

Flag-Day Founder Is Happy—Modest and Youthful

Ben Altheimer is eighty-four today. Philanthropist and, in his own words, "plain American citizen," Mr. Altheimer, whose suggestion of a national observance of Flag Day caused President Wilson to issue the first proclamation of this holiday in 1915, has turned down invitations to commemorate his birthday. He is to spend the day in his usual way, reading, and walking, if the weather permits, and talking with friends at the Harmony Club on East Sixtieth street, where he has been a member for many years.

Born in Germany March 6, 1850, Mr. Altheimer came to the United States and made his home in St. Louis. There he entered banking, and a comparative short time became a leader in that field. He came to New York sixteen years ago and engaged in philanthropy about 1910. His main work, president of Temple Emanuel, president of Temple Beth-El, and treasurer of the National Jewish Hospital at Denver. In 1927 he received the Cross of Honor from the United States Flag Association in recognition of his work in connection with Flag Day.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, March 5.—The sudden arrest of Dr. Benno Walter, vice-president of the German "Brasl Eritz" continues to provoke intense interest among the German Jews. Dr. Walter is being held in a secret police jail. No one is permitted to communicate with him.

Expect Crowded Courtroom At Hitler 'Trial' Tomorrow

With interest paralleling that aroused by the Reichstag fire proceedings, a jammed "courtroom" is expected tomorrow evening when Hitler and his regime will go on trial in "The Case of Civilization Against Hitlerism," an elaborate presentation of the record of Nazi laws and acts, to be staged under the auspices of the American Jewish Congress in cooperation with the American Federation of Labor and other groups.

Begin New Drive On Austria Jews

Christian Socialists Start Campaign to Revoke Citizenship Rights of Naturalized Jews—Want Jewish Doctors Fired—Socialists Buried

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) VIENNA, March 5.—Under the pretext that Jews were favored by the previous Social Democratic administration, the Christian Socialist party and its press today began a new campaign against Austrian Jewry. The Christian Socialist newspapers today demanded the revocation of the citizenship rights of tens of thousands of Jews who came to Vienna in the years after the World War from Galicia, Bukovina, Bohemia and Hungary and obtained citizenship papers as far back as ten years ago. The provinces formerly belated to Austria.

Jews' Change Blocked by Nazi Heads

Prevent Transfer to Agriculture and Artisanry

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, March 5.—Blocking all attempts on the part of German Jews to readjust themselves by training for agriculture and artisanry seems to have become a definite policy of the Nazi government. This policy is being carried out by local Nazi authorities all over Germany, judging from numerous reports reaching the Jewish Telegraphic Agency from various sections of the country.

In Rhineland, seventy farmers were called together by local Nazi authorities and told to dismiss immediately all Jewish youths being trained on their farms. A few hundred, Max Meisinger in Hegowen in the province of Mecklenburg, was taken into "protective arrest" by the secret police because he had employed Jewish youths.

They also demanded that Jewish doctors, employed since the end of the World War at Austrian hospitals and the sick fund panels be dismissed and replaced with Christian doctors.

The Morgen Blatt, organ of the Christian Socialists, declared that the population will "only greet such measures." The Salzburger Volksblatt, another paper organ, said that "our commercial, industrial and artisan interests demand the annulment of the citizenship rights of naturalized Jews." The Reich Post, commonly regarded as a semi-official government organ, emphasized that despite the possible dissolution of the Christian Socialist party, the leaders of the party now in the government will remain influential.

Jewish Restriction Sought

The Christian Socialist party and its leaders have been consistent advocates of restrictive measures against the Jews of Austria. Although scorning the methods of the German Nazis as barbarous, they have insisted that numerous clauses against Jews and restrictions against Jews in the professional and public life of Austria could be introduced "quite and in an orderly fashion without the suffering and cruelty of the Nazi regime."

Chief of the chief advocates of these restrictive measures is Dr. Emerich Czernak, president of the Christian Socialist party.

The new Austrian constitution based upon the Fuhrer's "Quadrage Gessino Army" which will make Austria an "authoritative corporate state" will be promulgated within a week. Austrian authorities announced today. It is known that the new constitution vastly increases the powers of the president. It is thought to indicate that preparations are being made for the restoration of the Hapsburg monarchy in Austria. Chancellor Dollfus and other leaders of the Fuhrer's regime denied over and again that they have any intention of restoring the monarchy at this time.

Jewish Socialists Buried in Vienna

Editorial Notes By HERMAN BERNSTEIN

The Aryan Myth

THE meeting of The Judeans at which Professor Franz Boas, of Columbia University, Professor Ellsworth of Yale, and Dr. Maurice Fishberg, discussed the Semites and the "Aryans," was of unusual interest and importance. The learned anthropologists exposed the absurdity of the Nazi race theories of the superiority of the "Aryans."

Professor Boas, the dean of American anthropology, who was the guest of honor, said that while it was generally accepted by scientists that the "Aryan" race theory was a pure fiction, it was necessary to keep on exposing it, in order to combat the vicious agitation of the "Silver Shirts" and other organizations of this type in this country. He pointed out that it would be a mistake to ignore this agitation, however important it may seem now.

Professor Huntington, of Yale, suggested that it would be wise for the United States to admit a limited number of immigrants from Germany not merely because they are oppressed or persecuted but in order to "add to the intellectual resources of American culture." He remarked that persecution is often directed against people whose quality is far above the average, and that "for such people the United States should be a refuge." He said such a form of selective immigration to the United States would be desirable, but added that the idea is still Utopian, for the reason that people are not yet sufficiently civilized to adopt these standards of immigration requirements.

Dr. Maurice Fishberg, author of "The Jews—A Study of Race and Environment," and authority on tuberculosis, delivered a brilliant and authoritative address analyzing the fallacies of the Nazi race theories. He pointed out that while the Germans have appointed themselves as the only people of the "Aryan," or true Nordic, race, the German authorities have never permitted an investigation of the racial composition of the German population. He said that it was distinctly prohibited to take anthropological measurements in the German army, the best group of men in whom reliable measurements as to the race composition of a population could be made under present conditions. And he gave the reasons why such an investigation was verboten. The whole "Aryan race theory would be disproved by the results of such an investigation.

Reich Exports To Palestine Show Increase

Transfer Agreement Was Large Aid, Figures Show

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
 BERLIN, March 5.—A huge increase in German exports to Palestine was reported yesterday in a long article in the Frankfurter Zeitung written by its Haifa correspondent.

The article stated that exports to Palestine had increased from \$780,000 in 1932 to \$1,300,000 in 1935, largely through the transfer agreement. This agreement provided that each German Jew going to Palestine would be allowed to take with him up to 50,000 marks worth of German goods. The agreement originally covered 3,000,000 marks worth of such exports was recently renewed for 3,500,000 marks worth.

The import of metal goods, the article stated, has practically doubled, with tremendous increases registered for pharmaceutical goods, chemical imports, and a twenty per cent increase in textile imports to Palestine, despite competition offered by Japanese goods.

Exports of Palestine oranges to Germany have increased only slightly, the Frankfurter Zeitung correspondent declared, rising from 5,500,000 marks in 1932 to 5,250,000 in 1933.

Proposals proposed by the Palestine Labor Party were accepted en bloc. They comprise a list of laboring Jews and Hashomer Hatzotz members.



Jewish Community In Virgin Islands Celebrates Revival

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
 ST. THOMAS, Virgin Islands, Feb. 20.—For the first time in more than fifty years a group of Jewish children was confirmed here in the Jewish Synagogue. The impressive ceremony was one of the recent developments marking the revival of Jewish community life in St. Thomas.

One hundred years ago this little island was an important shipping center and a Jewish-Sephardic-congregation flourished, with a handsome synagogue building and three schools. But the change of trade routes brought changes in the island, including a decrease in the Jewish population. A minister could no longer be maintained. Now a layman, Moses D. Sasso, is conducting services and instructing children.

The revival of activity is due to a large extent to the visit some six years ago of the Rev. Dr. Pereira Mendes who, during a stay of a few months, reorganized the school, preached and instituted "consecration" in place of confirmation.

This novel institution of consecration calls for adults to undergo a course of instruction, following which, with suitable ceremonies in the synagogue, they solemnly vow:

1. That the synagogue shall be kept open every Sabbath and services held.
2. That the children shall receive religious instruction.
3. That the honor of the Jewish name shall be upheld on the island.

Mendes Minister Emeritus

Dr. Mendes himself has consecrated eight persons, the oldest 83 years of age. For each festival or holiday he sends a sermonette which is read to the congregation. He has been made minister emeritus.

The children who were confirmed by Sasso according to the Sephardic ritual, are Clarence Maurice and Theodor Douglas, Gladys and Madeline Watson, Consuelo and Rachel Robles and Melvin Menges. The two sacred scrolls were kissed by the confirmands as a token of their allegiance.

Pro-Hitlerite Jews are Suffering From German Vets Organize Units

Milwaukee Chapter Growing Rapidly, Is Report

(Special to the J.D.B.)
MILWAUKEE, March 5.—Organizations of German World War veterans, sympathetic with Hitlerism, are growing rapidly in Milwaukee.

A Stahlhelm (Steel Helmets) chapter has just been organized, made up of men who fought not only on the German front but also, who battled the Spartacist riots, the 1919 revolution, the Rhineland separatists and the communists, during the period preceding Hitler's capture of power. This group is working closely with the Deutsche Ehren Legion (German Legion of Honor), a kind of a catch-all group taking in any ex-Germans soldier with Fascist leanings and any American, too, who may in some way have befriended Germany. Heinz Von Nobel of Milwaukee, described as a German officer during the War, heads both organizations. The two groups are to hold a joint "kammerschaft" (social) evening on March 10 in the Cafe Chanticleer. Thus far all the signs marked by display of Nazi flags and singing of Nazi songs, have been held in secret.

Milwaukee is now also the home of a Verein Der Deutschen Weltkriegs Veteranen (Order of German World War Veterans), which claims to be neutral on the question of Fascism and to have members of all shades of opinion.

Milwaukee Nazis Attack American Jews at Meeting

MILWAUKEE, March 5.—Attacks upon Jews became virulent as pro-Nazi Germans of this city, organized as the Friends of the New Germany, held their second public meeting. George Frohose, secretary of the local unit, denounced the Jews of this country, charging that they are "trying to buy up this country."

Although the meeting had been advertised in both the English and German press, it drew less than 700 people, including over 100 Jews, socialists and other anti-Nazis.

The first issue of a paper published by local Nazis, called Wisconsin Beobachter on its German section and Wisconsin Observer on its English page, was distributed at the meeting.

Paterason Collects \$11,000 For German Jewish Relief

THE WAR OF THE RACES

By HENRI BERENGER

Henri Berenger, author of the following articles, has for some time been French Ambassador to the United States, having been appointed to that post on December 8, 1925. He has represented his country in many lands and has often been a delegate to the League of Nations. Since January, 1932, he has been a member of the French Senate, representing the island of Guadeloupe.

Well-known as an author Mr. Berenger received the title of Laureate of the French Academy in 1894 and 1915. He is an officer of the Legion of Honor, and serves on a number of Senatorial commissions. He is at the present time president of the Senatorial Committee on Foreign Affairs.

Senator, ambassador, author, M. Berenger is considered one of the major French statesmen of today.

II.

AFTER eighteen months, the national socialist party, having developed from the first seven to the present twenty-five, has grouped themselves around Adolf Hitler to the ten millions after the putsch at Munich, announced the twenty-five titles upon which its program would be based.

We discover in these twenty-five articles, published throughout Germany at just this time, all the decrees, all the ordinances, and all the laws which in 1933, thirteen years later, have been promulgated by Hitler.

I should like to remind you, as you know, that the majority of the principal articles in this racist program of 1920. You will find there the beginnings of what has since been done. We must, at least admit, that the national socialists are consistent in their ideas.

Articles 4, 5 and 6 treat the German Jewish question and their solution of it in the following way:

"Article 4.—None but members of the nation may be citizens of the State. None but those of German blood, whatever their creed, may be members of the nation. No Jew, therefore, may be a member of the nation.

"Article 5.—Anyone who is not a citizen of the State may live in Germany only as a guest and must be regarded as being subject to foreign laws.

"Article 6.—The right of voting on the State's government, and legislation is to be enjoyed by the citizen of the State alone. We demand, therefore, that all official appointments, of whatever kind, whether in the Reich, in the country, or in the smaller localities, shall be granted to citizens of the State alone."

And Article 23, in conclusion, proposed penalties to exclude Jews from the right to own news-

papers and magazines or to write therein.

Outside the Law

Thus, from this time on, the Jews were placed outside the law and excluded from the German community. This was only a program, but we shall see how it was realized thirteen years later.

On the seventh of April, 1933, that is, at the time Hitler came into power, what was the first law he promulgated? The law concerning the reestablishment of officials and professors. This time, it was a law; it was no longer an article in a platform.

"Officials of non-Aryan origin are to be displaced. As for the honorary officials, they shall be forbidden to act in any official capacity."

And from then on, there came a rain of decrees and ordinances to explain, develop and give strength to the law, a rain of decrees and ordinances dismissing the officials, the doctors, the lawyers, the judges, the university professors, the private law firms. All the members of the liberal professions were excluded from what they had been doing all their life and were reduced to seeking new occupations. It was the textual realization of the racist program of 1920.

The "Aryan" Clause

And, as though this were not enough, along comes a new decree which applies to all "non-Aryans" and which excludes from the government of the State anyone who cannot prove that he and his "Aryan" blood running in his veins are of the same blood as that of his maternal and paternal grandparents were of "Aryan" stock.


National Socialism was, then, realized in less than fifteen years the whole anti-Semitic program that represented the German tradition, and now made it a law of the State. And we learn today that this extends not only to the liberal professions, to the public administration, but even to the schools, and that the little citizen who cannot prove that they are "Aryans" are the recipients of all sorts of obstacles in the secondary and primary schools. They are beaten, struck, spit upon, put on special benches, forbidden the right of playing with the others—in a word, reduced in a sort of slavery. And the Third Reich decrees that outside of the 80,000 Jews who have been able to leave this Germany, the others will not receive passports, that they and their descendants will be forced to submit to the persecution which the present regime contemplates.

"Cold and Hot Pogroms"

"Cold and Hot Pogroms"—Ed. J. Perry myself to describe as the "cold" pogrom, the legal pogrom. But there was something worse than this, something entirely different. There were the "hot" pogroms, with violence, and massacre, and theft, and downright looting. And do not wish to tire you with instances of this, for most of you have followed this problem, and have certainly read the Brown Book (the Brown Book is the Russian version—Ed.) which contains a true account of the thousands of murders, massacres and annoyances. I wish simply to remind you of the words, word not spoken, mind you—in the Nazi book of Dr. Goebbels, minister of Hitler's propaganda for German communities: "The Jews must be killed off like bugs."

But that is not all. They invented the refinement of the slow death in the country where you are to leave. Even in the country at least had the right to leave, I don't say that that would justify or arouse them, but... But not to pass upon the question, they must stay. They created the concentration camps. It was not very original. It was a re-invention of what the Germans had done to the

Believe Vienna Jewish Leaders Sailed for American J. D. C. Help

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, March 5.—The president of the Vienna Jewish community, Dr. Desider Friedmann and Vice-President Loewenherz, are understood to have gone abroad in order to negotiate with leaders of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee relative to extending the same amount of credit as heretofore to small traders and industrialists.

The assistance of the Joint Distribution Committee in the welfare work of the community is also being sought. It is understood that of late the Joint Distribution Committee has extended much less credit than formerly, and that the community leaders hope the negotiations will result in the necessary support.

And now the Hitlerites inflict upon fellow-citizens their system of concentration camps. Thus, at this moment, 75,000 people are imprisoned in such camps.

And still that is not enough. There is the boycott. The Jews are usually merchants, manufacturers or bankers—this is not a reproach, since the whole trend of the Middle Ages and our modern civilization forced them into these occupations. Therefore, it is necessary for the Germans to placard their businesses. Every "non-Aryan" house—that is, every Jewish house—is put on the black list. It is boycotted, as people say, and their bulky young men in brown shirts stand in front of the store, and whoever has the effrontery to enter one of these stores is immediately denounced. Naturally, these stores are abandoned, so that the Jews are reduced to misery. What can they do? They cannot be university professors. They cannot be judges. They can do nothing. It is a sort of slow auto-cannibalism, a slow death. That is the reason for the great number of suicides. Thus, in spite of the gagging of the German press in every way, it is still possible to learn what sort of life is forced upon these 500,000 Jews. Some 80,000 have left and about 15,000 have died, there are still 500,000 Jews living in the conditions I have just described.

Why is all this being done? Because the Jews are not "Aryans." Even though they were born in Germany, though their parents, their grand-parents were born there, though they lived there, loved there, served as heroes and good soldiers in an important war, they are not "Aryans." Even though they may love the German in which they have lived, they are not "Aryans."

Lithuanian Jews Seek to Return From Bureya

Ask Moscow Embassy for Aid in Getting Back Home; Citizenship Lost

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) — KAUJAS (Riga), Lithuania, March 5.—Lithuanian Jewish emigrants to Bureya, the region in Siberia set aside by Soviet Russia for establishment of an autonomous Jewish republic, have appeared at the Lithuanian embassy at Moscow to seek aid in returning to their former homes here. It was learned today. The disappointed emigrants explained that the situation in Bureya was hopeless and that settlers there had to encounter hunger and epidemics.

The return of these immigrants to Lithuania will be difficult, it is learned, because they had to surrender their Lithuanian citizenship, according to the regulations, when they departed for Bureya.

Latvian Anti-Semites Demand Jewish Disabilities

RIGA, March 5.—A law to prevent all Jews who entered this country since 1919 from engaging in trade or industry or working as artists was demanded in a memorandum submitted to the cabinet here by Latvian anti-Semites.

THEY SHALL NOT DIE

The Reader's Forum

Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin:

Three young Jews in Palestine, Shmuel Ben-Israel and Abner, imprisoned since last summer, are charged by the criminal police with the murder of Dr. Arlosoroff. The proceedings are taking place under circumstances which, under normal conditions, would have resulted in the withdrawal of the charge. Such a charge, assuming Jews of having murdered a respected Jewish patriot, is practically unprecedented in history; yet certain methods characteristic of the investigation in this case may result in an irreparable tragedy—the condemnation of innocent people—unless the energetic legal defense enjoyed by the accused up to now be ensured to continue regularly to the end.

To leave without defense the accused—in whose innocence so many Jews are, by now, firmly convinced—would be incompatible with our Jewish conscience. Jewry as a whole, without distinction of numerous data which seem to speak strongly in favor of the accused, has now been added the custody of a young Arab, held in evidence under the charge of having murdered an Arab. This witness has disclosed the name of the person who, he alleges, had in his presence, (possibly with his participation) committed the mur-

der of Arlosoroff; but the criminal trial authorities relate with countenancing a version according to which Stavsky and Rosenblatt have "bought" that Arab's confession—despite all the obvious improbability of such a hypothesis. This new fact threatens to prolong the proceedings. The friends of the accused who, until now have, been active in the defense, are now being forced to reconsider the necessity for the organization of the defense, can no longer provide for the purpose. According to the approximate estimate, the amount necessary for the defense is about £1,900 (\$7,500).

One of the signatories of the present appeal stands completely outside of any partisan discussion which takes place in Zionist circles; he is not even a member of the Zionist Organization. It is certain that hundreds of thousands of Jews—be they members of any political party or not—will realize the importance of suitably organizing the investigation in accordance with the law. The very thought that three young lives, when at any rate there are strong presumptions in favor of their innocence, could be exposed to supreme peril, for the only reason that the charges of the opposite side might not meet with the same energetic and rightful repulse of a duly organized force—should fill every Jew with horror.

We appeal to all those to whom the honor of the Jewish people, and the right of any person accused to be properly defended, is equally sacred. We ask them to contribute the necessary sum, according to their means, towards securing the necessary sum, and we firmly hope that our appeal will not remain unanswered.
