Planned Unity

IN YESTERDAY'S Jewish Daily Bulletin we published an interesting letter from Mr. Jacob de Haas, noted publicist, biographer of Theodore Herzl and Zionist leader of Louis D. Brandeis. Referring to my recent editorial, "Unity Among Rabbis," Mr. de Haas says:

"This talk of unity attained by careful preparation and organization is only a new form of hot words. . . . The confusion in Jewish life is not the result of sharp-differences between organizations, nor does it spring from divisions in the ranks of either the Rabbis or the laity. Its cause is the complete lack of a policy adequate to the situation. . . . The word 'Achanism' is being thrown at us as though it had the power to ward off evil. Actually it is used as a soporific. Let us be united. About what? About having unity, and then? Where there is no direction, how shall all of us pursue one road?"

My view of the 'type of unity needed by the Jewish people was expressed in that editorial as follows:

"Unity can be attained by careful preparation and organization, but first there must be the sincere and unselfish will to unite in the face . . . the most awful tragedy that has befallen the Jewish people. American Jewry needs unity—unity in planning with foresight and in acting with courage, dignity, wisdom and responsibility in this dark hour of Israel's exile."

Does this mean unity merely for the sake of unity? Unity without planning, unity without organization, unity with a policy is valueless. There must be careful-planning, coordination and organization. First a definite policy should be elaborated and then a united effort organized to carry it out.

Hitlerism is waging war against the Jews. Hitlerism is waging war against the Jews. Hitlerism is waging war against the Jews on all fronts, persecuting them ruthlessly at home and seeking to incite anti-Jewish hate abroad.

There must be a united command in the forces of Jewry to resist the Nazi offensive. The strongest and best trained army is doomed to failure if it lacks carefully elaborated plans and a united leadership. This also applies to the moral defense—war which the Jews have been compelled to wage against Germany.

Whether it be diplomacy, or protests, or the economic boycott against German-made products, or the campaign against German-made propaganda, there must be a definite, unified policy. There must be no scattering of energy, no overlapping activities, no overlapping efforts. In this crisis, the danger is too grave. American Jewry has found the road to unity in the relief campaign to be launched soon. It is to unite in defending the Jews against the Hitler attack. This (Continued on Page Eight)

Cease Racial Boycott, Nazi Leader Asks

Germany's Economic Life Endangered by Plan, He Says

MUNICH, March 20.—The Jewish fear of the new economic boycott proclaimed by the Nazi Trade and Artisans Association to begin on March 23 scheduled to continue until April 7, was somewhat allayed today by the Bavarian Minister of Economics Dr. Esser who spoke here today before the meeting of the Industrial Chamber of Nuremberg.

Dr. Esser declared that Jews had already been eliminated from the political life of Germany and are therefore unable to exercise publicly legal functions. He delivered a sharp warning against arbitrary interference "with economic developments which might mean the end of Germany's economic life."

Paris Paper Warns Against Nazi Tricks

States if Jews Return to Reich Their Money Will Be Confiscated

PARIS, March 20.—A warning to German Jews in foreign countries not to trust the persuasions of Nazi agents to return to Germany with their capital was delivered today by the *Parisien* newspaper. The French newspaper, edited by Georg Bernhard, former editor of the *Vossische Zeitung*.

The paper declared that the German agents are paid by the German government, which is now trying to improve its increasingly desperate economic position by such schemes. Numerous cases were cited by the *Tagblatt*, including the case of a wealthy South German banker who had all his possessions confiscated by the Nazis.

Jews Enlisted In Spring Job Drive in Reich

'Non-Aryan' Employers Asked to Give Work to Members of Race

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, March 20.—The Nazi-directed spring employment campaign begins tomorrow under the leadership of Chancellor Adolf Hitler, who today appealed to all German employers that they create as much extra work as possible.

The Berlin Jewish community issued an appeal today to Jewish employers to respond to the call from the "highest authority for making work," which they declared is "directed to the entire German nation, including ourselves."

"The Reich government has clearly stated that the economic life of the nation is not subject to other considerations than the economic laws," the Jewish community appeal said. "The Reich government is 'directed to the entire German nation' in economic life," therefore Jewish employers are not barred and every unemployed worker put to work relieves the general burden.

"We appeal to Jewish employers to engage Jewish youth unemployed through our Jewish employment exchange."

The *Juedische Rundschau*, organ of the German Zionists, also appealed to German Jewry "to collaborate in creative work for the unemployed." This is especially true of Jewish youth, which paper declared, was of supreme importance for Jewish youth.

"Practically the whole of German Jewish youth now realizes that their future, whether in Germany or in foreign countries and particularly in Palestine, lies in manual work," the *Rundschau* declared. Austrians Nab Zionist Group, Then Free It

Hechalutz, Labor - Unit for Training Pioneers, Detained En Masse

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, March 20.—Leaders of the Austrian Hechalutz, labor organization for the training of Jewish youth for pioneer work in Palestine, were arrested today and taken to police headquarters where they were interrogated at length by the officials.

After representations made to the police by leaders of the Austrian Zionists, the entire group was released.

Last week the entire Poale Zion party was declared illegal in Austria and forbidden to function anywhere in the country.

The action of the police seems to be part of a campaign to eliminate all organizations which had anything to do with the outlawed Social Democratic party.

Liepmann Is Freed, Deported to Belgium By Dutch Officials

AMSTERDAM, March 20.—Heinz Liepmann, author of "Murder Made in Germany," was released today from a Dutch jail after serving a one-month's sentence for having allegedly libeled President von Hindenburg of Germany, "the head of a friendly state," in his book.

Herr Liepmann was immediately deported to Belgium, thus setting at rest rumors that he might be deported to Germany.

"Murder Made in Germany" includes a chapter in which the accusation is made that von Hindenburg received money from a relief fund for his East Prussian estate.

Brooklynites Meet in Anti-Nazi Campaign

Dinner Tomorrow Also Tribute to Wise on Birthday

Four hundred leading citizens of the Brooklyn community have already signified their intention of joining tomorrow evening in a tribute to Dr. Stephen S. Wise at the Hotel St. George, which will serve as the beginning of an organized effort on the part of Brooklyn to mobilize its forces in opposition to the spread of Nazi propaganda, it was announced today by Supreme Court Justice Mitchell May.

The tribute to Dr. Wise is to take the form of a dinner which has been arranged in honor of his sixtieth birthday, and which is the culmination of a series of celebrations which have been held in New York during the past week. The entire proceeds will be utilized to furthering the campaign against the rise of Nazi propaganda in this country and Hitlerism abroad.

Five hundred leading citizens of Brooklyn have joined the dinner committee of five hundred, headed by Judge May, and have arranged the dinner in cooperation with the Brooklyn Division of the American Jewish Congress.

In a statement issued yesterday, Judge May declared that one of the first undertakings of the organization will be to organize a vigorous counter-campaign against Nazi propaganda in Brooklyn.

Castigates Nazi Meeting

He castigated the Nazi meeting in Ridgewood Saturday night, stating: "The meeting of Nazis held last Saturday night at Schwaben Hall in Brooklyn represents the most daring offensive which the Nazis have yet attempted in this part of New York City."

"It is perhaps the first repercussion of the coming to this community of William D. Pellay, of the Silver Shirts, and is unquestionably the beginning of what is intended to be a great offensive to win the support of the great Brooklyn community to Nazi hateful principles of Hitlerism."

McDonald Will Speak at Drive's Start Thursday

\$3,000,000 JDC-AFC Campaign Opens at Hotel Astor

High Commissioner James G. McDonald will be the principal speaker when the \$3,000,000 campaign for the settlement of German Jewish refugees in Palestine and elsewhere is launched under the joint auspices of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee and the American Palestine Campaign at Hotel Astor tomorrow evening.

Acceptances to the conference have been received from all parts of the country and it is expected to prove one of the most significant gatherings of its kind ever held. Before sailing for Europe, High Commissioner McDonald wishes to present the refugee problem to a representative gathering of American Jews, who in turn will transmit it to their communities. His address will be broadcast over the network of the National Broadcasting Company.

Other speakers will include Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, national chairman of the fund raising committee of the JDC, and Morris Rothenberg, co-chairman of the American Palestine Campaign and of the Council of the Jewish Agency for Palestine. Federal Judge Julian W. Mack will preside.

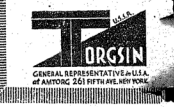

Proskauer Appeals For Charity Funds

Federation Work Has Decreased Enormously, Contributions Have Lessened, He States

**Public Must Give \$2,000,000 Over Subscriptions
to Enable Work to Be Carried On in
Tradition of Jewry Here**

The following is the statement made by Judge Joseph M. Proskauer at the board meeting of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies.

By JOSEPH M. PROSKAUER
The Board of Trustees has voted a budget for the year 1934 of \$3,500,000. In order that you may understand the significance of this figure, let me say that in 1929 the ninety-one institutions which represent, as you know, all the chief orphan asylums, old folks homes, hospitals, community centers and in general, most of the important Jewish philanthropic institutions, needed for the Federation a budget of \$5,200,000.

In the interval between 1929 and 1933 the demands on these institutions, increased enormously, and as the demands were increasing, the contributions to Federation were decreasing. The result of that has been that for every year from 1929 to 1933 inclusive we have had to reduce the budget of these institutions from Federation until it got to the figure of \$3,100,000 in 1933.

You will note, therefore, that for the first time since 1929 Federation has increased a budget—in fact, has decreased its budget—going up this year from \$3,100,000 to \$3,500,000.

Reduced Salaries
It is important that the public should understand the double significance of this action. The first meaning of it is that we have tried to persuade to face the absolute requirements of the poor and the sick and the needy. We had in the year 1933, for example, reduced the salaries of our social workers. We felt we had to reduce them because it was a compromise between either reducing them or reducing the money we were handing out to starving and sick people. But this year we had to take into account that the social workers themselves have a problem. The increase in commodity costs and we therefore felt an absolute obligation to increase those salaries of employees who receive less than \$3,000 a year, at least in part back to a point where we think they get a living wage.

Budget Inadequate

It is our earnest hope that when the public understands this situation, they will give us enough money this year to enable us to meet even more fully the obligation that we feel the community owes to the self-sacrificing men and women who devote their lives to this work of caring for the poor. This budget, though it represents an increase, is still a notably inadequate budget. The ninety-one institutions, for example, last year spent in their work almost \$1,000,000 more than they received; that is, we didn't have the money to give them and they had to draw on their capital funds to the extent of nearly \$1,000,000 to pay the expenses of the year. A year's postponing of these expenses in the hospitals, for example, The hospitals have the experience of observing very marked decreases in their pay patients. We figure that reduction at approximately 25 per cent. That is a large item in the income of every hospital and all their private pay income decreases to a considerable extent. Increase in the amount of free work they have to do. They have to take care for many more poor pa-

tients. That throws on us a burden that leaves us very little choice. We have got to keep hospitals open for poor, sick people who cannot afford to pay and the only way to keep them from going is to give them money, to take up the slack in their pay income.

Mission Almost Impossible
Therefore, in figuring this budget at \$3,500,000, the Board of Trustees took the figure which seemed to them to represent the very minimum of what would preserve the existence of these ninety-one institutions. We could not vote a smaller budget consistently in the face of the obligation to keep these institutions alive and going and ministering to the poor and needy in this still depressed condition.

In doing this, the Board of Trustees has done a very courageous thing. We have stated almost the very existence of Federation upon our ability to make the philanthropic public of New York realize the necessity of giving us this money.

Greater Appeal to Public

While we have increased our budget, our fixed income from annual recurrent subscriptions has fallen from \$2,900,000 last year to \$1,800,000 this year. Put another way, that means that people who give normally so much a year to Federation have reduced by \$400,000 for the year 1933. In 1929 our fixed income from regular annual recurrent subscriptions was \$3,700,000, so that you see our fixed income has fallen off from \$3,700,000 in 1929 to \$1,800,000 this year.

In 1929 these regular membership contributions represented 80 per cent of our total budget of \$5,200,000. In 1933 these regular contributions represented about 50 per cent. This year we have to raise by appeal to the public approximately 60 per cent of our budget; in other words, our fixed income has fallen to the lowest ratio in our history with respect to our budget, being only 40 per cent of the budget and that means that the public in order to keep these Jewish charities going on the lowest basis which it is possible to keep them going and by no means paying their total expenses but still asking them to pay part of their annual expenses out of their capital funds—the public we are appealing to, so that you see, must give us in addition to its annual regular recurrent subscriptions approximately \$2,000,000, the largest sum of money that we have raised in a deficit campaign.

Representatives of Jewry

Now you may ask me why the board vote of Federation was such a difficult situation. The answer is that we feel that we are the representatives of the Jewish community in philanthropic work here, we do not believe that the members of the largest Jewish community of the world wish us, as they do, to give up these institutions of hospitals and orphan asylums closed to the poor. We believe we carry a mandate from the public to give aid to the poor, to the heads of people who, in order that service would be homeless.

We have taken the great responsibility of raising this money on

ourselves because we have a firm and optimistic conviction that the Jewish public, when it understands this situation, will meet the needs of those who cannot take care of themselves and will give us this sum which is the smallest possible sum that we can recommend as that which is necessary to maintain the long tradition of the Jewish people in this city that they have never failed to take care of their own poor.

Rabbi Silver to Talk At Einstein Reception And Banquet Sunday

NEWARK, N. J., March 20.—Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland will be the principal speaker at the state reception and banquet which will be held in honor of Professor Albert Einstein here this Sunday.

At the afternoon reception in the Newark Armory Rabbi Silver will speak about the scientist, while at the dinner in the Mosque Ballroom he will talk on the cause for which the celebration had been arranged, the settlement of German Jews in Palestine. Rabbi Silver is making a special trip to Newark for the occasion.

Among the distinguished artists who will appear in Professor Einstein's honor will be Mins. Schumann-Heink, Oesep Gabriowitch and Giovanni Martinnelli.

More Sign C. C. N. Y. Boycott Petition

Five hundred signatures have been added by the Newark-Arch Conference of City College to its boycott petition, which asks college authorities to stop buying German-made goods. It was announced that as soon as one thousand students have signed the petition it would be forwarded to President Frederick B. Robinson. The student council resolution passed two weeks ago, was not sent to the Board of Higher Education.

N. Y. U. Appoints

"Twenty-seven teachers are among the new appointees to New York University yesterday. Twelve of fourteen instructors were titled and three were granted leaves of absence. Among those appointed to Bellevue Hospital Medical College were Bernard Freed and Abraham O. Tumen. Julius A. Kloterman, assistant professor of bacteriology, became associate professor; Milton B. Rosenblatt is advanced to clinical professor, and Joseph H. B. Shaffroff is now instructor in surgery."

Hadassah Unit Raises \$30,000 In Local Drive

**C. E. Russell Declares
Jews Have Right
to Zion**

More than 1,000 women present at the annual donor luncheon of the New York chapter of Hadassah, the national women's Zionist organization, held yesterday at the Hotel Waldorf-Astoria, heard Charles Edward Russell, president of the Pro-Palestine Federation, declare that "the world owes Palestine to the Jews." A sum of \$30,000 was raised during the Hadassah campaign, it was announced, and will be used for Hadassah health work in Palestine.

Mayor Fiorello H. LaGuardia addressed the women, explaining the problems confronting him in the municipal administration. He appealed to them to give "just a little bit of your help and cooperation in making New York City a happy city."

In his address, Mr. Russell declared, "I don't believe that if I had been born a Jew I would have had a more fervent desire to do the fruition of your ideals as to Palestine." Discussing the Jewish problem in Germany, he maintained that it is "on us to do and fold our hands and think that this cloud will pass. So long as there is a Jew left in Germany he is going to be persecuted and wronged. The only thing to do is to get them out."

"We must encourage and assist them to come out of the jungle

of Germany into the haven of Palestine," he concluded. Mr. Russell demanded the continuance of the boycott on German goods.

Other speakers at the luncheon were Mrs. David de Sola Pool, president of the New York chapter; Mrs. Abraham Liebowitz, Mrs. Herbert H. Lehman, who brought greetings from the Governor, and Edward Warburg, speaking on behalf of his mother, Mrs. Felix Warburg. Rabbi Milton Steinberg offered the invocation.

Among the guest artists present were Emanuel List, Inga Wank and Mrs. Alexander Bernadik. Officers of the chapter include Mrs. Herbert H. Lehman, Mrs. Rebekah Kohut, Mrs. Felix Warburg, Mrs. Abraham Liebowitz, Mrs. Nathan D. Perlman, Mrs. Louis I. Barst and Mrs. Kaufman Schlichter.

Student Role in Politics Discussed by Kotsching

Non-Jewish students have been powerful enough in Europe to cause revolutions and dictatorships, while Jewish students have been permitted no voice in politics, and practically no organization, said Dr. Walter Kotsching, head of the International Student Service at Geneva, who spoke on "Students in Politics in Europe" at Barnard College yesterday.

Illustrating the unrelenting conflict of those laboring under a "mistaken biological concept" against Jewish students and professors at the University of Vienna, the speaker described a police station which has been established in that institution for the protection of Jews.

Because the word kosher is on a shop window does not signify that the articles for sale in the shop are kosher.

Apparently a number of our co-religionists feel that any pure food products they purchase are satisfactory from their viewpoint, and undoubtedly they may be.

However, it would appear to be only fair to support manufacturers who produce foods in accordance with the Jewish Dietary laws. It helps to employ many of our co-religionists. As long as there are a large number of Jews who do care for kosher products, all should assist in this vital part of industry of Jewish life.

Jewish Agriculturist Tells How He Made Good

Sam Ocko, lecturing before the Jewish Agricultural Society's night school on Monday, described the success of his farming enterprise in New Jersey.

Ocko related the hardships he encountered before he realized success. He said that in 1919 he began farming on a small loan advanced by the Jewish Agricultural Society.

Gradually he increased his acreage, he said until this year, when he became owner of one of the greatest orchards in the East. He described hard work and experience gained on his parents' farm near Spring Valley, and early frugality as elements contributing to his success.

Plans Submitted For Enforcing Kosher Laws

Proposals Being Sent to Committee, Which Meets Soon

William Weiss, chairman of a special committee appointed by Aldermanic President Bernard S. Deutsch to devise means of enforcing the state kosher law, announced yesterday that copies of four plans were being sent to committee members.

"In a week or so," Weiss said, "we will meet again to try to select the most practical plan. In the interim all parties concerned will have ample time to consider each plan and choose the one most suited to the needs of the present situation."

The four plans under consideration are: one submitted by Dr. Nachman Eblin of the Kashruth Association, the group which has enforced the state kosher law during recent years; a plan drawn up by Dr. Moses Hyamson, former Acting Chief Rabbi of England; a plan conceived by Benjamin Koenigberg, a New York attorney acting independently of groups. The fourth plan will be submitted by Weiss.

Weiss proposed "my plan." Weiss said, "is drawn from the aggregate clauses of the other three. It includes a general statement of conditions now existing, the need for reform and creation of a special body to enforce the kosher law, and suggestions as to how a city-kashruth group should be organized." Remarking on the difficulty of securing unity of opinion among factions concerned with the enforcement of the kashruth law, Weiss observed that "the best we can hope for at present is an agreement among those concerned upon practical suggestions for the enforcement of the kosher law. It appears difficult to obtain an agreement in a short time which will unite in one body all groups which are interested in the supervision and enforcement of the kosher food laws, but we are optimistic."

Among the most pressing problems to be taken up when the committee reconvenes is that of whether the Department of Health or Department of Public Markets will enforce the kosher law.

The Bulletin's Day Book

Cutting the Cost of Sabbath Observance

We have just been talking with a young lady who once worked for the "directory game." She says the Jews are sofies under the kneading of high pressure salesmen, but through her we learn that many Jews contribute thousands of dollars yearly to unscrupulous racketeers trading in the name of religion.

Why Jewry presents a happy hunting ground for muling bands is not particularly interesting to us here, but how they expose themselves to the coercion of racketeers is a matter that should be undertaken for the benefit of those who prove to be personal suckers. No figures are available, but one authority on the "directory" racket reckons the income of promoters in New York City at more than a half million dollars annually—a half million dollars which could be given to worthy charities.

Few synagogues in the city have been immune to the operations of groups who seek to compile a directory or year book of respective congregations. The sanction of unanswering rabbis is first secured, "boller rooms" (rooms with a battery of telephones over which solicitors talk on the heat and blow off steam) are established, and all is in readiness for the advertising campaign. No doubt, you will be immune to the racket in church or synagogue directories, all jammed together in an ugly display and all of them too obnoxious to read.

Vocal piety is a requirement indispensable to those hoping to succeed in telephone solicitation. Reverent modesty combined with resistless perseverance and firmness must be incorporated in the total qualities of the appeal. Something between the mean and whine on the one hand and the blarney and the commanding bark of a drill sergeant.

A solicitation goes something like this: "Hello, Mr. Cohen, this is Mrs. Gold down at the synagogue. We are making up a directory for Rabbis Sound—directory of the congregations. Your Blank told us to be sure to call upon you to support this worthy cause with an advertisement for

the director; We would like so much money from you for an ad of such and such size, and may God bless you for your help. The entire congregation will read it and patronize your store. We'll send a man right over for the money."

When more persuasion is required the solicitor may add: "Judge Blank (who, incidentally, knows nothing of the director) will certainly repay the favor if ever he can do you a court favor." Or, if something of the nature of threats seems feasible, "I am sure that the entire congregation would be disappointed in not seeing your ad in the directory. You know, they are particularly careful to patronize those who support this good work."

It is miraculous how merchants contribute to this cause. Not only Jews, but businessmen of all sects give frequently, until on a hot day it hurts. They are literally sand-bagged into meeting the demands of the solicitors.

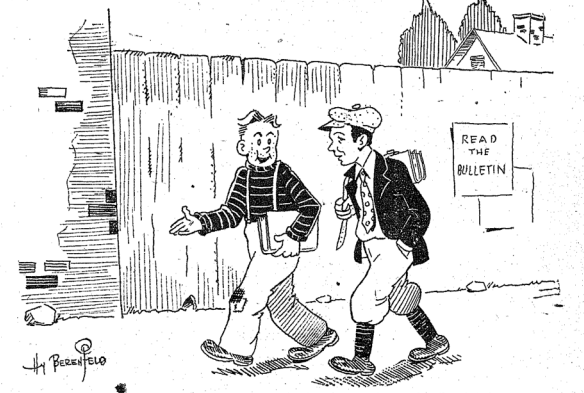
Few merchants ever risk the embarrassment of mentioning the modus operandi to the rabbi or prominent members of the congregation, whose names are mentioned as sponsors in the solicitation. But when they do, they meet with shocked surprise.

The rabbi usually agrees to publication of the directory when agents of small publishing companies offer him five hundred copies of the book free and a check for a small fee, about \$25, for his recommendation. He is never informed accurately as to how publishers make profit from the enterprises.

When the work is over, and it requires only a few days for all merchants within a radius of fifty miles to be contacted, the racket is to be approached, advertising receipts are found to aggregate \$2,000 or more.

Similar books are published—usually miserable looking affairs—for \$100. Solicitors receive fifteen percent of the contributions, collected, go ten per cent, and promoters take the rest. Frequently, it is said, the rabbi is fleeced out of his \$25.

A Chip Off the Old Block
The other night at the Vanderbilt Theatre a French farce of the sex variety started what may prove to be a short but not sweet run. It is called "Another Love," the work of Jacques Deval, and was received with a rather spiteful glee by the critics, who called it just "another one of those things." It concerns itself with the son of a libertine who, outraged by his daddy's conduct, successfully makes a play for the latest lady friend. This is considered very "hot stuff" for a French playwright but to an American audience it is all pretty hackneyed and nearly dull.

The Oppenheimer

Women Office Holders Feted At Pan-Hellenic

Five Jewesses Among Fourteen Honored by Congress

"We believe that the city's new workmen's compensation program will secure the best of medical care to the city's tired employees and eliminate political patronage from the choice of the physician and at the same time achieve substantial economies that are consistent under a clean government with good service," said Mrs. Justine Wise Tulin at a dinner given by the Pan-Hellenic Hotel last night for fourteen outstanding women office holders in the present city administration by the Women's City Club, the New York City League of Women Voters and the Exposition of Women's Arts and Industries.

Mrs. Tulin, assistant corporation counsel, was one of the five Jewesses honored. More than 200 people attended the dinner.

The general sentiment expressed by the women, each of whom declared the duties involved in carrying out her job, was an enthusiastic support of the present administration and its purposes of reform. Many also expressed the belief that women were as competent as men to fill official positions.

Mrs. Rose Miller, examiner in the office of the President of the Board of Aldermen, declared the humanitarian angle which the present administration is stressing. She described the graft in the asphalt markets which existed under Tammany as one of the reasons why the last administration was inefficient was because there were so few women in it. This was the opinion she expressed.

Equality in Public Office

The position of the woman in government was also described by Miss Pearl Bernstein, secretary of the Board of Aldermen. She said, "There is absolutely no reason why women who have the same training, experience and ability should not be accorded the same consideration for appointment to public office as men." Her work includes the preparation of the calendar for the Board of Estimate, following up on action of the Board, and supervision of the pension system.

Magistrate Anna Moskowitz and Mrs. Mary K. Simkovich, of the Housing authority, also addressed the group.

into every section of the country; and spreading propaganda for Hitlerism. "What is happening in Germany today ought to be sufficient warning to us," he admonished.

Representative Dickstein, explaining the purpose of the investigation, declared that it was not directed at individuals or any group of American citizens. He reviewed the activities of Heinz Spanknebel, one time leader of the American Nazi organization and now a fugitive from justice. He charged German boats with activities detrimental to the interests of the United States government, saying that evidence had been uncovered that these boats were smuggling ammunition and propagandists into this country.

Ships Bring Agents

"Every German ship brings in an average of 100 passengers who become engaged in pro-Nazi propaganda," he charged. "Money to support propaganda also is sent into this country from Germany."

Representative Albion opposed the resolution on the grounds that it would involve a far greater expenditure than the \$25,000 initial appropriation called for.

"This resolution is not going to stop the persecution of the Jews in Germany," he asserted. He expressed the fear that its passage by the House would cause diplomatic complications between the United States and "another country."

No Persecution

"There is no persecution of the Jews in the United States," Blanton declared, pointing out that there are Jews who hold some of the highest offices in the government.

"The resolution is a waste of public money," he roared.

Letter from R-representative Hamilton Fish Jr., of New York, was read by Representative Charles D. Millard, New York, in which the former expressed his approval of the resolution.

"There is no more room for Hitlerism in America that there is for Communism," Fish stated in his communication.

Representative Francis H. Shoemaker, of Minnesota, told the House he never did think that the highly educated Germany would go back to the days of the guillotine through a Hitler.

"The people of America are not in sympathy with the persecutions in Germany," he declared. Southern California Touched Southern California Touched by Representative Charles Kramer of that state. Kramer was a member of the preliminary investigation committee appointed by Dickstein in his capacity of chairman of the Immigration Committee.

tutions in the United States (about the time that Hitler, mainly Hitlerism, or paganism." He asserted that Hitlerism is leading directly to war and referred to Hitlerism as "equal and identical quantities."

Following the address of Mrs. Theresa Mayer Durlach, president and founder of World Peaceways, who had echoed the view that only by warring against all war can Hitlerism be struck a fatal blow. Dr. Wise took issue with her saying that the fight should be concentrated on Hitler. The fight for peace is secondary and incidental to the fight on Hitlerism, he insisted.

Other speakers at the luncheon including Professor John Dewey, who presided; Mrs. Estelle M. Sternberger, secretary of World Peaceways; and Miriam Beard Varga, daughter of Professor Charles A. Beard, voiced the concerted opinion that "the fight against Hitlerism is only beginning."

Mrs. Sternberger said that "the reason we are here is found in a comparison of Hitler's 'Mein Kampf' with the books of Dr. Dewey."

Dr. Dewey in an introductory address said that "Hitler has succeeded in buying off Poland, and France has bought yet again, and off because she does not regard with much respect the promises of Hitler made on paper."

Dr. Dewey spoke of the international munitions workers, who

he spoke in Nuremberg, where Hitler, Dr. Dewey, noted, and Semite, publishes Dr. Stuermer, most vicious of all the anti-Semite sheets. The Nazi party in Nuremberg has taken the lead in the advocacy of the boycott against the Jews. Last week thousands of leaflets and pamphlets were distributed in Nuremberg, the burden of whose line was, "Don't Buy From Jews."

Order Overruled

At the same time the chief of the Nazi Bavarian Labor Front overruled the order recently issued by the Middle Franco-German Labor Front, in the region of Nuremberg to the effect that Jews could not be leaders of economic enterprises and must appoint "Aryan" substitutes. He declared that the order had no legal validity. Under the Nazi regime the head of each business enterprise is the official leader for the enterprise with important powers.

This official action against Streicher, who is regarded as the most important leader of the Nazi boycott movement, is held to be a victory over the Nazi advocates of the boycott against the Jews, inspired by the revelations of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency on the concealment of the boycott, which the Jewish Telegraphic Agency first revealed and which was later published in the world press.

The United States which may be subversive to the country's form of government.

Since last spring the chairman of the Immigration Committee has conducted an unofficial investigation of Nazi propaganda activities and in a report presented at the opening of Congress revealed the results of the preliminary fact-finding inquiry.

The official investigation, Congressman Dickstein said, will seek to establish the findings of the earlier inquiry so that the proper legislative and legal action may be taken to halt the progress of the Nazi and similar movements here.

he declared, are the mainpring of war causes. He said he regrets the success of "German financiers who wield great power in Germany and who are encouraging war programs guided as peace programs." The speaker quoted an authority as having established beyond a doubt the existence of a pact of peace between Germany and Japan, and spoke with derision of the role of Hitler in condemning the peace. He assailed the Reich Chancellor for his "unscrupulous and ruthless methods."

Fascism vs. Capitalism

Mrs. Durlach's words were couched in no uncertain language. She said that Fascism is "really an enemy of capitalism, and the best way to fight Fascism is by organizing the capitalists." She declared the fact that the Nazis have set up "the battifield as a nursery," and pleaded that war in general and Fascism in particular be made the object of "economic war."

"The World Peaceways' president launched a verbal attack at the peaceed States Army which she said "burdens every man, woman and child in the United States with a twenty-five dollar tax." She said that whatever practices have sway in the Third Reich, "are to be found in the records of our last war, in the discipline and routine and equipment and manual of the American army."

With much emphasis she abored the "vast expenditures" made for munitions in this and other countries.

"I advocate teaching the people their power," declared Mrs. Durlach. "Teach them their buying power, and then teach them to crush the profit making munition factories."

Miss Beard enumerated the leaders of the Nazi administration in Germany and labeled them as "a bunch of hardened political criminals."

Among those present were Emil Lengyel, newspaper correspondent; Albert Brandt, writer on foreign affairs; I. A. Hirschman, founder of the Bamberger Musical School; James Waterman Wise, editor of Opinion and editor of the anti-Nazi Jewish World, copies of which were distributed among the guests.

The present rulers of Germany are camouflaging their war preparations behind deceptive words of peace. They are pleading poverty while spending huge amounts on armaments and conditions. The eyes of the world are being opened to the real menace of Nazism. Public opinion against Hitlerism is beginning to be crystallized in various lands. Though the Jews are not the only sufferers, they must do their full part unitedly in their own defense as well as in defense of civilization.
