An American Lesson

The Declaration of Tolerance, as a supplement to the Declaration of Independence, written into the history of the Pennsylvania Commonwealth, in connection with the application of the Silver Shirts for a certificate of incorporation, is an inspiring gesture which cannot fail to create a wholesome impression at this particular time. Drafted by Richard J. Beamish, Secretary of the Commonwealth, the document bears the signatures of more than a hundred religious, civic, political and economic organizations, and is a perpetual memorial against the organization known as the Silver Shirt Legion and similar un-American organizations.

The text of the "Declaration of Tolerance" contains the following passages:

"We protest against the issuance of a charter for either a business corporation or a non-profit corporation by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to any organization whose purpose either directly or indirectly makes for religious or racial intolerance or hatred."

"We also protest against the issuance of a certificate of authority to any foreign corporation seeking to do business in Pennsylvania, whose objectives either directly or indirectly make for intolerance or bigotry."

At the last moment representatives of the Silver Shirts withdrew their application for a certificate of incorporation by telegraph, but the hearing was held and the un-American organization was effectively rebuked.

In New York, at the Silver Shirt pro-Nazi meetings, envelopes containing the "literature" of the Silver Shirts are still being sold. These envelopes bear the inscription: "Hail, Patriot! Act to save your home—your family, your country and your constitution." Each envelope contains twenty-five cents, contains "the Truth about Communism in our Government, the Alien International Bankers and the Secret World Conspiracy."

And the Silver Shirts ask, among other questions, the following:

"Do you know that forty millions of this nation are living on charity, during a period of natural abundance?"

"Do you know that charity is being deliberately encouraged, that the resources of all may be depleted and thus the citizenry be subject to the plotters?"

"Do you know that Trotsky, alias Brannman, was a New York Jew, and that he was employed by Jacob Schiff of Kuhn Loeb & Company of New York (Continued on Page Eight)"

Levant Fair Opens In Tel Aviv; Thousands Attend Ceremonies

Many Nations Plan to Set Up Concessions—Interest is Worldwide—Palestine Government Cooperating

TEL AVIV, April 26.—The Levant Fair opened here today in the presence of twenty-four delegations representing foreign governments and thousands of guests and tourists attracted from all parts of the world to the annual Near East Exposition. Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchop, High Commissioner of Palestine and patron of the exposition presided at the formal opening ceremonies this afternoon.

The Fair, which will continue until May 26, is one of the most

important trade exhibitions in the East. It is aimed not only to attract trade to Palestine but also to draw the attention of the world to the increasing importance of the Near Eastern markets in the world trade.

The exposition grounds this year occupy more than 120,000 square yards of ground and the Fair is expected to attract over a half million people.

The first formal event of the Fair was a luncheon in honor of Sir Arthur, the heads of government (Continued on Page Eight)

75% Suburban Jews In Poland Are Starving

Deputy Reveals Terrible Economic Situation Confronting Them

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
WARSAW, April 26.—Seventy-five per cent of the Jewish population in the small towns of Poland are dying of starvation, Deputy M. Wisniewski declared today in an address before the Central Organization of Jewish Merchants, of which he is president.

Other speakers at the annual meeting of the group agreed that the terrible economic conditions in which Polish Jews find themselves is caused by the general growth of the Jewish population of the country, coupled with the simultaneous decline of the merchant class owing to the heavy burden of taxation imposed upon them.

Court Acquits Accused Jews

They Boosted Bureya Colony—Judge Rules They Did Not Hurt Poland

LODZ, Poland, April 26.—Two Polish Jews charged with having agitated against immigration to Palestine and in favor of immigration to Bureya, Siberia, set aside by the Soviet authorities for Jewish colonization, were acquitted today by a local court.

The court held that while agitation for colonization in Bureya was contrary to the interests of Palestine, it was not in any way harmful to the interests of Poland.

Bureya, in the Far Eastern region of Siberia, in which the Soviet authorities hope to establish an autonomous Jewish republic, has been the center of a controversy between the Zionists who denounce it as an attempt to turn the interests of the Jews from Palestine, and the Jewish Communist advocates of colonization within the Soviet Union.

Soviet Honors Jewish Fliers' Arctic Rescues

Awards Six Airmen Titles 'Hero of the Soviet Union'

MOSCOW, April 26.—Six Soviet Jewish fliers who participated in the arduous rescue of the survivors of the Chelyuskin Arctic expedition were today given the title "Hero of the Soviet Union." In addition each of the fliers received the Order of Lenin, one of the highest decorations of the Soviet Union, and an extra year's salary. The title "Hero" was created for the airmen by a special decree issued by the Central Executive Committee of the Soviet Union, the highest ruling body of the country.

The 104 men and women who were on the Chelyuskin expedition were awarded The Order of the Red Star. The Jewish flier Yevgeny was also awarded The Order of the Red Star.

Jewish Officer Died in Transfer
The Chelyuskin, Soviet icebreaker carrying an Arctic expedition under the command of Professor Otto Schmidt, was crushed by the Arctic ice floes. Boris Mogilwitsch, Jewish supply officer of the expedition, was killed during the transfer of supplies from the ship to the ice-floes. The ability of the group to survive was ascribed to the heroic work of Mogilwitsch in transferring all (Continued on Page Eight)

WARSAW, April 26.—The Jewish labor boxing club, the "Polski Związek Bojowy," notified the Polish Boxing Association that the Polish Jewish amateur boxing champion Rotholz, as a member of the club, would not compete against German teams at Poznan this coming Sunday in the boxing matches between fighters of the two countries to be held there.

Early in April the Polish Boxing Association chose Rotholz to represent Poland at the matches in Poznan and to represent the country in matches in Czechoslovakia and the Olympic games in 1936.

Joseph Bills Are Killed; Too Drastic, Reason

Many Acts Not Intended By Senator Would Be Misdemeanors

ALBANY, April 26.—Although passed in the Senate where they were introduced by Senator Joseph of the Bronx, the two anti-Nazi bills were killed in the Assembly rules committee, the members of which felt the measures might prove too drastic in their effects.

It was said in the rules committee that many acts intended by the legislator would be construed as misdemeanors under the bills' broad terms. The measures would declare criminal propaganda, uniforms and insignia tending to cause race prejudice.

The Civil Liberties Union is among those opposed to anti-propaganda legislation pending other state legislatures on the ground that under its provisions restrictions would be imposed on others than those intended in the measures.

Samuel Alleges She Urged Rosenberg to Admit Guilt

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JERUSALEM, April 26.—Mrs. Sima Arlosoroff, widow of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, occupied the witness stand today at both sessions of the trial of the three Revisionist Zionists accused of the murder of her husband.

As Mrs. Arlosoroff left the building at the end of the morning session she was booed by a large crowd of Revisionist sympathizers gathered outside. Presiding Judge Corrie, at the opening of the afternoon session, sharply condemned the demonstration against her and warned against a repetition. Defense counsel Horace Samuel joined with the presiding judge in his condemnation of the demonstration.

The widow of the murdered man unexpectedly concluded her testimony this afternoon, despite the fact that she had been expected to testify for several days.

When the court session opened this morning, a bitter but quiet fight developed between Mrs. Arlosoroff and attorney Samuel. Despite the attempts of Samuel to have her admit that at the time her husband was shot she cried "Arab! shot him," she denied over and over again having said anything of the sort. She insisted that she had yelled, "Jews shot him." She also denied having said that she couldn't shoot at the murderers because her hands were shaking. She declared that neither she nor her husband were armed the night of the murder.

At Little's Testimony
Samuel questioned her again on the position of the murderers at the time her husband was shot. She declared that she was unable to remember the exact position, thus enabling Samuel to repeat his argument of yesterday that the murderer was a left-handed man, (Continued on Page Eight)

Dickstein Promises Startling Revelations At Probe Hearings

WASHINGTON, April 26.—Preliminary hearings will be started here as soon as counsel is allowed to direct inquiry into material collected by secret operatives in connection with the House committee probe into Nazi and other anti-American propaganda.

Representative Dickstein of New York, who brought about the inquiry, declared that the information already unearthed by investigators will startle the nation by its subversive character.

The tour of inquiry will open in Asheville, N. C., a hotbed of the Silver Shirt movement and whose activities will be looked into in Philadelphia, New York, Boston, Detroit, Chicago, San Francisco and Los Angeles.

Jewish Life Reviewed in Latest Cables and Letters

Lazare Will Be Feted 30 Years After His Death

France Forms Group to Pay Homage to Historian

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
PARIS, April 10.—To celebrate the thirtieth anniversary of the death of Bernard Lazare, famous French-Jewish historian and poet, a committee has just been formed in France under the presidency of Senator Jean Luchaire, former member of the French Cabinet.

The work to which French Jews as well as Jews are this year paying homage is this champion of Jewishness in a world of bigots. It is his presentation of the Jewish side to Europe that was something with anti-Semitism. His greatest work, which has immortalized him in his "Anti-Semitism, Its History and Its Causes," which he published in Paris, in 1894, and in which he reviewed anti-Semitism from the early days of the Christian era. It was an answer to the persecution of Jews in Russia, Rumania and Germany of those days and to the anti-Semitism which began to raise its head even in France at that time and which culminated in the Dreyfus case.

It was largely due to the writings of Bernard Lazare, whose works have been translated into all languages of Europe, that the more progressive elements in European countries began to see the justice of the Jewish side of the story, and that anti-Semitism yielded its place to a more fair-minded attitude toward Jews.

Bernard Lazare distinguished himself particularly in connection with the Dreyfus case, as he was one of the principal champions of the innocently accused Jew in the French press, and helped to reestablish the Jew in French public opinion through his writings.

The famous Dreyfus case of thirty years ago, when anti-Semitism dominated France as Hitlerism does Germany today, has been brought to life again in France by the well-known French writer, Armand Lanster, in his new book just published under the title "Histoire de l'Affaire Dreyfus."

Although the new work in no way changes what the French have long ago accepted as definite proof of the innocence of the man who had been convicted purely because of anti-Jewish agitation, it brings out many new facts about anti-Semitism in France at the beginning of the present century, when the position of the Jew in France was very much similar to that of the Jew in Germany today. The book is based upon recently discovered documentary evidence, the Schwarzkoppen files, which add new proofs of the unfair anti-Jewish bigotry of those days and helps to vindicate the Jew in French eyes.

Reich - Jewish School Children Keep Sabbath

Gov't Order Sanctions Observance of Holidays

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
BERLIN, April 11.—A new government order issued here grants the right to Jewish parents to keep their children from attending school on the Sabbath. The Board of the Free Federation for the Interests of Orthodox Jewry issued a circular to all German rabbis calling their attention to the order.

"If parents do not avail themselves of the alternative and the youngsters attend school on the Sabbath," says the circular, "they will become accustomed from early youth to the complete desecration of the Sabbath."

"The formulation of the government order suggests that it expects Jewish parents in whose life religion plays any part at all, to make use of the right to keep their children away from school on the Sabbath."

"We would quote as an example of what should be done the attitude adopted in a middling town in Hessen where the Jewish population is overwhelmingly liberal. The town consented to keep the children from school. We should urge that the community arrange for supplementary classes for those children who fall back in their school work because of regular absence on the Sabbath."

Young Demonstrators Receive Jail Sentence

TBL AVIV, April 9.—Three more youths, Kerman, Ehrlich and Friedman, charged with participation in the demonstration against illegal immigrants hunting last December, have been sentenced to two months of hard labor. Magistrate Ralph Bodilly told the accused that protest against immigration restrictions would influence the government to curtail immigration of young men of their type.

South African Zionists Plan Palestine Venture

HAIFA, April 9.—A group of South African Zionist leaders who have been visiting Palestine decided to establish a new investment and insurance corporation with a capital of £100,000.

The heads of the corporation will be Nicholas Kirschner, president of the South African Zionist Federation, and J. Fraund, past president of the federation.

Jews Existed In South Spain Until Recently

Were Descended From Victims of Royal Edict of 1492

PARIS, April 10.—Despite five hundred years of strict enforcement of the laws excluding Jews from Spain, until recently there remained in the southern provinces of Spain thousands of descendants of the Jews who stayed in Spain after the Royal Edict of 1492, expelling all Jews from Spanish lands, according to the results of a survey published in the "Cahiers Juifs" of Paris.

These Spanish Jews, who are the direct descendants of that section of Jewish population of Spain who were allowed to remain in Spain because they openly accepted Christianity, have been conforming to Christian faith only externally, but in the intimacy of their homes continued to adhere to Judaism.

To the population at large they are known as Christians, as they attend Church and have their children baptized and comply with all the outward requirements of the Catholic Church of Spain. At the same time they still continue to celebrate the Jewish holidays and identify themselves as Jews among others of their own race.

Have Two Groups They classify themselves into two groups: the Black Jews and the White Jews. The Black Jews is the name applied to those who strictly adhere to all Jewish observances, and confess Christianity only as an outward form, while the White Jews observe only parts of the Jewish ritual, which consists of a mixture of Catholic and Jewish observances, although they too, acknowledge themselves as Jews among their own.

Centuries of secretiveness in order to avoid detection by the Catholic Church have left their imprints on these Jews in their accents from the rest of the population. Some of them occupy high places in government and church, and only rarely does one of them openly confess Jewish descent. The Jews' motto is the motto of the Spanish ambassador to the Court of the Czar of Russia. Senor Mendizabal, who when a discussion came up as to titles of nobility, said he could trace his nobility further back than any of the dukes and counts present, for he traced his descent to the Patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. He was a member of one of the Jewish Spanish families which secretly retained their Judaism for centuries.

Arab Leaders in Riots Of October, 1933, Appeal From Terms

JERUSALEM, April 8.—An appeal has been lodged by the fifteen Arab leaders convicted of participation in the bloody October 1933 disturbances at Jaffa, against their sentences ranging from five to eleven months' imprisonment. Chief grounds for the appeal are that these leaders were under the impression that the demonstrations had been legalized in view of a promise by District Commissioner Crosbie to receive a delegation which would proceed from the Jaffa Mosque to the government offices, a distance of about 200 yards.

Student at Hebrew University Describes His Activities There

GENEVA, April 12.—The April issue of *Moro Facts*, an "international student service," of which John G. McNaughton of Montreal is editor, features an article on "Student Life in Jerusalem," by Eliezer Elizer (Urdang), M.A., a graduate of Hebrew University.

"A fundamental difference," Mr. Elizer writes, "exists between the life of the Jewish student in Jerusalem and that of his brother Jewish students in other universities of the world. Three factors go to make up this basic dissimilarity: the place, the university, and the student body."

A student at Hebrew university, the author writes, is distinguished from his brothers abroad by a "feeling of spiritual stability, which in other places is cherished by the farmer whose meadows are his sole sphere in life and in whom a sturdy dog and satisfaction are inspired by the sight of the lush

verdancy resulting from the sweat of his brow and the toil of his hands."

Mr. Elizer describes the students as being for the most part pioneers who work for their livelihood and attend lectures in their leisure hours. "Some," he says, "have to give up their studies altogether in order to work; others who obtain remittances from their parents cannot forego what is to them the pleasure of engaging in rural labor in the summer recess. Last summer and during the Passover vacations many of the students were recruited to work in the Jewish colonies to relieve the state of under-employment resulting from State-restricted immigration."

New York University Sending Large Jewish Squad

However, N.Y.U. seems to be making up its deficiency and the Violet sprinters and field men are due to arrive on the eleven o'clock train. The Jewish athletic representative in the person of young Levi will be on hand to greet them inasmuch as there is a good chance of grubbing a meal at the Hall of Famers' expense.

Von Ellingsen Strong In Sprint Field Events

The University Heights' lads, forty-two in number, are registered into nineteen events. The Jewish athletes who will do their bit on the cinders and over the grass are Sidney Bernstein, George Weinstein, Charles Siegel, Eddie Charlop and Danny Skudowitz. In the field events N.Y.U. has the able Ed Finkelshtien and the Scheuer, two lads who have led the metropolitan shot put tide in recent months.

Besides these Jewish athletes, N.Y.U. is sure of points for its team title by the performance of George Spitz in the high jump and by Pete Zarembo in the hammer throw. The latter was the hammer throw champion in 1932, 1933 and in the Olympics.

City College Out of Running

The Lewisham Stadium City College looks as though a Dilling outfit had held an annual reunion there. It's all planned and dug up and it's in the same condition next September. Benny Friedman will be able to run a couple of hidden ball plays behind one of the dirt piles. Nevertheless, the spring sports have had to be canceled. 

Rafferty Bill Passage in N. J. Called Unlikely

Legislature Closing on Tuesday Leaves Little Time for Action

(Special to the J.D.B.) TRENTON, N. J., April 26.—Announcement here today that the Legislature will meet next Monday but adjourn on Tuesday night after May 15 leaves outlook for passage of the much-discussed Rafferty Bill against vicious propaganda and more unlikely. In view of the fact that the annual appropriations bill is to be introduced in the Legislature Monday it is very problematical whether the Senate will even consider the Rafferty Bill, even though the Assembly has already passed the measure.

However, on Saturday and Sunday there will be a week-end conference in Atlantic City of the joint Republican conference committee and it is possible the matter will be considered among the items to be taken up after Tuesday recess, although due cognizance must be taken of the fact that Assemblyman Rafferty, sponsor of the measure, is the Democratic minority leader.

The adjournment over May 15 will be taken primarily because of the state primary election, which is which is now on in full force.

The Jewish National Fund is sponsoring the dinner as a tribute to Menahem Ussishkin, world president of the Keren Kayemet Le Israel, in celebration of his seventieth anniversary, in connection with which a world movement is on foot to honor him by establishing a new settlement in Palestine to be known as Kfar Ussishkin.

B'nai B'rith Installs Urging humanity to war against Hitlerism, Alfons Goldschmidt, exiled German professor, attacked the Nazi regime in an address at ceremonies marking the initiation of 300 new members into District 1 of B'nai B'rith at Temple Emanuel, 1 East Sixty-fifth street, last night.

Propaganda Goldschmidt said: "Hitler preaches peace and prepares for war. He preaches for a larger population and diminishes it with wholesale murder. He talks of eliminating class and he is engaged in creating one of the bitterest class wars in history. Hitler talks of the general welfare of the people, but increases their misery."

'Shirts' Met in Yorkville The Yorkville contingent of William Dudley Pelley's Silver Shirts met at "Globe" membership meeting last night in the dingy basement of the Turn Verein at 182 East Eighty-fifth street.

Aside from taking the names and addresses of "Globe" members men and women, many of whom spoke German, the principal business of the evening was the sale of Silver Shirt literature. The propaganda material enjoyed a brisk sale. Among the items being sold was an envelope containing membership application blanks. Leaders of the party were the Silver Ranger and Liberation, recently suspended publication, and a copy of Representative Louis T. McFadden's anti-Semitic speech.

"Give \$10, \$100, \$1,000 to the War Chest if you can—but remember that Silver Shirt membership is totally dependent upon your qualification in the light of true Christian principles."

This morally and financially bankrupt organization of the Silver Shirts, which masquerades as a Christian organization, spreading the most absurd and vicious falsehoods, inciting religious and racial hatred, raising funds under false pretenses and by fraudulent means, received an effective lesson in Americanism in Pennsylvania the other day.

This is the beginning of the end of the "national radio" speakers who call themselves Americans and Christians, but who are really hirelings and advocates of Hitler, getting their orders and inspiration from the Prussian-Russian forged "Protocols of the Elders of Zion."

Respect For Smolar's Courage "How do you regard my friend Smolar?" I asked, emphasizing the word "friend." I watched Goebbels's face. It registered unmistakable respect for Smolar's courage.

He smiled, spread his hands in an open Agency, saying: "Well, you see for yourself he is still here."

"I asked, and the Jews in general? How about them?"

"Goebbels frowned for a moment and did not answer. I got in another lick for my Jewish friends. 'Can you deny that the Jew is intelligent, often more so than the Gentile?' I asked.

"Goebbels regarded me. 'Perhaps their wits have been sharpened by persecution,' he snapped."

Boris Smolar, chief European correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, is the only Jewish newspaperman representing an outside news service still on duty in the Reich. He has been with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency for more than twelve years and has represented it in most of the countries of the world. He was at one time Moscow correspondent of the old N. Y. World.

Wise Attacks Hitlerism At Passaic Rotary Meeting

(Special to the J.D.B.) PASSAIC, N. J., April 26.—"Civilization must reaffirm the principles and ideals, the standards and hopes by which mankind has arisen out of the darkness of the past; it will not suffer itself to be drawn to the repudiation of these standards by Hitlerism," declared Rabbi Stephen S. Wise at a dinner before the largest turn-out of the Passaic Rotary club.

Rabbi Wise spoke here in refutation to a speaker who presented the German angle of the plight of German-Jewry.

Name Peterson Supervisor of Poultry Code

Industrial Advisory Group to Aid Him in His Work

WASHINGTON, April 26.—New York's anti-racketeering poultry code will be supervised by Leroy C. Peterson, formerly an economist with the Consumers' Council of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration.

Peterson's appointment was announced today following the joint action of General Hugh Johnson, administrator of the National Recovery Act, and Secretary of Agriculture Henry Wallace.

An industrial advisory committee established under the code will assist Peterson in administrative work. Members of this committee selected by the industry are: E. V. Dwyer, Irving Sokoloff, Charles Sahn, P. J. Schwab and H. Julius Kosterin, elected by the National Poultry Merchants' Association; A. Winkle and A. Klein, elected by Independent Slaughter House Operators; Benjamin Shapiro, Solomon Phillip and Miles Guerin, elected by the Merchants' Association of Live Poultry Industry; Charles Sigal, Morris Gordon; George Shkold, elected by the Poultry Slaughter House Association.

The code covers the live poultry industry of metropolitan New York. Included in the conditions which it seeks to correct are racketeering among "schocheton" and the collection of fees for "protection."
