#### Is Goga Coming Back?

**T**he reports that Octavian Goga, the notorious reactionary and anti-Semite, is to be invited by King Carol to join the Rumanian Cabinet, indicate an ominous situation in the affairs of Rumania. Goga, a former member of the government, is one of Rumania's foremost poets and Jew-baiters. Now he is also identified with the Nazi movement in Rumania. During his period of office as a member of the Rumanian government he published a book full of the most venomous and vicious attacks on the Jewish people.

In 1927, when I had a lengthy interview with Queen Marie, of Rumania, and referred to Goga's anti-Semitic outbursts in his new book just published at the time, Queen Marie remarked:

"He is a great poet, but a poor diplomat."

To which I replied:

"He is a member of your government as a poet but as a diplomat."

It so happened that several weeks later Octavian Goga was dropped as a member of the Cabinet.

If it is true that Goga is now coming back to the Cabinet at the request of King Carol, it means that the Iron Guards and Nazis, Rumanian tools to determine and direct the major policies of the Rumanian government. Such a change at this time would lead to intensified anti-Semitism. It would also discredit and weaken the King Carol regime. In recent years the wise counsel of Foreign Minister Titulescu has helped to avert serious internal trouble in Rumania and to fashion a peaceful policy among her neighbors as a member of the Little Entente and of the Federation of Balkan States.

#### "A God-Given" Constitution

The Austrian Constitution is a remarkable document full of "ifs" and "buts" which make it practically meaningless. Thus Section Two, Article XVI, reads:

"All citizens are equal before the law. They can be treated in law as not equal only when practical considerations justify it."

All new-born citizens who conform with the necessary conditions are equally eligible for public employment."

"Every citizen has a right to express his opinion by word of mouth, writing, picture or any other manner within the limits fixed by law and conscience."

"Laws may deprive a preliminary censorship of the press, theatre, radio, cinema and similar representations."

"All inhabitants of Austria who have attained the age for deciding their religion (the age is 16) will enjoy full freedom of religion and conscience."

## Streicher Hit By Paper for Jewish Libel

'He Is Too Stupid,' It Says at Fables Appear in 'Der Stuermer'

(Jewish Telegraph Agency)  
LONDON, May 3.—Under the heading, "Infamous Accusation," The Manchester Guardian, noted English liberal newspaper, today denounced Julius Streicher, notorious Nazi anti-Semite, publisher of the bitter anti-Semitic sheet, Der Stuermer of Nuremberg.

"Julius Streicher," The Guardian declared, "publishes weekly an anti-Semitic paper exceeding all bounds of decency so constantly that the Reich government prohibits its dispatch abroad. He is too stupid and too violent to be capable of more serious offence and too well established as a preacher of his odious gospel to be silenced by ease or safety."

#### An Overwhelming Offense

After describing the contents of the special May Day ritual murder number of Der Stuermer, which was widely advertised all over Southern Germany, the Guardian declared that an overwhelming offense is that the virtual governor of a large and cultivated city and province in Germany revives a charge against the Jews which has been so utterly disproved.

"He does so," The Guardian said, "with the full knowledge that no other charge can work so terribly upon the passions of an emotional (Continued on Page Eight)

## Jews May Buy Land In Lebanon, But Not On Palestine Board

JERUSALEM, May 3.—President Debbas of the Lebanese Republic, which as part of Syria is administered under a French mandate, today issued a statement that all Jews legally entering Lebanon are welcome to buy as much land as they want but not along the Palestine frontier.

The president stated that the French High Commissioner objects only to acquisition of land by Jews when it is along the border.

Lebanese statistics disclose that 21,730 Jews reside in Syria.

## Suit Involving School Head Boycott Rights Is Adjourned

Yeast Company Using German Goods Asks Heavy Damages

A court suit which may determine the legality of boycotting firms dealing in German goods was adjourned to May 15 yesterday by Supreme Court Justice Brennan in Brooklyn.

The Certified Yeast Company, owned by Abe Schwartz and Morris Greenberg, is suing the Jewish Bakers Voice, the Bakers and Consumers Yeast Company, and the Ideal Yeast Company for a total of \$450,000. The company alleged that the latter three companies are also asking for a restraining order from the efforts of the three companies to discourage bakers from buying Certified yeast because the latter company allegedly bought German goods despite repeated editorial warnings in the Voice.

## School Head To Investigate Vladeck Charge

Campbell Promises a Thorough Search Into Nazi Propaganda

A promise of a really thorough investigation into the charges hurled by B. C. Vladeck, chairman of the Jewish Labor Committee, that students at Stuyvesant High School were required to read Nazi pamphlets printed in Germany was made yesterday by the Board of Education following a meeting between Vladeck and Dr. Jacob Greenberg, of the board.

The investigation, which will be headed by Dr. Harold G. Campbell, superintendent of schools, will endeavor to answer two questions propounded by Vladeck:

1. How did the booklet get into the library at the high school?
2. Why did the children ask for the pamphlet, which was entitled "German Youth in a Changing World"?

Dr. Greenberg told the Jewish Daily Bulletin that definite answers to these questions will be made by the middle of next week. An investigation made by the board last week resulted in a virtual whitewash of the officials at the high school. It was explained that some unknown person had mailed the pamphlet to the school, and it was sent down to the library and stamped "Property of Stuyvesant High School" without any one having read it.

Vladeck had asserted that at least six students were known to have read the pamphlet, which he characterized as designed to:

## Austria Jews Fear Menace In New Laws

Scrutiny of Constitution Shows No Guarantees for Equality to All

(Jewish Telegraph Agency)  
VIENNA, May 3.—Austrian Jews were alarmed and surprised when a close scrutiny of the actual text of the new constitution for Austria, which became available today, disclosed that the document does not contain guarantees for the equality of all citizens regardless of religion.

One of the most important clauses of the old republican constitution of 1920, for the Jews of Austria, was the phrase "privileges of creeds are disbanded."

The omission of these words from the new "authoritarian" constitution imposed by the Dollfus government has caused great alarm in Jewish circles, particularly in view of a sentence in the new constitution which reads: "Austrian citizens may be treated unequally only in so far as positive grounds justify." The language of this clause is vague and indefinite. Jewish citizens may be treated as they can be stretched to mean almost anything.

Earlier reports on the new constitution had stated that Jewish fears of discrimination had been completely allayed.

## Friedlaender, Authority On Music, Dies at 82

BERLIN, May 3.—Dr. Max Friedlaender, noted music historian and expert in the field of songs, particularly those of Schubert and Brahms and German folksongs, died here.

He was eighty-two years old and had been honorary professor of the history of music at the University of Berlin. His best-known work was the monumental "The German Song in the Eighteenth Century," published in 1902.

## 'A Christian' Presents £10,000 for Refugee Jews

LONDON, May 3.—A man who wished himself revealed only as "a Christian" today presented a check for £10,000 (approximately \$30,000) to the banking house of Rothschild as a contribution to the Central British Fund being raised to aid Jewish refugees from Germany.

At his express request his identity was kept secret and the contribution was announced as only from "a Christian."

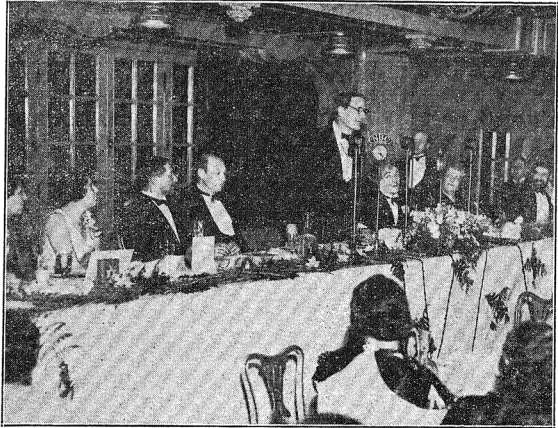

## Dr. Coralnik on Way To Guatemala to Study Settlement of Refugees

## Ukrainian Daily Takes Slap at Jews

### Under Wings of NRA Eagle Declares They "Don't Like Churches"

(Special to the J.D.B.)

JERSEY CITY, N. J., May 3.—"Jews Don't Like Churches" is the title of a front-page article in the Ukrainian Daily Svoboda, the organ of the Ukrainian National Association, issued here.

The article tells of a decision of Soviet authorities to transfer the seat of the Ukrainian government from Kharkov to Kiev this fall when sites of a number of churches in the latter city will be used for the erection of model army barracks. The barracks are to be erected where the ancient Pechersky Monastery now stands.

"Bolsheviks," the article declares, "have already established an anti-religious museum, but that is not enough for them. For that purpose they have been subscribing to a loan."

"But we are not surprised at that, for we know that Jewry is uncomfortable in church."

Svoboda displays a larger reproduction of the NRA Blue Eagle than is customary for a newspaper. With "We Do Our Part," it is the most conspicuous feature of the front page.

## Last Rites for Refugee Doctor Await Word From Relatives

Last rites for Dr. Ladislaus Michael Schwartz, German Jewish refugee killed in an automobile accident last Monday, await the receipt of a cablegram from Dr. Schwartz's relatives in Lucerne, Czechoslovakia. The message is expected this morning. Dr. Schwartz was born in Lacombe.

Dr. Schwartz was run down by an automobile Monday evening at Ninety-third street and Columbus avenue. His body was taken to the City morgue, where he was recognized by Dr. Charles Norris, chief medical examiner, of whose staff Dr. Schwartz was a member.

Dr. Schwartz, a well-known pathologist despite the fact that he was only thirty-six years old, was ousted last fall from the Professorship of Forensic Medicine in this country six weeks ago and sought aid from the Emergency Committee in Aid of Displaced Foreign Surgeons, of which Dr. Bernard Szold of 116 West Fifty-

ninth street is chairman. His pathology at the morgue and an appointment was obtained for him last Monday as assistant in the New York University department of medical jurisprudence.

Dr. Schwartz is survived by his father, mother, uncle and four brothers, one of whom is a prominent attorney in the Czechoslovakian town. He served two years in the army. He studied in Vienna, Prague, Budapest and Pressburg. He was for seven years chief of the pathology department in the Institute of Charity Department at the University of Berlin.

Besides his other appointments a place was made for Dr. Schwartz to do research work at the Mount Sinai Hospital. He was aided by Dr. Paul Kemmerer in obtaining a license to practise in New York State.

Dr. Schwartz's sole relative here is an aunt, Mrs. Ethel Flecker, 1249 Washington street in the Bronx. His body is lying at the Riverside Memorial Chapel, Seventy-sixth street and Amsterdam avenue, pending instructions from his family.

## Nazi Atrocities Hit by Labor of Rhode Island

### A. F. of L. Branch to Aid Boycott, It Resolves at Convention

(Special to the J.D.B.)

PROVIDENCE, May 3.—Hitlerite atrocities against Jews and the Nazi program of outlawing labor organizations today stood condemned in the judgment of Rhode Island as a result of action taken at the annual convention here of the Rhode Island branch, American Federation of Labor.

The delegates unanimously passed a resolution assailing the "persecutions committed against Jews and the Jewish people in Germany" and pledging the organization to "all possible co-operation in the movement to boycott German-made products until such time as the Hitler Government restores to their rightful position those people who have been persecuted."

The resolution was introduced under the auspices of the Rhode Island Textile Council after Rabbi Israel M. Goldman of Temple Emanuel-El, outstanding Jewish leader and sponsor of the Case of Civilization Against Hitlerism here, had outlined the situation in Germany. Rabbi Goldman described the outrages against Jews and the future harm done by the Nazi policy, relating also the exile of organized labor in the Reich which he called another barbaric and backward step on the part of a supposedly intelligent and civilized people.

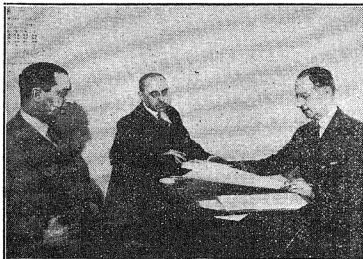
### Inaugurate United Jewish Appeal at White Plains Under Mark Eisner

The Jews of Westchester County will launch their effort to raise \$1,200,000 that has been assigned to New York Jewry as part of the national quota of \$3,000,000 for the aid of Jews of Germany, on Sunday evening, June 3, with a dinner at the Community Center in White Plains.

# German Business Men and the DHV

**Strongest Ally of Hitlerites  
Are Those Who Pay the Bills**

**Investigator Finds Labor Front Branch Functions  
Like a Well-Oiled Propaganda Machine  
—Shipping Lines Do Their Bit**

The following is the fourteenth of a series of articles detailing the rise and growth of the Nazi-inspired anti-Semitic movement in this country in all its ramifications.

One closely connected with German American Society recently remarked to me that unless something new unforeseen interferes with the present trend, within the next five or six months more than a ninety per cent of organized German Americans will be under the control of the League of Friends of New Germany.

PAT MCGRADY, which one year ago was known as the American Branch of the National Socialist Party.

At present, more than fifty per cent of New York's German American societies (some say seventy per cent) have come directly or indirectly under the spell of Hitler's American supporters. Those as yet uncoordinated include the German Catholic, German Jewish, German liberal, and German Socialist groups. To some extent the sports societies have been influenced toward the anti-Semitism of the Nazis, and in a much greater measure the singing societies have "gone Nazi." The DAWA (anti-Jewish boycott organization) is swelling into many groups and individuals which formerly have held aloof from political strife.

The German women's societies are said to be less restrained than those of the men in their deportment toward Jewish members, and Jewish members are being forced from virtually all but German Jewish groups. Even the children's societies are being hurt by the influence of the Nazis, who have begun the process of regenerating German American youth through the medium of their branch of Hitler-Jugend, called in this country *Deutsche Jungenschaft*. Their aim is to regulate and control the German youth movement.

**Sartor Resurts**

The League of Friends of New Germany has established battalions of uniformed guards throughout the metropolitan area. The number of these are reckoned by observers at approximately 750. They are tailored in the manner of German stormtroopers with a few slight differences. The shirts are white instead of brown, the trousers are of the regulation SS (or higher grade stormtrooper) make, boots are regulation; black ties are regulation, Sam Browne belt and shoulder straps are regulation, and arm-bands are regulation except that they are red, white and black rather than the customary red. The official pin, which has been a swastika superimposed on the American shield, is now a plain swastika.

The withdrawal of Jews and anti-Nazis from German American societies is facilitating the process of conversion for the ever-growing Nazi nucleus of revamped German American organizations. There is no open opposition to the

## The American Guardian

In the sixth of this series of articles, The American Guardian, an Oklahoma City publication, was described inaccurately as the organ of the "Minute Men," a Fascist group. Further investigation has revealed The American Guardian as a newspaper which is and has been fighting against Hitlerism and for Socialism. The "Minute Men" is merely a device to increase the circulation of the paper. Oscar Ameringer is the editor.

League of Friends of New Germany in their crusade of conversion and very little rivalry. The only rivalry is that offered by the aged Friedrich Heiss, publisher of *Amerikas Deutsche Post*, who sours on the League of Friends of New Germany when that group took their patronage from his publication and set up their own organ, the *Deutsche Zeitung*. Heiss at present is waging a feeble support for his *Deutsche Bund*, which is led by himself and Hans Wuerz, former propaganda leader for the American Branch of the National Socialist Party. At the same time, Heiss promotes an Aryan-Christian Union, which he hopes will some day be important. He is more unreasonably critical than the Friends of New Germany.

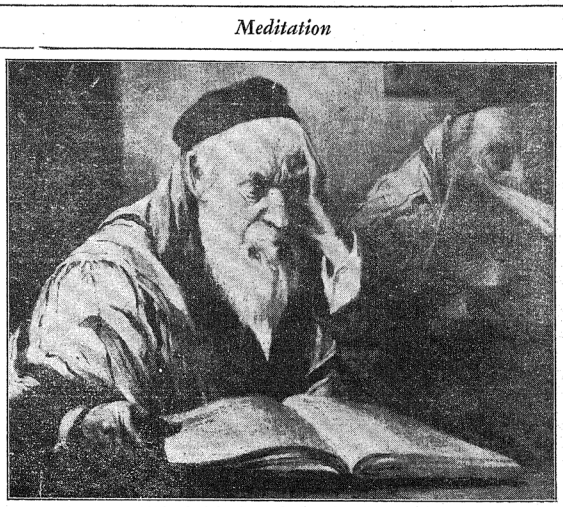
More than fifty large German American societies in the vicinity of New York are directly connected with the League of Friends of New Germany.

## Regarding the DHV

The most powerful ally of the League of Friends of New Germany is the *Deutscher Nationaler Handlungs-Gehilfen-Verband* with six offices in the United States from New York to San Francisco and others throughout the world. The DHV is composed almost exclusively of German merchants and professional men, and their employees, who are kept in close touch with Germany through great DHV international offices maintained in Hamburg and Berlin. From these offices come pamphlets on the New Germany and these are circulated either through the mails directly from Germany or from the offices of members of the DHV in this country. Since the ascension of Hitler to power his policies, both racial and otherwise, have been warmly defended in these communications. The DHV offices in Germany are the propaganda attacking the Versailles Treaty and France.

The DHV is a part of the German Labor Front, and all its members are German citizens and members of this National Socialist institution. Unless Germans in America are registered in the Labor Front, it is impossible for them to secure work on their return to the Fatherland. Hence the Germans here register through their membership in the DHV.

The organ of the DHV is "*Der Deutsche Kaufmann Im Ausland*," in translation, "The German Merchant Abroad." It keeps German businessmen abroad informed on the needs of the Nazi party at home. Employing much the same mailing list, the National Socialist World Post, edited by members of the Nazi Party, was Max Heppmann editor-in-chief, is published at Hitlerplatz 4, Hamburg. It is the organ of the Associations for Germans Abroad, and in a recent

front page editorial instructed all Germans abroad to seek to "replace Democracy with leadership." It demands that expatriates propagandize abroad the "totalitarian" conception of the Hitler Government, that is, the corporate state under absolute dictation of a "Fuehrer."

## A Little Lure, Please

Through the good offices of the DHV the League of Friends of New Germany were able to survive and prosper. Members of the DHV, mainly business men, have been persuaded or coerced into becoming members of the League of Friends of New Germany, and expensive advertisements have been secured for the *Deutsche Zeitung* from members of the DHV. From excellent authority it is learned that the North German Lloyd alone contribute \$800 weekly in advertising toward the League of Friends of New Germany. The cost of advertising in the *Deutsche Zeitung* is by far the highest of any newspaper in New York, when the size and circulation of the paper are taken into consideration. Its minimum rate of fifty-five cents a line may be considered extremely high when contrasted with that of the New York Times, which in most categories charges much less than twice that rate, although the circulation of the latter is thirty times as large and its prestige inestimably greater.

The close contact maintained by the League of Friends of New Germany with the Berlin government makes it expedient for merchants here to support the American organization just as they must support the National Socialist Party in Germany to maintain friendly relations with the Fatherland.

The DHV likewise contributes many members to the League of Friends of New Germany who pay one dollar a month dues and considerably more to the various funds that are forever being raised by the latter. When one considers that the League of Friends of New Germany has about 13,000 members in the city of New York alone and throughout the country approximately 25,000, the immense profits of the group can readily be envisioned.

In the campaign against American Jewry, the Friends of New Germany make up the nuclear mass of support; the DHV pro-

vides the most lucrative source of funds; the *Deutsche Legion* provides the actual physical manpower for projects requiring strong, able-bodied men; and the *Stahlhelm* provides the atmosphere for parades and military demonstrations, so dear to the hearts of all Germans and so essential to the maintenance of a patriotic fervor toward the Fatherland in German American circles. Dozens of other groups fulfill other specialized functions.

Although it is by no means the only example of the cooperation of the above named groups, the point might be illustrated by reference to the celebration occasioning the first anniversary of Hitler's rise to power, when all joined hands in a mammoth demonstration at the Central Opera House in New York with more than 2,000 people crowding the spacious auditorium. But for one American flag, one might well believe himself in Germany. The language was German; the decorations were Hitlerian; the uniforms were German and Nazi; and the spirit was exclusively National Socialist. Similar demonstrations are held on a greater or smaller scale throughout the metropolitan district every week. Infrequently reference to President Roosevelt is thrown in.

as a mark of appreciation of the Germans and German Americans for the benefits granted them by their new government. The reference, however, is so infrequent and so shallow as not to detract from the impression that these are a group of people whose hearts soul, and absolute allegiance are for the "alte Heimat" and the new leader of their old home.

The DHV is of considerable importance to the Friends of New Germany because of the link it maintains with the old home. Through the good offices of DHV officials of the North German Lloyd and Hamburg American lines, ships are placed at the disposal of those who would like to celebrate their affection for Hitler without restraint. Youth fests for America's Hitlerjugend, called here the *Deutsche Jungenschaft*, are held aboard these ships as well as in the Turnverein Halls. As yet uncoordinated groups are invited aboard the ships where they are allowed to see and hear about the wonders of Hitlerized Germany. The agents of these steamship lines constitute an excellent medium for communication between Nazi Germany and the Nazi movement in the United States.

# Rubin, Palestine's Painter, Declares New and Hopeful Jewish Art Is Being Created; Fame of Artist Spreading Through World

## Urges Wider Recognition by World of Recent Achievements

JERUSALEM, April 15.—Very few people who come to Palestine fail to see Rubin. Everyone certainly hears of him. No one knows his first name; he himself may have forgotten it. He is just Rubin to intimates and strangers alike. His fame has spread beyond the confines of the country in which he has made his home, following upon many years spent in France, Italy and America, acquiring and as assiduously discarding different trends of art that have finally given way before that new fashion which at a glance, is wholly "Rubin."

By saying, "That is a Rubin canvas," you stamp its origin and locale just as effectively as though you were to call it an El Greco, a Goya, a Gauguin or a Franz Hals, in the case of other countries. For Rubin's work expresses and depicts the great Hebrew traditions which are distinct from the ritual-Judaistic manner of Pilschowsky or Boris Schatz. It was Bialik, poet laureate of the Jewish people who declared, "Rubin's concepts are rooted in Hebrew tradition."

### The Influencing Tradition

It is the tradition of the simple folk types of the Yishub and also of the vital urge of the Palestinian landscape — dominantly influenced by the great Hebrew revival that goes on unceasingly.

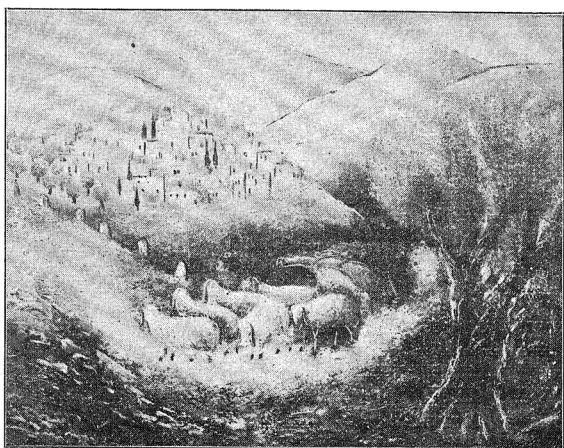
Rubin has been brought up in this traditionalism—he says he was a Yeshiva-bocher ("almudic student") once—but he has traveled a long way to adjust it to his own version. His is a mystic enthusiasm for the simple as well as for the macabre—a joyousness that is shown in his trio of sombre Safed musicians, throwing out the whole aura of Chasidism, in his inimitable landscapes of Galilee or Judea, in his still paintings of flowers, massed hues, and birds, in his study of grotesqueries at a merry festival-making.

His art is not static; it changes with the mutations of his ideas, the fluctuation of his concepts. But he manages to hold on to something essential, inimitable, in all his canvases, and that is "Rubin." One of the best known critics in England has written that Rubin paints landscapes of Palestine as no one else does, that his canvases have a rhythmic, ordered turbulence. There is in his work a characteristic austerity and vigor, an unforgettable originality that has singled him out to be the leading exponent of the new Palestinian art, to which an earnest band of young Jewish artists are devoting themselves.

### Internationalism in Art

Sitting with Rubin in his spacious studio on the top floor of a beautiful, Tel Aviv villa, overlooking the sparkling blue Mediterranean and the shining, golden strand of the picturesque fore-shore, we talked about his recent paintings and about his internationalism in art and about his proposal that an exhibition of living Jewish painters be held at the Levant Fair in order to crystallize the world conceptions of Jewish art and make clear what our people are doing for the advancement of culture.

Rubin is a tall, lanky man with a shock of upstanding black hair shot through with grey. To all who know him familiarly, he is a creature abounding in youthful vitality. Call him a young man at forty, and one will not be far wrong. He was born in Rumania in 1893, has studied art in the universities of leading European capitals, has been in Amer-

ica, and is the most exhibited artist abroad now living in Palestine, with a long record of paintings hung in the principal galleries and academies of Europe and America.

"My proposal for an exhibition in Tel Aviv of the works of famous living Jewish artists has an immense political and economic importance," he said, lounging on a sofa the brochure covering of which has figured in at least one of his paintings. "The onslaught upon Jewish genius in Germany has shown that we need an area of concentration so as to demonstrate, and perpetuate, the great power of living Jewish artists in modern art."

### Suggests Art Center

"The eyes of all Jewry are now turned to Eretz-Israel. We are going to have a medical center, a music center, a center of the lib-

eral professions here. Why not an art center? It is essential that in present-day conceptions of Palestine, art should occupy a leading place. There are so many symbols to show the awakening of the Land of Israel—the settlements, the spirit of Chasidism, the revival of the Hebrew language and literature, the regeneration of a whole people. Art has its claims to adequate representation in that symbolism."

A new Palestinian Jewish art is now being created, asserted Rubin. The day of the traditionalist or religious-motive picture was passing into more colorful times, and something less restricted to form, fresher, more vital, was evolving.

"Flowers, wild landscapes, trees, type, are linked with sky and sun and rolling countryside in the new Jewish art. It is an entirely new

philosophy making for a unique Eretz-Israel art.

"Tel Aviv must give the inspiration in the creation of the art center. What greater influence over cosmopolitan political and economic life at the moment is conceivable than this demonstration of Jewish talent? In their moments of relaxation, the statesmen, the politicians, the economists, the leaders of the world today turn to books, to paintings, to concerts, to the theatre, and it is natural that their general outlook should be swayed by what they see, read, or hear.

### Manifest Activities

"It is in this way that we can make our impression upon the 'Aryan' world, and create permanent Jewish values in universal art."

Rubin is not a painter alone; he has designed scenery for the celebrated "Habima" Art Theatre. The settings of Molliere's "Tartuffe," of "Periphrasy," and of Harry Sackler's "Rahab" were his creation. He found himself closer to the spirit of "Rahab," he says, because it was a Scriptural treatment performed by Jewish actors.

## Refugee Professor Placed on Faculty

(Special to the J.D.B.)

MADISON, Wis., May 3.—Still another expatriate Jewish scholar from Germany has found a haven in the United States, in the person of Professor Victor Jollos, zoologist, who has been elected to a place on the University of Wisconsin faculty.

Prof. Jollos, who taught and did research work at the University of Berlin and at the Kaiser Wilhelm Institute, is an eminent contributor in the fields of protozoology and genetics. He has been added to the Wisconsin faculty on funds granted by the Rockefeller Foundation and the Emergency Committee for Aid of Displaced German Scholars.

### Tobin Elected

(Special to the J.D.B.)

PASSAIC, N. J., May 3.—Herman J. Tobin has been elected president of the Passaic County Board of Taxation.

### Zatkin's Ibsen

Nathan Zatkin, who made his debut as a producer by presenting at the Little Theatre a revival of Ibsen's drama "The Lady From the Sea" took liberties with the original script of the dour Norwegian. The young producer used his blue pencil and interspersed a few Broadway touches with the idea in mind of lightening, if possible, this very, very serious exposition about the underlife of a man who thought she knew what she wanted.

### For Ibsen Fans Only

"The Lady From the Sea" is for genuine Ibsen fans only. It is one of the dramatist's later efforts, written when what little sense of humor he possessed had been wiped away by adversity. It has always been considered as one of his weakest. To a modern audience brought up on Freud, Adler and the other prying fellows who dig into our subconscious minds, the play will sound terribly dated. It is exceedingly verbose.

For the sake of those who skipped "The Lady" when they studied their Ibsen in college, this is to inform you that it is a play about a woman who weds a young girl had an affair with a robust sailor. It seems that they had loved one another with an Ibsenian intensity and had entered into some sort of mystical marriage. ## Library of Books Burned by Reich To Open May 10

Paris Institutions to Include Volumes by World-Famous Writers—Many Contribute

The Deutsche Freihalte-Bibliothek (German Library of Burned Books) will be officially opened May 10 at 65 Boulevard Arago, Paris, its sponsors, Heinrich Mann, Lion Feuchtwanger, H. G. Wells, Romain Rolland and Andre Gide announced in a joint communication received yesterday by the American Commission Investigating Fascist Activities.

The library will contain all books which have been officially banned or burned by the Nazi Reich. In addition to such banned authors as Lessing, Heine, Karl Marx, Einstein, Voltaire, Sigismund Freud and others, a complete collection of Fasciana, as contained in the writings of Adolf Rosenberg, Hitler, Wilhelm II and H. Stewart Chamberlain, will be available.

The collection has been brought together by material, writings and books contributed by the American Commission Investigating Fascist Activities, headed by Edward Dahlberg, novelist, and 20,000 volumes donated by German refugees who were able to salvage their personal libraries.

## Flower Day Campaign For Palestinian Funds Begins Tomorrow Eve

The annual Flower Day of the National Labor Committee for the Jewish Workers of Palestine will take place tomorrow evening and all day Sunday.

Part of the proceeds from this year's Flower Day will be applied to the Arlosoroff Memorial Fund, whose object is to settle Jewish families, including refugees from Germany, on land in Palestine, and to name the new agricultural settlement after Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff.

Nineteen "goyim" make up the group of footballers who will sail on the S. S. Roma for Naples under the supervision of Elmer A. Schroeder, president of the United States Football Association.

It is generally conceded by soccer critics that the team which will represent the United States in forthcoming games is much more formidable than the eleven which won their way into the semi-finals of the world championship at Montevideo, Uruguay, in 1930. This last team had several Jewish athletes on the roster.

Four players on the Stiv Eleven were national titleholders, and the same number from the Pawtucket Rangers, eastern champions, form the bulk of strength in the national outfit.

## Jewish Players on All-American Team

This national team will play the All-American League societies who, in our estimation, represent the cream of all the teams in the metropolitan area. Such stars as Archie Stark, "Red" Bullantini, Carroll, Slaven, Schwarz, O'Brien, Teddy Glover and Stan Chesney have assured the league officials of their appearance tonight.

Chesney and Glover make up the Jewish element on this otherwise heathen crew. The game will start at six-thirty and the stakes are high, for there are play-offs in each of these divisions. The winners in each section will play in the eight principal cities of Italy to decide the world's championship soccer eleven.

# Charity Dinner Plans to Raise Two Millions

## Speakers Will Show Need for New Contributions to Fund

Plans for a \$2,000,000 drive next fall to offset a threatened deficit in its budget were discussed by 200 business and professional leaders at a dinner meeting at the Hotel Plaza last night of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies.

The deficit the Federation is facing, it was pointed out by Waldemar Kops, chairman of the Business Men's Council Executive Committee, comes at a time when the ninety-one affiliated philanthropic agencies are coping with the greatest problems in their history.

-Stressing the huge increase, which had come in the need for free service in the Federation institutions, Kops presented charts which showed graphically how this need had risen from 1928 to 1933. In the seven affiliated hospitals, the number of the number of patients treated yearly has grown from 11,138 in 1928 to 22,236 in 1932, an increase of 100 per cent.

During these years of increasing need for free service, Kops stated, and have increased in an alarming manner. He presented another chart showing the annual contributions of members which in 1928 amounted to \$3,797,367, by 1934 had fallen to \$1,600,624, a drop of 43 per cent. In the same period the number of annual contributors has decreased 51.4 per cent.

## 'Der Stuermer' Devotes 12 Pages to 'Ritual Murder'

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, May 3.—Der Stuermer of Nuremberg, notorious Anti-Semitic weekly, yesterday appeared with alleged "details" of what it called "the Jewish plot to murder Adolf Hitler." Twelve pages were devoted to discussion of "Jewish ritual murder," climaxed with the assertion that the Jews are planning the biggest and most gruesome ritual murder against Hitler and his followers ever witnessed by the world.

The rest of the paper was devoted to the usual fulminations against the Jews and assurances that the "dastardly Jewish plot would not succeed." Streicher asserted that the Czar of Russia was the victim of a plot similar to the one being planned against Hitler. He advocated "tireless anti-Semitism" as the best means of guarding against "Jewish plots."

## Jewish Body Sends Protest to Hitler Against Libel Spread

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, May 3.—The Reichsvertretung der Deutschen Juden, the all Jewish German Representative Body, yesterday sent a protest to Chancellor Adolf Hitler against the spread of libels against the Jews by Der Stuermer, Julius Streicher's Anti-Semitic weekly, which appeared yesterday with a special edition accusing the Jews of ritual murders.

According to the Jewish press here, the Reichsvertretung telegraphed to the Chancellor "Der Stuermer is spreading a special edition in which Judaism is charged with ritual murder in monstrous and horrible illustrations."

"Before God and man, we raise our voice solemnly protesting against this unparalleled defamation of our faith."

Declaring that in his opinion it will be possible to put the recommendations into effect and that they will be brought to the attention of the next session of the State Legislature, Deutsch insisted that the matter should not rest there and "should not remain just a gesture." He revealed that various groups, interested in advancing their own interests, had approached city officials in an effort to have their own rabbi collected funds in connection with kashruth.

"The city," he announced, "will not give any private agency authority to levy tribute. Kashruth enforcement affects every Jew and consequently conservative as well as orthodox and other branches of Judaism are permitted to assist in the matter."

Deutsch promised full cooperation from the city as soon as the claims reached an agreement among themselves. He expressed the hope that municipal finances would permit the expansion of supervising force. He also intimated that it may take more years than the span of one administration to adjust all difficulties incidental to the problem.

## Shoetown Problem Allied

"More inspection and supervision is not enough," he continued, "the shoetown problem is allied to this. There have been charges of racketeering." He also quoted the health commissioner as saying that supervision to did not belong in his department but in the Department of Markets which is the one maintaining inspectors. The sentiment at yesterday's meeting appeared to favor the Health Department.

Persons who participated in the discussion or were present included Arthur Simon, confidential investigator for the Department of Health; Moses H. Hoenig, counsel for Young Israel; Rabbi Moses Hyman of the Rabbinical Council of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations; Rabbi Solomon Reichman; Rabbi Dr. Gartenhaus of Degel Harabanim; Rabbi Menachem Magropolis and Rabbi Harry Burstein of Keneseth Harabanim; Louis Lande of the Board of Aldermen, and Rabbi A. D. Burack, representing rabbis of Yeshiva College.

# Jews Paicky, Says Goldman, At Ivriah Fete

## Cautions of Indifference German Problem Is an Old One

More than 1,000 women attended the annual springtime breakfast of Ivriah, women's division of the Jewish Education Association, held yesterday at the Waldorf Astoria, Park avenue and Forty-ninth street. Dr. Solomon Goldman of Chicago, spoke on "The Present Jewish Problem."

"The present crisis in Jewry is not one of Anti-Semitism," said Dr. Goldman, "but rather of contemporary reaction to it. We have become paicky and distrustful. Throughout the ages of the past the Jew has shrugged his shoulders with contempt for his enemies. It is in the present that the only book on Anti-Semitism that has come down to us was written by a traitor. It is the 'Against Apion' of Josephus. His trouble is that we have ceased to be Jewishly conscious."

Regarding the German situation, the speaker asserted that the Jews of Germany have been confronting a crisis for fifty years. He cited the low birth-rate among them, the number who were converted to the Christian church, and the exaggerated patriotic feelings to support this contention. There is evidence enough, he said, in Dr. Lessing's book, 'The Jewish Self-Hate.'

(Continued from Page One) in so far as this does not conflict with government order: or motion picture.

2. "Religious belief must not interfere with the citizens' duty. Public employment is independent of religious belief. For employment in educational institutions the law will establish exceptions to this."

The preamble to this latest "Constitution" reads thus: "In the name of God Almighty, by whom all laws emanate, the Austrian people have been given this Constitution for a Christian German Federal State on a corporate basis."

Under the reservations embodied in the new "Constitution," any interpretation may be given to the laws, which emanate not from God Almighty, but from the present makeshift rulers of Austria. To suit the political purposes and chauvinistic or religious or racial prejudices of the present government, the new constitution could easily fit into any Fascist or Nazi scheme. Citizens could be declared as not subject to the law "when practical considerations justify it." Citizens are equally eligible for public employment, if they establish patriotism. This opens a wide field for graft and prejudice. Who is to determine the "patriotism" of a citizen applying for public employment?

Citizens have a right to express their opinions by word of mouth, writing, picture or any other manner "within the limits allowed by law." At the same time they may decree a preliminary censorship of the press, the theatre, the radio, the cinema, and so forth.

Full employment is declared "independent of religious belief, but for employment in educational institutions" the law will establish exceptions to this declaration.

Is there anything in this "God-given" Constitution that could not cover any of the measures of bigotry and discrimination introduced by Hitler Naziland?

# Talk Has Failed To Check Wars, Goldstein Says

## Refusal of Men to Fight Alone Can Avail, He Tells Students

Vigorous denunciations of war were delivered by Rabbi Sidney E. Goldstein, Kirby Page, Rabbi Le. Jung, and Professor Reinhold Niebuhr at the Jewish Educational Society's Seminary last night where for the first time in the history of New York City students representing the theological seminaries of all religious beliefs held a rally to protest against war and war preparations.

"War cannot be ended by arms reactions or by degrading and brutal wars," Dr. Goldstein said. "It must be ended altogether or not at all."

"We must recognize," said Rabbi Goldstein, "the failure of the instrumentalities which we have trusted during the last generation. The League of Nations was organized to establish international cooperation, to reduce armaments, to end war. But while the League has solved some minor controversies, it has failed in the greatest crises that have arisen in the world. The peace pacts, including the Briand-Kellogg Treaty, have also failed because of the conditions, compromises, and reservations attached to the treaties.

"The disarmament conference has likewise failed chiefly because the delegates assumed the validity of the war system, and spent their time discussing reductions in tonnage and guns."

"There is only one way in which we can end the age old evil of wars, the war system, and the modern devices of warfare today, war cannot be fought without manpower in the field and without attempts to prevent the manpower from the service of the government in the prosecution of the war program, war will come to an end. Wars will cease only when men refuse to fight."

## Suit Involving Boycott Delayed

(Continued from Page One) firm of Grotes and Conroy, attorneys for the Certified Company, last July charged that the three defendants "deliberately and maliciously attempted to prevent the plaintiff's customers and other Jewish bakers from purchasing the plaintiff's products, intending to destroy the good will of the plaintiff's business." The suit was charged with intimating in editorials that the Certified was not a reputable concern. It is alleged that the defendants, by the defendants made "improper, intimidating, and coercive threats against Jewish bakers who used the plaintiff's products."

## Boycott Not Mentioned

No mention of the anti-German boycott is made in the complaint. The answer, filed by Bushel and Iselin, is to deny the allegations, denied allegations of intimidation, coercion, and unlawful interference.

One of the features of the case is the introduction of James Waterman Wise's book, "Swastika," to demonstrate the righteousness of the boycott. Editorials in the Jewish Voice, the Jewish News, and with Hitlerite atrocities are also among papers on file with the court.

"Among the items are four editorials published by the Jewish Bakers' Voice asking the bakery industry, which is predominantly Jewish, to boycott the goods of the Certified Company."
