Stopping the Fraud

GOVERNOR LEHMAN'S approval of the Wald bill which makes it a misdemeanor to alter or conceal the mark on imported merchandise giving the country of its manufacture is sure to make the boycott of German products even more effective than it has been thus far.

As Samuel Untermyer recently pointed out, German manufacturers and importers and certain of our own retailers have been successfully resorting to frauds, evasions and devices by which they have deceived the American consumers. The German goods have been knowingly and misleadingly marked with the names of cities, provinces and states in Germany, instead of with the name of the country as specifically required by the law. Untermyer sharply criticized the Treasury Department for permitting these gross violations.

Senator Albert Wald and Governor Lehman deserve high praise for stopping in New York the evasive methods of the German manufacturers to camouflage their mark of origin of their products.

Samuel Untermyer, whose indefatigable efforts to curb these tricky violations of our laws and whose tireless work for the anti-German boycott have attracted worldwide and favorable attention, also merits the gratitude of all right-thinking and liberty-loving people.

Gangster Students

The Cuzists, the followers of the anti-Semitic Professor Alexander Luzzatto, were defeated in the Radutz by-election to the Parliament and they avenged themselves by attacking Jewish passengers in the trains. They beat the chief Rabbi of Jassey and plucked his beard. They attacked other Jewish travelers and forced them to shout "Long live Cuzist!"

It is reported that in Radutz, where the by-election was held, the Cuzists attacked not only the Jews but also Christians whom they suspected of having voted against the Cuzist state. The anti-Semitic rumors were dispersed by the gendarmes.

In 1927, while visiting Rumania, I heard from eyewitnesses and victims exactly the same accounts of Cuzist outrages. The same attacks on Jewish passengers in moving trains were made there. The same humiliations were heaped upon anyone who looked like a Jew to the Cuzist ruffians in students' uniforms.

Protest Rages In Palestine Over Rulings

Jewish Labor Holds Many Meetings—His-tadruth Angered

JERUSALEM, May 8.—A wave of protest is sweeping the country against the government policy announced Sunday, which granted the Agency for Palestine only 6,000 immigration certificates and established an ordinance prohibiting Jews from picking enterprises owned by Jews which employ Arab labor.

Incensed by the rulings, Jewish labor here last night opened its campaign against the new immigration policy with a mass meeting.

Ten protest meetings have been announced for tomorrow by the Histadruth, Central Labor Federation of Palestine. A proclamation recently issued by the Histadruth revealed that the Jewish Agency had asked the government for 20,000 immigration certificates. The Labor Federation's protest meetings are to be held in Jerusalem, Tel-Aviv, Haifa and in the larger settlements.

Hebrew Teachers Plan Strike End

Get Conditions and Wage Demands for Their Return

The bill is now Section 435-C of the State Penal Law. It was introduced into the Senate by Senator Albert Wald.

Wauchope Will Be Present at Geneva Parley

Will Also Be in London When Emir Arrives—Rumors Are Rife

LONDON, May 8.—Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, High Commissioner for Palestine, has decided to go to Geneva for the forthcoming session of the Mandate Commission of the League of Nations, the press reports today.

High Commissioner Wauchope will stay in London during June, when Emir Abdullah of Transjordan will be here. The Emir's visit has been reported in the Palestine press to be for the purpose of being crowned king of Palestine following his recognition of the Balfour Declaration. The Colonial Office informed the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that the Emir's call "is purely one of courtesy."

Jerusalem's Arab newspapers have been reporting that High Commissioner Wauchope's purpose in going to London is to prepare for the reception of Emir Abdullah.

Still other rumors are to the effect that the Emir will sign a treaty with the British that would unite Palestine and Transjordan into one kingdom under his rule.

Arab Prisoner Testifies Against Revisionist Trio

Mejid Claims Details of Confession Were Furnished by Rosenblatt and Stavsky—Judge Rebukes Him

JERUSALEM, May 8.—Abdul Mejid, Arab convict who declared that the Revisionist Zionists now on trial for the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff attempted to bribe him to assume the blame for the murder, took the stand again this morning when the trial resumed.

Mejid, who was examined by Musal Al Alami, Arab government prosecutor, said he was called to the office of Chief Investigator Rice, whom he told he knew nothing about the murder of Dr. Arlosoroff. Later, however, his fellow convicts Issa Darwish and Sufchi, were also brought into Rice's office and confronted Mejid.

When the questioning began again Sufchi winked to him, Mejid said, and he began his confession that he and Issa had killed Dr. Arlosoroff, relating details which he said were furnished him by Rosenblatt and Rosenblatt.

"Did others in your cell understand what Stavsky and Rosenblatt told you?" prosecutor Alami asked. Mejid answered that the other prisoners didn't understand Hebrew, but that one of the prisoners saw him talking to the Revisionists.

Orders Confession Read
Following a request from defense counsel Horace Samuel, the court ordered that Mejid's first confession to Rice be read in court. "Did Rice show you the bullets which killed Arlosoroff?" Samuel asked the Arab. "He showed me four bullets from which I picked one resembling the bullet previously shown me in jail by Rosenblatt," Mejid replied, adding, "when Rice asked me what bullet was used to kill Arlosoroff, I answered a nickel Ross."

At this point Samuel asked the court for the reading of Mejid's second confession, which was made to prosecutor Bahor Shitret, with more details on the killing of Dr. Arlosoroff. The court consented. After the confession was read Samuel asked Mejid: "Is this your signature under the confession?" "That is my name," Mejid declared, "but everyone can sign my name. This statement contains only what I said," he added, he said.

Reich Puts 2-Week Ban On Paper for Printing Death Notice of Jewess

GENEVA, May 8.—The "Frankische Kurier, a newspaper in Franconia, where Julius Streicher is political boss, was banned for two weeks for publishing the death notice of a Jewish woman who was noted for her philanthropic work among Jews and non-Jews alike, it was revealed today.

The story was brought back to Geneva by a newspaper correspondent who had returned from a visit to Southern Germany and illustrates the methods used by Nazis to enforce the boycott on Jewish advertisements in the German press.

Fascism Called Peace Threat At Conference

Parley on War and Economic Injustice Blames Financial Muddle

Speakers at the Conference on War and Economic Injustice, held during morning and afternoon sessions at the Broadway Tabernacle yesterday, indicated that Fascism is one of the major threats to world peace and that the cause of Fascism is the peculiar economic muddle in which the finances of the world are tied up.

At the morning session Reinhold Niebuhr, principal speaker, declared that capitalism is seeking to save itself by insisting on the lower middle classes in Fascism. He defined Fascism as "a lower middle class psychosis—the poor man's movement," and stated that Germany had a choice of Fascism or Socialism. He indicated that the former course was adopted under the manipulation of the capitalist class.

Villard Recalls Willard

Oswald Garrison Willard, former editor of The Nation, recalled the late President Wilson's assertion that America must face a revolution, more than likely a bloodless revolution. He stated that the World War interrupted the country's trend toward revolution, and that in this he laid most of the country's recent economic distress.

Rabbi Louis I. Neumann held that ministers and rabbis are the champions of their congregations, favoring the element that is the better off element. He said that with respect to this, the clergy "are not carbon copies of the people in power, but they are, therefore, more radical." "We are the custodians of all good traditions and spokesmen for the little fellows," he said.

Dr. Russell W. Bowie conducted devotions at the opening of the conference at ten A.M.

Speakers during the afternoon session of the conference included Dr. Allen Knight Chalmers, Rabbi Edward L. Israel, Mrs. Billmore Morehouse Herrick, Dr. Henry W. Laidler, Dr. Charles C. Weber, and Maxwell S. Stewart.

The lower floor of the Tabernacle was well filled with some five hundred persons, who took advantage of the opportunity to put questions to the speakers and speak on their own subjects under discussion.

Israel Orphan Home Children Eager to Begin Show Holiday

There is an air of anticipation about the premises of the Israel Orphan Asylum in New York. Both children and staff are looking forward to the near future when, their belongings packed, they will move to their new Brooklyn seashore home. There they spend five months of each year.

Already preparations are in progress at the summer home. At the end of May, the city house at 374-282 Second avenue, now a beehive of activity with more than 150 children on five floors, will be empty except for the office staff.

Each floor in the city houses a different age group, the little inmates' ages ranging from two to seven. Each floor is a complete unit with its own dining room of small chairs and tables, in which boys and girls are trained in self-help. Each age department has its own rows of cribs, a playroom and a kitchen, especially adapted for the youngsters.

On every floor two nurses and a porter are in attendance. There is a special staff for night duty. Another group of employees directed the kitchen which is managed in strict accordance with dietary laws.

There is a Hebrew school, a kindergarten and regular classes un-

der supervision of the Board of Education teachers.

At the end of the Israel Orphan Asylum to a man in the street and two things come instantly to his mind: the annual Madison Square Garden and the Gaiety Theatre. Elaborate entertainment and the presence of notables from every conceivable field of endeavor, and Judge and Mrs. Hartman.

For the Garden affair, it receives so much publicity each year through the press, radio and other mediums that no further mention need be made of it here.

Not so well known is the fact that Judge Hartman has been heading the institution since its inception that Mrs. Hartman was connected with it for many years in various capacities, including that of superintendent. Following their marriage, Mrs. Hartman has been continuing her daily stint on full time, the only difference being that she resigned as a paid employee and is now serving under the title of honorary superintendent.

The house physician visits children daily. There is a large medical staff, including numerous specialists. A little "hospital" and a dental room are on the premises. Two dentists visit the institution weekly.

Kraus Granted Stay Of 6 Months Here

Dr. Arthur J. Kraus, ousted City College instructor, yesterday revealed that the Department of Labor had granted him a six-month extension of his stay in the United States. He was to have been deported to Poland last March.

Dr. Kraus was dropped from the Philosophy Department of the City of New York after a hunger strike in protest against mistreatment of Jewish students in Polish universities.

Social Groups Unite to Deal With Distress

B'klyn Group Merges With Guardians, Judge May Approves

The problem of the prevention and correction of delinquency in Brooklyn is now being dealt with on a city-wide basis in coordination with similar work in other boroughs, according to an announcement made public last night by Supreme Court Justice Mitchell May, president of the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities. Accompanying the announcement was an appeal to the contributing public of Manhattan and other parts of the city to recognize the obligation to support the Federation's \$500,000 campaign without regard to borough divisions.

Justice May declared that the Brooklyn Jewish Social Service Bureau has been merged with the Jewish Board of Guardians of New York and that it will function hereafter as the Jewish District of the Jewish Board of Guardians with headquarters at 285 Schermerhorn street.

In the success of this experiment, declared Justice May "may bias the trial to other functional coordination of the Jewish social services on both sides of the East River." The Brooklyn Federation and the New York Foundation are jointly financing this venture in social engineering. It is a matter of mutual interest that the governing boards of the two participating agencies were able to negotiate the merger with genuine understanding in behalf of better service to the community."

Basel Deplores Lack Of Communal Spirit Among N. Y. Jews

"Every individual should be trained for communal responsibilities," Dr. A. Basel said in a lecture conducted by the Bronx Jewish Community Club at the Schiff Center, 2510 Valentine avenue, last night. Dr. Basel's topic was, "Function and Value of a Jewish Community."

"I feel that the greatest hindrance in developing Jewish institutions in this city is caused by the lack of cooperative communal spirit," Dr. Basel declared. "Of the 2,000,000 Jews dwelling in New York comparatively few support Zionism which are the pride of Jewry."

City College Celebrates Its 87th Anniversary; Robinson, Eisner Speak

City College celebrated its eighty-seventh anniversary with all-day Charter exercises yesterday. A morning session was held in the Great Hall while a military drill was the feature of the afternoon exercises in the 102nd Engineers Armory.

President Frederick E. Robinson and Mark Eisner, chairman of the Board of Higher Education, were the principal speakers at the morning session.

In the afternoon the Student Council conducted a Charter Day exercise of its own. Norman Thomas, featured speaker, assailed the policy of celebrating a college anniversary with a military drill. He also attacked Fascism and Hitler.

Fascists in America Are United Against Jews

America's Inertly Encouraging To Anti-Democratic Groups Here

Championed by Fascists in U. S.

Reactionists, the Disgruntled, Envious Poor, 'Rugged Individualists' and Prophetic Intellectuals Flock to Fold of Pro-Nazis and Their ilk

Agents Are Active
It is difficult to prophesy with regard to the success of the Congressional Committee created by the Dickstein resolution for the investigation of Nazi and other propaganda. German Nazis continue to remain in this country and will do so more than likely until, like the refugee Spanknobels, they are summoned to an accounting. There will be not only the American citizens who have been appointed by the Government to head the Nazi groups, and these can place in evidence their former chiefs' deloga.

The following is the last of a series of eighteen articles dealing with the anti-Semitic movement in the United States. The first was published on Wednesday, April 18. The articles were based on an exhaustive investigation of Nazi propaganda activities in this country and in Germany for a period of over a year.

Shirt movement, "explained" the Wirt charges in confidential letters widely circulated from Washington. Felley pointed out that Jews were at the bottom of the conspiracy mentioned by the Hoosier teacher, George Christians, commander-in-chief of the Crusader White Shirts, took occasion to identify himself as the author of the "Kerensky" phrase, and thereby won for himself nation-wide publicity.

A Common Enemy
While in many cases there is no tangible alliance between the various Fascist organizations operating in the United States, nevertheless they strive for the same goal, batter their common enemy which is Democracy, and generally aid each other's cause. They all seek to render "America to Americans," although the Khaki Shirts speak English with a heavy Italian accent; although the Silver Shirts in New York (75 per cent of their following drawn from the League of Friends of New Germany) normally is composed of the native German; although the American Nationalists speak with an Irish brogue; although the Croix de Feu are entirely at home in French and not at all in English; although the entire Fascist movement, particularly in the East, is expressed in a babel of tongues in which English is common to all.

Dr. William A. Wirt, white-collar patriot from Gary, Ind., is shown attacking the "Brain Trust," charging that it is attempting to establish Communism here. Because of his attitude toward the Government he is strongly espoused by a number of Fascist, anti-Semitic groups in this country.

Is America going Nazi? In the course of seventeen articles I have pointed out the tremendous growth of Fascism, the adoption by it of a political nature, the creation of hundreds of new Fascist organizations throughout the United States, the tendency of reactionaries to abandon all but the matter in power to join the rising Fascist movement, and the efforts to unite all small political groups into a powerful Fascist anti-Semitic party. This development, considering the rapidity with which it embedded itself in American political affairs, is the most remarkable in the history of the country.



How far it will go is a question which may now be answered as accurately by the most ignorant trader on the street as by the politician. The Fascist movement is generally scorned. It was so received by other European countries, which eventually bowed before the overwhelming forces of unity, aggression, violence and persecution which characterize the Fascist movement. As yet no nation, aside from those led by non-Fascist dictators, has found a means of stunting the growth of Fascism within its boundaries. It is surprising that the United States government, traditionally tolerant of alien political beliefs and activities, succeeds in discouraging the Fascist and Nazi movements.

A Potpourri
Fascism provides a link for the reactionists, the disgruntled, the envious poor, the rugged individualists, the prophet, the rugged individualist, the proud "Aryans," the religious and nationalistic fanatics, the demagogue, the political racketeer, and the man who regards the law as his business, has attracted anti-Communist and somewhat anti-Semitic pamphlets throughout the nation. These are printed in Germany and distributed free of charge here. The booklets he distributes justify Hitlerism and the Hitlerite type of government. Easy to read and containing the respectable American names subscribed to these booklets.

On one thing can the divergent Fascist groups see eye-to-eye. That is the Jewish question. Virtually all Fascist organizations are anti-Semitic, and they are united in this respect a kindred feeling despite their entirely different economic and social philosophies. It is remarkable that not one group, to achieve unity in their own ranks, should so effectively inspire unity among their enemies.

Anti-assurance have Jewish citizens or Catholic citizens or any other citizens who might be considered a minority group that one or two years hence some powerful force will not merely bring together all minor political parties into a Fascist machine, and then proceed to invoke the terrorism of the middle Ages against them.

Three authorities which might be commonly expected to defend the American democratic form of government are the Department of Justice, the Post Office Department and the Federal Reserve Board.

U. S. Gov. Her Guard
My inquiries at the investigation bureau and the press office of the Department of Justice revealed an apparent ignorance of Nazi conditions in Germany. When I asked for specific information concerning action being taken against such groups as the Silver Shirts, the Crusader White Shirts, and other Fascist organizations, the Department of Justice spokesmen indicated that they had little data and were not taking action against these groups.

In the Post Office Department the same situation prevails. Members of the inspection force presented me with a complete file of anti-Semitic literature being circulated through the mails. The specimens had been gathered in the course of the last two years and represented approximately ten letters and circulars. One of the "anti-Semitic"

samples happened to be a seal sold months ago by what is now the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League. It was about the size of a postage stamp and its inscription urged that for humanity's sake Nazi goods should not be bought. Members of the department told me that the sale of these stamps, circulated through the mails, had been declared illegal because of a clause which enjoins against the use of seals so closely resembling stamps.

Other evidences of anti-Semitic propaganda included a number of chain letters which demand, "Hit the Jew whenever you can." Copies of a number of scurrilously anti-Jewish newspapers were on display in the Post Office files, but they continue to circulate through all the action the Post Office Department may take, will continue to do so. Here and in other departments I discovered an awful respect for the freedom of the press and sanctity of the mails. It appeared that none is willing to take the responsibility of prosecuting the case against American Fascism because of the bow that might emanate from the entire press of the country.

Mr. Aldrich Comments
When such charges were laid before Chief Inspector A. P. Aldrich, he wrote in part: "The absence of greater activity by the Post Office Department in connection with Nazi and other anti-Semitic propaganda which does not come or to an unwillingness to assume responsibility. Action is taken whenever it is shown that matter is being disseminated through the mails in violation of the Postal Laws. The department has no authority, however, to suppress the dissemination through the mails of literature which does not come within the scope of the Postal Laws even though such literature contains statements objectionable to particular groups or organizations."

"With respect to the opening of mail matter, Post Office inspectors, as well as all others in the department, are governed by Section 701 of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1932, which reads as follows: "No person in the postal service, except those employed for that purpose in the Division of Dead Letters, or a branch thereof, shall break, or permit to be broken, the seal of any letter or other matter while in the custody of the postal service. Neither postman-

ters, inspectors, employees of the Post Office Department, nor officers of the law, without legal warrant therefore, have authority to open under any pretext a sealed letter while in the mails, not even though it may contain improper or criminal matter, or furnish evidence for the conviction of offenders."

Thus these chain letters and seditious circulars may be sent through American mails with virtual impunity.

Section 211
Perhaps the only clause which might be brought into play is one tucked on to the end of Section 211 of the Act of Congress with regard to mails. This act, approved March 4, 1909, and amended two years later, provides for the non-mailability of letters or indecent material, instruments for abortion or the prevention of conception, and various devices related to both categories, the circulation of which is punishable by not more than five years' imprisonment, a fine of \$5,000, or both. "And," the appended paragraph reads, "the term, 'indecent,' within the intendment of this section shall include matter of a character tending to incite arson, murder, or assassination."

Felley fairly stuffs the mails with matter that tends to incite to wholesale murder of Jews; Christians has sent through the mails orders for the capture of all local national capital; the Congress of Friends of New Germany has stirred a large portion of German Americans to an intense hatred of the Jew. And yet no action has been taken.

Section 212 provides for the non-mailability of material which slanders or defames another when such matter is written on the outside of an envelope, cover, or wrapper. It offers no protection, however.

450 in Newark Pay Tribute to Mrs. Felix Fuld

Rabbi Goldman Asks End of Hysterical Reaction by Jews

(Special to the J.D.B.)
NEWARK, N. J., May 8.—In paying tribute to Mrs. Felix Fuld, Presbyterial Philip Lindeman, Isaac Lowenstein and A. Diamond at a dinner in Fuld Hall of the Y.M.-Y.W.H.A. last night, more than 450 representative Jewish citizens heard earnest pleas to forego hysterical or panicky reaction to any current manifestations of anti-Semitism, and to concentrate rather on developing their sense of Jewish consciousness.

The principal plea was voiced by Rabbi Solomon Goldman, who was the main speaker at the event which marked fifty years of the Y.M.-Y.W.H.A. in this city, and the start of a week's celebration of the opening of the present building. Elgin and Kinney streets a decade ago.

"Used to it?"
"Declaratory of anti-Semitism doesn't worry me; I've used to it," Rabbi Goldman maintained that "what we must emphasize in the present crisis is not anti-Semitism, but the Nation, not the spread of Nazism, but rather what is the manner of reaction to it. For the first time in eighteen centuries, the Jew is being persecuted by panicky and hysterical because we're afraid and not prepared. Our ancestors shrugged their shoulders and walked away from any manifestations of anti-Semitism."

In asserting that the "Jewish nation is a recognition of the common aspirations and unity of our people," Harry L. Gluckman, executive director of the National Council on Anti-Semitism, said: "The solution of our difficulties is not to be found in pleasing our Christian neighbors or excelling them in pollution; it is the essential problem of inner emotional adjustments."

Banberger Sends \$5,000
The dinner paid \$10 a plate, a minimum to be devoted to the institution. A highlight of the occasion was the announcement by Michael A. Slavisky, toastmaster, that Mrs. Banberger has paid \$5,000 for his ticket and that through the efforts primarily of Harry A. Lindeman was the first president of the book, the 87th half century ago. Diamond was unable to attend.

Other speakers included Samuel I. Kessler, present head of the center; Dr. G. Robinson, its executive director. Rabbi Charles I. Hoffman delivered the opening prayer. The principal feature of the 87th anniversary journal was a comprehensive history of endeavor during the past fifty years, written by Nathan Kusny, local lawyer and playwright.

Turner admitted Jews had been killed in racial persecutions, but said physical violence has given way to mental mistreatment of the German Jews.

However, despite his criticism of anti-Semitism, the Berlin clergyman declared that "Germany needs Christian brotherhood, and that anything else in its present crisis" and contended that "Christ must supplant the boycott in the dealings of other nations with Germany."

Germany is turning toward militarism, he said, because "it waited long years for other nations to disarm, but saw only greater and greater armaments among its neighbors."

The Bulletin's Da Book

The Parisier Tagelblatt's Berlin correspondent calls attention to the fact that comparatively little importance is attached abroad to the person of Hitler's "viceroys." Hess whose role is becoming more and more important and whose influence is increasing every day.

In other words, they ain't doing right by our Nell, and Adolf Hitler (alias Dr. Jekyll and Mrs. Hyde) is still playing the viceroys. The capitalist villains who't have the eloquent call of the II seek an angle of the program.

On the other side of this isolated palace area (grounds like a concentration camp) we find the labor front, the brown-shirted regi-

ments and the party. In the latter it is said, so the correspondent's touching tale runs, that Hitler knows not what is actually happening. Everything is concealed from him.

Hess, though, knows all, hears all, has his finger on the pulse of everything. Calmly, quietly he holds consultations with influential Nazis, taking care not to create stir around his name or position. With Hitler totally unaware (what refreshing ignorance!) Hess stands before the leader of the labor front, with commanders of storm troopers.

This, according to our scribe, Hess is really being groomed for the organizer of a new front—against Hitler's capitalist environment.

The day will come when Hitler will have to make his choice. Then he will see light through his "viceroys." Hess is not too sure of his allies. He does not appear to be trusting implicitly in Roehm who, though he has a more ambitious and conceited than Goering himself.

If, as has been rumored of late, Roehm is really being groomed for the post of the Minister of War, the new front will acquire a pretty big role. In any event, this Hitler-less front is probably a reality at this time.

As to the contention that it seeks to enforce a complete Nazi program, just imagine what the Jewish program will be like, if what Germany is enjoying now is only a part of it.

Austrian Jewry Fight for Control

Agudath Israel and Zionists Grapple Over Leadership

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, May 8.—The Jewish population of Vienna is extremely agitated by a threatened split in the Vienna Jewish community. The Austrian Agudath Israel, ultra-orthodox Jewish organization, demanded that the leadership of the Jewish community, now in the hands of the Zionists, be given to the religious groups and threatened to secede and form an orthodox community, if their demands are not granted.

The Judische Presse, organ of the Agudath Israel, declared that a central committee of Austrian Jewish orthodox elements has been formed to further the Agudath policy. Propaganda for the Agudath point of view has already begun, and the government press is supporting the campaign against the Zionists and the Jewish national groups. Mass meetings are being held in the Vienna Jewish districts by the Zionists protesting against the Agudath agitation.

Dealer in Reich-Made Products Expelled by Warsaw Community

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, May 8.—The Warsaw Jewish community decided today by a unanimous vote to elect Menachem Ellenberg, an expelled member, from the governing board of the community. The decision to expel him came after a lengthy campaign in the Jewish press against Ellenberg, who was accused of dealing in German goods.

At the same time, the board went on record as favoring the strengthening of the boycott campaign against German-made goods.

'Fascism vs. Zionism' Provokes Quarrel Among Italian Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

TURIN, May 8.—The entire board of the Turin Jewish community resigned today. The board was split owing to a conflict between the Zionist and non-Zionist elements. The quarrel arose when Turin newspapers declared that Fascism and the acceptance of Zionism by Italian Jews could not be reconciled.

Advocate Ovazza, prefect of the province, was appointed government commissioner for the Turin Jewish community.

Seven more department stores in New York were listed yesterday among those no longer buying German goods. This brings the total number of stores refusing merchandise of the Nazis to sixteen.

The American Jewish Congress, making announcement of added strength of the boycott, named as the recent enlistments in the anti-Nazi campaign:

- Saks Fifth Avenue Store.
- Saks Thirty-fourth Street Store.
- Gimbel Brothers.
- Sterns.
- Russ Brothers.
- James McCreery and Company.

Dr. Joseph Tenenbaum, chairman of the Boycott Committee of the American Jewish Congress, listed as earlier recruited department stores: R. H. Macy and Company, Best and Company; Bloomingdale's; Arnold Constable; Lord and Taylor; Hearn's Department Stores, Inc.; and L. M. Blumenthal and Company. Dr. Tenenbaum said that all of these concerns have ceased buying merchandise made in Germany as a result of consumer resistance to German goods.

Dr. Tenenbaum believes that with the addition of the seven department stores virtually all the leading department stores in Manhattan have joined the ranks of those refusing to do business with Nazi Germany.

Anti-Nazi Hail Wald Measure

(Continued from Page One) fraud violation. "I do find that metal tape measures had to be broken before the word "German" could be seen. Vandy cases had been tampered with and purchaser could view the mark of origin. Previous legislation proved inadequate.

In a letter, Dr. Fisher declared, the law seemed to fit misbranding and not the thousands of instances in which the retailer sells goods, knowing that a mark of origin has been tampered with, but does not disclose that fact to purchasers.

Praising the assistance rendered by Senator Ramsey, "I wish all credit for the bill's passage must go," Dr. Fisher explained that the latest section of the Penal Law has been amended to cover misbranding. "Its force lies in two chief directions. In the first place it extends to articles in intra-state commerce the Federal prohibition against the defacement and concealing marks of origin.

Forces Close Examinations
"The second substance is novel. It scores those who sell articles of merchandise to the knowledge of the vendor or his agents, employes or servants the mark of origin has been removed.

The act covers every person who sells in the State of New York to examine carefully the product for indications of defacement, for violation two is so broad that it comes from an inspection of the article, knowledge of the removal, defacement or obliteration of the mark of origin could have been obtained, and the act cannot be sold now without violating the criminal law of the State.

"The only way the vendor can escape penalty is by placing signs again a mark of origin not only on the article itself, but also on both the immediate and outer containers of the goods.

Seller Must Prove
The new law also provides that where a mark of origin is not in evidence through removal, obliteration, etc. it is a prima facie proof of violation. The act becomes effective at once. Similar measures are soon to be introduced in other states.

Dr. Fisher gave credit for assisting him in drafting the bill to Henry Sofer, chairman of the Lawyers' Committee. Professor M. J. C. Rosen and other students of Columbia Law School, he said, did the necessary research work, under the direction of Lawrence Greenberg.

In commenting on the bill Mr. Sofer said: "I am reorganizing the Legal Committee and am assigning a number of my associates and attorneys who will devote themselves specifically to the task of bringing to the attention of the authorities and prosecuting every violation of the Wald measure."

"Let the teachers come to me with two people from the synagogue who will have two representatives and a fifth man chosen by both factions to decide the strike," Solowitz declared over the telephone yesterday.

The terms which teachers will present to the board, demand at least \$20 a week, as well as vacations and wages during religious holidays, suspension of teaching activities.

The Yeshiva has been closed since the dispute started and the four teachers, including one woman, began picketing the school with placards proclaiming to passersby that the institution's board of directors was unfair to organized labor.

Demand Recognition

The teachers at first demanded that the board recognize the Central Committee of Hebrew Teachers' organizations in settling the strike, but the refusal of the board of directors to deal with the union has forced them to modify their demands in this respect.

At a meeting held Sunday night in the synagogue parents of the children attending the Yeshiva requested they would support the teachers' demands; that the teachers' demands be granted by the board of directors; that the directors of the school settle the strike with the teachers; that the children would not lose time from their studies, and that they would form a parents' committee to meet with the directors and present their demands.

According to the teachers, their average salary was \$15 a week, and often "they weren't even sure of that."

There are 300 pupils in the school, ranging in age from six to sixteen.

Asked why he questioned Isaac about details of the murder in the office of Investigator Rice, Mejd replied: "Sufshi taught me how to put the questions to Issa. Sufshi knows everything. It was always with Stavsky and Rosenblatt and he received \$500."

Cross-examined by the court on the matter of the man writing Mrs. Arlosoroff at an identification parade, Mejd declared that he saw her then for the first time. "I hear her what Sufshi taught me to say."

"Exactly what you tell her?" Pressing Judge Corrie asked Mejd, however avoided a direct answer to the question. He gave direct answers to questions put by Samuel.

Judge Corrie lost patience and interrupted one of the examining witnesses with the admonition: "Tell us yes or no and don't refer to Sufshi's alleged teaching at every question."
"Did you throw away your shoes months after Dr. Arlosoroff was killed?" Samuel asked him. Mejd did not answer.

Mejd's next answer by Samuel Mejd declared that he knew Tel Aviv well and was familiar with the scene of the murder, adding that he knew the route to the cemetery, since his brother was buried there. He also admitted that he had served a short jail term, was acquainted with the police and had received pay from the police for serving them. Mejd was still on the witness stand when the morning session ended.

at the polls should open the eyes of the Rumanian people to the menace of the gangster bigots in students' uniforms who are led by a perverted university professor. The Iron Guard, the National Rumanians led by Cuzza and Goga, are undermining peace and order in Rumania. The Jews are the first sufferers. But the menace is more far-reaching. It is directed against all the decent elements of the Rumanian people. Fortunately there are men in Rumania who are determined to stand up to the government today who understand this.

Religion and War

Two hundred Christian ministers and several rabbis at a conference of "We, the Economic Injustice" indicated their opposition to war. They also expressed themselves in favor of a radical change in the economic system which breeds war.

The most forceful declaration was made by Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick, pastor of the Riverside Church, in which he expressed his opposition to war and "every alliance that maintains and encourages it," and recalled the remark of Field Marshal Haig: "It is the business of the churches to make my business impossible."

Then he made the following statement:

"I renounce war because of what it does to our own men. I renounce war because of what it compels us to do to our enemies, bombing and shelling their cities, murdering their children by blockades, laughing over our coffee cups about every damnable thing we have been able to do to them. I renounce war because of its consequences, for the lies it invents and propagates, for the undying hatreds it arouses, for the dictatorships it creates, for the loss of democracy, for the starvation that stalks after it. I renounce war and never again, directly or indirectly, will I sanction or support another."

During the World War, the churches of all the nations involved in the war gave their blessings to the soldiers, sailors and airmen. They blessed the enemy, the people who did not know the real causes of the war, who had no voice in the declaration of war, who had no real grievance against the enemy, who prayed to the same God for victory. The result of the World War was neither victory nor peace.

The spiritual leaders, the clergy, who sanction war and bless it are untrue to the highest ideals of religion. The noblest essence of religion is the ability to be compatible with the brutalities of war.

Hyman Reveals Conditions

HARRISBURG, Pa., May 8.—Joseph C. Hyman, secretary of the Joint Distribution Committee, declared last night that the Jews of Germany are infinitely worse off now than they were when the present situation began in the Reich.

Addressing a mass meeting at the Jewish Community Auditorium for the United Jewish Appeal, Hyman said that its honorary secretary said: "At no time since the present Nazi government has come into power, have the Jewish people of Germany felt as hopeless, so uncertain, so despairing."

"To me, the answer is clear and inescapable—to refuse our help to them would be an act of crass injustice and abandonment of our common duty as Jews and of our obligation as human beings."
