"Fantastic Projects" DR. CHAIM WEIZ-MANN, chairman of the Central Bureau for the Settlement of German Jews in Palestine, has sent a report to the United Jewish Appeal, in which he refers to "fantastic projects" to settle large numbers of refugees in such lands as Angola and South Africa. . Dr. Weizmann writes, in part,

as follows:

"In the search for a new homeland for German Jews, adventurous and fantastic projects have been eagerly brought up, whilst the great opportunities which Palestine offers to them as to others are persistently overlooked. We are told that Palestine is too small, and fantastic schemes are constantly being sprung on us which speak of territories waiting to receive immediately millions of Jews. Names of exotic countries are tossed at the public and plans involving millions are lightly—and without a shred of expert knowledge—discussed. We have never claimed that Palestine as it is today is capable of receiving immigrants in the mil-What we did, and still do is that the absorptive capacity of Palestine, even of Palestine west of the Jordan, could be increased many times

According to Dr. Weizmann's report 11,000 German Jews set-tled in Palestine during 1933 and an additional 4,000 refugees entered Palestine thus far this

The "adventurous and fantastic projects" referred to by Dr. Weizmann have not even been considered seriously, as far as we know, and immediately upon the publication of the Angola proj-ect in a London newspaper, the Joint Distribution Committee, the Ica, as well as High Commissioner McDonald denied catemissioner McDonaid defined cate-gorically that such a plan was being seriously considered. There can be no doubt that

Palestine today is the most log-Palestine today is the most log-ical and most practical solution of the problem of the German Jewish refugees. The dreamers of Zion turned out to be the most farsighted and most practical leaders in Israel, as evidenced by the Jewish achievement in Palestine and by the asylum which that little country is now in position to offer to the victims of anti-Semitic persecutions in Naziland. Naziland. Dr. Weizmann has been more

Dr. Weizmann has been more instrumental than any other Jew in obtaining the historic Balfour Declaration and thus making possible the rehabilitation of Palestine. But the Balfour Dec-Igration and the mandate have been subjected to various inter-pretations by the Colonial Office and by Prime Minister Mac-Donald during the past years so that unforeseen obstacles have that unforeseen obstacles have been placed in the way and Jew-ish immigration to Palestine has been limited to a most deplor-(Continued on Page Three)

### Demonstrators Quelled. Workers' Quarters Invaded

sh Telegraphic Agency) WARSAW, June 13. — Dr. Paul Joseph Goebbels, Nazi Minister of Propaganda, arrived here this afternoon by airplane to deliver at the University of Warsaw a lecture on the aims and purposes of the National Socialist movement, Goebbels was accompanied by a party of Ger-man officials and Nazi journalists. The entire party was heavily guarded by Polish police because of the storm of protest and in-dignation which the announcement of the visit had aroused.

Precautions taken by the police against disorders attendant on demonstrations against the visit of Hitler's aide included the closing of the public parks. Labor organizations attempting to distribute anti-Hitler proclamations in the streets of Warsaw found themselves prevented from doing so by the police, who rushed all distribu-tors of the leaflets off the streets.

Headquarters of the labor or-ganizations and of the Jewish youth groups, including the Zion-ist youth organization, were occupied by police guards to prevent any massing of groups for demonstrations.

### Dr. Finkelstein Named To B'nai B'rith Hillel **Foundation Commission**

Dr. Louis Finkelstein, member of the faculty of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, has been named a member of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation Commission, it was announced yesterday by Alfred M. Cohen, president of B'nai B'rith.

Dr. Finkelstein was born in Cin-Dr. Finkelstein was born in Cin-cinnati in 1885 and was educated at the College of the City of New York, at Columbia University, and York, at Columbia University, and the Jowish Theological Seminary of New York. He has served as rabbi in New York City and has been vice-president of the Rabbi-nical Assembly of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America. He is the author of several schol-arly books on Jewish history and literature.

### Jewish Discrimination Prevails in the South, Burman Tells Anti-Nazis

An optimistic outlook of conditions in the South was given by Edgar H. Burman, commander-in-chief of the Anti-Nazi Minute Men at a mass meeting sponsored by the Garment Center Post at the Hotel Martinique, Thirty-second street and Broadway. "I didn't find any Nazi agitation at all in the smaller communities," Burman said. "The average Jew is not accepted equally on a social basis but he is not interfered with

# Crimson Suggests Degree

New fuel was added to the seething fire of controvery over Hanfstaengl's impending arrival in Hantstaengi's impending arrival in Cambridge by an editorial in yes-terday's Harvard Crimson, daily undergraduate publication, which suggested that the university re-open its honorary degrees list and pay "fatting tribute" to its illus-

Under the heading "Render unto Caesar" the Crimson suggests that not only should "Putzy" be wel-comed to Cambridge, but he should be accorded honors such as have n given no German official since 1902, when Prince Henry received an honorary LL. D.

In anticipation of a "certain pitals and privoutory" against its suggestion, the editorial states that when the university honored Alfred E. Smith hospital cases.

thereby endorsing either his opin-ions or the Democratic Party. The editorial points out, too, that Har-vard felt no cause for embarrassment in connection with the degree it gave Prince Henry when fifteen years later the United States and Germany were World War opponents.

## Alumni Deride Idea

New York City alumni of Har-vard were inclined to make light of the Harvard Crimson's editorial suggestion vesterday that Ernst F. S. Hanfstaengl be awarded an honorary degree.

"What the Crimson suggests ed-"what the Crimson suggests ed-itorially is of no moment to any-one," said H. V. Kaltenborn, Har-vard graduate, radio news com-mentator and former editor. "It's a certainty that no serious consideration will be given to the proposal by the university or by any-one else."

"It sounds to me like a hoax," said an official of the Harvard Club, a class mate of "Putzy's." who asked that his name be v held because he considered the "asinine ideas of undergraduate editors too trivial" for formal com-

entors too crivial. Tor formal comment.

"Harvard honorary degrees are awarded with great care," he pointed out. "They are seriously considered for many months in advance and are given only to men who bulk large in importance. who bulk large in importance.

"Hanfstaengl is in no respect a person of such stature as to be a person of such statute as to be a fit recipient of a Harvard honor-ary degree. I say this entirely apart from my personal views as to the merit of the cause with which he is now associated."

# Viereck's Nose Rubbed in Mud By His Erstwhile Collaborator

Paul Eldridge Pens Masterly Vituperation of 'Cringing, Three-Faced' Hireling of Hitler's Hate-Ridden Reich

In a brilliant, stinging article in the June issue of Panorama, a magazine published in Boston, the George Sylvester Viereck who has figured so prominently in the Con-gressional investigation of Nazi intrigue in this country and who has travelled around the United States mouthing admiration for Hitler in one breath and complete freedom from anti-Semitism in freedom from anti-Semitism in the next, is artistically exposed and thoroughly deflated as "a cringing soul," a "trickster" and a "man with three masks."

The author of the article is Paul Eldridge, erstwhile collaborator of Viereck in literary ventures. Bid-ridge, a Jew, will never again collaborate with Viereck, judging from the vitriolic nature of his attack on the Hitler swastika-

swinger. The article, captioned "George Swastika Viereck," is in the form of a direct "answer to a speech delivered in Madison Square Gar-den (at the DAWA rally on May 17), wherein the monarchist-re-publican-fascist chameleon and foe of liberty proclaimed his hymn of

Excerpts from Article Excerpts from the article fol-

"When I read quotations from your speech in the various news-papers, I thought: The young Narcissus grew drunken as he saw his image in the ripples of the fountain; the middle-aged one is drunken as he watches his name shimmer on the front page, and my indignation turned to disdain.

"Today, however, you sent me a typewritten copy of your en-tire speech delivered at the Madison Square Garden. It was an audacious, a brazen challenge. I must take up my cudgels once



# Austria Lists a New Criminal— The 'Trade Trespasser'—A Jew

New Business Law Strikes at 'Emulation in Trade -When Iew Closes Business He Must Receive 'Authentication for Qualification' to Resume'

By JOSEPH FISHERIG VIENNA, June 3.—A new class of "criminal" has arisen in Aus-tria—the "trade trespasser." Un-til recently it was imagined that the only form of trespassing was walking without permission on another man's ground. Today, when unemployment is so rife and competition in industry so acute, emulation in trade has become an

offense similar to trespassing.

It was in this spirit that the "Gewerbesperre" or trade ban was introduced in Austria. When a man is forced to close down his husiness he is unable to start out in a new branch owing to the trade ban. He must first obtain from the

'Strike the Jew' When the "trade ban" was in-troduced in Austria some time ago it was foretold in economic circles that misery was bound to increase at a devasting rate. In effect, the "Gewerbesperre" has meant the hermetic sealing of the only door to reemployment of thousands of Austrian citizens. Today, with the Austran citizens. Today, with the new trend of political feeling, the Jew is the person who is most severely hit by the ban.

A new factor in the economic control has arisen. Trade regulations have been tightened up in such a way that many husiness.

such a way that many business-men who have been established for years are suddenly prevented from continuing in one or other of the most important branches of their commerce, since they find themselves without the necessary "authentication for qualification." This authentication, however, has nothing to do with real qualifica-

'Ostjude' Excluded

An Ostjude today, if he attempts obtain the necessary authentication, finds from the outset that he is excluded. That wonderfully vague word "Bodenstaendig" which can be translated by the botanical can be translated by the botanical term "hypogynous," plays an im-portant part in present day Aus-ria. "Originated from the soil."— and if you have not "originated from the soil." you are "nicht Bodenstaendig"; that means that you have nothing in common with the traditions of Austria since you had the misfortune to settle there after 1914. Being a foreign element, you have no rights to a livelihood. So the Ostjude, who until a few months ago was a patriotic Austrian, bringing his patriotic Austrian, bringing his children up to respect Austrian culture and Austrian traditions, now finds himself in a similar position to his fellow Jew across the German frontier. The difference is, that in Austria the pres-ent regime does not believe in the mailed fist, like in Germany, but in the silken glove, and little is known abroad of what is happen-

So the Ostjude is not "boden-staendig" and finds it impossible to obtain authorization to trade. His only alternative to starvation is to try and trade without the necessary authorization. Then he

traders authorization. Then he becomes a criminal.

The Trade Ministry grants traders authorizations only after the sanction of the co-operatives. These, however, are not merely preventing Jews from obtaining the authorizations, but are taking proceedings against "trade trespassers.

The nearest she came to meeting a Jew was in overhearing a fossil at a dinner party in New York—who wore a collar exactly like Gladstone's—assert that "no club would dream of admitting Jews to its membership." She adds: "This, if true, ship." She adds: "This, if true, reflects no credit on clubs." Which recalls Lewis Browne's discovery Jew-excluding club usually admit up to a maximum of two Jews in order to save face from the charge of anti-Semitism. Perhaps it is possible to see America without seeing a single Jew, but unless you met at least a few Jewish intellectuals in New York, you cannot know all that New York may have to offer on the higher levels.

### Thomas Mann's Surprise

HAVE learned, thus belatedly, HAVE learned, thus what single episodes during his American American visit gave Thomas Mann his greatest surprise, From the manner in which he spoke of it later it is doubtful if he has got over it yet and should he un-dertake to write either a book or an essay on his American visit, he will undoubtedly give this epis a place.

There is, of course, nothing astonishing in that, and he maintained his savoir faire. Being inured to the customs of this country, I am neither sur-prised nor shocked. The value of a visiting celebrity is that through his eyes we are led to make new assavs of customs and values assays of customs, and values which we have long taken for granted. The chief value Lemuel Gulliver rendered was to the Liliputians, Brobdingnagians, Houyhnhms and the Yahoos whom he visited, who took for granted their customs until they could see them afresh through Gulliver's intelligence. The more fact that Thomas Mann should express sur-prise at the drinking of his health in iced water immediately makes that custom suspect—and cer-tainly in a land from which the blight of Prohibition has been re-

moved.

We can only hope that when
Thomas Mann lands on European
soil—he ought to be there any
hour now—he will drench the
recollection of the iced water
toast in bumpers of good nonGerman beer, or, if that doesn't German beer, or, it that doesn't serve, in a draught of wine. And perhaps also he will regard the iced water toast as a symbol of Western individuality. I'm sure there would have been a wider variety of liquor in these States had be paid us his first visit during the good old days of Prohihition.



### High Commissioner at Testimonial Tea Says Situation Is Bad

"In one or two countries of Eastern Europe Jews are facing pos-sibilities more terrible than any-thing that has happened to them thing that has happened to tnem yet," High Commissioner James G. McDonald, of the League of Nations German Refugee Body, declared yesterday afternoon at a tea in his honor tendered by the board of directors of the People's ORT Federation, at the Advertis-ing Club, 23 Park avenue.

When he first undertook his task, the High Commissioner told task, the High Commissioner told his audience, he realized that a most democratic approach was es-sential in order to win the sup-port and confidence of the masses of Jewry the world over. Today, Mr. McDonaid said, there is a teel-ing of unity among Jews for the time being, which he characterized as a "contribution which the Nazis made to Jewish life."

One of the great problems con-fronting him is "the orientation of the Jewish people toward a new kind of life. We must make peo-ple work with their hands, do ple work with their hands, do things that are fundamental." Many Jewish leaders are agreed on that point, Mr. McDonald said. "In a larger sense, ours is a prob-lem of rehabilitation, of retrain-

ing, etc.". When his task is completed and when his task is completed and he has more leisure, he may write a book on "Unity Among the Jews . . . Which Is Not," Mr. McDonald said.

### 3,367 Jews Entered Palestine in March, Says Official Gazette
