### Leaving the Sinking Ship

From Asheville, N. C., comes the news that Federal Judge E. Yates Webb signed an order directing the United States Marshal to take possession of all property of the Galahad Press, Inc., publisher of the *Silver Shirts of America*. The Galahad Press admits insolvency and "averts that it should be declared bankrupt." William Dudley Pelley is the editor of *Liberation* and head of the *Silver Shirts*.

On the eve of the Congressional investigation into the Nazi activities in the United States, the organ of the *Silver Shirts* declares itself bankrupt. It now admits its financial insolvency. Its policy was such that it was morally bankrupt before it started on its campaign of rabid anti-Semitism. It tried to "drive Hitlerism in the United States by spreading the alien poison of hate and bigotry. Now that the Nazi agents in this country have received instructions to watch their step and to conceal the evidence of their activities, their allies are going in to hiding, and are rushing away from the sinking ship.

### The Arlossoff Trial

The Arlossoff trial in Jerusalem is attracting worldwide attention among the Jews. Dr. Chaim Arlossoff, one of the most brilliant Zionists, head of the political department of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, and most popular leader of the labor movement in Palestine, was murdered as he was walking with his wife along the seashore in Tel Aviv. Three Revisionists, Abraham Stavsky, Zvi Rosenblatt and Aba Achmoller, were arrested and charged with the murder of the Jewish labor leader.

The assassination of Arlossoff has stirred Palestinian Jewry as no other crime stirred it before. It has released a flood of passions and popular bitterness. The most fantastic stories have been circulated by the two opposing camps. The most venomous and vicious accusations have been leveled on the leaders.

Whether the accused Revisionists are guilty of the dastardly crime or not, there is no doubt that the leaders of the Revisionist organization have no hand in it, and could not have sanctioned it. The character of the leaders is well known to the Jewish world. Among these leaders are men who have devoted themselves as sincerely and as unselfishly in behalf of the restoration and rehabilitation of Jewish Israel as any other of the outstanding Zionist leaders. They differ in their ideology of the restoration of Palestine, but terrorism cannot be part of any Jewish program in Palestine or elsewhere. Terrorism is the one

## Civil Liberties Union Attacks Joseph Bills

'Could Be Used to Attack Jews Themselves,' Asserts Baldwin

The Civil Liberties Union yesterday swung into action against Senator Lazarus Joseph's two anti-Nazi propaganda bills which were passed the day before by the New York State Senate without discussion.

Opening gun in its campaign to kill the measures was a telegram to members of the Rules Committee of the Assembly urging that the bills either be not reported or referred for public hearing. The message characterized the bills as so "general and vague they would penalize all propaganda." It was signed by Roger N. Baldwin, director; Harry F. Ward, chairman, and Arthur Garfield Hays and Morris L. Ernst, counsel.

In a statement to the press Baldwin pointed out that the Joseph measures were so sweeping that they "could be used to attack the Jews themselves."

"It is plain," he said, "from the language of these bills that they strike not only at Nazi propaganda, but at any propaganda which stirs up prejudice. Almost all propaganda does that. These bills

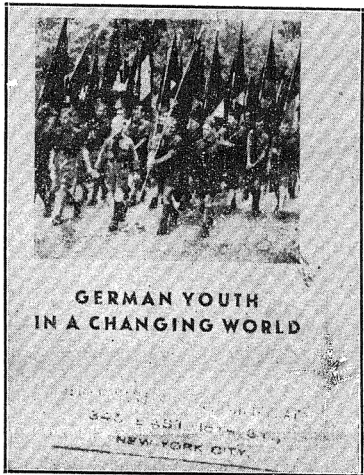

## Rabbi Delegate Force School Walks Out on Pupils to Read Kashruth Body Nazi Matter

Objects to Conservative Propaganda Contained in Books Used at Stuyvesant H. S.

Complications continue to pile up in the kashruth dilemma which Adelman's President Bernard S. Alderman has been for some weeks striving to untangle.

The latest twist is the walkout of Rabbi Jacob Levinson, delegate of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis at the conference which are attempting to clarify the issues. Rabbi Levinson and his supporters object to the suggestion that conservative rabbis have their say in kashruth regulations.

Rabbi L. Seltzer, secretary of the union of Orthodox Rabbis, declared yesterday that kashruth is strictly a religious problem and as such should be handled by strictly

Shortly before it went into conference yesterday afternoon the Board of Education received protests against the alleged inclusion of Nazi propaganda as required reading matter in German classes at the Stuyvesant High School, 245 East Fifteenth street. Superintendent of Schools Dr. Harold G. Campbell, who attended the meeting, and George J. Ryan, president of the Board of Education, had been informed previously of the alleged Nazi attempts to propagandize Hitlerism through the medium of New York high school class work.

According to B. Charney Viadec, chairman of the Jewish Labor Committee and manager of The Jewish Daily Forward, a copy of the book, *German Youth in a Changing World*, had come to his hands with the inscription, "Property of the Stuyvesant High School." Viadec charges that the book was written by ten members of the propaganda department of the Nazi youth movement in Berlin. The special English language edition which came into his possession he described as having been printed for distribution in England, Canada, the United States and other English-speaking countries. Viadec's newspaper expressed sharp resentment that the book should be introduced in New York

## Deport Nazis From Brazil; Attack Jews

Police Beat Back Fascist Assaults; 22 Propagandists Expelled

RIO DE JANEIRO, April 25.—A battle took place today between Brazilian police and members of the anti-Semitic Fascist Integrals today in the city of Belo Horizonte, in the State of Minas Geraes, according to reports reaching here.

The anti-Semitic Fascists attacked a Jewish meeting held as a protest against anti-Semitism in Brazil. Police intervened at once and beat back the Fascist attack after a clash on the streets.

The government of the state of Rio Grande do Sul deported twenty-two German Nazis who were conducting blacklist propaganda in the state against opponents of the Nazis. The German Ambassador in Brazil intervened on behalf of the prisoners, but his protests were disregarded and the men deported.

Deputy Nogueira, a member of the Constituent Assembly, introduced a measure calling for the limitation of immigration into Brazil to five per cent for each nationality on the basis of the census of 1920.

The office of Sao Paulo and Rio de Janeiro decided to take over control of immigration, demanding a guarantee deposit from each immigrant of \$500, the deposit to be returned when the immigrant has been established definitely in the country. The orders make it practically impossible to bring into the country impoverished relatives and German Jewish refugees.

Jewish institutions of Sao Paulo have organized a league to combat the growth of anti-Semitism. The new group issued a paper to the Jews of Brazil to join the organization and to fight the menace of Fascism and anti-Semitism in Brazil.

Maronites, Christian Arabs from the Lebanon and Palestine, who have established large colonies in Brazil, have been organized to raise funds for a campaign against their opponents. They claim that they are being persecuted by Mohammedans, Englishmen and Jews.

## Nazi's 'Race Fleet' Will Tour Hinterland

BERLIN, April 25.—Nazi Germany now has its own "race fleet." Two hundred Nazi doctors, picked for their excellence in making eloquent speeches, have been sent to the cities of Germany as apostles of the Nazi racial doctrine. All the "apostles" have attended a special course in "race politics."

A huge public mass meeting was held in Berlin as a send-off for the racial expedition. Dr. Rado Hergin, told the meeting that the "whole scientific world must join in enlightening the youth of the land on racial science."



# The Ku Klux Klan Riding Again

## Jews and Catholics Are Objects Of Their Malignant Activities

From Long Beach, Cal., to Long Island Units  
Spring Up—Impetus Given Affiliate  
Movement by Nazi Propaganda

Nazi activities in this country have been brought to a head by the first open attack on the Jews of America by the Friends of New Germany, Hitler organization in the United States, which has proclaimed a boycott on the Jews. The following is the seventh of a series of articles detailing the rise and growth of the Nazi-inspired anti-Semitic movement in this country in all its ramifications. The articles are based on an exhaustive investigation of Nazi propaganda activities in this country of over a year.

The Ku Klux Klan, which was to have been dissolved about eight years ago, is again taking part in the fight against the Jews and Catholics. From the be-sheduled ranks of the KKK have emerged leaders of local Fascist groups throughout the United States, and the mother group, shows off its terrorist powers, continues to unleash occasional broadsides, which are considerably muffled in the campaign now being waged by far more powerful Fascist forces which have come to the front with complete political, social, and economic philosophies.

From Long Beach, California, to Long Island, New York, the Klan has stirred from its lethargy. Circulars with the Klan insignia have been found in widely separated communities announcing: "Communism will not be tolerated! The Ku Klux Klan rides again!"

The Klan was revived in the East after a three year lull at Freeport, Long Island, last September. There they made plans for the distribution of propaganda and eventual resumption of terrorist operations.

The Klan began its new campaign with a show of fraternal feeling for German Nazi groups in New York and California. In the latter state, the Silver Legion had drawn heavily from the ranks of the Klan and there appears to be an interlocking of membership among the groups. The Silver Shirt alliance with the League of Friends of New Germany has been described in other articles.

KIKK Woos Nazis  
First overtures to the Nazis were made by Harry W. Goring, Grand Dragon of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., of the State of New York, when he delivered before the Brooklyn a scathing attack on Jews and promised the support of his group in any anti-Jewish movement begun by German-Americans to end anti-Kludd boycotts. Since then he has given a number of anti-Jewish lectures before the League of Friends of New Germany both on Long Island and in Manhattan. Recently his sentiments have been received more cordially than on the occasion of his Brooklyn address, which was delivered at a time when the Fladddeutscher Volksverein was not thoroughly Hitlerized.

The Kourier, monthly publica-

tion of the Klan, is nationally circulated from Atlanta, Georgia. In this magazine appear frequent denials that the Klan is in league with "the Blue Pants, Silver Shirts, and Cauder Vests" and in one number it was said that "we do not wish them well because we know that some of the men promoting such organizations do not deserve our good wishes." This may well be regarded as an effort on the part of the Klan to stem the sweeping of its members into the ranks of stronger, more active Fascist groups. The Klan hopes that one day the fiery cross will again be planted in all the states.

At the present the Klan is most active in Oklahoma, which, incidentally provides headquarters for many reactionary and Fascist groups. Klan demonstrations, replete with flaming crosses and sheets, have recently been held at Tulsa, Kay County, Bethany, and Oltion.

**The Flaming Cross**  
In New Jersey and Pennsylvania recently the number of flaming crosses have been on the increase, particularly in southern New Jersey and northeastern Pennsylvania. The strongest support of the Klan comes from the smaller towns and villages. Since the federal cleanup of these organizations a decade ago, the Klan has confined its activities mainly to innocuous social affairs, although occasional anonymous threatening letters are received, bearing the stamp of the KKK.

In Illinois, the Klan is most active in and near DeKalb where they meet in the Knights of Pythias Hall and abandoned farms. The Indiana chapter headquarters is at Hammond. Florida has a great many groups with the strongest holding forth in Tampa and environs. Orlando, Daytona Beach, De Land, Eustis, Dunedin, Sanford, Ocala, and Bushnell form Province Number Three. Province Number Six is composed of units in Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland, Massachusetts, Louisiana, Connecticut, Rhode Island (a joint province), West Virginia, Maryland, Wyoming, Georgia, Ohio, and Washington.

In New York, outside of a number of units on Long Island, the Klan maintains strong and active units in Albany, Bellerose, Horeheads, Binghamton, Endicott, Harpersville, Cortland and Oswego. Mineola and Freeport are Klan activity centers on Long Island.

From Inside Out  
The Klan is not by any means as active in national politics as some of its foster children, the Silver Shirts, Khaki Shirts (even in their decrepit state), the Order of "73," and the Crusader White Shirts. Klan activities are confined to local politics, which in many sections of the country they manage to handle effectively. The Klan's inherent hate of the Jew and acquired antipathy for Communism makes it an ally of Fascist forces, and the Klan, it now appears, has proven an excellent training school for many who now lead separate Fascist and anti-Semitic movements against the Jews.

An offshoot of the Ku Klux Klan is the Industrial Defense Association which was incorporated in

source of subsidy for the spread of this propaganda in the United States, and when last heard from Easley had not made this known even to members of an "American Section of the International Committee to Combat the World Menace of Communism," whose names had been appended to the volume. Congressman Hamilton Fish withdrew his name from the list shortly after the nature of the book became known.

Cortrupe Beels Easley, Easley's wife, has written frequently for Amerikas Deutsche Post, a New York publication which specializes in fanatical anti-Semitism and pro-Communism and which was once the organ for the revamped Nazi Party in the United States. Mrs. Easley was granted permission to use the address of the New York offices of the Sons of the American Revolution for her anti-Communist activities (which one might judge from their nature are pro-Fascist), although officials of that organization disclaimed any knowledge of the type of work she was carrying on.

George Sylvester Viereck, wartime pro-German propagandist and present day propagandist for the Hitler government, is another distributor of these books, while they can also be found in almost any Nazi book shop.

1926 under the laws of the State of Massachusetts. Its expressed purpose is "to inculcate the principles of Americanism and to oppose Socialism and Communism among the people of the United States," but thus far it has proven an organ for inciting the country to persecution and pogrom against the Jew. It is "a strictly Gentile association."

Edward Hunter, once a private detective in Lynn, Mass., is the Executive Secretary of the association. Through his offices a number of books and pamphlets condemning Jewry as the controllers of Soviet Russia and Communism abroad are circulated through the country. An official publication of the association, "What's What," has contained many bitter attacks against the Jews in description of Socialist and Communist activities abroad and in the United States. Among the literature distributed by this agency is much of the material now being written and published by Nazis in Germany. It claims association with American patriotic and fraternal societies, police departments, military authorities, and the immigration, naturalization, deportation and legal departments of the national government.

Among the many societies which have aligned themselves in the Ku Klux Klan and to some extent the American Nazis in the fight against Communism, are the National Civic Federation, the American Vigilant Intelligence Federation, the Better American Federation, the National Security League, the American Defense Society, and many others.

The manner in which these organizations frequently ally themselves (perhaps altogether unwittingly) with American Fascist groups may be cited in the case of the National Civic Federation, which has as its chairman Ralph Easley of New York. A few months ago Easley distributed copies of a book "Communism in Germany" throughout the country. The book bespeaks an exaggerated conception of the "red menace" in Germany, contained passages which would reflect against the Jews.

Easley sent a large quantity of these books to William Dudley Pelley, who has since been selling them at fifty cents the copy. Easley distributed them, according to his statements, free of charge. He has been unwilling to disclose the

## Says Canadian Colleges Biased Against Jews

### Educator Charges 'Numerus Clausus' Exists in Private Institutions

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)  
 GENEVA, April 13.—That privately-controlled Canadian universities have within recent years established a "numerus clausus" for Jewish students, is reported in the April issue of *More Facts*. According to Claris E. Silcox, of the Canadian Institute of Social and Religious Research, this restriction ranges from eight to twelve percent, "depending either upon the specific professional training sought, or on some local condition."

Mr. Silcox lists three fundamental factors as contributing to the inauguration of these restrictive measures. One is that the Jew is essentially an urbanite, eighty-six percent of the entire Canadian Jewish population living in ten of its cities; second, Jewish tradition has always put a premium on learning; and third, the cosmopolitan characteristics of the Jew, who "must carry about with him at least two cultures."

Antipathy to Jewish students is, in some measure, also based on the fact that while a large proportion of them win scholarships, few scholarship or bursary funds have been supplied by wealthy Jews.

### Revisionist Zionists Unite in Germany; Kareski Heads Group

 BERLIN, April 7.—Three State Zionist (Revisionist) groups have united and formed an all-German State Zionist Organization for the avowed purpose of promoting among German Jews the aims and ideas of State Zionism in the Herzlian sense. Georg Kareski, former president of the Berlin Jewish Community, has been chosen head of the new unit and Adolf Hirschfeld, formerly chairman of the State Zionist Organization, is vice-president.

The three groups, representing all the Revisionists in Germany who have united, are the State Zionist Organization, the League of Jewish Revisionists and the League of State Zionists.

### English Insurance Co.'s Biased Against Jewish Car Drivers

 LONDON, April 4.—Because Jewish car drivers are less and make big claims and small damages," certain insurance companies specializing in motor car insurance have come out openly in their discrimination against according accounts from members of that faith, according to the Daily Herald.

Companies which have hitherto discouraged Jewish applications by technical excuses and demands for documents for proof of place of birth, driving experience, etc., now aver their dislike of accepting Jewish accounts.

### Sephardic Jews Aided

## Renegade Jew Libels Race In Argentine Fascist Paper

 BUENOS AIRES, April 8.—"The use of Christian blood for Jewish Passover ceremonies is not at all an innovation," says the writer of an insinuating article in *Bandera Argentina*, a German-financed fascist publication.

The article is written by one Isaac Wertman (or Wortman) Bosch, who became a convert to Christianity to revenge his dismissal from the ICA (Jewish Colonization Association), of which organization he was an official many years ago.

Bosch's article asserting the practice of the blood ritual is not the first despicable step he has taken against the Jews. Moreover, not content merely to broadcast his invectives, he makes it a point on each such occasion to telephone the officials of the ICA in order to taunt them with his latest "achievement."

The article in question begins with the recent Jewish Telegraphic Agency report to the effect that the Jews of Bulgaria petitioned the synod there to obviate blood ritual propaganda. The degenerate writer in *Bandera Argentina* uses the report as "evidence" for his shameful assertion.

As further evidence he quotes the case of Mendel Bellis and speaks bitterly of the "Chosen people," which he labels "universal parasite."

**Quotes Bellis Case**  
 "Without going into long and difficult investigations," Bosch writes, "I should like to quote one more case. At the beginning of the century there occurred in the famous city of Kiev an instance of a ritual murder. At that time it was shown that the Jew Bellis had murdered a Christian child in order to use his blood for the ritual acts of Passover. The whole

Christian world trembled with anger because of the horribleness of this sectarian anti-Christian passion."

The writer then includes among his proofs the ten plagues of the Haggadah, and the story of Joseph in Egypt.

Jewish organizations here are considering taking legal action against the author of these charges and his editor. It is thought, however, that it would perhaps be advisable for Bellis to institute court proceedings against the two on his own behalf. Some understanding may possibly be reached with North American groups.

A brother of Mendel Bellis lives in this city.

### Husband-Beater Fined By Palestine Court; Bar Testimony of Children

 TEL AVIV, April 10.—Sandra Tawail, Yememite Jew who is about sixty years of age, and his wife were required by the Magistrate here to pay a deposit of five pounds apiece on the promise that they will not come to blows for one year.

The wife is charged with beating her husband.

Sandra said the wife had struck him repeatedly and brought his three sons, aged nine, ten and eleven years old respectively, to testify.

The lady claimed that it was she who had been beaten and she brought a fifteen year old girl to testify.

Magistrate Kornegoren forbade the youngsters from testifying against their parents. He ordered the couple to keep the peace.

## Abdullah Says Labor Shortage No Politics in Hurts Farming Visit to London In Palestine

### Arab Press States Emir Will Rule Palestine and Transjordan

 JERUSALEM, April 25.—Emir Abdullah of Transjordan, who today was host at a luncheon in Amman in honor of Moshe Shorok, member of the political department of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, ridiculed the idea that his protective visit to London was for the purpose of negotiating with the British government.

Stories current in the Arab press throughout the Near East state that the Emir's visit to London is in preparation to his being crowned king of Palestine and Transjordan.

The London Colonial Office has emphatically denied the story, stating that the Emir's visit to London in June is merely one of courtesy.

### Preserve Your Judaism, Reich Jews Are Told

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)  
 BERLIN, April 11.—A plea that German Jews who expect to remain in the country "maintain the existence of Judaism" and show that they are not merely Jews who hang on the edge," was made by Heinrich Stern, president of the Representative Assembly of the Berlin Jewish community and president of the Federation of Liberal Jews in Germany, in an address at a meeting of the Community's Representative Assembly.

"The existence of Palestine in whose upbuilding all sections of Jewry are showing increased and lively interest is of especial importance to Jews. But those who wish to remain in Germany should remain faithful to their faith," he declared.

### Throng of Workers Take Leave of Building Trade in Cities

(J.D.B. Special Correspondence)  
 TEL AVIV, April 9.—Nearly 1,500 men in the towns and colonies have been recruited to help in the orange picking and other seasonal agricultural works which are being neglected because of shortage of labor. Most of these recruits have relinquished lucrative jobs in building trades in order to aid the farmers, lest they lose their agricultural season. Many schoolboys have become volunteer workers and are camping in tents near the groves. Girls in navy trousers are a common sight in the labor contingents.

As a result of intensive activity to help the farmers, the building trade in Tel Aviv is practically at a standstill, in spite of the great need for housing and business premises. It is hoped that the grant of the new immigration quota by the Palestine government will ease this pressure.

## Adler to Talk at Birthday of Boston Temple

### Eminent Jewish Leader to Deliver Address There

BOSTON, April 25.—Dr. Cyrus Adler, president of the Jewish Theological Seminary of New York and head of Dropsie College, Philadelphia, will be the guest of honor and principal speaker at the celebration next Sunday of the seventy-fifth anniversary of Temple Families Temple.

Noted figures in civic, philanthropic, education and religious fields are expected to participate in the event. Speakers will include prominent New England rabbis, heads of leading institutions, and the Mayor of Boston.

Rabbi H. H. Rubenowitz and Elhu-ah Stone, president of the Temple Congregation, head the celebration committee. The musical program will be directed by Professor S. Bratslavsky, musical director of the Temple, assisted by the Temple choir and Cantor I. G. Glikenstein. A reception and dinner will be given Dr. Adler following the exercises.

## Attack Jewish Students at Wisconsin College Under 'Red-Bait' Guise

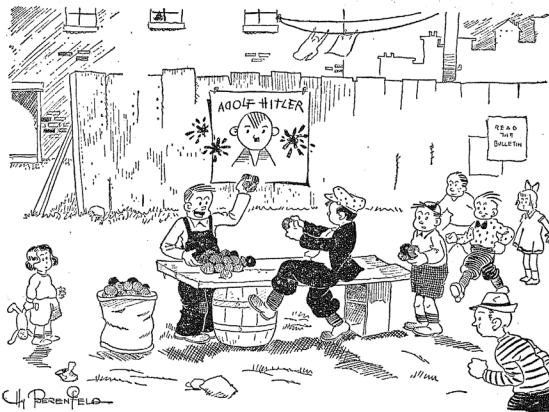

MADISON, Wis., April 25.—Fast upon the heels of one prejudice incident at the University of Wisconsin came another in the form of an accusation that certain university students were leading an anti-Semitic attack under the cloak of red-baiting.

A few weeks ago The Daily Capitalist, a local publication, declared that three qualified students who had been running for election to campus posts had been defrocked because of being Jews.

Victor Marcus, editor of The New Student, university organ of the local National Student League, advised that a group of students, headed by William Haight, campus radical-baiter, had gone to advertisers in The New Student, urging them to desist from publishing the magazine on the ground that it was run by New York Jews who did not spend money in Madison. Haight admitted the charge but declared that both Jews and Gentiles comprised the group which was fighting The New Student, and added that their opposition to the publication was based not especially on the fact that The New Student is run by Jews, but on the basis of anti-semitism and anti-Americanism of the publication.

Marcus plans an appeal to university authorities to stop the activities of Haight and his group.

## Jews Not Unified, Dr. Freehof States

Communities in Large Cities Have Two-Fold Purpose, He Says at Luncheon

(J.D.B. Special Correspondence)  
CHICAGO, April 24.—The problem of the Jewish community in every large city, such as Chicago, is two-fold, Dr. Solomon B. Freehof, of K. A. M. Congregation, told members of the Community Council of the Jewish Charities of Chicago, who honored him at a farewell luncheon held at the Standard Club. He will retire in August to go to Congregation Rodot Sholom in Pittsburgh.

"First the community must have decent mutual respect between the various Jewish groups," Dr. Freehof said in his talk on "The Chicago Jewish Community in Retrospect." "Secondly, it is necessary to conquer the vast mass of irresponsible and unaffiliated Jews."

Using the Chicago community as the "perfect example," Dr. Freehof declared the fact that the Jewish community only seems able to come together on special occasions and that immediately breaks up into its various component parts. This, he declared, is true not only in Chicago but in all large American cities.

"There is nobody who can speak for the Chicago Jewish community. In every great American city the groups of Jews are just a milling mob. We have no Jewish community."

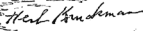

The text of the Declaration of Tolerance follows:

"To the Secretary of the Commonwealth, Honorable Richard J. Beamish:

"This protest has been signed as a perpetual memorial against the organization known as the Silver Shirt Legion of America, Inc.

"We protest against the issuance of a charter for either a business corporation or a non-profit

corporation by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to any organization whose purpose either directly or indirectly makes for religious or racial intolerance or hatred.

"We also protest against the issuance of a certificate of authority to any foreign corporation seeking to do business in Pennsylvania, whose objectives either directly or indirectly make for intolerance or bigotry.

"We, as individuals and as representatives of organizations whose mandates we are commissioned to express, believe that this Commonwealth founded by William
