Retail Unit, Employees Union Propose License Cards for Merchants

(Jamish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, April 8 .- The German Central Retail Organization and the employees union of the retail trade today jointly addressed a memorandum to Minister of Economics Dr. Kurt Schmitt asking

all retailers beginning July 1. Jewish commercial circles are alarmed at the move, seeing in it the possibility of the introduction of further discriminations against Jews in trade.

Previous experience with the working of Nazi laws has shown that where power is placed in the hands of Nazi officials to decide upon qualifications for licenses the Jews invariably suffer.

To 'Purify' Nobility

BERLIN, April 8.—The purification of the German nobility, which was begun in the fall of 1933, will be energetically pursued until "not even a single drop of Jew blood runs in the veins of the German nobles," Lieut. Colonel von Bogen, administrator of the German Nobles Association, announced today in the Deutsche Zeitung.

He declared that the German nobility does not want "nobles who are descendants of Shylock."

Like all other groups in Germany, the German Nobles Associa-tion was coordinated after the adton was coordinated after the advent of the Hitlerites. Colonel von Bogen was appointed administrator and the "Aryan clause" was at once applied in the most brutal manner. Nobles with Jewish blood were ousted from the association others with a Jewish parent still living were informed that they must disown them if they wanted

to remain on the register of nobles.

White Slavery Causes Anxiety In East Europe

Jewish Ass'n Reports to League Body on Its Work

GENEVA, April 8.—Conditions existing in Central and Eastern Europe last year and which are continuing to exist are causing great anxiety regarding white slave traffic conditions, the Jewish Association for the Protection of Jewish Girls and Women reported to the permanent committee on Traffic in White Slaves, which is meeting here today. The committee is part of the machinery set up by the League of Nations to deal with the evil.

The need for employment causes many adolescents to leave their homes and go abroad, where poverty and helplessness bring many erty and nepleasuess bring many evils, particularly sexual, and ex-pose young people to temptations which they would normally disdain, the report pointed out.

"Yet we may thankfully state that these evils have as yet not arisen in the Jewish communities where the crisis is great and our intervention has been even less necessary than in more normal times," the Jewish Association renormal

Thorough Investigation Se As outlined recently by Repre-sentative Dickstein, the investigatand the Dickstein, the investigating committee is to seek three primary objectives: "First, ascertain the facts about methods of introduction into this country of destruction into this country description of the countries; second, ascertain facts about organizations in this country that organizations in this country that seem to be cooperating to spread this alien propaganda through their membership in this country; third, study and recommend to the House appropriate legislation which may correct existing facts and tend to prevent the recurrence of a similar condition in the future.

Appointment of the committee is the result of passage on March of a resolution introduced by Representative Dickstein, who a few months ago headed a sub-committee of the Committee on Immigration and Naturalization in the conduct of an informal and unofficial investigation of propaganda activities directed from abroad. This unofficial investigation brought to light sufficient in-formation to warrant the authorization of an official congressional investigation.

PREACHED IN CITY PULPITS

Discussing the recent film, "The House of Rothschild," Rabbi Louis I Newman, speaking at the Con-gregation Rodeph Sholom, 7 West Eighty-third, asserted that the prophets and rabbis more truly represent the Jewish people than do the bankers and financiers.

"However well-intentioned cer-tain plays and books may be," Rabbi Newman continued, "they present a picture of the Jew seen through Gentile eyes, and unconsciously the hoary myths regarding the Jewish people are perpetuated. 'The House of Rothschild' has many commendable features, but it serves chiefly to solidify the Gentile belief that Jews are money-lenders, resting their trust on the power of gold. Nothing could be farther from the truth. Sigmund Freud, Albert Einstein, Jacob Epstein, Louis Brandeis, Stephen Wise and Chaim Nachman Bialik are more representative of the Jewish people than the bank-ers, manufacturers, department store owners and others who are thought of as typical Jews by the non-Jewish world. The Rothschild family, as well as other banking families, who happen to be Jews, deserve much commendation, but It is a mistake for Gentile audi-ences to consider them the archetype for other Jews.'

The 'Banking Princes'
The hope of the Jewish masses lies in their own will and courage rather than in the financiers rep-resented in the "House of Roth-schild," declared James Waterman Wise, editor of Opinion, at the Free Synagogue Carnegie Hall,

yesterday morning.

"Despite such occasional gestures as the Rothschilds' insistence emancipation for their ghetto brothers as the price of financial support to the allied governments against Napoleon," Mr. Wise said, "the overwhelming mass of evidence proves that the poverty-stricken Jewish masses of yester-stricken Jewish masses of yesterday, as of today, could hope for little beyond an occasional dole from those who, like the Roth-schilds, had amassed great wealth. For the Jewish people, which is constantly being driven deeper into the chasm of economic despair, to put its trust in banking princes is but its trust in banking princes is absurd as for the Gentile masses to confuse the money power and the monied interests with the handful of Jews who happen to

play an insignificant part therein.
"What comfort, for example, "What comfort, for example, can the 600,000 Jews of Germany take from the fact that while they are racially spurned, economically despoiled, and humanly degraded by Nazism, a handful of Jewish bankers and industrialists have gone unhurt? So long as an economic system endures under which it is well for the House of Roth-schild, so long will it be ill for the House of Israel. The real enemies of German Jewry are those inter-racial capitalist interests which have made Hitlerism and all its works not only possible but inevitable. The real hope of the Jewish masses—as of the masses of all races and nations lies not in the House of Rothschild or of Morgan, or Warburg or of Rockefeller, but in their own will and courage to emancipate them-

A Plea Against Hitler Stating that "The House of Rothschild" is "almost a plea against Hitler without mentioning his name," Rabbi Sidney S. Tede-sche, at the Union Temple, Brookiyn, compared the plight of the German Jews today with that of the European Jews during the Napoleonic era.

He expressed his belief that no Rothschild will liberate Jews of today "It is not the Rothschilds with their millions who will be the salvation of the Jews," Rabbi Tedesche declared. but the people themselves who by "but the people themselves who by their example and by their manner of living will tend to shame the world so that they will no longer use the Jew as a convenient scape. goat for the world's ills. Man will yet learn to walk the world with dignity."

Warns Against Fascism

Americans must act today to defeat the movement toward Fascism in this country, warned Rabbi Joseph Zeitlin at the Temple Ansche Chesed, West End avenue and 100th street.

"There is a clever adage, 'If youth but would and age but could,' which vividly characterizes could, which vividly characterizes human nature," he said. "People are always guilty of the evil of postponement. We are inclined to glorify the past and the future but we are ever forgetting the present. Procrastination has permitted the germ of evil to grow to tremendous proportions. Many malicious movements here and in foreign countries might have been averted, had we but eradicated their nefarious effects in their inception. We as Americans dare not allow the Silver Shirts or any such bigoted groups to exist. must not delay in eliminating them completely. Now is the time to act if we would avoid the stains that besmirch the honor of certain 'civilized nations' in Europe." Inner Vision Necessary

Speaking on the subject, "Sight and Vision," Rabbi Israel Gold-stein declared before Congregation B'nai Jeshurun, Eighty eighth street west of Broadway:

"Most people go through life with closed eyes, possessing eye-sight that lacks inner vision, which is the ability to see more than meets the visible eye. "We need spiritual vision in or-

der to see the beauty of goodness

and wrong, to catch a glimpse of the eternal verities, to discover the reality of the invisible forces of life, and to perceive the Great Invisible---God.

"We need social vision to appreciate our duties toward our fellowmen, looking upon life not as a narrow selfish experience, but as an opportunity to share with others the precious boon of fellowship. We need social vision to sympathize with the sufferings of others. We need social vision to recognize the injustices of our society and to strive to cure

Jewish Question Attracted Him During Student Days in Berlin

Wickham Stood, former corres-pondent of the London Times at Berlin, Rome and Vienna, and finally its editor, explains the true nature of Hitlerism and to what extent it may be a menace to peace in his book, "Hitler, Whence and Whither?"

A series of articles, of which this is the first, will be published daily from the chapter, "Germanism and Jewry."

By Wickham Steed The relations between Germanism and Jewry need to be exam-ined from a much wider angle of vision than that of Hitlerism, on the one hand, and of anti-Hilter-ism, on the other. No man, how-ever impartial he may think himself, can hope to escape the charge of being biased if he attempts to survey a subject so vast and so intricate. It may therefore be well if I say how I came to study it and what warrant I have to speak of it at all.

of it at all.

Broadly, this warrant is derived from some forty years' continuous observation of the relations between Germans and Jews in several countries and under conditions not unfavorable to the formation in my twenty-second year, I went to Berlin University I did not realize that there might be a Ger-man-Jewish or, indeed, a Jewish problem. Jews I had met, though lithout attaching more signifi-cance to their physical and mental characteristics than to those of other territy. But it is the winter and other people, But in the winter and spring of 1892-93 I attended many political meetings in Berlin — So-bialist, Liberal, Conservative, and others—mainly, I confess, because I wished to accustom my ear to the German language loudly spoken the German language loundy spoken in public. Among these meetings was one organized by the famous, not to say notorlous, Court Chaplain Stocker, who attracted large audiences by the vigor of his diatribes against the Jews and by his belief that in Jews and by his chapter of the same of the sam obvious belief that in denouncing opvious benef that in denouncing them, he was acting as his hero. Martin Luther, would have acted; and he always ended by demanding that they should be bundled off to Palestine and leave the German people in peace.

Chaplain Denounces Jews So unbecoming in a Christian pastor did these fulminations seem that I called upon Court Chaplain Stocker to put what he doubtless thought were impertment ques-tions. I found him sitting below a bust of Martin Luther and posing so as to bring out the facial re-emblance between him and the hief parent of the German Reformation. He treated me not only to a private denunciation of the Jews, but to an indignant harangue against England, a Jew-ridden country, unconsciously enslaved to country, unconsciously enslaved to Jewish finance, enslaved to such an extent that he, Court Chaplain Stocker, had been prevented from dring any large hall in London or an anti-Jewish meeting. As I eft the reverend gentleman I renember wondering whether his news upon Jewry in Germany ould be altogether sound, seeing hat his views upon England were sed upon what struck me as a ghtly inadequate data. A fierce agitation presently arose over the question of his guilt. Jewish organ-izations throughout the world took up and supported their co-religionist's case. In the long run, how-ever, the case was won and the ever, the case was won and the innocence of Dreyfus established less by this Jewish support than by the moral heroism of French-mon like Emile Zola, Colonel Picquart, Jaures, Anatole France and many others. Thanks to their ef-forts enough evidence was obtained to warrant a revision of the Dreyfus trial by a military court at Rennes in 1899; and though the court, influenced by the idea that the honor of the army was at stake, refused to acquit Dreyfus, the agitation went on in a milder form until he was "amnestied" and, at the beginning of the Great War, reinstated in the army.



A month before a tournament starts, Sidney, who is an insurance salesman living in the Bronz (which must be quite a grind in itself), begins the arduous and monotonous routine to which he attributes his excellence on the table courts of America.

He retires each night at the unseemly hour of ten, sleeps alone, and touches not the filthy weed nor the jocund fruit of the grape. He rises early and after an ice cold needle shower and a brisk rub-down, sprints for the subway and a seat. It is on this jaunt downtown that Sidney devises new strategems which he will use to outplay his rivals.

But sweet are the uses of ad-versity. Already this gallant lad has defeated J. Kriegel in the national table tennis tournament being held at the Hotel Astor. This match was terrific and nerve-wracking to watch. It kept the spectators in a frenzied state of delirious excitement from the first



And no wonder. A recent survey shows that there are at least eight differently shirted groups on the isle at present. They all have one thing in common -- mortal hatred of each other.

Four of the groups are Fascist. Two wear black shirts, one blue, and the fourth grey. Sir Oswald Mosley, called the founder of British force. ish fascism, is leader of the Brit-ish Fascist Union, largest and wealthiest of the groups of this Mosley's followers wear black shirts, black caps and black belts. They want a corporate state, a national council and a senate. For propaganda purposes they main-tain five bulletproof armored cars in which the proselytizing mem-bers are safe from flying pop-bottles and similar missiles. There are about 18,000 British Fascist Unionists.

The second black-shirt group is that established by Arnold Leese, who insists that his comrades were wearing the black haberdashery when Sir Oswald was still a social democrat plotting the ruin of the empire. Mr. Leese's outfit, the Imperial Fascist League, is decidedly anti-Semitic. There are some 10,-000 Imperial Fascists. The Fascists of Kensington we

They are against Fascist state. They claim a membership of 400,000. The official count gives them 10,000. They admit financial difficulties. The members of the fourth Fas-

The Dick-stein committee already has brought to light that "a large fund set aside by the official German government is being used in ad-vocating abroad, in America and elsewhere, the principles of a Na-tional Socialist Party of Germany, gopularly known as 'Nazi' princi-ples." Other facts to be proved definitely relate to methods of conducting the propaganda activities in this country

Representative Dickstein has charged that Nazi chieftains Germany have in the IInited States their own system of secret police for the purpose of intimidating persons in this country, who have relatives in Germany through fear of bodily harm to these relatives, to join and cooperate with organi-zations established in the United States to promote the Nazi ideas of government.

One of the main efforts of the McCormack committee will be to uncover definitely the activities of such organizations as the Silver Shirts, Order of '76, the Crusaders of Economic Liberty and the Friends of New Germany.

It has been indicated that the committee will call Representative Louis T. McFadden of Pennsylvania. for an explanation of reports that he is allied with the Silver Shirts. This fact became known after Federal agents had under investigation the alleged dis-semination of a purported Con-gressional address by the Pennsylgressional address by the rennsys-vanian attacking international fewish bankers.
