

wave of discontent and unrest. His program was based mainly on the forged "Protocols of the Wise Men of Zion". The German unemployed were told by the Nazi demagogues that the Iews were responsible both for the war and for the "dictated" peace. The starving Germans were told that the Jews had conspired to dominate Germany that they had amassed fabulous fortunes, that they were holding the most important governmen posts, that they controlled the press and the universities, finance and commerce, that communism in Germany was a dis tinctly Jewish movement. The Hitler agitators told the hungry German masses that the Jews were of an inferior, destructive race, and that the Jews were to blame for all the ills that had befallen Germany.

It did not matter that the accusations against the Jews were brazen and absurd falsehoods. The deluded German masses believed them.

Following the line of least resistance, the Hitler regime set out to persecute, humiliate and exterminate the Jews of Germany, forcing the professionals out of their occupations, driving the intellectuals from the press and the universities, burning the books of the authors who had raised the prestige of German literature in the world, depriving countless thousands of the opportunity to earn their livelihood. And all this was done to purify the Teutonic Aryans.

I do not share the view that German Jewry is doomed be-yond hope. It is inconceivable that the German people will not

awaken before long from their delirium caused by the venomous and savage propaganda of hate. The awful tragedy of the Jews is not merely a Jewish

problem. While the liberals outside of Germany have given expression to their abhorrence of the Nazi acts of violence, the conscience of the world is not sufficiently aroused against the Hitler reign of terror because the world does not yet fully realize that the Hitler policy is really directed against the Jews not on account of their wealth or power, nor on account of their racial inferiority, but rather because the Jews in general are regarded by the Hitlerites as symbols of progress, of peace, of social justice. On various occasions reactionary, retrogressive governments have chosen the Tews as the first scapegoats, whenever the aim was to clip the wings of progress, to conceal or justify the crimes or blunders of despotism, to divert the minds of the masses from the real causes of their sufferings. Jews have thus been sacrificed in the past for various causes - sometimes religious, sometimes racial, sometimes economic, sometimes political-for all sorts of mythical grievances. In Germany today all these invented reasons have been com-

bined in the Nazi program.

peace and progress. The martial spirit of Prussian militarism is being reawakened by the demagogues that rule Germany today. A new and real threat to peace is being developed with unparalleled cynicism. The children and the youth of Germany are taught that by force alone can the German nation live.

Yesterday General von Horn, artillery commander during the World War, at a demonstration of the war veterans' league, in the presence of President von Hindenburg, said:

"Adolf Hitler has given to war a new meaning; he has given to it the idea of being a blessing for the fatherland."

Hitler himself is talking about peace. But General von Horn has blurted out the truth.

The happenings in Germany should not be regarded merely as an internal problem, for they may have grave consequences affecting other nations beyond the boundaries of Germany.

Collective Agreement on Jewish Workers

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency HAIFA, Jan. 15—Fourteen Revisionists, right wing Zionists, and four members of the Histadruth, central labor organization, were arrested here and several more were interested to the contract of the contract residence and several more were injured as the result of a labor quar-rel between the Revisionists and the Histadruth which broke out last Tuesday, and which has resulted in the arrest of fifty-eight of the combatants

The dispute began when a con-tracting firm owned by the Revi-sionists refused to sign a collective agreement regarding terms for the agreement regarding terms for the employment of Jewish labor. This agreement has already been signed by thirty-two contracting firms of Haifa. The Revisionists alone re-fused to sign. The Histadruth thereupon called a strike in a building in Hadar HcCarmel upon which Revisionists and members of the Histadruth were working. When the Revisionists refrained from striking and offered to make up the shortage of labor, the local workers' council began picketing. The Revicouncil began picketing. The Revi-sionist workers resented the picket-ing and declared that they were exclusively entitled to the work, and had merely allowed a few Histadruth members to work there.

After the Haifa Communal council failed in an attempt to mediate, the Revisionists, who have few members in Haifa, brought in reinforcements from outside. Saturday they paraded through the main street of Hadar HaCarmel. The marchers clashed with onlookers in the streets. Attorney Meyerowitz.

#### 30,000 IMMIGRANTS ENTER HOLY LAND **DURING YEAR 1933**

Jewish Newcomers Do Not Include Tourists Remaining In Country Illegally

#### Ships Did Not Sail

In November, 1933, however, ships did not sail, the firms obtained no orders and the populations of entire German provinces which had worked or months to prepare the usual quantities of Christmas merchandise not only did not get paid for the work but were left with monstrous debts for raw materials on their hands

hands.

This Christmas season German toys were boycotted abroad, with the result that in the month of November alone German exports dropped about twelve percent as compared with the exports in November of 1932. This Christmas merchants abroad ignored Germany, with the result that Germany. with the result that German exports totalled forty million marks less then

totalled forty million marks less then they did last year. The whole of Germany's shipping industry was paralyzed. Germany was stuck with the Christmas goods are a total loss, because they must be shelved until another Christmas. Thousands of German families wooled for enabling the state of another Christmas. Thousands of German families worked for nothing. The whole "Christmas industry" suf-fered a deficit this year unequalled by that of any other year in German history.

#### Non-Jewish Consumers

The "Christmas industry" in Germany is an industry intended for non-Jewish consumers. The German government therefore had reasonable government therefore had reasonable grounds for thinking that although she felt the effects of the Jewish boycott in other fields, she would surely not feel them in the field of

trade with strictly-christian articles.
The great disappointment which Germany experienced in the matter therefore came as a very unpleasant surprise, one which showed that the Lewish howest of Germany Jewish boycott of Germany is not as purely Jewish as various Hitler officials represented it to be.

A "re-estimation of values" re-essumation of values has therefore begun in government circles with regard to the question of whether it would be better to deny the effects of the Jewish boycott upon German exports to the world or to speak openly about them.

Nevertheless Dr. Schacht, Presi-dent of the German Reichsbank and virtual Minister of Finance in Germany, has just made a long speech in which he publicly disclosed the "secret" that Germany can no longer endure the foreign anti-German boycott; that if the export of Gerboycott; that it the export of Ger-man goods continues to fall as it has been falling, Germany would simply be on the threshold of bank-ruptey and would not be able to pay her foreign debts; that something must be done abroad in order to terminate the boycott campaign which the Jews are carrying on against Germany everywhere.

Dr. Schacht's speech was naturally a very diplomatic one. On the one hand it was intended to warn the American government and that of England that they would not collect their debts if they would tolerate Jewish propaganda against Germany in their countries, and on the other hand, it was an announcement to the world that Germany simply can no

But Dr. Schacht had merely to fire the first "shot", and now even such Hitlerite officials as have no claim whatever to schooled diplomacy are making speeches about the effect of the Jewish boycott upon German finances — speeches intended to keep Germany from actual bankruptcy and increased unemployment.

Since Dr. Schacht's speech, speeches have been made by Dr. Schmitt, Minister of Economics, and Dr. Ley, Commissar of Labor. The latter is by no means a friend of the Jews, by no means a friend of the Jews, but in his address he was forced to admit that Germany could now easily be submerged by a great wave of unemployment if the boycott of Germany should continue as intensively abroad as heretofore.

#### Anti-German Boycott Here Opens English Market, Paper Says

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) LONDON, Jan. 2.—The New York correspondent for The Daily Express here has in a recent dispatch communicated the message that "the recent whispering campaign activities of Jewish organizations in New York to force a total boycott of German goods has opened to British manufacturers a sudden and unexpected market opportunity.

"I plead for a new development of mankind through harmony and beau-ty in human relationships toward the oal of world peace.

Besides these red oases, one finds on the maps splotches of green which stand for turnip fields, and spots of brown for wooded areas. The cities have vanished altogether. Oaks have been planted on their sites, and thick groves of trees stretch from the woods of Teutonburg to the Black Forest and the Hartz River

After a lengthy sojourn in Barbarya, I learned to distinguish three distinct classes of Barbaryans. The ruling class are the so-called Osaphs or Barbaryans proper. This aristocratic group dwells in forests and on tree-tops.

and on tree-tops.

The less dominant class are the Heilots, a term bringing to mind both the truly German "Heil" and the ancient Greek Helot or slave. As a matter of fact, the Heilots are the negligible survivors of the lower middle classes who had been shouting "Heil!" in honor of their ruling class so long and so ardently that they finally disintegrated into these miserable Heilots. The former proletarian class no longe exists in Barbarya. What is left of the proletariat constitutes the points marked red on the map. It is there that these "concentrational" Europeans are confined, "concentrational" Europeans are connined, or, rather, are doomed to slow death and total annihilation. They live under stricts surveillance. Using the alphabet is a capital offence. Runie script, the characters of which require the use of pointed knives, is not accessible to them because they are not allowed to possess weapons of any kind. Thus, writing is the exclusive privilege of the upper class, whose members carry sharp knives with them. With these knives

they also skin the oxen, whose flesh they cut into chunks and devour raw. The concentrational Europeans com-municate with each other by means of a secret sign language reminiscent of that of deaf-mutes. If one of them is caught talking to a fellow prisoner he is beaten up severely and, often as not, flogged to death These concentrational Europeans are fed on turnip offal, dung and occasional leftovers thrown to them by some of the softer-hearted Barbaryans.

The members of the Heilot class are of fair complexion. They have blue eyes, tangled beards, and are clad in brown canvas suits. Had they worn animal skins instead, they might be taken for Huns. But skins are the exclusive privilege of the upper class. The female Heilots wear their hair in long braids and coquettishly display necklaces made of enemies' teeth. The last vestiges of civilization may be observed in these women's long finger nails observed in these women's long linger had dyed red in accordance with the style at present in vogue among our own ladies in the West. The men and women of this class toil in the turnip fields, the concentrational Europeans or former working classes being deprived of all opportunity to engage in any occupation.

What seemed narticularly strange to me was that I noticed among the Heilots a number of people of an absolutely non-Aryan east of countenance. My official guide, who would not let me out of sight either during waking or sleeping hours and who kept in his pocket—to be on the safe -a test tube with a specimen of my blood, explained to me that not all Heilots were full-blooded Aryans but that many of them had assimilated themselves to such a degree that their actions and manners became no less Aryan than those of their

After a long and fatiguing journey acceeded at last in reaching the residence the chiefs of Barbarya's ruling caste. I had been accustomed, during my former travels, to meeting all kinds and manner people. Particularly replete with surprises was the land of the Houyhuhms. And yet, when I beheld for the first time the rulers of Barbarya, those most exclusive inhabitants of our globe, I was dumbfounded.

Indeed, as my readers shall see, there maced, as my readers shall see, little was ample reason for astonishment. As soon as I caught sight of this all-lighest aristocracy of Barbarya, I could hardly resist exclaiming out loud, at the top of my

Maybe he exaggerates his good will to men, but I am perfectly willing to take the witness stand and swear that he has a good deal of it, even if it dosn't work overtime for every person who makes claims on it. Regarded as a bookish person, as a potential Talmud scholar gone wrong, he would, by and large, talk to a human being than read even a good book.

He is conscious, however, and painfully so, that smaller men have done much more with much less knowl-edge and style. He told how he recruited 65 boys from a neighborhood that was then con-sidered one of the worst in the city. sidered one of the worst in the city. These young people, he said, were only too happy to take advantage of the opportunities he offered them to advance themselves in a musical way. In those days, he added, talent had nowhere to go for advice. Many of these boys needed more than advice; they needed the wherewithal to start them along the lines leading to a career. Out of that group have come some of our finest musicians. Fourteen of the group are now members of the Philadel-phia Orchestra. There is hardly an phia Orchestra. There is hardly an orchestra of importance in this country that does not have a former student of the Symphony Club. Not long ago one of the Symphony Club students failed to pass the examina-tions of the Philadelphia Orchestra. Now he is earning more in one day than the other fourteen earn in a week. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) HARBIN, Manchukuo, Jan. 15— The official Manchukuo news agency today stated that the well-known German engineering firm of Siemens Schuckert is withdrawing from Man-chukuo and China as a result of the boycotting of German goods by Jew-ish firms. Most of the Siemens' firm representatives in the Far East mrm representatives in the Far Last were Jews who refused to continue handling German goods. The Ger-man firm thereupon ordered its agent to leave Manchukuo and settle in Hongkong.

Certificates of Purity Are to Be Demanded of Newcomers There

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Jan. 15 — The Thuringian government today ordered officials not to grant naturalization pares until the applicant had undergone physical and mental tests and had obtained a certificate of purity from the racial department. More than 130 applicants for na-

turalization in Thuringia were or-dered by the Thuringian Minister of the Interior to prepare for examina-tion on their racial descent. The order is part of a special racial cam-paign in Thuringia and provides also that all teachers, policemen, and state officials must undergo a compulsory course in racial education, similar to the one taken by all physicians, except the Jews. In the future, it was announced, even judges, social work-ers and state and municipal employees must all take special courses or-ganized by the racial department of the Thuringian government.

The Thuringian state will also be the first state in Germany to carry the first state in Germany to carry out a racial registration of the en-tire population. All residents must establish their descent sixteen gen-erations hack and supply informa-tion for the official files.

A racial exhibition has been opened in Munich showing photographs and models of racial Jewish traits. The object of the exhibition is to educate the population how to distinguish between Aryans and non-Arvans.

Macy's department store and its president became the object of an attack by Samuel Untermyer, presi-dent of the American League for the Defense of Jewish Rights, in an advertisement which the daily papers man manufactures were difficult to man manufactures were difficult to replace, but that his concern was spherituring for them as rapidly as possible. Women's fabric gloves and children's full fashion cotton losiery he cited as examples of superior German merchandise, which could not as yet be duplicated without entailing much higher costs to the ultimate consumer. In some lines, he said, manufactures from Czechoslovskia, as well as from the lines, he said, manufactures from Czechoslovakia, as well as from the U.S.A., and from other countries, were being substituted, but for the present Czechoslovakian factories operating to capacity output cannot produce enough to replace entirely German manufactures.

#### Disposing of Stocks

'In the meantime', Mr. Straus said, "we are trying to sell what German merchandise we have. To do this we must treat it much the same as goods from other countries. same as goods from other countries. All imports are marked with a stamp of the country of origin as required by law. We have instructed, our salespeople to call attention to the fact of German origin before purchase is consummated. We have received complaints from a number of our German customers regarding our distinction of German goods from the rest. Likewise, we have received complaints in gradually diminishing numbers from Jewish customers against our handling Ger-man goods at all."

"Our present policy with regard to German goods will remain in effect until Americans again show themselves willing to buy Germanmade merchandise", Mr. Straus con-

Mr. Straus emphasized the fact that Macy's handling of German goods is a reflection of the dwind-ling of popular demand for manu-factures from New Germany. Sets of German china were displayed on shelves china were displayed on shelves where they could be seen to best ad-vantage by customers. Their only vantage by customers. Their only, identification as being of German hake was the usual label printed in small letters on the back of each piece, "Made In Germany."

The saleslady at the perfume counter in Macy's described "Auf Wiederschen" perfume as being an excellent brand. As far as one hight judge from her description of the article, German perfumes had not been boycatted or discriminated against in Macy's.

"Women's fabrie gloves made in Germany were displayed at Macy's glove counter, and their quality was described in highly favorable terms. No mention of the boycott was made by the salesgirl, however. The German products appeared to be of lar-ger stock than those made in other

The new party, in its program, denies antagonism toward any reli-gion, but declared its adherence to gion, but declared its adherence to British tradition and constitution as far as religious freedom is concerned. lar as reigious freedom is concerned.

Nevertheless, the very first spokesman for the party, Skeels, is known as an anti-Semite, who only a few weeks ago published a lengthy attack on Sir Oswald Mosley, leader of another British Fascist group. He of another British Fascist group. He accused Sir Oswald of being an in-strument of the Jews and a charla-tan who was being paid by the Jews. The attack on Mosley was published in Der Stuerner of Nu-renberg, edited by the notorious Nazi anti-Semite, Julius Streicher. Skeels recently participated in Nazi agitation in Germany, address-ing numerous mass meetings with his friend Streicher. Up to a few

his friend Streicher. Up to a few days ago he was part of the leader-ship of the anti-Semitic Imperial Fascist group. It is generally suspected here that Skeels is a paid Nazi agent.
