The Balfour Interpretation TN his plea for greater sympathy for the homeless victims of German persecutions and for a more liberal immigration policy by the gov-

ernments of the world in the present crisis, High Commispresent crisis, Fight Collinas-sioner McDonald, speaking be-fore the council of the auto-nomous body created by the League of Nations, declared:

"The Jewish leaders throughout the world, not only in theory, but in actual practice, give their funds to non-Jews. But I am forced to express the great-est disappointment over the failure of the Christian world to meet responsibilities in this mett responsibilities in this matter. If Christians had done as much as the Jews, there would be no refugee problem to-day. I feel it necessary to declare day, I feel it necessary to debate this before this governing body which does not contain a single Jewish member."

In the course of his report, Mr. McDonald emphasized the

progress of settlement of refug ees in Palestine and declared that Palestine is at this time practically the only area offer-ing immediate opportunity for refugee colonization upon an appreciable scale.

Lord Robert Cecil, that great humanitarian statesman, one of the world's greatest champions of peace, chairman of the governing body created by the League of Nations to aid the refugees, stirred the council by an impressive appeal for the permanent solution of the re-fugee problem "essential for the eredit of civilization."

He also pointed out that Ger-

many should aid in this work,

"We feel we have a strong aim on the German government to make easier that part of our work concerned with p ports enabling refugees to tra-vel and find permanent homes, and not to stay where they ori-ginally fled, and where there is no solution. This trouble, for which we are not responsible, is caused by measures which the German government has seen fit to take. The German govern-ment must do something to relieve us of the hurden imposed by nothing that we have done.

"Merely providing a solution for the day is no solution. We must provide subsistence to prevent starving, but we must seek a permanent solution."

Very little is asked of the German government—to adjust the problem of passports for the refugees. # Report Reveals Synagogues at Anti - Semitism Parley Fight

### Drive Against Endeks Is Monday to Mark Cere Urged; Jews Attacked in Several Cities

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) WARSAW, May 6.—The great danger to Poland resulting from the artifically fostered anti-Semitic spirit which is growing here apace was established in a report submitted today to the council of the Polish Socialist Party.

The report, detailing methods used by propagandists to create a spirit of anti-Semitism among the Polish masses, urged an immediate campaign against the Endeks, the National Democrats, a militant anti-government, anti-Jewish party, which the report ac-cused of using Hitler methods.

The report to the council followed a week in which anti-Semi-tic activities reached a climax in several communities where Jews were attacked on the streets and in their homes by Endeks, Naras (members of the National Radi-cal faction which recently seceded from the Endeks) and Nazis.

# £2,000,000 Loan by Gov't Causes Turmoil

Excitement Equaled OnlyWhenWhitePaper Appeared in 1930

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, May 6 .- Palestine Jewry was in a state of furor today when it became furor today when it became known officially that the government had granted the Agency for Palestine a total of only 5,600 immigration certificates, and in addition had issued an ordinance prohibiting Jews from picketing enterprises owned by Jews and employing Arab labor The new law will thus make illegal the united fight waged by all parties and factions to employ Jews only.

The excitement in Jewish Palestine today was, equaled only by the publication of the White Pa-per of 1930 by the British government, which was based on Sir John Hope Simpson's land report. The White Paper, which was issued by the MacDonald Labor government, contained a declara-tion of policy which was regarded by Zionists as a vital blow against the Balfour Declaration and the Mandate. Dr. Chaim Weizmann, then president of the World Zionist Organization, resigned as a protest against the document.

Added excitement was lent here by the simultaneous publication of the news concerning the £2,000, 000 loan negotiated by the Pales-tine government. The entire Hebrew press was unanimous in condemning the loan as a "blow to Jewish interests."

# Anti-Nazi Units Call for Action Against Hitler

Convention Asks Mayor Permit Them Parade in Yorkville

Lines of a united front against Hitlerism were drawn Saturday afternoon when 600 delegates representing 125 organizations of various convictions convened at Irving Plaza Hall in a United anti-Nazi Conference sponsored by the National Committee to Aid Victims of German Fascism.

Telegrams to Mayor LaGuardia and Police Commissioner O'Ryan demanding the right to hold an anti-Nazi parade in Yorkville next Thursday were sent by unanimous decision of the delegates who represented Jewish, labor and fraternal organizations.

A four-point program was unanimously adopted calling for aiding victims of the Hitler regime; arousing public opinion against Nazism, dissemination of Hitlerite propaganda and organization of the supporters of Hitler in the United States; cooperating in the ooycott movement against Gernan goods, and demanding an sylum for political refugees in the United States.

Plan Anti-Fascist Pape To carry out this program an executive committee headed by David Gordon was elected, which will organize a United Anti-Nazi Committee. Delegates were in-tructed to build up anti-Nazi centiment, especially in Ridgewood and Yorkville. Literature, open-air meetings and even an anti-Pascist newspaper are on the pro-



Describing what he called the narrowing political, economic and "marrowing political, economic and social horizon of the Jew throughout the world," Rabbi Milton Steinberg of the Park Avenue 
Synagogue, made a plea for support of the United Jewish Appeal

Rabbi Steinberg pointed out that one-half of the Jews are liv-ing under conditions which constitute a denial of freedom, "There is little help that Jews can expect from the outside," he asserted "we must seek our salvation by ourselves."

Rabbi Steinberg emphasized that the plight of the Jewish children in Palestine is far more tragic than that of the adults. He said that there are 60,000 Jews be-tween the ages of fourteen and twenty-two who are economically destitute in Germany.

After an address by Carlos L. Israels, chairman of the Junior Division of the Appeal, steps were taken to mobilize the youth of New York in the \$1,200,000 drive of the Greater New York United Jewish Appeal.

"Among the worst enemies of the
Jew is the political racketer and
gangster who uses the name of his
faith for his own filthy gain. I am
referring especially to the gentlemen responsible for the Brooklyn Jewish Democracy. Anyone who dares link the name of 'Jew' with any political organization ought to be scourged and excommunicated They are the vilest type of pro-fessional Jew.

"Those who undermine our faith most are the wrongdoers, whom the world will always hail as rep-resentative of our race. We believe that this provision of the law is unconstitutional and discriminatory, and is unfair both to the public and to ourselves. We have, therefore, instituted a suit to have this provision of the law

In taking this action, we seek simply to make it possible for the public to buy milk of the highest quality-Borden's milk-at as low a price as any other milk.

For more than 75 years we have worked to improve milk quality and to acquaint the public with those improvements. We have tried at the same time, through advertising, to increase general appreciation of the value of all milk-thereby making some contribution, we believe, both to public health and to total milk consumption.

We do not think that we should be penalized for this course by being forced to sell Borden's milk at a higher price, or that the public should be penalized by having to pay more for a quality product because of its advertising, which is measurable and of a constructive character.

In seeking the right to sell Borden's milk through stores at the same price as other milk, we wish to make it clear that we are not in favor of any course which would result in higher retail prices for any milk. # American Germans Flocking To Hitler Fold: Against Jews

'Those Not for Us Against Us,' Says Slogan; Members Grow Rolder and More Hostile Toward Neighbors Not Sympathetic; Writer Warns U. S.

The following is the sixteenth of a series of articles detailing the rise and growth of the Naziinspired anti-Semitic movement in this country in all its ramifi-

During the last year the Nazi organization has expanded widely through a series of strategic maanded widely neuvers which, while gaining a

citizenry. It then began the process of co ordinating other societies with its policies by atacking their neutral or anti-Hitlerite attitudes as treaor anti-fittlerite attitudes as trea-sonable to the German people. It demanded the fealty of German Americans to the old fatherland and got it.

The Friends of New Germany and their first great capture, the United German Societies, then instituted the DAWA, a group which now embraces all German Americans favoring the boycott of Jews and which may be extended later to include "Aryan" Americans. In the meantime it has Hitlerized social affairs of German American society in New York. The Steuben Society, one of the largest and most honored of German American societies, was forced to meet with the Nazis' written demands for the Hitlerizing of the German Day celebration in New York on December 6 before the Nazis would lend their support to the The Steuben Society has since lost many Jewish members as it drifted further into the Nazi fold, and today it is desperately seeking to ward off complete absorption by the Nazis. To do this it compromises its liberal policies and trades on its respectable name to have the anti-Nazi boycott declared illegal. It has been active in Washington, D. C., to this end.

Supporters of "Friends" The League of Friends of New Germany is drawing its support from virtually all types of German American organizations. The sing-ing societies, the music and theatre groups, political (non-Socialist) groups, sport and turn societies, literary and cultural vereins, (non-Socialist) relief and benefit associations, women's groups, war veteran organizations, and the massive professional and trade groups—all have contributed mem-bers to the Nazi anti-Jewish and

pro-Hitlerite campaign.

The mails are being utilized to spread the doctrine of Hitlerism; the public rostra, the radio, to a limited extent the movies, and the press serve as carriers of Nazi propaganda. Under this unflag-ging attack American opinion is gradually being diverted towards Tascism and anti-Semitism. The Security and support of the security of the security of each construction of the security of t

their acquired processes of reason. In recent weeks there has been a veritable landslide of support In recent weeks there has been a veritable landsilde of support gained by the Nazis who have opened new and wider doors to their organization by creating the DAWA, which appealed to those wishing to defend Germany and German Americans from the "Tewish mennee." The next step in organization, has already been fore-shadowed with the adoption of the slogan, "The Enemies of Germany are also the Enemies of America." I believe an alarmist attitude

toward the American Nazi situa-tion is justified. As the Nazis march, their lines grow ever stronger. They are fighting an active battle, against which passive resistance cannot prevail. Anti-Nazi forces find themselves fighting on altogether too many fro Their shells, timed to explode in Berlin, are without effect among the ranks of their assailants in America. The struggle promises to be a long one, and it appears strategically correct that defense fortifications should be strengthened before the rapidly growing enemy overwhelms all resistance.

### Plan of Attack

One might do well to adopt the Prussian methods of attack: cleaning up the immediate opposition and consolidating one's position before engaging in a scattered at-tack on a distant enemy.

The spirit of the American Nazis, which grows bolder as time Nazis, which grows bolder as time goes on, may be sensed at any meeting of the League of Friends of New Germany or their allied groups. It is distinctly Hitlerite, despite the American citizenship of its members. To illustrate: On the night of March 17 aboard the Hamburg American liner, Deutschland, which lay at the company pier in New York, the German Commercial Association (DHV), the Board of Trade for German-American Commerce, and other German and German-American organizations entered into a festive evening. German Ambassador Dr. Hans Luther spoke.

At the height of festivities omeone called for the Horst Wessel Lied, the Nazi marching anthem. All but one, a woman, raised their hands in the Nazi salute. She blushed under the stare of many guests. She was questioned about her conduct, and when she ex-plained that she refrained from saluting in deference to her friendship with Jews, she was badgered Her tormentors continued bother-ing her throughout the dinner, until Dr. Martin Genzel, a neighbor at the table, arose and announced that he would not stand for fur-ther molestation of the young woman.

How Gentlemen Are Treated During the early morning hours Dr. Genzel was taken out on deck and severely thrashed by a number of the celebrants, after which he remained unconscious for hours. He was treated by Dr. I. T. Griebl a Nazi kingpin of the group, and taken home rather than to the hospital.

This is the spirit of the American Nazis. They are courteous and friendly so long as one is with them. But in the words of one of their slogans, "Those who are no for us are against us," and they are treated as enemies. This spirit allows for no middle course in German American society, hence there is the necessity for each group to choose. And most, prac-

come into Nazi ranks. The German American children are afforded lavish entertainment at jugend fests aboard German ships, in the Turn Halle, and at other places. They are allowed to strut in their uniforms, similar to those of the Hitlerjugend at affairs for grown-ups. And from many viewpoints the Hitler youth groups appeal more to child psychology than do the non-Hitler organizations. The Nazi youth movement is designed here as in Germany to bring to manhood German American youth with a strong sense of responsi-bility to the German government and the old fatherland,

The same holds true of the women's organizations, which, it is widely recognized, are more cruel than men's groups in their attitude toward Jewish members. The women's groups are fashioned after Hitler's philosophy on the subject of wifely deportment. The Kirche, Kueche, Kinder theory is being ap-plied here also. Perhaps the most influential women's organization in the movement to Hitlerize German American women is the Women's Division of the DHV. Women's charity and benefit groups are largely exempt from anti-Semitism and other unwholesome features of the new order of German American society.

#### Their Sales Talk

The bulk of new support being given the Nazi movement comes from 110 trade vereins in the vicinity of New York City. These German American concerns are being drawn into the DAWA under the impression that the anti-Nazi boycott is meant as a boycott of all German American goods and services. This is untrue, but nevertheless the impression is assiduously spread by Nazis who seek support for their organization. There are numerous reports to the effect that Jewish employers have boycotted the American wares of discharged German employees and German American shops; but no bona fide instance of this sort has been disclosed. The support of these trade vereins however is sufficient to fortify the DAWA against financial worries and allow them to continue their march against American Jewry. Again in this case, the influence of the thoroughly Hitlerized DHV is important in the process of Nazi con-version. It is a leader of all the lerman American commercial orranizations

The writer can not believe that erman Americans, who have stablished an enviable record in phases of the development of e United States, can be at heart s thoroughly anti-American as hey now appear. Of all the nations

which go into the composition of the United States few have contributed more than the German does not German Americans to special privi-leges—such as the transplantation of Hitler's anti-Semitism in America. Nor does it give the German American element the right to set themselves up as a superior or even a distinct element among the sixty or more nationalities living America First?

The sentiment of German Americans for the old home is under-standable. Of 6,873,103 German Americans (that is, of German parentage) 1,608,814 were born in Germany. It is difficult for one to divorce his sentiments from his native land and the land of his forefathers. This is particularly true of Germans who are disciplined to revere Germany and its institutions. But the United States most hold precedence in the alle-giance of its citizens. Otherwise America should become the a for settlement of all European disputes. Almost twelve per cent of the country's population was born abroad. Thirty five per cent are of a pure foreign stock. I quote from a copyrighted spe-

This is a quasi-official news agency recently established to furnish Germany with what the Ministry of People's Englightenment and propaganda considers proper news from abroad.

The cablegram conveys the information that 750,000 so-called Americans already have withdrawn from "purely American clubs in the United States" considering them inconsistent with Nazi ideals.

All hyphenated German-American societies in the United States are to be united in the Friends of New Germany under Reinhold Walter, a German, the announcement says. The 750,-000 persons who are said to have severed their American association will be in it.

I inquired at the German Em-bassy in Washington concerning the truth of this information. A spokesman would neither deny nor affirm it. If the information is affirm it. If the information is correct, the Hitler government violates all American principles since the Monroe Doctrine. If this information is correct the Nazi regime's jurisdiction over American citizens should be ended. (To Be Continued Tomorrow)

### Jewish Social Service Expended \$21,000,000 For Relief Since 1874

The Nazi offensive is directed at Christianity because it sprang from Judaism. Hitlerism is just as grave a chal-lenge to the Christian world as to the Jews. And the answer to Hitlerism must come from the to Hitlerism must come from the Christian world as well as from the Jews. It is a question of war and peace, of might and right, of darkness and light, of right, of darkness and fight, of barbarism and civilization. It is the revolt of the hairy ape against civilized man."

High Commissioner McDonald High Commissioner MICDORAG and Lord Robert Cecil are right when they emphasize that the problem of the German refugees is not merely a Jewish problem, but that it should be the concern of the entire civilized world.

Palestine is recognized as the only bright ray of hope in connection with the settlement of refugees. But Palestine can at this time absorb a far larger number of refugees than are admitted there. The great British statesman, Lord Robert Cecil, who has done so much for the rehabilitation of Palestine in the spirit of the Balfour Declaration, should exert his induence in this crisis with the British government to give a more liberal interpretation of the historic Balfour Declaration and the Mandate, to fulfill the sacred pledge made by the Bri-tish government to the Jewish people. Palestine is prospering now because of the efforts of Jewish labor, of Jewish enter-prise and of Jewish investments. There is a shortage of labor in Palestine just now. To ke down Jewish immigration To keep Palestine at such a time as this, when the country's absorptive when the country's absorptive capacity justifies a much larger number of immigration certifi-cates than that granted by the government, and when the tragedy in Germany has made thou-sands of the ablest and the most intelligent Jews homeless; to treat the present situation as normal, to resort to technicalities—all this is hardly in keeping with the world's conception of the fairness of the British people and is not in the spirit of the Balfour Declaration.

### Herzl Exhibit Opens In Vienna; Shows **Early Zionist Letters**

VIENNA, May 6.—The beginnings of political Zionism are indicated here at a Herzl exhibit which has just opened. Among the objects shown are the various correspondences carried on be-tween Theodor Herzl, father of Zionism, and Lloyd George, King Victor of Italy, von Plehve, Grand Duke Friedrich of Baden and Premier Koerber.

Also at the exhibit are docu-ments concerning Herzl which have been lent from the archives of various governments and League of Nations.

### Palestine Communal Assembly Will Meet

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, May 6.—The Asefat Hanivcharim, the regularly elected assembly of the Jewish communities of Palestine, will open its session on May 15, according to an official announcement here. The assembly will take up a number of political problems, including immigration, and also the regulation of labor and employment strife.

The Balfour Declaration has been subjected to various interpretations by Zionists and non-Zionists. Those Jews and non-Jews who try to justify the cautious British policy in Palestine by injecting the Arab rights and claim to Palestine, and by re-ferring to the promises made by Great Britain to the Arabs dur-ing the war, forget or overlook the interpretation of the Balfour Declaration given by the man terpret it—Lord Balfour himself.

Among many other striking statements, Lord Balfour de-clared in the Hbuse of Lords, in 1922, as follows:

"The mandatory system al-"The mandatory system al-ways contemplated the Mandate for Palestine on general lines of the Declaration of November, 1917. It was not sprung upon the League of Nations, and, be-fore the League of Nations came into existence, it was not sprung upon the Powers that met together in Paris to deal with the peace negotiations. It was a settled policy among the Allied and Associated Powers before ever the Armistice came into existence. It was accepted in existence. It was accepted in America, it was accepted in this country, it was published all over the world, and, if ever there was a Declaration which had behind it a general consensus of opinion, I believe it was the Declaration of November, 1917.

human being supposes that Palestine is an over-populated country. It is, I believe, an under-populated country at the moment at which I speak fore all the economic developfore all the economic develop-ments to which I look forward have had time to take place; and if the hopes that I enter-tain are not widely disappointtain are not widely disappoint-ed, the power of Palestine to maintain a population far great-er than she had and could ever have under Turkish rule will be easily attained in consequence of the material well-being which under Turkish rule were wholly impossible...

"The hopes that I have just expressed with regard to the growth of population in Palestine, with regard to the numbers it could support, of course are based, and necessarily based, upon the amount of capital expenditure you can give to that country, upon the character of the population who are going to make use of the machinery provided by that capital expendi-ture, and upon the character of the Government under which all these operations will be carried

"But it can only do so, I believe, if you can draw upon the enthusiasm of the Jewish com-munities throughout the world. As soon as all this Mandate question is finally settled, as soon as all the existing legal difficulties have been got over, they will, I believe, come forward and freely help in the development of a Jewish Home.

"That is not going to be a great speculative investment; that is not going to bring mil-lions into the pockets of international finance: that is not going to prove wildly exciting upon the Stock Exchange of London or New York; that is going to be carried out as much, indeed far more, in order to carry out these great ideal designs-idealist, if you prefer that name than to earn dividends or to make fortunes. . .

of economic difficulties, the leaders of some of the Jewish communities retreat. Some of the Jewish institutions which it had taken decades to build up have been thoughtlessly and unceremoniously sacrificed upon the altar of economy and expediency.

"Jewish institutions are being starved. The chief excuse for abandoning the first line of defense is economic depression, but I maintain that this is a very nar-row, short-sighted view. The grave error which we have committed during the past few years was the haste with which we proceeded to relieve ourselves of our Jewish communal responsibilities. To my mind that constitutes an indictment of American Jewish leadership and a real source of danger for the future of American

Characterizing the Laughlin report as a "knavish, deliberate slur upon the whole Jewish people," Deutsch charged that it "carries all the earmarks of an attempt to introduce a racial passport system in the United States, based on the Nazi model."

"For years we in this country have been lulled into a false sense of security," Deutsch declared "We have regarded ourselves as a people apart, not subject to misfortunes and tragedies of the kind endured by our fellow Jews across

"In this concept we resembled the Jews of Germany who believed their prestige, their civilization, their contribution to Germany's repute rendered them immune from any serious assault upon their position.
"It is unnecessary here to ex-

patiate on the fallacy of that view or to describe the dreadful tragedy of German-Jewry which is being hung by the noose of the 'Aryan paragraph.

We have lived to see the attempt being made to introduce the 'Aryan' paragraph in these United States. A new and spurious race purification theory, similar to that of the Nazis, under which the Jews are singled out for attack and segregation is now being de-veloped in this country. Race Selection

Race Selection
"I call your attention to the white standard of race selection, advanced by Dr. Laughlin. Dr. Laughlin's 'purification of race theory,' is as dangerous and as spurious as the purified 'Aryan' theories advanced by Nazis, to which it bears suspicious

"His singling out of the Jew for mention as a particular race group to be barred from general admission to the United States, despite the condescending tribute to so-called 'superior' Jews is a knavish, deliberate slur upon the whole Jewish people, which dif-fers only from the Nazi brand in that it is couched in more political language.

To face the threat implied in

this anti-Semitic move, which he described as the more dangerous for its subtlety, as well as the other anti-Jewish assaults. American Jewish Congress chief urged the "classes and masses" of Jews in this country to "close their ranks" and "act together to save themselves." A call to "boycott Nazi-Ger-many to save humanity" was the

"The Waterloo of Hitlerism," Dr. Tenenbaum said, "will come on the battleground of economics and it is the economic issue which will deliver the blow of mercy to the Nazi regime. Pointing out that the boycott

has become world-wide, and that its first year has brought Ger-many "on the brink of bankruptcy," Dr. Tenenbaum expressed the hope that the American government would not accede to Hitler's request for a loan which would be used directly in an effort to break the boycott.

Central Labor Federation of Pales-tine, was immediately called into session and issued a proclamation calling for "a decisive war against both acts of the government," terming them as a "second edi-tion of the White Paper of October 1930, which provoked Jewry all over the world." At the same time steps were

The proclamation of the Histadruth revealed that the Jewish Agency had asked the government for 20,100 immigration certificates.

Agency held an extraordinary sit-ting here to consider the draft of a statement on the immigration problem, which will represent the views and attitude of the Jewish Agency toward the Palestine government. Meanwhile the immigration department of the Agency ounced officially that all applications for certificates received since this week will be considered in September, when the winter immigration schedule is made up. The government loan is regard-

ed as an additional and severe blow, because as the Hebrew press pointed out, while the burden of paying for the loan will fall on Palestinian Jewry, they will benefit only to the extent of £75,000. The remainder will go directly or indirectly to the Arabs, since government ...gencies employ mainly Arab labor. Some £250,000 will be used to obtain land for land-less Arabs, while £106,000 will go for Arab, schools. The distribu-tion of the loan, the Hebrew pa-pers complained bitterly, "is en-tirely in the spirit of the White Paper, Lord Passfield, Simpson and French."
