# Austrian Appeal To End Strife Strikes Nazi Anti-Racial Note

#### Austria's Blunder

WE POINTED out here a few W days ago that the policy of the Dollfuss Government to ward off Hitlerism by its own brand of Nazism is suicidal. The latest events in Austria substantiate this view. Chancellor Dollfuss, relying on the Heimwehr and his other Fascist supporters, is practi-cally paving the way for the Nazi triumph in Austria.

The New York Times correspondent, Frederick T. Birchall, cabling from Vlenna, writ s that the only difference between the Hitler and Starhemberg doc-trines are those of digree and trines are those of digree and personality, that while anti-Semitism has not yet reared its ugly head in Heimwehr action, it surely will, and then the sole divergences will be those of effi-

divergences will be those of em-ciency and personality.

The outrageous attack by the Government troops on peaceful workers, on women and children, many of whom were killed, is sure to intensify bitterness and strife in Austria and to create a situation which will hasten the coming of Hitlerism.

"Why the Socialists were made objects of this attack is still a mystery, because the futile call for a general strike came only after resistance to the search for arms at Linz had resulted in bloodshed," writes Mr. Birchall. "It was not the Socialists but the Nazis who were exploding bombs all over Austria, propa-gandizing against the Govern-ment and striving to upset the regime of Chancellor Engelbert Dollfuss. The Socialists were striving to induce the Chancellor to enlist them in his defense of Austria."

Little Dollfuss has chosen the reactionary anti-Semitic Heim-wehr Fascists to 1:an on. The wehr Fascists to I an on. The weakness of Austria was its strength. Dollfuss had gained the sympathy of other nations because of his courageous efforts to resist the German Nazis By resorting now to cowardly mithods that are as despicable as those of the Hitlerite Nazis, as dose of the interest Nazis, bolifuss is practically making ready to hand Austria over to Hitler. # Restrictions Reconsidered American Federation

#### **British House Questions** Malcolm MacDonald on Tourist Deposit

LONDON, Feb. 14.-The House of Commons today once more considered the restrictions imposed by the Palestine government against tourists in Palestine, when members of the House questioned Malcolm MacDonald, son of the Prime Minister and Under Secretary for Dominions, on the subject.

MacDonald revealed that all those traveling ourists except first class must leave a deposit of \$60 at 'he Palestine frontier. This condition is applied to tourists from all countries, including En-land and the United States, he

He denied, however, that the restrictions interfered with legitimate tourists. They merely prevented tourists entering the country for the purpose of remaining there illegally, he said.

This is the first time that the note of nationalism has been introduced into the battle with the Austrian Socialists.

The appeal, which was broad cast over the entire country, urges listeners to "stand with us for Dollfuss and help us make Austria free, Christian and German." All Austrian Jewish Socialists organizations were dis solved today by order of the Dollfuss govern-ment. Among them were the Poale Zion, Socialist Zionist group, and the Jewish Socialist youth or-ganizations. However, only Mendel Singer, Poale Zion leader and representative of his party on the Jewish community, was arrested so far.

### Place for Only 200 Groups

Nearly 1,500 families have already applied at the office of the Association for Jewish Farm Settlements, sponsor of the first agree industrial colony, which is being established near Hightstown, N. J., with the assistance of the Subsistence Homestead division of the Federal government.

### Scholar Asks Bible Be Read AsaHistory

#### Dr. Glueck at Banquet, Tells of New Light Shed on Old Book

Speaking at a dinner given for him last night at the Harmonie Club before his departure for Palestine, Dr. Nelson Glueck stated that the Bible, in the light of re-cent archaeological discoveries made in Palestine, should be re-interpreted as a book of history. The dinner was given under the auspices of the American Friends of the Hebrew University. Edor the Hebrew University. Low ward M. M. Warburg, a director of the Museum of Modern Art, pre-sided. Henry Morgenthau was honorary chalrman. One hundred and fifty archaelogists and laymen

The Bible is not only a book of history as we understand that term today, Dr. Glueck further declared, but also a theological document presenting a specific religious point of view. Records found recently in western Palestine give historians opportunity fill gaps in important period of Hebrew history, he said.

His address was illustrated by slides showing pottery and other objects excavated at Rujm el Abd, Dhibam and Balauah in Trans-jordan, which he stated had given the world three of the most imant inscribed monuments and reliefs which have thus far be discovered in Palestine. Includ Included in the pictures shown were an cient synagogues excavated at Hamme and Beth Alpha by the Hebrew University. He announced that the expedition he would lead under the auspices of the American School of Oriental Research can School of Oriental Research, Bagdad, and Hebrew Union Col-lege, Cincinnati, would set out in March to try to verify the exist-ence of a trade route through the territory of Edom as far as the Gulf of Aqaba. The discovery of part of this highway the previous year had substantiated the his-torical validity of the background of the Biblical narrative in the 14th Chapter of Genesis. Shards or remains of pottery from cities of this period were shown by Dr.

Glueck. Dr. Glueck, who leaves for Palestine this morning to continue estine this morning to continue an archaeological survey of Trans-jordan, said that the joint expedi-tion of the Hebrew University-Harvard University last year un-covered large portions of the an-cient Biblical city, Samaria, which Omri built. Photographs of the inscriptions, ivories and buildings found there which have greatly augmented our knowledge of the history of the Kingdom of Israel. history of the Kingdom of Israel nistory of the Kingdom of Israel, were shown, together with life-size colored tracings of mosaics found at Beth Alpha by a Hebrew University expedition University expedition.

Dr. William Foxwell Albright of Johns Hopkins University, permanent Director of the American School of Oriental Research School of Oriental Research at Jerusalem, also spoke. He stated that the latest discoveries made by Dr. E. L. Sukenik, archaeolo-gist of the Hebrew University, were not made in an excavators' were not made in an excavators; camp, but through findings he has just made of ancient Jewish coins discovered in Jerusalem, whose in-scriptions prove that a Jewish autonomous state existed-in the Persian period two centuries after the return of the Jews from the Babylonian exile. Dr. Albright pointed out that we know for the first time through the discoveries made by Dr. Sukenik, the political nature of this autonomous Jewish

The second category is that of Jews who go through life as in a trance, who do not begin to know the meaning of it all, who cannot even understand the beauty of the tragedy and the martydom of the Jew. It is the Jew of the first category who insure the safety and survival of our people."

### Farm Council Discusses Aid To Agriculture

#### To Establish Analytical Service; Also Will Improve Roads

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) JERUSALEM, Jan. 20.—The establishment of an analytical service for soil surveys and analyses a request for consultation on proposed legislation in irrigation and land tax, license fees for wine and the compilation of a booklet of information for local shippers to foreign countries, were among the rs discussed at the seventeenth meeting of the General Agricultural Council, which has a membership of Englishmen, Jews, Arabs, German Christians and Catholic monks, all engaged in agriculture. Three of the five Jew-ish members are American.

The demand for an analytical

service as part of the Department of Agriculture is considered essen fial in view of large sums invested in land development and the im-portance of such investigations in the progress and development of agriculture generally and plantaagriculture generally and planta-tion industries particularly. In ad-dition to a soil survey, analyses of soils, irrigation and agricultural products, will be conducted if the Government adopts the proposal.

Other matters reviewed were proposals for improvement of village roads in the citrus belt; a shipping board to control export of citrus fruit to ensure better marketing; regulations to prevent despatch of unripe fruit; proposals involving expenditure, such as animal nutrition, tuberculosis control erection of dipping tanks for con trol of tick-fever; and a proposal to publish an agricultural journal.

#### But Revenge Themselves by Stealing His Show's Theatrical Costumes

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) WARSAW, Feb. 3.—Distress is rampant in the Warsaw underworld these days because a former inhabitant, Isaac Faberovitch, known as "Urke Nachalnik," has gone straight and is exposing the life of the underworld in a series of literary creations.

The underworld has been under a cloud ever since the last time Urke was released from prison and began writing his books. His former cronies are particularly incensed because Urke gave up his previous profession, and their ire culminated in an act of revenge which they recently perpetrated, although indirectly, upon him.

One of Urke's plays, "The Law Suit" is now running at the Scala Yiddish Theatre here. Late one night a group of unknown persons made their way into the theatre and made off with the costumes of a number of actors, particularly of a number of actors, particularly of those taking leading parts. The thieves were certain that the play could not go on without costumes.

Mr. David's book does not nrow any new light on the origin of Columbus. It is divided into three parts, two of which are made up of extracts, in English, om books by Celso Garcia taken f de la Riega and Vicente Blasco Ibanez, respectively. Concerning the first part, mention should be made that the Royal Spanish Academy of History resolved, in 1926, that "there does not now exist in Spain any public legal document certifying the Spanish origin of Columbus." Furthermore, it was found by the commission ap-pointed to investigate La Riega's theory that the documents pre-sented had been forged. That Blasco Ibanez, a novelist, should be taken as an authority on his-torical matters is beyond my comprehension

The Hebrew origin of Columbus is proved by means of certain monograms found in the letters ne admiral to his son, and a by the enigmatic letters which precede the signature of Columbus. The monograms are illogical deductions and queer conjectures. There is really nothing extraordinary about these letters. Columbus need not have been afraid of the Catholic Kings because he was pretended to be, an ardent Catholic. As for the mystic signature, one can only point out that Prof. Amzalak, of Portugal, has given a different interpretation Columbus's signature a long time before Mr. David ever thought of writing his book.

It is not uncommon to notice that many investigators in this field of history wished, at any risk, to attribute to Columbus the nationality that best suited their sympathies. Nevertheless, whe-ther Italian or Spanish (and now a Spanish Jew), the personality of the great navigator is just as the personality glorious as ever. It is regretful to see people like Mr. David and others compromise their fair literary reputation by such an cursion which they could have had no interest to undertake, for it is really difficult to attempt to destroy something which has been proved historical and traditional. One may hope that he will learn, without being ready to bet any money on the possibility. I hadn't been in the room very long when this young fellow launched into a most objectionable mimickry of the amobjectionable mimicary of the am-bulance-chasing type of lawyer, rendering the English with a thick Yiddish accent. I looked at the fellow; he seemed youthful, his face unlined and untroubled, his coloring reddish blond, his silken. I assumed at first that he was a Gentile who, mistaking me for a Gentile, thought himself rfectly at ease in mimicking an objectionable type of Jew. (One may be a racial chauvinist without hesitating to admit that there are some objectionable Jews, though not many.) If there was any embarassment in my hosts I any embarassment in my hosts didn't notice it, and thinking hi Gentile and believing that perhaps he thought, mistakenly, that I was Gentile too, the best thing to do was, I thought, to change the sub-ject. This I did.

But as the evening waned into early morning it became evident that the young man who had mimthe objectionable lawver icked with the Jewish accent was hi If a Jew and that he knew that I was Jewish, too; no profound se-cret, I assure you. But for no cret, I assure you. But for no good reason at all this young fel-low launched into an attack on some Jews, embroidering it with another mimickry, and this time, I observed, my Gentile hosts were embarrassed, and lapsed into an uneasy silence.

Now what was that young man doing? He was indulging in a lit-tle racial self-hate and self-flagellation. If he had presented his mimickry of Jewish lawyers at a gathering exclusively of Jews, the self-hate implicit in his mimickry would not have had the complet exercise that it had with Gentile listeners. It will take that young fellow a little time to learn it is proper for a group of Jews to burlesque, mimic, satirize their fellows. It may even be proper for a group of Gentiles to make mock of Jews. It may even be proper for a stupid Gentile to make fun of Jews in the presence of persons whose names and nondescript appearance put him off the track. But this young Jew boy was expressing his contempt for other Jews in the presence of Gentile friends as a way of indicating

This mimickry of his does not constitute a major case or race betrayal, but there is no telling but that at some other time he may expose his Jewish Friends to Gentiles, who may take a cackling delight in his "wit."

## **ANSWERS**

The allegation that the "So cialist Government" naturalized East European Jews on a large scale is entirely untrue.

As regards the naturalization of East European Jews in Ger-many, the following official reply given by the Prussian Minister of the Interior in 1930 to a question in the Prussian Diet may be quoted:

"In accordance with the resolution of the Prussian Diet of April 8th, 1927, aliens from Eastern Europe not of German antecedents are as a naturalized only after having lived in Germany for at least ten years. No such residential qualification is required in the case of aliens who are of German antecedents. Since 1919 107,559 aliens have become naturalized in Prussia of whom 96,864 were of German ante cedents, and only 7,654 were aliens from the East not of German antecedents.

Even if 90 per cent of these 7,654 naturalized people were Jews, only 6,900 East European

Jews would have been naturalized in Prussia during eleven vears, or just over 600 a year,

The official Conti Press Bureau stated (after Hitler's accession to power) the number of East European Jews who were naturalized in the German Reich since the War at 12,500, making less than 1,000 a year, compared with 65,000,000 in-habitants. These 12,500 Jews had lived for ten or more years

in Germany, their children be-ing educated in German schools. Thus, (1) No millions of East European Jews passed through Germany since the war, but only 150-160,000 (50% of all migrants); (2) No hundreds of thousands of East European Jews immdated Germany the highest number ever living in Germany did not exceed 99,000. At the time of Hitler seizing the power the number had already decreased to about 76,000; (3) The number of East European Jews naturalized in Germany since the War does not exceed 12,500.

No system atic inquiry is possible, for a vic tim of persecution who gives evidence is not only punishable un-der German law (the evidence being termed "gruelpro usually translated as "gruelpropaganda," lated as "atrocity mongering") but may be arrested without a warrant and may, without trial, be sent to a "Brownhouse" for a beating, or to a con-centration camp (a far greater hardship than ordinary imprison ment)

Varies in Distinction The persecution also varies in

There are Jaws-who'may be quite pen-minded and intelligent-who, although residing in Germany, honestly maintain that "things are The reason is that in their own district there may be little active persecution, and, as hardly anything appears in the German press, the truth may not have come to their knowledge. In a town like Treves, for example, the cruder excesses have been avoided, although anti-Semitic legislation is operating there as In Baden the perseelsewhere. In Baden the perse-cution of the Jews as well as of the political opponents of the re-gime has been relatively mild. In Berlin it has been frightful carly days of the persecution hun-dreds of Jews (and not only German Jews) were physically mal-treated. A full account of what treated. A full account of what happened in Berlin alone would several volumes, and it would make such reading as to cause lost wonder as to how such dreadful things are possible in the modern world. But Berlin is not the worst-it probably repres a fair average of what has happened to the Jews in Germany. In Hessen the anti-Semitic excesses went on month after month, so that hundreds of Jewish families were compelled to seek refuge in the forests or to leave for other parts. The emigration of the Jews abroad is only part of the total emigration, many having fled from regions of severe persecution to regions of persecution less severe (in Berlin, for example, there are many fugitives from Hessen, Silesia and elsewhere). The cities of Worms, Brunswick and Cassel also have an appalling record. In Breslau, the chief Silesian city, and in some of the outlying townships and in some parts of Saxony the persecution has been feroclous. the persecution has been reroctions. In the concentration camps which probably hold about 50,000 prisoners—Jews are often selected for special maltreatment. Thus at Dachau the more repulsive camp duties are assigned to Jews. One of them was Dr. Spiegel, who became known to the world at large (though not by name) through a photograph that was published in many English and American newspapers and periodicals showing how he was paraded through the streets of Munich, without shoes, his trou-sers cut short at the knees, and a placard hanging around his neck with the words "I shall never more complain to the police about the the In concentration camp at Brandenburg Jewish pri-soners get no proper ration, but are made to cat the leavings from the meals of the other pr from one bowl and without knives or forks. In almost all the con-centration camps Jews are -compelled to put up with special in-sults and indignities.

There can be little doubt that the peculiarly malignant character of the persecution of the Jews in irg, a persecution which is continually being revived, is connected with the incessant agitation of the Stuermer, a weekly that specializes in anti-Semitism. It is dited by the Nazi leader Julius Streicher, who was in charge of the anti-Semitic boycott on April 1. The Stuermer not only incites to ever-renewed persecution but It continually publishes the names of individual Jews, with their ad-dresses, as suitable for victimiza-One of its special features is the pillory, in which it publishes the names of Gentile girls who have associated with Jews (whose rames are often published as well), demanding that they shall be boy-cotted by all, thus exposing them to public execration and possibly to violence and economic ruin. The Stuermer shows no sign to date of abandoning its campaign.

Hitler at Top The persecution has been organ-ized from top to bottom. Its chief riginator and inspirer is, of course, the German Chancellor, Adolf Hitler, and after him the other Nazi leaders, and then the professional and academic classes. The students, to some extent the smaller shopkeepers, and, of course, the disciplined Brown course, the Shirts, follow.

Among the worst persecutors are doctors, dentists and other professional men who want the jobs of their Jewish colleagues, and conceal their desires under the enthusiasm for the Nazi cause that makes such a favorable impres sion of youthful fervor and idealism on visitors to Germany. Jew ish professional men are continu-ally being denounced as "Marx-ists" (even when they have had nothing to do with politics) to the Brown Shirts or to the secret state police (now the chief terrorist or ganization in Germany) by envi-ous Gentile colleagues. The German 'professional journals — the Deutscher Apotheker and the Berlin Aerzte Korrespondenz, for example—continue to incite to re-newed persecution. Altogether, the persecution is the work of educated Germany. Uneducated Germany. persons have, no doubt, been in-struments of the persecutors, but uneducated Germany as a whole has had no part in it.

## ToRecommend Postponement

#### Jewish Congress Without Power to Alter Date for Election

The American Jewish Congres is without power to change the date of elections for the World Jewish Congress or to postpone its convocation, according to a state-ment issued yesterday by Dr. Stephen S. Wise, honorary presi-dent, and Bernard S. Deutsch, president of the organization. The organization, however, will recom-mend postponement of the world congress to the world congress executive committee.

The statement, embodying the views of the American Jewish Congress administrative commistence of the American Service of the American Jewish of the Commister of the Commister of the Commister of the Committee of the Zionist Organization of America, points out that preparations for the Commister of the Commission of Commission of the Commiss postponement of elections.

#### It Takes Cognizance

"The administrative committee of the American Jewish Congress takes cognizance of the resolutions adopted by the national executive committee of the Zionist organization, reaffirming the necessity of zation, rearrisming the necessity of convening a World Jewish Con-gress which shall deal with the most critical problems of the Jew-ish people throughout the world, but calling for the postponement of elections to the World Jewish Congress in order that preparations thereto may be more thor-oughly made," according to the statement.

"The American Jewish Congress has no authority to determine or to alter the date for the elections and connot take responsibility for postponing them. In respect to matters affecting the World Jew-ish Congres, the American Jewish Congress is simply representative of the World Jewish Conference which has issued the call for the congress and is organizing the elections throughout the world.

#### It Will Recommend

"The American Jewish Congress, however, will recommend to the executive committee of the World Jewish Conference to accede to the request of the national executive mittee of the Zionist Organization of America and to postpone the date for the convening of the World Jewish Congress to some other time.

"Decision taken as to the date of the elections by the World Jewish Congress executive does not modify the obligation of the American Jewish Congress to continue the work of preparing for the World Jewish Congress. The American Jewish Congress cannot postpone for a single moment dis-charging the responsibility imposed upon it by the World Jewish Con-ference. The American Jewish Congress goes on with this work in the faith of the full support of all the Jews in America.

#### Invitation to Cooperate

"In connection with this work, a American Jewish Congress continues to look to the active support of all Zionists and non-Zion-ists of America who believe in the necessity for the World Jewish

"The American Jewish Congress "The American Jewish Congress continues to invite each and every Jewish group and individual, regardless of sect or party, to cooperate in the democratic and efficient organization of Jewry for the defense of their rights as Jews and as citizens and for their greater service to civilization and democracy.

"The World Jewish Congress Men's Benevolent Association on Committee is directed to go on with its work of preparation."

At this time, when Palestine is economically prosperous, it comes as a shock that the teachers and students of a recognized and valuable institution of Jewish learning should have to ap-pea' to world Jewry on the ground that they are on the point of starvation. It would seem that a matter of this sort should be handled promptly and discreetly by the leading repr:sentatives of the Jewish community of Jeru-salem in order to prevent this disagreeable publicity. Other ways should and could be found to help this worthy institution.

### Illness Halts Plan to Adopt Reich Children

#### Milwaukee Awaits Recovery of Immigration Chief at Capitol

(Special to the J.D.B.)
MILWAUKEE, Feb. 14.—Illness
of the commissioner of immigration at Washington is holding up p'ans of the Milwaukee Jewish Orphan Home and private families here to adopt fifty children of German-Jewish victims of the Nazi terror.

At a meeting of the home's board of directors today, a telegram was received from United States Senator Robert M. LaFollette, Jr., ex-plaining that the local adoption petition was in the hands of the immigration bureau, but that ill-ness of the bureau's head delayed action. Official government sanc-tion must be obtained to bring the fifty children into the country.

Ryan Duffy, Wis-consin's second senator at Wash-ington, and Congressmen Raymond Cannon and Thomas O'Malley of this district, promising coopera-tion in the orphan home's effort, A communication has also been sent to Secretary of Labor Perkins, asking her assistance in the proposed adoption.
