Paths of Peace

THAS been reported that Ernest Bloch's Avodath Hakodesh, (Sacred Service), which was acclaimed in Carnegie Hall on Wednesday evening, is soon to be produced in Germany. We do not know how authentic this information is. Perhaps the Sacred Ser-vice will be presented under the auspices of the Jewish cultural organization which is permitted to give plays and concerts exclusively for Jews. But even under such circumstances the Nazis are sure to feel irritated when the Cantor in the Sacred Service will read in Hebrew:
"The Law of the Lord is

perfect.

It doth restore the soul

His precepts are sure and enduring
And give wisdom to the simple.
The Laws of the Lord are just

Laws. Rejoiding the heart;

The Law of the Lord is holy, Enduring forever.

Behold these precepts the Lord hath shown thee; Take heed of them, neither forsake them."

These lines are followed by the peace song, sung by the Can-tor and the chorus: "Tree of Life, Life unto then that receive it,

And its preservers are happy, For its way: are ways of

beauty,

And all its paths are paths of peace."

While the Hitler government

is discriminating against the Jews and persecuting them on rather than religious grounds, it may regard these Hebrev sentiments, accentuated in Bloch's impressive music, as treason. If the Law of the Lord is per

feet, what are the Nazi laws?
And if the Lord's paths are
paths of peace, what are the
Nazi paths?

The laws of love and justice and righteousness and peace have been replaced in Nazi Germany by decrees of hate and prejudices and by a psychosis of war-madness. A reminder of this even in a Hebrew prayer may arouse the Nazi ire.

A Timely Warning Dr. Paul Hertz, former Par-Hamentary Secretary of the German Socialist party, now in exile in Prague, is reported to have declared in an interview with the New York Times correspondent:

"If the United States grants Germany credits for raw materials in any large quantities, the United States will be responsible for the next war in Europe. . . . Toronto Bakers Reach Agreement; Get 8-Hour Day and Wage Raise

TORONTO, Ont., April 12.—
After a conference which lasted
until the early hours of this morning an agreement was reached between the Hebrew Master Bakers' Association and the International Bakers Union Local 181, Toronto, settling the short strike which began last Saturday night.

The terms of the agreement favor the union, guaranteeing an eight-hour day and a wage raise of \$2 per week. Henceforth the pay of first-hands is to be \$36 a week, of second-hands \$32, and \$28 for third-hands.

Bakers will resume work on Saturday.

Weiss Recommendations Sent to Aldermanic Board Offices

Although recommendations for amendments to the sections of the Mrs. West. Chata Danal Law com cerning kashruth were presented yesterday morning to the office of the President of the Board of Aldermen by William Weiss, chair-Aldermen by William Weiss, chair-man of the Mayor's sub-committee on kashruth regulation, no imme-diate action will be taken.

terday to the Jewish Daily Bulle-tin by Louis Lande, chief examiner for the Board of Aldermen. Mr. Lande explained that no action can be taken within the near future because the State Legislature is expected to adjourn shortly.



Are Left Five-Eighths of Residuary Estate of Late Jacob Golland

Jewish charitable organizations will receive five-eighths of the residuary estate of the late Jacob Golland, who died April 6, under the terms of the will filed for probate at Surrogate's Court yesterday afternoon. According to the formal estimate, Mr. Golland left "more than \$11,000."

The will, dated October 22, 1931, bequeathed \$1,000 to the New York lodge for Elks No. 1, \$5,000 to a sister-in-law, Mrs. Lillian Golland, and leaves the residue in trust for the benefit of the de-ceased's brother, Israel Golland. On his death, the will provides that the trust shall continue for the benefit of Isaac Golland Jr., another brother, and Annie Golland, a sister.

On the death of each, the principal of the trust is to be divided as follows: one-half to the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies; one-eighth to the New York Guild for Jewish Blind; and one-eighth to whatever Catholic and Protestant institutions for the blind may be selected by the executors, the Fifth Avenue Bank and Frederick Falzberg, The remaining one-fourth will go to Mrs. Lillian Golland.

Steed Analyzes Nazis' Faith In Ascent Through 'Aryanism' Discussed at

Hitlerite Third Reich Must Be Founded Upon Race, Press Meeting Is Current German Belief; Jew Is Indicted as Enemy of Teuton Idealism

Wickham Steed, former corres-pondent of the London Times at Berlin, Rome and Vienna, and finally its editor, explains the true nature of Hitlerism and to what in his book, "Hitler, Whence and Whither?"

Now the fundamental idea of the Hitlerite movement is that the pre-eminent position to which Germany has a right in the world can be assured only by a return to the Nordic purity of its "Aryan" origin. The Hitlerite "Third Em-pire" (as distinguished from the

of which Voltaire naughtily said that it was neither Holy nor Roman nor an Emipre—and from the Sec-Hohenzollern. Empire of

1871-1918) must he founded solely upon race, and must unite in one realm all human beings of German race, and none but these. This community of pengs of German race, and none but these. This community of blood, sole source of national energy, is what the Hillerites mean by "Volkstum."

The "Volkstum," the Germanic blood-community, comprises ev-erything that is authentically Ger-man and unites the vital forces of the race.

This supreme treasure of the ermanic race, pure "Aryan" Germanic race, pure "Aryan' blood, the international forces represented by the Jews are accused resented by the Jews are accused of striving, with diabolical skill and tenacity, to destroy. Among their foulest ideas Hitler enumer-ates those of Parliamentary Democracy and of human equality.

Principle is Aristocratic
The German "Aryan" principle
is, ex hypothesi, aristocratic, since
the Aryan race is an aristocracy
among races and therefore entitled to rule the world. Inasmuch as Christianity is adulterated by many false conceptions, it is necessary to Germanize Christianity. ssary to Germanize Christianity. In 1924, the Germanic "Aryan" writer, von Wendrin, discovered that the mystery behind the Chris-tian Scriptures is that Christ (whose name is to be written "Krist") is none other than the Scandinavian deity, Baldur. No-tions like these explain the recent subjugation of the Protestant Ger-man Churches by a Hitlerite group known as "German Chris-tians"—against whom three thousand Protestant pastors, under the leadership of their elected Bishop, Dr. von Bodelschwingh, have been

These dissentient pastors hold, with St. Paul, that in Christianity there is no place for racial dis-crimination, "neither Greek nor Jew, circumcision nor uncircum-cision, Barbarian, Scythian, bond nor free," whereas the "German Christians" maintain that baptism Christians maintain that saptism alone is not enough to make a German Christian unless he is an authentic "Aryan," and that the Jewish spirit must disappear from Christianity, the Old Testament re-duced to a Nazi version of the Gospel according to St. Mark.

The ideal, which the "German

Christians" have already sought to realize, would be to replace the Cross by the Swastika. In fact, the "Aryan" Germanic Christian

resent that race) alone embody the true spirit of Christianity.

From these premises the Hitlerite indictment of the Jews naturally follows. In the Jew all the elements inimical to Germanic idealism are bound up. His critical and skeptical spirit under-mines every healthy principle. He mines every healthy principle. He is the supreme Marxist whose in-ternational heresy foments revo-lutions and the ruin of States, so that he may enrich himself with the spoils. He, .oo, is the supreme capitalist, greedy of gain, careless of the people's needs. Without capitalist, greedy of gain, careless of the people's needs. Without real roots in any land, he is a ubiquitous and agile parasite, the creator of a false art, of a falsely objective science, and the destroy-er of culture. He is the memy of the human race, the enemy of God Himself, the enemy of the Light, First, or Holy the cloud that hides from the "Aryan" race the Sun which is its symbol.

Some may think I exaggerate. If so, they have but to study current Nazi literature or, in default of time to do this, to read Mr. Edgar Mowrer's chapter "Perish the Jew!" in his book Germany Puts The Clock Back. The Nazi song-book for the Storm Troops contains several samples one of which runs:

So stand the storm battalions Ready for racial fight Only when Jews lie bleeding

The professing Jews in Germany number 565,000, or less than one per cent. of the total population. What have these 565,000 or, for that matter—if the haptized and assimilated Jews and Jewesses of Germany and their descendants be the million or two million German Jews, to say in self-de-fense? Roughly, they plead the signal services they have rendered Germany where they have been established since the fourth cen-tury, at latest. Jews were present at the Court of Charlemaone in the eighth and ninth centuries and had permission to build syna-gogues and keep their own ceme-teries. Though, during the Middle Ages, and through the Renaissance and the Reformation, full citizen the reforms at the end of the eighteenth centuries gave them full equality, and the Prussian Edict of 1847, as well as the Constitu-tion of the North German Confederation in 1869, confirmed it.

Jewish Proportion Down So far from being a growing danger to the German people the proportion of Jews to Germans has decreased during the past fifty or sixty years. Even in the chief citie s, where the Jews mostly live, it fell, for instance, at Hamburg from 4.5 per cent. of the popula-tion in 1866 to 1.75 in 1925. Likewise in Berlin the Jewish proportion was 5.5 per cent. in 1871 and only 4.3 per cent. in 1925. Since only 4.3 per cent. in 1925. Since the Jews were long debarred from the ownership of land, and in the Middle Ages non-Tews were forbidden to lend money on interest, it was natural that the Jews should

Immigration Records Broken

Locker disclosed that the half year between September, 1933, and February, 1934, broke all immigration records, with 19,000 legal immigrants entering Palestine dur-ing that period. Nevertheless, he pointed out, the World Zionist Executive was deeply concerned lest the opportunities for an even greater flow of Jewish immigrants be lost through the immigration policy of the Palestine govern-ment. He declared that the Executive will continue its fight for increased immigration into Pales-

The Laborite Executive member stressed the importance of the plan for raising a big loan to consolidate the debts of the organization and to make the colonies in Palestine self-sufficient. He said that the reason the plan to form coalition Executive had failed was due to the fact that the opposition groups had demanded four new members from their ranks while the Executive had proposed to add one member of the Mizrachi, orthodox Zionists, and one member of the General Zionist oppositionist group. The admission of four new members, Locker said, would have raised the membership of the Executive to seventeen and necessitated the dismissal of two members, which would have un-dermined the authority of the World Zionist Congress, where the men were elected.

The Revisionists, Locker clared, were completely isolated and the oppositionist groups could not find a single action of the Ex-ecutive that could be questioned on the basis of general Zionist responsibility.

The Executive will continue to regard itself responsible toward the whole movement and will ap-peal for support from all constructive forces, Locker declared in con-

Currency Influx Aids Palestine

Total of £3,684,664 in Currency Reported By W. J. Johnson

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) JERUSALEM, March 22.—There is a total of £3,684,664 in currency in circulation in Palestine, reports William Joseph Johnson, State Treasurer who acts as Currency Officer. Of this sum £3,273,052 a in notes and £411.612 in coinage.

The total number of notes in circulation here aggregates 2,168,-552 and of silver and bronze coins 14,495,000. Of note currency, the bulk-1,428,452-are of £1 denominations, and of coins the bronze quarter-cent and half-cent pieces number three million and the five mils or cent pieces number 3,060,-000. There are 3,430,000 five-pias tre coins, or quarters, and 2,260, 000 ten mil pieces or dimes. This increase in currency reflects

the expanded activities in the country, caused by an influx of German Jews and others.

Viva Villa Gory Spectacle "Viva Villa" which Metro-Goldviva villa which Metro-Gold-wyn brought into the Criterion Theatre for a two-a-day run is not a picture for the chicken-hearted. It is the goriest, most hearted. It is the sadistic film to come uncut out of Hollywood but for those who do not mind a maximum of bloodshed and a minimum of sentiment "Viva Villa" will titillate you thoroughly

Personally I liked the picture. I thought it had zest, interest. movement, excitement and color. It is a full-bodied variation of one of the most exciting episodes in modern history. Historically, Ben Hecht, who wrote the picture, went far afield. Instead of fol-lowing chronologically and faithlowing chromologically and faith-fully the career of the Mexican bandit, Hecht embellished the myths that have arisen about this unlettered gusty savage. With his talents as a dramatist Hecht cleverly emphasizes the more obvious characteristics of the bandit chief. He shows him as being cruel, ruthless, ignorant, yet hearty and ofresp, ignorant, yet nearty and of-ten well meaning. To make the picture complete he uncovers Vil-la's weaknesses—his indecision, his man-like fear of his wife's nag-ging. These human touches do much to make the entire film more believable.

True Conception of Charity Most Alive in U. S., Einstein Relates

The true conception of charity the giver, but as a benefit to the more alive in the United States donor himself. The recognition is more alive in the United States than in Europe, in the opinion of Professor Albert Einstein, who so declared in a message yesterday from his home in Princeton, N. J., to Supreme Court Justice Mitchell May, president of the Brooklyn

Federation of Jewish Charities. "The recognition that posses-sions are not a privilege but a trust must always remain alive among us," wrote Professor Ein-stein, and "among non-Jews, too, this conception is far more alive here than abroad."

Professor Einstein in his mes-sage urged that support be given the \$500,000 twenty-fifth anniver-sary campaign which the Brooklyn Federation is now conducting to meet the 1934 budget requirements of the twenty-five affiliated

Writes of Charity
"I have been requested," wrote
Professor Einstein, "to give a message in relation to Jewish charity, and especially concerning federa-tions, or community chests, or ganized in communities throughout the country in aid of distressed Jews, and the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities, which is observing its twenty-fifth anniversary with a campaign to meet ap-peals for aid through its twentyfive constituent societies.

The spirit of mutual aid and self-sacrifice occupy first place in the moral tradition of the Jewish people. Had it not been for this tradition, there would be no Jews in existence now, and so long as this tradition continues to be transmitted solicitously from gen-eration to generation, the hatred opposing us cannot do us any

The statement continued:

"The fairest quality of Jewish charity is the fact that it does not stop at the bounds of our own pecthat possessions are not a privilege but a trust must always remain alive among us. Among non-Jews, too, this conception is far more alive in the United States than in Europe

"Most peoples have preserved themselves by establishing States and by conquering and defending territory by force of arms. Even the Jewish people in the Bible era established existence on this basis. The Jews would long ago have been destroyed, like all other nations, if they had not discovered and maintained a more solid basis for their existence. This new basis was the moral law and the cherishing of tradition based on this law.

"So long as we ourselves may cherish the happy feeling that our tradition gives animation to lofty values, we Jews all over the world will not cease to feel our solidarity. and we shall continue to exist as a and we shall continue to exist as a community even if spread all over the world. In this sense, benefactions are a blessing to the giver."

Jews Blamed For All Ills. Asserts Editor

Due to War's Aftermath. Says Bernstein at YMHA Talk

The War's aftermath has brought upon the Jews blame for all the ills of mankind, declared Herman Bernstein, editor of the Jewish Daily Bulletin, speaking at the club forum of the Young Women's Association last night. Some "minions of autocracy and

reaction," he declared, "have blamed them for the War and others have blamed them for the peace. Some have attacked them for aiding the German military machine and economic structure and others for the victory of Allies. In Germany they were at-tacked soon after the war for having opposed the submarine warfare, and thereby assuring Germany's defeat; while in some of the allied countries the Jews were denounced for constituting what they might have called the 'brain trust' of Germany.

"All revolutionary leaders were

credited to the Jews and Communism was branded as a specific Jewish doctrine. And there was a time when certain German Jewbaiters in their blind madness went so far as to declare that the forner Raiser was not only influ-enced by Jews, but was himself of Jewish descent, and for that reason did not defend Germany as a loyal 'Aryan' should have

The act relating to non-profit corporations, approved by the Governor, provides that the Department of State shall not isa certificate of authority to any foreign non-profit corporati if the application for the certifi-cate of authority sets forth any kind of business for which the domestic non-profit corporation could not be formed under the laws of this Commonwealth.
"Under the former Pennsylvania

law," Einhorn explained, "it was possible for a foreign corporation to engage in such business in Pennsylvania, for which no Pennsylvania charter could be obtained. The new provision is an attempt to eliminate this anomalous condition and in so doing equalize do mestic and foreign corporations.

"If the Silver Shirt Legion of America, Inc.," Einhorn added, "were intending to do business as

a domestic corporation, it would be necessary, under our procedure here, to file a petition with our courts and a hearing would be held before a master, at which hearing testimony would be given with re-spect to the purposes of the organization

Try to Avoid Rigorous Laws "Certainly, it seems quite clear that the Silver Shirts, being a corporation of the State of Delaware are attempting to get in via the back door into Pennsylvania and avoid the rigorous rule now obtaining with respect to the granting of charters to domestic corporations.
