A Propaganda Offensive

HITLER in Italy, Goebbels in Poland, and "Putzy" Hanfstaengl on his way to the United States. Handsome Adolf is visiting the Duce whose friendship he had attained by his attempt at the fascist Nazification of Austria. Perhaps the Duce will tell him once more what he had suggested before—that the Nazi policy of religious and racial persecution is a serious blunder for which Germany must pay dearly. Perhaps Hitler is in Venice to give new assurances to Premier Mussolini that he will cease all efforts to bring about the *Anschluss* with Austria. Hitlerite Germany has lost itself in Europe. She has lost most of her sympathizers and friends. She is economically and financially on the very brink of disaster. She pleads poverty, blaming the boycott, but she still has plenty of money for propaganda and agitation in foreign lands. She also has plenty of funds for rearmament, for war preparations.

It may be, however, that the meeting of Mussolini and his stretched initiator Hitler is for the purpose of holding a little "Armament Conference." 1935 has been styled in the Balkans as the Mussolini year, the year when Mussolini will be prepared for war. When Hitler defied Mussolini by attempting to force Austria into the Nazi fold, the Mussolini scheme suffered a setback. The dictators were in disagreement, and the war menace became less acute.

Hitler, seeing his own impending doom, is apparently trying to win back the favor of his strongest protector whom he endeavored to imitate without success. He is undoubtedly preparing to make all sorts of concessions and compromises, to save himself.

The visit of Goebbels, the Nazi Minister of Propaganda and Enlightenment, to Poland is also an attempt to mend the Nazi fence. The chief Nazi propagandist delivered a lecture in Warsaw, lauding the theories of Nazism and justifying anti-Jewish persecution in Germany. His assurance that German Nazism is not an export article is reminiscent of the Italian Fascist assurance that Fascism was not intended for export purposes. Propagandist Goebbels, a member of the Hitler Cabinet, came to lecture in Poland on Nazism, and his speech was actually broadcast.

Illegal Entry Irks Regime In Palestine

Government's Report Describes Progress of Past Year

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, June 14.—The economic and cultural progress of Palestine and developments there during the past year are exhaustively described in the report of the Mandatory Government to the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations, made public today.

The report, published in a huge volume of 315 pages, declares that illegal Jewish immigration into Palestine has caused the government much concern.

Upset Calculations
"The government cannot allow defiance of the law," the report asserts. "Palestine's welfare requires the adjustment of immigration to the economic needs both in quality and numbers, but illegal settlers were not selected in both respects, causing disproportion and overcrowding of the professions. It actually did upset the calculations for the periodic assessment of the labor schedule."

"All visa applicants are now warned of the consequences of illegal settlement. Also, the High Commissioner will deduct from the labor schedules a number representing the estimated illegal settlement."

The government, according to the report, is considering the formation of a statistical office to establish a closer relation between immigration and the absorptive capacity of the country.

Aid to Reich Exiles

Reviewing immigration data, the report states that to relieve German Jews, 8,000 immigration certificates were granted in 1933 in advance of the regular schedules. The government also gave special consideration to applications of Palestine residents for admission of near relatives from Germany. It also facilitated the admission of

Hertz Protests Jewish Acts Against Fascists

LONDON, June 14.—Dr. J. H. Hertz, chief rabbi of England today issued a statement deploring participation by Jews in attempts to disrupt Fascist meetings.

Such action, he declared, has been interpreted by the Fascists and other anti-Semites as proof that the Jews are a body against one special political party.

"This is a fantastic falsehood," he declared, "but is capable of greatly harming British Jewry. Irresponsible Jews, interrupting the meetings, make possible the broadcasting such falsehoods, discrediting their faith and undermining the position of the Jews."

Hull Demands Protection for Reich Citizens For Stavsky Aid

Jersey Governor Asked to Investigate Charges That One Was Hurt

(Special to the J.D.B.)
NEWARK, N. J., June 14.—A letter from Secretary of State Cordell Hull demanding protection for German citizens in this country, was forwarded by Governor A. Harry Moore to County Prosecutor William Wachenfeld today. Governor Moore asked the prosecutor to investigate the matter, which resulted from the rioting between Nazis and anti-Nazis in Irvington and Newark on May 21 last.

Secretary Hull wrote in his letter that the German Embassy had complained of an alleged physical attack on Albert Jung, a German citizen, during the street fighting that took place at that time.

Hull expressed the hope "that appropriate measures will be taken to insure German nationals proper protection."

Jung, who is reported to have returned to Germany immediately after the fracas, is said by German officials to be in good health.

Warsaw Naras Launch Fierce Attack on Jews; One Killed

Hooligans Use Knives, Clubs, Iron Bars on Jewish Inhabitants—Pillages Store and Homes Severe Press Censorship

LONDON, June 14.—An actual pogrom in the Pownonski district of Warsaw, details of which were rigorously suppressed by the government, are revealed in reports from an authentic source reaching here today.

Hooligans belonging to the Nara party on Friday night invaded Jewish homes and stores, pillaged and wrecked them and ferociously attacked the Jews of the district with knives, clubs and iron bars. One Jew succumbed to the wounds inflicted on him. Several, including a woman, were severely wounded and remain in a grave condition.

The terror-stricken Jewish residents of Pownonski fled from their homes, leaving their possessions to the vandals.

Rabbis Appeal To All Jewry For Stavsky Aid

Kook, Meir, Palestine Leaders, Issue Manifesto

JERUSALEM, June 14.—A manifesto proclaiming faith in the innocence of Abraham Stavsky, convicted for the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, and calling on Jews throughout the world to rally to his support, was issued here today by Chief Rabbi I. H. HaCohen Kook and Jacob Meir. The manifesto, issued in behalf of the Palestine rabbinate, bears the signatures of many prominent rabbis here.

The manifesto follows: "We, the undersigned, deem it our duty to arouse the hearts of all Israel and all righteous humanity in view of the great danger that innocent blood is to be shed in Jerusalem if we fail to arise unanimously in the name of the holy spirit, justice and honor to defend this innocent life."

"We are all witnesses before God and man that Abraham Stavsky is totally innocent of Arlosoroff's murder."

"The verdict was based on extremely weak indications and it was only the result of outside influences that a section of the court was inclined to accept them. The absolute truth which is known to us in all its aspects is in this case

Rabbinical Council Wins Kosher Meat Control Litigation in Montreal

(Special to the J.D.B.)
MONTREAL, June 14.—The authority of the Jewish Community Council was upheld today when the Superior Court dismissed injunction proceedings by Schochet I. Schwartz, who was outlawed by the council.

The justice ruled that according to the law of the Jewish faith slaughtering meat is a religious act and the Rabbinical Council therefore is the only recognized authority. Schwartz was prohibited from using the slaughter house if he worked without recognition by the council.

The justice is considered a victory for the council in its effort to obtain control of the sale of kosher meat.

Perlman Urges Solons Support U. S. Entry Bills

Liberal Gesture Would Repudiate Nazism, He Declares

An appeal to New York State's representatives in the United States Congress to support three bills, awaiting passage, which would humanize present immigration measures was made today by former Congressman Nathan D. Perlman.

Perlman, who is a vice-president of the American Jewish Congress, is the author of the legislation on the immigration law passed by Congress, which gives non-quota status to wives and children of American citizens and preferential status to their parents.

The bills for which he urges passage are known technically as H. R. 9364, H. R. 8312, and H. R. 8313.

The first would legalize the residence in this country of aliens who entered up until July 1, 1924. The second would give the government permission to request aliens to change their status without the necessity of first leaving the country. Under present regulations a person who wishes to change his status from a visitor to that of an applicant for permanent admission must first leave the country and apply through a consulate abroad.

The third measure would liberalize the discretionary powers vested in the Department of Labor in deportation cases.

Passage Would Hit Nazis
In urging the passage of these bills Perlman declared: The passage of these bills will do much to humanize the exchange of our present immigration regulations. Such legislation, in addition to its immediate effects upon the groups involved, will, in my judgment, have an important effect upon public opinion in this country and abroad.

"At this time when Nazism is making gains, a struggle here upon the world and is exercising great effort to reproduce its medieval practices and philosophy in our own country, such a legislative gesture will have the effect of re-negating Nazism and of reaffirming the traditional principles and practices of a liberal, humane and democratic society in which the American nation is predestined."

Executive Unit Launches A.J.C. Election Drive

Kallen Urges Jewish Bodies to Participate in Efforts

The setting up of an executive committee, comprised of representatives of Jewish fraternal, religious, labor and professional organizations here for the purpose of launching an intensive campaign among Jewish organizations to secure their participation in the democratic national elections to the American Jewish Congress, was announced yesterday by Professor Horace M. Kallen, chairman of the elections committee of the American Jewish Congress.

The executive committee was elected at the first meeting of the Committee of One Hundred and thirty-five, chosen at a conference at 331 organizations in New York where formal participation in the elections was voted. The election work is to proceed under the direction of the American Jewish Congress.

Carl Sherman, former Attorney General for New York State, was elected chairman of the election committee with the following vice-chairmen: S. Bonchek of the Jewish National Workers Alliance; Mrs. Rose L. Stein of Hadassah; S. Eisenberg of the Federation of Polish Jews of America; and William Weiss, president of the Union of Orthodox Congregations of America.

An executive committee of twenty-one was elected comprised of the following:

Dr. Alexander S. Zlotnik, President; George O. Arkin of the Independent Order B'nai Abraham; Hyman L. Rosenfeld, president of the Yiddishische Arbeiter Bund; Dr. Maurice S. Cahane of the Yiddish Socialists; Isadore Epstein of the Yiddish Socialists; Dr. Joseph J. Kallen, president of the Jewish National Workers Alliance; Elias Ginsburg of the Zionist Revisionists; Jacob Goldstein of the Jewish Postal Workers; Mrs. Florence Harris of the Young Women's Union of Congregation Beth Shalom; Michael R. Kaplan of the Lodzer Yiddish Bund; Paul R. Kramer of the Wykower Benevolent Association; the Yiddish Workers' Union; Morris Margulies of the Zionist Organization of America; Dr. H. Rosenberg of the East Side Chapter of the American Jewish Congress; Dr. S. S. Schacter of the Tifereth Israel; H. Schacter of branch 70 of the Workmen's Circle; Dr. S. S. Schacter of the Young Men's Association; and the Yiddish Workers' Union.

The executive committee will immediately set into motion the various activities of the entire committee, the election representatives of the entire community, which constituted itself as a permanent body at the previous meeting.

430 Jews Entered U. S. During May

Of 430 Jews who arrived in the United States during May, 259 were refugees from Germany, according to figures furnished by Isaac L. Asofsky, general manager of the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society. They were met by ETAS representatives who rendered such assistance as was required in connection with their entry.

During the same period, the report shows, 476 individuals called at the ETAS for advice and assistance in their immigration, naturalization and related matters. The Washington bureau of the organization, the citizenship bureau, the bureau for transients and unemployed and other departments were called upon to render extensive work in their fields, serving meals, providing temporary lodging and finding jobs.

'Dark Horse' Is Elected President of Clinton St. Synagogue

Herman Koenigsberg, "dark horse" candidate, has been elected president of the Clinton Street Synagogue, it was announced yesterday.

The thirty-five-year-old attorney-elect came out with a fractional fight which continued until five o'clock in the morning.

Simultaneous with his election the congregators' books were turned over for auditing to Louis Septimus, certified public accountant.

Koenigsberg was the underdog candidate for a presidential election, which had been avidly sought by the two principal contestants, Lieber Grill and Samuel Selkowitz.

Grill was forced to withdraw from the race at the last minute, due to a death in the family. This left Koenigsberg, whose sympathies were more or less with the Grill faction, and Selkowitz to fight it out.

Election of an entire new slate of officers was in accordance with recent settlement between the opposing factions, which had been hurling angry charges at each other since last December, when Selkowitz was defeated for reelection as financial secretary.

Litigation Bewildering
A bewildering mass of litigation has characterized the dispute, but opposing groups finally agreed to place the matter in the hands of the congregation, in the form of an election, and thus take it out of the courts.

Maneuvering administration of the synagogue has been in charge of a temporary committee.

Among its officers and worshipers have been members of the Guggenheimer, Schiff and Sulzberger families. Dr. Stephen S. German Jew Kills Self Over Worry

Martha Reiss, 40, a German Jew, took his life yesterday by jumping from the top of the American floor of the Hotel Manhattan Towers, 2186 Broadway, because he despaired of aiding needy relatives in Nuremberg, Germany.

Reiss was killed instantly when his body struck a fourth floor extension of the hotel. He had been staying at the hotel since March 5. A note addressed to a friend, Sid Rosenberg, of 169 Central Park South was found in Reiss's room. The message revealed that the

Dr. Ludwig Freund, leader of the Jewish War Veterans in Germany, arrived yesterday morning on the way whittled from the Hamburg, denying persistent report that he had slipped out of Reich without the knowledge of the Nazi authorities.

"There is nothing strange about my arrival," Dr. Freund told JT Jewish Daily Bulletin. "All my friends knew that I was sailing. Freund was vague as to what he plans to return to Germany.

Pressed for a direct statement on present conditions in Germany the visitor admitted that, "conditions both economically and politically are very bad."

Myself, however, have not been molested or persecuted," I added. Dr. Freund claimed that I talked freely in Germany while I toured, and only once was I stopped, and then at the point of arrest.

Dr. Freund, a doctor of philosophy of the University of Leipzig was a young man in this country. He joined the Buchberger Jaeger regiment during the World War I. An officer. He saw action during the last week of the war.

Until recently he was the editor of the Jewish War Veterans' organ. However, with the advent of the Nazis, he was barred from writing for his paper. The paper is still published, however.

He refused to discuss with the German people are satisfied with the present regime on the grounds that he might be misquoted.

He said he had worried about eighty-year-old father and six sisters, who are believed to have lost their positions as a result of the Nazi anti-Semitic policy.

Flow of Exiles Into Belgium Is Decreasing

Work Seekers Banned, But Asylum Given to Refugees

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
BRUSSELS, May 29.—The steady stream of exiles from Nazi Germany into Belgium shows a decided decrease, the Committee for Assisting the Victims of anti-Semitism announced in a statement made to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

During the past few months, the Committee declared, a number of refugees applied for work in Belgium. The majority were expatriates from France and Holland. Action by the French government has resulted in a cessation of the exodus.

The policy of the Belgium government with reference to foreign newcomers amounts to a feeling there sufficient numbers of work already. Foreigners intending to come here to seek employment are barred entry. German refugees have been welcomed politically, however, as well as other political prisoners. The country considers itself an asylum.

Refugees from lands other than Germany are not permitted to work here unless their employment would be of distinct benefit to Belgium and the country's economic welfare.

A commutation has been established primarily for the purpose of coming to the rescue of these refugees. Refugees possessing means are of course permitted to live here. Others may remain and take employment until such time as the situation improves. It is possible for them to emigrate.

Those who refuse or neglect to put their names on register for emigration proceedings are ejected forcibly.

Rich Will Deteriorate If Hate Laws Persist, Says 'Exchange' Scholar

SAN FRANCISCO, June 14.—Jewish persecution in Germany under the Hitler regime is far more than violence. It consists of legal discrimination. If the laws making this possible persist, the German nation will deteriorate.

This was the conclusion voiced by General David P. Barrows, former president of the University of California, in an address before members of the Commonwealth Club in San Francisco recently after spending five months as exchange professor in Berlin.

Startling revelations of unbecomingly strong-arm efforts at coercion on the part of its president, C. K. Froehlich, who also heads the DAWA (German American counter-boycott movement), were contained in a statement yesterday from a member of the German Commercial Association of 1888.

The statement contains the following charges against Froehlich, of which he admitted with "explanatory" reservations, in a telephone conversation.

1) That in a letter sent over his signature to "Aryan" members of the '58ers, Froehlich asserted they must either become affiliated with the German American Commercial League (DAWA) or strong party organization, or lose their "political and social rights" in Germany.

2) That at a meeting of the '58ers, he declared that any German citizen who was aware of the above "rule" must either comply with it or be placed on the Nazi Black-list, and that if he failed to affiliate himself with such organization representing the German Labor Front, he would be subject to seizure if he were to cross the German border.

3) That at another meeting of the '58ers, in an effort at sabotage against the employment agency activities and other commercial pursuits of this organization, he suggested that the association donate the \$700 in its treasury (part of which is an insurance fund for members) to the "Vereins Deutsche Gewerkschaften so that it could declare itself a virtual insolvency and thus break a legal hold on its headquarters at 138 Liberty street.

This latter suggestion, made at a meeting this week, was boomed and hissed by members, according to the statement.

The gathering, an extraordinary general membership session, was held at the Franziskaner, 1651 Madison avenue, for the purpose of deciding whether the association was to continue or to dissolve.

Members voted almost unanimously to continue, but on the condition, non-political and non-religious basis.

In this connection it was pointed out that the association is composed of members of many different shades of German origin, many of them Jews.

Nazi Members Froehlich and his associates under cover, organization during the past year, when Froehlich eased his way into the presidency and succeeded in electing Edward, treasurer of the United German Societies, elected treasurer of the '58ers.

Although the state of officers has since been changed, it is still the stigma of Hitlerism, the association's members have successfully waged a two-year battle to maintain their loyalist policies as American citizens.

Recently the group has found itself in financial difficulties, and Froehlich and his tactics have been criticized as the result of new and more intensive machinations aimed at dissolving the association.

Nazi officers achieved partial success at this week's meeting when they were able to railroad over the heads of dissenters a vote to reconstitute the organization on commercial activities "for financial reasons only," and to go on as a purely social group.

Women Resist Tactics
The above decision included "temporary" surrender of the '58ers' employment service, which has been operated without cost to members, including the cost of a letter carrier; and abandonment of the association's Liberty street offices.

After Froehlich's high-handed methods had succeeded in rushing through a favorable vote on the foregoing suggestions, it was dis-

closed that the organization holds a lease on its headquarters which does not expire until next April.

It was at this point that Froehlich suggested that the association donate all monies in its treasury to the Verein Deutsche Gewerkschaften and thus avoid paying rent, according to the statement.

Determined opposition to the Hitlerites' tactics was presented by women members of the association, who particularly resented Froehlich's demand that the club affiliate itself with the German American Commercial League. While this latter organization recently has been forced to admit women to its roster, it continues to adhere to the Nazi insistence that woman's place is over the soup pot.

Vienna Ruling Bars Municipal Work for Jews

Paper Points Out New Decree Contradicts Previous Pledge

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
VIENNA, June 14.—Only citizens of Christian parentage hereafter may obtain municipal employment, Dr. Kresse, vice-mayor of the city, declared today. The ruling in effect bars Jews from obtaining holding employment in the municipal services.

The Neue Welt, reporting this decree, points out that Mayor Kresse was expected to be rebuffed by the Austrian Fascist government, had declared that the rights of minorities would be strictly respected. It accuses the government of making a statement for consumption outside Austria and another for actual observance within the country. It observes that "Austrian Jewry will not be able to accept this disparity without protest."

The Nazis, in the past few days, have made a practice to send violent letters to Jews and other warning the recipients against informing the government of acts provoking research on the basis of every informer will be outlawed by the Nazis.

Dr. Viteles Awarded Foreign Fellowship; Plans European Study

PHILADELPHIA, June 14.—Announcement was made by the Social Science Research Council has awarded a foreign fellowship to Dr. Morris S. Viteles, assistant professor of psychology at the University of Pennsylvania, who has received at the university.

already adopted the methods of their German masters were about to get new lessons in Jew-baiting. The Jews of Poland protested against the visit of Goebbels for propaganda purposes. The Catholic newspapers in Poland also expressed themselves against the Nazi persecutions of the Catholics in Germany, and branded Nazism as being anti-Christian in spirit. The League for Human Rights also voiced its protest on the occasion of Goebbels' visit.

Propagandist Goebbels denied that the Hitler government resorted to terrorism against the Jews and explained that the Jewish population of Germany had dominated the liberal movement and the professions and that when the Nazis came into power, this Jewish influence was removed. That is all. He failed to mention the bloodless pogrom against German Jewry practiced on this day in Germany.

The anti-Semitic Poles, especially the hooligan pogromists who call themselves Nazis, were happy to get this encouragement from one of the Nazi leaders. According to an announcement in the Gazeta Warszawska, the National Polish Lawyers Association, affiliated with the anti-Jewish National Democratic party, will start blacklisting Poles who retain Jewish attorneys to represent them. In a public appeal, this Association is urging the elimination of Jewish lawgivers from practice at the bar in Poland.

The Naras, a combination of Russian Black Hundreds and German Nazis, are continuing their violent physical attacks on the Jews.

The Pilsudski government has given assurances that it is doing all in its power to suppress the organization that has revived the disgraceful antics of the Halalites in Poland, in 1919. But these assurances lack sincerity as the Minister of a Foreign State is permitted and only to engage in propaganda for Nazism but also to spread anti-Semitism. The plight of Polish Jewry has grown ever more tragic since the beginning of the Polish-German political flirtations.

And "Putzy" Hanfstangl is hurrying to the Harvard celebration of the last summer he decided to come over here after all. Before leaving Berlin, the

friend of Hitler and his press chief, offered a gift to Harvard for a Hanfstangl scholarship. The condition upon which the gift is offered contains practically an "Aryan" clause, for the winner of the Hanfstangl scholarship would have to use the money for study in a German college. That would eliminate Jewish students. Besides, what American student would be proud to receive the "Putzy" Hanfstangl scholarship.

Harvard cannot accept the Hanfstangl offer.

It will be interesting to watch the conduct of the Hitlerite "envoy" in this country. German propaganda has always been arrogant and stupid. The German people always lost as a result of such propaganda in the end. "Putzy" Hanfstangl is sure to make a fool of himself, if nothing is done to make him a martyr.

U. S. Will Act Against Racket In Live Poultry

Criminal Action Seen as Government Investi- gates Conditions

(Special to the J.D.B.)

WASHINGTON, June 14.—Criminal action against racketeers in the New York live poultry industry will be undertaken by the Agricultural Adjustment Administration and the National Recovery Administration as a result of a conference in New York early this week, it was learned today.

The contemplated action will be in connection with the enforcement of the live poultry code for the New York metropolitan area, which passes in and out of racketeers and unfair trade practices in the industry. The code covers the five boroughs and the counties of Rockland, Westchester, Nassau and Suffolk in New York, Hudson and Bergen in New Jersey, and Fairfield in Connecticut.

Already an intensive investigation of the live poultry marketing situation is under way in New York. The Department of Agriculture, of which the Agricultural Adjustment Administration is part, has sent investigators and auditors to that city to gather evidence of violations of the poultry code. These investigators are cooperating with Leroy Peterson, code supervisor.

Alleged violations on which a number of those in the live poultry business are being investigated include sale of inedible products, rebates, destructive price-cutting, price discrimination, misrepresentation, prodigious, excessive feeding, illegal sale, misrepresentation and unlawful combinations. These practices are barred by the code.

Hadassah Hospital Work in Palestine Made Public Here

The low death rate of 3.8 per 1,000 among women in childbirth at the Rothschild Hospital at Jerusalem and the Hadassah subsidized hospitals in Tel Aviv and Haifa is recorded in the 1933 report of the Hadassah Medical Organization, made public here yesterday by the Women's Zionist Organization of America.

Other outstanding developments of the past year were the appointment of ten exiled German physicians to the medical staff of the Jerusalem hospital, and the permission to engage other German doctors to thrive in post-graduate work in hospitals and laboratories. With this permission was contemplated Hadassah-University Medical Center a radium institute was established with 200 milligrams of radium and irradiation equipment brought by Professor Ludwig Halberstadt, German cancer specialist, who now directs the institute.

RECIPES

CHEESE CAKE

- 1 pkg. zwieback
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 cup melted butter
- 2 lbs. cottage cheese
- 2 tbsps. flour
- 1 tsp. grated lemon rind
- 2 tbsps. lemon juice
- 5 eggs
- 1 cup cream

Grate or cut zwieback, 3/4 teaspoon salt and cinnamon with the zwieback and blend thoroughly with the melted butter. Retain 1/2 cup of the crumb mixture for the top. Butter a 9 1/2-inch spring form pan and line the bottom and sides with the crumbs. Press the crumb mixture through a fine strainer twice. Combine 1 cup sugar, the flour, salt, grated lemon rind and juice and blend with the cheese. Add the beaten egg whites and cream. Fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites, pour into the lined spring form pan and sprinkle crumbs on top. Bake in a moderately slow oven (325°) about 1 1/2 hours, or until a silver knife inserted in the center comes out clean. Remove from the oven and set on a cake rack in a warm place to cool slowly. When cool remove spring form carefully.

Neboh's President Pleads Not Guilty

Accused of Misrepresenting Meats as Kosher—Case Adjourned to July 3

A plea of not guilty was entered by the Special Session Court, 120 Soherman street, Brooklyn, by Abraham Kaufman, president of the Neboh Koshel Provision Company, charged with offering for sale four barrels of non-kosher briskets and four barrels of tongues. The case was adjourned to July 3.

The complaint was made originally by a member of the office of Arthur Simon, confidential investigator for the Department of Health. The case was heard in various magistrates' courts of Brooklyn, and finally the defendant was held for trial in \$500 bail. In a long decision Magistrate Martin reviewed the details of the case and gave his definition of what constitutes kosher meat. He stressed the tremendous growth of the kosher products industry, declaring that so many people are placing reliance in the firms dealing in them that fraud should not be tolerated.

Shadow of Death Hangs Over Reich Jews, Stephens Warns

(J.D.B. Special Correspondence)

ZONDRON, May 28.—An account of the plight of the German Jews is published in the current issue of the Daily Express. Pembroke Stephens, former correspondent in Germany for the newspaper, and who was held in a Nazi prison, writes that the shadow of death hangs over every Jew living in Hitler's Third Reich.

"I have spent the past few days visiting 'districts where the Jews are reported to be suffering most keenly,'" the article continues. "There are now roughly 500,000 Jews in Germany; 100,000 of them have emigrated—50,000 to Palestine and the Orient, 50,000 to the rest of Europe."

"A man or woman who marries a Jew forfeits position, wealth, influence, respect. There is no exception, however highly placed, to the cruel rule."

"Some Jews have been allowed to retain their place in industry, but tolerance of the Jew in business is only due to fear of upsetting trade."

"But there are still judges in Germany, and a Nazi, of Barmen, who despoiled twenty-eight Jewish graves, was sentenced to thirteen months."

"In a big town a Jew can hide himself. In a village he is isolated and exposed. Friends of fifty years standing do not greet their old Jewish friends when they meet them in the village; they look the other way. Jewish children are boycotted by former playmates as if they had the plague; farmers willing to borrow money from the small Jewish trader in democratic days do not take their debts seriously; customers prefer not to buy in Jewish shops, and storm-troopers stand outside the doors of Jewish cinemas warning visitors of a boycott."

Brazilian Newspapers Urge More Liberal Immigration Law

RIO DE JANEIRO, June 14.—Several prominent newspapers here are opposing the immigration law which would permit the entry of immigrants up to two per cent of the number from each country present in Brazil in 1920.

The newspapers point out editorially that its immigrants have been a blessing for Brazil, and that the country is indebted to them for the establishment of a number of industries. An increase of at least three per cent in the quota is urged.

As already reported, this law would especially affect Jewish immigration, since there were comparatively few immigrants from Russia, Poland and Rumania in Brazil in 1920.

Hilfsverein Has Aided Many Emigrants to Leave Reich

Information Given to 60,000 Last Year—Various Colonization and Aid Bodies Collaborate—African, South American Plans Told

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
BERLIN, May 24.—"The machinery which has been set up by the Hilfsverein der Deutschen Juden, especially to come to the rescue of German Jews wishing to emigrate and "start life anew," was described at an annual meeting of the organization held here by Max Warburg, vice-chairman.

"The Hilfsverein stands on the basis that the German Jews want to stay in their homeland, whose future is their own, in the hope that they will secure for themselves a dignified way of continuing their life."

"If, however, it appears to German Jews impossible to remain in Germany for economic reasons, and for the future of their children, then it is a consequence the need to emigrate, and the Hilfsverein places great value on the importance of careful preparation of the emigrants."

"The Hilfsverein has taken in hand a thorough-going inquiry into all the possibilities that exist for the emigration of German Jews. It has collated this material very fully, and there has already been a consultation on a big scale, and another one is being arranged. The sixty thousand people were given advice and information of all kinds during the course of 1933; 7,700 people were furnished with information for the railway and ship tickets, visas, food, and the transport of luggage, household goods, machinery and automobiles.

"The correspondence has been maintained on behalf of many thousands of people with the authorities, and with Jewish Communities and local committees.

A Duty to Help

"The Hilfsverein," Mr. Warburg continued, "considers it its duty to help those who have taken the grave decision to leave the Fatherland to establish for themselves a new existence. The Hilfsverein has been active in this regard in all countries except Palestine. Till now it has cooperated in emigration to thirty-four countries. The needs of the emigrants' work require the material and moral assistance of all our members. We know to what an extent the claims of their own family circle and of the Jewish community in the protection of German Jews at the present time. But no German Jew or Jewess may at this time stay in Germany, and the Hilfsverein has never been faced by tasks more serious than now, and the concentration of all German Jews has never been more essential. Only the loyal cooperation of all will give us the strength to carry our responsibility and to continue our work."

Group Is Indispensable

Dr. Mark Wischnitzer, general secretary, said that the Hilfsverein is indispensable. If it did not exist, it would have to be created. "We always think of the men who founded the Hilfsverein, James Simon, Paul Nathan and Eugen Landau, who is happily still among us," he said. "German Jewry has them to thank for it that thirty-three years ago an organization was brought into existence that by experience built up an apparatus that is still functioning in 1933 and must continue to function in the future."

"There are also due," he said, "to the organizations that are collaborating with the Hilfsverein—the Jewish Colonization Association (Jca), the Joint Distribution Committee, the American Jewish Committee, Dr. Bernhard Kahn, was for many years general secretary of the Hilfsverein, the Hicem and the Anglo-Hicem."

Dr. Sigmund Wassermann, who submitted the financial report,

enumerated the objects on which the Hilfsverein expenditure had gone, emigrant welfare work, Ukrainian orphans' aid, students' aid, emigrants' aid, aid for schools, for the children's village Den Siemen, the Hebrew Grammar School of Dr. Biran, the prospective Palestine aid for the Children's Home Ahava, etc.

"In 1933," he said, "the Railway Station Service of the Hilfsverein dealt at the Schlesische Bahnhof with 15,000 emigrants and re-emigrants, 6,213 men, 4,478 women and 2,459 children. The Railway Station Service also looked after the Christian contacts passing through Germany on their way to Palestine."

Dr. Baec Speaks

Rabbi Dr. Leo Baec, president of the Polish Jewish Center for Jewish and the Central Committee of German Jews for Aid and Construction, emphasized that the scope of the work was much greater now.

"In March, 1934, a new wave of emigration set in," Dr. Wischnitzer said.

"The Hilfsverein has correspondents in the Argentine, Bolivia, Brazil, Colombia, Paraguay, Chile, Guatemala, Cape Town and Johannesburg, and in the United States and Bombay in Kenya, Addis Ababa in Abyssinia, Teheran and Meched in Persia, and in Singapore, Harbin, Shanghai and Manila."

"The doors are said to be closed to immigrants," Dr. Wischnitzer said, "and, therefore, the gaps everywhere that can be filled. The prospects for some occupations are very bad. In Palestine, for instance, for merchants, shopkeepers and the like. But there are employment openings for skilled workers, mechanics, technicians and artisans of all kinds."

"It certainly deserves attention that apart from European countries, the Hilfsverein was able to assist would-be emigrants to transit to thirty-four different overseas countries, primarily to the United States of America. These people have gone out to the Argentine, Brazil, Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, Paraguay, South Africa, South West Africa, Rhodesia, Kenya, Abyssinia, Persia, India, China and Japan."

300,000 Argentine Jews

"At the beginning of the century," said Dr. Wischnitzer, "there were few Jews in the Argentine outside the Ica colonies. Today there are about 300,000 Jews. In Montevideo, where there were fifteen years ago practically no Jews, the Jewish Community now numbers 37,000. The establishment of these new Jewish centres is due to the pioneering enterprise of Russian, Polish and Lithuanian Jews, who afterwards brought over their families and friends."

"A characteristic appearance in the present emigration movement is the slow but indisputable increase of overseas emigration. But it is only an emigration movement of individuals. The plans for groups or mass settlement have in no country gone beyond the early stages. Colonization requires considerable funds and proper human material. The settlement efforts in France have not prospered. Many enterprises have collapsed, others are still in the constructive stage."

"There have been projects for Jewish mass settlement in Argentina, Paraguay, Angola, Kenya, Abyssinia and Australia. None of these have so far assumed definite shape, but some of them deserve earnest consideration. Expert opinion is that South American

rica, Southern Brazil, parts of Paraguay, the South of Chile and the Argentine come into the picture. To the north of Rio de Janeiro, Assunção and Santiago de Chile, however, European workers cannot compete with natives.

"The Ica, in addition to its colonies, has in the Argentine a land reserve of over 200,000 hectares. But the position in the grain market must improve before there is a likelihood of settlement there. As things are today, a settler, in the opinion of the Ica administration, must be prepared to live on capital for two or three years, or longer."

"Africa, Angola, Kenya, Abyssinia, South West Africa and South Africa come into consideration for individual settlement. It must be pointed out, however, that a mixed farm calls for a comparatively large capital, and a coffee plantation in Angola, Kenya requires 50,000 to 60,000 marks. These considerations do not, however, bar young people from finding employment in existing enterprises, particularly in Africa."

"The work of the Hilfsverein during the past year was not conducted solely among poor people," said Dr. Wischnitzer, "for new wave emigration demands large sums of money and even emigrants who have capital find it necessary to ask for the assistance of an organization like the Hilfsverein. Nor does the Hilfsverein confine itself to charitable work. The work it did in pre-war days, from 1905 to 1914 was constructive. It helped to build up the mass settlement of Russian Jews in North America, which has become so important a factor in Jewish life."

New Emigration Projects

"Present day developments have started new emigration movements," he continued, "and new Jewish Communities are founded and new Jewish centres created, the Hilfsverein is doing its share towards this construction of a happier future."

Now Interest in Education

Dr. Leon Fram, of Temple Beth El, Detroit, speaking of new experiments in adult Jewish education, said that one of the most encouraging phenomena in the field of Jewish education today is the recent growth of revival of interest in education for adult persons. Adults who are themselves fascinated by the study of Jewish history, he said, will have all the keener sense of the responsibility

of a Jewish education for their children. Children who know that their parents are engaged in Jewish study are bound to feel an increased respect for their own educational training.

Dr. Fram said that courses of instruction in Jewish history, religion, literature and culture are being offered in some twenty-five schools, chiefly in large cities. Classes, he said, meet once a week. A conservative estimate of the number of attending students, he said, approximately 5,000. Many of the schools are housed in temples and synagogues, he continued, but a number of them are found in community centers and Hebrew school buildings.

More Than Religion

Rabbi Morton M. Berman, director of Jewish education in the Free Synagogue of America, speaking of Jewish education and Jewish experience, said that increasing acceptance of the view that Judaism is something more than a religion, tends to impel the Jews to "revolutionize both the content and the method of Jewish school programs." Failure of the Jewish people to teach their children that Palestine is the center of Jewish civilization, he said, and not as a remote ancestral home, was deplored by the speaker.

He urged that more time be spent in teaching the children more about what he termed "Jewish living."

The evening session will be devoted to the annual message of the president of the organization, Rabbi Samuel H. Goldenson, of New York City.

WERNERFELDE, Pa., June 14.—"A plea that the Jewish people 'display good will instead of hatred' toward the Nazis who are provoked to committing violence by an attitude of antagonism, was voiced by Professor Henry J. Cadbury, of Bryn Mawr, chairman of the American Friends Service Committee, held here at the South Mountain Manor Summer Resort. More than 150 rabbis from all parts of the United States and Canada attended.

"Persecution of the Jews in Germany by Hitler and his Nazis can be ended," said Professor Cadbury, "not by the hate that the Jews may display but by the good will which they should show."

"By hating him and trying to fight him, you will only help make him worse in his attack on the Jews. But if the Jews the world over would try to convey to Hitler and the people of Germany their ideals and appeal to their sense of justice, the problem would be solved much sooner."

"War Without Bloodshed"

The speaker described the boycott of Jewish products in Germany as a "declaration of war without bloodshed." He urged that Christians, "as their duty," help fight the injustice done by the Nazis. He said that "for the sake of Christianity and its doctrines," non-Jews join in the movement to stop the Jewish people in Germany."

The afternoon session was devoted to reports submitted by education committees.

Rabbi Abraham J. Feldman, of Hartford, chairman of the Educational Committee, said in his report that the increasing interest in adult education for adults can be attributed to "vision and foresight" of people who, apart from what is still hoped may be temporary disturbances, believe that religious education for children alone will never be adequate. This, they believe, must be supplemented by education for adults. The Rabbi asked that the committee be permitted to continue its program of adult education, and that support be given to the Hebrew Union College.

Paper Scores Canada Clergy on Race Stand

Cites O'Connell's Talk as Example for Them

(Special to the J.D.B.) MONTREAL, Que. June 14.—Commenting on Cardinal O'Connell's recent speech in Boston where he openly condemned racial hatred and Jewish persecutions, the Jewish Daily Eagle draws a parallel between this stand and the attitude of the Catholic clergy in the Province of Quebec who have not identified themselves with any open protest against the anti-semitic propaganda in the Province. Some of the clergy, in fact, are known to have given their blessing and support to the movement.

"What is specially noteworthy in the cardinal's liberal attitude," states the Eagle, "is the parallel that may be drawn between him and the dignitaries of the Catholic church in Canada. Surely Cardinal O'Connell is as good a Catholic as the Catholics of the Province of Quebec. But here the attitude towards the Jews is somewhat different. Here the representatives of the church remain indifferent to the anti-Jewish incitement, carried on under the mantle of Christianity.

"Anti-Semite Clergy
"Why the solemn stillness on the part of the church authorities? Why do they not raise their voices in protest to condemn the wild cannibalistic acts of the local well-to-do?" The reader is well known. But we do know that there are many clergymen who are very much in sympathy with the anti-Semitic incitement. It is well known that certain church dignitaries have lent a hand to foment this anti-semitic incitement, and the fact that the Catholic church, which is so influential in Quebec, has not done anything to stop this vile propaganda against the Jews, this fact alone is a fight that the churchmen in America.

Cautious Advised

To the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin: The developments in Germany during the past two years have made the Jews more realistic than at any time in the past century.

They discovered an economic weapon, the boycott, to fight back their oppressors.

In this country unfortunately, they have developed a class known as "professional Jews" who travel about with chips on their shoulders continually looking for trouble and as this is the easiest thing to find they have found plenty of it.

This leads us to the conclusion that real honest Jewish Jews should not believe everything they hear above and beyond that and not jump at hasty conclusions.

The professional Jew who spreads unauthenticated propaganda is just as dangerous to Jews as the bigoted Nazi.

American Jewish, at this time, is receiving whole-hearted support from the large and ever growing group of Christians and it is our opinion that this support should not be jeopardized by a mere handful of malicious propagandists. I use the word malicious advisedly, as there are undoubtedly a very few meaning Jews who spread propaganda, untruthful and often first determining whether it is based upon facts.

Let us lean backward a bit before we spread rumors about local institutions that are supposed, by discriminating against Jews, and thus avert overt acts which have become irrevocable.

Concerns that are friendly, or which for business reasons are compelled to steer a middle course, should be mind that the show which is put on by the Jews is not always the most enthusiastic. The soft spoken man, who possesses the false facility of "acting like a son of his business" instead of con-

tinually prying into that of his neighbor, who knows what Judaism means and follows its precepts to the best of his ability and above all others men, bring credit to the Jewish race and respect unto himself.

"Let he who is without sin cast the first stone" and "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you" are maxims applicable to Jews and Christians alike. Not to one or the other, but to both.

Those who deserve support for our brethren abroad, respect for ourselves at home, fame, money or anything, we must earn it through the honest and honest efforts, respect for the opinions of others and good sportsmanship; in fact, we must so conduct ourselves that even he who is without sin cannot cast the first stone.

May we repeat our admonition, not to accept everybody's and anybody's word without confirmation and not to let the boyhood have injury to the person or persons concerned. Be aggressive, yes. Do not strike first and think afterward. Do not let the boyhood have injury to submit the facts together with your proofs to the committee in charge for confirmation.

The Poughkeepsie Regatta

The climax of the rowing season every year has been the traditional classic at Poughkeepsie. Every crew with money enough to finance the trip to Poughkeepsie aims for this meet every summer. It is the high-water mark of a sportsman's season.

It is grueling and thrilling, beautiful to watch and even more so to participate in.

In preparation for the renewal of this intercollegiate rowing regatta at the small town on the Hudson, the faculty and authorities at Yassar, that exclusive college, have issued a special announcement. The dean said that it is perfectly satisfactory for the girls to marry and remain in school.

Inasmuch as there will be seven universities represented at this race on June 16 Yassar College feels that it is an unwise policy not to come out with their now famous "marriage statement."

The Cream of America's Oarsmen Will Be Afraid

There are some people who actually believe a regatta is held every time the fleet comes to New York and unloads its thousands of goods on the lakes and boats of Central Park.

However, on June 16, from a point four miles below the bridge that spans the Hudson at Poughkeepsie, seven boatloads of the best oarsmen, rowers and sweepers representing the Universities of Pennsylvania, Cornell, Syracuse, California, Columbia, Navy and Washington will

sink their blades into the waters and stroke for victory.

Yale and Harvard Not Entered

The crews of Yale and Harvard, although participating in many regattas during the rowing season, usually arrange their schedules so that they do not compete against one another until their annual meet at New London. This second water carnival is a classic in itself and is almost as famous as the Poughkeepsie Regatta on the Hudson. The latter has achieved such fame and has been hallowed by tradition for such a long time that it assumes the aspects of the colorful Oxford-Cambridge races.

The Race Is a Four-Mile Grid

There will be several other races besides the Varsity competition. Each university has also entered a freshman crew, a junior varsity shell and a 150 pound boat. Whatever the course of the other races it is the Varsity which decides the intercollegiate shell supremacy of the country.

During the season the races are anywhere from a mile and a quarter to a mile and three quarters in length. Sometimes they are as long as the three-mile distance. However, the Poughkeepsie course is four miles long and it is grueling, heart-breaking. Without doubt, the rowing season is a hell of a lot of fun. Besides the enormous stamina that an oarsman must possess for this terrific shell game, he must acquire a rhythmic pull, which is itself a thing. And still this race has great numbers of enthusiasts and candidates, who apply for positions in the boat despite the rigorous strength that it takes to be a sweepersman.

Regatta Steeped in Traditions

This race has been held for over forty years and each year traditions have been added and strengthened. The boats that come from all over the country, yachts, steamers, canoes, the observation train chugging along the shore keeping pace with the blade-wielders on the river, all make for color and a gala time.

We recall witnessing the regatta a few years ago in a driving rain. Columbia University swept the races that year after three of the crews were swamped. California's team, which had been left behind from the west coast for this race was one of the crews which was swamped and had to be pulled out of the stretch. It gave rise to the saying, "Three thousand miles for a ducking." Well, it's all part of the game.

Then again the winning team of this regatta collects all shirts of the men in the rival shells. Likewise, according to tradition, the coxswain of the winning crew is tossed overboard. What for? you may ask? Well, just to keep tradition alive.

A Toss-Up as to The Winner

California's crew of eight hulls from the West is a strong combination over long distances. Cornell is rated as a fair choice and Pennsylvania may pull a surprise. Columbia has been left behind in the shorter distance of a mile and a quarter, but may im-

Jewish Lads on Columbia Crew

Coxswain Solomon is one of the few Jewish oarsmen on the Eastern waterways. Another is Myron Michelman, stroke of the Columbia eight this year. Both these sailors are seniors and have been with the crew for the last three years. They have made this their only sport because of the long hours of practice throughout the year that has to be put in.

The coxswain is the man who keeps the rhythm and steers the boat. He is responsible for the morale that exists in the shell and it depends on his knowledge of the young blade-wielders at what point in a race they can let everything go and give their all for a final push.

The stroke, on the other hand, gets the signals from the coxswain for an added few beats and sets the pace. If he should be dipping his oars at the rate of thirty-four strokes per minute, the seven behind must be pulling away at the same rate of speed. Should the stroke pick up his beat, it is the duty of the coxswain to check the other lads in the boat.
