Leaving the Sinking Ship From Asheville, N. C., comes the news that Federal Judge E. Yates Webb signed an or-der directing the United States Marshal to take possession of all property of the Galahad Press, Inc., publisher of Lib-eration, the organ of the Sil-ver Shirts of America. The ver Sint's of America. The Galahad Press admits insolv-ency and "avers that it should be declared bankrupt". Wil-liam Dudley Pelley is the edit-or of Liberation and head of the Silver Shirts.

On the eve of the Congressional investigation into the Nazi activities in the United States, the organ of the Silver Shirts declares itself bankrupt. It now admits its financial insolvency. Its policy was such that it was morally bankrupt before it started on its campaign of rabid anti-Semitism. It tried to serve Hitlerism in the United to serve Hitterism in the United States by spreading the alien polson of hate and bigotry. Now that the Nazi agents in this country have received instruc-tions to watch their step and to conceal the evidence of their activities, their allies are going into hiding, and are rushing away from the sinking ship.

The Arlosoroff Trial

The Arlosoroff trial in Jerusalem is attracting worldwide attention among the Jews. Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, one of the most brilliant Zionists, head of the political department of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, and most popular leader of the labor movement in Palestine, was murdered as he was walkwas murdered as ne was wan-ing with his wife along the sea-shore in Tel Aviv. Three Revi-sionists, Abraham Stavsky, Zvi Rosenblatt and Aba Achimeier, were arrested and charged with the murder of the Jewish labor

The assassination of Arlosoroff has stirred Palestinian Jewry as no other crime stirred it before. It has released a flood of pas-sions and political bitterness. The most fantastic stories have been circulated by the two opposing camps. The most venomous and vicious accusations have been hurled at the leaders.

Whother the accused Revisionists are guilty of the dastardly crime or not, there is no doubt that the leaders of the Revi-sionist organization have had no sandist organization have had no hand in it, and could not have sanctioned it. The character of the leaders is well known to the Jewish world, Among these leaders are men who have devoted themselves as sincerely and as unselfishly in behalf of the re-storation and rehabilitation of Eretz Israel as any other of the outstanding Zionist leaders. They differ in their ideology of the restoration of Palestine, but terrorism cannot be part of any Jewish program in Palestine or

'Could Be Used to Attack Jews Themselves, Asserts Baldwin


The Civil Libertles Union yesterday swung into action against Senator Lazarus Joseph's two anti-Nazi propaganda bilis which were passed the day before by the New York State Senate without

Opening gun in its campaign to kill the measures was a telegram to members of the Rules Committo members of the Rules Commit-tee of the Assembly urging that the bills either be not reported or referred for public hearing. The message characterized the bills as so "general and vague they would penalize all propaganda." It was signed by Roger N. Baldwin, director; Harry F. Ward, chairman, and Arthur Garfield Hays and Morris L. Ernst, counsel.

In a statement to the press Baldwin pointed out that the Joseph measures were so sweeping that they "could be used to attack the Jews themselves."

New 'Declaration of Tolerance' Crowns Defeat of Silver Shirts

HARRISBURG, Pa., April 25.—
A Declaration of Tolerance designed as a "supplement to the Declaration of Independence" was written today into the history of the Pennsylvania Commonwealth.
The declaration was drafted by
Richard J. Beamish, Secretary of the Commonwealth, and bore the signatures of more than a hundred religious, civic, political and eco-

nomic organizations.

The document is "a perpetual memorial against the organization known as the Silver Shirt Legion of America" and against all organizations of similar un-Americations can objectives.

Deport Nazis From Brazil: Attack Jews

Police Beat Back Fascist Assailants; 22 Propagandists Expelled

RIO DE JANEIRO, April 25.—

tacked a Jewish merting held as a protest against anti-Semitism in Brazil. Police intervened at once and beat back the Fascist attack after a clash on the streets.

The German Ambassador in Brazil intervened on b half of the prisoners, but his protests were disregarded and the men deported.

The German-American Chamber of Commerce does not contemplate joining the anti-boycott movement sponsored by the DAWA, the Ger man-American Protective Alliance, according to General Herman A. Metz, the chamber's president.

At his Fifth Avenue office General Metz yesterday spiked a re-port to the effect that his organization would in the near future join the anti-boycott group, as an-nounced by Louis Zahne in his speech at the Nazi meeting held Tuesday night at Schwaben Hall Brooklyn.

"We do not intend to join any political moves or movements. This is a strictly business institu-tion," General Metz declared yes-

In the meantime plans for an all-German department store, first announced about a week ago, are proceeding apace under DAWA auspices. The object of the proauspices. The object of the pro-posed store will be to enable the sympathizers of the anti-boycott movement to purchase merchandise of German origin.

Ask Mayor LaGuardia Curb Nazi Acts Here

A curb on Hitlerite activities was asked of Mayor LaGuardia in a resolution passed last night at a meeting of the Kings Highway Division of the American Jewish Congress, held at Temple Ahavath holom of Flatbush, Avenue R and Last Sixteenth street.

Proposed by Rabbi Benjamin Schultz and adouted unanimously by the 500 people present, the res-olution declared that the local Nazi movement, acknowledging Adolf Hitler as its leader, impelled the ignorant and excitable elements of the population to malien their fellow-citizens of Jewish faith and that violence is being incited by the Horst Wessel song

Miller said he was acting on be-half of himself and his neighbors, who compained that the synagogue was a nuisance; while the rabbi said emphatically, for himself and his friends who prayed with him,

that Miller was greatly mistaken. Justice Smith upheld Rabbi Mordcholowitz.

The trouble started several months ago, Rabbi Mordcholowitz declared yesterday, when he was teaching Hebrew to young men and women at the Ocean Parkway Jewish Center, 490 Ocean park way, Brooklyn. A reverent man, recently arrived from Palestine, Rabbi Mordcholowitz looked sadly upon the current American scene and discovered that orthodoxy was suffering a severe blow.

Yiddish, "I don't favor the way

Last month neighbors took out Last month neighbors took out an injunction against his syna-gogue on the grounds that East Second street, Brooklyn, was in a restricted neighborhood, and that therefore a synagogue ought not to be allowed to exist there. But the court decided that, what with delicatessen stores, tobacco shops and fish markets in the vicinity, nobody could rightfully object to a synagogue.

So, instead of restricting the rabbi, the court restricted the neighbors from taking out any more injunctions. That was month ago.

Stars Are Hungry



Says Canadian Colleges Biased Against Jews

Educator Charges 'Numerus Clausus' Exists in Private Institutions

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
GENEVA, April 13.—That privately-controlled Canadian universitles have within recent years established a "numerus clausus" for Jewish students, is reported in the April issue of More Facts. Ac-cording to Claris E. Silcox, of the Canadian Institute of Social and Canadian institute of Section Religious Research, this restriction ranges from eight to twelve percent, "depending either upon the specific professional training sought, or on some local condi-

Mr. Silcox lists three fundamen-tal factors as contributing to the inauguration of these restrictive measures. One is that the Jew is essentially an urbanite, eighty-six percent of the entire Canadian Jewish population living in ten of Jowish population living in ten of its cities; second, Jewish tradition has always put a premium on learning; and third, the cosmopoli-tan characteristics of the Jew, who "must carry about with him at least two cultures."

Renegade Jew Libels Race In Argentine Fascist Paper

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) BUENOS AIRES, April 9.—"The use of Christian blood for Jewish Passover ceremonies is not at all an innovation," says the writer of an instigatory article in Bandera Argentina, a German-financed fascist publication.

The article is written by one Isac Wertman (or Wortman) Bosch, who became a convert to Christianity to revenge his dis-missal from the ICA (Jewish Colonization Association), of which organization he was an official many years ago.

Bosch's article asserting the practice of the blood ritual is not the first despicable step he has taken against the Jews. More-over, not content merely to broadover, not content merely to broad-cast his invectives, he makes it a point on each such occasion to telephone the officials of the ICA in order to taunt them with his latest "achievement."

The article in question begins with the recent Jewish Telegraphic Agency report to the effect that the Jews of Bulgaria petitioned the synod there to obviate blood ritual propaganda. The degenerate writer in Bandera Argentina uses the report as "evidence" for his shameful assertion.

As further evidence he quotes the case of Mendel Beilis and speaks bitterly of the "Chesen people," which he labels "universal

Quotes Beilis Case "Without going into long and difficult investigations," Bosch writes, "I should like to quote one more case. At the beginning of the century there occurred in the famous city of Kiev an instance of a ritual murder. At that time it was shown that the Jew Beilis had murdered a Christian child in

Christian world trembled with anger because of the horribleness of this sectarian anti-Christian passion."

The writer then includes among his proofs the ten plagues of the Haggadah, and the story of Joseph in Egypt.

Jewish organizations here are considering taking legal action against the author of these charges and his editor. It is thought, however, that it would perhaps be ad-visable for Beilis to institute court proceedings against the two on his own behalf. Some understanding may possibly be reached with North American groups.

Many schoolboys have become volunteer workers and are camping in tents near the groves. Girls in navvy trou-sers are a common sight in the labor contingents.

As a result of intensive activity to help the farmers, the building trade in Tel Aviv is practically at a standstill, in spite of the great need for housing and business premises. It is hoped that the grant of the new immigration quota by the Palestine government will case this pressure.

Quite fortunately, and equally quite by chance, through the medium of a talk delivered by your editor, Mr. Herman Bernstein over the radio one night, I discovered The Jewish Daily Bulletin, the existence of which was unknown to me until that time. I bought it the very next day and it is the first thing I do each morning as soon as I reach a newsstand where same is sold. I do not put it down until I have read every word in it and then I save it. I can only say that I wish that every Jew would know about it and read it. I have done my best to advertise it and have given it to a great number of my friends who were as sur-prised and delighted as I was to learn of its existence. I am sure they are now deligh devoters of this educational and enlightening little sheet. It may be small in size but it is great in importance. As a Jewess I am, naturally,

very interested in the present German situation and also very perturbed, as is every real Jew and a great many non-Jews.

What passes my understanding is the effrontery of a nation and its representatives, busy trying to convince the world that whatever occurs within the boundaries of that nation is its own internal affair and none of the concern of the world.

To illustrate: In Chicago, at the request of a German representa-tive the Mayor of Chicago issued an order banning a German film

denicting the "bloody reign of the Hitler terror." In Prague, upon representations from the German Embassy, they removed carica-tures because the "gentle, delicate and spiritual" rulers, who, as your correspondent stated "can dish it out but can't take it" objected, and so on indefinitely, such as the attempts to interfere with meetngs, publications, lectures, etc., this and other countries, in which attempts, of course, they have not always met with success

have read a great deal of lit erature, pro and con, about the Hitler government and the ridi-culous and assane ideas and lies which it fosters upon its people and which they swallow hook, line and sinker, and I have learned one thing which has always puzzled me, namely why they do the goose step in Germany. They are a flock of geese if they can be made to swallow the drivel which is being fed them, and haven't the sense at same time to see that it is but a ruse to blind them as to what is actually going on and what is being done to the "faithful fol-lowers" that they are being led about with a giant halter and manacled as surely as though they had chains and bolts. It passes all human understanding But then I suppose stupidity is something that does pass understand-ing. I guess there is nothing more blind "than those who will not see."

Let us hope the day will come when these foolish blind people will regain the sense and intelligence with which the world has credited and that intolerance, brutality and stupicity will meet the end they merit.

The action of the Senate in passing such bills without either reference to committee or debate is to be condemned as unthinking submis-sion to a philosophy akin to Hitlerism."

BERLIN, April 25.—The provisional banning of the American film, "Every Woman's Man," starring Max Baer, Jewish playwright prize fighter, which was shown in the United States under the title
"The Prize Fighter and the Lady." was made permanent today by the Nazi authorities.

The Nazis prohibited the showing of the picture anywhere in Germany on the ground that Baer is Jewish. The ban is in line with the pol-

icy, announced some time ago by Propaganda Minister Paul Joseph Goobhels, forbidding the showing in Germany of films starring Jewish actors and also films made by Jewish companies. Nazi storm troopers have been

forbidden to attend cinema houses owned by Jews or which show films with Jewish actors, even when wearing civilian clothes.
