Israel Unterberg
With the passing of Israel Unterberg, American Jewry loses a quiet, lovable, modest and of personality whose sincerity and generosity made themselves felt in American Jewish life. One of the finest types of the Russian Jewish immigrant, he achieved genuine distinction by aiding and inspiring the work of Jewish education in this country. With Professor Mordecai M. Kaplan, he was one of the founders and main supporters of the Society for the Advancement of Judaism. He contributed most generously and unostentatiously to various Jewish philanthropies and relief work. But his whole-hearted devotion to the cause of Jewish education was his growing achievement.

A Zionist Master Builder
This evening fitting tribute will be paid to Menachem Mendel Ussishkin at a testimonial dinner on the occasion of his seventieth birthday anniversary. A new colony, to be known as Ekfar Ussishkin, is to be established in Palestine in honor of the man who had the vision to organize, maintain and develop the Kfar Kayemeth, the Jewish National Fund. With unparalleled perseverance and energy, he devoted his life to the creation of the most constructive institution among Zionist activities. Called the "Iron Man" of Zionism, Ussishkin has been uncompromising in his practical idealism. One of the foremost Russian Jewish intellectuals and Zionist leaders, he brought into the movement a discipline that is rare among idealists and visionaries. And at the end of Ussishkin became one of the influential leaders of the Zionist movement in Russia. Zionists were regarded as deluded idealists. Ussishkin was more far-sighted than most of his associates. He realized that the settlement of Jews in Palestine through the instrumentality of the aid of a Jewish National Fund would prove the wisest and most practicable policy of Jewish rehabilitation. The Palestine Zionists who at first doubted the importance of his project, Ussishkin fought all opposition with his characteristic vigor. Even his own conservative views, and his contributions to the upbuilding of Eretz Israel are of great, last value to the Jewish people.

Ussishkin is one of the real masters, rebuilders of the new Zion. But in building the new Palestine, he realizes that some of the finer and nobler traditions of the old Palestine must be retained. For, as he said on one occasion, without the old (Continued on Page Eight)

Revisionists Gain Another Point in Trial

Gov't Case Weakens as
Police Tracker Makes
Statement

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JERUSALEM, May 1. — The case of the government against the three Revisionists, Aba Achmeier, Zvi Rosenblatt and Abraham Stavsky, was greatly weakened this afternoon when Shlomo Weisberg, expert official police tracker, who was testifying as to the shoes worn by the accused, suddenly asked the court to be allowed to make a voluntary statement.

Granted permission by the court, Weisberg declared that although there was a great resemblance between the footprints at the scene of the murder and those of Stavsky, nevertheless the footprints at the spot where Dr. Aizikoff was shot might have been those of another person.

Weisberg added that there were no indications on which definite proof that the footprints were made by Stavsky's shoes might be based.

Another sensation was created in the court when Weisberg, during cross-examination by defense attorney Horace Samuel, disclosed that Chief Investigator Rice called him into a three and a half hour conference yesterday on the testimony he was to give today. The cross-examination of Weisberg by Samuel will continue tomorrow.

Earlier in the trial, Weisberg was limited to explaining to the court technical details, such as the length and width of Rosenblatt's and Stavsky's shoes.

Police Officer Collier, another footprint expert, also testified and gave similar technical explanations.

**Hesse Announces Jews
May Send Children to
Schools in Three Towns**

BERLIN, May 1. — The authorities of the state of Hesse announced today that they had granted permission for the establishment of Jewish private schools, functioning as district schools, in Darmstadt, Mainz and Offenbach.

Jewish parents are encouraged, in a ministerial order issued today, to transfer their children from the regular public schools to these Jewish schools stipulating that the children may attend these schools regardless of the district in which they live.

Lewisohn Says Hardship Grips Reich Jews—Not Exaggerated

Fugitives in Dreadful
Plight, He Declares in
Montreal Talk

(Special to the J.D.B.)
MONTREAL, May 1.—Ludwig Lewisohn, noted Jewish author, who returned to American shores after a long voluntary exile in France, declared there was nothing exaggerated about reports of persecution of Jews in Germany, during an address last night before a large Zionist gathering.

Discussing the world Jewish situation of the present time, Lewisohn declared that the facts about Germany are as stated, and that fugitives with whom he lived for a whole year are in a dreadful plight, finding it difficult to lead a Jewish life.

He advocated Palestine and the production of the Jewish masses as the only solution to the Jewish problem, declaring that otherwise the Jews will ultimately face the same tragic situation in other countries.

"The forces at work in Germany," he said, "are at work all over the world." Lewisohn stated that the next five years will see the Jewish persecutions under a new life is reconstructed. The Jews must go on the land and become

Submit Brief Zionist Accord For Raftery Bill Passage Looms, Lipsky Says on Return

Prepared by Sponsor
and Pesin—Cites
Precedents

NEWARK, May 1. — A brief prepared by Assemblyman John Raftery and Samuel Pesin, citing arguments that the former's so-called anti-Nazi bill is constitutional, was received late last night by the State Senate at Trenton.

The bill was passed by the Assembly two weeks ago, but widespread opposition has kept it in the Senate committee. Arguing that the measure in no way hinders the constitutional rights of freedom of speech or the press, the brief maintains that similar legislation has been sustained by courts here.

The brief states: "In effect, the purpose of the bill is to prohibit libel against a racial or religious group. That law as such is unconstitutional. That law as such makes a libel against an individual."

less interested in intellectual professions. He also pointed out that Jews in Soviet Russia are persecuted through the process of assimilation.

After being shown the fallacies of assimilationist theories, many former German assimilated Jews are now sending their children to Palestine, he said.

Louis Lipsky, member of the World Zionist Executive who spent three weeks in Palestine where he attended the annual conference of the Zionist General Council (Actions Committee) returned on board the S.S. Majestic yesterday. He was accompanied by Jacob Fishman, editor of the Jewish Morning Journal.

In a statement regarding the Actions Committee meeting, Mr. Lipsky referred to the "better understanding" existing among various factions of the Zionist organization as a result of the conference. He criticized the stand taken by the Revisionist party of which Vladimir Jabotinsky is head, in not changing its "accessionist policy" and in "creating inner antagonisms."

"The meeting of the General Council, the first since the Prague Zionist Congress, succeeded in bringing about a better understanding between the various parties and factions, whose differences have been the source of a great deal of anxiety among Zionists and friends of the Jewish Palestine," said Mr. Lipsky's statement.

Hits Revisionists

EEE Attacks Reputed By Venezelos

Talks to Greek-Jewish
Heads—Nazi Activities
Gaining

SALONICA, May 1. — A new orientation in Greco-Jewish policy was foreshadowed here today in a significant interview accorded by Euthimios Venezelos, former Greek premier and leader of the Liberal party to two leaders of the Salonica Jewish community.

The former Premier expressed to the Jewish leaders his profound regret that the Jews in Greece tend to hold him responsible for statements in the Venezelist press in Salonica attacking the Jews. These statements, Venezelos declared, are to be condemned. He revealed that he had modified his views on the question of a secessionist policy for the Jews of Salonica, and no longer considers this institution indispensable for peace between the Jews and the Venezelists.

The electoral college has long been a source of friction between Venezelists and Salonica Jews, with the latter hotly opposed to its existence. The Venezelists strongly attacked abolition of separate voting for the Jews, the majority of whom in the last election supported the present government of Premier Tsaldaris.

Venezelos promised the Jewish leaders that he would bend every effort to the work of establishing harmonious relations between the Jews of Greece and Venezelists.

Hitler Propagandists at Work
Hitler propagandists are continuing their activities in Greece on a more elaborate scale than ever before. An illustrated lecture delivered by M. Kundorfer, representative in Athens of the German Nazi party, in the most luxurious cinema house in the capital, attracted wide attention. Many members of the Nationalist party, which has been friendly to the Jewish population, attended the lecture and the new German Jewry and its program. Among those present was Mme. Lina Tsaldaris, wife of the Greek Premier.

Nazi Prober Promises Finner Despite Descent

U. S. Hitlerites Push Boycott of American Jews

DAWA Supported by Reich Organizations to Be Listed

Nazi activities in this country have been brought to a head by the first open attack on the Jews of America by the Friends of New Germany, Hitler organization in the United States, which has proclaimed a boycott on the Jews. The following is the text of a series of articles detailing the rise and growth of the Nazi-inspired anti-Semitic movement in this country in all its ramifications. The articles are based on an exhaustive investigation of Nazi propaganda activities in this country and in Germany for a period of over a year.

Nazi Germany has launched its first great offensive against American Jewry. Flying the colors of the DAWA (Deutsch-Amerikanischer Wirtschaftsausschuss; the German American Protective Alliance) Hitler's former American Nazi Party has declared a boycott on American Jews.

Elsewhere is reproduced the cover of the Business Guide of the DAWA, which has recently come off the press and is being widely distributed in New York City throughout New York. The booklet, the first of a series to follow, contains almost one thousand names of firms, each of which have paid \$5 for the privilege of being listed among those which do not boycott German goods. It exhorts its subscribers, which according to this reporter's information have risen during the few weeks of the organization's existence, to over 15,000 in New York City and environs, to patronize DAWA stores and wear the DAWA button.


The DAWA, of a political, economic, and social nature, excluding and boycotting Jews, may be considered the nucleus of the new American Nazi Party based upon a program similar to that carried out by Hitler's party in Germany. Comparing today DAWA, expressly an organization for the boycott of American Jewry and their "ausgeschaltung" from so-called American economic and political life, will broadcast its theories over Station WINS. Their program will be held every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:30 to 10 A. M.

German Groups Support DAWA
The DAWA is supported by the United German Societies and League of Friends of New Germany, two groups which are thoroughly Hitlerized and anti-Semitic. The first was "captured" by the Hitlerites shortly after the latter had dropped its title, "American Branch of the National Socialist Workers' Party." At present both masquerade as American groups. The League is still in existence, the unofficial but direct control of Fritz Gissibl and other German Nazi agents who continue to remain in this country.

The DAWA booklet is composed of fifty pages in both English and German. More than one hundred categories of service offered by the DAWA include everything from midwives and funeral parlors to attorneys. While for the most part these names are drawn from business houses located in the German Yorkville and Ridgewood sections of Manhattan and Brooklyn, a large number of concerns in all other boroughs and nearby New York and New Jersey cities

are also listed. Much of the goods handled by the advertisers are exclusively of German manufacture. German business concerns are now displaying the DAWA emblem as prominently as that of the NRA. Reflecting the rapid spread of the DAWA organization, the directory contains two postcards, both addressed to the United German Societies at 347 Madison Avenue, one of which is to be signed by business concerns wishing their names to appear in a new, enlarged edition of the trade guide and the other calling for the signatures of private subscribers who wish to receive the trade guide, which will be printed within the next few weeks. The slogan, printed on the cards, is "Unity is Strength."

The purpose of the DAWA, as far as can be learned from those nearest the inner Nazi circle, is to co-ordinate all German business in this country with the policies of the Hitlerites and later to extend the scope of the association to American Aryans. Jews and Jewish concerns are definitely out of the organization; or at least such is the case as this is being written. German American wives have been warned by DAWA speakers to avoid buying from Jewish shops if they had to go blocks out of their way to do it.

Strongest Weapon Yet
The DAWA is by far the sturdiest weapon adopted by the Nazis thus far in their fight against

American Jewry. It contains in its elements believed sufficient to unite German American against American Jewry. During succeeding articles I shall discuss at length the co-ordination of all classes of Germans with the DAWA movement — classes which could not be brought into a purely political anti-Semitic group like the Friends of New Germany. They are being forced into this apparently "defensive" organization by their Nazi masters who assure them that this is the end course leading to economic survival. Despite the assertions to the contrary, the anti-Nazi boycott can not imply the boycott of Germans or German Americans in this country unless they handle German manufactures. American Nazis have now appealed to the nearest German citizenry with the declaration that the Jews intend boycotting them regardless of the wares they handle.

The United German Societies has publicly announced, with regard to the ultimate expansion of the DAWA, that "There is not a shadow of doubt that American citizens of German descent will receive an encouraging response from hosts of fair-dealing Americans who refuse to be associated with an undertaking (anti-Nazi boycott) so un-American, a propaganda so insidiously conceived in hatred and carried on to the grievous injury of a large element of

loyal American citizens."

The purpose of the DAWA as set forth in pamphlets put out by the United German Societies follows: In securing the collapse of the anti-Nazi boycott—

1. To combine all German-Americans in the city of New York in one defensive front;
2. To organize a community of interests of all those, be they importers or merchants, artists or artisans, who are the victims of the boycott;
3. To influence and induce all American citizens of German origin and millions of other right-thinking Americans to patronize only such firms which are known to reject the boycott and which have joined the organization mentioned in two.

Lecturers are being sent to all German American societies in the metropolitan district in the crusade to convert the entire German-American population to DAWA principles. Thus far few if any organizations outside those controlled by the Nazified United German American Societies have subscribed to the plan, but observers report that large lists from the major societies have expressed their willingness to join.

A 'German' Store

We have in the above plan the scheme for the creation of a German-American commercial empire. The plan provides for its expansion to become an American "Aryan" business association. The DAWA has announced that it will shortly bring into existence its first venture, a German store selling German goods. It is hoped by its sponsors that the success of this concern will warrant the establishment of other stores selling German goods almost exclusively.

The DAWA was brought before the public on the evening of April 8, when approximately 12,000 persons sought entrance to the Ridgewood Grove Arena in Brooklyn. Two hundred uniformed stormtroopers stood guard. The crowd booed at the mention of Jews, Jewish leaders, and public officials who had protested against the terrorism of the Hitler Government. When the name of Mayor LaGuardia

was mentioned, catcalls came from all parts of the auditorium. Bundmeister Louis Zane said, "LaGuardia was elected the mayor of all New York, not only of Jewish New York. And the ballot is the ammunition of Germans against this mayor, who has publicly declared himself on the side of the (anti-Nazi) boycotters. We will make a memorandum of that for the next election." He then proclaimed the anti-Nazi boycott a double-edged weapon which in the end would be turned from the Germans to the ruin of the Jews.

Brooklyn Schuster, leader of the Jewish Nazi cell then told the audience that they did not need the rights of the Jews in this country, and he ordered them to fight for these rights. He charged the women with the duty of spending their husbands' money in German stores for the purchase of German goods. The meeting ended with the frenzied audience rendering three cheers for (first) Chancellor Hitler and (second mentioned) President Roosevelt.

They Give You A Pin

According to an announcement in the Deutsche Zeitung, Nazi organ in New York, the DAWA plan is to grace the lapel of every German American in German American society; German America is to work in cooperation with Germans in the fatherland for the DAWA idea's realization; and that all societies, regardless of their nature, whether they be for sport, singing, benefit, or political, will be induced to join the DAWA.

The leaders of the DAWA come from the highly Hitlerized United German Societies. Those in charge are Willy Warnecke and H. Froelich.

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Mark Laying Of Cornerstone For Zion Center

Synagogue Group Will Observe Ceremony at Washington Meet

The laying of the cornerstone of the Jerusalem Synagogue and Centre, which will take place in Jerusalem next Monday before an assemblage of Palestinian notables, will be observed in this country by the United Synagogue of America, it was announced yesterday by Louis M. Moss, president of the United Synagogue.

Mr. Moss announced that a special ceremony will be held Monday by delegates assembled at Washington for the twenty-second annual convention of the organization. The ceremony will feature a special address by Professor Abraham Newman of Philadelphia, chairman of the Palestine Committee of the United Synagogue of America. Included in these ceremonies will be the reading of messages from prominent religious leaders in Palestine, who are expected to be present at the laying of the cornerstone.

Initiated by American Group

The Jerusalem Synagogue and Centre will give Palestine its first modern synagogue-centre and is expected to play an important part in the spiritual life of Palestine Jewry. The project was initiated by the United Synagogue of America as a joint effort of that organization and the Yeshurun Congregation of Jerusalem, headed by Henrietta Seid, and served mainly English-speaking Jews resident in Palestine. Funds for the erection of the synagogue and centre were raised by the United Synagogue of America several years ago. The architecture competition was held jointly among Palestinian and foreign architects to determine the best plan for the structure.

Abraham H. Levinthal of the Brooklyn Jewish Centre, chairman of the Jerusalem Synagogue and Centre Committee of the United Synagogue of America, will play prominent part in the ceremonies attending the laying of the cornerstone.

Rabbi Silver Praised Project

Rabbis and Jewish leaders in various fields united yesterday in praise of the new synagogue and centre. Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland declared: "The Jewish youth of Jerusalem need a recreational and cultural centre. Jerusalem, likewise, needs a modern institution satisfying the spiritual yearning which I hope will be headed by a great spiritual leader whose influence will be felt among the young generation of Palestine."

Dr. David de Sola Pool declared that the erection of the Jerusalem Synagogue and Centre will bring to the Jews of the Holy City "the most important instrument of spiritual life and will serve all mankind as a symbol of the spiritual union of the Jew with Palestine."

Praise for the new structure was also given by Lipsky, chairman of the United Palestine Campaign; Rabbi Arthur H. Neulander, president of the Long Island Branch of the Adolphus Assembly; Dr. Abraham Cohen, Samuel Spiegel, president of the National organization of the Women's League of the United Synagogue of America; Mrs. Israel Davidson, president of the New York Branch of the Women's League of the United Synagogue of America, and many others.

Brooklyn Relief Requests Increase

Improved Economic Trend Not Affecting Poor, Brenner States

Improved economic conditions have not yet been reflected in the number of poor families requiring relief and service, according to a comparative study of the work of the United Jewish Aid Societies of Brooklyn for March and February. Both the number of families assisted and the total amount of relief granted were greater during March than in the previous month. "Many families which husbanded their resources during long periods of unemployment," the report stated, "have now been compelled to seek material relief. Others, displaced by technological advancements, are experiencing difficulty in returning to a normal life in some industry which no longer requires as many workers as before."

According to the study, which was prepared for the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities, of which the United Jewish Aid Societies is the family welfare agency, the Societies gave direct service to 1,470 cases in March, as against a total of 1,363 cases for February. A total of 804 heads of families received grants adding up to \$36,623 during March, while in the preceding month 755 heads of families received allotments totaling \$31,866.

Mortimer Brenner, president of the United Jewish Aid Societies, in making public the report, pleaded for support of the Federation's \$500,000 twenty-fifth anniversary campaign now under way to meet the budgetary necessities of the twenty-five affiliated institutions.

Rabbi Will Supervise Cunard Line Kitchens

Charles Fruton, the Jewish representative of the Cunard Line, announces that, by arrangement with the Union of Orthodox Rabbis of London, a credited rabbi will act as supervisor on board all their liners.

The Cunard Line has always maintained a kosher kitchen. The innovation of an orthodox rabbi representative on board ships, it was felt, would appeal to a great many people observant of the dietary laws.

Rabbi Mordecai Ehrlich, in charge of the kosher kitchen of the Acadia, installing new equipment throughout both the meat kitchen and the dairy kitchen. This will also be done on the other ships.

Dolfuss Makes Starheimberg Vice-Chancellor

Heimwehr Leader Denies There Is Jewish- Austrian Issue

VIENNA, May 1.—Prime Ernst Ruediger von Starheimberg, leader of the Heimwehr, the Austrian Fascists, today became vice-chancellor of the Federal Christian State of Austria. He succeeds Major Emil Fey, leader of the Vienna Heimwehr and commander of the forces which crushed the Austrian Socialist movement.

Y. V. Starheimberg, who has advocated friendly relations between Austria and Germany on the basis of independence for Austria, has stated on several occasions that "there is no Jewish problem" in Austria and has repudiated "utopian race theories."

The Reichspost, official government organ, in a long article today, sharply scored the Zionist leadership of the Vienna Jewish community and supported the Union of Austrian Jews and the Agudath Israel in demanding that the community should confine itself to purely religious, non-political issues, in representations to the government.

posed exclusively of Germans who could vote in the German elections. Its membership is now exclusively Jewish. Nazi leaders still guiding its policies and activities unofficially.

The sphere of influence of the League of Friends of New Germany has been extended in ever-widening concentric circles. It has placed strategically its members in groups free from Nazi influence, and by various forms of pressure and coercion has succeeded in winning these organizations to its policies.

Some Statistics

While the Friends of New Germany have only about 12,300 members in Greater New York and about 25,000 throughout the country, it maintains dictatorial powers over German American societies which embrace what some authorities reckon to be 500,000 members. The cooperation of the League of Friends of New Germany with such groups as the Silberman Circle (estimated at 36,000 to 143,000 in manpower), the Crusader White Shirts, and others makes it an alliance whose membership would be an asset to any political party.

In the DAWA we have the seed of a political party, which may easily be extended to embrace more than one hundred small Fascist groups in the United States. The DAWA in the form of a united German America will appeal to the public for support in its second and greatest bid for influence in the coming of May 17, when DAWA sympathizers will be herded into Madison Square Garden under the slogan

"Down With the Jewish Boycott."

"Down With the Infamous German Haters."

Less and Better Ballyhoo

Have you noticed that during the past few years the moving picture companies have gradually acquired a sense of restraint in ballyhooing new pictures? Whether this is another manifestation of the depression is not certain, but evidence points to that October day when stocks tumbled because, immediately after that, the boys whose job it is to pep up possible cinema palace patrons became subdued.

Now Use Discretion

I do not mean to even hint that the publicity getters have forgotten or cast aside their adjectives. It is simply a new type of discretion. In the not so old days the press department never said a picture was anything less than colossal. Now it has descended to a mild magnificence. As a matter of fact, press departments do not whop-it-up for a new film unless it is really believed that the picture has merit. Instead of pandering people into seeing a picture and then have them signifying their verdict with an audible raspberry the press agents now save themselves for something worthwhile.

As a result, picture fans are now inclined to put some faith in advertising and publicity. "Cavaladeo," "Henry VIII," "Catherine The Great," "House of Rothschild," "Viva Villa," were all introduced with the loud beating of drums and each picture justified the noise. "Edimond" pushed hard because it was introduced because of its subject matter; the picture itself was a fine and honest artistic effort. The producers were exuberant over "Nana" but then it was introduced with a new star and even at that it was not really a bad picture. The one over-praised picture of the season, "Alice in Wonderland" which, after all, isn't such a bad record!

Composite Director

No one can say that directors, the fellows who are responsible for the final version of a film, have not taken their share of publicity. It sends out an interesting thing about these gentlemen. According to the

press department of that company the following is a composite view of the average Hollywood director:

"An American, five feet eleven, weighing 174 pounds, brown hair, blue eyes, about 41 years of age, may be wearing glasses. He is a sports enthusiast, a good golfer, an omnivorous reader, a regular attendant at football games, and a good story-teller. He is sympathetic, and slow-spoken, and a good deal of a diplomat. And he bears no resemblance whatever to the movie director of fiction, for he never wears boots and riding pants. He has spent some 14 years in the picture industry, and has directed something like 42 productions during that time, nearly half of them talkies. Probably he is under contract to a major studio, for which he has made about 14 of his 42 films."

Half of him was, or were, on the stage before going into pictures, mostly in the acting end of the theatrical work. And in most cases he started in Hollywood as an actor or a writer or a property man— seldom as a director, although since talking pictures, several stage directors have transferred directly to screen directing.

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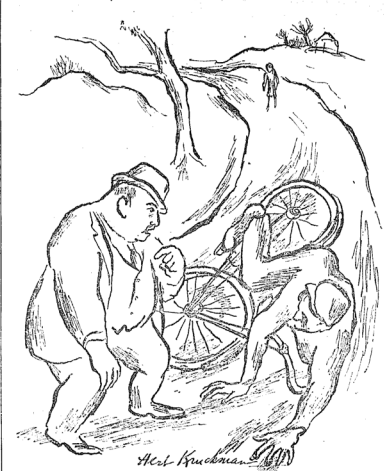

The Bulletin's Book

With Colonel Edwin Emerson, president of the Friends of Germany, back in New York for two weeks now, the propaganda machine of the local pro-Hitlerites must be humming smoothly. The spring sowing of "Truth About Germany" and "German Youth in a Changing World" and "American Illustrated News" is proceeding apace.

Colonel Emerson, it appears, had left for Berlin January 20 for a quick flying visit and probably to get orders from the Nazi high-ups. But, like the plans of Bobbie Burns' mice, his too went astray. The Colonel says he took part in a fencing match while in Germany, and a counter-revolutionary fencing foil went through a very tender portion of his anatomy. He was therefore forced to stay in Berlin longer than he had planned.

But now he's back in his offices in the Whitehall Building, 17 Battery Place, Room 121.

A strange feature of the Colonel's stay in Berlin was that that nobody would even admit he was there. With so influential an American at the Nazi capital it was rather queer that American correspondents would always receive the announcement that the foreign office had never heard of his presence in Germany. He was, nevertheless, staying at an unassuming pension on Unter den Linden.

The Colonel has had a versatile career, say the least. He was a rough rider with Teddy Roosevelt, a prisoner of war in Turkey during the World War, a founder and guiding light of the Friends of Germany (not to be confused with the Friends of New Germany), and he is at present a correspondent for whatever German newspapers still exist, a disseminator of Nazi literature, and what not.

Emerson was born in Dresden and speaks with a marked German accent. He earned the title, "Colonel," by appointment to that rank in the New York State National Guard. When he was a prisoner of war in Turkey, the story goes, he was transferred to Germany and there interned. But he

seemed to have unusual freedom for a war prisoner. He wrote for the Continental Times, an English-language pro-German newspaper published in Amsterdam.

After the War Colonel Emerson came back to this country and began writing prolifically. He became correspondent for a number of German newspapers.

He became an ardent Republican and wrote a biography called "Hoover and His Times" for the presidential campaign of 1932. The chief claim to fame of this volume is in the way it is written.

Instead of following the usual chronological order in relating Hoover's life Emerson began with Hoover in the White House and ended up with Hoover's birth in West Branch, Iowa. The book can still be found in the cut-rate stores selling publishers' surpluses. Its price, we think, is forty-nine cents.

It is paradoxical that Emerson, the anti-Semitic and pro-Nazi, eulogized Hoover's "humanitarianism" in his biography. Going back on their writings seems to be a habit of Nazi propagandists. There is George Sylvester Viereck, who collaborated in the writing of "My First Two Thousand Years," a novel relating the story of the wandering Jew. Although not militantly pro-Jewish, the book at least was sympathetic to the Jews.

More than sixty lines are devoted to Emerson in the Who's Who in America. A number of interesting facts about him can be picked up there. He was born in Dresden in 1860, graduated from Harvard and was foreign correspondent for several American newspapers. In 1905, when he was covering the Russo-Japanese War,

SLANTS ON SPORTS

From the Sidelines

One of the first letters we opened in the office Monday morning on our return from the Penn relays at Philly was a faint little note. Our secretary filed it under the "C" with the other crank and complaint letters we have received this far.

Morris Weiner

In part the letter says, "I learn from reliable sources that you are a former City College man. Perhaps that accounts for one thing I don't like about you. The other thing is the fact that you don't write enough on checkers and chess and devote entirely too much space to the Communist College of New York." Pleasant chap, this egg!

Friedman Moves

Scheduled in a policy of giving the reader what he wants we wrote a story that will please him no end. Benny Friedman, chief stockholder and head man of C.C.N.Y. gridiron, is looking ahead to the football surprise he'll bring New York next fall. He not only hopes to produce a strong winning team but is using the old Friedman punch to get the job right now.

Old gruds stopped troubling for a moment when they first heard the news that Friedman was selected as the new coach. They almost cabbled, but when the news first leaked out that Friedman would hold spring practice. Incidentally, this year marked the first time in athletic history at City College that the football team held spring training. It is merely one of the many signs of the new deal in Lavender athletics which the coming of Friedman heralds.

Safety Above All

Scheduled to come to a conclusion last Friday, a select group of thirty-seven players will continue to scrimmage twice a week at Van Cortlandt park for another month. This came about because Friedman did not think that his charges had received sufficient scrimmaging experience under him.

For the first few weeks of the spring drill the new coach drilled all his men on the pure fundamentals of football, stressing blocking and tackling. The head mentor's pet aversion is a player who may pass well or kick excellently yet at the same time is a poor blocker or tackler. Several of last year's veterans have tentatively lost their spots because they cannot meet the technique demanded by the new all-American player. At every session, Friedman is emphasizing safety in football above all. His teachings are designed to secure the utmost amount of protection for the player and thus far spring injuries have been negligible.

Excellent Coaching Staff

The majority of coaches throughout the country choose as their assistants men who are versed in the systems of the game the head man is expounding. Usually a former player on a university team is chosen. Friedman has gone this route. He has no "one special system." He personally thinks them the bunk. And when it came to selecting his aides he seems to have picked, in our estimation the best coaching staff in the country. Where else can you find a man with Mielziner's playing and coaching experience working towards the same goal as a Doc Alexander, by the way, is taking care of the ends, or a Doc Alexander, taking care of the centers and guards, under their great boss, Benny Friedman? It does seem to be one of the strongest coaching units in the east.

And it is due to the excellent instruction of these coaches that the

City Eleven has shown such splendid results in spring practice. Last week the Columbia scrimmage revealed a perfect example of the new spirit that the Lavender gridder have been inspired with. The boys were full of pepper and kept shouting to each other. Let's take the Bowl away from these Roses." And, in the first five plays that Columbia attempted, with several Stanford game veterans in the line up, the Lions lost four yards.

School Football Conscious

It does appear that the City is losing some of its class consciousness, that only a minority are interested in Dean Gotshall's literary endeavors, and that most of the students and grades at St. Nicholas Heights are surreptitiously reading a football guide book behind Griffin's "Math Analysis."

Usually the turn-out at C.C.N.Y. has been poor but this time 250 candidates answered the coach's call for first practice. Uniforms were distributed to sixty-five men but even with the help of his aide, every man might expect his proper share of attention under the wizard hands of the chief coach.

The cut made last week was the first this year. The staff felt that it would be bad for the morale of football at the school if any preliminary cuts were made. But football needs a few other things besides enthusiasm to make it properly and only those boys with promise, weight, brown, and the ability to take coaching, were kept on the squad.

Training Camp

With the Lewisham stadium so hard to get, the squad has been organized into groups who travel to the Bronx by truck. Instead of a team A or team B, Benny is most often referring to his men as the First Trainload or the Second Truckload. Rumor has it that Mike Kupperberg, last year's captain, carries three men on his shoulders when no room is left. However, Mielziner, the line coach, carries the truck.

The thirty-seven athletes who remain on the squad will form the nucleus with which Benny will work the balance of the season and whom he hopes to have back when the St. Nick outfit leave for training camp.

Friedman is convinced of the necessity of such a nucleus and in itself is another promising aspect. Years ago, City went away at the beginning of each football season and turned out teams that were a total loss. In fact, the last time the Lavender had a gridiron contingent at camp, the eleven made football history in the east. Its high scorer, Eddie Duker, was up with the nation's leaders and the boys produced five victories, the best record to date.

Now, you might argue, from what source is Benny to get his new material? The following may serve as an answer. Friedman is embarking on a lecture tour of New York City's high schools. He will talk on the value of athletics in a high school disunion. We have a hunch that application blanks for admission into City College will be distributed by the fave to the youngsters as they leave the auditorium.

We have never seen the ends in action but reports have it that they are hard men to take out on end sweeps and they cover the gridiron in record time when going down under kicks.

The backs, Sidre, Cooper, Rockwell, and Schwartz are a well balanced bunch. "Tudy" Cooper can plunge hard and crack a line wide open. He is an excellent blocker and won the Parker Field in 1933 as the outstanding man on the City College eleven. He can boot the pigskin in a fashion to delight any coach's heart and even Le Roy Mills, the great kicking expert, praised this young Jewish athlete for his remarkable footwork. Cooper can place the ball in any corner of the field from any angle. Sidre is a good passer, a hard runner, and an excellent forward pass snatcher, despite his poor vision. Unterberg Dies; Philanthropist and Educator

Head of JEA Passes Away at 71; Services to Be Held Today

Israel Unterberg, manufacturer, banker, philanthropist and president of the Jewish Education Association, died yesterday morning at his home, 335 West End avenue, at the age of seventy-one years old. His family was at his bedside when he succumbed in the early morning.

Funeral services for Mr. Unterberg will be held today at 10:30 A. M. at the Interdenominational Building in the Jewish Theological Seminary and Dr. David de Sola Pool and Dr. Mordecai M. Kaplan will officiate. Burial will take place in Washington Cemetery of the Shearith Israel, Cypress Hills.

He is survived by a widow, two sons, David and Clarence, and four daughters, Mrs. I. C. C. Green, Mrs. Edgar J. Nathan, Mrs. Milton J. Powell and Mrs. Samuel Derskoff.

Israel Unterberg led a life filled with adventure in finance and business and at the same time was a quiet leader in the fields of philanthropy and education. His early business career, which began when he was twenty-one, led him to gain a modest fortune, allowed him to give vent to his charitable feelings.

Born in Lithuania

He was born December 15, 1863, in a small town in Lithuania. He received his early religious education at the home of his grandfather in Europe and from him inherited his love for Jewish life. Mr. Unterberg came to America at the age of ten. When he was twenty-one, after working with his father for several years, he went into the shoe business in Lithuania, small store on Canal street. The New York office of his large shirt business today is located at 40 West street, in the Textile Building, of which he is president.

Early in his career he branched off into real estate. He was president of the Butchers and Drovers Bazaar, which subsequently merged with the Bore Bazaar.

Early in his life Mr. Unterberg organized and headed a number of synagogues, among them the Derach Emuna, at Arverne, L. I. where, for many years, he maintained a summer home.

Promoted Religious Training

During the World War he was especially active on behalf of Jewish soldiers. He also had been associated for many years with the Montefiore Hospital and Home, serving for twenty-five years as president of the board of directors there.

His principal interest, however, centered around the promotion of Jewish education. He was a director of the Jewish Education Association. In 1925, in memory of his parents, he contributed the building that houses the Teachers' Institute and the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. His chair in Talmudic Philology to him and Mrs. Unterberg.

ist policy, creating inner antagonisms and hatreds all along the line; but insofar as the other parties are concerned a great deal of progress was made in Jerusalem in modifying partnership through compromise and adjustment.

"In this effort to create an atmosphere of peace and good will the Executive of the Jewish Agency played a leading and determining part. The issue of religious practices raised by the Mizrahi (orthodox Zionists) party was met by the proposal of the Executive with regard to the Sabbath which received the unanimous approval of the entire council. The solution reached with regard to Kshutrit did not satisfy the Mizrahi, but the voluntary act of Kshutrit (labor group) in deciding to place all of its public kitchens under ritualistic supervision but at the same time standing by the principle of religious freedom of the individual, should go a long way in removing the acrimony exhibited by the Mizrahi on this issue. In the matter of certain problems in the field of organized labor a resolution was unanimously adopted which will have the effect of bringing about a more orderly relationship between employers and laborers without violating the principle of organized labor.

Labor Adjusts Itself

"It is interesting to observe the tendency of Hatzaduth through its leadership to adjust itself with due regard for the interests of the workmen to the new conditions that arise in Palestinian development. The attitude of labor leaders is the best answer to the destructive tendency of the Revisionist party in the labor field.

"As a consequence of the moderating influence of the Executive, it may be said that the Executive is now in a better position to pursue its policies and to administer the affairs of the Jewish Agency than it was in the months following the Prague Congress during which time it was pursued by the sabotage of parties and a continuous fusillade of partisan criticisms.

Regarding Palestine

Speaking of the economic development of Palestine which Mr. Lipsky said is the "only hopeful note in the great sea of trouble in which Jewish Zionism is now finding themselves," Mr. Lipsky praised the "unbounded confidence of the Jews" who are settling in the country.

"It seems as if the thousands who have recently come in are being driven by destiny to provide speedily for the thousands of Jewish Jews of the world who are bound to follow them in the near future. There is fervent haste in their labors."

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Palestine there would be no new Palestine; without our past in Palestine, there would be no sense in building the present and the future of the Jewish people in Palestine.

Oscar Leonard has translated some fragments from Usishkin's forthcoming book, "Sefer Usishkin." Two brief extracts from these fragments illustrate effectively his conceptions of the new and the old in Palestine.

Usishkin describes a conversation he had with a young woman who had come to live in Palestine. When he asked her for her impressions of Jerusalem, she replied:

"But I have not been in Jerusalem."

"How is that possible?" wondered Usishkin.

"I am simple," answered the girl. "I am not interested in ruins whether they are of buildings or human beings. We are confronting new life. The new life is the life of the future. We are our holy of holies. These are our life. For others, the past. For us, the future. Deeds, actions, for the future—yes. And only for the future."

And Usishkin comments:

"She spoke with enthusiasm, with certainty and indomitable courage. Then, silence. I did not speak. I did not move. I rose and walked over to the train window. I looked out upon the passing fields, rapidly covering with night."

Several days later he met on the streets of Tel Aviv the daughter of a friend of his from Southern Russia. The girl had been a student of natural science. She had been in Russia before and came direct to Palestine.

When, in the course of conversation, he asked her how she liked Jerusalem, the girl replied:

"I am ashamed to say I do not know Jerusalem as yet."

"You too? Why?" asked Usishkin.

She remained silent for a few moments and then said in a voice trembling with emotion:

"I am not yet worthy of the immeasurable joy of seeing the Capital of our Homeland, Jerusalem, the city which has shed its light and its law over all peoples—What have I done for my people and my homeland that I should be worthy of such happiness? I have dedicated myself for a life that shall be dedicated to our people and our land. I must learn, learn much. I must work, work very hard. If I succeed, well; if I fail, I can add one brick to the great sacred structure, then I shall make a pilgrimage on foot to Jerusalem and kiss its pavements."

Because Usishkin has understood and felt the emotions of the various practical idealists in Jewish Zionism, he has endeavored to rebuild Eretz Israel, he worked indefatigably and energetically to translate the dream of ages into living reality.

For the Jewish people, it is to be established in Palestine by the Jews of the world. The Jews of Belgium, Great Britain, France, Poland, Lithuania, Russia, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Greece and even Germany are doing their share to honor Usishkin by contributing to the Jewish cause, to the establishment of the new settlement in his honor. The Jews of America will undoubtedly participate in this magnificent tribute to the Jewish people, who are characteristically generous human.

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ul a criminal offense. The bill in effect makes it a criminal offense to libel a racial or religious group. Certainly the latter object is more conducive to the protection of the rights and peace of the community and to the general welfare, and clearly comes within the police power of the legislature. When it is considered that the object of the bill is to insure domestic tranquility, general welfare and to avoid violence and breaches of the peace, it is not surprising that the police power of the legislature enact it."

The legislature continues in session Tuesday and Wednesday morning and then adjourns until after May 15.

Revisionists Gain One More Point

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The Communist parade, during a two hours' hike from the Baitzay to Union Square, held frequent demonstrations against the "Hitler Youth." Americans of all national extractions took part in the procession, which was organized under the auspices of the United Front May Day Committee. Every grade of representation in the police maintained order during the parade and cleared the way for the marchers at Union Square where Communist leaders spoke and urged the marchers to march generally and institutions typical of these specifically.

Among unusual features of the Communist demonstration was the appearance in Union Square of a man dressed as an old bewhiskered German Jew led in chains by a number of "Storm Troopers." Every grade of protest from the Jew brought him in contact with the butts of his guards' rifles.

The Deutsche Arbeiter Klubs protested against the present form of the parade in the knowledge that both floats and speakers in Union Square voiced opposition to racial discrimination and hatred, particularly between Negroes and whites.

Estimates of the number of paradeers differed widely, Communist enthusiasts claiming anywhere from 150,000 to 250,000. Socialists claimed that their line of march embraced from 70,000 to 100,000. More conservative calculations estimated that 100,000 were led both, with probably, many more.
