# Life of North American Jewry in Review

## Warns Against Nazi Agents in Scholars' Robes

Prof. Sachar, of Illinois U., Sees 'Research Professors as Foes of Jews

(Special to the J.D.B.)  
PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 5.—A plea to save American universities for America against the inroads of Nazi propagandists masquerading as research professors was made yesterday by Abraham L. Sachar, of the University of Illinois, at a dinner in celebration of the 50th anniversary of the B'nai B'rith. More than 1,000 people attended the gathering.

"We have lost the universities of Roumania, we have lost the universities of Poland," he declared. "Let us not awake to find that we have lost the American universities." He described his encounters with these so-called research professors in different parts of the country. The Hibbel Foundation, which combats this evil, must be extended to include many additional universities, he said.

Judge Myron Sulzberger, of New York, told of the activities of the Anti-Defamation League, characterizing it as a Jewish service in bringing to the surface the hidden machinations of detractors. He extolled the Tydings Resolution, which expressed the hope that it would soon pass the Senate.

Senator William H. King, of Utah, deplored the mil'itaristic spirit now animating Germany and Japan. He condemned Hitlerism, characterizing it as d'spotism and tyranny, and paid high tribute to the Palestine rehabilitation program.

At the dinner, the local B'nai B'rith lodges, under the chairmanship of Joseph L. Kim, pledged themselves to raise \$25,000 within the next two weeks.

## Plan Drive in New England

Adopt Campaign for JDC and Palestine After Heated Session

(Special to the J.D.B.)

BOSTON, Feb. 5.—After a warm debate, a proposal of a joint campaign in "this community for the benefit of the Joint Distribution Committee and for Palestine" was accepted yesterday by fifty representatives of a number of Jewish organizations, including the American Jewish Congress, Associated Jewish Philanthropies, B'nai B'rith, Hadassah, Joint Distribution Committee and the Zionist Organization of America. Allocation of the proceeds from the campaign will be on an equal basis.

The meeting was called by Louis E. Kirstein, Judge A. K. Cohen, Dr. E. M. Selekman and Joseph J. Kaplan. Dr. Selekman, director of Associated Jewish Philanthropies, opened the meeting with a statement that the joint campaign should be held, but that final allocation of the funds should be designated by a committee which shall use its discretion in this matter.

This suggestion gained momentum at the gathering, with an overwhelming majority opposed to it. It was insisted that the Palestine campaign must be treated at least on a par with the Joint Distribution Committee. The Zionist Organization would not leave the matter to the committee but demand that it be decided before the commencement of the drive. A counter resolution to this effect was introduced by Elihu D. Stone.

Judge A. K. Cohen, urging a compromise, said that Boston be guided by the decision from New York. If this is found unacceptable, the local committee, he said, would resign. He suggested course of action to be adopted that Jewish tradition and the failure of more relief programs in the past necessitate the recognition of the purity of the Palestine drive, but for the sake of unity and harmony, equality was acceded to.

## Supreme Court Upholds Anti-Trust Law Decree In Koshier Poultry Case

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—An injunction issued by the Federal District Court in New York City, restraining the Official Orthodox Poultry Slaughtering of America, Inc., Local 167 of the International Brotherhood of Chauffeurs, Teamsters, Stablenmen and Heifers of America and certain members of organizations from continuing to violate the Sherman anti-trust law in handling poultry in the metropolitan district, was sustained today by the United States Supreme Court.

The government in its suit brought in the Federal Court in New York alleged that the members of the different organizations, by threats of violence and terror, had entered into an unlawful conspiracy in May, 1927, to control those who should engage in the poultry business inter-state commerce in the metropolitan area.

## Argentine Cuts Immigrant Law

### New Regulations to Facilitate Entry Take Effect March 7

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
BUENOS AIRES, Feb. 5.—A series of new immigration regulations which will make possible a freer entry into this country have been made public here and will go into effect on March 7.

According to the new ruling, relatives of Argentine residents in Class II will be accorded the same privileges formerly reserved for Class I relatives. They will also be exempt from the usual immigration tax, which amounts to thirty-three gold pesos.

Class I includes parents, children, husbands, wives, brothers and sisters of persons living here. Class II includes more distant relatives, such as uncles, aunts, nieces and nephews, brothers and sisters-in-law. Prospective brides and bridegrooms will be required to pay the immigration tax at the Argentine consulate in the country from where they are coming, the money to be refunded when the marriage papers are issued to them here after their arrival.

According to the new regulations, farm laborers who come here upon the affidavit of a colonization society or can otherwise prove that they intend to engage in agriculture will be exempt from the fee. It is expected here that the new (Jewish Colonization Association) and the Immigrant Protective Association will take advantage of the opportunity to bring in a number of Jewish colonists.

Immigrants who can show documents proving that they have already lived in Argentina will also be permitted to enter without paying any fee.

### 79 Out of 80 Jewish Boys Are Flunked by Lithuania

KAUNAS (Kovno), Lithuania, Feb. 5.—A masked number of clauses enforced by the Lithuanian government was revealed today when it became known that seventy-nine out of eighty Jewish students who applied for admission to the University this year failed in their examinations.

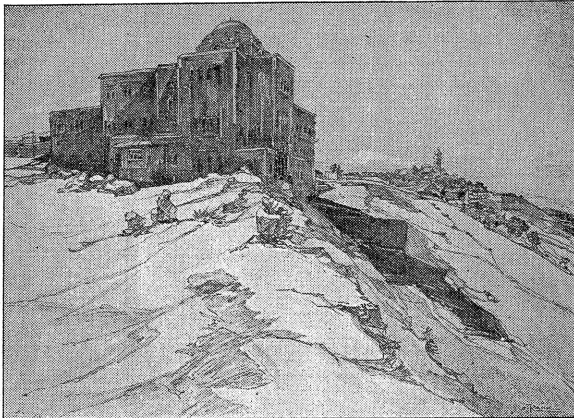
All of the eighty students in question were enrolled last year as free students, which meant that they were not matriculated, but allowed to attend lectures in the hope of being enrolled officially this year and permitted to take the examinations. Failure in the examinations means complete expulsion from the university and refusal to allow them to attend even as free students.

### 'The Dybbuk' to Be Made Into Scene for La Scala

The libretto of the opera will be written by Renato Simoni and the well-known composer Ludovico Rocca has been commissioned to write the music for the new opera.

## Jesser Traveling Troupe Dissolved

### Non-Aryan Actors Traveling Through Holland Are Cast Adrift

AMSTERDAM, Jan. 23.—The Jesser troupe, a touring company of exiled Jewish actors under the direction of Prof. Leopold Jesser, famous stage manager, has suddenly been dissolved. The news has caused quite a sensation in artistic circles all the more as secrecy prevailed about the motives of the dissolution. Some papers claim that Jesser's new assignment as stage manager of the "Totterdemische Hoofdstad Tooniel," a leading theatre, is responsible for the dissolution. The manager of this theatre, Herr Cor van der Lugt-Molert, however, denied the report that he had engaged Jesser only on condition that he give up the work with his troupe. The impresario Herr Ernst Krauss admitted that the troupe had been dissolved until further notice but refrained from any comment. Prof. Jesser will now direct Schiller's "Wilhelm Tell" in Rotterdam, but with Dutch actors.

## British Interest Rises In Levant Fair Next April

LONDON, Feb. 5.—Nine countries are erecting pavilions at the Levant Fair, Walter Runciman, president of the Board of Trade, informed the House of Commons today in answer to a question from a member.

He also stated that six other nations are still undecided as to participation in the fair. The British pavilion at the fair will be the largest, the cabinet member declared, adding that numerous firms from Great Britain will participate both in the English pavilion and in other sections.

## Jews Strike in Warsaw

WARSAW, Feb. 5.—The Jewish branches of the ladies' ready-wear tailors and shoemakers organizations went on strike here today because of the prevailing economic conditions. About 2,500 Jewish workers are affected.

## Nazis Tell U. S. Its Jews Are So Bad They Ignore Even Monroe Doctrine

BERLIN, Feb. 5.—The headquarters of the Association of People's European Nazi Organizations today issued a proclamation headed "United States, Awake!" The organization is charged with spreading anti-Jewish propaganda throughout the world.

Urging Aryans to recognize the yellow and black races, but to put Jews even lower than Negroes, the proclamation, which is addressed to the United States, pointed out that Americans are doing their best to protect themselves against

the Negroes, but fail to protect themselves against the Jews "who are even more dangerous because they are not so easily recognizable, and who do not even observe the Monroe Doctrine," the declaration pointed out.

"Unless urgent measures are taken, Americans will find themselves sliding from a half deadly sleep to actual death," the Nazis warned America, concluding with a reference to German experience in the African colonies "where Negroes can be managed and dominated to the advantage of Aryan," which is not the case with Jews.

## Nazis Stop Seeing Jews as Problem

### Herr Professor Welcomes an Independent Nation for Semites

BERLIN, Feb. 5.—The Jewish question is no longer dangerous in Germany, Professor Gustav Guenther of Hamburg declared today in addressing the School of German Education here. Professor Guenther stated that the Jews are not a problem in Nazi Germany, citing as an example the friendly relations between Germany and the Soviet Union, despite the German opposition to Communism.

"A similar attitude will be taken toward the Jews if they establish an independent nation," Professor Guenther said.

## Exit Jewish Volksbank

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
BERLIN, Feb. 5.—German Jewish banks will no longer be allowed to carry the name of Volksbank, people's bank, it was disclosed today at a meeting of the small Jewish bank representatives here. The meeting was called for the purpose of adopting a unified control system.

Reports submitted to the conference declared that Breslau, Leipzig and other courts in Germany had refused to register Volksbank, people's bank, claiming that the title was misleading, and prohibiting Jewish banks in Germany from carrying the title in the future.

## Mock Nazi 1936 Olympics Tests

### Dutch Paper Says Jews 'Haven't a Ghost of a Chance'

AMSTERDAM, Jan. 23.—"The American Olympics Committee, and notably General Sherill, have been deliberately misled by German with regard to the question of the participation of Jews in the Olympic Games in 1936 in Berlin." This is the essence of a lengthy article in the Amsterdam newspaper Het Volk. The paper recalls that the Germans asserted foreign Jews could participate "just as well as German Jews." Emphasizing that the Jews have been excluded from every German sports association and club, Het Volk declares that German Jews have no ghost of a chance to undergo any training. As a matter of fact, the Aryan paragraph in itself renders it impossible for Jews to participate. In the case of Helena Meyer, who is a half-Jew, it was declared that there was no objection to her joining the German Radio team if she should want to join it. The paper doubts that under these circumstances, with the social anti-Semitic boycotts and the German non-Aryan can be in any of the teams.

# Snow in Jerusalem Annazes Arab Delights Young and Old

JERUSALEM, Jan. 17.—To the world at large, the idea of this Holy City being covered in a white pall of snow, the bleached domes and spires and steeples and minarets of a tri-religious center standing out picturesquely from the surrounding Judean hills, seems wholly incongruous because Palestine is in the sub-tropics. "Snow in Jerusalem" sounds as inappropriate and as unbelievable as "Yoboganning in Timbuktu" or "singing in South Sea Islands" or "Monsoms in Minneapolis."  
But from the look of it, the texture, the feel of it, the Arctic atmosphere it produces, the rapid slushy thaw, and the comments of those proudly ransacking their memories for reminiscences of Bigger and Better Snowfalls in Russia and of pro-war days—what have the Soviets done to the snows of yesterday?—and is Merrie England, it really is northern snow, I hope to tell you.

Just "cracker" that this year's three-hour snowfall has produced so far is the remark made by the young Jewish lad, studying English literature, who after a long climb at the embankments of the buildings of the walled Old City of Jerusalem emerging from their untended cloak, said brightly, "I know now what they mean by a 'whitened sepulchre'."

The people who seemed most bitter with the elements were the Arab demonstrators, who waved leaflets and banners of defiance and braving the slippery, slushy cobble-stones of the Old City. The Palestinian police, on the other hand, looked forward to snowballing refractory demonstrators instead of using tear gas, a stock of which had been laid in from England in anticipation of the coming of the winter weather bullets. But their ebullient spirits were chained by the sober politicians in the force.

Jewish urchins and Arab ragamuffins had their first real outdoor occasion since 1927, the date of the last heavy snowfall. Inter-ethnic or inter-racial combat raged madly and done in the streets for hours, and shrewd witnesses were won or crushing defeats suffered, whichever side had the most snowballs. It was the first snowfall since the elbow-strength to wild. As usual, some over-enterprising youths got stones mixed up in their white globes, and they will probably face a law case out of it.

**Snow in the Orient**  
What struck visitors to Jerusalem as the most exciting part of the event was the juxtaposition of typical and familiar Oriental scenes with the incense of winter, "covering a multitude of sin," one was said in reference to But, a Tenek, or Shanty-Town, east of Jerusalem, where the houses are roofed with corrugated iron or plain oil cans. The stately camels disdainfully picking their way along the slippery roads, wondering at this new snow, and the fat-mountain man and determined majestically to ignore it, followed by bewildered Bedouins in the desert, and the ornamental palm trees in Jerusalem gardens, and the pines and cypresses, burdened with white, brushing off to a shower at the slightest movement; the mantle of snow over the Temple Area, at the southeast corner of the walled city and the great idea of public taste in their manufacturing novelties, will seize this price-less opportunity.

What a land! What a land! People commuted from Tel Aviv to see the wonder with their own eyes, suspecting the local Hebrew press of mythical exaggeration. Local modesty thins their heart and soul into new window decorations, particularly the enterprising newcomers from Hitlerland. Many German newly arrived here, went about chucking and briskly rubbing their hands and stamping their feet—this, at least, was a reminder of their former country which they did not mind having accentuated.

**Youngsters Jubilant**  
But the honors of the day must go to the youngsters of Eretz-Israel, our homegrown future generation, particularly those from outside Jerusalem and from the colonies who made an excursion up to our altitude of 2,700 feet above sea-level to see the marvel they had so often read about. Those sturdy kids of six and seven, whose memory of previous snowfall was dim enjoyed it most, glad that the Clerk of the Weather should have given them the boon of this precious experience in Polar climate.

Altogether a satisfactory climatic event. For, from a practical viewpoint, snow is just as good as rain up in these arid hills, and it thaw fills the reservoirs and cisterns just as surely as if it had come down wet in the first place. On the other hand, it was a relief to have a half of its water supply for normal summer requirements conserved within the month, and people walk about with their expressions on their faces at the thought that there will be more baths during the hot season later on.

We have hitherto envied Syria its snowcapped Mount Hermon and the Lebanese mountains annually covered in white. There is a "Lebanon Snow" (Sheleg Levanton) in the Tel Aviv area, but it is chocolate-brown, and delicacies in ice-cream known as "hoky-poky" in England, and other refreshing dainties in the summer, that all owe their nomenclature and structural origin to the snows of Lebanon. It is time that Jerusalem should have its own white, as mention in this typical summer industry. Perhaps some of the ingenious German Jewish immigrants, who are the backbone of public taste in their manufacturing novelties, will seize this price-less opportunity.

tween many of the German associates with Nazi leanings and the Post. The reason for the break, Spiegel observed, was that Heiss realized the American Nazi sympathizers were "getting wild."  
**Slams Opposition**  
"I don't think we Jews are doing the right thing in making a big fuss about Hitlerism," said Spiegel. "Half of the stories coming from Germany aren't true anyway." Firmly, Spiegel expressed the conviction that printing an anti-Semitic broadside would do more harm to the Jewish publisher than good. They may harbor liberal views and oppose the pro or anti-racial expressions of opinion which pass through their hands. He mentioned that for years he has been in sympathy with Jewish movements. He praised Heiss for his "splendid view of things" and added that their twenty-two-year-old friendship never "was disturbed by differences."  
Spiegel's secretary told a reporter when he first entered the printing shop that the boss "is not a Jew." Spiegel was Heiss and Heiss, bespectacled, a little, slightly deaf, was there with him, preparing the next week's issue of the Post.

**'Nazis Are Broke'**  
Spiegel was asked whether the German societies in this country are financing the publication of the Post. "The Nazis here are broke," said Spiegel. "They were up and up with the Nazis since severed their connection and are up with another paper." Spiegel is a well-built man, with a high forehead and prominent nose. "I wish we could let the Germans work out their own troubles," he said. "We can't be any help to them. After all they are working out their own economic policy." Quoting Heiss, the printer said that whatever harm Hitler is doing, "the good weighs more heavily on the scale."  
"He has unified Germany and brought much good to the German people," said Spiegel, again echoing the words of the American Deutsche Post.
