### "Men of Russia"

THE CURRENT issue of The New Outlook contains an article on "Men of Russia". by James E. Abbe, an American newspaperman, formerly employed by the "Soviet photo-graphic trust". Mr. Abbe states that most of the men who control Russia today are not Russians, not even Slavs. He writes: "Stalin is a Georgian, a different race. Kaganovitch is a Jew. Litvinov is a Jew. Karakhan, Armenian. Smirdovitch (Smidovitch) is a Jew. Ordionikidze is Georgian. Kurtz is Austrian, Karl Radek. a Jew."

The biographical sketches of sixteen men in the Russian Government are given. "Men in business for Russia in strategic positions: buyers, traders, are rarely ever Russian", writes Mr. Abbe. "Members of the Jewish race from all over the world predominate. Every member of the foreign office press censor bureau is a Jew. Little men of Russia who help in responsible positions, heads of offices, trusts, are mostly Jews. It is significant that the three warriors on our list are Russians. But Slavic Russia has been launched as a business firm by others than Slavs. The infusion of alien blood has quickened the pulse, the respiration, of the 'Russian bear'".

Though the article is intended to though the article is intended to be an accurate picture of the men who rule Russia today, and though it was apparently the purpose of the author to be sympathetic to the role played by Jews in Soviet Russia today, it is misleading be-cause of the inaccuracies it con-tains. Of the six Jews among the sixteen men in control of the Soviet sixteen men in control of the Soviét Government, only two, Kaganovitch and Litvinov, should have been in-cluded. The other four, Radek, Borodin, Padolsky and Smidovitch, do not belong in that list. Radek is a brilliant publicist and editor. Padolsky is head of the Foreign Office passe, gensorship. Borodin parts a minor position. Lifschitz 'is "second in command of the Mos-cow Antore". Smidovitch whom "second in command of the Mos-cow Antorg". ### Conference Sunday To Study Refugee Aid

#### Delegates of 1800 Groups Will Meet in Hotel Pennsylvania

More than 1,500 delegates representing 1,800 Jewish organizations in New York City will participate in a city wide emergency conference to be held on Sunday afternoon at the Hotel Pennsylvania, to deliberate on methods of encouraging the settlement of German Lewish refugees in Palestine.

The conference, arranged under the auspices of the Council of Jew-ish Organizations on Palestine, of which George Z. Medalie, Jacob Fishman and Dr. Samuel Margoshes are the leaders, will mark the first time that all of New York's Jewish communal, fraternal and religious bodies will meet as a single unit to consider the German Jewish problem.

Declaring that "the response that the call for the conference has evoked has been unprecedented in its unanimous expression of coop-eration and solidarity." Mr. Medalie stressed the importance of the conference.

It is expected that the meeting at is expected that the meeting will go on record as declaring it-self fully in agreement with the plans of the Jewish Agency for Palestine to settle German Jewish refugees in Palestine and that aid will be volunteered for the forthcoming National Emergency Campaien.

# "University In Exile" Issues Social Research

Dr. Alvin Johnson of the New School for Social Research an-nounces the first publication of Social Research, an international quarterly published by the members of the graduate faculty of political and social science-the University in Evile

In his foreword to the first issu Dr. Johnson says, "Nothing could be more natural than the emergence of a new organ of publication at the New School, where the largest organic grouping of continental scholars abroad has been established as a Graduate Faculty of Political as a Graduate Faculty of Political and Social Science. It would be impossible, even if it were prac-ticable, for an organized body of continental scholars to function abroad exactly as they had func-tioned at home."



In the absence of specific statutes and direct precedents, the court will decide the legality of the anti-Nazi boycott by balancing the conflicting social, economic and political factors involved (33 Columbia Law Review 1439; Mr. Justice Holmes on Privilege, Malice and Intent, 8 Harvard Law Review, pp. 1, 9).

In other words, were the question to arise before an American court the boycotters would be called upon to show their justification and purpose, and against these the court States.

The boycott's justification: The defense of the Jewish people against a campaign of extermination within Germany and of vilification and hatred without; the answer of orhatred without; the answer of or-ganized labor in America to the death-blow administered to organ-ized labor in Germany; the protection of democratic institutions and human rights everywhere from the fate that has engulfed them in the Reich:

And as against these high purposes:

The threat of non-payment, of German bonds held by American investors; disturbance of trade relations between America and Germany; the threats of German re-prisals in the form of boycotting American goods.

Let us look somewhat more closely at these considerations which on their face would seem to militate against the boycott.

The argument most frequently advanced against the boycott is that it would react unfavorably on the repayment of the huge private loans floated by Germany in this country in the years immediately preceding the depression.

The obvious reply to this argument is that the holders-of German eat James Reid, New Utrecht, 6-2, bonds in this country constitute a comparatively small group, whose De Witt Clinfon is thus assured private interests are not to be iden-

the glow of the Reichstag pyre; the anti-Jewish and anti-intellectual orgies of last spring; the wave of protests and boycott resolutions that swept the outside world;—all took place long after Germany had suspended payment on her long-term obligations. To be exact, the de-cree of the German government declaring a moratorium on private debts owed to foreigners was promulgated on May 23, 1932. Since that time the German Reichsbank has steadily pursued the policy of depressing the value of German private obligations by defaults in the payment of interest, and of buying back these bonds at bargain prices-"Of the \$1,200,000,000 of German dollar bonds originally issued here, Germany has repatriated \$450,000,-000, and each day that passes sees the remainder steadily whittled down" (Edward I, Condlon in the New York Times, Jan. 12, 1934).

The German bonds have been and are being repurchased by Germany at an average cost of 50 cents on the dollar. This cost is further diminished by the depreciation of the dollar in terms of the mark. Thus, a \$1,000 bend for which the Germans received \$1,000, or 4,200 marks in 1927, is repurchased by them at a cost of \$500, which at the current rate of exchange is equivalent to approximately 1,333 marksjust one-third of the original loan!

It would have been impossible for Germany to effect these enormous savings without a continuing default in the payment of private obligations; which results in the depreciation of her securities in Wall Street. In the light of the subsequent events, the default may be considevents, the detault may see considered as an integral part of the re-patriation scheme, and is obviously unaffected by any consideration of boycott activities in the creditor

countries. It is also argued that the boycott disturbs German-American trade re-fations, impairs Germany's ability to buy in America, and may result in a counter boycott on her part.

States consist overwhelmingly of raw materials. The report of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce for 1932 shows that in that pre-Hitler year this country exported to Germany \$84,000,000 worth of crude materials, \$13,000,000 worth of "semi-manufactures" and only \$34,000,000 worth of finished products, including manufactured foodstuffs, a proportion of nearly three to one of unfinished to finished products.

Of the raw materials, by far the nost important single item is cotton, of which over \$68,000,000 worth was exported in 1932-over 50% of Germany's total imports from the U. S. This cotton is indispensible to Germany's textile industry, and is of the short-staple variety, which cannot be obtained everywhere. Moreover, German textile machinery is adapted for this short-staple cot-ton, and it would cost Germany a staggering sum of money in new machinery if she desired to change the long-staple product.

Such materials as cotton scrap metals and raw furs are bought by Germany in the U. S. not for consumption but because they are vital necessity to her industrial life She converts them into finished products and resells them to other countries, including the United States, in ruinous competition with American manufacturers. In order to enable her exporters

to gain an advantage over their competitors, Germany uses the notorious "scrip mark" system, which is a compulsory subsidy to German this: foreign bondholders receive part of their interest in the form of scrip, which is redeemable only at the Gold Discount Bank in Germany at a discount of 50%. This scrip is then sold by the Bank at 571/2% of its face value, to the German exporters, who are thus en-abled to quote bargain prices for their wares in the international markets.

American purchases of German goods in 1932 amounted to approxi-mately \$73,500,000, of which over \$42,000,000 worth were in finished manufactured products, \$20,000,000 in manusessemi-manufactures and one of the control of products, in the vast majority of instances, could have been pur-chased from our own American manufacturers and could have given employment to our own American labor.

It is true that our exports to Germany exceed our imports from that country. However, as President Roosevelt has pointed out (New York Times, Jan. 25, 1934, p. 9), in arriving at the true balance of trade we must take into account the "invisible exports"-payments ac-

grants, shipping services, insurance, etc. These items swell the figures etc. These items swell the figures of German exports to a point where our favorable trade balance, if any, is negligible.

There is no gaineaving the fact that trade relations are disrupted by an effective boycott. But we may seriously doubt whether in the case of our trade with Germany, the boycott would be disadvantageous to America. The nature of German purchases here; the nature of American purchases in Germany; the unscrupulous methods of Germany in her competition with American manufacturers here and abroad; the direct benefits inuring to American capital and labor from a replacement of German products by those made in America; these factors may well cause a court to hesitate in declaring that the in-terests of the United States are injuriously affected by the boycott, or that the supposed injury to trade is more important than the tremendous stake which America has in the tions and human rights.

### Poor Always Welcome at Denver Hospital, Says Mrs. Pisko, "Mother" of Institution

#### Pioneer Tubercular Worker in New York to Attend Annual Meeting

A comfortable little old lady, known as the "mother" of the Na-tional Jewish Hospital at Denver, came to New York yesterday after-noon. She is Mrs. Seraphine Pisko, seventy-three, pioneer hospital and social welfare leader of Denver, Cosocial welfare leader of Denver, Co-lorado, and executive secretary of the hospital ward for more than thirty years. With Dr. William S. Friedman, president of the institu-tion, she has arrived to attend the national annual board meeting, to be held Sunday at the Waldorf Astoria.

At the age when most women are relegated to arm chairs, Mrs. Pisko is still full of enthusiasm and ambi-tion for her remarkable "child", the first and largest national, non-sectarian, free hospital for tubercular poor in the United States. A grey-haired, pleasantly wrinkled, diminutive woman, dressed simply in black she speaks with pardonable pride of

the modest birth of her life's work.
"In the early days of Denver, poor
people with tuberculosis, Jews, came
from every part of the country in search of health in the Colorado cli-But they needed more than climate-they needed food, shelter and medical care. We were just and medical care. We were just a handful of Jews in those days and we could not take care of them all. We did the best we could, but it was not enough. Our rabbi, Dr. William S. Friedman, conceived the idea of a free hospital for tubercular patients. We finally managed to open through the help of the B'nai Brith Lodge, and we started with one building;—we now have sixteen."

The hospital is "kosher" and has a Hebrew school for the children, besides its regular public school studies. There is a synagogue in which services are held twice a day and "Kaddish" recited for the dead.

Mrs. Pisko recalls as a "wonderful dream comes true", the dedication of the hospital thirty-five years ago, on December 1899. Previous to this date the poor Jewish consumptives used to live in "rooms", hardly cared for neglected, with occasional free rices by some kindly physician.

"Now", she said, with glowing res, "we have one of the most upto-date hospitals for tuberculars in the world. We are able to help fardvanced patients to a remarkable degree. We are also doing won-derful work for crippled children and our hospital contains the only tional preventorium for children n the United States. And most im-

### Jewish Shop in Rio Mobbed by Students: Police Save Owner

Display of Pair ing in Window Gave Offense to Students Leading Attackers

(Tamish Telegraphic Agency) RIO DE JANEIRO, Jan. 31-A painting of Rio harbor showing a Negro in the foreground served as in excuse for a mob attack upon the place of business of a Jewish trader in gold here today.

The student leaders of the mob asserted that the painting, which is the work of a Brazilian artist, was an insult to the Brazilian nation. Zitrin, the Jewish owner of the store, which is on the principal street of Rio, displayed the painting in his show-window.

Police saved Zitrin from the hands of the mob by arresting him. In commenting on the incident, the Jornal do Brasil attacked Zitrin for having considered himself a Brazilian and demanded the cessation of Tewish and Japanese immigration.

#### Change of Front

The comment by the Jornal do Brasil is apparently indicative of a reversal of policy on the part of the newspaper, since only last month the Jornal featured a detailed article on the growth and recon-struction of Palestine. The article, which was accompanied by photographs of the new Palestine, was written by Dalbo Cortez, one of the editors of the Jornal do Brasil, and was called "The Return of the Jews to Palestine, the Zionist Ideal and the Renaissance of Israel in Its Historic Land."

At the time it appeared, the article was considered a phenomenon favorable to the efforts of the Palestine Labor Fund, which is now conducting a campaign in Brazil.

The Jornal do Brasil is one of the oldest and most influential newspaners in the country.

Soon after Hitler's victory, Russian Nazi groups had been formed in Germany and within a few months a whole net of such groups had been established in all the countries in established in all the countries in which Russian emigres live. Recently all these groups were united in one world body and a triumvirate of three was appointed to run the whole organization. The three members of this triumvirate are Von-siazki, Kazem-Bek, and "General Count Bermond-Awaloff." In view Count Bermond-Awaloff." In view of the importance the Russian Nazis attach to "pure Russian Descent", it is interesting to note that Mr. Vonsiaszki is a Pole, while Mr. Kazem-Bek is not only not "pure Russian", but not even an "Aryan", belonging as he does to the Caucasion "mountain "ite." tribes". The play is a trifle better than the ordinary run of the mill mystery play. It is well acted, expertly directed and intelligently presented, but it is, unfortunately, not exciting an especially gripping. The first act or especially gripping. The first act is by far the best, but the next two sessions slough off to a whisper. M. Matthews' performance is a needed lesson for actors who think that the only way to play a role is to holler, stamp and practically whistle their way through a part to convince the audience that they are "in there" trying. Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin: I appreciate the reply of Mr. Paul J. Phelan, in yesterday's issue, and regret that he misunderstood the tone of my remarks by taking them altogether literally, with regard to the persecution of the Jews in Germany, as compared with the per-secution of Catholicism in Latin countries

Of course it is difficult to separate a religion from its adherents, and when one is persecuted, the other suffers as a result. But there is a difference of degree in emphasis. For example, Russia perse-cutes religion, yet the adherents are not persecuted if they obey the law. The clergy are deprived of suffrage; but if they change their occupation to what is legally per-mitted, they are still cittiens. Simi-larly, if Mexico and Spain have phasis. For example, Russia persedeprived their clergymen and Sisters of their religious functions -at least if they change their occupations they are still citizens. And if they adopt atheism or socialism, they would surely be accepted by the regime. But not so with the German Jews. Although the Nazis can say that they are not persecuting the Jewish religion (except banning the Old Testament from the churches; and except SHEHITAH, method of slaughtering animals), their aim has been pub-liely repeated, namely, to extermi-

sin and becomes surprisingly prigg-

Persecution is not justified,

But who other than a Catholic has a right to tell a Catholic not to change his belief to atheism or any other, if he so chooses? Therefore what right have Jews to interfere in Catholic countries?
