The Jewish Protest

THE general strike held yesterday in Jewish Palestine in protest against the restrictive immigration policy of the Palestine government represented every group of Palestinian Jewry. All political differences were forgotten in the just demand for a larger number of immigration certificates for Jewish workers waiting to be admitted to Palestine where the shortage of labor is acute at present.

The Zionists in Poland and other lands joined in this protest against the illiberal immigration policy of the Palestine government.

Palestine is prosperous today because of the work, the enterprises, the sacrifices of the Jewish people. The absorptive capacity of Palestine now fully justifies a liberal immigration policy for Jewish labor seeking a new home and new opportunities in the old home of the Jewish people. The restrictive immigration policy affecting Jewish immigration to Palestine at this crucial moment is not in keeping with the pledges contained in the Balfour Declaration and the mandate.

This is the acid test of the mandatory power's sincerity with regard to the Balfour Declaration. Victims of Nazi Germany and of other lands indulging in economic discrimination on religious grounds are eagerly seeking refuge in Palestine. To them Palestine is the only hope. To them Palestine would be the only salvation. The actual fulfillment of the Balfour Declaration would not only save these refugees from their desperate plight, but would also aid in the progressive development and the increased prosperity of Palestine for all the inhabitants of the land.

So far the failure to fulfill the Balfour Declaration as conceived by the author of that declaration has served to intensify friction between Arabs and Jews, for the demand for necessary Arab agitators endeavored to convince the Arab masses that Great Britain had never intended to make good its promises to the Jewish people.

If the mandatory power fails in the fulfillment of its obligations and permits the restrictive immigration at a time when the "absorptive capacity" of Palestine justifies a very much larger Jewish immigration to Palestine, what becomes of the sanctity of international agreements and covenants?

Pellely Indicted by Grand Jury; Charged With Fraud in Business

Fourteen Page Indictment Names Two of His Aides

ASHKEVILLE, N. C., May 23.—William Dudley Pellely, chief of the Silver Shirts, national anti-Semitic organization, and two of his aides, were indicted by the Buncombe County Grand Jury today on charges of fraudulent stock sales. The two aides are Robert C. Summerville and Don D. Kellogg. The men are named on sixteen counts and the bill of indictment is fourteen pages long. Receivership proceedings against Pellely's outfit, the Galand Press, Inc., publishers of *Life* magazine, the Silver Shirts' weekly organ, began April 15 when Pellely and his two aides were ordered to appear before the Buncombe County Superior Court within ten days. At that time W. Bowen Henderson, Asheville accountant, was appointed temporary receiver for the press. Summerville admitted to investigators that the company

45 Jews Hurt In Clash With Tel Aviv Police

Three Seriously Wounded Following Protest; General Strike Casts Seven-Hour Pall on Holy Land

TEL AVIV, May 23.—Forty-five Jews were wounded here, three of them seriously, in the course of a two-hour clash between a mixed crowd and police detachments. Barricades were set up in the streets and the enraged demonstrators fought a blood-battle with the police.

After the crowd left a cinema house in which a protest had been held, they formed a demonstration. The marchers encountered police lines on Bialik street. A merciless attack by the police infuriated the marchers, who replied with a volley of stones. Twenty-five Laborites and ten Revisionists are among the injured. The others were onlookers.

Chimney Swastika Scares Observer

Hospital Building Design Misleads Passerby on 68th Street

An eagle-eyed observer who happened to be strolling along East Sixty-eighth street yesterday afternoon gazed skyward and to his horror and consternation noticed what he believed to be the Hitler swastika freshly painted on the chimney of the New York Hospital.

Running to a phone booth he managed to grasp the news over the wire to the press. A sleuth was assigned to the scene of the alleged outrage.

After some skillful inquiries a reporter learned that the swastika was not a recent painting, or the result of some Nazi vandal's suppressed art desires coming to the fore. Rather, he discovered that the emblem was a design built into the chimney when the New York Hospital was erected.

Colledge Robert, of Boston, Mass., the architect who drew the plans for this building some four or five years ago, adopted this design. It has no architectural significance as a chimney marker.

'Terrorist' Trial Awaits Murder Hearing Finish

Documents Prosecution Needs in Use at Arlosoroff Case

JERUSALEM, May 23.—The trial of the Zionist Revisionists accused of membership in the Brith Habryonim cannot take place until the trial of the Revisionists accused of murdering Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff is ended, government officials declared today, pointing out that many of the documents essential to the prosecution are being used in the Arlosoroff case.

Aba Achmimer, who was acquitted of complicity in the murder of Dr. Arlosoroff, was re-arrested by the police and charged with having been the leader of the Brith Habryonim.

Achmimer immediately began a hunger strike because the police refused to free him on bail. After four days of fasting Achmimer ended his hunger strike, stating he did this out of deference to Rabbi A. E. HaCohen Kook, Chief Rabbi of Palestine, who urged him to break his fast since the Jewish religion forbade suicide and Achmimer was said to be in bad health.

Ivy Lee Denies Nazi Sympathies; Report in Press Is Discredited

Responding to "rumors" widely featured in the Yiddish press yesterday, the offices of Ivy Lee Sr., one of the foremost publicity men of the country, yesterday told the Jewish Daily Bulletin that the concern had nothing whatever to do with Nazi propaganda or the activities of Nazis in this country.

According to the reports which appeared in the foreign language press, Ivy Lee had been brought before the Congressional Committee to Investigate Nazi Propaganda, and subsequently he had written his resignation from the League of Friends of New Germany under pressure from Rockefeller interests, which he represents as public relations counsel at a salary of \$50,000 yearly. Nazi Meetings Are Banned In Irvington

Blow to Hitlerites Seen in Decree by Safety Director

IRVINGTON, N. J., May 23.—As an aftermath of the riot yesterday between Nazi and anti-Nazi sympathizers, Director of Public Safety Edward Baileine today announced the banning of all Nazi or anti-Nazi meetings in this town.

This is a blow to the Nazi cells in Irvington, which has been a hotbed of Nazi activity.

JERUSALEM, May 23.—High Commissioner Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchop, who is due to retire this summer, may remain in office for another two-year term, Palestine papers reported today. The High Commissioner will make his decision during his forthcoming visit to London, newspapers stated.

'Born a Rabbi,' H. P. Mendes Marks 60th Birthday in Pulpit

Not one lifetime but nearly two are encompassed in the sixty years that separate the initial Shabbath sermon of a twenty-two-year-old rabbi in a small Manchester, England, congregation in 1872. Recognition yesterday tendered Dr. Henry Pereira Mendes by the New York Board of Jewish Ministers on the anniversary of the celebration of his sixty years in the ministry.

The rabbi emeritus of the Portuguese Synagogue, Shearith Israel, was the guest of his fellows of the rabbinate in the vestry rooms of Shearith Israel. He was the cynosure of all eyes and the subject of all laudatory addresses delivered at the meeting.

Among those who spoke were Rabbi David de Sola Pol, Rabbi Mendes' successor at Shearith Israel, Dr. Bernard Drachman of D'Ichon Ephraim Synagogue; Rabbi Max Hirsch, rabbi of the Board of Jewish Ministers, who presided, and Dr. Mendes himself. Dr. Mendes, who consecrated himself to the rabbinate on the night of his bar mitzvah, comes of a long line of rabbis. His father, Abraham Pereira Mendes, was minister of the Sephardic congregation of Shearith Israel in England, when his third child, Henry, was born. He had previously been Chazan in Sephardic communities in Jamaica, British West Indies, and later became layman and preacher in the ancient Sephardic community of London. Years later in 1882 after his son had taken the leadership of the congregation of the ancient Jesuath Israel Synagogue in Newport, R. I., he came to this country as minister of that synagogue, oldest American congregation.

Dr. Mendes' maternal grandfather, David Aaron de Sola, was the cantor preacher of the Spanish Portuguese Synagogue of London, the first Sephardic prayer book and the author of many volumes in English. An uncle, Abraham de Sola, professor at McGill University, was minister of the Sephardic community in Montreal while another uncle, Samuel de Sola, became Chazan of the Spanish and Portuguese Synagogue in London.

His father, as a matter of fact the long and distinguished line of de Sola rabbis, scholars, physicians, martyrs and statesmen carries Dr. Mendes directly to the sixteenth century. His mother's mother, Rica Melodia, was daughter of Raphael Melodia, the chief rabbi of the Sephardic of England, and sister of David Melodia, chief rabbi in succession to his father. For thirteen generations, Melodias were chief rabbis in Mantua, Florence, Padua, Ferrara, Rome, Venice, Prague, and London.

Thus Dr. Mendes was, in the manner of speaking, born to the rabbinate. And now at the age of eighty-two he can look back at his long career with the fondness that

comes with the knowledge of a job well done, a heritage fulfilled. At the age of twenty-two the young rabbi became the first Chazan and minister of the newly organized Sephardic Synagogue in Manchester. Three years of service and an invitation came from America to accept the position of preacher at Shearith Israel, New York's oldest congregation—the only one in the metropolis that antedates the Revolutionary War. For forty-eight years, until 1923, Dr. Mendes ministered actively as Shearith Israel; since then he has been rabbi emeritus.

His Communal Work

Dr. Mendes' Jewish communal activities have been as wide as they have been varied. Locally he organized the Montefiore Hospital, the Crippled Children's East Side Free School and the Institution for the Improved Instruction of Deaf Mutes. A founder of the American Hebrew magazine he has long campaigned for laws protecting Sabbath day observers and against the introduction of sectarian exercises in public schools. As a member of the American Jewish Committee and the Alliance Israelite Universelle, he took part in the 1921 protest and secured the rights of Jews throughout the world.

One of the pioneer Zionists, Dr. Mendes took a leading part in the introduction of the movement to this country. In his memoirs he has written:

"Soon after Dr. Herzl began his great movement, Dr. Gaster, chief rabbi of the Spanish and Portuguese community of England, called upon me in London where I was visiting, saying that Dr. Herzl wished to meet me. They both had read the newspaper and Dr. Herzl asked me if I would undertake to introduce the Zionist movement in the United States. I readily and eagerly consented. On my return to America I became the first Zionist association, secretary, president and I served for one year on the Actions Committee. My interest in Zionism has never been diminished but I had to withdraw from active participation."

Mrs. Lederer Dies; Was German Exile

Emily Lederer, wife of the dean of the Graduate Faculty of the New School for Social Research, died unexpectedly in her sleep early Tuesday morning at her home, 3247 Johnson avenue, Spuyten Duyvis, N. Y., it was learned yesterday.

Mrs. Lederer, who came to this country in September as a German refugee, was an authority on the cultural arts of the Far East, and had collaborated with her husband on "Japan and Europe," published in Berlin three years ago.

Funerary services will be held this afternoon at the Walter B. Cooke Chapel, 1 West 190th street, by a ceremony at the Fernicite Crematorium in Westchester.

Jewish War Veterans Battle Communism

An immediate campaign against Communist activities in America will be waged by the Jewish War Veterans of the United States, according to an announcement yesterday from the group, following a meeting of the national executive committee at the Hotel New Yorker.

An immediate committee to combat the movement has already been appointed, the announcement stated. This committee will seek aid of other Jewish organizations and will map out a plan of procedure.

Slaughterers' Head Quits on Eve of Hearing

Reply to Charges of Corruption, Racketeering Not Made by Union

Dr. Jacob Blum, president of poultry slaughterers' Union Local 440, resigned on the eve of the hearings at which his union was to make answer to the charges of coercion, intimidation and racketeering filed by the Vand Schoelkin Office, a rival union, with Arthur Simon, it was revealed at the hearing yesterday.

The scheduled answer was not made at the hearing yesterday. The reason, it was explained, was that Nathan L. Perlman, counsel to Local 440, had not had time. Asked, however, whether the Local wished another hearing, Metzler said, "As far as we are concerned, this is final."

Fist Fight Breaks Out

A fist fight almost broke out in the trial room of the Health Department, 139 Centre street, where the hearing was held. When, at the close, one of the poultry slaughterers insulted another. An altercation was prevented by the intervention of a policeman. A heated argument continued on the street for some time after the policeman had evicted the slaughterers from the room.

Keltzer was called to the stand first, and said that he had received a sealed resignation from Blum. He could not open it, he said, because of the union by-laws. Abraham Heller, executive of the Local, volunteered the information that Blum resigned "because he felt like it."

Asked by Mr. Simon as to charges that members of the union used a speed system of slaughtering poultry which was not in accordance with the kosher laws, Metzler asserted that the union members used a system known as "trappel schicht" which, while it expedites the slaughtering, is perfectly lawful, he said.

They Don't Know

Repeating Melton Heller answered "I don't know" to questions concerning the union fired at them by Jacques Buitenkant, counsel to the Vaad Schoelchin Office. Buitenkant declared that the charges of racketeering and coercion are still unanswered, and asserted that Local 440 "is controlled by racketeers."

Damaging accusations had been presented by Simon to the union executives in a conference last week. None of these were touched upon by Local 440 executives in the hearing yesterday.

Tribute Is Paid Memory of Late Meyer London

Rand School Library Is Dedicated to First Socialist Congressman

The memory of Meyer London, first Socialist Congressman in the United States and defender of the unemployed, will be perpetuated in the Meyer London Memorial Library of the Rand School of Social Science, which was dedicated last night at an open air meeting in East Fifteenth street, opposite the Rand School, where the library will be permanently housed.

The library is based on the Rand School collection, which was started about ten years ago with funds provided by the Meyer London Memorial Foundation. Interest from the fund will now be used to augment the library and to meet its most important collection on the social sciences anywhere in New York. The Forward Association, Workmen's Circle and various labor organizations contributed generously to the fund when it was begun after Meyer London's tragic death in an East Side automobile accident. The volumes will be housed on the floor of the Rand School, which occupies the old People's House.

Among Jewish Socialists Meyer London was for a number of years an outstanding figure. He was born in Swalvia, Poland, in 1871 and studied at the gymnasium in Pottawa. Later he came to the United States, where his father had for several years been a Hebrew teacher.

In this country Meyer London studied and practiced law. At the same time, as one who in his early youth had become a member of the Social Democratic Party in Russia, he threw himself into the Socialist cause here with such energy that many consider him one of the most important figures in the development of the movement.

National Secretary Lauds Richmond Hill Zionist Unit

Morris Margulies, secretary of the Zionist Organization of America, described the Richmond Hill Zionist District as "an important link in the national unit, in a speech before members of the group at the Richmond Hill Jewish Community Center. He praised Jonathan Schneider, president, for his activity in its behalf.

American Maccabi Group Meets Tonight

A rally and meeting of the United States Maccabi Association will be held tonight at the East Midwood Jewish Center, Ocean Avenue, Brooklyn.

Motion pictures of the first Maccabiah (Jewish athletic games in Palestine held in 1929) will be shown. Morris Weiner, sports editor of The Jewish Daily Bulletin, will speak on the "Jewish Athlete Situation." Mr. Eluestons will deliver an address on the Maccabiah movement and its significance to American-Jewish youth.

Mann to Arrive Here; Book Will Be Issued

Thomas Mann, Nobel Prize winner who is now a refugee from Hitlerite Germany, will visit this country at the end of the month. A parade, synagogues services and speeches will mark the thirtieth anniversary of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States Sunday.

The speakers' list at the service, which will be held at the Park Avenue Synagogue, 50 East Eighty-seventh street, includes Governor Herbert H. Lehman, Mayor Fiorello H. LaGuardia, Attorney General John J. Bennett, Major General Dennis E. Nolan, Senator Royal S. Copeland, former Congressman W. W. Cohen, James W. Gerard, Herman Bernstein and Alderman President Bernard M. Deutch. Samuel Uternwyer will also speak. His address will be broadcast over Station WJMC.

After the services the group will mass outside the temple and march to the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, 110th street and Amsterdam avenue, to attend services sponsored by the United Spanish War Veterans.

The parade preceding the service will start from Temple Emanu-El, Fifth avenue and Sixty-fifth street, with the veterans marching in full uniform. William Bernan, commander-in-chief of the organization, together with his staff and guests, will review the marchers.

Defying the tradition which calls for complimentary tickets to public officials, Brooklyn's Borough President, Raymond W. Ingersoll, yesterday purchased a ticket to the annual marine-sport dance to be given by the Junior Federation of the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities at the Half Moon Hotel, Coney Island, on the night of June 16.

Nazis Pay for Ballyhoo at \$1 A 'Heil,' Queens Teutons Opine

While the Deutsche Zeitung and other Nazi publicity mediums report that the residents of the German-American communities in the Borough of Queens are "waming with the zeal and the crusading spirit of Nazism," the residents themselves brand the statement as a lie.

The purported enthusiasm with which recent Nazi demonstrations have been received, they assert, has been purchased at a dollar a head.

They cite as an example a "monster Nazi Mass meeting" held in a College Point hall on the Queens North Shore a few days ago under the auspices of an organization known as the First Sport Club, a group of young Germans none of whom, it is said, has been in the United States for more than five years.

Bona-Fide Residents Absent Three life-long College Point residents stood near the line of march and watched the parade of between 200 and 250 persons which preceded the meeting. Not more than three bona-fide local residents were among the assemblage, they reported, and these were members of the so-called "sport club."

The procession wound up at the hall, where three large buses un-

loaded a ready-made audience, whose faces bore an uncanny resemblance to those which face Nazi fire-eaters nightly in Yorkville, in Newark, in Ridgewood and in Mass-peth.

With stern visaged, uniformed Nazis in attendance, the meeting proceeded with addresses—not by the leading German-American citizens of College Point or of Queens, but by Weiner Brink of Manhattan, William Meyer of Union City, N. J., and George Haselhorst of Detroit.

Queens Is Suspicious The real residents of Queens are suspicious of all this racket. They do not suspect their Jewish neighbors and fellow business men of anything sinister, and they seek and appreciate their trade. They remain unimpressed by the clamor raised by the Spankoebels and Weiner Brinks who have come among them and they are even slightly amused at the swashbuckling "swastickling" of these brass newcomers.

Socialist Rally in B'klyn To Strike at Nazis

German Socialist organizations of Greater New York and Queens county sections of the Socialist

party will hold a mass protest meeting against "Nazi propaganda and intrigues that are poisoning the hearts and minds of the Germans in the United States," at Myrtle and Onderdonk avenues, in Ridgewood, tomorrow evening.

Organizers of the meeting characterized the section where it is to be held as the center of Nazi activities in the East, and indicated that similar demonstrations will be staged all over the country as a clear warning to "all professional meddlers and paid propagandists."

Speakers at the Friday meeting will include Elliott White, writer; James Oneal, editor of the New Leader; Samuel A. de Witt; Siegfried Lipschitz, director of the Trans-Atlantic Information Service, and Siegfried Junglicht, managing editor of the Neue Volkszeitung.

Scientist Explodes Nazi Myth Of 'Aryanism,' Derides Claims

Germans Spring From Many Racial Strains, Says Prof. Boas

Writing on "Aryans and Non-Aryans," Professor Franz Boas, pioneer in the field of anthropology, sets forth, in the current issue of *The American Mercury*, the reasons why there is no "Aryan race," and, indeed, any pure race that has not adopted many of its racial characteristics from geographical environment. Following is an extract from the *Mercury* article:

By FRANZ BOAS
The present policies of the German government are based on the assumption that an "Aryan" has certain biologically determined qualities which are entirely foreign to every "non-Aryan."

There are said to be 6,000,000 non-Aryans in Germany, but since according to the prescribed definition a fourth part of non-Aryan blood is enough to stamp the individual as non-Aryan, the actual number may well be close to 1,000,000 or even more. According to the present policy, many these are practically excluded from all participation in German economic, social, and intellectual life.

What is an Aryan? Aryan is a linguistic term and nothing else. It means that there was once one language, nowadays called the Aryan language, which gradually spread over a large part of Europe and Asia, and developed into all the different "Aryan" languages spoken today. In this sense an Aryan is anyone who speaks an Aryan language, such as English, American Negro or Hindu.

A judgment of the German policy requires the answer to two questions: Is the Aryan really the so-called "Aryans" and "non-Aryans"; the other, to what extent does the behavior of a single human being and of a people depend upon hereditary traits?

Roughly speaking, we may divide the population of Europe into three groups, which are situated in strata extending from west to east: in the north the tall blond blue-eyed Northwest Europeans; in the middle, in the region of the Alps and east and west of them, the darker Alpine types; in the south the very dark Mediterranean type of Spain, Italy and Southern France. Of course, there are other local types which do not conform well with such a hard and fast classification. . . .

It is a fiction to speak of a German race. We should rather ask where the bulk of physical build are represented among the Germans. Here we encounter a complete lack of unity. Blonds with long heads in the North, darker people with shorter heads in the Rhineland provinces there, narrow noses there; noses turned up and aquiline, the general build tall and short, broad and slight. There is no "German race" there are only local types which are very different one from another, each of which comprises individuals of different characteristics. . . .

Since the Jews are considered as a thoroughly different element, we must define their racial position. There is no more a Semite than there is an Aryan race, since both terms define linguistic groups, not human beings. We can only speak of Near Eastern types. There are

ion outside Germany and also disgusted the decent Germans, according to reports in the London and other foreign newspapers. It is believed that after the sharp criticism in the foreign press, sale of this particular issue of *Der Sturmer* was prohibited in Berlin, where it might fall into hands of foreigners.

The Manchester Guardian wrote: "It is inconceivable that the new Germany as a whole thinks and feels like Streicher. How long, then, will she allow him to continue?"

The Referee said: "Streicher knows quite well that every account which he published was a criminal lie. He knew quite well that Jews are not and never have been guilty of ritual murders. He knows, further, that this foul libel on a whole race has in other countries, notably Tsarist Russia, inspired pogroms in which thousands of innocent men, women and children have been massacred. That is the reason, we suspect, why he published his lies; he wants to foment pogroms. Unfortunately, he is the worst man in Europe. But Hitler recently promoted him representative of the Munich government in Bavarian Franconia."

The Frankfurter Zeitung displayed extraordinary courage in telling the truth in Germany about the effect of the Streicher incitement to pogroms. The Frankfurter Zeitung said: "The ritual murder number of Der Sturmer has created in and

outside Germany the stir that was to be expected from its aim and contents; a stir and anger naturally not confined to Jewish circles. It exceeds in its text and pictures anything we have hitherto seen in this way."

The Ruskoye Znamya, the organ of the Black Hundred pogromists under the Tsar, never stooped to such depths in agitation against the Jews as *Der Sturmer* does now under the Hitler regime. The Nazis stop the sale of this issue of *Der Sturmer* in Berlin and at the same time promote the publisher to a high and responsible post. The Nazis understand the meaning of such promotion, discounting any explanations that may be made by the Hitler government for foreign consumption.

The London Times writes that "almost every issue of *Der Sturmer's* journal *Der Sturmer* contains at least one personal attack on a named Jew, which no impartial reader could construe as anything but an incitement to violence."

In addition to the ritual murder myths, *Der Sturmer* is devoting its pages to reproducing extracts from a new version of the "Protocols of the Wise Men of Zion," called "Life and Activities of the Jewish Kabbal," just published by the Deutsche Kulturwart Verlag of Berlin. These are blossoms of the new Kultur in Naziland.

Town Calls Holiday in Honor Of Ben Bear's 80th Birthday

Decorate Scandinavians Pay Tribute to Jewish Pioneer

(J.D.B. Special Correspondence)

DECORAH, Iowa, May 21.—The little town, peopled mainly by the sons and daughters of Scandinavian pioneers, turned out en masse to make a public holiday of the eightieth birthday of Ben Bear, "the Bear" of Decora, a German Jewish immigrant who came to this place in 1876 when it was hardly more than a name on a map, made it his home, reared his children in it and built up a clothing business which has kept pace with the development of the town and the surrounding community.

Everyone Attends

To this celebration came not only the members of the family but every neighbor—friend the Big Bear has made in Decora, from the butcher and the baker to the banker, the doctor, the lawyer and the college president—for Decora is the site of Luther College, founded many years ago for the sons and grandsons of the pioneers from Sweden and Norway.

Ben Bear was born in a village in the province of Wuerttemberg, Germany, and at the age of thirteen came to America to make his fortune. In those days, according to Mr. Bear's recollection, it took a man a week to cross the Atlantic. The Monday after his landing he was at work in the butcher shop, and by the end of the week he had saved enough to go to the city of St. Louis. He worked for this firm for about ten years and then left for the West to strike out on his own.

When he reached Chicago he asked the ticket agent to pick him a town a town further west. The ticket agent selected Cedar Rapids, Iowa, but fearing that it was a town unequal to opening a store in so "populous" a town, the young Bear went further, wandering in and out of the small communities of northern Iowa and southern Minnesota, until he struck a place fifty miles west of the Mississippi River, a town called Decora, in Wisconsin. There, in the Scandinavian settlement of Decora, he drove his stakes.

Thoses Site for Store

Early in the morning after his arrival he rented a vacant store, on the very spot where now stands the sixty-foot triple-front two-story brick-restaurant, clothing and shoe store, over which you may now read this legend: "Ben Bear—Fifty-eight Years Your Cedar Rapids Store."

Ben Bear has won the affections and esteem of his townsmen not alone by being an honest and fair-dealer, but also by his interest in taking an active part in many community endeavors. He was the first president of the electric plant; was an active worker in the little Cedar Grove school; was the owner of the opera house and its metropolitan hotel; and he was chairman of the county Red Cross committee. He came to Decora in 1854 to Miss Antonia Hamburger of New York and in their home in Decora were born their three children, Mrs. D. C. Gieseler, of Springfield, Ill.; Mrs. A. C. Heller, of Grand Island, Neb.; and Alexander Bear of Grand Forks, N. D., the "three Bears" who have made it the toast to its only Jewish pioneer.

Offer Evidence Students Were Propagandized

Jewish Leaders Find Proof 'Silver Ranger' Distributed at College

MODESTO, Calif., May 23.—Jewish leaders here have turned over to authorities information which they say proves previously received reports that copies of "The Silver Ranger," Nazi publication, have been distributed among the students of Modesto Junior College, which is maintained as a step between high school and the university.

First reports several weeks ago were that the distribution of the publication was being made by a son of the Silver Shirt leader in this vicinity. It was stated that he was passing the papers about indiscriminately among the college students.

Jewish leaders, in presenting their facts to authorities for action, now claim to have verified these reports.

Cahan Quits Faculty At Syracuse to Write Full Time to Writing

SYRACUSE, May 23.—Professor Samuel Cahan, Jewish instructor at Syracuse University, has resigned, after fourteen years on the faculty of the School of Journalism, in order to give all his time to newspaper work and writing.

During the summer of 1927 he traveled in Russia as a special correspondent for the New York Herald-Tribune and last year he was a member of Governor Lehman's commission to investigate the costs of education.

California University Honors Its Benefactor

Rabbi Decries Great Britain's Policies in Zion

Ought to Revise Her Immigration Laws, Says Newman

BRIDGEPORT, Conn., May 23.—A plea for a more just Palestine immigration policy on the part of the British government was expressed today by Rabbi Louis I. Newman of Temple Rodef Shalom, New York City, speaking at the annual conference of the State Federation of Temple Sisterhoods at the Hotel Stratfield.

"Great Britain is making a grievous error in not cooperating with the Jewish people more actively in the upbuilding of the Jewish homeland in Palestine," Rabbi Newman declared.

"The action of the Syrian government in welcoming Jewish immigrants is a heinous example of the importance which far-sighted statesmen attach to the entrance of Jewish newcomers. It will be long before Transjordan opens up to the Jewish colonists and thereby takes its place among the progressive and forward-looking regions of the Mediterranean region.

Meat Dealer Asks \$50,000 In Koshur Suit

Butcher, Persecuted by Rabbis, Seeks Damages From Packer

(Special to the J.D.B.)

SYRACUSE, N. Y., May 23.—A law and order case which a Kashuth misdeedman opened here yesterday at the court house, when Isaac Berkman, butcher, asked \$50,000 damages from Wilcox & Company and Martin Grant, Syracuse manager for the corporation. The plaintiff charged that his business was ruined when the defendant sold him non-koshur meat, representing it to be kosher.

Last August the local rabbinical court prosecuted Berkman at a public trial and exposed him as selling non-koshur meat that was labeled kosher. As a result, Berkman claims, he was held up to shame and disgrace before his clients and the public and his business was ruined and he suffered humiliation and mental, physical and spiritual anguish. The trial, the first of its kind in this city, drew a capacity audience.

Milwaukee College Band Abandons Concert Plan Scheduled for Reich

MILWAUKEE, Wis., May 23.—The plan of the Milwaukee State Teachers College band to give concerts in Germany has been abandoned, it was announced here today.

The decision of the German consul not to allow admission charges for concerts is given as the official reason. The first of the kind, however, protests of local anti-Nazi organizations are believed to be the real cause for the change in plans.

Christian Race Prejudice Held Religious Treason by Pastor

(Special to the J.D.B.)

SEATTLE, Wash., May 23.—A declaration that Christians discriminating against Jews are traitors to their religion was made here by Dr. John B. Magee, pastor of the First Methodist Episcopal Church and president of the Seattle Council of Churches, speaking before 400 persons at Herzl synagogue.

"Any so-called Christians," declared Dr. Magee, "who discriminate against Jews or any other persons because of religion or race is not only un-Christian but anti-Christian—because Christianity, like its mother religion, Judaism, preaches the brotherhood of man."

"Anti-Semitism is anti-Christianity," he asserted.

Dr. Magee delivered the sixth in a series of seven lectures on "4,000 Years of Jewish Contributions to Civilization." Discussing the present regime in Germany, the clergyman said:

"All true Christians thoroughly disapprove and denounce in stronger language the tyranny of the Hitler regime in Germany. Hitlerism can not last. Persecution and discrimination must always fail in the end."

"Christians sometimes forget

the great contributions of Judaism to Christianity. Christ was a Jew and all his apostles were Jews. The Old Testament and the writings of the rabbis form the basis of Christian teaching. From Judaism, Christians have taken their belief in the fatherhood of God, the idea of a Messiah and the hope of a better world."

Temple Model for Church

"The Christian church is modeled after the Jewish synagogue. Prayers and services used by the Jews are duplicated in the church. The religious school originated with the Jews, and altars, vestments and ordination of priests are a Jewish contribution to Christianity."

The series of lectures, directed by Rabbi Philip A. Lang of Herzl Synagogue, was sponsored by the State Supreme Court Justice Beals; Justice Charles E. Claypool; Worth McCure, Seattle superintendent of schools; and Richard G. Tyler of the University of Washington; Herman A. Horowitz, editor and publisher of the University of Wisconsin; Mrs. Tarica; Mrs. Thornton Goldsby; P. Allen Rickes; and Mrs. Harry Cohen, president of the Herzl sisterhood.

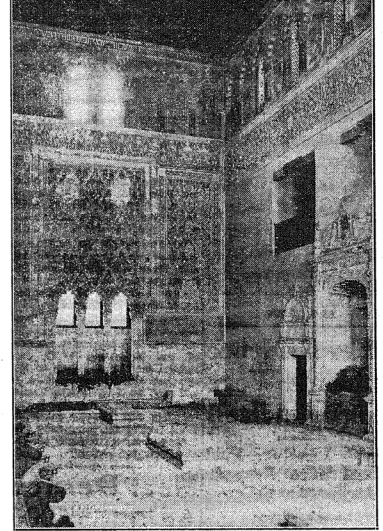

Vintage of 1914

Although no producer's name appeared on the program, the Victor Herbert revival of "The Only Girl" which started a limited run at the Forty-fourth Street Theatre last night, is evidently the work of J. Magnes Rallies Philadelphians Behind United Appeal Banner

Over \$60,000 Raised at Banquet Starting Local Drive

(Special to the J.D.B.) PHILADELPHIA, May 23.—The local campaign of the United Jewish Appeal was launched here last night by Dr. Judah L. Magnes, broadcaster and Jewish Community in Jerusalem. Dr. Magnes was the principal speaker at a dinner at the Hotel Benjamin Franklin.

Dr. Magnes called upon Jews to give because "it is money that you and I are giving as a ransom. We are not yet captives. We are buying our own freedom for this money. For how long? No one knows. This 'kesef kiporim' is described in the Torah as money that is being used for sacred walls—*for the sanctuary, for refuge—* in order that men may take hold of the horns of the altar and feel themselves safe.

"Kesef kiporim" is used to atone for your own souls," Dr. Magnes clarified, "it is not money for charity. Do not give it if you think it is used upon Jews to flesh to flesh, from blood to blood, from generation to generation. It is this red line of our tradition which we wish to spin, spinning out into eternity."

Judge William M. Lewis, who preceded Dr. Magnes, explained that "we are called upon to fight back a catastrophic hurricane whose terrifying clouds have burst over Germany and threatened to engulf our people everywhere. We must approach this United Jewish Appeal in terms of personal relationship to the threat of Nazism. If we fall in Leet talk we have lost our own lives and strength to the forces whose goal is the extermination of Jews not alone in Germany but in every land where Jews are slain."

Though no definite quota was set, the local committee expects to raise approximately \$200,000. Towards this sum, upwards of \$60,000 was raised at the banquet which was attended by 1,000 representative members of the Jewish community.

Simon L. Adler Dies Suddenly Of Heart Attack

Was U. S. Court Judge in Western New York; Appointed in 1927

(Special to the J.D.B.) ROCHESTER, N. Y., May 23.—Simon L. Adler, judge of the United States court for the western district of New York, died of a heart attack here today. He was sixty-six years old and unmarried.

Judge Adler was appointed to the bench in 1927 after serving for fifteen years in the State Assembly, where he had been Republican majority leader for many years. He was born in Seneca Falls, N. Y., on August 31, 1867, the son of Lewis and Anne Adler. He studied at the Rochester Free Academy and Cornell University, and received his law degree at Harvard in 1892.

Since that time he has been practicing law here. For seven years he practiced in New York City. While in that city, Judge Adler began to take interest in politics, and in 1910 he was elected to the Assembly. Six years later he was chosen majority leader of the Assembly.

He has written a number of books on government and historical subjects.

The racial theory of Aryan purity is, of course, all important, but . . . there is no rule without an exception, and if a Jew proves useful to the Hitlerite movement, his "non-Aryanness" may be overlooked.

For Instance—No less a star in the Nazi galaxy than Herr Goebbels has his own private "home Jew"—one Jacob Trachtenberg, a Russian emigrant naturalized in Germany.

Last year Goebbels' ministry financed Trachtenberg's book directed against "the tales of horror." And now in the list of recommended (or is it required?) reading, just issued by the Reich Ministry of the New Germany, among such immortal men of letters as Hitler, Goering, von Papen and other major and minor gods of the Reich, there is listed that distinguished author, Jacob Trachtenberg, with his latest opus, entitled "Against the Brown Book."

"In Trachtenberg's volume," according to the April issue of the official organ of the Stuttgart German Institute for Foreign Affairs, "are depicted the international aspirations of the Communist International, spreading in all countries, to provoke disorders."

(Special to the J.D.B.) ATHENS, Ga., May 23.—The faculty of the University of Georgia has awarded the Eta Sigma Pi scholarship key to Nathan Wolfe of Atlanta, senior in the School of Commerce, according to an announcement.

7 Witnesses On Stand Verify Stovsky Alibi

Uphold Claim He Wasn't in Jerusalem on Night of Murder

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JERUSALEM, May 23.—Seven witnesses were placed on the stand today to verify Abraham Stovsky's alibi that he was in the Jerusalem restaurant on the night of the assassination of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, for whose murder Stovsky and Zvi Rosenblatt are now on trial. Abi Achmeier, a third defendant, was freed when the court held the evidence against him insufficient.

Sarah Recheinin, a waitress in the Hasharon restaurant, testified that Stovsky was in the Jerusalem restaurant on the evening of June 18, 1933, between eight and nine o'clock.

Rosa and Chaim Borevohoff, aged twelve and sixteen respectively, whose mother is a cook at the restaurant, also testified to seeing Stovsky there at the time mentioned by Miss Recheinin.

Moishe Wrubel, who dined in the restaurant at the same time as Stovsky did, also saw him there between eight and nine o'clock.

Moishe Mandelbaum and Jacob Friedman, who stayed at the Turgemann Hotel, testified that on the evening in question they saw some one called Stovsky in the hotel. Mandelbaum, however, stated that early Saturday morning Stovsky asked him for the identification parade staged by the police.

At Smith Sounds Plea for Relief Contributions to Refugee Fund

Letter to Warburg Says All Creeds Should Do Their Part

Every American, "no matter what his religion," is urged to contribute to the United Jewish Appeal to aid "Jewish victims of persecution and intolerance" from former Governor Alfred E. Smith to Felix M. Warburg, national chairman of the drive to raise contributions for the relief and rehabilitation of Jews in Germany and for the settlement of refugees in Palestine.

"The whole world must feel a responsibility for the human beings who, deprived of their livelihood and even their homes in Germany, must find a new place and a new way of life to sustain life," Governor Smith said.

His letter to Mr. Warburg reads as follows:

"No one, no matter what his religion, can afford to ignore the appeal you are now making on behalf of the Joint Distribution Committee and the American Palestine Campaign for a fund which will permit us to make a contribution toward the rehabilitation of the Jewish victims of German intolerance."

"I am especially gratified to see that the Palestine and Joint Distribution campaigns have been brought together this year for a united effort which should make you more successful."

Others who will participate in the program will be Dr. Samuel H. Hays, chairman of Temple Emanu-El, who will deliver the "baccalaureate sermon," and Louis Lipsky, co-chairman of the United Jewish Appeal; Dr. Henry Goldkowitz and Rabbi Ralph A. Habs.

Ivy Lee Denies Nazi Sympathies

fair, was mentioned as one of the Nazis who took part in the alleged executive session of the League of Friends of New Germany at the "Carn Hall" from morning until midnight, which assembly was called for the purpose of discussing Lee's rumored withdrawal.

Lee, who has been falling far behind in his work since yesterday, it was said that he has been out of town recently.

Burnham Carter, a partner of Lee and spokesman for Lee, denied that the concern had anything to do with Nazi propaganda or activities either here or in Germany. He stated that the concern's sole German account consists of publicity work for the large Industrial Gesellschaft, the German day care center, which he said Lee had absolutely no connection with the Friends of New Germany or any of its leaders, that he had not been connected with the withdrawal of the stockholders from the event that he "continued handling Nazi propaganda," and that no word, written or oral had been passed between Lee and Carter.

Dr. I. T. Griebel, prominently mentioned as having taken part in the alleged executive session of the Turn Hall, states that he has no knowledge of such a session, and that he did not meet with the Friends of New Germany on Tuesday, as claimed. He said that, to his knowledge, the only meeting held was the regular weekly meeting of the League of Friends of New Germany which took place at the Turn Halls on Tuesday night, but this, he asserts, he did not attend.

Observers at the Congressional Committee secret hearings held here last week report that Ivy Lee's name did not appear before the committee. It was said, however, that Lee's accounts had been brought before the committee, apparently to learn whether or not his conduct had transferred the Friends of New Germany to Nazis in this country. Account books brought before the committee, it was said, constituted the only connection between Lee and the Nazis.

Carter, Lee's partner, would not discuss the matter. He was refused to state whether or not Lee had appeared before that body, and he expressed the opinion that the committee would not give the information furnished as the hearings were private.

Judge Postpones Anti-Nazi Trials

Defendants, Arrested After Brawls, Express Disappointment

The six anti-Nazis who were arrested in the rioting following the Madison Square Garden DAWA meeting last Thursday were disappointed yesterday when Magistrate George Van Antwerp, United State Court postponed the case to June 2.

Joseph Tauber of the International Labor Defense, who, with Louis Finkelstein, L. L. D., and Irwin Nussbaum of the Socialist Lawyers' Association, is defending five of the defendants, protested.

The five, who are charged with disorderly conduct, are: George Mehlberg, 2176 Amsterdam avenue; Robert Peter, 2176 Fourth-third street, Astoria; Phil Papo, 621 West 130th street; Bernard Nagel, 1916 East Seventy-first street, Brooklyn, and Sam Levit, 35 East Nineteenth street.

lowed an evasive speech delivered before the Nars by the Polish priest Zaleski, whose address contained and inciting anti-Jewish prophecies.

Nara tactics have exasperated police officials charged with keeping order and has led to the arrest of many of the hoodlums. Nars have now adopted a system of secret meetings in woods on the edges of large cities.

A meeting of this sort near hundreds of Nars was raided by police, who arrested a large number, removing them to jail in Warsaw.

Another group of Nars were escaping hid in the woods and later carried out a mass attack against Jewish residents of near-by summer resorts. The houses and Nars were severely beaten by them.

Only when they attacked a group of Jewish workers were they beaten off.

reopened and normal life began again.

The strike was peaceful except for two isolated incidents. Reich Suicide Seen in Stand Against Jews

Professor Smith Lauds Part Played by Jews in Civilization

LONDON, May 23.—Continued persecution of the German Jews will lead to national suicide, for Germany, Professor Elliot Smith, noted anthropologist, declared today in an article in the London News Chronicle.

Professor Smith, who is chairman of a scientific committee appointed by the Royal Anthropological Institute to determine the contribution of the various races to the upbuilding of civilization, stated that "although I usually object to becoming involved in political controversies; in this case it is our duty to protest the Nazis claim against the Jews."

"Actually the Jews played a pre-eminent part in introducing civilization to barbarian Europe, while Nordic played no part in the process and civilization was far advanced."

At the same time, it was revealed that more than 200 persons in all sections of the country have stock in the paper, many of them prominent socialites.

On April 23, an order signed by Judge Yates Webb directed United States Marshal Charles Price to take possession of all property of the press, pending action of the company that the company reports, the Boston and New York.

Judge Webb declared the Galahad Press bankrupt on May 2, and George Craig was named referee to hear claims of the creditors.
