Anti-Jewish Bedfellows

This week's issue of Today, containing the second installment of a series of articles entitled "Hitlerism Invades America," has a reproduction of a letter signed by the "Editorial Adjutant of Silver Shirts of America" which reveals one of the sources of the "valuable information" supplied to the "Silver Shirts."

The letter contains the following paragraph: "Please, get in touch with my friend, General P. S. Imadade, 61 East 129th Street, N.Y.C. He is one of our members . . . A former Imperial Russian General, he is now doing 'little jobs' and is financially rather incapacitated. But he is the Head of the Second North Section of the All Russian Committee, consisting of former Imperial Russian Officers, and is able to be of real help to us in our Work. He is supplying us now valuable information from Paris about Soviet Russian developments."

As you know, friend Melman, it is now editor of the "Russia's Gazette" and very anxious to get an English Edition in his Russian plant. May be it would be advisable to consider the propositions with your men and me."

It is the same old story. People of the type that introduced the "Protocols of the Wise Men of Zion" here and abroad, are now supplying "valuable information" and helping in the "Work" of the Silver Shirts and other Nazified anti-Jewish organizations. They are the "experts" to the "Silver Shirts" and they furnish the necessary ammunition for the anti-Semitic campaign.

According to this letter, the Imperial Russian General is supplying the Silver Shirts "with valuable information from Paris about Soviet Russian developments." To the "Silver Shirts" and to the Imperial Russian officers Soviet Russian developments mean Jewish developments. These "experts" are trying to make the world believe that the "Work" of the Soviets in Russia is a fulfillment of the so-called "Protocols of the Wise Men of Zion." The "Imperial Russian Officers," seeking employment, are now selling their "expert" counsel to the Silver Shirts and their "valuable information" as they sold it immediately after the Russian revolution to anti-Jewish organizations in various lands. It did not matter to them whether it was the Ku Klux Klan, or the Dearborn Independent, or the German anti-Semites, as long as they were paid for their "expert" testimony. Now it is the "Silver Shirts" and the "Imperial Russian Officers" who are selling their "information."

What I wrote about the discreditors of the "Protocols of the Wise Men of Zion" is just as today today. The same characters are seeking to discredit the Jews for revenue only. They

Reich Groups Plan Further Curb on Jews

Retail Unit, Employees Union Propose License Cards for Merchants

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN, April 8.—The German Central Retail Organization and the employees union of the retail trade today jointly addressed a memorandum to Minister of Economics Dr. Kurt Schmeltz asking him to introduce license cards for all retailers beginning July 1.

Jewish commercial circles are alarmed at the move, seeing in it the possibility of the introduction of further discriminations against Jewish trade.

Previous experience with the working of Nazi laws has shown that where power is placed in the hands of Nazi officials to decide upon qualifications for licenses the Jews invariably suffer.

To Purify Nobility

BERLIN, April 8.—The purification of the German nobility, which was begun in the fall of 1933, will be energetically pursued until "not even a single drop of Jew blood runs in the veins of the German nobles," Lieut. Colonel von Bogen, administrator of the German Nobles Association, announced today in the Deutsche Zeitung.

He declared that the German nobility does not want "nobles who are descendants of Shylocks."

Like all other groups in Germany, the German Nobles Association was coordinated after the advent of the Hitlerites. Colonel von Bogen was appointed administrator and the "Aryan clause" was at once applied in the most brutal manner. Nobles with Jewish blood were ousted from the association and others with a Jewish parent still living were informed that they must disown them if they wanted to remain on the register of nobles.

Prior to the War many of the impoverished German nobles married wealthy Jewish wives.

5,000 East Siders Hear Mayor Condemn City's Fire Traps

More than 5,000 residents of the lower East Side, nearly all Jewish, gathered yesterday afternoon in Hamilton Fish Park on East Houston Street to hear a group of speakers, including Mayor La Guardia and B. C. Vlodeck, member of the New York City Housing Authority, denounce old-law tenement houses as dangerous fire traps and demanded their immediate replacement with low-cost modern housing.

Mayor La Guardia, who was introduced by Harry Schlaich, chairman of the meeting, declared that he was determined to have vacated all old-law tenement houses that were fire traps and that no amount of opposition would deter him. He said there was great opposition to his housing plans and that selfish interests were involved. He disclaimed any original in proposing the plans and said he was sur-

Frick Pays Mysterious Visit to Palestine

JERUSALEM, April 8.—After a mysterious two-day visit to Palestine, Dr. Wilhelm Frick, Nazi Minister of the Interior, left Palestine for Germany. No reason was assigned for his sudden and mysterious visit to the Holy Land. During his stay in Palestine Dr. Frick was guarded by specially assigned members of the Palestine police force.

White Slavery Causes Anxiety In East Europe

Jewish Ass'n Reports to League Body on Its Work

GENEVA, April 8.—Conditions existing in Central and Eastern Europe last year and which are continuing to exist are causing great anxiety among Jewish social workers. The Jewish Association for the Protection of Jewish Girls and Women reported to the permanent committee on Traffic in White Slaves, which is meeting here today. The committee is part of the machinery set up by the League of Nations to deal with the evil.

The need for employment causes many adolescents to leave their homes and go abroad, where poverty and helplessness bring many evils, particularly sexual, and expose young people to temptations which they would normally disdain, the report pointed out.

"Yet we may thankfully state that these evils have as yet not arisen in the Jewish communities where the crisis is great and our intervention has been even less necessary than in more normal times," the Jewish Association reported.

British Fascists Refused Hall For Meeting

Call Jews 'Undesirable'; Papers Commend Management

LONDON, April 8.—When a group of Imperial Fascists, who had hired a hall at Potters Bar, near London, distributed handbills announcing that "Jews and other undesirables would not be admitted" to their meeting, the management of the hall returned the money paid for the hall rental and refused to permit the meeting to be held.

Latvia Reports Yiddish Writer

Tacharny, Refugee Journalist, Charged With Disseminating False News About Country

RIGA, April 8.—Daniel Tacharny, Yiddish journalist who has been here since his expulsion from Germany last year, was hurriedly deported yesterday on the charge of having disseminated false news about Latvia.

Tacharny was escorted to the Lithuanian frontier by police. He will go to Paris.

It is believed that the expulsion of Tacharny marks the consummation of an anti-Semitic campaign conducted against him with the aid of Latvia, a Latvian anti-Jewish publication.

Seeks Thorough Search of Subversive Propaganda in U. S.

(Special to the J.T.B.)
WASHINGTON, April 8.—The House Committee chosen by Speaker Rainey last Thursday to conduct a thorough investigation of propaganda subversive to the interests of the United States, disseminated by Nazi agents, sympathizers and the Fascist element in this country, is expected to hold its first meeting Tuesday. Representative John W. McCormack of Massachusetts leads the probe body, which was sponsored by Representative Dickstein of New York.

Representative McCormack contacted the other members of his committee right after Speaker Rainey had announced their names. They are Representative Samuel Dickstein of New York, chairman of the Committee on Immigration and Naturalization; Representative Carl M. Weldman of Michigan, Representative Charles Kramer of California, Representative Thomas A. Jenkins of Ohio, Representative Will Taylor of Tennessee and Representative U. S. Guyer of Kansas.

Through investigation sought An outlined recently by Representative Dickstein, the investigating committee is to seek three primary objectives: "First, ascertain the facts about methods of introduction into this country of destructive, subversive propaganda originating from foreign countries; second, ascertain facts about organizations in this country that seem to be cooperating to spread the alien propaganda through their membership in this country; third, study and recommend to the House appropriate legislation to deal with a serious situation and tend to prevent the recurrence of a similar condition in the future."

Appointment of the committee is the result of passage of March 20 of a resolution introduced by Representative Dickstein, who a few months ago headed a subcommittee of the Committee on Immigration and Naturalization in the effect of an informal and unofficial investigation of propaganda activities directed from abroad. This unofficial investigation was conducted by the committee in information to warrant the authorization of an official congressional investigation.

Steed Weighs Reich Jewish Problem

Must Examine Relationship Between Them From Wide Angle, He Writes

Jewish Question Attracted Him During Student Days in Berlin

Wickham Steed, former correspondent of the London Times at Berlin, Rome and Vienna, and finally its editor, explains the true nature of Hitlerism and to what extent it may be a menace to peace in his book, "Hitler, Whence and Whither?"

A series of articles, of which this is the first, will be published daily from the chapter, "Germanism and Jewry."

The relations between Germanism and Jewry need to be examined from a much wider angle of vision than that of Hitlerism, on the one hand, and of anti-Hitlerism, on the other. No man, however impartial he may think himself, can hope to escape the charge of being biased if he attempts to survey a subject so vast and so intricate. It may therefore be well if I say how I came to study it and what warrant I have to speak of it at all.

Originally, this warrant is derived from some forty years' continuous observation of the relations between Germans and Jews in several countries and under conditions so unfavorable to the former as to be a considered judgment. When, in my twenty-second year, I went to Berlin University I did not realize that this might be a German-Jewish or, indeed, a Jewish problem. Jews I had met, though without attaching more significance to their physical and mental characteristics than to those of other people. But in the winter and spring of 1892-93 I attended many political meetings in Berlin—Socialist, Liberal, Conservative, and others—so many and so intense, because I wished to acquaint my ear to the German language loudly spoken in public. Among these meetings was one organized by the famous, not to say notorious, Court Chaplain Stocker, who attracted large audiences by the vigor of his diatribes against the Jews and by his obvious reluctance to those of them, he was acting as his hero, Martin Luther, would have acted; and he always ended by demanding that they should be huddled off to Palestine and leave the German people in peace.

Chaplain Denounces Jews
So unbecoming in a Christian pastor did these denunciations seem that I called upon Court Chaplain Stocker to put what he doubtless thought were impertinent questions. I found him sitting below the bust of Martin Luther and posing so as to bring out the facial resemblance between him and the chief parent of the German Reformation. He treated me only to a private denunciation of the Jews, but to an indignant harangue against England, a Jew-ridden country, unconsciously enslaved to Jewish finance, enslaved to such an extent that he, Court Chaplain Stocker, had been prevented from hiring any large hall in London for an anti-Jewish meeting. As I left the reverend gentleman I remember wondering whether his views upon Jewry in Germany could be altogether sound, seeing that his views upon England were based upon what struck me as a pretty inadequate data.

Still, Court Chaplain Stocker was by no means alone. A daily anti-Semitic paper, the Staatsbürger Zeitung, was published in Berlin at that time and was widely read. Even the Kreuz Zeitung, the organ of true-blue Prussian evan-

gelical Conservatism, had a strong anti-Jewish flavor; and an agitator named Ahlwardt, whose language might have served as a model for that of Herr Hitler, was writing scurrilous pamphlets and speaking to crowded meetings against the Jews and their misdeeds. Ahlwardt even got himself elected to the Reichstag on the strength of his denunciations. These circumstances induced me to look into the German-Jewish question more seriously and to seek enlightenment from Jewish and non-Jewish friends.

Anti-Semitism Is Anti-Capitalism
Among others I approached the Jewish treasurer of the German Democratic Social party, Paul Singer, who informed me that anti-Semitism was merely a form of anti-capitalist agitation, since the Jews were the foremost representatives of the capitalist system, and that everything would come right as soon as the triumph of the Socialist revolution had put an end to capitalism itself. I regret to say that this explanation convinced me as little as the assurances of Court Chaplain Stocker had done.

For some years in France, again in Germany, and afterwards in Italy, I kept one eye on the Jewish problem, hoping to find a clear

path through the assertions and counter-assertions which I suggested it. It was during this period that the Dreyfus affair began and ran its course. This affair, it may perhaps not be superfluous to say, arose out of the condemnation of Captain Alfred Dreyfus, a Jewish staff officer in the French army, on a charge of having betrayed important military secrets to Germany. Despite his protestations of innocence Dreyfus was sentenced to life-long confinement in a tropical penal settlement, known as "Devil's Island," on the strength of a secret and—as it turned out to be—a forged document which was shown neither to him nor to his counsel. A fierce agitation presently arose over the question of his guilt. For years it split parties, classes, and even families in France into two warring factions. Jewish organizations throughout the world took up and supported their co-religionist's case. In the long run, however, the case was won and the innocence of Dreyfus established less by this Jewish support than by the moral heroism of Frenchmen like Emile Zola, Colonel Picquart, Zola's, Anatole France and many others. Thanks to their efforts enough evidence was obtained to warrant a revision of the Dreyfus trial by a military court at Rennes in 1899, and though the court, influenced by the idea that the honor of the army was at stake, refused to acquit Dreyfus, the agitation went on in a milder form until he was "re-absent" and, at the beginning of the Great War, reinstated in the army.

Clergy Opposes Dreyfus

During the course of this affair I saw, both in France and at Rome, that the Catholic hierarchy, the religious orders, including the Jesuits, and clerical organizations in general were thoroughly hostile to Dreyfus, perhaps because international Freemasonry was on his side. The Papal Secretary of State, Cardinal Rampolla, went so far as to express to M. Sazonov, who was then representative of Russia at the Holy See, his deep satisfaction at the refusal of the military court at Rennes to acquit Captain Dreyfus of treason, though it granted him "extenuating circumstances"—and M. Sazonov earned the cardinal's displeasure by replying that in Russia the behavior of the Rennes tribunal was looked upon as outrageous. Of Dreyfus' innocence I had good reason

Jewish Doctors Return From 'Floating Congress' to South

Leading Jewish doctors of New York and other cities have just returned home after participating in the "Floating Congress" of the Pan American Medical Association held on board the S. S. Pennsylvania on a sixteen day cruise to South America. One hundred and seventy-five scientific papers were presented at sixty-four separate sessions on board ship, covering a wide range of medical and surgical problems. In addition special sessions were held in Venezuela and Puerto Rico in which doctors from these tropical countries participated. The new "four nations," including President Juan Vicente Gomez of Venezuela, acted as official hosts to the delegates.

Dr. Bernard Sachs, president of the New York Academy of Medicine, who was honored by being elected one of ten American doctors serving as vice-presidents of the association, delivered three important papers during the congress and was the principal speaker at a special meeting dealing with education of the modern child. One of Dr. Sachs' papers—a discussion of nervous and mental disorders of childhood—aroused great interest at the convention, for in this paper the noted New York physician minimized the significance of heredity in nervous illnesses and urged a conservative viewpoint on sterilization, claiming that some of our greatest personalities have come from so-called tainted stocks, and declaring that absolute race purity was rarely ever attainable.

Opportunities for Doctors

In another address he spoke of the opportunities offered by medical organizations in the field of public health, and advocated the participation of physicians in local political affairs, especially in matters dealing with the health of the community, emphasizing, however, that doctors should take part in

political activities not as politicians, but as public spirited citizens.

The modern psychoanalyst's viewpoint was presented by Dr. Philip R. Lehmann of New York, director of the Mental Hygiene Clinic of Post Graduate Hospital. Dr. Lehmann, who studied with Professor Sigmund Freud in Vienna, was responsible for the interesting statement that fixed characteristics are not existent in individuals or nations and that individual and national characteristics may be altered.

Diseases of the digestive tract were discussed by other notable Jewish physicians, among them Dr. Max Einhorn and Dr. I. W. Field of New York.

Methods of treatment of tuberculosis were discussed by Dr. Edgar Mayer, Director of the Pulmonary Department at Cornell Medical College, Dr. James Edlin and Dr. M. Tannenbaum.

Dr. Joshua Sherman of Lancaster, Pa., demonstrated on many of the passengers an original method of treating seasickness, which was the subject of a paper he read at one of the sessions of the Congress.

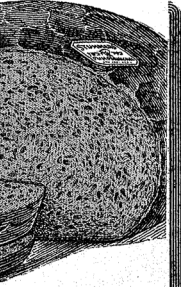
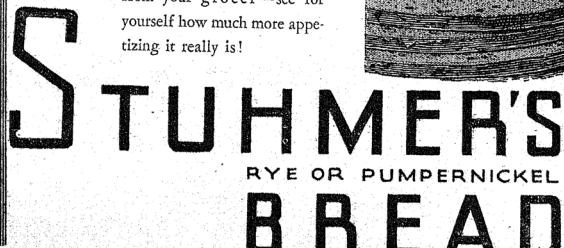
First Court Step Won By Man Who Returned Boycotted Nazi Goods

A motion for summary judgment brought by the Utility Products Company, 15 Warren street, in its suit against Jonas Hales, jobber of plumbing specialties, 241 1/2 East Twenty-fourth street, Brooklyn, to recover \$150 for a shipment of German-made washbasins which Hales returned, was denied by Municipal Court Justice Harold P. Kunster. It was learned yesterday.

Hales ordered the material last November without knowing that it was of German origin. He distributed the hinges to various contractors but they were not returned to Hales because of the boycott. Hales then returned the unsold hinges and offered to pay for the sold ones. The Utility Products Company, however, brought suit to recover the full amount.

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Accept Plans To Reorganize N. J. Activities

125 Members of United
Synagogue Vote to
Centralize Work

(Special to the J.D.B.)
PATERSON, April 8.—A complete reorganization plan of the New Jersey Branch of the United Synagogue of America was accepted here today by 125 members meeting at the fifth annual convention at Temple Emanuel. Delegates representing synagogues throughout the State were in attendance.

The plan, presented by Rabbi Benjamin Plotkin of Congregation Emanuel, Jersey City, who later was elected president of the New Jersey organization, completely centralizes the activities of the New Jersey Branch in a group of newly-formed committees.

"World events are bringing home to men and women the religious and humanitarian impulses the need of reorganization, of new strategy and of new machinery in the struggle for peace, justice and brotherhood," Rabbi Plotkin declared.

The New Proposals

The plan calls for the establishment of an administration committee which will meet each month at the Y.M.H.A. in Newark, and the following other committees:

An executive committee, including representatives from every congregation in the branch, which will meet three times a year in different places and receive reports of the administration committee.

A committee on organization, extension and propaganda.

A committee on public affairs, which will deal with social justice, peace and inter-racial relationships.

A committee on youth and adult education.

A committee on Jewish law and canonization.

A rabbinical council, which will be the religious authority for the branch.

A rituals committee, which will seek to improve religious services. Then also calls for state organizations of men's clubs, young people's leagues and junior congregations of the state.

A proposal that the branch be divided regionally was accepted. The plan concluded with the urgent suggestion that a permanent field director be appointed.

Rabbi Charles I. Hoffman declared the nomination for president of the branch after devoting the last five years as its leader. Rabbi Plotkin was elected president.

Other officers elected were Morris B. Sherman, Orange, first vice-president; Ira F. Scheraga, Newark, second vice-president; George Gold, Paterson, third vice-president; Elias Shapiro, Jersey City, secretary; Samuel Schechner, Newark treasurer; and William Raphael, Hillside, chairman of the executive council.

Cites Palestine Progress

SYRACUSE, April 6.—Abraham Goldberg, Zionist leader, said that progress in Palestine is advancing rapidly in spite of the world-wide depression, in his address at the Temple Society of Concord, under the auspices of the newly formed Jewish Council of the Zionist Organization.

'Grandpa' Puffs Contentedly As He Reaches 100th Milestone

It was three o'clock at the Yonkers Home of the New York Guild for the Jewish Blind, and the sightless old men were sitting around and blinking into the ether yesterday. But Grandpa Finkelstein, oldest inmate, was sitting at a table and puffing contentedly on a brand new pipe crammed with fragrant tobacco.

For yesterday Grandpa Finkelstein had reached one hundred years.

Around the table were from forty to fifty men and women and children, all direct and indirect descendants and relatives of Grandpa Finkelstein, who had come from near and far to help the patriarch usher in the new century.

Blind and old was Grandpa Finkelstein, but nobody thought of sight or age as 101 candles were lighted on a massive cake on the center of the table.

Grandchildren and great grandchildren looked on with awe at the 101 candles. They realized Grandpa Finkelstein couldn't see the cake, but that was all right, because soon the smoke from the patriarch's new pipe settled such a cloud over the table that nobody else was able to see the cake either. The 101 candles stood out in the smoke fog like 101 light-houses.

Grandpa Is Content

It was a birthday party for

Grandpa Finkelstein, such as had never been "brulled" at the Yonkers Home. Wines and candy were pressed into Grandpa's wrinkled hands. New clothes, shoes and ties were brought for Grandpa to touch and admire. But best of all he liked the pipes—two of them—and the cans of tobacco his dotting relatives had brought him. For other inmates would have to take his word for it that he had a new suit and tie and pair of shoes, but they would smell that he had two new pipes and enough tobacco to last him into the early part of 1935.

This made Grandpa Finkelstein feel content. He stroked his white beard and his eyes "egan to water."

"How does it feel to be a hundred years and one day old?" he was asked.

"Ah, good tobacco," said Grandpa Finkelstein.

"What are your thoughts as you turn the century and climb the perilous dark road of a new decade?" somebody else asked.

In response, Grandpa Finkelstein drew harshly on his pipe, and the smoke of burning patist forced his interrogators to beat a hasty retreat.

Sightless and aged is Grandpa Finkelstein. And happy as a Spring songbird is he with his two new pipes and forty or fifty-odd relatives.

Fish Groups to Send Delegates To Conference N.J. Legislature

Wholesalers, Retailers
Vote to Send Men
to See Amen

In an effort to eliminate abuses in the fish industry and prevent strikes such as the one which tied up the Peck Slip market all last week, representatives of wholesalers and retailers met at 36 Peck Slip Saturday and voted to send committees to confer with Harlan Amen, special assistant federal attorney general, today or tomorrow.

The wholesalers and retailers agreed last a fair price scale could be reached by mutual consent without outside interference. At Saturday's meeting, abuses in the industry were discussed, and, although no definite decision was reached, Harold L. Straus, chairman of the meeting, reported that the industry was on its way to a better understanding.

Straus, who is a member of the firm of Straus and Osserman, counsel to the wholesalers, represented the wholesalers' newly formed association, while Sam Wapole represented the new retailers' union.

Stanley Osserman, who returned from Washington, where he is working on a NRA code for the industry, reported progress.

He said that it will be at least two or three months before the code will be ready for submission to the NRA authorities. Osserman left for Washington late last night.

German Jews Deny Swastika Used at Rallies

Followers of Naumann Claim 'Alien Jews' Spread Reports

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN, April 8.—The National German Jewish Union, the organization of nationalist German Jews, headed by Dr. Max Naumann, today issued a denial that the swastika flag bedecked its meeting hall, and flies over its assemblies.

The union declared that in the hall where its last two meetings took place a small swastika flag, firmly nailed into position, was a permanent decoration of the place. "We asked its removal, which the proprietor of the building refused," the Union statement asserted. "Besides, swastika is no longer merely the emblem of hatred of the Jews. It is now the official German emblem and it is not possible for the Jewish Germans to deny this."

"The Christian cross," according to the statement, "first was anti-Jewish, but no Jew refuses the Iron Cross or other official orders incorporating the cross."

The statement heatedly accused "the agents of spreading the report that the Naumann followers meet under the sign of the swastika and character" the report as "crude propaganda."

The National German Jewish Union is a small band of followers of Dr. Max Naumann, ultra-nationalist leader who has espoused the program with the suggestion of the discriminatory measures against Jews who profess German nationalism.

Dowager Lady Rayleigh Dies in London at 87

LONDON, April 8.—Dowager Lady Rayleigh, sister of the late Earl of Balfour, died at her London home yesterday.

Lady Rayleigh was eighty-seven.

East Side Mourns Julius Gold, Iceman and Patron of Arts

Julius Gold, iceman and patron of the arts, was laid to his last resting place yesterday, next to his wife in the Mount Judah Cemetery, Cypress Hills, while the Jewish east side mourns the passing of one of its most beloved characters. He was sixty-eight.

More journalists than would care admit owe their start to Gold. When the late Jose Barondess came from Europe, eager to write but penniless, it was with aid of Gold that he rose to fame. Every Friday afternoon after a hard day's work, Gold walked up the rocky steps to Barondess' room and left outside a cake of ice and near it a bag of food and a copy of the *Augenblick*, the East Side's great Jewish paper of the time.

Some of the older residents of East Broadway harken back to the time when he first went to this country forty-eight years ago, a sturdy young man of twenty. He saw a band of hooligans tormenting an old Jew and pulling his "poyke" by his bundle he came into them. It was a comely rout. Ever after, whenever the hooligans paid one of their visits to the "Jewish sultan" would be there. Ruffians annoying Jews. Nine years ago Julius Gold sold

blanching when the victims warned, "I'll call Julius."

At 225 East Broadway there stands the imposing Bialystoker Home for the Aged, housing 200 inmates. That was Gold's work, too, David Sohn, the superintendent, said.

Abraham Cahan, Philip Kranz and Jacob Gordon are among the writers who were aided by Gold in their younger days, said Jacob Kreplak, writer and one of Gold's proteges. He would sit with them for hours discussing the day's news and the latest book, he commented.

He told about Gold's restlessness, his artistic soul, his kindness. "Do you see that crowd?" He pointed to the thronged street outside the Zion Memorial Home, where the services took place. "Every one of those 5,000 people who will walk in Gold's funeral procession today owe him something. Each one of them received some kindness from him."

Six children survive Julius Gold—five sons and a daughter. They attended to Jewish learning he had given them, the money he had spent for books in his home, classics of Jewish lore.

Biegeleisen Dies; Nazi Is Sentenced For Maltreatment

Author of Works Dealing with Literature and Folk Lore Given 13 Years in Jail on Complaint of Lieutenant in Concentration Camp

LWOW, April 8.—Professor Henryk Biegeleisen, Nestor of Polish literary historians and folk lore authority, died here at the age of seventy-eight.

Professor Biegeleisen was born in Toustke, Galicia. He is the author of a five-volume illustrated history of Polish literature and of a work of Polish folk lore, published in three volumes: "Mother and Child," "Marriage," and "In the Cradle, at the Altar and at the Grave."

Professor Biegeleisen also published a critical series of the works of the Polish classicists Mickiewicz, Slowacki, and Fredro.

Although the press incorrectly states in a number of instances that Professor Biegeleisen was Christian, he was descended on his mother's side from Nachman Krochmal, eighteenth century Jewish philosopher. He was buried in a grave of honor in the Jewish cemetery here yesterday.

Nazi Is Sentenced For Maltreatment

Given 13 Years in Jail on Complaint of Lieutenant in Concentration Camp

COPENHAGEN, April 8.—A concentration camp official, Dr. Joachim Hofmann, was given a thirteen-year sentence for maltreating Lieutenant Colonel Weiss, a prisoner at his camp, it was revealed yesterday.

The sentence was imposed by a court which held a secret trial at Stettin after information sent privately by Lieut. Col. Weiss to Field Marshal Mackensen, a personal friend, resulted in a trial order by Premier Hermann Goering.

Testimony at the trial brought out the fact that a Jewish merchant of Schragenehm was among those mistreated by Hofmann. Weiss is not Jewish.

Greek Zionists Reich Expected Use Synagogue For Clashes Silesia Verdict, Poles Maintain

Revisionists Attempt Explanation of Their Aims

SALONICA, April 8.—A bloody clash between Zionist Revisionists and General Zionists occurred in a synagogue at Castoria when the Revisionists insisted, despite opposition by the community, upon explaining the political program of Vladimir Jabotinsky, leader of the Revisionist movement.

More than fifteen persons were injured and several leaders of the riot were arrested, reports from Castoria indicate. The rioting lasted at least an hour and was finally broken up when the police entered the house of prayer and took the leaders of the disturbance into custody.

Fifteen of the injured Revisionists protested that Communists were responsible for the disturbance. They asked for measures which would avoid graver occurrences in the future.

Chief Rabbi Appeals For Support of Fund To Aid Refugee Jews

LONDON, April 8.—Pleading for the support of the second appeal by the Central British Fund committee, Chief Rabbi Joseph H. Hertz, in his Passover sermon, the Central Synagogue yesterday said that "the terrible plight of our German brethren is a normal challenge to the Jews of Great Britain."

Chief Rabbi Hertz appealed for solidarity to aid the victims of tyranny who have been subjected to degradation and persecution, and whose "role crime is the fact that they possess Jewish blood."

Reich Expected Silesia Verdict, Poles Maintain

Regarded as Important Victory for Jews; Other Cases Pending

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
WARSAW, April 8.—Comment in political circles here indicated that the German government officially recognized the justification of the claims advanced by the Jewish doctors Fuerelen and Frenkel of Beuthen, Upper Silesia, and agreed to relocate them in the sick fund panel system of the plebiscite area, as well as pay them damages for the time during which they were ousted from that system, only because the government expected a verdict in favor of the Jews and wished to avoid such defeat.

It was revealed that conciliatory negotiations to avoid a negative verdict were instituted by the German government.

The report that the German government had acknowledged its guilt in the case to the Upper Silesian Mixed Claims Commission of the League of Nations was regarded as an important victory for German Jews. Other cases in which physicians claim as did Fuerelen and Frenkel that they were ousted from the panel system merely because they were Jewish are pending before the Mixed Commission.

House Burned in Galicia Thought Act of Ukrainians

LWOW, April 8.—Fire believed to be of incendiary origin yesterday destroyed the house and shop of Mendel and Wolf Stangow, brothers, at Polanka, a village not far from here.

It is thought that the burning of the building is an act of vengeance on the part of Ukrainians.

A Man's Sized Game

Sidney Heitner, the present table tennis titheholder, scoffs at the ferociousness of football or lacrosse. He laughs at the rigors of rugby and ice hockey. And, it is with a sneer in his voice that he condescends to speak of water polo or wrestling.

Sidney is a tall, twenty-three year old Jewish lad who came to this country from Austria eleven years ago. He has the well built body of a tennis player, due to years of strenuous practice at this man's-sized game. The tiger look that comes into his eyes as he advances to the field of honor is enough to unnerve a less formidable opponent. Well has he merited the appellation of the "Amazing Austrian."

Very Confident

Every inch the fighter and sportsman, Heitner admits that he will repeat. "I never was in better shape," he says and we can readily believe it. The rigorous and grueling training grid that he endures in order to reach the pinnacle of physical perfection is well nigh incredible.

Just before the tournament starts, Sidney, who is an insurance salesman living in the Bronx (which must be quite a grind in itself), begins an arduous routine of morning and evening runs which he attributes his excellence on the table courts of America.

He retires each night at the unseemly hour of ten, sleeps alone, and touches not the fire, wine nor the jocund fruit of the grape. He rises early and after an ice cold needle shower and a brisk run to the subway and a seat. It is on this jaunt downtown that Sidney devises new strategies which he will use to outplay his rivals.

But even the uses of advantage already this gallant lad has defeated J. Krieger in the national table tennis tournament being held at the Hotel Astor. This man was tennis and nerve-wrecking to watch. It kept the spectators in a frenzied state of delicious excitement from the first serve.

"All Due to Clean Living"

Heitner says of his training routine: "It really is important. I have played lawn tennis and I think the mental strain of the outdoor game is as nothing compared to the strain I did win this tournament Schussheim will. But I wouldn't want to bet on Schussheim's chances."

But Heitner who evidently is quite close to Heitner remarked: "Yes, it is all due to right living and clean thinking."

Greatest Tournament Of Its Kind

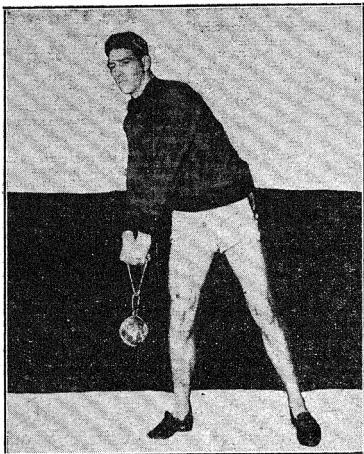
There are 200 other contestants in this the greatest match of its kind that the United States has ever known. The Hotel Astor's main ballroom is the scene of action and the sessions are crowded to capacity.

One can readily believe that the showmanship of a Tex Rickard was the inspiration for such a stupendous and gigantic sporting event. Twelve specially constructed tables line the floor and the speed of the bounding balls causes an unwitting spectator to wish he hadn't taken that last drink.

Four Players Seeded

Four players were considered a sufficient number to be seeded by the officials inasmuch as that body wished to spare the feelings of some of the others. The field this year is unusually good but only Heitner, Abram Berenbaum, Marc Schussheim and Sol Schiff were seeded. The latter is known as the tiger of table tennis tournaments.

Former Record Holder

This business of seeding only four contestants, as J. P. Allen, one of the foremost experts on table tennis in the East, says, "is showing that discretion is the better part of valor."

Schiff has already chopped his way through the eastern championship and came out the winner because of his lightning-like strokes. Schussheim is on the same side of the draw as Heitner and has held the national crown on six different occasions. This year he claims that his sporting blood has been aroused. Schussheim came through the opening rounds with a new stroke that promises a whirlwind battle when he meets the present champion. "Marvelous Marcus" is considered Heitner's chief rival.

Track Tricks

Every year the national A. A. U. body decides whether it will allow the use of certain devices during track meets. These decisions have been demanded of this organization by track coaches throughout the country.

It all started about four or five years ago when a Western track coach initiated the use of the starting blocks for sprinters. After most of the world's record makers for sprint events had been shattered beyond recognition, the august assemblage known as the A. A. U. met and decided that the new marks would not be recognized. They cite the use of the starting blocks as the grounds for their argument.

In the past, their meetings were after the manner had been broken. For the last two or three years they have met before an important track and field meet and decided what would be okay or rejected altogether.

The coming Penn Relays, which will be held at Franklin Field, Philadelphia, on April 27 and 28, has caused the A. A. U. to issue instructions that no artificial devices shall be employed.

Steiner Criticized

Speaking of the Penn relays, we recall an incident that occurred to Fred Steiner, giant weight man on the University of Pennsylvania's track squad some years ago. At Franklin Field he stood on a raised platform and heaved the thirty-five-pound weight for a new intercollegiate record of fifty-four feet, five inches.

Sporting enthusiasts generally

admitted that this platform had added at least one foot to Steiner's great toss. Coaches all over the East came out against this new device. They stated there was no apparent use in using artificial means to increase a distance which could not be reached otherwise.

Breaks Open Mark

A fortnight after this meet at Franklin Field, the U. of P. boys came to New York City for the intercollegiate which was then held in the Squadron A Armory at Kingsbridge.

Four men were entered in the finals of the thirty-five-pound weight event. All had tossed the ball beyond the fifty-foot mark to reach the finals. Mort Zemlich, 250-pound trackman from N. Y. U., was New York City's only entrant.

Steiner in his first toss in the final event, without the use of an artificial platform, hurled the iron ball fifty-four feet and nine inches. This was an increase of four inches over his previous throw when the platform had been used. The rest of the field all came over the fifty-two foot marker but Steiner won with his splendid toss.

As yet we haven't heard of any new devices that may be employed at the Penn Relays. It is sure, but something or other is sure to be on deck when the starter's gun goes off.

The Bulletin's Day Book

Wearers of colored shirts expressive of militant party affiliations are becoming so frequent in Great Britain as to cause the Home Office to recognize them as a public danger.

And no wonder. A recent survey shows that there are at least eight differently shirted groups on the list at present. They all have one thing in common—mortal hatred of each other.

Four of the groups are Fascist. Two wear black shirts, one blue, and the fourth grey. Sir Oswald Mosley, called the "British Hitler," is leader of the British Fascist Union, largest and wealthiest of the groups of this ilk. Mosley's followers wear black shirts, black caps and black belts. They wear a corporate state, a national council and a senate. For propaganda purposes they maintain five bulletproof armored cars in which the proselytizing members are safe from flying pop bottles and similar missiles. There are about 18,000 British Fascist Unionists.

The second black-shirt group is that established by Arnold Leese, who insists that his comrades were wearing the black haberdashery when Sir Oswald was still a social democrat plotting the ruin of the empire. Mr. Leese's outfit, the Imperial Fascist League, is decidedly anti-Semitic. There are some 10,000 Imperial Fascist League members.

The Fascists of Kensington wear blue shirts so they will not be confused with the other Fascist organizations, they say. They are an offshoot of the Mosley outfit, having split with Mosley when they thought he was becoming too dictatorial. They are against "Jewish domination" and for a Fascist state. They claim a membership of 400,000. The official count gives them 10,000. They admit financial difficulties.

The members of the fourth Fascist group wear grey shirts. They were organized recently by Cecil Serford Skeels as the Fascist Party of the United Kingdom. Then there are the non-Fascist shirt wearers, chief among them the red-shirts. These are members of the Independent Workers Party, an organization apparently neither communist nor socialistic. They number 10,000, and are mostly young people who are valuable for demonstrations. They wear grey trousers with their red shirts.

But surpassing all the others in color and in the green-shirt. Their color is symbolic of the economic theory which their founder, Major Douglas, of Scotland, has formulated. One of their slogans reads: "Would a maggot, lodged in an apple, die of hunger if the apple were too large?" There are about 3,000 green

shirts, and they are prominent at all sorts of political meetings where they ask questions and enter into discussions with the avowed purpose of presenting their point of view.

The communists wear khaki, the favorite color for workshirts in England.

Last but not least is the movement of white shirt wearers which was founded by a British Jew. White, in England, is the symbol of charity and benevolence, of brotherly love. While the number of white shirt wearers has not yet been established, it is said that their numbers are steadily increasing.
