## A Tower of Strength for Democracy and Peace

Eduard Benes, the Czechoslovak Minister of Foreign Affairs, is celebrating the fiftieth anniversary of his birthday today. He will be honored on this occasion not only in Czechoslovakia but wherever his work for democracy and for peace is known and appreciated. He is one of the few constructive statesmen in Europe who is both a realist and an idealist. His influence on European affairs is far more felt than that of most representatives of the greater European powers because of his dynamic personality, his earnestness, his vision, his idealism, his knowledge and his courage. He is a disciple of President Masaryk, one of the few truly great statesmen in the world today.

Dr. Benes plays a conspicuous role in the League of Nations, and even his enemies admit Czechoslovakia is his genius. He is the father of the Little Entente, which has been gaining considerable strength in chaotic Europe. Benes, like Masaryk, realized long ago that the salvation of Czechoslovakia lay first in work and then in the good will and friendship of its neighbors. Czechoslovakia was surrounded by enemy states that had suffered economically and territorially because of the creation of this new state. It was surrounded by peoples that hated and envied the new state which worked so industriously and which has made better progress than any of the new states and many of the older states in Europe.

Benes is opposed to the idea of the restoration of the Hapsburg dynasty, and the spread of Islam beyond the borders of Germany. These would constitute the gravest menaces to Czechoslovakia.

The Czechoslovakia of Masaryk and Benes is a tower of democratic strength in dictator-ship-ridden Europe.

President Masaryk in Washington and Eduard Benes in Paris really created the new state of Czechoslovakia during the World War and at the peace conference. Their eloquent pleas and forceful arguments won the Allied statesmen to their cause and particularly the deep sympathies of President Wilson and Colonel Edward M. House.

It is therefore no wonder that Czechoslovakia has suffered less than other European states from the internal friction and the minorities constituting the population. These minorities have been dealt with intelligently and justly. Every attempt to transplant Nazi anti-Semitism in that country has been checked promptly and effectively.

## Trade Fair to Indicate Markets For Products Not German-Made

An International Trade Fair, which will offer a guide to the products of American industry and other nations, except that of Germany, designed chiefly for those refusing to deal in Nazi-made merchandise, will be held at the Grand Central Palace during the week of October 22 to 27, the American Jewish Congress, which initiated the project, announced yesterday. The fair has the support of organized labor and of prominent non-Jewish Americans and various national organizations. Rabbi Stephen S. Wise heads the committee of sponsors which has

already received the endorsement of Colonel Theodore Roosevelt, Governor Wilbur L. Cross of Connecticut, Governor Clyde Herring of Iowa, Governor Hill McKeister of Tennessee and Governor Gifford Pinchot of Pennsylvania. The American Federation of Labor, through its president, William Green, has signified its willingness to join the sponsors who include Dr. Alvin Johnson, director of the New School for Social Research; Roger Baldwin, director of the American Civil Liberties Union; George Gordon Battle, communal

## He'll Pay Call On Cummings, Koelble Says

Wants Notables Indicted in Boycott; Dickstein Probe Continues

(Special to the J.D.B.) NEWARK, N. J., May 27.—On the heels of Samuel Dickstein's one-man investigation of Nazi activities here yesterday, Alphonse G. Koelble, assistant counsel for the Friends of the New Germany, told reporters he is planning a Washington trip tomorrow to ask Attorney General Homer Cummings to prosecute the parties promoting the boycott of German goods.

Koelble, whose law offices are at 269 Broadway, New York, said he would ask for the specific indictment of Samuel Untermeyer, president of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League; Mayor Fiorelli H. LaGuardia of New York; Theodore Roosevelt; James W. Gerard, former United States Ambassador to Germany, as well as the American Federation of Labor and the so-called boycott committee of the American Jewish Congress. The Nazi lawyer declared he would urge their prosecution on charges of violating the Sherman anti-trust laws.

**Parades His Titles**  
"I have been practicing law for two decades in New York," he said with a pompous flourish, and he has plenty of precedents in support of my request. They indicted Nazi leaders in the Federal Court of New York. I will ask that the Grand Jury prove itself impartial by probing the opposing faction. Koelble endeavored to impress the gentlemen of the press with his high-sounding titles of president of the America First League, the German-American Citizens League and the German Democrats of New York.

Meanwhile Representative Dickstein, vice chairman and lone attendant member of the Congressional Committee to Investigate Nazi Activities in the United States, yesterday held private hearings in the post office building here, to which storm troops and police taking part in the recent Irving trial were summoned.

## Czech Province Swept by Wave Of Race Hatred

Dr. Rozsypal Cautions Jews of Carpatho-Russia to Take Action

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) PRAGUE, May 27.—Race nationalism is growing in the Carpatho-Russian section of Czechoslovakia and energetic action must be taken immediately to stem the tide of anti-Jewish feeling, Dr. Rozsypal, president of the Carpatho-Russian section, declared at a special meeting of Jewish representatives at Uhohod, Czechoslovakia.

Dr. Rozsypal declared that he personally is no longer willing to take responsibility for the development of anti-Jewish feeling and advised representatives of his Jewish communities to combat anti-Semitism.

The Judische Stimme of Munkacs, commenting on Dr. Rozsypal's speech, objected to his declaration, pointing out that anti-Semitism was a matter for authorities to deal with. The paper pointed out that the group active in formation of committees are directly responsible for filling Czechoslovakian schools with Jewish children in a completely Russian district.

The chief reason for anti-Semitism in the section was blamed by the Stimme on advocates of Czechoslovak nationalism. The Jewish party should have remained completely neutral in the conflict between national groups, the paper insisted.

## Atlantic City Parley Hears Social Appeal

Ability Alone Should Be Criterion, Declares Philosopher-Critic

(Special to the J.D.B.)

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., May 27.—A demand for equal opportunity for Jews in the professions was uttered here today by Dr. Morris R. Cohen, professor of philosophy at the College of the City of New York, in an address before the joint convention of the National Conference of Jewish Social Service, National Association of Jewish Court Executives and National Council for Jewish Education at the Hotel St. Charles.

Outlining the position and the possibilities of the Jews in the professions Dr. Cohen said: "As Americans as well as Jews, we must not abandon the principle of the opening of opportunity to each individual according to his ability. The community as a whole is entitled to the best doctor, to the most capable lawyer and if the best—judged by any fair test—happens to be a Jew, the community as well as the individual suffers a loss if the latter is deprived of his opportunity to function according to the best of his ability."

**Welchs Practically**  
"I know that this position is often characterized as idealistic and not sufficiently practical. But if practicality consists in confining our ideas as to what is really worth while, the essence of wisdom still is as it always has been, to avoid narrow practicality."

Other speakers at the convention, which will be concluded Tuesday, included Professor Horace M. Kallen, Morris D. Waldman, Dr. Isadore Lubin, Dr. Selig Perlman, David J. Sapos, Fred E. and Bernard Cantor.

## Jew Named Soviet Envoy To Germany

Wide Interest Attends Appointment, Viewed as Diplomacy Test

MOSCOW, May 27.—Jacob Suritz, a Jew, has been named Soviet ambassador to Germany, it was officially announced yesterday.

Suritz has been serving as Soviet ambassador to Turkey for the past eleven years.

The announcement has aroused wide interest here, since his appointment is provoking general curiosity concerning the manner in which the Nazi government will maintain diplomatic courtesies and immunities when the diplomat changes to be a Jew.

There is as yet no indication here that Berlin has approved the appointment.

# Conventions Sifts Social Problems

## U. S. Jews Face Same Peril As Kin, Waldman Points Out

### 'Splendid Isolation' of America Has Disap- peared, He Says

The following is an extract from an address delivered by Morris D. Waldman, secretary of the American Jewish Committee, before the National Conference of Jewish Social Service workers, Mr. Waldman's subject was "Problems Facing the Jews throughout the World and their Implications for American Jewry."

"American Jewry has never been the victim of the illusion of 'splendid isolation.' Always, we have resented and responded whole-heartedly to the general and political problems of our brethren in other lands. As the largest and wealthiest single Jewish community in the world we have more than adequately played a leading role in all the great crises of modern times, from the support of Palestine development to the alleviation of the effects of famine and pogroms.

"But hitherto we have given and helped as a rich uncle to poor but distant nephews. Up until now, we have been philanthropists and we are older brothers united with our kin in a common fate and before a common danger.

#### World Problems Same

"Even a superficial inspection of the Jewish scene reveals that there are no longer distinct problems facing separate communities of Jews but that, by and large, the Jews of the world are facing the same social and economic problems. In Poland, for example, it has been estimated that 200,000 Jewish families are in need of relief, that unemployment among the Jewish proletariat is enormous; the destruction of the middle class continues, the opportunities in the professions and the civil services are increasingly restricted. What is true of Poland is equally true of Rumania, Austria, Hungary. In Germany the ruthless destruction of economic opportunities goes on. In Russia the Jew as merchant and small trader has been condemned to an economic death. In all these countries in short the prevailing economic structure of Jewish life is being persistently undermined.

"These conditions are common to anti-Jewish activity. Mainly they result from the harsh but immutable economic forces that in our times cut across national boundaries. Because these factors are international in scope their effect is to be seen also up in the American Jews as well as upon the Jews of Eastern and Central Europe.

#### Old Order Changed

"Since the war, particularly, the old economic order and social system have entered upon a new line of evolution which seems to presage more extensive changes yet to come. Certain tendencies appear to me to be inevitable, as they affect the economic life of the Jews of the world. First, there is the tendency toward state capitalism, or state regulation of economic enterprise. This takes various forms in many countries, of a nationalization of industries and the creation of state monopolies, of a closer regimentation of both capital and labor. Secondly, there is the growing trend toward concentration in industry, the trust or cartel movement, which has the effect of shutting out small industries and business. The chain-stores are also manifestations of this movement.

"These large producing and selling units are doing away with the small Jews who were, when salesman-

ship and personality played a decisive role in the economic order, valuable and necessary as instrumentalities in industry. Now mass-production and the new development in large-scale salesmanship tend to make the qualities of the Jew less essential.

#### Jews Hit Economically

"There is also the increased striving after national self-sufficiency as expressed in higher tariffs and quotas. The Jews have largely contributed to the development of such world commerce, and they are being seriously menaced by its startling decline—especially in England, Poland, and Eastern Europe.

"Likewise, the growth—especially in Eastern Europe—of co-operations which supersede the old village trade has hurt the economic present and future of many thousands of Jews.

"Finally, too, there have recently arisen movements pointing toward an aggravated anti-Semitism of consumers, and 'boycott the Jew' movements. There is also an anti-Jew sentiment in 'big business' whose interlocking directorates many times attempt to remove the competition of a Jewish fellow-manufacturer.

#### In Short, and Put in its baldest terms, we are witnessing today the suspension of the principle of free competition which until recently has been the mainstay of the capitalist system and under which principle the Jew gained his political emancipation and patterned his social life.

#### Agrees Already Felt

"These permanent world problems facing Jewry today will, and have already begun to, have their effect on Jewish life in America. Religious and cultural assimilation will tend to become of less an issue than it was heretofore, under emancipatory conditions. Palestine will become a more important issue as a partial territorial solution. Judaism may be divided by economic and political issues; or it may be convulsively shaken since, state and future are one, for all its members. These questions, perhaps, are imponderables, incapable of solution. Yet they must be faced, and their implications realized, by the Jews of America and the world at large.

"Added to the prevailing economic conditions is a new importance of anti-Semitism. Aich, whether officially sponsored or unofficially promoted, aggravated the economic position of the Jew and confronted him with the problems of civil and social as well as economic adjustment.

"A great danger of this latter-day anti-Semitism is its universal nature. It appeals to the universal passions of fear, ignorance, and hatred. And, to make it more threatening still, it appeals as a strategy or way out of the economic and psychological difficulties of our present day. This unique factor makes Nazi anti-Semitism something infinitely more formidable than any other form of anti-Jewish hostility we have hitherto been called upon to face. It is a phenomenon so world-wide in scope that so long as we are engaged in combatting it we have the feeling we are fighting for a whole ethnic, a civilization, a culture, against the forces of a universal reaction that seek to destroy them.

#### Race Hate Everywhere

"The anti-Semites revolt against reason, these attacks upon democracy and justice, these appeals for a tribal 'totalitarian' blood-sta-

and for a return of the Jew to the ghetto, are known in almost every country of the world.

"Perhaps never before have all Jewish problems been so merged into one upon such a universal scale. Whatever may be the commercial policy of governments, there are no high tariffs for Jew hatred. In that respect, all countries are free traders.

"And because we believe that the things for which America stands are so basically antithetical to the tribal system of Hitlerism, our first and immediate problem as Americans as well as Jews is to stem this rising tide in our own land. We must put up a high and insurmountable tariff against the importation of these barbaric principles and their dissemination in our country. We must protect our constitution and our institutions from bigotry and race hatred. This is all the more necessary since these are elements of danger in our situation in the United States. We are suffering under a long and devastating economic depression; which playing upon the minds of thousands of people—render them susceptible to mob spirit and waves of emotion. The fact that some Jews have won important positions and distinctions furnishes under such conditions material for attack; social discriminations against Jews in our universities and clubs are part of our birthright even in this land of refuge.

#### Sources of Anti-Semitism

"The anti-Jewish movement in the United States seems to find its principal support in the active or passive allegiance of thousands of German and German-American. These people are, I think, generally liberals, since great numbers of them originate in families which left Germany in 1848 as political radicals. However, it is natural that their patriotism be stirred by the new German nationalism which they believe vindicates all German in character and view. Also, agitators sent by the German government have done their work well; German vermin or clubs in our largest cities have expelled Jews and other dissidents, and have become Nazi 'cells'; protests have been conducted by threats against relatives still living in Germany. And since they have an Ernst Bloe, chief of the Nazi party's foreign staff, declaring in a proclamation dated January 13, 1934, and published in America's Deutsche Post of March 1: 'Each individual German is today in his guest-country an exponent of our National Socialist Party of the world, even when he is not a party member.'

"Then, too, there still remains latent in the United States the anti-Jewish feeling explicated not long ago by the Rev. H. H. Hahn and the Dearborn Independent.

It is interesting that if the present attempts to stabilize the economic structure of the country fail to achieve results there is a possibility of a non-concretic method being tried. Dr. Isadore Lubin, commissioner of the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the Department of Labor, warned the joint session that Jews should realize from their experiences in Europe that non-democratic methods mean disaster for them.

#### Discuss Economic Trends

They should therefore lend every effort to the present attempts to achieve economic security, he demanded, he declared. Dr. Lubin claimed that the only hope for complete absorption of the present unemployed in the United States and the extension of government services in the non-profit fields of teaching, public health and recreation.

#### Nationalism in Jewish Life Asked by Dinin

NEW YORK, May 27.—Dr. Samuel Dinin of the New York Teachers Institute today demanded that nationalism rank as a "integrating factor" in modern Jewish life. Dr. Dinin spoke at a joint session of three Jewish social service and education associations, at the Hotel St. Charles.

"What we must do," declared Dr. Dinin, "is cultivate together as many of the elements which make for a people's nationality as possible. The first task is obviously to get all Jews—or as many as desire it—together in some community organization which can include all of them. The second is to get a common unifying center—Palestine. The third is to cultivate a common language, which can serve as a universal means of communication and expression. The fourth is to provide a comprehensive system of education, recreation and community living which will expose young and old to the best and widest possible Jewish culture and render it possible for them to learn and experience creatively as much Jewish culture as possible."

## Zionists Lay Immigration Protest Plans

### Polish Factions Fail to Effect United Front for Purpose

WARSAW, May 27.—Polish Zionists failed in their attempt to form a united front in protest against immigration restrictions imposed by the Palestine government.

Strenuous efforts to achieve unanimity similar to that which characterized the general strike called off by Palestine Zionists last Wednesday were unsuccessful. The various factions will hold individual protest meetings.

The Zionist executive, together with the League for Labor Palestine, will hold meetings all this week to "manifest our sympathy with the general strike in Palestine and the political fight now being waged by the Jewish Agency for Palestine."

Another group made up of the Mizrahi, orthodox Zionists, the Zionist Revisionists, the E. Y. Liberman group and the Agudath Israel, Orthodox Jewish group, will carry out a one-hour strike and hold protest meetings on June 4.

WARSAW, May 15.—A new Yiddish daily, the Freund, has started publication in Warsaw. It is issued by the famous Kletzkin Verlag, and the editors are Alter Kozmin and Salmon Reizen.

The Freund revives the name of the first and most widespread Yiddish daily in the old Russian Empire. The first issue appeared in Petersburg on January 25, 1903, and it was transferred to Warsaw in 1910, where it appeared till the early days of the war.

## Funds Sought For Memorial To von Slatin

### Austrian Jew Led Distinguished Career as Soldier, Governor

LONDON, May 27.—An appeal for funds for a memorial to Sir Rudolf von Slatin, Austrian Jew, was published yesterday in the London Times. Sponsors of the memorial include Admiral Lord Chatfield, Lord Cromer, Lord Euston and Sir Reginald Wingate.

The appeal was made for a memorial "commemorating his remarkable services in the Sudan and also in Britain, his gallantry as a soldier and his ability as an administrator."

Baron Rudolf Carl von Slatin, known as Slatin Pasha, was born in Austria in 1857. He left Vienna for the Sudan when he was twenty-one years old, and was later appointed governor of Darfur by General Gordon. Von Slatin was captured by the Mahdists in 1884 but later escaped and became British Inspector-General of the Sudan. He was held until 1914. He was an honorary major general in the British army and lieutenant general in the Egyptian army. During the World War he headed the group offering aid to prisoners of war. He died in 1931 in Vienna.

### Jewish Party Deputies Cast Their First Votes at Czechoslovakian Polls

PRAGUE, May 27.—For the first time in the history of Czechoslovakia, deputies of the Jewish party, Angel Goldstein and Julius Reiss, cast votes in the presidential election last week. They voted for the reelection of President Masaryk.

The Zionist organ Selbstwehr welcomed the occurrence at the first chance for Jews as Jews to express support for Masaryk. His election in these anti-democratic days, the paper declared, indicates not only democratic victory but also Czechoslovakia's repudiation of group, racial or class distinctions.

# CRUCIAL MOMENTS

## Two Radio Stars Who Took A Straight Road To Success

The usual success story begins with a background of abject poverty, of frustration and struggle. Waiting around for some biographical material, we came upon two members of the microphone fraternity, Vivienne Segal and David Ross, who have reached a point of eminence in the top ten. These two artists do not tell a harrowing tale of struggle when they recount the early days of their careers.

David Ross, dean of the CBS announcers, artist in his own right with his Poet's Gold program, and winner of the Pulitzer Award in 1932 given by the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, was born and educated in New York. After graduation from high school, David took a classical course at City College, specialized in scientific agriculture at Rutgers and then journalism at New York University. In 1925 Ross accompanied a friend to a New York local station to see his first radio program. A heavy turnout of the audience for the next fifteen minute "spot" failed to appear. The director was in a frenzy. When some of the audience members were an excellent reader of poetry and dramatic sketches, he immediately drafted the visitor, who made his radio debut without rehearsals of preparation.

The director was so impressed with David's voice and ability that two weeks later he called Ross and offered him a job as staff announcer at the station. He accepted the offer and remained there for more than two years. When the Columbia Broadcasting System was organized in 1929, David Ross became a staff announcer. He now is the oldest CBS announcer from the standpoint of continuous service.

Besides announcing almost every conceivable type of program, Ross is best known for his pioneer work in popularizing poetry readings on radio. In addition to his own readings of poetry on other presentations, he conducts the popular Poet's Gold program, which he started more than three years ago.

Vivienne Segal, as prima donna of a Broadway operetta at the age of 15, knew the feel of the spotlight's beam throughout her career. She has made her entrance in radio as featured soprano of "Acordians" with Abe Lymann's orchestra, over the Columbia Broadcasting System network every Tuesday at 8:30 p. m. When she was eight years old she had her first radio experience in dramatic club. Even then she dreamed of becoming a famous actress and her mother, who had some dramatic ambition as a child, encouraged her.

At the age of 12, she was proficient as a pianist and was appearing in the ballet of the Philadelphia Civic Opera for the same year she played Puck in "Midsummer Night's Dream." For this performance she received her first newspaper criticism, which stated that "the role fit her better than her rights." A year later she sang in splendid soprano solo in the concert of the same production. One of the highlights of this period of her training came when she was taken out of the ballet of the Operatic Society to play the role of Juliet. She was hailed as a prodigy, and her parents permitted her to take an intensive course in voice culture. She sang in the concert on track—her chance to star, at the age of 15, in the Shubert produc-

tion of "Blue Paradise." With only four days of rehearsal for her part, she made her debut with the opening of the show in the Casino Theatre in New York City.

In quick succession she met with success in numerous musical productions including "Oh, Lady Luck," "Little Wimper," "Yankee Princesses," "My Lady's Glove," "Adrienne," "Florida Girl," several editions of the Ziegfeld Follies, "Cats in the Hat," "The Song of," "Three Musketeers," "Chocolate Soldier," "Clinging Vine," "Merry Widow," "A Wise Child," "Music in the Air." Also in demand for movies, she found time to appear in such outstanding pictures as "Song of the West," "Golden Dawn," "Glide of the Regiment," "Viennese Nights" and "The Cat and the Fiddle."

## President Speaks From Gettysburg on Memorial Day

### The Struggle for Material

All preconceived notions to the contrary, Hollywood is perpetually on the look-out for new stars and new writers. The idea that the California colony is over-run with budding actors and famous writers who are kept on the side-lines because they are not related to somebody connected with moving pictures is completely untrue. It cannot be stated with positiveness that being in the "family" is really a hindrance, but the boys who make it keep up a supply of picture fare are perpetually scouting for talent.

### Hard to Break In

I do hope the above will not send you to your trunk and to the ticket window for passage to the Coast because despite the need for new material companies are rather reluctant to sign up newcomers. It is not merely the lack of pictures is a costly business and every mistake adds to the final reckoning when a film is released. The companies simply cannot afford to take chances on unknown players and writers. That accounts for the large number of published books and performed plays that never get into the theatrical field are welcome on studio lots.

America seems to have an ambition—to get into the movies and if companies were to give every one a chance, either as a writer or actor, there would be no time or room to make pictures. For that reason, if you have Hollywood hopes, get yourself an agent, otherwise you will never get a hearing.

# Kramer Brings Nazi Inquiry to North Carolina

## Summons Pelley Associates; Records Are Investigated

(Special to the J.D.B.)  
ASHEVILLE, N. C., May 27.—Representative Charles Kramer, member of the Congressional committee investigating activities of the Hitler League, yesterday conducted an executive hearing into the affairs of the Silver Shirts at the Federal building here.

Three members of the anti-Semitic, Fascist group which is headed by William Dudley Pelley, were examined during the hearing. They were Robert Sumnerville, Don D. Kellogg and Mrs. Marion Wright, said to be close associates of Pelley.

Harry F. Sieber, secretary-treasurer of the Foundation for Christian Economics and of the Silver Legion of America, Inc., was sought by Sumnerville for a hearing, but could not be located.

Meanwhile, four truckloads of records and correspondence were removed to the county courthouse. The matter was impounded by a court order.

Congressman Kramer arrived in Asheville Friday and conferred during the day with George W. Craft, referee of the National Press, printers of Liberation, Pelley's weekly periodical which is edited by the Roosevelt Administration and opponents of Silver Shirtsian, filed a bankruptcy petition several weeks ago. The magazine has not appeared for some time.

The records removed to the courthouse will be made available to the State and Federal courts, as well as to the Congressional committee. Representative Kramer announced that all information disclosed in this city will be reviewed at public hearings scheduled in Washington within a few weeks.

Previously meetings had been marked with the presence of the agitators and the old established order, the New York Staats-Zeitung and the German Jewish League, had served the German community here for a century.

"Full Harmony" Reported  
Yesterday the New York Staats-Zeitung gave a glowing account of the election. It had been undertaken in "the fullest harmony." The paper described the election as signifying the "bringing into a united front of divergent groups." It did not mention, however, the fact that the united front carried the swastika.

Dr. Alphonse Richter of the Veterans League, protocol-secretary; Dr. O. Oberdorfer, rejected as election as secretary, as did John H. Werderman, and John H. Ducker for other offices. Dr. Oberdorfer was elected as secretary of Ridder. Carl Nicolay, who has frequently been identified with Nazi activities in New York, accompanied by a photograph of Surits, said that he will enter his post during the middle of July.

# Advices Jews To Quit Reich If Necessary

## Max Warburg, Hamburg Banker, Lauds Hilfsverein for Work

BERLIN, May 27.—German Jews who find it impossible to remain in Germany under present conditions must emigrate, Max Warburg, Hamburg banker, yesterday declared before the annual meeting of the Hilfsverein (German Jewish aid society), of which he is an officer.

Mr. Warburg said: "The Hilfsverein stands on the ground that German Jews want to stay in their home land, Germany, whose future is theirs, hoping to secure a dignified continuation of life. But if the German Jews find it impossible to stay in their home for economic reasons and for the future of their children, the need arises to emigrate."

Other speakers urged careful preparation prior to such emigration, and declared that the Hilfsverein is doing much in this direction.

his law associate, Maximilian Eader, and a number of Federal officers, the Nazis demonstrated none of the goose-stepping impetuosity of the early part of the week when they marched and, in turn, were buffeted by outraged citizens of Irvington. Storm troopers, which is ascribed as the cause of the riot, the night of the fray, was not in evidence yesterday. The witnesses, who had been subpoenaed some days ago, appeared rather abashed as the photographer maneuvered for picture possibilities and, with some show of solemnity, the hearings were brought under way by officials in attendance.

Joseph Haubner, a storm trooper frequently seen in charge of the uniformed detachment maintaining order at New York City meetings, coyly hid his face from photographers behind a chubby fist which he gnawed from time to time. The other storm trooper (who describes themselves as Ordnung Dienst or "ushers") were from the Irvington cell of the Nazis.

They gave as their names: Ludwig Gruenwald, president of the local cell of the Friends of New Germany; Carl Jaeger, vice president; August Schlosser; and William Becker.

## See Slaying as Aiding in Unification of Polish Jews

BIALYSTOK, May 27.—Huge crowds of fellow-workers yesterday followed the funeral cortege of Mendel Lubnicki, the Jewish weaver who was murdered Wednesday of knife wounds received when he was attacked, with other Jewish workers, by a group of National Radical anti-Semites inflamed by an election speech given by a priest.

Lubnicki's funeral was an imposing demonstration of Polish workers. The procession, which passed through the main streets, was headed by a party of the weaver's comrades in the Left Polish-Soviet movement and by a delegation from the Polish Workers Bund and the various Trade Unions.

All Jewish shops in the city were closed. Banners delivered at the grave of the dead weaver by representatives of various labor groups emphasized the fact that the National Radical anti-Semites cement the ranks of the Jewish workers of Poland.

The funeral made a tremendous impression upon the whole population.

# Naras and Socialists In Frequent Clashes
