NAZIS BEGIN BOYCOTT DRIVE AGAINST JEWS IN GERMANY

Editorial Notes

"The Internal Affair"

THE petition signed by a quarter of a million Americans, Gentiles and Jews, addressed to the President of the United States and presented at the White House by Alfred M. Cohen, president of the B'nai B'rith, is an effective expression of public opinion reexpression of public opinion re-garding the outrages perpetrated upon the Jewish people in Hit-ler's Germany during the past year. Even though this perition is somewhat belated, it will help to crystallize public feeling to-ward the happenings in Germany which are depicted with restraint,

dignity and care.

"Speech and press, wherever free, unite in condemning this blot on the civilization of our time," declares the petition. blot on the civilization of our time," declares the petition. "Hope for its removal rests on a quickened public conscience manifesting itself so unmistak-ably that the German people, themselves grossly wronged, may come to realize the injustice done in their name not alone to Jews but, in their government's treat-ment of the Jews, to all man-

And the B'nai B'rith requests that the petitions be presented to President Roosevelt "so that with an accompanying note written in the spirit of fairness and with the vision for which our President is so worthily distinguished, they may be forwarded to the

German government."

When the petition, signed by distinguished American Christian clergymen protesting against the Beilis ritual murder case staged by the Tsarist govern-ment, was presented to Secre-tary of State William Jennings tary of State William Jennings Bryan, with a request to have it transmitted to the Tsar, Secre-tary Bryan suggested that the document be presented direct to the Russian Ambassador. That was done. The memorandum was delivered to the Russian Ambassador, who returned it to Bishop Grier, whose name braded the list of the eminent mers of that powerful protest. rne Russian Ambassador refused

Wise Dinner Funds to Help Fight Fascism

Proceeds of Dinner to Be Used to Counter Nazi Movement

The rising tide of Fascism in America will be met in Brooklyn by a counter-attack made possible by the funds to be raised at the dinner to be tendered to Rabbi Stephen S. Wise at the Hotel St. George on March 22, Judge Mitchell May announced yesterday.

The entire proceeds of the din-ner will be utilized in financing the counter-Nazi movement, and in the mobilization of a strong anti-Fascist movement in Brooklyn, Judge May declared.

"As the largest Jewish commun-ity of the world," he said, "Brooklyn must and will contribute its share to the work of combating the menace of Hitlerism not mercto the Jews but to the civilized standards of society and the democratic foundations on which our country is built."

The celebration of Rabbi Wise's The celebration of Rabb Wise's sixtleth birthday will entail a number of functions throughout the country and particularly in New York City. Besides the dinner in Brooklyn on March 22, there will be a banquet next Monday at the Hotel Astor and a lunch Sunday at the Hotel Biltmore.

On Sunday morning, an anniversary service for Dr. Wise will be held by the Free Synagogue in Carnegie Hall. The services will be conducted by Rabbi J. X. Cohen and Rabbi Morton M. Berman. Among the speakers who are scheduled to appear are Joare scheduled to appear are Joseph M. Levine, president of the congregation of the Free Synagogue; Rabbi William F. Fineshriber of Philadelphia; Dr. Frank Oliver Hall, Robert Szold, and Mrs. Rebekah Kohut. Dr. Wise will respond.

In a special musical service, an augmented choir will render Men-delsohn's "Come Let Us Sing."

The inclination to blame the for whatever evil them was second nature to wide ectors of the Rus sian people, and it still persists. I have heard the street cars too often in these years, I have been witness to too anti-Semitic outbursts by drunken or desperate Russians, to doubt that the evil growth is still there.

The most significant fact, howthe Soviet regime is being applied to the Herculean job of tearing that foul weed of Tsarism. It no reflection on the Kremlin that the job is far from done. It is merely another proof of the fearful hold prejudice can have on dark minds.

Driven Underground Where formerly hatred of Jews was open, insulting, often brutally violent, it is now reduced to a futile and usually hidden emotion All the machinery of education and propaganda in the hands of the ment-which means every thing from wallpapers to radio schoolroom to theatre—is to fight anti-Semitism. All the vast repressive apparatus of a thoroughgoing dictatorship is used to punish expressions of anti-Semitism in word or act.

Even aside from its interna-Conalist principles, the Soviet regime is obliged by the very na-ture of its history to struggle against anti-Semtism. It is fully are that it is the first weapon of White Guard invasions and conquests in the terrible years of civil warfare. Both in fact and in the minds of the Russian masses anti-Semitism and counter-revolution are two strands in one rope, inextricably intertwined.

Additional charges against the Shochtem Union, Local 440, are to be lodged today with Mayor La Guardia by the Vaad Shochtem Oifes, poultry slaughterers' section of the Food Workers Industrial Union, whose members claim the rival group is subjected to extord "browbeating" by a group of alleged racketeers.

About fifty slaughterers par-aded down Broadway from their Eighteenth street headquarter Eighteenth street headquarters Wednesday bearing placards and banners which demanded that the Mayor keep his campaign pledge to end racketeering in the city. Arriving at City Hall, they found action from his secretary. The Mayor is slated to saue a state ment on the matter this morning.

The Charges

1. A charge of two dollars for rental of the wooden crate is lev-ied against all farmers. The charge to far in excess of the real cost of the crates.

2. A charge of fifty cents on a bag of chicken feed is levied chicken feed is levied against farmers and markets.

3. Twenty dollars per carload of poultry is charged against

Three cents per pound on poultry is charged against markets and butchers, also collected by racketeers

5. The kosher laws, including a statute set up by a rabbinate council a few years ago regard-ing a limitation on the number of crates of poultry which a slaugh-terer may kill per day, are vio-

6. Strong-arm methods are employed in the Washington Market to force cash contributions from customers. Racketeers, according to the Vaad Shochtem Oifes, to the Vaad pocket the cash.

Charge Rabbi Threatened I. Levine, organizer of the Butchers, Poultry and Meat Cut-ters Union, said yesterday that the head of the Vaad Shochtem Oifes, Rabbi Isaac Rothenberg, had een offered by racketeers the al-

ternative of merging his union with the Local Union 440 or suffering physical violence. Threats were made by unknown "strong-arm men" who said they would kidnap him. A statement published yester-

And he believes that it will serve only to bind the Jew closer into the French nation, unless meddlers outside the country precipitate a now non-existent distinction be-tween the French "native type" (he could not call them "Aryans") and French Jews.
"Thus far," he explained, "due

to the admirable foresight of the French Jews, racial and religious barriers have been wiped out. French Jews have made an effort to contribute men to the army and to every national cause magnificent sums of money."

Will Support Zionism Himself a Zionist, he believes

that Zionist, he believes that Zionism will be given favor-able support under the French Fascist government, and he says that the synagogue will be carefully preserved as one of the national religions of the New France his account

French Fascism, his account made clear, would retain the essential requirements of Jewry, its religion, its history, and its cus-toms, but it would throw off old oos which have forever brought on persecution. Unlike German Fascism, where all but "Aryans" are cast from the fold of the national elect, and more Russian Communism where racial parity is perfect, what with

will not be Stalin's ordinances against dicris ination, French Fascism would i moulded.

The upshot of his discourse, as we understood it, was that French Jewry would no longer be regarded as a race but rather as a religion under Fascism.

"And." he looked back as he adjusted his raincoat and remove umbrella from the cabinet, "we'll have to do the same here in America. We'll have to find a decent Fascist leader with a rational viewpoint and support him.'

Personally, we prefer to continue to march with democracy.
. . . We have yet failed to find that autocratic regimes have ever been very favorable to Jews and even where this was the case, the favor was just as easily replaced by persecution and terror. One has only to think of the Jews and the medieval kings and princes.

Besides the very essence of Jew ish life and history has been the everlasting struggle of the Jew for democracy, so much so that the enemies of Jews chose to use the innate democracy of the Jew as an argument against him.

No, we do not believe the Jew

will take kindly even to a French Fascism. -P. Fascism.

The Beilis affair, by which the Tsarist government endeavored to discredit the Jews and justify itself in the eyes of the world, was regarded by autocratic Russia as an internal affair. But the civilized world did not treat it merely as an internal Russian affair. Enlightened public opinion everywhere was aroused. S The against the vigilous protest Tsarist Russia.

The Nazi reign of terror directed against Jews. Catholics. Protestants, liberals, radicals and pacifists cannot be viewed merely a German internal affair. The effects of the Hitler regime are widespread, extending far be-yond the borders of the Nazi your the borders of the Nazi Reich. The Nazi propaganda in foreign lands is conducted for the purpose of inciting race harred and undermining demo-cratic institutions. The German government of today is violating international good-will, resenting at the same time any criticism aimed at it in other lands.

In 1908 I met Leonid Andreyev, the great Russian writer, author of "The Seven Who Were Hanged," and discussed with him the "internal affairs" of Tsarist He lived in Russ Russia. this is what he said for publica-

"How it is the European and the American press has ceased to interest itself in our struggle emancipation? Ts it possible that the reaction in Russia appeals to them more than our people's yearnings for freedom, simply because reaction happens to be stronger at the present time? Russia today is a lunatic asvlum. The people who are be ing hanged are not the people who should be hanged. In Russia the honest people are in pri son while the criminals are a large. The Russian government is composed of a band of criminals, but I do not hold that the Russian government alone is guilty of the horrors committed in Russia. The European nations are just as much to blame, for they look on in silence while the t despicable crimes are committed. Perhaps I am not speaking as a diplomat. I know that one nation must not interfere with the internal affairs of another nation, according to national law. But why do they interfere with our movement for freedom? France helped the Russian government in its war against the people by loaning money to the Tsar. Germany also helped secretly. When an individual murders, robs, dis-honors women, he is thrown into prison. But when the Russian government is murdering or torturing helpless men and women and children, the other govern-
