RABBI Stephen S. Wise, whose sixtieth birthday is being celebrated, has achieved distinction as one of the foremost leaders of world Jewry today. As a Zionist, as a Rabbi, as the founder and president of the Jewish Institute of Religion and as leader of the American Jewish Congress, American Jewish life as no other Jewish spiritual leader. As an orator, he ranks high among the greatest in America. As a champion of civic righteousness and social justice, he exerts a farreaching influence. Dr. Wise has made enemies but he has made a vast multitude of friends and admirers. He is one of the most popular of the Jewish leaders and spokesmen.

While Dr. Wise has on several occasions committed errors of udgment, he has been on the right side of vital Jawish problems most of tie time. His outdanding qualities are his sin-cerity, his wholeh arted devotion to Jewish ideals, his boundless love for the Jewish prople, and his indefatigable work for human rights and equality for the oppressed and the downtrodden.

Declares Wolfe. Psychologist

Head of Mental Clinic Gives His Reasons in Magazine Article

Germany is suffering from a nervous breakdown, declared W. Beran Wolfe, director of the Com-munity Church menta. hygiene clinic, writing in the current issue of the Modern Psychologist.

Outlining the background of re-cent German history, and demon-strating the reasons for this break-down, Dr. Wolfe explained, "The technique of a nervous breakdown technique of a nervous breakdown is simple: You fail in a critical situation because your private logic has been knocked out by the superior force of common sense, the force of reality. You go through a brief terror, and as you recover from the immediate sting of defeat, you unconsciously build up an alib. If you can, you save your face by hanging the blame on the convenient shoulders of a scapegoat."

Dr. Wolfe maintains that this is Dr. Wolfe maintains that this is what has happened in Germany. "In the case of Germany," he writes, "this is Hitlerism. Just as a nervous stomach or a palpitat-ing heart may become the louding neart may become the boat-speaker of a personality in the throes of a nervous breakdown, so Hitler has become the mouth-piece of a distraught Germany. Once the technique is crystallized, nothing else matters. Reason is thrown to the winds, reality is excluded from consideration." The scapegoat, he explains, lay close at hand, in the person of the Jew.

German Paper Belabors Press As Carrier of Hitler 'Lies'

charges of being subsidized by the Nazis appearing in the New York Times last Tuesday, the Deutsche Zeitung, mouthpiece of Hitlerite groups in the United States, in its March 17 edition belabors the American press as a carrier of lies American press as a carrier of lies regarding Hitler's activities in office. In effect, the article proclaims the entire American press out of step with one exception—the Deutsche Zeitung.
A wireless dispatch to the New York Times from Berlin reported

that German government subsidies to the Deutsche Zeitung and its English-language supplement, The German Outlook, would be discontinued. The following day the New York Times published an in-

of papers in which they disclaimed the ever having received subsidies from the German government. The German Outlook says in

> "The editors of this paper wish to state here and now that they are not going to be intimidated by any libelous articles regardless of the paper in which they are published and will continue to set the record straight concerning the New Germany."

The March 17 edition of the Deutsche Zeitung and its English Deutsche Zeitung and its Engaism supplement devotes pages to ridi-culing and attacking prominent Americans taking part in "The Case of Civilization Against Hit-lerism" at Madison Square Garden. Virtually every speaker is branded as an inveterate hater of terview with the editors of the the German nation.

Jewish Culture Reviving, Asserts Rabbi Newman

An appeal to American Jews to think of Judaism as a constructive way of life was made Friday night by Rabbi Louis I. Newman at the Oneg Shabbat of the Youth Congregation of Temple Rodeph Sholom, 7 West Eighty-third street.

"We are witnessing a remark-able revival of Jewish culture, and the synagogue is gaining thereby," Dr. Newman declared. "American Dr. Newman declared. "American Jews must not think of Judaism merely as a bulwark against anti-Semitism but as a constructive way of life. Independent of outer way or life. Independent or outer circumstances, the Jewish laity, particularly in the so-called re-form or liberal circles, must en-courage personal piety and per-sonal faith if Judaism as a religion sonal faith if Judaism as a religion and cult is to exert authority among its adherents. The time has come to recover, not to discard, Jewish ceremonies and to make Jewish ceremones and to make Jewish, rather than general, hu-manist or non-sectarian, ideals the motivating factor in the individual conduct of Jews."



Jews Retain Traditional Scapegoat Role

Jewish Problem Will Intensify While Economic Crisis Lasts

Correspondent Finds Anti-Semitism Increasing Throughout Europe as Politicians Sacrifice Jews to Unrest

GENEVA Anti-Semitism throughout Eur ope is clearly on the increase and is likely to grow deeper and more disastrous as long as the world crisis keeps the continent pinned under its crushing weight.

This is the conclusion forced up-on me as I traversed half a dozen countries in rapid succession noting the Jewish problem even in ing the Jewis problem even in its surface manifestations. In Germany it happens the phe-nomenon has taken sharpest forms and is most apparent. But it is not limited to Germany by any

as the most vulnerable portion of the population and traditionally the "scapegoat" in time of trouble, provide an easy outlet for pop-ular discontent. Individual politicians and political groups every-where are only too ready to use anti-Jewish sentiments as a lightning rod to divert wrath from their own heads.

Poland as Refuge

The irony of history has made Poland for the time being a land of refuge for Jews from Germany and Austria, and Jews of Polish extraction by the thousands are returning to the land of their birth. need only step across the Polish frontier from Russia to experience the impact of anti-Semi-tism. Restrained by the Pilsudski regime, it is there close to the surface, makes itself felt in all social and business relations and may break through the restraints any

The Jew in Warsaw is constantly aware of his special position because of his race, even when he does not suffer economically on that account. The very circumstance that he is a national political issue—anti-Semitism being the chief plank in the program of the opposition to Pilsudski from the right—is scarcely calculated to set his mind at ease. He feels himself an intruder, under suspicion and the object of undeserved hatreds.

"Outsiders"

I was in one of the leading cabarets in Warsaw, in a company which included several high officials. Being left at the table with one of them, while the rest were on the dance floor, I asked, merely to make conversation:

"Who owns this place?" The official seemed distressed by the question, as if I had alluded to

"I am sorry to say," re replied apologetically, "that it is owned

In enlarging on the theme he referred to the Jews as "foreigners" and "outsiders." Only when

I pointed out that these Jews had been in Poland for many centuries and could hardly be considered foreigners, did it dawn on him that he was talking to an American

In Russia, as I have indicated in s, anti-Semitism is still widespread but being deliber ately and vigorously fought by the Soviet government. Its total exyears, perhaps decades. Mean-while, should there be any serious Germany to run away.

A Political Factor
In Poland, Austria and other countries anti-Semitism is an ac-tive political and social force. One

can not guess how soon a turn of the wheel of events will give it wider play. In Austria, at any

wider play. In Austrie, at any rate, that possibility is imminent. But in Germany, anti-Semitism is in its full flower. The most terrible sign of it, perhaps, is the terrible sign of it, perhaps, is the matter-of-fact way in which seem-ingly gentle, kind-hearted German burghers go in for Jew-batting, without the slightest sense of wrong-doing. It is for them natural effortless behavior, leaving their kind hearts undisturbed. Rooted Anti-Semitism

his fine generosity of spirit the
host related how, when he meets former Jewish acquaintances in the streets or on the trolley-cars, he stops to speak to them. He actually thought to overwhelm his guests by this proof of his broadnindedness! To wind up the subject he said, in an earnest fatherly tone:
"I can only wish one thing, for

your own sakes, my dear friends: that you may never have to deal

with Jews in your life!"

At that point the Americans ended the comedy by letting it be known that they were Jews. The incident in itself was trivial but the Americans, of whom I was one, realized the devastating effect that a single year of Hitler propaganda had on a simple, normally decent, German.

The Greater Courage I was discussing the cumulative tragedy of German Jewry, sub-jected to an attitude such as this incident typifies, with a young writer, the son of a Jewish father and "Aryan" German mother. Until a year ago he was a patriotic German, scarcely aware of any relationship to Jews. Now-al-though he manages as yet to hold an important position on a great journal—he is aware of it with the intensity of a sensitive highlygeared mind.

"I sometimes accuse myself of lack of courage," he said, smiling a smile of pain. "Perhaps I should have emigrated to Palestine or America. But then again it seems to me that the greater courage is in remaining despite everything,

He tells me that his conscious

He tells me that his conscious-ness and memory as a Jew go back to the year 1881 when, as a lad of seven, he went with his father, the Rev. Dr. Aaron Wise, head of Temple Rodeph Sholom, to wel-come the victims of the Romaness that one finds it hard to agine what Jewish life in Amerand even in the world at large uld have been without him. He s not only built physical strucres but he has set afoot social vements and given impulses and offs and Pobyedonostzev, who were petuses to social progress and then passing through Castle Garminal welfare and Jewish feel-den. "It is for me the tragedy of

tragedies," to find my life begin in the era of Pobyedon life begin in the era of Pobyedon-ostzev and end in the year of Hir-ler." The most vital thing to Rabbi Wise is the strengthening of Jewish consciousness. He puts it in this way: "Everything that con-tributes to the strengthening of the Jewish consciousness I believe Anything that weakens that consciousness, whether it be Re-form, or Orthodoxy or Conservaform, or Orthodoxy or Conserva-tism, I am opposed to and I can-not help regretting the petty, puny, trivial, needless divisions be-tween Reform and Orthodoxy for

which Reform has its full share of responsibility.' And this is his message to the Jewish people, as he starts on the seventh decade of his life:

"We Jews must go on living.
Under all circumstances Jews will
survive. The question is not whether we will live, but how shall Shall we merely survive wo live. wo live. Shall we merely survive or shall we once again, honorably, proudly, creatively and even nobly live. It is not enough to take Jews back to Zion. Zion must come back again into the heart of the Jew. Every Jew ought to be a cell of the Jewish National Home. Hitler cannot destroy us, but faith-less, godless, ideal-less Jews can debase and destroy everything that

BEARING GIFTS

NOW comes another vicarious cist and the weary humanist—it remained for one of this hand to them friendly advice and admonities. them friendly advice and admonition. This time it is an Ameri-

can Fascist, editor of the American Review, formerly Collins. America is going Fascist and

Rabbi Silver

The Bookman, Mr. Seward Collins. This gentleman is convinced that he advises the Jews to prepare

themselves for vent. He graciously volunteers to indicate the required method of preparation. The Jews should "curb their ambitions in public life and in certain professions and businesses." They should voluntarily achieve solidarity and a certain amount of separation by linquishing some of the forms of participation in national affairs, temporarily won for them by liberalism, and turning more for their happiness to themselves and to the immonse stores of Jewish tradi-tions." The alternative is to have "this outcome forced on them in strife, agony and bloodshed."

Mr. Collins draws a dark picture of what American Fascism is go-ing to be. "Unless the Jews themselves take step to prevent the Fascist wave which is sweeping in the wake of an impractical democracy from taking a cruelly racialistic turn, they are almost certain to suffer here as they have in Germany and so many times before. And their fate is likely to be worse here than in Germany! Americans notoriously more given to extremes and less amenable to orderly measures than the German people."

Thus forewarded and properly starmed, American Jews should, according to Mr. Collins, proceed to accept voluntarily and submissively the full ghetto program which the Fascist theory has prescribed for the Jews of the world. They should surrender at once the "illusion of liberalism," that "unreasoned liberalism" to which they are so strangely addicted. They should give up at once the docof assimilation and full by assimilation, Mr. equality. Collins understands that reprehen-sible desire of American Jews to enjoy the same rights and privi-leges as all other Americans. Upon surrendering all their outmoded notions of liberalism, equality and full rights of citizenship, American Jews will then be spared—what? Racial bigotry and its suffering and bitterness, replies Mr. Collins. But what greater bigotry and suffering and bitterness can there be than that which is already involved in this ghetto program which this Fascist friend of the Jews advises them to accept so gratefully and so gracefully

Even the most unbalanced of the Nazi madmen never proposed such a preposterous program to the Jews of Germany and never insulted their intelligence by ex-pecting them to entertain it for a moment. It remained for one of those rose-water American Fas-cists who, in spite of all that has happened in the lands of the col-ored shirts, can still indulge themselves in dreams of "personal lib-erty (sic!) under Fascism," who fondly believe that an American Fascism will wage war upon capitaliam and socialism with equal fervor (as the young and befuddled idealists among the German Nazis believed) and who, tired of the tension and the arduous adventure of modern life and thought, yearn after the simple "ancient ways" of life, when there
m were no socialism and feminism
m and pscho-analysis (sic!) to concofound and harass the placid classi-

scale the heights of such imbeditity or naivete. Truly, "the higher the ape goes, the more he shows his tail."

It is clear that the American Fascists for whom Mr. Collins speaks want exactly the same things that the Nazis wanted and things that the Nazis wanted and achieved in Germany: to disqual-ify, disfranchise and socially, politically and economically to quarantine the Jew.

They are just a wee bit squeamish about the harsh methods which their Teutonic brothers employed. their Teutome prothers employed. They would like to achieve their objectives quietly, without noise or violence, by a sort of gentle-man's agreement. . These liter-ary "Feinschmeckers" cannot

ary "Feinschmeckers" stand the smell of blood. . stand the smell of blood. . . . They shudder at the thought of whips and lashes and mangled bodies and concentration camps. The obliging Jew should quietly, without fuss or protest, return to his ghetto and or protest, return to his ghetto and to the promised security of servi-tude and self-abasement, and leave the field clear for the Collinses and their chosen clan to run the country by the divine right of their having been born—Irishmen or Scotsmen or Englishmen.

No, dear little would-be despots of the quill, the affair is not likely to be as simple or as peaceful as all that. The Jew will not be tricked into turning Fascist in order to escape the disabilities which Fascism would force upon him. The Jew knows his history. He knows that Fascism, whether of the Hitler or of the Collins brand, means a throwback to the Middle Ages, and, for the Jews, the Middle Ages are not a mystically -roman-Ages are not a mystically roman-tic theme for literary nympho-lepsy, but blood and suffering and degradation. He will not throw degradation. He will not throw in his lot with those who seek to "monarchistic and aristocratic principles" in government. He has lived under the beneficient aegis before and he knows exactly what they mean when they are translated into laws, acts and institutions

He will fight for that "un-reasoned liberalism" which razed his ghetto walls, restored his human rights and gave him, as well as all other denied and exploited peoples, a chance to live in freedom and in dignity. He will fight for those "liberal doctrines" which have been the cornerstone of American democracy since its incention. When these are destroyed and the Jew is then confronted with a choice between Fascism and Marxism, between blck reac-tion which demands of him as the price of toleration the surrender of his equality and his human dignity, and a collectivist society which wipes out all distinctions, the hard common sense of the Jew can be trusted unhesitatingly to choose the latter.

The Jew will never reconcile himself to the disabilities to a Fascist State any more than he reconciled himself in the past to the disabilities which Tzarist Russia forced upon him. Persistently. determinedly and relentlessly he will work underground for its ultimate overthrow. We are a stiff-necked people. This "obstinate Judaeorum" was well known to Nazi Mathematics

"There is gradually aris-ing," the author concludes, "an en-compassing spiritual and social unity, the unity of mankind, whose organization on new bases is the problem of the modern historical epoch—a problem for the solution of which the harnessing of all the forces of the Orient and the Occident will be necessary.

They still don't know what their fate will be, But all indications point to a gradual increase of restrictions against the Jews. Robert Stricker, one of the Austrian Jewish leaders, recently warned the Jews of Austria no to be too optimistic and told them that "dark days are ahead."

A numerus clausus was intro duced for Jewish artists on the government-owned radio system Jewish artists will be permitted only in proportion to their num ber in the general population. . . In Linz all the Jewish doctors employed by the municipality were summarily dismissed and applicants for their posts informed that they must produce proof of "Ger man nationality." . . . It urges that the elimination of naturalized Jews from business, professional and public life be carried out not in accordance with the law, but in accordance with the "political in-terests of the state."

Individual Jews Must be Mentioned for Action Basis: Fear Precedent

GENEVA, March 15.—A decision on principle for all Switzer-land in connection with actions against collective bodies for insults to Jews is seen in the decision. sion of the State's Attorney for Zurich who today dismissed the application of a Jewish lawyer for damages from the publisher of the Swiss Nazi organ, Eidgenosse. The Jewish attorney contended that he had been personally attacked through the publication of anti-Semitic articles in the Nazı paper.

The decision of the Zurich officials is similar to the action of the Mixed Tribunal in Cairo, Egypt, which decided against the suit brought by Umberto Jabes, an Italian Jew living in Egypt, against the president of the Ger-man Club in Cairo and the publisher of an anti-Jewish pamphlet sponsored by the Cairo German Club. The court hold that Jabes failed to prove that he had been personally libelled.

Similar actions are pending in Basie and Berne, Switzerland, where the local Jewish communities brought actions against the publishers of anti-Semitic papers and against publishers of the "Proof the Elders of Zion", long since proven forgeries. It is be-lieved that the Zurich decision will serve as a precedent for decisions on the Berne and Basle cases. his decision the Zurich

State's Attorney admitted that it was advisable in the interests of public peace to punish such at-tacks as those contained in the Nazi anti-Semitic sheets, but de-clared that it was impossible to stretch the penal code to fit such cases. He said that punishment was possible only in cases where an individual was directly named and libelled.

Nevertheless, he ordered the state treasury to carry the costs of the case and refused to award damages to the accused publisher of the Swiss Nazi paper.
