### A Propaganda Offensive

HITLER in Italy, Goebbels in Poland, and "Putzy" Hanfstaengl on his way to the United States. Handsome Adolf is visiting the Duce whose friendship he had alienated by his attempt at the forcible Nazification of Austria. Perhaps the Duce will tell him once more what he had suggested before—that the Nazi policy of religious and racial ersecution is a serious blunder for which Germany must pay dearly. Perhaps Hitler is in Venice to give new assurances to Premier Mussolini that he will cease all efforts to bring about the Anschluss with Aus-tria. Hitlerite Germany has isolated itself in Europe. She has Jost most of her sympathizers and friends. She is economiend friends. She is economi-really and financially on the very brink of disaster. She pleads poverty, blaming the boycott, but she still has plenty of money for propaganda and agi-tation in foreign lands. She also has plenty of funds for rearmament, for war prepara-

It may be, however, that the meeting of Mussolini and his wretched imitator Hitler is for the purpose of holding a little 'Armament Conference. 1935 has been styled in the Danama Mussolini year, as the year when Mussolini will be prepared for war. When Hitler defied Mussolini by attempting to force Mussolini scheme suffered a set-back. The dictators were in disagreement, and the war menace ecame less acute.

Hitler, seeing his own impending doom, is apparently trying to win back the favor of his strongest protector whom he enstrongest protector whom he en-deavored to imitate without suc-cess. He is undoubtedly pre-pared now to make all sorts of concessions and compromises, to ave himself.

The visit of Goebbels, the Nazi The visit of Goebbels, the Nazi Minister of Propaganda and En-lightenment, in Poland is also an attempt to mend the Nazi fences. The chief Nazi propagandist delivered a lecture in Warsaw, lauding the theories of Nazism and justifying anti-Jewish persecution in Germany. His assurance that German Nazism is not an export article is reminescent of the Italian Fascist assurances that Fascism was not intended for export purposes.

Propagandist Goebbels, a member of the Hitler Cabinet, came to lecture in Poland on Nazism.

# Illegal Entry Irks Regime In Palestine

### Government's Report Describes Progress of Past Year

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, June 14. — The economic and cultural progress of Palestine and developments there during the past year are exhaus-tively described in the report of the Mandatory Government to the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations, made public

The report, published in a huge volume of 315 pages, declares that illegal Jewish immigration into stine has caused the government much concern

#### Upset Calculations

The government cannot allow defiance of the law," the report asserts. "Palestine's welfare re-quires the adjustment of immigration to the economic needs both in quality and numbers, but illegal settlers were not selected in both respects, causing disproportion and overcrowding of the professions. It actually did upset the calculations for the periodic assessment of the labor schedule.

"All visa applicants are now warned of the consequences of illegal settlement. Also, the High Commissioner will deduct from the labor schedules a number representing the estimated illegal set-tlement."

The government, according to the report, is considering the for-mation of a statistical office to establish a closer relation between immigration and the absorptive capacity of the country.

LONDON, June 14.—An actual pogrom in the Powonzki district of Warsaw, details of which were rigorously suppressed by the government, are revealed in reports from an authentic source reaching here today.

Hooligans belonging to the Nara party on Friday night in-vaded Jewish homes and stores, pillaged and wrecked them and ferociously attacked the Jews of the district with knives, clubs and iron bars. One Jew succumbed to the wounds inflicted on him. Several, including a woman, were severely wounded and remain in a grave condition.

The manifesto follows:

"We, the undersigned, deem it our duty to arouse the hearts of our duty to arouse the hearts of all Israel and all righteous human-ity in view of the great danger that innocent blood is to be shed in Jerusalem if we fail to arise unanimously in the name of the holy spirit, justice and honor to defend this innocent life.

"We are all witness before God and man that Abraham Stavsky is totally innocent of Arlosoroff's

### Rabbinical Council Wins Kosher Meat Control Litigation in Montreal

(Special to the J.D.E.)

MONTREAL, June 14.—The authority of the Jewish Community
Council was upheld today when
the Superior Court dismissed injunction proceedings by Schochet I. Schwartz, who was outlawed by the council.

The judge ruled that according to the law of the Jewish faith slaughtering meat is a religious act and the Rabbinical Council therefore is the only recognized authority. Schwartz was prohibited from using the slaughter house if he worked without recognition by the council.

The decision is considered a vic tory for the council in its effort to obtain control of the sale of kosher meat.

# Repudiate Nazism, He Declares

An appeal to New York State's representatives in the United States Congress to support three bills, awaiting passage, which would humanize present immigra-tion measures was made today by former Congressman Nathan D. Perlman.

Perlman, who is a vice-president of the American Jewish Congress, is the author of the amendment to the immigration Law passed by Congress, which gives non-quota status to wives and children of American citizens and preferential status to their parents.

The bills for which he urges passage are known technically as H. R. 9364, H. R. 8312, and H. R.

The first would legalize the res idence in this country of aliens who entered up until July 1, 1924. The second would give the govern-ment discretion to permit persons to change their status without the necessity of first leaving the country. Under present regulations a person who wishes to change his status from a visitor to that of an applicant for permanent admis-sion must first leave the country and apply through a consulate

The third measure would liberalize the discretionary powers vest-ed in the Department of Labor in deportation cases

Passage Would Hit Nazis
In urging the passage of these
bills Perlman declared: The passage of these bills will do much to humanize the workings of our present immigration regulations. Such legislation, in addition to its Such legislation, in addition to its immediate effects upon the groups involved, will, in my judgment, have an important effect upon public opinion in this country and

"At this time when Nazism is seeking to gain a strangle hold upon the world and is exercising great effort to reproduce its medipractices and philosophy in own country, such a liberal our own country, such a liberal gesture will have the effect of repudiating Nazism and of reaffirm-ing the traditional principles and practices of a liberal, humane and democratic society on which the American nation is predicated."

Herman Koenigsberg, "dark horse" candidate, has been elected president of the strife-racked Clinton Street Synagogue, it was announced yesterday.

The thirty-five-year-old attor-ney's election came after a bitter factional fight which |continued until five o'clock in the morning.

Simultaneous with his election the congregation's books were turned over for auditing to Louis Septimus, certified public account-Koenigsberg was an unheralded

candidate for the presidency, which had been avidly sought by the two principal contestants, Lie-her Grill and Samuel Selkowitz. Grill was forced to withdraw from the race at the last minute, due to a death in the family. This

left Koenigsberg, whose sympa-thies were more or less with the Grill faction, and Selkowitz to fight it out. Election of on entire new slats

Election or an entire new state of officers was in accordance with a recent settlement between the opposing factions, which had been hurling angry charges at each other since last December, when Selkowitz was defeated for reelection as financial secretary. Litigation Bewildering

A bewildering maze of litigation has characterized the dispute, but opposing groups finally agreed to place the matter in the hands of the congregation, in the form of an election, and thus take it out of the courts. The ruling, in effect, bars Jews from obtaining or holding employment in the municipal services

The Neue Welt, reporting this decree, points out that Mayor Schmitz, who was appointed to his post by the Austrian Fascist government, had declared that rights of minorities would strictly respected. It accuses the government of making one declar-ation for consumption outside Austria and another for actual observ ance within the country. It ob-serves that "Austrian Jews will not be able to accept this disparity

without protest."

The Nazis, in the past few days, have made it a practice to send violent letters to Jews and others warning the recipients against inwarming the recipients against in-forming the government of acts of terrorism. The letters warm that every informer will be out-lawed by the Nazis.

# Flow of Exiles Into Belgium Is Decreasing

### Work Seekers Banned. But Asylum Given to Refugees

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
BRUSSELS, May 29.—The
steady stream of exiles from Nazi Germany filtering into Belgium shows a decided decrease, the Committee for Assisting the Victims of anti-Semitism announced in a statement made to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

During the past few months, the

Committee declared, a number of refugees applied for aid, but none from Germany. The majority were expatriates from France and Holland. Action by the French gov-ernment has resulted in a cessation of the expulsion.

The pelicy of the Belgium gov-ernment with reference to foreign newcomers amounts to a feeling there is sufficient labor in the country already. Foreigners in-tending to come here to seek employment are barred entry. German refugees have been welcom liberally, however, as well as other political prisoners. The country considers itself an asylum. Refugees from lands other than

Germany are not permitted to work here unless their employ-ment would be of distinct benefit to Belgium and the country's economic development.

A commission has been estalls lished primarily for the purpose of coming to the rescue of these refugees. Refugees possessing means are of course permitted to live here. Others may remain and take employment until such time as the mission finds it possible for them to emigrate.

# U.S. Will Act **Against Racket** In Live Poultry

### Criminal Action Seen as Government Investigates Conditions

(Special to the J.D.B.)
WASHINGTON, June 14.—Criminal action against racketeers in the New York live poultry industry will be undertaken by the Agricultural Adjustment Administration and the National Recovery Administration as a result of a confer ence in New York early this week it was learned today.

The contemplated action will be in connection with the enforcement of the live poultry code for the New York metropolitan area, which places a ban on rackets and untrade practices in the industry. The code covers the five boroughs and the counties of Rockland, Westchester, Nassau and Suffolk in New York, Hudson and Bergen in New Jersey, and Fairfield in Connecticut.

Already an intensive investiga-tion of the live poultry marketing situation is under way in New York. The Department of Agriculture, of which the Agricultural Ad-justment Administration is part, has sent investigators and auditors to that city to gather evidence of violations of the poultry code These investigators are cooperating with Leroy Peterson, code su-

Alleged violations on which a number of those in the live poultry business are being investigated in-clude sale of inedible products, redestructive price - cutting, price discrimination, misrepresenting produce, excessive feeding, ille-gal sales, price misrepresentation and unlawful combinations. These practices are barred by the code.

### Hadassah Hospital Work in Palestine Made Public Here

The low death rate of 3.8 per 1.000 among women in childbirth at the Rothschild Hospital at Jerusalem and the Hadassah subsidized saiem and the Hadassan subsidized hospitals in Tel Aviv and Haifa is recorded in the 1933 report of the Hadassah Medical Organization, made public here yesterday by the Women's Zionist Organization of

Other outstanding developments of the past year were the appoint-ment of ten exiled German physicians to the medical staff of the Jerusalem hospital, and the per-mission to thirty other German doctors to engage in post-graduate work in hospitals and laboratories. In connection with the contem-plated Hadassah-University Medical Center a radium institute was established with 200 milligrams of radium, and irradiation equipment brought by Professor Ludwig Halberstadter, German cancer special-ist, who now directs the institute.

- pkg. zwiebacl 1% cups sugar 1/2 tsp. cinnamon 14 cup melte<sup>3</sup>
- cup melted butter lbs. cottage cheese
- 2 thsps, flour
- tsp. grated lemon rind 2 tsps. lemon juice
- eggs Grate or roll zwieback rather
- 1 cup cream

fine. Mix % cup sguar, 1/8 tea-spoon salt and cinnamon with the zwieback and blend thoroughly with the melted butter. Retain 1/2 cup of the crumb mixture for the top. Butter a 91/2-inch spring form pan and line the bottom and sides with the crumbs. Press the cottage cheese through a fine strainer twice. Combine 1 cup sugar, the flour, salt, grated lemon rind and juice and blend with the cheese.

Add the beaten egg yolks and cream. Fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites, pour into the lined spring form pan and sprinkle crumbs on top. Bake in a moderately slow oven (325°) about 11/2 hours, or until a silver knife inserted in the center comes out clean. Remove from the oven and set on a cake rack in a warm place to cool slowly. When cold remove spring form carefully.

# Shadow of Death Hangs Over Reich Jews, Stephens Warns

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
LONDON, May 28.—An account
of the plight of the German Jews is published in the current issue of is published in the current issue of the Daily Express. Pembroke Ste-phens, former correspondent in Germany for the newspaper, and who was held in a Nazi prison, writes that the shadow of hangs over every Jew living in Hitler's Third Reich.

"I have spent the past few days visiting districts where the Jews are reported to be suffering most keenly," the article continues. weenly," the article continues.
"There are now roughly 500,000
Jews in Germany; 100,000 of them
have emigrated—50,000 to Palestine and the Orient, 50,000 to the rest of Europe. "A man or woman who marries

a Jew forfeits position, wealth, in-fluence, respect. There is no exfluence, respect. There is no ex-ception, however highly placed, to the cruel rule.

"Some Jews have been allowed to retain their place in industry, but tolerance of the Jew in busi-ness is only due to fear of upset-

ness is only due to lear of upset-ting trade.
"But there are still judges in Germany, and a Nazi, of Barmen, who despoiled twenty-eight Jewish graves, was sentenced to thir-teen months.

"In a big town a Jew can hide himself. In a village he is isolated and exposed. Friends of fifty years' standing do not greet their old Jewish friends when they meet them in the village; they look the other way. Jewish children are oner way. Jewish children are boycotted by former playmates as if they had the plague; farmers willing to borrow money from the small Jewish trader in democratic days do not take their debts seridays do not take their debts seri-ously; customers prefer not to buy in Jewish shops, and storm-troopers stand outside the doors of Jewish cinemas warning visitors

In Montevideo, where there were fifteen years ago practically no Jews, the Jewish Community now numbers 17,000. The establish-ment of these new Jewish centres is due to the pioneering enterprise of Russian, Polish and Lithuanian , who afterwards brought their families and friends.

"A characteristic appearance in the present emigration movement is the slow but indisputable increase of overseas emigration. But it is only an emigration movement of individuals. The plans for groups or mass settlement have in no country gone beyond the early stages. Colonization requires considerable funds and proper human material. rica, Southern Brazil, parts of Paraguay, the South of Chile and the Argentine come into the picture. To the north of Rio de Janeiro, Asuncion and Santiago de Chile, however, European workers cannot compete with natives.

"The Ica, in addition to its col-

onies, has in the Argentine a land reserve of over 200,000 hectares. But the position in the grain mar-ket must improve before there is a likelihood of settlement there As things are today, a settler, in the opinion of the Ica administration, must be prepared to live on his capital for two or three years.

or longer.
"Africa, Angola, Kenya, Abyssinia, South West Africa and South Africa come into consideration for individual settlement. It must be pointed out, however, that a mixed farm calls for a comparatively large capital, and a coffee plantation in Angola or Kenya requires 50,000 to 60,000 marks. These considerations do not, however, bar young people from finding em-ployment in existing enterprises,

particularly in Africa.
"The work of the Hilfsverein during the past year was not con-ducted solely among poor people," said Dr. Wischnitzer, "for nowa-days emigration demands large sums of money and even emigrants who have capital find it necessary to ask for the assistance of an orto ask for the assistance of an or-ganization like the Hilfsverein. The crews of Yale and Harvard, although participating in many re-gattas during the rowing season, usually arrange their schedules so that they do not compete against one another until their annual meet at New London. This second water carnival is a classic in itself and is almost as famous the Poughkeepsie Regatta on the Hudson. The latter has achieved Hudson. The latter has achieved such fame and has been hallowed by tradition for such a long time that it assumes the aspects of the colorful Oxford-Cambridge races.

#### The Race Is a Four-Mile Grind

There will be several other races besides the Varsity competition. Each university has also entered a freshman crew, a junior varsity shell and a 150 pound boat. What ever the outcome of the other races it is the Varsity which decides the intercollegiate shell supremacy of

the country.

Usually during the season the races are anywhere from a mile and a quarter to a mile and three quarters in length. Sometimes they may even go the three-mile distance. However, the Poughkeepsic course is four miles long and it is gruelling, heartbreaking, with a terrific pace all the way.

Without doubt pulling an oar in a shell along with seven other sweep-swingers is the most gruel-ing of all sports. A four-mile grind on the river is equal only to four football games played consecutively without rest or time out. This sport takes more out of a fellow, as we once said and we repeat, than water polo, ten-nis; soccer and lacrosse combined. For here, once the starter's gun has been fired, there are no moments of letting up, of easing, or coasting along. It is a steady, ruthless sweep onward, and only the best men can qualify.

Besides the enormous stamina that an oarsman must possess for that an carsman must possess for this terrific shell game, he must acquire a rhythmic pull, which in itself is tiring. And still this sport has great numbers of enthusiasts and candidates, who apply for positions in the boat despite the pro-digious strength that it takes to be a sweepsman

#### Regatta Steeped in Traditions

This race has been held for over This race has been need for over forty years and each year tradi-tions have been added and strengthened. The boats that come from all over the country, yachts, steamers, canoes, the observation train chugging along the shore keeping pace with the blade-wielders on the river, all make for color and a gala time.

We recall witnessing the regatta a few years ago in a driving rain. Columbia University swept the races that year after three of the crews were swamped. California's team, which had come all the way from the west coast for this race was one of the crews which was swamped and had to be pulled out of the Hudson. It gave rise to the saying, "three thousand miles for a ducking." Well, it's all part of the game

Should the stroke pick up his beat, it is the duty of the cox'un to check the other lads in the boat.

Thus, tomorrow at the Pough-keepsie regatta, you will be able to hear the chunk of the oars and the shrill cries of the cox'uns as they shout, "Stroke, Stroke! Pick her up number four! Stroke fellers, stroke!"

Spokesmen for the Hitlerite group declared that another meeting will be called for June 27, be held in the same hall.



Discussing political developments in Palestine, the report states that "Arab discontent with Jewish immigration and land sales to Jews, which had been manifest for ter years, was renewed in 1933, cli-maxing in the October and November riots.

The Jewish press, it states, and the Prague Zionist Congress discussed immigration in terms alarm ing to the Arabs. Hostility to Je ish immigration was intensified by knowledge of the recent settleme of an estimated number of 10,000 Jews without permission, which, the Arabs argued, showed the government's inability to control immigration.

### Praises Abdullah

"The government made it clear there would be no change in the policy regulating immigration in accordance with absorptive capacity. Nevertheless serious riot-ing followed," the report states. It declared that only the influence of the Emir Abdullah of Transjordania prevented repercussions "embarrassing to the Palestine government."

While the Arabs demonstrated against the government for its "undue generosity" in immigration of Jews, the Jews expressed dissatisfaction on account of the government's niggardliness. A clash with the police resulted. The report mentions the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, Palestine

Zionist labor leader, "whose loss is deeply felt not only by the Jews with whom he labored with de-votion and success, but also by the High Commissioner and officers of the administration with established mutually belpful relations of trust and es-

"Hanfstaengl's flying visit to
America has nothing to do with
the Harvard reunion," the document continues. "He aims to be . helpful to the Nazi regime, he will seek to block the wide-spread boycott of German goods, to further activities of Nazi units, strengthen their links with the agencies of government and finally to raise funds for the Hitler regime which is in a desperate state of bankruptcy."

In pursuance of the committee's attack of the Nazi's visit, Alfred Wagenknecht, its executive secretary, sent the following telegram to Secretary of Labor Frances Parkins:

"Demand you refuse admittance Ernst Hanfstaengi press representative bloody Hitler regime. His trip here is calculated to extend activities Nazi agents among National Guard and American Fascist groups as exposed in the Congressional Investigation Committee hearings. Past record linking Hanfnearings. Past record linking Hani-staengl to acts of terrorism and espionage culminating in Black Tom dynamiting and others makes his exclusion imperative." The committee's statement gives

ws: "Under his pose of urbanity and cosmopolitan culture he is one of the most coldly calculating and vicious of the Nazis. He is known vicious of the Nazis. "As Hitler's confidential adviser n relations with the foreign press, Hanfstaengl is to be held respon-sible for the consorship, threats and intimidation which have been used to persuade or force reporters to tell stories favorable to the discredited hunger dictatorship of the German Fascists."

Charged With Sabotage

But while this organization and other associations and individuals were joining in the outcry against Hanfstaengl's admission to this country, by far the most important indictment against Hitler's gentleman nurse was contained in the State Department affidavit signed by James Larkin, deported Trish radical.

In this document, according to the World-Telegram, Larkin swears Hanfstaengl was the master mind during the war who outwitted the British and French secret service agents by destroying \$1,000,000 worth of ammunition when the Allies most needed it.
