopted, the law will clarify the legal status of the German Jews and remove the uncertainty that has been hanging over them since last January. Numerous conferences on the proposed law have been held at which German Jewish leaders and organizations have been consulted by the Nazis on the law. Briefly, the law had been reached with Jewish leaders they were suddenly told by Nazi authorities not to expect the promulgation of such a law in the near future.

## The Week In Review

Germany Amidst a series of conflicting reports, the proposed law regarding the status of Jews in the Reich, the draft of a code giving Jews and non-Jews the same status of second-class citizenship, regarding their participation in certain professions and rigidly forbidding intermarriage, was made public by responsible authorities.

New measures by the Nazi government to stir up world hatred against the Jews took the form of a new international propaganda service quietly distributing mimeographed sheets dealing with people poorly oriented Aryans concerning the doings of the Jewish "world." The Boersen Zeitung, chief financial organ, reported that the Steuben Society and the German-American Chamber of Commerce were backing the anti-Jewish, anti-boycott drive in the United States.

Jewish students were barred from final examinations in Prussian universities, only sons of war veterans being exempted.

Minister of the Interior Fritz urged haste in ousting Jews from public posts. . . . Transfer taxes were waived for Jews who sold businesses from Jews to Aryans.

The case of the Jews of Upper Silesia again will come before the League of Nations when the Council, meeting this month, considers several petitions protesting discrimination against Jews in the Jewish minority there. The Council has signified, however, that the petitions will be taken up at closed sessions of the body.

## Palestine

The Arab Executive announced, and secured official permission for a country-wide demonstration on January 10 against continued Jewish immigration into the country.

The anticipated Municipal Government Ordinance, establishing a slight margin of self-government for Palestine, was promulgated.

The hearing of the three defendants in the Arlosoroff murder case, a dramatic turn when the defense shifted emphasis of the case onto the revolver owned by the assassin victim and the attorney accused the defense of trying to clear the three men by establishing a case against Dr. Arlosoroff's wife.

Five Arabs accused of membership in the terrorist organization responsible for a series of outrages in Palestine were freed in Haifa magistrate's court.

## Roumania

Outward disorders have gradually

been increasing in Roumania since the assassination of Premier Duca and the vigorous measures taken by the Tarescu government, together with the frequent requests for extradition of the premier that he would spare no effort in crushing the anti-Semitic Iron Guard which was reformed on the basis of his predecessor. The Roumanian situation still remained troubled, however, with Nicholas, the king, a reluctant member of the new ministry. With King Carol's popularity somewhat in eclipse, the nation hard-hit by the general economic situation and disturbed by the rapidity of political developments, since the summer election, tension remains high and there is considerable foreboding regarding the future among the Jews of the Jewish community.

## Poland

The fourth All-Polish conference of the Agudath Israel made a significant break when it decided not to participate in the proposed world congress of all orthodox groups of Jewish rabbis, which was to meet in Jerusalem next year.

The prayerbook used by the Ba'al Shem Tov, founder of the Chassidim, came into the possession of the Lubawitzker Rebbe, Rabbi Joseph Isaac Schneerson, and stated that the Rebbe was of a major sensation among the devout Chassidim who flocked to Warsaw from miles around for a glimpse of the famous book.

Two hundred chederim, Hebrew schools, were closed by the authorities for lack of teachers. The Polish rabbinate is studying the plight of the teachers and is considering an appeal to the government in their behalf.

## Hungary

Anti-Semitic disorders flared into the open again as a nation-wide strike of students broke out in all Hungarian universities. The strike students were strictly prevented from registering for the new university semester as the striking students were ordered to return and adopt their twenty-point anti-Semitic program.

## Austria

Events in Austria moved with gradually increasing speed in a definite Fascist trend as the Heimwehr, Fascist guard, extended its influence. Austrian Nazis defying the Dollfuss efforts to crush the movement to transform the country to a display of bombings and other form of violence unparalleled in the country.

It is the duty of the Jews abroad  
to work against the Nazis and their  
propaganda by every means at their  
disposal. And it is not only as a  
Jew that I suggest this measure, but  
as a Jew of Germany. There is  
a mistake to identify the Nazis  
with Germany.

The majority of the Germans long  
to shake off the yoke of barbarism  
and violence. To work against Hit-  
lerism means not only to work for  
the Jews of Germany, but also to  
work for Germany.

I do not know which I am most:  
a Jew of Germany or a German.  
I have lived in Germany for centuries.  
I was educated in Germany, my  
mind was formed not less by the  
contributions of German literature  
and philosophy than by the Jewish  
classics. I think in the German lan-  
guage, the German language is  
essentially a part of my existence.  
In fact, my whole feeling is German.  
And it is as a German that I sug-  
gest we work against Hitlerism by  
all means.

The Destroying Nazis  
It is hard to comprehend what  
it means to live as a Jew in Germany  
today. I for instance, who have  
I was happy in Germany, it was  
ideal for my work. Now, they have  
confiscated the books of my library  
have demolished my library, torn up  
my manuscripts, mangled the sci-  
entific material which I had collected,  
mutilated 140 years of my work.  
They even trampled down the flower

## Anglo-Palestine Bank Takes Over Work of Jewish Colonial Trust

Latter Reverts to Old Func-  
tion of Holding Company;  
Bank Formed in 1902

(T.T.A. Special Correspondence)  
LONDON, Jan. 5.—After thirty-  
four years of active work, the Jew-  
ish Colonial Trust has ceased its place  
to its daughter company, the  
Anglo-Palestine Bank.  
Founded in 1899 by Herzl as the  
financial instrument of the Zionist  
Movement, the Jewish Colonial  
Trust has for many years held an  
important place among the Jewish  
institutions of England. The deci-  
sion to transfer its banking busi-  
ness to the Anglo-Palestine Bank  
shows the declining importance  
of the Diaspora, and the ever-growing  
significance of Palestine in the  
Zionist Movement.

The Jewish Colonial Trust was  
originally intended to be a mere  
holding company, and its function  
with the aim of encouraging the  
establishment of the financial insti-  
tutions necessary for the develop-  
ment of the Jewish Home in Pale-  
stine. Since formed from this  
original intention, however, and it  
self became an active bank.

Bank Formed in 1902  
In 1902, it founded a subsidiary  
company in Palestine, the Anglo-  
Palestine Bank, for the purpose of  
conducting the banking business  
and of furthering the economic devel-  
opment of Palestine.

Without doubt the Jews in Germany  
are not living in any sense of

We Shall Regain It

There is no getting away from  
the fact that, for the present, Ger-  
many is a lost country to the Jews,  
as it is lost to every good European.  
We shall regain it, that I know. But at pre-  
sent, and probably for many months  
to come, maybe for years, we must  
reign ourselves to the fact that this  
fine country is being governed by  
the Germans, and that we represent only the most  
primitive instincts of its population.

Now, although we must leave hun-  
dreds of thousands of German Jew-  
ry to their fate, it is not possible to  
save at least a few; to save those  
who are the most helpless and  
threatened by the gravest peril  
whose rescue is of the utmost im-  
portance for the future? I mean the  
children. Towering far above all  
questions of choosing the right fac-  
ties to work against the Nazis, is  
this other, more urgent problem—  
how to save the children from the  
German hell. The barbarism of the  
Third Empire strikes with tenfold  
gravity at the tender, unformed  
souls of the children. The naturally  
courageous spirit must inevita-  
bly become distorted if during  
the impressionable years of their  
life it is made to suffer what the  
Third Empire seeks to inflict on the  
souls of Jewish children. If you  
rescue a hundred or more, you will  
be performing an act for which not  
only the children themselves, not  
only the Jews, but the whole world  
will thank you.

Colonial retained control over this  
daughter company, practically the  
whole capital of which it owns. The  
two banks were under one central  
direction, and each acted as the  
other's representative in its own  
sphere of activities. The Jewish  
Colonial Trust remained the finan-  
cial instrument of the Zionist  
Movement, but its work in Palestine  
was understood through the Anglo-  
Palestine Bank, in which some 90  
percent of its capital was invested.

In the course of time the daugh-  
ter company grew stronger and  
stronger and soon outgrew its  
parent company in importance. The  
Anglo-Palestine Bank grew grea-  
ter by the growth of Zionist  
activities in Palestine. In the 31  
years of its existence it has over-  
come innumerable difficulties and  
done extremely valuable work. As  
a result, it has won the confidence  
of the whole Jewish population of  
Palestine, and become the recog-  
nized central Jewish bank in the  
country, with branches in all the im-  
portant centers.

Reverts to Old Function

It has now been found neces-  
sary to have two separate banks  
conducting the banking business.  
The Jewish Colonial Trust is there-  
fore reverting to the function that  
Herzl originally intended it to  
of a holding company, while its  
whole banking business is being  
transferred to the Anglo-Palestine  
Bank, which will in future carry on  
the whole business, both in Pale-  
stine and in London. The Jewish  
Colonial Trust retires from all  
active banking business. It has ful-  
filled the purpose for which it was  
founded. It has called into exist-  
ence a number of financial insti-  
tutions in Palestine, which can now  
stand on their own feet.

The financial position of the  
Anglo-Palestine Bank is a remark-  
ably healthy one. Its total deposits,  
the end of September last, had  
amounted to over \$20,000,000, and  
in the succeeding two months of  
October and November its funds had  
increased by a further \$3,000,000.  
Its assets show an exceptional liq-  
uidity, for nearly \$4,000,000 of  
the Government securities of Great  
Britain, the Government of British  
Government securities, cash in hand  
and deposits with other banks. Few  
of the biggest banks in the world  
show so high a proportion of their  
assets in immediately realizable in-  
vestments. In addition, some \$500,000  
are invested in Palestine itself  
in the form of mortgages, loans and  
investments in industrial and finan-  
cial undertakings.

Change Purely Formal

The Anglo-Palestine Bank con-  
trols the General Mortgage Bank of  
Palestine, and has considerable  
holdings in the Palestine Electric  
Corporation and in Palestine Potash  
and three of the most important  
enterprises in the country.

Many will regret the passing of  
the Jewish Colonial Trust, but con-  
ditions in the world. But the change

is in most respects a purely formal  
one. In two respects at least, how-  
ever, it is significant. In the first  
place, it is a victory for those sec-  
tions in Zionism who are in favor  
of transferring all the central or-  
ganizations to Palestine, where  
they would be in closer touch with  
the actual work of Jewish re-  
construction. In the second place  
the change illustrates the growing im-  
portance of Palestine in the Jewish  
work. While the business of the  
Diaspora institution had remained  
stationary, that of the Palestinian  
institution had grown enormously.

## EDITORIALS

### Outlook for 1934

By DR. HANS KOHN

Mankind has entered upon the year 1934 with renewed hope. The economic situation shows a definite improvement in very many countries. The worst of the depression seems to be behind us. An unclouded, in 1924, a great optimism would be unfounded, and there are reasons to hope that recovery in the interest of the people may not be too quick. The United States and Great Britain, where the economic crisis first made its appearance, seem leading towards recovery.

But if the economic outlook for 1934 seems brighter than in any of the three preceding years, the general political horizon is deeply clouded. In 1924 twenty years will have passed since the first World War broke out. The reason for its outbreak was the emotional grip which nationalism had taken of the peoples in Europe. The atmosphere in Europe was so tense at that time with national aspirations and passions that an outbreak seemed sooner or later inevitable. The spark which kindled the fire into explosion was the deed of a passionate nationalist, a Serbian student who killed a man who to him was the symbol of a hated nation.

Today the atmosphere of Europe is as tense with national passions as it has been in 1914 or perhaps even much more so. And nationalism has reached beyond Europe and taken hold of the imagination of the people all over the earth. In the Americas (where a war between Bolivia and Paraguay has been going on for many months notwithstanding many energetic efforts at conciliation) and in Asia, and Africa. As the assassination of the Roumanian Prime Minister Duca proves, the passionate nationalists (most of those idealistic fanatics are to be found among the students) have not died out in Europe.

The governments of Hitler in Germany and of Mussolini in Italy try to strengthen and increase, by all educational means, the spirit of the modern state, the nationalistic spirit among the youth. But it is not the governments or some governments in Europe which are forcing the nationalistic spirit upon the peoples and preparing them for war, the peoples themselves are full of

the spirit of nationalism and even very liberal governments build strong navies or adhere to economic nationalism. Thus the political outlook for 1934 seems very obscure.

Nevertheless the year will pass in all probability without any large-scale war breaking out because the governments are afraid of the possible consequences and of the unknown outcome of a modern war and do not wish to take the risk. Therefore they will try to restrain their peoples. This breathing space will allow those who believe in peaceful cooperation as the aim of human development to strengthen all their efforts to replace the at present dominant national ideals of this people by loftier ideals and emotions which will augur better for the future of mankind. But this is necessarily a work of many years and therefore we must welcome meanwhile every effort to keep the precarious peace of the world, precarious as it is, to allow us to lay the foundations for coming years which may open to us an outlook less full of anxiety and animosities than the present period has been.

### The Tydings Resolution

The halls of the United States Senate rang again with denunciation of the German persecution of the Jews when Senator Millard Tydings of Maryland arose and submitted a resolution urging President Roosevelt to convey to the Hitler government "an unequivocal statement of the profound feelings of sorrow and pain experienced by the American people" at the oppression of the Jews of Germany.

Several months ago Senator Joseph R. Burton, majority leader in the United States House, spoke in a vein very much like this. His expression of indignation had no effect beyond gadding the barbed Nazis to outbursts of anger, very much like the bull which when the handkerchief strike its hide. Senator Tydings' resolution is not only commendable in itself but commendable in that it is only the initial step in a series of steps, and final one which we, we trust, the presentation of a memorandum by President Roosevelt to the German government along the line indicated by Senator from Maryland. According to Senatorial procedure, the Tydings' resolution is now in the hands of the Foreign Relations Committee, which will debate and vote on this committee to report out this resolution, or else, kill it in committee. When and if this resolution is voted out, the United States Senate will debate and vote on it.

The burden laid upon the President of the United States by the terms of the resolution are not, we believe, too heavy for him to bear. It is entirely within the democratic traditions of President Roosevelt to require him to express to

Berlin "the earnest hope of the people of the United States that the German nation will speedily alter its policy" toward the Jews and will restore their civil and political rights.

In the preamble to his resolution, Senator Tydings quieted that fear always evident in legislative chambers that an old precedent is being violated or a new one created by pointing out that on nine separate occasions the United States has raised an official voice against the persecution of Jews in other countries, as far back as 1840 and as recently as 1919. No one dare say that President Roosevelt is not a friend of Jewry, but he has, for reasons which apparently satisfy him, not dared to speak against the persecution of Jews in Germany on his own initiative. A resolution passed by the Senate, and it is to be hoped, in the lower House as well, would provide him with the impulse and the justification to put the United States on record as an outspoken friend for justice to the oppressed.

In commending Senator Tydings for raising his voice for justice to the Jews of Germany, one should not forget to give praise also to Max J. Kohr for whom the Senator derived the basic information for his resolution.

### Friends of Palestine Protest

Representatives of every American Jewish group that has at heart the development of Palestine gathered at the Hotel Astor in New York Wednesday evening to make known to the Palestine government, its disappointment at the reduction of immigration certificates and to publish its sense of indignation at the procedure. The meeting, in the nature of a joint conference of the American Representatives of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, attracted representatives of all leading Jewish organizations in America. ### A Memorial for Duca

To the Editor of the Jewish Daily Bulletin:

"Greater love hath no man than this: that he give up his life for a friend."

The history of our Jewish people is replete with names of Jewish heroes who have been martyred in the Jewish cause. I cannot recall the name of any non-Jew in all history who gave up his life for the Jews.

It is true that Emile Zola, Georges Clemenceau and other noble spirits braved social ostracism and popular contempt by their championship of Captain Dreyfus. Another example of similar martyrdom was that of ex-Governor Slaton of Georgia, who by these groups the action of the Palestine government in ignoring, in effect, the request for 24,700 immigration certificates for the six months period ending March, 1934, and granting only 20 percent of this quota, was interpreted in the resolution as one that "gravely endangers the very existence and expansion of many of the agricultural and industrial enterprises."

It is to be hoped that this American Jewish protest, reiterated by the Jewish groups of every other nation, will have some effect in the countering of the Arab propaganda against Jewish immigration, a propaganda to which the British authorities in Palestine seem to be lending so servile an ear that the uniformed observer might almost be justified in concluding that the Mandate for Palestine is being executed, not for the benefit of the Jews of Palestine, but for that of the Arabs.

He had no reli-ous national ties with his people. He had no of group solidarity. He was not interested in problems of Jewish survival, in the reconstruction Jewish life, in the national renaissance of his peo-ple in the Diaspora or in Palestine.

He naturally, therefore, Jewish life appeared to almost entirely in its negative aspects and as a Jew. His solution for anti-Semitism was naive. He should be good and kind and renounce all

gauble thoughts and the "ravings and frothings of hat- red and injustice will grow powerless." Wassermann once wrote of Columbus that he was Jewish in his inimitable inclination to find a sentimental solution for practical problems. Perhaps if Wassermann had lived in a land other than Germany, the classic land of Jew hatred, where intellectuals are given to so much mur- bid brooding over race and nationalism, and where metaphysical dialectics are so frequently brought into the service of national aberrations he would not have wearied his soul so much with painful self-scrutiny and with so many fruitless attempts at needless rec- onciliations. Race psychology and nationalistic vagaries are a German specialty. Unfortunately many of the intellectuals among the Jews in Germany permitted themselves to fall under its weird spell and thus suffered a tragic spiritual and intellectual doctomy.

The Jewish people, which missed the in- tellectual leadership which Wassermann might have given to it in the testing and turbulent times of the last quarter of a cen- tury, will nevertheless not be unkind to his memory. He was, after all, only a child of his age, one among many beguiled by the glamorous promises of liberalism and eman- cipation and at last betrayed and broken by them.

His people will treasure the works of his genius and will rescue them from the bonfire into which the Germans have cast them. The unmistakable stamp of the moral tradition of the Jew is upon all his works—the racial passion for justice, for freedom, for peace, the reverence for human life, for the inviolability of human personality.

Wassermann wrote "none can deny that justice—not merely as an abstract idea, as the incarnation of deity, but as a moral command of supremely violent urgency—constitutes the moral and legislative, political and religious fundament of Judaism." And of himself he wrote: "Indubitably the work of every outstanding author can be viewed as centering about one dominant idea. In my case, I believe, the dominant idea is that of justice." The cry for justice which rings out from the pages of "The Maurizius Case" and "Der Anden- gart", the love of humanity which is the essence of "The Goose Man", the mystic gospel of the reality and greatness of the human soul which is the burden of "The World's Illusion", place Wassermann in the direct line of the great teachers of his people. Israel will preserve his memory for he has been a faithful servant of its imperishable ideals.

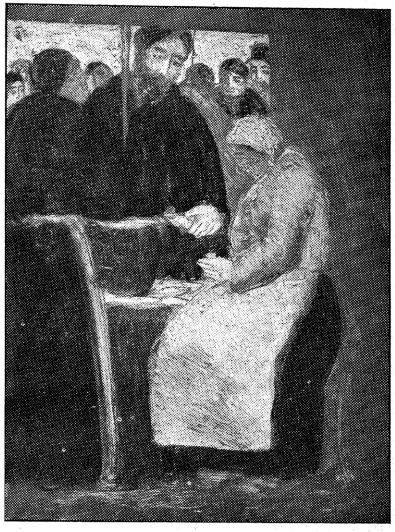

You see, it had become "the thing" to see the Dybbuk in English as it had more recently, become the fashion to see Yoshe Kalb in Yiddish. "My bones," so to speak, told me that it would not become the thing to see it in English. I thought it rather noble and Quixotic for Mr. Frohman to try to bring a wider audience to this Yiddish folk play, and I regret the failure too much to want to say, "I told you so."

At the time the English theatre public was staying away in droves from the English version of "Yoshe Kalb" I was one of a small group of auditors assembled one night in what might be called the salon so- ably conducted by Mr. Goldberg at Lakewood. I am told that this Mr. Goldberg is well known as an entertainer in the Jew- ish world, despite the fact that he has made rather few theatre appear- ances, if any, and it is possible that the nature of this humor, so effective among a few hundred, might evap- orate in a large theatre. ## New Orleans Marks 80th Anniversary of Home for Children

Established in 1854, Institution Has Undergone Changes; Now Houses 125

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 12.—Local Jewry gathered at the Jewish Children's Home here this week to help usher in the eightieth year of this institution's existence. The public observance of this Home's anniversary, stretching down from pre-Civil War days, seems to have become a tradition within this charming Jewish community.

It was during a yellow-fever epidemic in 1854 that a mass meeting of New Orleans Jews was held for the purpose of creating a separate orphanage for the children of the widow and the orphan. At present the Home is devoted to the field of child care only. However, between that time and the present, there has been a period of steady development and expansion, marked especially by its becoming affiliated with the Jewish Seventh District of the B'nai B'rith and the creation in 1902 of the Newman Home Training School as an adjunct of the Home.

The cornerstone of the present Home, situated on St. Charles Avenue, off the world's most beautiful thoroughfares, was laid on Thanksgiving Day, 1886, the building being constructed at a cost of \$100,000.

Dr. J. W. Newman is president of the Home and Harry L. Ginsburg, its superintendent. At present, and twenty-five children are housed within it at present, under supervision of a permanent trained staff of ten. There is no rigid routine, emphasis being placed by the management on attention to the particular character and needs of each child and development of a feeling of responsibility in each.

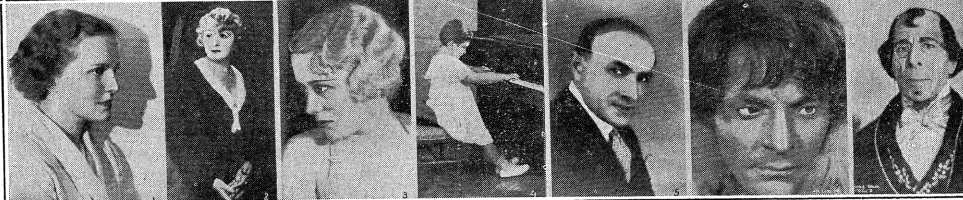

YOUNG Mr. Sidney Kingsley, who surprised everyone, including himself, with the success of "Men in White", is by his own admission hard at work on another play. He confesses that this new work will deal with the conflict between religion and science, in which God comes off very well. After witnessing Eugene O'Neill's "Days Without End" (Henry Miller Theatre), I can do nothing but look askance at Mr. Kingsley's efforts.

The subject of religion has had an almost fatal attraction

for the artists and especially when the question of atheism or faith is the thesis. The playwright who takes up nothing of a morass both for himself and his audience. If Kingsley can hurdle the barrier he is a much greater playwright than I suspected. Mr. O'Neill didn't. Although his "Days Without End" has its moments when the audience is appreciably moved, it shows in many long stretches when the same audience wonders when the actors in front of them are going to stop ranting and get down to business.

The plot, an unusually simple one, recounts the struggles of a man with his spiritual beliefs. It shows a morose fellow, played by two actors, Earle Larimore, the "good" and Stanley Ridges, representing the "evil" nature of us all, who can't decide whether he should retain his disbelief in God. Finally faced with the illness of a wife whom he loves, he goes back to the Church and all ends well.

To the religious-minded, "Days Without End" will bring nothing of heads and comfort but to those who are inclined to treat religion as a matter of convenience the reaction will be one of indifference. The problem presented by Mr. O'Neill is as old as man himself and the author's conclusions are convincing only to those already convinced nevertheless the genius of O'Neill is not completely dulled in verbosity and the play should enjoy a run.

### Re-Echo Not Very Reverberative

The much-maligned members of the banking profession came in for another lambasting in J. Golden's "Re-Echo", which opened at the Forrest last night. The same author was responsible for "Precedent", a stirring play based on the Money-Billings case. That was a first-class dramatic play in which the injustice of our laws and social system were given a thorough going-over and because his theme fairly shouted drama, the play enjoyed some success. In "Re-Echo" Mr. Golden is not so fortunate. His tale of a fraudulently, dishonest banker is done against a much narrower background. His banker is, just incidentally, a banker—he might be any man. The plot is none too credible and the incidents are often ludicrous when they should be serious.

The only friends bankers have left are the people who hope to borrow money from them. As for going up in the air, Mr. Golden might just as well have written about man-eating sharks.

## Ballet Dances In Masterpieces Of Russian Village Peasant

Costumes that might earn a place for themselves at an exhibition of peasant art and handicrafts, if they were not too busy being danced in, can be seen at the Monte Carlo Ballet Russe, now current at the St. James Theatre.

The costumes in question are those worn in "Prince Igor", an exhibition of the spirited dancing of half-barbaric tribes on the steppes of southern Russia, which comes from Borodin's opera of the name. It is not accurate to call them costumes, for they are not stage costumes in the usual sense of the word. They are actual clothes, made by artisans in the villages of the Caucasus, some of them of hand-woven cloths which would make even Rodier of Paris raise an eyebrow, and others lavishly embroidered by the Caucasian women.

In the "Prince Igor" wardrobe there is, also, a special treasure, a collection of some dozen pairs of boots. They were made in the same region, and they are triumphs of handiwork, with many-colored small bits of leather cunningly stitched together to form bizarre designs in the native style.

This collection of costumes and boots has an interesting history. When Serge Diaghilev, the great figure of the Russian ballet world, was planning his first invasion of the Western world, he commissioned Nicholas Roerich, who is now the head of the Roerich Museum in New York, to supply him with setting and costumes for the "Prince Igor" ballet.

Roerich went to the Caucasus and set the village craftsmen to work producing blouses, robes and trousers

in their own best manner, and using boots that were an achievement even in that paradise of boots.

Diaghilev's first company, which went to Paris in 1909, the Polovtsian dances in their clothes, and danced in the America in 1916 and 1917.

## Spengler's Forthcoming Work

Oswald Spengler, famous philosopher-historian, author of 'The Decline of the West', has written a new book entitled 'The Hour of Decision', which has already sold 100,000 copies in Germany in spite of the fact that it has been the target of vitriolic attack by all Nazi literary and historical critics and that it has just been banned from review over the German radio system.

'The Hour of Decision', which Alfred A. Knopf announces for publication in the United States in February, is Spengler's application to present-day political and social problems of his well-known thesis that Western culture is in decline. Although Spengler, like the Nazis, is anti-democratic, anti-Parliamentary, and anti-Marxist, he is not anti-Semitic and he is opposed to Hitler's present policy in regard to the working classes. In this book he argues for a purely aristocratic society and against all forms of contemporary social legislation such as the Nazis are now proposing.

Professor Baumer, leading Nazi scholar, has denounced the book as 'un-German, individualistic and merely aesthetic.' Although Spengler professes to stand for the high ideals of Prussianism, Professor Baumer maintains that Spengler does not understand the real meaning of Prussianism.

### 1,000 Hear Mrs. A. Silverman Describe the Situation in Booming Palestine

## MUSIC

It was a lucky star which led some days ago to the scheduling by Signor Giulio Gatti-Casazza of a "Don Giovanni" at the Metropolitan Opera on Wednesday evening and the concert of the Gatti-Casazza of "Eine Kleine Nachtmusik" at the beginning of a symphony program on Tuesday night. The very next night. Thus was a most fortunate sort of continuity effected, right in the midst of the winter program, inordinately confused scene.

And what could be more pleasant than to report that both the opera and the "serenade for string orchestra" were accorded eloquent interpretations? For even though Ezio Pinco, who sang the title role at the Metropolitan, was cold-ridden, and the shimmering delicate and wit and fineness of the "Nachtmusik" was followed by a wondrously effective "Introduction and Hymn" by Igor Markevitch, these placed, lovely Mozartian works stand out in retrospect.

Incidentally, one of the minor comforts of the music week was the opportunity to hear Pinco with the orchestra. In the latter case, the basso sang a mellow, rich "Fiesco" in the belatedly revised "Don Giovanni".
