Wise at Sixty

RABBI Stephen S. Wise, whose sixtieth birthday is being celebrated, has achieved distinction as one of the foremost leaders of world Jewry today. As a Zionist, as a Rabbi, as the founder and president of the Jewish Institute of Religion and as leader of the American Jewish Congress, he has impressed himself upon American Jewish life as no other Jewish spiritual leader. As an orator, he ranks high among the greatest in America. As a champion of civic righteousness and social justice, he exerts a far-reaching influence. As a tribune for the Jewish people, he is courageous, fearless, endowed, with the fire and zeal of the prophets of old.

Dr. Wise has made enemies, but he has made a vast multitude of friends and admirers. He is one of the most popular of the Jewish leaders and spokesmen. While Dr. Wise has on several occasions commented on errors of judgment, he has on the right side of vital Jewish problems—most of it's time. His enthusiasm and faith are his sincerity, his wholehearted devotion to Jewish ideals, his boundless love for the Jewish people, and his indefatigable work for human rights and equality for the oppressed and the downtrodden.

Dr. Wise is one of the most colorful, dynamic personalities in Jewish life today. As an American and as a Jew, he occupies a high place of honor in American life. He is still brimful of enthusiasm and energy, he is energetic and youthful. May his inspiring leadership and his vigorous battle for the right continue for many years to come.

A Literary Jubilee

Ossip Dymov, Russian-Jewish dramatist and novelist, is honored today on the occasion of the thirtieth anniversary of his literary activity. On Sunday evening friends and admirers of Dymov will witness characteristic scenes from his plays at the Civic Repertory theatre, and tribute will be paid him by his literary colleagues.

Ossip Dymov is one of the most brilliant Russo-Jewish authors who have also commenced his literary activity in Russia, but also in the United States, in Germany before the Hitler regime came into power, and in other European lands. His earliest stories in Russian were masterpieces of humor and satire. He was styled at that time as a new Chekhov, who had also commenced his literary career as a humorist and satirist. Dymov's drama, "Shma Burek", depicting the pogroms in Russia, created a sensation in many lands. It was a stirring work of dramatic art. It was also one of the most effective pro-fights against the Russian pogroms.

Hindenburg Backs Racial Hate Exhibit

Anti-Semitic Show in Berlin Opens April 21, Continues Six Weeks

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, March 16.—An anti-Semitic racial exhibition which will open here on April 21 and will continue for six weeks, has the active sponsorship of President Paul von Hindenburg, it was learned today.

The slogan adopted by the Nazis for the exhibition is "German Nation—German Labor." A special section has been set aside to illustrate how the Jews are "alienated" from the German nation.

Included in the exhibition are also sections devoted to cartoons and photographs showing "Jewish inferiority."

Jewish Leader Demands Nazis Admit Party

Attacks 'Aryan' Laws Against Jews Who Accept Its Theories

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, March 16.—Dr. Max Naumann, leader of the Nationalist German Jewish party, last night delivered a sharp attack on the application of "Aryan" legislation to those Jews who, like himself, accept the Nazi theories in full and ask only to be permitted to join the ranks of the Nazis.

Dr. Naumann spoke at a meeting of his party. The hall in which the meeting took place was elaborately decorated with swastika emblems. A number of uniformed storm troopers were in the audience.

Dr. Naumann's group, which claims to be just as German as the most fanatical Nazis, has waged a long struggle to be recognized as Germans and as Nazis. The group has been rebuffed consistently by the Nazis.

Codreanu and Henchmen Are Charged With Killing Late Premier

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BUCHAREST, March 16.—Corneliu Zelea Codreanu, leader of the anti-Semitic Iron Guard and several of his henchmen will go on trial here Monday morning charged with the assassination of Premier Ion G. Duca on December 29. Premier Duca was killed by Nicholas Constantinescu, student member of the Iron Guard at Sinaia station as he was returning from an interview with King Carol.

After the murder of Premier Duca, Codreanu disappeared and was reported to have fled to Ger-

McDonald Issues Call To U.S. Jews For Reich Relief

Conference Will Consider Problems That Face Groups Seeking to Help Jews of Germany

On the heels of an announcement by the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee and the American Palestine Campaign of the Jewish Agency in connection with the minimum fund drive to raise \$3,000,000 for the relief of German Jews, High Commissioner James G. McDonald, of the German Refugee Body, issued an emergency call to American Jewish leaders to gather Thursday night for a conference at the Astor. The conference is sponsored by both organizations and marks the inauguration of the drive.

Paul Baezwald, chairman of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, and Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America, said that the meeting is of considerable importance in view of Mr. McDonald's scheduled return to Europe on Friday.

House Burned In Anti-Semite Polish Outrage

Number of Outbreaks Are Reported in Several Villages

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) WARSAW, March 16.—The house of a Jewish grain dealer in Krulawski, near Rembeletz, burned to the ground after it had been set on fire during the course of an anti-Semitic night attack upon the village, it was reported here today.

All the inmates of the house were asleep when the attack occurred. Mendel Birnbaum, the owner of the building, was taken to a neighboring hospital for treatment.

Palestine Grants 1,350 More Permits

Laborers' Certificates Allowed Against Undecided Quota for 2 Months

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, March 16.—The government of Palestine today advanced to the Jewish Agency for Palestine 1,350 "laborers' certificates" against an undetermined immigration schedule for the next two months.

"Under the British system of restricting immigration into Palestine according to the absorptive capacity of the country," the Jewish Agency submits a proposed schedule of Jewish immigration which is either accepted by the government or reduced.

Recent immigration schedules submitted by the Jewish Agency have been drastically reduced by the Palestine authorities. Last October when the Agency asked for 24,000 certificates for the period up to March, the government granted only 5,000 certificates, 2,500 of which had already been used.

"The purpose of the conference will be to lay before attending delegates the essential facts of the problem facing relief organizations which are working in the interest of the German Jewish refugees and Jews still domiciled in Germany."

Seeks Definite Expression Mr. Baezwald and Mr. Rothenberg said that the High Commissioner "is desirous of bringing back to Europe with him a definite expression of the will of American Jewish to his brethren."

The Joint Distribution Committee devoted funds obtained in its campaign which is headed by Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, chairman, chiefly to the economic aid of the Jews still in Germany by providing facilities for training large numbers of "white collar" workers in the manual trades, for vocational training of Jewish youth barred from professional careers and the establishment of schools under Jewish auspices for youngsters ousted from the public schools of the "Third Reich" because of their race.

Uses for the Funds

The funds raised by the committee were used also to facilitate the emigration program of the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society and the Palestine A.S.C. and to augment the reduced incomes of Jewish welfare organizations in Germany. Refugee aid groups were assisted and together with the British Central Fund for the Relief of German Jews, the Jewish Agency, the Jewish Colonization Association, the committee cooperated with the High Commissioner on the refugee problem.

Reich Diseased, Declares Wolfe, Psychologist

Head of Mental Clinic Gives His Reasons in Magazine Article

Germany is suffering from a nervous breakdown, declared W. Beran Wolfe, director of the Community Church mental hygiene clinic, writing in the current issue of the Modern Psychologist.

Outlining the background of recent German history, and demonstrating the reasons for this breakdown, Dr. Wolfe explained, "The technique of a nervous breakdown is simple: You fall in a critical situation because your 'private logic' has been knocked out by the superior force of common sense, the force of reality. You go through a brief terror, and as you recover from the immediate sting of defeat, you unconsciously build up an alibi. If you can, you save your face by hanging the blame on the convenient shoulders of a scapegoat."

Dr. Wolfe maintains that this is what has happened in Germany. "The alibi of Germany," he writes, "is Hitlerism. Just as a nervous stomach or a palpitating heart may become the loudspeaker of a personality in the throes of a nervous breakdown, so Hitler has become the mouthpiece of a distraught Germany. Once the technique is crystallized, nothing else matters. Reason is thrown to the winds, reality is excluded from consideration." The scapegoat, he explains, lay close at hand, in the person of the Jew.

Relief Group Plans \$100-a-Couple Dinner

German Paper Belabors Press As Carrier of Hitler 'Lies'

Protesting its innocence of charges of being subsidized by the Nazis appearing in the New York Times last Tuesday, the Deutsche Zeitung, mouthpiece of Hitlerite groups in the United States, in its March 17 edition belabors the American press as a carrier of lies regarding Hitler's activities in office. In effect, the article accuses the entire American press out of step with one exception—the Deutsche Zeitung.

A weekly digest to the New York Times from Berlin reported that German government subsidies to the Deutsche Zeitung and its English-language supplement, the German Outlook, would be discontinued. The following day the New York Times published an interview with the editors of the

papers in which they disclaimed ever having received subsidies from the German government.

The German Outlook says in part:

"The editors of this paper wish to state here and now that they are not going to be intimidated by any libelous articles regardless of the paper in which they are published and will continue to set the record straight concerning the New Germany."

The March 17 edition of the Deutsche Zeitung and its English supplement devote pages to ridiculing and attacking prominent Americans taking part in "The Case of Civilization Against Hitlerism" at Madison Square Garden. Virtually every speaker is branded as an invertebrate hero of the German nation.

Jewish Culture

Reviving, Asserts Rabbi Newman

An appeal to American Jews to think of Judaism as a constructive way of life was made Friday night by Rabbi Louis I. Newman at the Oneg Shabbat of the Youth Congregation of Temple Rodeph Shalom, 7 West Eighty-third street.

"We are witnessing a remarkable revival of Jewish culture, and the synagogue is gaining thereby," Dr. Newman declared. "American Jews must not think of Judaism merely as a bulwark against anti-Semitism but as a constructive way of life. Independent of other circumstances, the Jewish rally, particularly in the so-called reform or liberal circles, must encourage personal piety and personal faith in Judaism as a religion and cult is to exert authority among its adherents. The time has come to recover, not to discard, Jewish ceremonies and to make Jewish, rather than general, humanistic and non-sectarian, ideals the motivating factor in the individual conduct of Jews."

Wendell Phillips also spoke.

Leaders Disagree on Newark Kosher Bill—Action Is Postponed

(J.D.B. Special Correspondence)

NEWARK, N. J., March 15.—From present indications, the five "city fathers" who comprise the local City Commission are due for a headaché before the proposed kosher meat regulation ordinance is effected here.

Final action on the motion has been postponed until interested parties and rabbis can get together and draft an ordinance acceptable to all. Last week's initial hearing developed into a heated session.

Meyer Zemel, one of the largest property owners in the city, urged complete withdrawal of the pending ordinance, asserting he "wanted peace among the Jews." When Mayor Meyer C. Ellenstein asked him to avoid racial innuendoes, Zemel asked the mayor to withdraw from consideration of this ordinance because he is the only Jewish member of the Commission. Zemel's contention was that most of the Jewish families in the city are compelled to buy from 120 to 150 kosher butchers, "in a combination, who charge from forty to fifty cents a pound for meat."

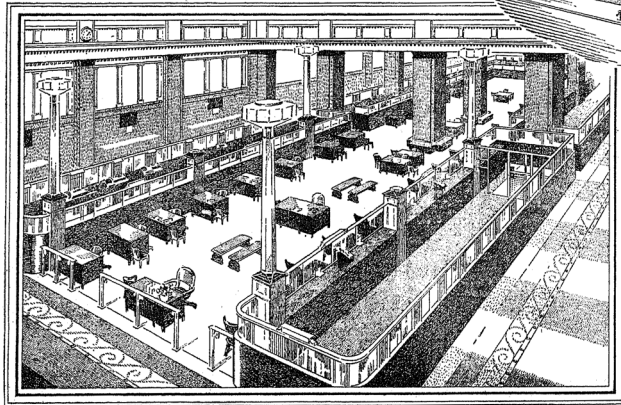
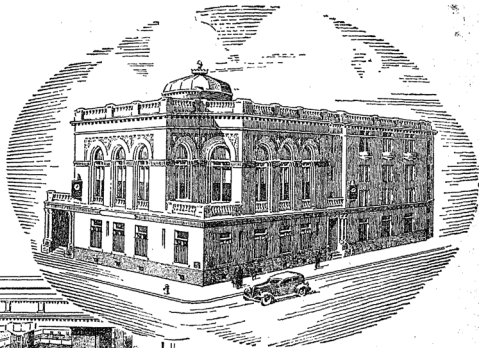

Jews Retain Traditional Scapegoat Role

Jewish Problem Will Intensify While Economic Crisis Lasts

Correspondent Finds Anti-Semitism Increasing Throughout Europe as Politicians Sacrifice Jews to Unrest

(This is the final article in the series of seven by Eugene Lyons, noted foreign correspondent who has just completed a tour of European countries analyzing the condition of the Jews for the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. The articles have appeared daily in the Jewish Daily Bulletin.)

GENEVA.

Anti-Semitism throughout Europe is clearly on the increase and is likely to grow deeper and more discernible as long as the economic crisis keeps the continent plunged under its crushing weight. This is the conclusion forced upon me as I traversed half a dozen countries in rapid succession, analyzing the Jewish problem even in its surface manifestations. In Germany it happens the phenomenon takes dramatic forms and is most apparent. But it is not limited to Germany by any means.

The simple fact is that the Jews, as the most vulnerable portion of the population and traditionally the "scapegoat" in time of trouble, provide an easy outlet for popular wrath. In Germany, politicians and political groups everywhere are only too ready to use anti-Jewish sentiments as a lightning rod to divert wrath from their own heads.

Poland as Refuge:

The irony of history has made Poland for the time being a land of refuge for Jews from Germany and Austria, and Jews of Polish extraction by the thousands are returning to the land of their birth. Yet one need only step across the Polish frontier from Russia to experience the anger and hatred of them. Restrained by the Pilsudski regime, it is there close to the surface, makes itself felt in all social and business relations and may break through the restraints any day.

The Jew in Warsaw is constantly aware of his special position because of his race, when he does not suffer economically on that account. The very circumstance that he is a national political issue—anti-Semitism being the chief plank in the program of the opposition to Pilsudski from the right—is scarcely calculated to set his mind at ease. He feels himself in a trap, under suspicion and the object of undesired hatreds.

"Outsiders"

I was in one of the leading cabarets in Warsaw, in a company which included several high officials. Being left at the table with one or two while the rest were on the dance floor, I asked, merely to make conversation: "Who owns this place?" The official seemed distressed by the plainness of the question and I had alluded to a painful subject.

"I am sorry to say," he replied apologetically, "that it is owned by a kind Jew."

In enlarging on the theme he referred to the Jews as "foreigners" and "outsiders." Only when I pointed out that these Jews had been born in Poland and had grown up and could hardly be considered foreigners, did it dawn on him that he was talking to an American Jew.

In Russia, as I have indicated in previous articles, anti-Semitism is still widespread but being deliberately and vigorously fought by the Soviet government. The recent extermination is a task of many years, perhaps decades. Meanwhile, should there be any serious

social disturbance in the country, the Jews would be certain to feel the brunt of it.

A Political Factor

In Poland, Austria and other countries anti-Semitism is an active political and social force. One can not guess how soon a turn of the wheel of events will give it wider play. In Austria, at any rate, that possibility is imminent. But in Germany, anti-Semitism is in its full flower. The most terrible sign of it, perhaps, is the matter-of-fact way in which seemingly gentle, kind-hearted German burghers go in for Jew-baiting, without the slightest sense of wrongdoing. It is for them natural ethical behavior, leaving their kind hearts undisturbed.

Rooted Anti-Semitism

Just such a German invited two Americans to his home. He fairly overflowed with kindness, took them into the very bosom of his family. To one of these Americans, indeed, he was related by marriage through a relation in Cincinnati. Before leaving was over he was offering to entrust his lovely daughters to these Americans for a visit to the United States.

The table talk turned, as all German table talk does nowadays, to the Nazi government's treatment of the Jews. And the mild German, who, even when realizing the gravity of what he was saying or the bottomless depth of his prejudices, voiced anti-Semitic utterances as one who associates only with the "black hundreds" of the old Russia. He not only justified but actually boasted of what the Hitler regime was doing to the Jews.

He Greeted Jews

The Americans, naturally, argued the matter. To demonstrate his fine generosity of spirit the host talked to his guests, who were former Jewish acquaintances in the streets or on the trolley-cars, he stops to speak to them. He is usually thought to overwhelm his guests by this proof of his broad-mindedness! To wind up the subject he said, in an earnest fatherly tone:

"I can only wish one thing for your own sakes, my dear friends: that you may never have to deal with Jews in your life!"

At that point the Americans ceased to listen, being so well known that they were Jews. The incident in itself was trivial but the Americans, of whom I was one, realized the devastating effect this country's year of Hitler propaganda had on a simple, normally decent, German.

The Greater Courage

I was discussing the cumulative tragedy of German Jewry, subjected to an attitude such as this incident typifies, with a young writer, the son of a Jewish father and "Aryan" German mother. Until a year ago he was a patriotic German, scarcely aware of any relationship to Jews. Now—although he manages as yet to hold an important position on a great staff—he is aware of the intensity of a sensitive highly-gifted mind.

"I sometimes accuse myself of being a 'chick,'" he said, "with a smile of pain." "Perhaps I should have emigrated to Palestine or America. But then again it seems to me that the greater courage is to remain in Germany, despite everything, biding our time."

"There are too many Jews in Germany to run away. My must

Wise, head of the Free Synagogue, predicted his early, voluntary retirement from the many activities with which he has been identified during his lengthy career—his American Jewish Congress, of which he is the honorary president, the Jewish Institute of Religion, of which he is the president, the Zionist Organization of America, of which he is a member of the Administrative body as well as the Synagogue and many other organizations with which he has been identified.

He made this prediction as part of his answer to the question as to whether he felt any satisfaction (Continued on Page Five)

Einstein to Talk At Wise Dinner Monday Night

Voluntary Retirement Is Soon Predicted by Rabbi

Professor Albert Einstein will speak at the testimonial dinner to be tendered Monday evening at the Hotel Astor in honor of the sixtieth birthday of Rabbi Stephen S. Wise. This will be his first public address in this city since his arrival to the United States.

Sidney Hillman, president of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America, Mayor LaGuardia, Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America, and Judge William W. Mack will also speak on the various activities of Dr. Wise during his career. Bernard S. Deutsch, president of the Board of Aldermen, will speak on behalf of the American Jewish Congress, which he heads, and of which Dr. Wise is honorary president. Former Secretary of State Bainbridge Colby, who is chairman of the dinner committee, will preside.

Stephen S. Wise

The Human Touch

By HARRY SALPETER

YESTERDAY Dr. Stephen S. Wise, the unordained but one the less potent, Pope of American Jewry, was sixty years old. His birthday falls on Wednesday, on St. Patrick's Day. Yesterday he attended a sermon in the presence of himself by his favorite rabbi—Louis I. Newman, in Temple Rodeph Shalom. Today, in his own Beth Shalom Synagogue, he will listen to "additional eulogies and eulogy response. A man can be sixty years of age only once and once, Wise could be forgiven for asking even more of this singular occasion than he has.

I spent approximately an hour with Dr. Wise. Dr. Wise supplied a stenographer, as a precaution, suppose, against the possibility of misquotation and as a means of preserving in full the words spoken by Stephen Samuel Wise, even so inauspicious an occasion.

The interview took place in Dr. Wise's private study, but I had the feeling that instead of conducting an interview with a man on the subject of how it feels to be sixty I was as privileged listener in an almost empty synagogue. Dr. Wise spoke on delivered for my exclusive benefit. Every time I sought to ask a personal contact, so to speak, was met by a thrusting of my hand. In fact, oratory as constantly intervening between myself and Dr. Wise. Every time I tried to break through it, I was so thoroughly rebuffed that I gave up as a bad job the task of establishing an informal contact, like the Rabbi rolled out and the stenographer scribbled and I— I rolled a couple of cigarettes.

Prophet, Senator, Actor Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, without being any the less a rabbi, has to him the qualities of a pained prophet, a Senator of the people, a tragic actor. If we find nothing of the actor in his mannerisms, we can find it in the causes which he has pursued in the forty years of his public career as rabbi, battler for justice, for human rights, for world rights and against civic corruption. If in our imagination we wrap a toga around him, the ga, at least belidious, it doesn't make him ridiculous, as it might smaller man. He has the figure of the face for it.

He looks and acts, for a man of his age, as if he had abounding faith. I do not believe that the light of the troubles of Jewry nately burden him, for he has an knack to smile and to make jokes and even to play with his pain. In fact, he is strong enough to have made confession of his own weakness. "I must not be brief," he is reported to have told an interviewer who was making a brief statement. It seems that he talks for publication if he had pages of printed matter to run around in, as much as he has time for a sermon. But even when he doesn't say a word, and he has been known to listen, he looks as if he were meekly. Which of course he is. He has his mark upon Jewry: life in America with such an individual and unmistakable images that one finds it hard to imagine what Jewish life in America and even in the world at large would have been without him. He is not only built physical structures but he has set ample social precedents and given impulses and even to social progress and mutual welfare and Jewish feel-

ing. To the non-Jewish world he stands as the symbol of the best in the Jewish rabbi; he has stood in thousands of Christian pulpits and stood in them as a credit to his people.

In a man who has achieved so much, a few mannerisms and even the public absence of a sense of humor may be forgiven. Even the Rabbi's egotism is magnificent and only the petty ones on the sidelines, who have done nothing, can do nothing and will do nothing, may give themselves the petty pleasure of caviling at a big man who can afford to have lemmings because they do not disfigure him.

Prophet May Be a Bore
One sometimes wonders how much close scrutiny by contemporary representatives of the press even the prophets of old might have, withstood and whether, privately, some of them were not thought to be boring, unable to answer simply a simple question about the weather. But Stephen S. Wise is not a prophet, or a charlatan. He is that individual amalgam known as Rabbi Stephen S. Wise. The proof of his individuality and of his bigness seems to me to consist in the fact that it is possible to argue about him, that he is debatable ground.

Answering a question as to what has been the chiefest satisfaction of his life Rabbi Wise replied that he found it in "the consciousness that I have done something in conformity to the vision and in obedience to the spirit of Theodore Herzl, to move Jews to stand up a little straighter, and to be a little more self-respecting in their own eyes and in the eyes of non-Jews. I am entirely ready to be remembered for that one thing, that I have tried to teach Jews, and I know that I have helped some of my fellow-Jews to hold up their heads higher and to think of their Jewishness not as a disgrace to be shirked, or as an affliction to be averted, but as a privilege to be cherished, and as a glory in which to rejoice."

He tells me that his consciousness and memory as a Jew go back to the year 1851 when, as a lad of seven, he went with his father, the Rev. Dr. Aaron Wise, head of Temple Rodeph Shalom, to welcome the victims of the Romanoffs and Poyedonostov, who were then passing through Castle Garden. "It is for me the tragedy of

tragedies," she says, "to find my life begin in the era of Poyedonostov and end in the year of Hitler." But the great and striking difference to Rabbi Wise consists in the fact that while Jewry in the early '80s had to take its persecution "lying down," today they can fight back and fight hard.

The most vital thing to Rabbi Wise is the strengthening of Jewish consciousness. He puts it in this way: "Everything that contributes to the strengthening of the Jewish consciousness I believe in. Anything that weakens that consciousness, whether it be Reform, or Orthodoxy or Conservatism, I am opposed to and I cannot help regretting the petty, puny, trivial, needless divisions between Reform and Orthodoxy for which Reform has its full share of responsibility."

And this is his message to the Jewish people, as he starts on the seventh decade of his life:

"We Jews must go on living. Under all circumstances Jews will survive. The question is not whether we will live, but how shall we live. Shall we merely survive or shall we once again, honorably, proudly, creatively and even nobly live. It is not enough to take Jews back to Zion. Zion must come back again into the heart of the Jew. Every Jew ought to be a cell of the Jewish National Home. Hitler cannot destroy us, but faithless, godless, idealless Jews can debate and destroy everything that is Jewish."

(Continued from Page Four) in his achievements. "No," he said, "there can be no satisfaction for a man who is in the midst of battle. How long I shall remain in that battle I do not know, but I confess I have a great horror of a man in public, or, as I am, in semi-public life, surviving himself. The Jewish

teacher must learn how to withdraw before he is invited to do so. It will not be many years before I shall ask to be relieved of all responsibility in the Synagogue."

Keep Issues of Kashruth Strictly Within Jewish Fold

In every age, the problems of Kosher food and supply have been serious matters to the Jewish public. The leading reasons for these hardships have been manifold, but speaking of the present time only, one could outline them as follows:

Turning from the general consideration of manufacturing, retailing and purchasing Kosher food to the practical end of Kashruth observance, i. e., observance of the Jewish dietary laws, one is confronted with what appears on the surface to be a chaotic condition. The lack of confidence in some of the established forms of Kashruth endeavor and method of supervision should be accounted to one reason. The frequent overcharging the price of products,

and the hesitancy by some of the storekeepers to carry Kosher products because of a slight increase in manufacturers' production cost, is another reason. Furthermore, there is the absence of a harmonious and cooperative spirit among the rabbis and their organizations.

The common cause of Kashruth, cosseted by many one of the most important pillars of Judaism and its survival, demands that truth in statement when Kashruth is mentioned should be absolutely correct. A generally accepted basis for judgment on the questions involved is lacking. Then there is a conflicting variety of organizations striving to achieve proper observance, conveying to the layman an impression of unethical and otherwise unsound activity.

Jewish Workers Parties Banned

Austria Acts Against Poale Zion Hitachduth and Laboring Groups

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
VIENNA, March 16.—An order issued by police today bans throughout all Austria the Poale Zion Hitachduth group and the Federation of Laboring Jews. The activities of both organizations were declared illegal.

Both groups were represented in the Vienna Jewish community, but their mandates were annulled following the crushing of the Social Democrats, in accordance with a government order.

Mendel Singer, leader of the Austrian Poale Zion, was arrested during the civil war and was released only a few days ago. The Dollfuss regime made it clear that it regarded the two Jewish workers' groups as part of the outlawed Social Democratic party.

Schenectady B'nai B'rith announced to the 12th SCHENECTADY, March 16.—Schenectady Chapter, B'nai B'rith, recently celebrated its ninetieth anniversary here with a program conducted by the Albany Chapter.

A sum of \$9,264.97 was thus paid out to maintain literati and scholars in 1933-34. Among the beneficiaries are many who are foremost in Hebrew literature, who through illness or old age are prevented from making a living. Some of those receiving funds reside in foreign countries, including Palestine.

BEARING GIFTS

By ABBA HILLEL SILVER

NOW comes another vicious friend of the Jews to give them friendly advice and admonition. This time it is an American Jew, the editor of the American Review, formerly known as the *Weekend*. Mr. Seward Collins. This gentleman is convinced that the best way to get rid of Fascism and to advise the Jews to prepare themselves for its speedy advent. He graciously volunteers to indicate the required method of preparation. The Jews should "curb their ambitions in public life and in certain professions and businesses." They should voluntarily achieve solidarity and a certain amount of separation by "retaining some of the right of participation in national affairs, temporarily won for them by liberalism, and turning more for their happiness to themselves and to their own certain Jewish traditions." The alternative is to have "this onus forced on them in strife, agony and bloodshed."

Mr. Collins draws a dark picture of what American Fascism is going to be. "Unless the Jews themselves take step to prevent the Fascist wave which is sweeping in the wake of an impractical democracy from taking a cruelly racialistic turn, they are almost certain to suffer here as they have in Germany many times before. And their fate is likely to be worse here than in Germany! Americans are notoriously more given to extremes and less amenable to orderly measures than the German people."

Thus forewarned and properly alarmed, American Jews should, according to Mr. Collins, proceed to accept voluntarily and submissively the full ghetto program which the Fascist theory has prescribed for the Jews of the world. They should surrender at once the "illusion of liberalism," that "unreasoned liberalism" to which they are so strangely addicted. They should give up at once the doctrine of assimilation and full equality. By assimilation, Mr. Collins understands that reprehensible desire of American Jews to enjoy the same rights and privileges as all other Americans. Upon surrendering all their outmoded notions of liberalism, equality and full rights of citizenship, American Jews will then be spared what? Racial bigotry and its suffering and bitterness, replies Mr. Collins. But what greater bigotry and suffering and bitterness can there be than that which is already involved in this ghetto program which this Fascist friend of the Jews advises them to accept so gratefully? So gratefully?

Even the most unbalanced of the Nazi madmen never proposed such a preposterous program to the Jews of Germany and never insisted that they be accepted, expecting them to entertain it for a moment. It remained for one of those rose-water American Fascists who, in spite of all that has happened in the lands of the colored shirts, can still indulge themselves in dreams of "personal liberty" (sic) under Fascism, who fondly believe that an American Fascism will wage war upon capitalism and socialism with equal fervor (as the young and befuddled Idealists among the German Nazis have dreamed) and who tried of the tension and the arduous adventure of modern life and thought, yearn after the simple joys of no socialism and feminism (and psycho-analysis) (sic) to confound and harass the placid class-

ist and the weary humanist—it remained for one of this hand to scale the heights of such imbecility or naivete. Truly, "the higher the age goes, the more he shows his tail."

It is clear that the American Fascists for whom Mr. Collins speaks were exactly the same things that the Nazis were and achieved in Germany: to disqualify, disfranchise and socially, politically and economically to quarantine the Jew. They are just a wee bit squeamish about the harsh methods which their Teutonic brothers employed. They would like to achieve their objective quietly, without noise or violence, by sort of gentleman's agreement. . . . These literary "Feinschmeckers" cannot stand the smell of blood. . . . They shudder at the thought of whips and lashes and mangled bodies and concentration camps. The obliging Jew should quietly, without fuss or protest, return to his ghetto and to the promised security of servitude and self-abasement, and leave the field clear for the Collineses their chosen clan to run the country by the divine right of their having been born—Irishmen or Scotsmen or Englishmen.

No, dear little would-be despots of the earth, the affair is not likely to be as simple or as peaceful as all that. The Jew will not be tricked into turning Fascist in order to escape the disabilities which Fascism would force upon him. The Jew knows his history. He knows that Fascism, whether of the Hitler or of the Collins brand, means a throwback to the Middle Ages and, for the Jews, the Middle Ages are not a mystically-romantic theme for literary nympholepsy, but blood and suffering and degradation. He will not throw in his lot with those who seek to revive "monarchistic and aristocratic principles" in government. He has lived under the beneficent rule of the Jews and he knows exactly what they mean when they are translated into laws, acts and institutions.

He will fight for that "unreasoned liberalism" which razes his ghetto walls, restored his human rights and gave him, as well as all other demised and exploited peoples, a chance to live in freedom and in dignity. He will fight for those "liberal doctrines" which have been the cornerstone of American democracy since its inception. When these are destroyed and the Jew is then confronted with a choice between Fascism and Marxism, between black reaction which demands of him as the price of toleration the surrender of his equality and his human dignity, and a collectivist society which wipes out all distinctions, the hard common sense of the Jew can be trusted unhesitatingly to choose the latter.

The Jew will never reconcile himself to the disabilities to which he is subjected by any man; thus he reconciled himself in the past to the disabilities which Tzarist Russia forced upon him. Persistently, determinedly and relentlessly he will work underground to bring about a complete overthrow. We are a stink-necked people. This "obstinate Judeaerum" was well known to

ART AND ARTISTS

Max Weber and Others
 J. B. Neumann, who gave up his lively New Art Circle some years ago to lecture on the Aesthetics and History of Art, has returned to the gallery field as co-director of the Contemporaria New Art Circle at 509 Madison avenue. The "Contemporaria" stands, I suppose, for the architectural and interior decorating part of the gallery while the "New Art Circle" stands for Mr. Neumann.

The first exhibition opened with a display of recent paintings by Kuniyoshi, Max Weber and Arthur Dove.

The Kuniyoshis are amusing, as his paintings always are apt to be. They are the works of a talented, highly inventive and sophisticated

personality who strives to be quaintly original. His little portraits is a lovely bit of painting. The intellectual abstractions of Arthur Dove on the other hand leave me, at least, entirely cold.

As for Max Weber, I remember seeing several of his paintings while I was a student at the National Academy of Design. They held me spellbound although I understood but little. They were strangely fascinating both attracting and repelling me. Since then I have always been on the lookout for his work and the more I saw the more I grew to like them.

Weber's opened my eyes to the shallowness and falseness of the Academy and imbued in me a desire for self-expression and independent experimentation.

Keeping Authors Happy

The script of Erekline Caldwell's play, "Tobacco Road," which is now running on Broadway, will be published by Viking Press. Behind a simple announcement lies a story that demonstrates the daily struggle of the publishers of the publishing business.

Viking Press are the publishers of Mr. Caldwell's novels. He was originally published by Thomas Scribner & Company but after two flops went over to Viking. His "God's Little Acre" was fairly successful. He then submitted a book of short stories which didn't do quite so well. His next venture was a novel about which there was much discussion and word of this possible rupture, having gotten around, other publishers immediately made tracks for Caldwell's haunts with fat contracts dangling in the offing but Viking jumped into the breach and decided to publish the book without further ado.

Disturbed Scene

The scene was quiet until Caldwell's play, "Tobacco Road," opened. Based on his novel of the same title, Viking, when they became Caldwell's publisher took it over from Scribner. There seemed no reason for its publication in play form. It was undoubtedly offered first to Viking and they must have rejected it for soon it was going the rounds of the other publishers who expressed an interest in it. These other publishers hoped they could bring it out. Mr. Caldwell would then give them his other books. When they learned that he had had a contract with Viking the play was rejected.

Viking evidently experienced a change of mind and heart and making a gesture for their author's sake decided to publish the play. Chances for its success as a publisher are very slim but an author has been made happy.

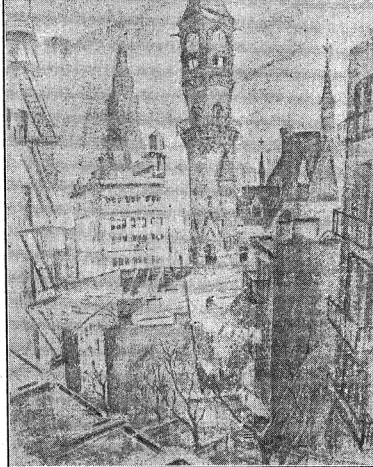
Fun While It Lasted

Recently some of these creditors and especially some of the authors whose royalty payments had been delayed, decided that the gas was running low and took a petition which they had and the firm has been adjudicated a bankrupt. Hammerlaug hasn't given up yet but there is a lot of scurrying around after jobs by some of the employees.

BOOKS

And the Twain May Meet

TODAY, when the whole world is in mortal fear of another war that may shake the very foundations of our culture, "Orient and Occident," by Hans Kohn (The John Day Company) is a very timely book. Dr. Kohn, who is the author of a number of other works, such as "A History of Nationalism in the East," "Nationalism in the Soviet Union," "Nationalism and Imperialism," knows his Orient not from hearsay or reading alone. He has visited China and Japan, and has traveled extensively throughout the Near East and Russia. His point of view is rather novel in that he sees East and West coming closer and closer together, instead of trending divergent paths, because "the organization of mankind in vertical sections of rigidly secluded peoples and cultures gradually loses significance in the presence of the horizontal organization in rank, classes and mental attitudes, which is found in all peoples."

This concise but exhaustive and brilliantly written treatise takes up, one by one, the reasons for the conflict between the Occident and the Orient, the political, cultural and social problems, the role of Bolshevism, the economic problem and the new prospects in world politics. "There is gradually arising," the author concludes, "an encompassing spiritual and social unity, the unity of mankind, whose organization on new bases is the problem of the modern historical epoch—a problem for the solution of which the harnessing of all the forces of the Orient and the Occident will be necessary."

Re-Forming Judaism

New Judaism for old is the thesis of "The Future of Judaism in America," by Eugene Kohn (The Liberal Press, New Rochelle). The author does not advocate, however, a new reform in ritual or ceremony. His wish is to see all the functions of America's so-called united religiously, culturally and, if possible, socially. Under the prevailing circumstances many of the beautiful traits of ghetto life have been lost. But the author does not deplore the fact, nor does he urge a return to an existence of isolation. What he would like to see, is the ancient ideal of Israel re-stated so as to make it possible for the present and coming

Jews In Soviet Russia

A new title, "Where the Ghetto Ends," has been selected for Leon Demnen's book on Jews in Soviet Russia, which will be published by Alfred H. King, Demnen, who lived in Russia and Poland for eighteen years, was formerly on the literary staff of the Moscow Daily News.

Big City Sunday

There is something typically New Yorkish about the way, a week ago today, Beethoven's stupendous Missa Solennis and a buffoon's party at the Metropolitan Opera shared the music spotlight.

Only a few hours intervened between the last strains of the mass, which so lengthy and much too exacting for ecclesiastical use, and the opening remarks by Ray Knight, NBC announcer, who was master of ceremonies at the Met's "Operatic Surprises Party of 1934, Celebrating a Half Century of Progress." In the matinee performance at Carnegie Hall there were Toscanini at his best; the Philharmonic-Symphony; the chorus of the Schola Cantorum, and a quartet composed of Elisabeth Rethberg, Sigrid Oneglin, Paul Althaus and Ezio Pinza, all remarkably well fitted for the tough afternoon's work they put in. In the evening, at the Met, there were merely to scratch the surface, Lauris Melchior with and without four balloons which had been added strategically to his ample girth so he might properly impersonate Salome; Rosa Fonnelle on a bicycle and in a radio station; Gladys Swarthout, Frederick Jagel and

Virgilio Lazari on other bicycles; Lawrence Tibbett in a William S. Hart costume, with two amazing hoistings to explode from time to time; Rose Brampton as a hot-cha warbler; Lily Pons as a beautiful baby; Pompilio Malatesta as a noisy one.

Another Odd Day Another odd juxtaposition on a single day concerns the Met alone, "Goetterdaemmerung," which is art, and "Linda di Chamounix," which is located on an imaginary point midway between art and life, and partakes only slightly of either, were the Gatti-Casazza offerings. The breach was not narrowed even by the superlative singing of La Pons, Richard Crooks and Gladys Swarthout in the Donizette charade.

Sokoloff Again It was too bad that Ezra Rachlin, who plays better, and Nikol Sokoloff, who should know better, gave their attention the other night to the Rachmannoff Piano Concerto No. 3.

Sokoloff conducted his New York City Orchestra, Rachlin played with technical skill and fine tonal sense, but the concerto remained an undistinguished, fast aging piece. Wagnerian matters and the Schubert "Unfinished" took up the rest of the evening.

Having slammed the door in the face of the Jews who attempted to shift their occupational basis to the land and to manual labor, the Nazis now are trying to utterly ruin the 600,000 German Jews...

But all Marchants point to a gradual increase of restrictions against the Jews. Robert Stricker, one of the Austrian Jewish leaders, recently warned the Jews of Austria, not to be too optimistic and told them that "dark days are ahead."

A numerous clause was introduced for Jewish artists on the government-owned radio system. Jewish artists will be permitted only in proportion to their number in the general population... In Linz all the Jewish doctors employed by the municipality were summarily dismissed and applicants for their posts informed that they must produce proof of "German nationality"...

Palestine
The Einstein Institute of Physics in the Hebrew University in Jerusalem was officially dedicated. The work of the great Solomon and Dora M. Shapiro of the United States... All Palestine Jews, Christians and Moslems are being urged to support the proposed income tax to be introduced by the Palestine government...

England
The Zionist Revisionist party was completely dissociated from the World Zionist Organization, when the Zionist Executive issued a compromise eliminating the Zion Revisionist organizations as were still within the organization.

The Rest of Europe
The Italian steamer Martha Washington was renamed Tel Aviv... Another Italian ship had its name changed to Jerusalem... The German government is on trial before the Upper Silesian Mixed Commission for having broken its pledges to respect the rights of the Jewish minority in Upper Silesia... The University of Warsaw was closed indefinitely after Endek students brutally assaulted the Jewish faculty...

The United States
The American Jewish Joint Distribution Board in U.S.A. and the American Palestine Campaign of the Jewish Agency for Palestine joined together and will open a united drive to secure \$500,000 for relief work among German Jewish refugees. Unity was achieved after a plea by James G. McDonald, League of Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, to recognize the desperate need of the hour...

A petition bearing 350,000 signatures, signed by an acting President Roosevelt to intervene on behalf of the German Jews and that such intervention would be "in accordance with the traditions of our country" was submitted to the Chief Executive by a delegation headed by Alfred M. Cohen, international president of the B'nai B'rith, under whose auspices the petition was gathered. Professor Albert Einstein celebrated his fifty-fifth birthday this week in Princeton... There was no cooperation. Dr. Einstein worked as usual.

Swiss Decision Bars General Nazi Libel Suit

Individual Jews Must be Mentioned for Action Basis; Fear Precedent

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

GENEVA, March 15.—A decision on principle for all Switzerland in connection with actions against collective bodies for insults to Jews is seen in the decision of the State's Attorney for Zurich who today dismissed the application of a Jewish lawyer for damages from the publisher of the Swiss Nazi organ, Eidgenosse. The Jewish attorney contended that he had been personally attacked through the publication of anti-Semitic articles in the Nazi paper.

The decision of the Zurich officials is similar to the action of the Mixed Tribunal in Cairo, Egypt, which decided against the suit brought by Umberto Jabes, an Italian Jew living in Egypt, against the president of the German Club in Cairo and the publisher of an anti-Jewish pamphlet sponsored by the Cairo German Club. The court held that Jabes failed to prove that he had been personally libeled.

Similar actions are pending in Basle and Berne, Switzerland, where the local Jewish communities brought actions against the publishers of anti-Semitic papers and against publishers of the "Protocols of the Elders of Zion," long since proven forgeries. It is believed that the Zurich decision will set a precedent for decisions on the Berne and Basle cases.

In his decision, the Zurich State's Attorney admitted that it was advisable in the interests of public order to punish such attacks as those contained in the Nazi anti-Semitic sheets, but declared that it was impossible to stretch the penal code to fit such cases. He said that punishment was possible only in cases where an individual was directly named and libeled.

Nevertheless he ordered the state treasury to carry the costs of the case and refused to award damages to the accused publisher of the Swiss Nazi paper.

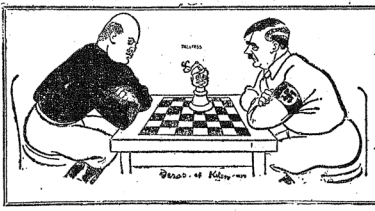

many. An intensive search for him failed. Yesterday Codreanu was arrested by police as he was about to enter a building in which military courts were sitting. He declared that he had come with the intention of surrendering himself so that he could stand trial with the men accused of the murder.

Codreanu was accompanied by Colonel Zavolano in whose home he had been hidden, his lawyer and by the priest Diamtrecu, known as an anti-Semitic agitator. Codreanu and the two men who with him will be tried as accomplices in the murder.

"Sold Rumania to Jews"

That the murder of Premier Duca was not an individual act was indicated by the statement of Constantinescu, who said: "I killed Duca because he sold Rumania to the Jews."

Immediately after the Liberal government of Premier Duca ordered the suppression of the Iron Guard, which had been carrying on a violent anti-Semitic campaign all over Rumania, Codreanu declared in his paper, Garda, that any attempt to suppress his group would be answered with a reign of terror. He even said direct personal threats to Premier Duca.

When the Premier carried out the suppression of the Iron Guard, Codreanu fled disguised as a woman.

Codreanu began his career about ten years ago. After contacts with the German anti-Semites while yet a student in Germany, he returned to Rumania and assassinated the prefect of Jassy because he arrested students who had carried out an attack on the Jews. Codreanu was arrested but later freed.

He then organized the anti-Semitic League of the Archangel Michael, which was later renamed the Iron Guard.

Attacked on Campus

Professor Handelman was attacked by the Enderk students as he was leaving the meeting. The attack occurred on the university campus.

Police authorities immediately ordered the University of Warsaw closed for an indefinite period.

The grey shirt organization of the Enderk students at the University of Warsaw is spreading to other universities in Poland. The anti-Semitic propaganda among Polish students is increasing rapidly.

The Enderk students belong to the National Democrats, which is an anti-Semitic, anti-government political party. The party is very active and has a number of representatives in the Sejm and the Senate.

The American Palestine Campaign, of which Louis Lipsky is national chairman, has supplied funds for the commission for the Settlement of German Jews in Palestine. This work made it possible for more than 10,000 refugees to settle in Palestine.

German Children

The campaign has also supported the work of the Jewish Agency to facilitate immigration to Palestine of German Jews and many of them have been helped to establish homes on the land. In addition it has supported the plan of the Jewish Agency to educate and shelter 4,450 German Jewish children who were sent to Palestine. The youngsters will receive elementary and secondary school training, higher education and agricultural, trade and domestic science training.

Funds realized in the unified campaign to be launched at the conference will be devoted to the relief and reconstruction projects of both the Joint Distribution Committee and the American Palestine Campaign of the Jewish Agency.

The Jewish community in Mecklenburg-Schwerin reported today that the Jewish population of the district had decreased since the last census from 1,700 to 670 and that it was impossible to maintain Jewish institutions any longer in view of the sharp decline in income.

The Baden administrative court located at Karlsruhe today annulled the decision of the Mannheim district court, which refused to grant a license to a Jewish innkeeper on the ground that "a Jew is unfit to maintain an inn."
