A Clumsy Excuse

SOME time ago I commented on Mr. Lloyd George's recent article in which he praised Hitler and state that "there is an impression that the Jew hunt has been called off."

Mr. Lloyd George has received numerous letters of criticism from various people. Two of his answers have now been made public. In a letter to Mr. Isidore Wartski, of Bangor, he writes, in part, as follows:

"The cases you mention are certainly scandalous. When I get all the evidence, I will refer to the matter in my next article. I shall indeed be sorry if I have been misled as to there being an improvement in the condition of the Jewish population in Germany."

He also addressed a letter to Mr. Philip Guedalia, the famous author, saying:

"I am sorry to hear that there is no foundation for the reports that reached me that Hitler was toning down his attack on Israel. I was under the impression that it was that savage Goering who was responsible for most of these ferocities, and that Hitler was gradually fighting him down. If you have any evidence to the contrary, I wish you would let me have it. His, what I call, quote arrangements for the professions I do not expect him to modify. Having regard for his followers I am afraid that is more than I can expect. I was thinking rather of outrages and the active and cruel persecutions which marked the first outbreak."

As a statesman and a publicist, Mr. Lloyd George should have made sure of his facts before rushing into print with his unwarranted apology for Hitler. His explanation that he was under the impression that Goering and not Hitler was responsible for most of the ferocities is unworthy of the British statesman. As the leader and dictator of Nazi Germany, Hitler is responsible for all the outrages that are being perpetrated by his regime.

What further evidence does Mr. Lloyd George want? If he only followed the authentic reports on the German atrocities now being committed in one form or another and published in the leading newspapers of England, he could not have been ignorant of the shocking happenings in Hitlerland. Is it possible that Mr. Lloyd George was stirred to protest only by "outrages of the active and cruel persecutions which marked the first outbreak and that the cruel policy of vengeance and silent pogroms now methodically employed by the

Retail Fish Men Dictate Price Scale

Wholesalers Debate Reply to Passover Boycott Threat

Fish retailers, who have proclaimed a stringent boycott against the wholesale dealers in the trade because of allegedly exorbitant prices just preceding the Passover holiday, yesterday presented an ultimatum to the wholesalers in the form of a price scale which they demanded that the wholesalers accept.

Representatives of the wholesalers immediately went into conference to decide upon a course of action. The meeting, which was attended by about thirty representatives of the two groups was held in the office of the Ekspozitoe Fish Company, 29 Peck Slip.

The United Retail Fish Dealers Association of Greater New York threatened that unless the wholesalers agreed to a "fishless Passover" unless the wholesalers acceded to their demands for reasonable prices. About 700 retailers are members of the Association.

In the meanwhile a million and a half pounds of fish, worth approximately \$150,000, is tied up by the strike.

Sol Wolpew, vice president of the retailers, asserted that the wholesalers must prove their good faith. He declared that there was no consistency on the part of the wholesalers in the price scales, and that retailers never knew from day to day what the prices would be.

Stanley Osterman, counsel for the wholesalers, replied that the group he represented would not give in to the retailers, because the retailers' association might become too strong.

It is estimated that the wholesalers have lost \$50,000 during the strike.

Works Barred

Austria to Ban Books by Jews From Libraries

Decision Follows Report to Exclude 'Undesirable Authors'

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, March 27.—Books by Jewish authors will be banned from the Austrian libraries just as they were banished from the libraries of Germany, it was reported today by the Volksbildungsbeirat, official organ of the General Lower Austrian People's Education Societies.

The paper listed the works of Arthur Schnitzler, Jacob Wassermann, Stefan Zweig, Franz Werfel, Max Brod and Lion Feuchtwanger as among those of Jewish writers to be thrown out of the libraries of Austria.

This decision followed a report drawn up by a specially appointed committee "to exclude undesirable books and authors from Jewish libraries." The report was submitted to the municipality of Vienna.

One Killed, Another Suicide, Many Untold Torture in Gunzenhausen

Local Nazi Leaders Defy Hitler's Orders—Conduct Work Campaign Under Streicher, Arch Anti-Semite—Berlin Alarmed at Anti-Nazi Boycott Progress

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

PRAGUE, March 27.—New anti-Semitic disorders of a most serious nature have broken out in Gunzenhausen, Germany, according to authentic reports received here today. One Jew was so brutally tortured that he hanged himself in desperation. Another Jewish victim was found with four knife-wounds in his heart.

Despite the pogrom terror raging in the town, German authorities have failed to arrest a single one of the aggressors, it is learned, while eleven badly-wounded Jews have been taken in "protective custody" by the police.

Owing to the atmosphere of terror which reigns in the town, it was found impossible to obtain statements from Jewish residents.

(Gunzenhausen is in Bavaria, forty miles southwest of Nuremberg.)

Tel Aviv Bans Conference of Workers' Union

NUREMBERG, Germany, Mar. 27.—Propaganda for the spring employment campaign of the Nazis is being conducted in Nuremberg and all through the Franconian province along the lines laid down by Julius Streicher, Hitler anti-Semite and editor of the Nuremberg weekly, Der Stuermer, a survey by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency established today. Streicher will be remembered as the organizer and prime mover in the April 1 boycott on the Jews last year.

Streicher has been one of the influential Nazi leaders who have persisted in their demands for the complete boycotting of the Jews despite the more moderate stand of a wing of the Hitler cabinet.

Nazis Follow Streicher.

Tuberculosis Serum to Be Tested in Denver

Colorado Prisoners Volunteer To Try Remedy Developed By Dr. H. J. Corper

Preliminary arrangements for testing a tuberculous preventive serum on Colorado convict volunteers are detailed in a message received yesterday by Justice Samuel D. Levy of the Domestic Relations Court, from Dr. H. J. Corper, research director of the National Jewish Hospital in Denver, in whose laboratory the serum was developed. Justice Levy heads the New York committee of the hospital.

The new serum has been tried on animals and found successful. Now it has been made ready for tests on humans. It is not a cure for tuberculosis but is intended to organize normal persons against contracting the disease.

More than 800 prisoners in the Colorado state penitentiary have responded to Governor Ed. C. Johnson's call for volunteer subjects for experimentation. Twelve men will be selected from twenty-five tentative choices thus far made. It will be at least six months after the tests before anything definite is known, full results will not be known for years, Dr. Corper writes.

Rabbi Mandelbaum Leads Congregation in Chicago

Hitler Regime Is Weakening, Says Newman

Urges No Compromise That May Lessen Reich Boycott

(Special to the J.D.B.)
BOSTON, March 27.—The financial front of the Hitler regime is weakening, declared Rabbi Louis F. Newman of Congregation B'nai Shalom of New York, speaking at the Brotherhood of Temple Ohabei Shalom here this evening on the anniversary of the Madison Square Garden meeting last year.

The return of Ambassador Dodd to this country makes it clear that the German situation is being discussed at Washington," Rabbi Newman asserted. "Now is the time for all Americans who believe in fair play to make clear to the Government that they will tolerate no agreements with Germany which will undermine the counter-boycott against German 'made goods.' The 'sales-resistance' of purchasers in the department stores of this country and elsewhere ought to convince Mr. Roosevelt and Secretary Hull that there is no yielding on the part of the people in their opposition to Hitler."

"If Hitler eliminates the 'Aryan' clause," Dr. Newman continued, "if he halts the propaganda, both official and unofficial, against German Jewry, if he restores the office to their posts, and if he gives an ironclad guarantee that there will be no resumption of the anti-Jewish campaign, Jewish leaders will be obliged to reconsider their attitude. They are presidents for apologies to the Jewish race for slanders, and Hitler would do well to read them carefully, and to act upon them."

Hillel Foundation Changes Effectuated

One B'nai B'rith Group to Be Closed, Another to Be Opened

CINCINNATI, March 27.—One B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation will be closed, another opened, and Jewish student groups at nearby universities will be linked with Hillel work, it became known following a Chicago meeting of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation Commission.

It is at the University of West Virginia, where Jews number only about 100, that the foundation will be closed and moved to some Eastern or Southern university.

A full-time director will be named for the foundation at Northwestern University and an associate director is to be appointed for the University of Illinois which is now the center for national Hillel work. It was also decided at the meeting presided over by Alfred M. Cohen, head of B'nai B'rith, to develop a Jewish youth symposium, the results of which will be forwarded to Jewish groups in universities.

Dr. A. L. Sachar, national director of B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations, who actively directs the work at the University of Illinois, reported on his first year in office. He referred to the development of "defense technique" made necessary by spread of anti-Semitism.

Unscrupulous Misrepresent Non-Kosher Foods as Kosher

Kosher foods—those produced under rabbinical supervision—are in continuous demand by Jews who adhere to the observance of the traditional laws. Many Jewish families, while not observant in every respect, purchase kosher foods, as they maintain a kosher home. A great number of our Jewish people are not familiar with the requirements of kashruth, and are under the impression that any article displaying Hebrew lettering or the word "Kosher" is bona fide.

Unscrupulous manufacturers take advantage of this fact, misrepresenting products and utilizing meaningless Hebrew phrases, and so delude the people. They go so far as to induce reputable concerns to offer food products for sale which are mislabeled "Kosher for Passover." Our Food Information Department received a call for information as to cookies for sale at a group of stores. These were displayed as being "Kosher for Passover." Upon investigation it was learned that the manufacturers selling to these stores claim a rabbi is sometimes at the place of baking but his address or position is not known.

Misleading Signs
As to the rabbinical authority, an effort was made to get in touch with the rabbi in question, which proved unsuccessful. At a visit to one store of the group it was found that the cakes were displayed and two display signs in Hebrew lettering stated "Fresh French Cookies for the Holidays." Partly covering the cake boxes with a piece of glass, another display of non-kosher wafers and candies was shown. One of the men in charge was called and given to understand that the signs were misleading. He immediately removed the signs. At another store on the same street, the same variety of cookies were found with a display card stating in Hebrew, "Kosher for Pesach."

The proprietors of this group of stores and their managers can not be blamed—during this period of Passover—for trying to sell food products which they are told are kosher for Passover.

Assuming the products in question are kosher, the fact of selling them in the place where they are in actual contact with chometz,

Jewish Life Reviewed in Latest Cables and Letters

Reich Jewish Culture Body Will Expand

Plan Administrations in All Important Jewish Centers

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
BERLIN, March 17.—Plans for expansion of the work of the Jewish Culture League, headed by Dr. Kurt Singer, to embrace all Jewish cultural units in the country, were explained by Hans Wilhelm Steinberg, musical director of the League, at a gathering of press representatives here.

"In addition to the central administration in Berlin," he said, "administrations will be set up in all important Jewish centers. The executive of the League will have ten to twelve members who are to include representatives of the Jewish communities, a group of promoters consisting of representatives of the Jewish communities and collaborators in special branches of the work."

The plans will require the Jewish citizenry of Frankfurt to work in conjunction with Cologne. "An exchange system of artists is planned, and the League is hoping to have leading artists and actors perform. Training studios and courses for young people will be introduced."

Weizmann Tells of Plans in Palestine

Eager to Work at New Sieff Research Institute, He Says

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
—HAIFA, March 18.—In a special interview to "Haaretz," Haifa daily, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, who received a warm ovation when landing from the Royal Mail steamer, stated that his principal purpose in coming to Palestine was to work at the new Daniel Chaim Sieff Research Institute at Rehoboth, of which he is the head. Research is to be conducted there in Biological and Physical Chemistry, Pharmacology, and in subjects connected with citrus-growing, tobacco cultivation and silk production. The official opening of the Institute is on April 8. He stated that Daniel Sieff is donating £20,000 for the purpose.

Inspection of the arrangements made for settlement of German Jewish immigrants, supervised by Dr. Arthur Ruppin, is another of the purposes of his visit. Palestine offers a great opportunity for such settlement,—in fact, it is pre-eminent over other countries proposed, and he believes that it is possible to settle 10,000 German Jews a year for a number of years.

Dr. Weizmann refused to touch on internal Zionist affairs in his conversation, saying that he had been dealing lately exclusively with matters of German Jewish settlement. He will be in New York at the beginning of May in connection with this activity, he said.

Free Transit Between Syria, Palestine Arranged

Adventurous Tourists Crowd Tel Aviv for Purim Carnival

But Excessive Gaiety Is Frowned Upon by Followers of Agudath Israel; Street Procession Satirizes Hitler

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

Tel Aviv, March 4.—Hiring back seats of taxi-cabs in garages at fifty cents for a night's lodging—

Sleeping in huge freight crates put up as garages by German Jewish newcomers—

Standing in lines two deep to get a glass of orange juice at five times the usual price—

Spending eight hours in the Tel Aviv-Jerusalem train on a journey usually taking three hours—

Such were some of the adventures of those people who came down to see the Purim Carnival this year, only to be scoffed at by their friends upon their return to their native haunts.

It is not generally known that the Ashkenazic pre-war community of Jerusalem—the followers of the Agudath Israel—had pronounced a "cherem," excommunication, on the city of Tel Aviv during the Purim festivities, forbidding ultra-orthodox Jews to visit the city because the holy festival of Purim was being celebrated with too much gaiety. The street carnival was particularly denounced by Chief Rabbi Dushinsky's adherents.

Hitler Boulevard

Some interesting figures were featured in the street procession on Thursday afternoon, March 1, depicting in satire the political and current topics of the day. Hitler was the chief target for mockery, the largest figure being a huge creature seated on a dragon of three heads, painted red with a huge swastika. In the pictorial representation there were figures of Jewish intellectuals, guarded by Nazi brown-shirted bullies in concentration camps. Scattered through the parade were figures of books, bearing names of Sigmund Freud, Karl Marx, Einstein, Remarque, Zweig, Ludwig, Wasserman, and other banned German writers. The dragon was growling the whole time.

"American Jewry," in the parade of the Twelve Tribes of Israel, then and now, was represented as a massive "All-Rightnik" Yankee Jew, standing on a heap of golden coins flowing into collection-boxes, himself wearing a hat and showing the empty linings of his pockets. Behind him was the representation of a crashing skyscraper, with a falling dollar sign, symbolizing the financial situation among American Jews today.

Assaulting of Western Jewry was depicted in a huge figure of a monocled, bespattered, frock-coated "gentleman," under which was pictured a smart dance in progress in a luxurious hall and a pork and champagne party.

The blue-and-white Mad Macabee band, marching behind the German dragon, was a high spot of the parade, evoking cheers. Of local interest was the large blue cow, named Palestine, being milked into pails transferred to a large can labelled "The British Treasury."

"Boycott German Products" was the name of a float on which a shop with sunshaded windows was shown. "Free Immigration" was a doorway of bronzed and sturdy Palestinian children, native born, and wearing national molodies. Finally a beautiful Queen Esther rode a camel and brought forth enthusiastic plaudits.

There was a special broadcast concert by the Tel Aviv experimental wireless station, for which amplifiers had been erected in the city, and was dedicated to the Levant Fair, Purim, and Tel Aviv's Quarter-of-a-Century anniversary.

Ramat-Gan Acquires New Shoe Factory

Tell Story of Jewish Youth's Sacrifice In Polar Regions

A Good Recipe

Ernest Bloch is a great composer. He is now the foremost Jewish composer in the world. When Mr. Bloch speaks on music, he speaks with authority. However he says on that subject is extremely interesting and illuminating. But Mr. Bloch makes the mistake of many celebrities who discuss their work every subject under the sun merely because they attained fame as masters in their own field. Mr. Bloch, who has views on Hitler and Hitlerism, he not only reveals his own limited knowledge of what is happening in Germany, but he renders a disservice to the cause of all right-thinking people who are combating the Nazi menace.

Mr. Bloch is quoted in The New York Times saying:

"The phenomenon of Germany is bigger than the treatment of the Jews. A movement as profound as the Lutheran Reformation, and even more so, I greatly respect Hitler's sincerity. He believes wholly and disinterestedly in what he is doing. He is a fanatic, if you will, on fire with his cause, and he is not an opportunist making political capital. I do not think he is right. But to label him and his movement anti-Jewish is a gross error. The movement goes much further back; its Jewish aspect is discernible in H. S. Chamberlain's book, 'The Foundations of the Nineteenth Century.' Great books like the movements of the world. Chamberlain's work, with its terrible anti-Semitism, has had an immense, unrecognized influence on the rise of the nationalistic movement crystallizing in Fascism today, just as Marx's 'Das Kapital' has had on the movement of one time—Communism."

There is no doubt that Chamberlain's book, bristling with distortions of facts and vicious anti-Semitism, served as one of the pillars of Hitlerism and Nazism. "The Protocols of the Wise Men of Zion" formed another pillar of Hitlerism. To speak of Chamberlain's book as a great work is just as absurd as to speak of "The Protocols" as an authentic work.

When one of the interviewers asked Mr. Bloch what the functions of a creative artist should be in this experimental age, the great composer replied:

"To make love and create beautiful works. Not only artists, but every one should do this in this experimental age, the great composer said. The artist should do their work finely, beautifully, for its own sake. That would save many of our problems. People depend too much on hypotheses that they don't understand—Freud or Communism or technocracy." The great Jewish musician would follow his own splendid racial

Libraries of German Books Being Formed

Literature Condemned by Nazis Will Be in Collections

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, March 27.—A provisional committee met last night in the home of Lady Asquith to discuss plans for a movement for the establishment of libraries of German books condemned to flames in the Reich by Nazis.

Prince Hubertus von Loewenstein, author, who was among the present committee members, collecting and publishing of books by German refugees in Paris at London and suggested the extension of this plan to New York.

Others named included Lord Marley, the Labor peer, who recently returned from a tour of the United States; Louis Golding, noted British Jewish novelist; and J. B. S. Haldane and Ellen Wilkinson, British journalists.

Dr. Kantarowicz, secretary of the new German Library in Paris, reported that emigrants from the Reich had collected valuable material, which is now being held in hundreds of small archives throughout Europe. These collections, representing over two hundred thousand documents, will be assembled at the Paris library, he declared, and will be available soon to scientists and men of letters.

Premises have been taken in Paris, to accommodate 15,000 volumes of cultural works by Germans from the eighteenth century to the present day. The library will be opened on May 10.
