T EON TROTSKY has been ordered to leave France on observed the duties of neutrality to which he took engagement when the hospitality of France was accorded him." Rumors have been broadcast that Trotsky was busy preparing to create a "Fourth Inter-national" for world revolution.

Trotsky thus figures again Trotsky thus ingures again prominently in the press of the world and France is extremely excited. Perhaps the whole "Fourth International" plot has been concocted at this particular moment to furnish the French people with a new affair—the Trotsky Affair—in order to make them forget the embarrassing Stavisky scandal.

That Trotsky, the advocate of "permanent revolution," is irri-tated by the manner in which the is being treated by Stalln and the Third International is quite natural. But judging by the characteristic traits that marked Leon Trotsky's achievements in the past, it does not seem probthe past, it does not seem prop-able that he is now seriously en-gaged upon forming new organi-zations to foment world revolu-tion. Trotsky is a great orator and a brilliant writer. Since he was exiled by the very govern-ment he had helped to create. e had to limit his activities to his writings. He has produced several books of lasting value and has written a series of keen and illuminating articles for capitalist magazines and newspa-pers. In Russia his following has diminished to the vanishing pas diminished to the vanishing point, according to recent ob-servers. He undoubtedly still has numerous admirers in many lands, who remember him not only as the brilliant agitator, pamphleteer and historian, but as the organizer of the Red ny. But what Trotsky could accomplish in Russia, together with Lenin who was idolized and followed blindly by the bolshe-viki, he could not do today. He ould not form anything more than a paper organization that would be opposed this time not only by the capitalists and the moderate socialists but also by

Rothenberg Report Reveals Extent of Progress in Palestine

250,000 Jews There-11.174 From Reich Came During Year

How the progress of reconstruc-tion in Palestine made it possible for the Jewish homeland to ab-sorb more Jews in one year than all the other countries of the world combined, is told in a report just issued by Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America. The report offers population statistics showing that there were 250,000 Jews in Palestine on March 1 of this year, wh the figure for 1921 was 85,000.

A supplement to the report states that since April 1, 1933, 11,000 German Jews have come to Palestine, About 1,500 of those have come to Jerusalem and 1,800 to Haifa. The villages and small townships have absorbed approxi-mately 2,000.

Commending the organization, headed by Mrs. Joseph Layman, on its service record of fifty years, Rabbi Rosenblum declared:



Intrigue Against U.S.

Intrigue against the Government is more openly undertaken by the Friends of New Germany than by the Silver Shirts. It is, from the viewpoint of origin, decidedly more viewpoint of origin, decidedly more bold than that springing from the home-grown reactionaries of the Silver Legion. As far as can be determined from court testimony and other information at hand, the Friends of New Germany intend instituting a revolution in the United States, using as their stormtroops here Germans, German-Americans, and all who can be stirred to revolt against the "Jewish Government of the United States." Thus far their plans have more nearly become palpable realities than any undertaken by the imported leaders of the American Soviet revolution

This reporter, after having stu-died the Fascist movement both here and in Germany for more than one year, does not pretend to know all the intrigues of the Friends of New Germany. The which have come to my attention however, point without any doubt in the writer's mind to the un-American nature of the League of Friends of New Germany and its allied German-American and Ame-

rican organizations.

National Guard Group As far as can be learned, for the first time in the history of the National Guard, a group has partitioned itself as a distinct non-American national group. The ex-istence of the "National Guardsmen of German Descent," a group drawn from various units of the National Guard throughout New York City, came to light about three weeks ago. Under the di-rection of Carl Nisselbeck, an active worker with the League of Friends of New Germany, a mili-tary concert and ball was held in the main ballroom of the Turn Halle at Lexington avenue and Eighty-fifth street on Sunday night, March 25. The ball, accorda thoroughly Hitlerized organization of German War Veterans.

Nisselbeck, an enlisted man of the 244th Coast Artillery, was rebuked for his action by superior officers at the New York National Guard headquarters in New York. Nevertheless, according to the offices of the manager of the Turn Halle, the concert and ball came off as scheduled. Nisselheck's resignation was accepted by the Na-tional Guard on March 30. Since then, according to word from the National Guard headquarters. nothing more has been learned of the organization, which has been created and may still exist con-trary to all rules of the National Guard.

The organization, which gained its inception in the 244th Coast Artillery in the armory at Sixth avenue and Fourteenth street, eli-cited the severe criticism of a cited the severe criticism of a spokesman at the National Guard headquarters. He said, "We will not tolerate any such faction within the National Guard, whether it be of German, Jewish, Irish, French or of any other national descent. The National Guard is an organization to defend the na-Particularly in this cosmopolitan city of New York." he added, "will we set severe restric-tions against the formation of any

racial or national group of the Na-tional Guard." it is learned that the National Guardsmen of German Descent came as a result of agitation on the part of local Nazi groups, in-clusive of the Friends of New Ger-

many. The Stahlhelm, with which the German guardsmen cooperated, has been coordinated with the Hitler Government.

Scheme in California

On the other side of the country, throughout California, a similar scheme, more daring in nature and considerably better developed, has been undertaken by the Western Division of the League of Friends of New Germany. First intima-tion of the Nazi plot to corrupt American military forces and vet eran organizations came to light when in a Los Angeles suit be-tween rival members of the Western Division of the League of Friends of New Germany for con-trol of the highly profitable branch, damning testimony was introduced to show that Nazis, some of them not American citi-zens, had planned to organize within the National Guard, to import arms from German ships, and to agitate among veterans with the intention of stirring them to revolt against the government. The testimony indicated that Ger-man stormtroopers had been drilling in anticipation of Der Tag, when they would lead American Fascist troops to power and glory.
The length of the startling charges incorporated in the testimony make impossible their re-production in this article. They will be fully discussed in later ar-ticles, along with Nazi methods

and American societies.
In other than military forces, the influence of the Nazis has been Their efforts have been di rected toward the banding together of disgruntled laborers and farmers in the middle west, where the organization is aided by an international German group, which has been carrying out the dictates of the Hitler Government in all foreign countries since the ascent of the chancellor to power.

Now in the conversation in which the hapless, though remunerated, author told me this sad story he had in-sisted that the unwanted book was the best thing he had ever done, a not unusual thing for an author to say about a book which is to come out or recently has been nublished.

I cannot say that curiosity about this book devoured me. I had read this author's previous work and written a favorable piece about it and even praised it in conversa-tion with friends who wanted to

know a good book to read. But I can say that I was nibbled at by curiosity and I wrote to the publisher asking to be remembered when review copies of such and such a work were sent around. was eager to see who was right and who was wrong. In reply I received a penny postal card, say-ing: "We regret to inform you that

ing: "We regret to inform you that
... by ... is no longer on our publication list, as previously announced." I telephoned the publisher to ask the name of the firm which was going to publish it, on the supposition that publication rights had been sold to a pub-lisher who wanted the book and could repay the thousand dollars advance. No one could say who would publish the work. Perhaps no one will publish the work—at least not at present. In the good old days a publisher would issue a book that he thought was good, as well as one he thought was good, as well as one he thought was only salable. Argentine Minister Condemns Buenos Aires Temple Outrage

He doesn't like that. He likes to Explosion Was Heard Over Radio-Fascists, Believed Supported by Nazis, Upbraided Jews for Broadcasting Services

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, pril 9.—The bomb explosion April 9.—The bomb explosion which shocked Jews at prayer in the Libertad Street Synagogue here on the evening of March 30, first night of Passover, was heard not only in the temple and its environs but was broadcast over all of the Argentine by the radio

The temple was filled with worshippers who had come to hear Cantor Barsky. Suddenly there was the sound of a loud explosion. Panic ensued among the men and women in the temple, and the noise was carried to listeners through the microphone which had been set up for broadcasting the ser-vices. There were no casualties inside the synagogue.

inside the synagogue.

To all appearances, the attack upon the temple was planned well in advance. Several days before Passover a clerical factist sheet called El Crysol published an article upbraiding the Jews for daring to send that "sunffine preview." to send their "snuffling prayers' over the air waves on Good Fri-Since the flavor of the anti-Semitic outbursts in El Crysol is not at all representative of the Argentine, even of the Argentine brand of anti-Semitism, it is believed here that El Crysol is supported by the German propaganda fund. No Argentinian would think of making a physical attack upon persons at prayer.

Further evidence of planning by the attackers is to be seen in the fact that before the attack telephone wires in the temple were the object of anti-Somitic attacks Several months ago the front of the building was smeared with tar. the building was smeared with tar, an act which aroused the condem nation of all the press. Somewhat later the same vandals threw stench bombs into the building when a wedding was in progress. Immediately after the explosion

occurred, police arrived and locked all doors in order to check up on present. Two Christians found in the temple were arrested. One, Jose Castro Viego, a Span-iard, said he had come to hear the Jewish music, and no evidence to the contrary has as yet been found. The other man was an Italian, Jose Palletti, against whom, also, no evidence has been found.

When the arrested were escorted out of the temple by the police, fascist legionnaires attempted to interfere. In the ensuing struggle a group of young fascists atta a Jewish merchant. Philip Gomberg, who lives near the temple.
"Death to the Jews," the fascists shouted until two of them were ar rested, when they dispersed.

Minister Condemns Outbreak A young Jew who passed the temple shortly before the explosion reported to the police that he heard a woman sitting in an automobile which stood at the curb, its doors open, say to a child:

"Lie down. They are going to shoot soon." The woman spoke in German.

Such manifestations of anti-Such manifestations or ann-semitism as the attack upon the temple are "foreign to the spirit of freedom and equality which constitutes Argentinian tradition." stine during 1933.

There is no unemployment in Palestine, Mr. Rothenberg declares, German Jews are showing greater interest than other immigrants in learning Hebrew rapidly in order to adjust themselves to the life of the country. "Russia's position is more affected now by foreign than internal affairs," Trotsky said.

"We have been called German agents, but the Allied represen-tatives in Russia did everything to spoil things for us and for themselves, and in that way they helped Germany more than we did. Certain members of the French and British Missions blundered by supporting the Polish legions, the Ukranians, by stirring up the Roumanian armics against us, but the Polish legions, the Ukranians and Roumania all helped Germany. American representative took no initiative in any of these mat ters, but he permitted a number of foolish things to be done. We have been called German agents, but I can assure you that Germany has no greater enemy than our party."

In answer to my question as to how long the Brest Litevale peace of the Soviets with Germany would last, Trotsky re-

"We are continuing the war against Germany in the Ukraine right now. Neither we nor Germany consider our peace of long duration."

And when I asked him how he visualized bolshevism would work out side by side with German imperialism, he replied:

"The Russia of the Soviets and militaristic Germany are absolutely incompatible."

During my visit to Russia in 1918 I succeeded in obtaining the original letter addressed by Trotsky to Lenin and Stalin, written from the Brest-Litovsk Peace conference, in which Trotsky gave his reasons why he reed to sign the separate peace with the German militarists, and in which he also predicted the coming of the German revolution. Leon Trotsky was the only one among the leading bolshe-viki who opposed the Brest-Litovsk peace treaty, stating, "We cannot participate in the looting war of the Allies, nor can we sign the looting peace

can we sign the looting peace with Germany."

In March, 1918, there was a considerable campaign against the Jews in various countries because a number of Jews played a conspicuous role in Soviet Russia at the time. During my interview with Trotsky, I as him whether he did not think that anti-Semitism would grow more intense in Russia because of the activities of some of the Jews among the bolsheviki. To this Trotsky replied:

"Anti-Semitism is being eradicated in Russia. The masses are not anti-Semitic. Only the remnants of the bourgeoisie are. The Soviet government will deal drastically with this menace. drastically with this menace. The fact that Jews are elected to the highest offices in the Soviet government of workers and peasants shows that there is no anti-Semitism in the Rus-sian masses."

Favor Aid for Jewish Courts In Palestine

Wauchope to Make Recommendations, Says Cunliffe-Lister

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, April 18.—High Commissioner Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope of Palestine will make recommendations to the British government on the subject of granting subsidies to the Jewish rabbinical courts in Palestine, Sir Grenfell rabbinical courts in Palestine, Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, Secretary of State for Colonies, replied today in the House of Commons to a question put to him.

The questioner, a Conservative Member of Parliament, D. J. B. Joel, wanted to know why Arab religious courts were granted financial assistance, while Jewish religious courts were ignored. Sir Philip replied that Arab subven-tions dated back to the time when Turkey ruled Palestine,

When asked about the electric concession on Lake Tiberius granted to Pinchus Rutenberg, who built the Jordan hydroelectric station, Sir Philip answered that if the level of the lake would be lowered by the power plant, lead-ing to desecration of the site which has sacred associations, the government will take steps to pre vent such desecration.

The communication points out that while the Department of Commerce lists no glove imports fro Luxembourg, the American ma ket has recently been flooded with leather gloves, carrying the Luce embourg label. This is confirmed by an investigation carried out by the Committee of the America Jewish Congress.

Dr. Tenenbaum's communication declares: "This committee is seriously concerned regarding the ex-traordinary disparity which exists between what we understand to be the dimunitive exportable surplus of kid gloves in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg and the large quantities of these gloves which are being offered for sale in th retail stores of this city, marked 'Made in Luxembourg.'

Believes Reich Mislabels Gloves "If, as we have been led to be lieve, Germany is the principal origin of this supply, it follows that the fiscal regulations of both Luxembourg and the United States are being infringed by unscrupulous traders in order to deceive the very numerous American citizens who are refusing to purchase all kinds of German merchandise, but who would glady acquire the products of Luxembourg and Belgium.

To ascertain with any degre of accuracy the volume of this trade in so-called Luxembourg gloves seems to be impossible, but whereas the Department of Commerce lists no such imports from Luxembourg, we have found retail establishments which sell them almost exclusively in perfect good

"We have no doubt that the grand-ducal government will gladly take measures to stem this abuse at the source if notified of its existence by you," the communica-tion declares.

Department of Commerce statistics show, according to Dr. Tenenbaum, that Germany has been the largest exporter of gloves to the United States, sending here in 1932 3,812,487 pairs, valued at \$2,777,-
