Couple Killed White House Receives By Galician Terrorists

State of Terror Due to Ukrainians Exists in Polish Province

WARSAW, March 14.—Serious
acts of anti-Semitic terror are reported from the Polish province of Galicia, inhabited mainly by Ukrainians.

In the East Galician village of Potaczysko, the Jewish shochet Salman Feingold and his wife Malka were murdered. Nothing Malka were murdered. Nothing was removed from the house. In the village of Czypowitze, Lipa Sternberg found at his door a letter in Ukrainian warning him to leave the village immediately or he would be billed. he would be killed.

In many other villages, according to the Lemberg Jewish paper, Neyer Morgen, Jews are afraid of being killed during the nights. The paper emphasized the alarming in-crease in terroristic acts against Jews and declares that anti-Jewish acts are developing in Galician villages with an unheard of rapid-

The Ukrainians, who are opposed to their Polish rulers and desire independence, have made Jews their scapegoat for their failure to achieve freedom.

Quarter Million Signatures Urge U.S. to Plead for Jews

Cohen Heads Delegation Presenting Fourteen Volume Plea to President Asking Him to Intercede for Reich Victims

WASHINGTON, March 14.—A petition bearing a quarter of a million names, urging President Rogewelt to intervene with Germany "in accordance with the traditions of our country," in behalf of the persecuted Jews there was presented to the White House today. Our time, was presented to Merch 19. The petition and the long list of names, bound in fourteen volume, was presented to Marrior Senting Affred M. The petition requests the President to express to Germany the **FurtherThreats** distress which persecution of the Jews has caused to Americans and to the civilized world in general.

Stressing the gravity of the sit-uation of the Jews in Germany where, he said, there has been no abatement in the persecutions and restrictions against them, Mr. Levy declared that "the Jews of United States had a unique opportunity to bring immediate ractical and concrete relief to German Jewry through settlement in Palestine." "While the German Jewish ref-

ugees can obtain little more than a precarious refuge on the conti-nent where economic uncertainty militates against their absorption," he continued, "those German Jews who have been settled in Palestine have already become fully inte-grated in the economic structure

grated in the economic structure of a country that has given them a permanent home.

"More than ten thousand Jews have already been absorbed in Palestine and many additional thousands can be settled there without injury to its economic equilibrium, if sufficient funds available. It is our first duty as Jews to exert all our energies and all our resources in behalf of the German Jews, for they are doomed to a living death of ostracism, degradation and disfranchisement, unless we provide the means for establishing them in Palestine."

Kosher Concern Head Charged With Violation of Code

Health Department Officers Say Kosher Situation Here 'Messy'

Abraham Kaufmann, president of the Neboh Kosher Provision Company, of 488 Broadway, Brook-lyn, will be arraigned today in the Fifth District Magistrate's Court Brooklyn, charged with a viola-tion of Section 435a of the penal code, it was learned yesterday.

The Neboh concern, according to Arthur Simon, confidential investigator for the Health Department, has two factories at the Brooklyn address, one for kosher products and one for non-kosher products. The charge on which Kaufmann is to be arraigned concerns eight bar-rels of meat found in the kosher

Investigator Simon declared that he and other inspectors of the Health Department had been in-vestigating the Neboh Company's alleged evasion of the kosher laws for several weeks.

Officials of the Health Department hinted of sensational disclosures in connection with violations of the kosher laws throughout the city. One official of the depart-ment characterized the kosher sit-uation here as "messy" and "graft ridden."

Speakers Will Review Rabbi Wise's Career

Talk on Appreciation of His Work to Mark Luncheon

Speakers at the celebrations in honor of the sixtieth birthday of Rabbi Stephen S. Wise this week will review Dr. Wise's career in the rabbinate

At a luncheon Sunday at the Hotel Biltmore, representatives of the Free Synagogue and the Jew-ish Institute of Religion will express their appreciation of his labors on behalf of these and other Jewish institutions. They will recewish institutions. They will re-call his fight for freedom of the pulpit and militancy in Jewish life.

In 1907, Dr. Wise founded the Free Synagogue because his pas-sion for pulpit freedom had prompted him to reject any other congregation. Previously, he had been connected with the Madison Avenue Synagogue in New York and the Beth Israel Congregation, Portland, Oregon. In 1922. Dr. Wise founded the Jewish Institute of Religion, a rabbinical school founded on the principal of unity in Jewry. Many of the graduates from this institution will participate in the anniversary celebration of its founder.

Other aspects of Dr. Wise's life will be reviewed at the banquet to be held on Monday evening at to be held on Monday evening at the Hotel Astor. Albert Einstein, Bainbridge Colby, Dr. John Haynes Holmes, Bernard S. Deutsch and Mayor LaGuardia will be among those who will speak of the ac-tivities of Rabbi Wise in civic life. Dr. Wise has always interested himself in the problems of social justice, woman suffrage, civic cleanliness, child labor, labor conditions, world peace, interdenominational understanding, Jewish rights, and the establishment of the Jewish homeland.

Nazis Would Ignore American Protests. Asserts A. J. Messing

"Our President has failed to make a protest to the German government because he realizes that men of barbaric instincts and ruthless ambition who are in control there would ignore or ridicule such a move from the United States Government," it was as-serted by Arthur J. Messing at last night's meeting of the Men's Association of Temple Rodeph Sholom, 7 West Eighty-third street.

"As long as the rights of the merican citizens are not in-olved," Messing continued, "we American citizens are not involved," Messing continued, "we have no official or legal right to interfere in the internal affairs of Germany. I believe that we should bend every effort to get the Jews out of Germany."

Good Will Court Works Quietly To Settle Disputes Shop.

By L. ZARCHAROFF

Restoration of errant husbands, settlement of debts, mediation in family or neighbors' quarrels, landlord-tenant troubles — in a iandord-tenant troubles—in a word, the entire gamut of human tragedy as well as comedy—is grist for the mill that is the Good Will Court. Cases that would confound King Solomon are not infrequent on the calendar of this unique institution unique institution.

Consider the complaint of a firm which sells on instalment and seeks to collect from a man and wife. The defendants' rejoinder runs somewhat as follows: They had implicit faith in their President Hoover who urged a radio in every home, a car in every garage, who said that no home should be without a baby and that the baby should have a dog to play with.

So Mr. and Mrs. Citizen bought, on the monthly payment plan, a car for their garage and a radio for their living room. They had no child of their own but adopted no cause of their own but adopted a youngster and purchased for him an imposing shepherd dog. Today they cannot meet the payments and the gigantic canine is consuming more food than the whole

It's situations like this one that make life interesting for the Good Will Court's judges, a group of three representative citizens, changed from week to week, and consisting of a Catholic, a Jew and a Protestant. All its services free, the court is the idea of Municipal Court Justice Nathan Sweedler who was struck with the thought of how much of taxpayers' money could be saved if a large number of cases could be settled amicably out of court. Not only money, but time and energy are conserved by this informal tribunal that changes hatred into love, antipathy and distrust into understanding sym-

Any person may, and a great many do, come with any grievance which, it is felt, may be satisfactorily settled without resort to litigation. Irrespective of race, na-tionality or creed, an effort is made to bring the contending parties together. The court meets every Monday night in the Brook-Eagle Building on Johnson No Court Formality

Everything there is informal. No one is sworn in. Technical rules of evidence are not observed. Any method agreeable to both parties is used to reach an agreement, the process is consummated in a few minutes of friendly discussion in contrast to long drawn out court trials that engender bitter feeling. Among the Jewish complainants

recently there came an old blind man, whose daughter died in child-birth. Her husband refused to put up a tombstone on her grave which greatly grieved the sight-less father. "Even one for \$25 would make me happy," he pleaded in Yiddish. The Good Will Court interceded and the son-in-law agreed to comply. agreed to comply.

Father and Children

Another old man, from Brighton Beach, whose business went to pieces in the depression, told the judges that his six grown-up children, all well-to-do refused support him. The children have been invited to the next session, and there is every prospect of sat-isfying the impoverlshed father.

"My son took \$1,600 from me, promised to pay back at the rate of \$25 a month. He made two \$20 payments and one of \$15. That was three months ago, and that was all. His business in Hudson, N. Y., is prospering," a mother testifie.1

One of the judges casually in-One of the judges casually in-quired when did the son borrow that amount. The answer was, "thirteen years ago." Neverthe-less, a course of action calculated to assist the aged mother was mapped out.

Some people who appear before the Good Will Court are referred to their rabbis, priests, ministers Lawvers and doctors familiar with the institution's record of offectively handling hundreds of cases. often volunteer their services gratis.

If ever there was "a poor man's court" it is this creation of Judge Sweedler's where those who appear are not likely to be made inarticulate by the disappointingly impersonal procedure and rigidity impersonal procedure and rigidity of a more conventional court. In more than twenty years of law practice, Judge Sweedler had am-ple opportunity to observe the disheartening court system with its iron-clad rules of evidence and other obstacles to pursuit of justice in a truly humanitarian manner

His conception of the situation calls for sympathy and under-standing. He is always willing to take a chance on human nature, and time and again his theories have been vindicated in the ings of the Good Will Court.

Full Equality For Jews As Race Found In Russia

Existing Persecutions Based on Class Distinctions Rather Than Race—Religious Bans Apply to All Alike

If absolute equality with all other peoples is any consolation, Jews in the Soviet Union have it in all their troubles. The economic burdens and political pressures under which so many of them are half-crushed are not bigger nor heavier than those imposed on their non-Jewish neighbors.

Certainly there are specifically Jewish problems in the new Russia, problems growing out of the unique history and the unique racial make-up of the 3,000.000 Jews within the Soviet frontiers. other racial minorities, whether Georgians or Tartars, also have specific problems. The point is that the Soviet regime makes no distinction of race or creed in distributing blows or

Equality of Persecution

The Jewish and the Armenian and the Great Russian "boorzhoo-ie" are subject to similar per-secution, even unto the third generation. Indeed, there is a distinct tendency to treat the former Jewish merchants and small manufacturers slightly more liberally, on the theory that Tsarist restric-tions forced them into trade and business by barring them from less shameful pursuits.

Liberty of religious instruction is forbidden to the Jews, but no more strictly than to Christians or Mohammedans. The patriarchal rabbi and the Greek Orthodox "pope" down his street have bit-terness against the Godless in common and use the same desnerate methods for evading anti-religious laws.

Fight Nationalism

Nationalist movements or even tendencies of the Zionist order are treated as treason and counter-revolution. But one needs only observe the ruthless extermination of separatist Ukrainian thought or nationalist tendencies in Central Asia to realize that the Zionist has plenty of company in his misery.

Right down the line this paral-lelism holds true. The Soviet Jew, if he suffers at all, suffers as a full-fledged and equal Soviet citi-zen. The difficulties of the present epoch-shortage of food and other goods, suppression or every vestige of individual freedom, 'liquidation' of bourgeois ele-"liquidation" or bourgeois ele-ments and bourgeois points of view—sometimes rest more heav-ily on some Jews. Hundreds of thousands of them do not fit so easily into the standardized offlcial mold as their Gentile neigh-bors. But even the most bitterly anti-Soviet Jew inside Russia cancharge anti-Semitic discriminstions

No Racial Basis

It is a fact that Jews form perhas over fifty per cent of the vic-tims of the G.P.U. drive for hid-den "valuta," that is to say gold, foreign currency, diamonds and the like. The attempt of certain well-meaning people abroad, how-ever to nicture it as anti-Samitic

Complaints Universal

The Jewish colonists would com-plain bitterly — if they dared plain bitterly—if they dared—a gainst their collectivization, against the prices paid by the State for their products, against the impositions by the machine-tractor stations. They could say nothing, however, which would not be said just as bitterly by their non-Jewish peasant neighbors.
"Declassed" Jews by the tens of thousands—disfranchised because

beclassed. Jews by the tens of thousands — disfranchised because of their capitalistic past—live the lives of hunted creatures. They, and usually their children as well, and usually their children as weil, are barred from the best jobs, excluded from the schools, denied food, books and generally treated as outlaws. But that again is a status which they share with former aristocrats, Gentile merchants, landowners, priests. They are the status which are the status which is the status of class rather than rac latted.

On the other side of the picture. long suppressed Jewish strivings have at last been satisfied. Na-tional autonomy in both the cultural and administrative sense is enjoyed by the Jewish population where it makes up the predomin-ant racial element. Yiddish is recognized as an official language, used in State documents, in courts, everywhere.

Yiddishists Active

There are passionate propa-gandists of Jewish (or more accurately, Yiddish) culture who un curately, Yiddish) culture who under the Soviet system have unlimited scope of activity. Yiddish literature, theatre, education have equal rights with Russian. The contents of that culture must be distinctly Soviet, with ardent Communists in dictatorial places. But the accent is Jewish. The age-long sense of inferiority, the psychology of the "pale," are fast

isappearing.
The Jews, in brief, are coming more and more to share the life of the whole Soviet nation, which at the present juncture is a life of hardships and exacting sacri-fices. Like the rest of the population, they are being splintered into classes and categories: proletarians and peasants, politically elite groups and outlawed groups. Jews in posts of power who are as overbearingly bureaucratic as any Tsarist "chinovnik" and Jews who have failed to adjust themselves to the new order and are as meek-ly self-effacing as denizens of ancient ghettos.





New Labor Dep't Regulations **May Ease Alien Restrictions**

(Continued from Page One)
a public charge bond authorized
by Section 21 of the immigration
act of 1917. It is contemplated in the proposed regulations to allow the consular officer to refuse a visa to an alien if he has other reasons than the possibility of be-coming a public charge for considering the alien inadmissible.

Important Questions Involved Work in drafting the new regu-lations was started early in the year by Secretary Perkins after an opinion concerning important legal questions involved was given her by Attorney General Cum-mings. The new regulations are expected to be prepared within the next few weeks and are to be sub-mitted to the State Department. They will relate to certain provis-ions of the immigration acts of 1917 and 1924.

According to Attorney General Cummings, the Secretary of Labor is authorized to accept a public charge bond, provided for in the immigration act of 1917, from an alien in advance of his arrival here. He has also ruled that the Secretary of Labor is not required to consider applications for admis-sion on a public charge bond in the chronological order in which the applications are filed.

Under these rulings, it is expected that the new regulations, when issued, will give more consideration to applicants for admis-sion from countries where political and religious persecution is
