Hitler's Moral Default
DR. H. J. HALMAR
 SCHACHT, president of the Deutsche Reichsbank, in his statement announcing the German moratorium and suspended cash payments on all their foreign debts for six months, concludes thus:

"A spirit of compromise, patience and goodwill are essential if the world is to escape a new economic relapse. Let Germany's goodwill be met by equal goodwill in foreign countries."

The London Times, commenting on Dr. Schacht's explanation, charges Germany with "a direct breach of faith" and refers to Dr. Schacht's defense of Germany's stand as "reminiscent of the murderer who having slain both his parents pleaded for mercy on the ground that he was an orphan."

"It is really impossible to avoid the conclusion," writes the London Times, "that the reversal of Germany's trade balance since the beginning of the year has been the direct result of her inflationary domestic policy and of the retaliatory measures provoked by her treatment of the Jewish population within her borders—both factors for which she must be held responsible—even if no account is taken of the more sinister implications of her increasing imports."

"In pursuing this course the German Government has been willfully neglectful of their good name. By allowing a forced default upon their international obligations they have shattered the remains of their credit."

Dr. Schacht's plea for a spirit of goodwill, "if the world is to escape a new economic relapse," sounds like a brazen mockery in the light of events since Germany fell under the sway of Hitler. His concluding sentence, "Let Germany's goodwill be met by equal goodwill in foreign countries," is typical of Hitler's arrogance.

Now Germany has now defaulted on her international obligations to her creditors. But ever since Hitler came into power, Germany has defaulted on her human obligations as a civilized nation. Her moral default has led to her financial default. The end of Hitlerism is approaching rapidly.

Silver Shirt Leader Surrenders To North Carolina Authorities

ASHEVILLE, N. C., June 15.—William Dudley Pelley, Silver Shirt chieftain, erstwhile publisher of the now defunct Liberation, anti-Semitic weekly, who was recently indicted by a Buncombe County Grand Jury for alleged violation of the North Carolina blue sky laws, surrendered to officials here today. He was released on bond of \$2,500.

For some weeks it was rumored that Pelley had been in hiding somewhere in Mexico. He disappeared suddenly when Liberation gave the death rattle and unpaid creditors stormed for payment. The Cahalab Press, publishers of Liberation, was declared bankrupt on May 2 by Federal Judge Yates Webb.

The Silver Shirt leader had a long and notorious career before the demise of Liberation. He wrote popular novels which had a negligible circulation, was the C. A. secretary during the World War in Siberia, preached mysticism and other doctrines and finally became identified with the anti-Semitic movement in the United States.

Butchers Union Sees Rumania Imposing New Social Reforms At Conference

Sheppard Says 5,000 Will Join Strikers on Monday

Influenced by the attitude of proprietors of kosher shops against the high prices being asked for meats by packers, the Hebrew Butcher Workers Union of Chicago, international organizer for the Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butcher Workers Union.

Approximately 5,000 members of the union will go out on strike on Monday, according to Sheppard.

The union's decision followed action on the part of proprietors who cancelled all orders in protest against prevailing wholesale prices of beef, veal and lamb, which have risen four to five cents a pound, according to Charles Cohen, president of the Federation of Kosher Butchers of Greater New York.

Goldstein Exhorts U. S. to Assume Burden of Unemployment

BUCHAREST, June 15.—Efforts are now being made in Rumania to deprive the Jews of the most elementary rights, including the right to work for a living. Dr. William Filidernar, president of the union of Rumanian Jews, declared today. In a message to Rumanian Jewish youth Dr. Filidernar described the present situation as "worse than fifteen years ago when Jewish emancipation in Rumania was accomplished."

The administration of the youth organization is now launching a nation-wide campaign against anti-Semitism and has also prepared a program of lectures treating with such topics as assimilation, the Zionist movement and the Jew in politics.

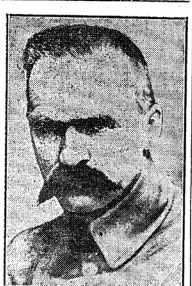

Rabbi Demands Social Reforms At Conference

Goldstein Exhorts U. S. to Assume Burden of Unemployment

(Special to the J.D.B.)
WERNERSVILLE, Pa., June 15.—Rabbi Sidney E. Goldstein, chairman of the social justice commission of the Central Conference of American and Canadian Rabbis, meeting here at its forty-fifth annual conference, sounded a plea for social reforms which he said are the problem of the United States government to solve.

In his annual committee report which was heard by more than 150 attending delegates, Rabbi Goldstein echoed the expressions used by President Roosevelt in his Congressional message recently. He presented a statement of principles and ideals as they relate to present day societies and asked that government relief be extended to meet unemployment problems, etc.

"No government," he said in his report, "has the right to assume that the problem is solved. What is needed by these idle men and women is work and wages."

The conference presented a proposition.

Defender of Jews Felled By Assassin

Killing of Pieracki is Climax to Series of Outrages

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
WARSAW, June 15.—Col. Boleslaw Pieracki, Polish Minister of the Interior and determined opponent of political anti-Semitism, fell here this afternoon on the steps of his home, the victim of an assassin's bullets.

The murder of Marshal Pilsudski's intimate friend and associate climaxed a series of outrages and acts of terrorism in all parts of the country which received striking impetus in connection with the visit here of Dr. Paul Joseph Goebbels, Nazi propaganda chief.

Col. Pieracki was shot as he was returning to his home this afternoon by an unidentified assailant who succeeded in making his escape. He died shortly afterward after an emergency operation.

Although the assassin was not discovered, the general conviction held by the authorities was that the murder was an act of vengeance by the National Radicals (Naras) for government action undertaken to suppress the terrorist attacks of the Naras on the Jews.

The government yesterday took action against the Naras in several districts where the Naras attacked verged on a pogrom, closing headquarters of local Naras groups and suppressing a Naras newspaper. Col. Pieracki, as Minister of the Interior, was reported as charged with directing action against the anti-Semitic, anti-government group.

Arctic Survivor, Now Refugee, In Straights

The only surviving member of Professor Alfred Wegener's Arctic expedition of 1930-31, who was dismissed from his post as geographer in a German institution because of his Jewish blood, is one of the neediest cases for whom relief funds are being sought. It was revealed Friday by the United Jewish Appeal.

Now thirty-nine years old, he has been with numerous Arctic expeditions and was so severely wounded during the Wegener expedition that his feet were amputated as a result.

Store Owner Fined For Delaying Law

Baum, Kosher Meat Control Supervisor, Makes Arrest;
Woman Pays \$25

NEWBURGH, N. Y., June 15.—Mrs. C. E. Wales, owner of a kosher meat market in this city, was fined \$25 by Judge Daniel Becker for violating provisions of Section 1653 of the Penal Law, which makes it a misdemeanor to refuse, unlawfully resist, delay and obstruct a public officer in the discharge of his duties.

Shepherd S. Baum, newly-appointed supervisor of Kosher Meat Control of the Department of Agriculture and Markets, was the arresting officer.

This is the first known case in which Section 1651 was enforced to further the authority of a kosher food inspector.

Jews Friendly to U. S. Germans, Rabbi Declares

Antipathy Directed Not to Fellow Americans, But to Nazis

A letter of good will has been addressed by Rabbi Solomon A. Pineberg, of Mount Vernon, chapter of the Jewish War Veterans to several hundred Nazi sympathizers and advertisers in the Deutsche Zeitung.

"Any study of the actual facts," writes Rabbi Pineberg, "will reveal that Jews in America have no ill will whatever toward the German people, but that their antipathy has been spent, and are being spent now, by Jews in stores, restaurants, factories and all sorts of commercial enterprises owned or operated by Germans. Tens of thousands of Germans have been employed and will continue to be employed in industries or households owned by Jews."

"There is no boycott being conducted against German American citizens by any Jewish organization. Anyone who claims that such discrimination exists is using falsehood and fraud to foment trouble which can bring profit to the Jew, but to the detriment of the Jewish people. Jewish agitators who seek to bring about strife between Jews and Germans in this country."

He concluded with a request that "if your commercial interests have been damaged in any way because of your German origin, and if you will communicate this information to our National Committee, we shall take prompt steps in your behalf."

The statement was made in connection with the fourth anniversary of the Jewish War Veterans. Rabbi Pineberg also urged "the Jewish shirt organizations to go out of existence. We cannot fight Hitlerism while using its methods. A Jewish organization with fascist psychology is as bad as any other, and in such context we, the minority, are doomed."

Friedenwald Will Benefits Charities

Sanitorium, Hospital, Homes Are Left Bequests by Baltimorean

(Special to the J.D.B.)
BALTIMORE, June 15.—Seven charitable institutions benefited from the will of the late Hiram W. Friedenwald, died for probate here. Mr. Friedenwald was a real estate developer and president of a building supply company.

The will made bequests of \$128,000, of which \$28,000 went to various institutions, and left the residue of the estate to the Mount Pleasant Sanitorium. Trust funds of \$40,000 to Miss Beulah A. Shulman and \$10,000 for Miss Maria B. Ambach, a niece, will be divided between Sinai Hospital and the Mount Pleasant Sanitorium on the death of the recipients.

Other bequests went to Sinai Hospital, \$10,000; Council Milk Ice Fund and the Hebrew Home for the Aged and Infirm, \$5,000 each, and the Little Sisters of the Poor, the General German Orphan Asylum and the Kerman Hospital and Industrial School for Crippled Children, \$1,000 each. Relatives received \$54,000.

Most Germans Not Sympathetic to Race Hatred, Says Houghton

"Intelligent Germans with whom I conversed in Berlin and other parts of Germany felt that the Nazi regime gave them nothing. People in general are not in sympathy with the Hitlerite anti-Semitic program, which promised a millennium that they see failed to materialize," declared the Rev. Dr. Will H. Houghton, pastor of the Calvary Baptist Church, on his arrival aboard the Cunard liner Berengaria Friday. With Mrs. Houghton he made a seven weeks' tour of Europe, studying youth movements abroad.

University professors and other leaders throughout Germany told Dr. Houghton of the persecution of the Jews in the beginning of the Nazi rule, and of the discrimination at the present time. In Berlin he learned that 70,000 had been exiled.

"I can't say that I saw much in Germany that I could condemn. Conditions are getting worse," Dr. Houghton said. In Austria, Czechoslovakia and other parts of the continent he observed a growth in anti-Jewish feeling, which he attributed to the "Nazi contagion," although, he explained, most countries are developing their own fascism.

"I believe in Zionism very ardently," was one of Dr. Houghton's statements. There is a possibility of Germany being the aggressor in a European war, he said. Some of her neighbors are afraid of her and in general fear is the outstanding characteristic in Europe today; everybody is afraid of his neighbor.

All religions in Germany find conditions oppressive. Jews are made to bring them under

political control, the minister declared, and Hitlerism may wreck itself on this issue.

He conversed with some Nazi leaders in Berlin. Dr. Houghton admitted, but would not reveal either their names or what they said, as that "would prove extremely embarrassing to them."

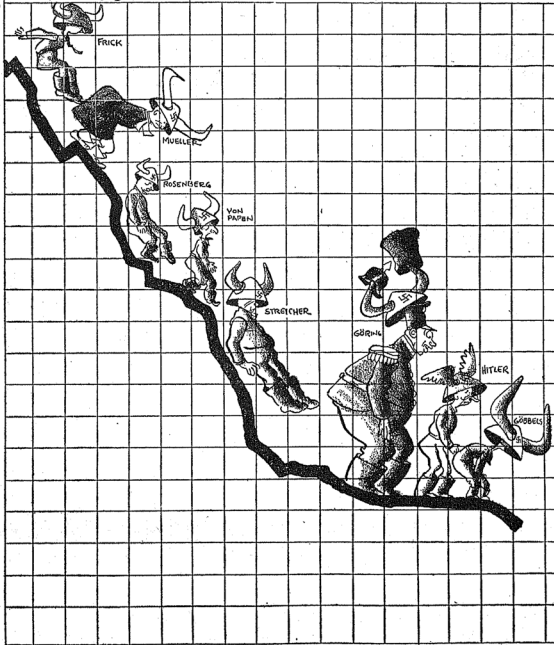
Pachay explained the band had no objection to the hand members going to Germany, or any other country, as individuals.

Discontent Rife In Reich, Says U. S. Journalist

Describes Hitlerland as 'A Great Slave Colony' Ruled by Fanatics

(Special to the J.D.B.)
BALTIMORE, June 15.—"A tremendous undercurrent of dissatisfaction in Germany" is reported by S. Miles Bouton, American journalist who landed here yesterday after leaving Germany "at the urgent request of the Nazi government."

In an article in the Baltimore Sun, for which he was special correspondent in Berlin for thirteen years, Bouton describes Nazi Germany as "a great slave colony, governed by such an aggregation of, in part, honest fanatics, in part, ignorant, stupid and brutal men, as never before controlled the destinies of a great nation."

Elsewhere in the article the American writer remarks: "I have left a country where it is a crime to express—or even to hold, if they are discovered—opinions differing from those dictated by the men in power."

All opposition is crushed "with the most brutal and ruthless measures." Bouton believes that Nazis are driving Germany into a war, which he expects within five years. Hitler's "reign of bigotry and terror" would be promptly terminated, Bouton holds, if Germany but knew where to turn after he is shorn of power.

Rabbi Demands Social Reforms at Conference in Wernersville

(Continued from Page One)

gram of social reforms that would include the total elimination of child labor, old age pensions, retirement pensions taking effect at the age of sixty-five, together with a system of unemployment insurance.

The committee further recommended "a comprehensive program of public construction, by municipal, state and federal authorities, of buildings, roads, bridges, hospitals and schools and especially of housing projects on a national scale, to wipe out slums and slum areas."

Dr. Sidney E. Goldstein, chairman of the Social Justice Commission of the conference, in his report of the commission's work discussed unemployment, distribution of the national income, socialization of basic enterprises, the NRA and the trends of political organization in this country.

The commission, Dr. Goldstein reported, found that "unemployment continues at the end of five years. The social effort to be the most acute 'problem in our economic life.' There are at least ten million men and women in the United States who are in the million families utterly destitute and dependent upon public aid, he said.

Urges New Tax System

To distribute the national income wisely and justly, the commission advised a "radically revised system of taxation that will include a 10% increase of surtaxes upon current incomes; a marked increase in inheritance taxes and gifts; a heavy tax upon corporate surpluses and reserves; the taxation of tax exempt securities; and the removal of competitive taxes upon commodities in current use."

A further suggested remedy, the report stated, was a program of control over the prices of commodities so that the increase in wages would not be constantly outrun by the increase in the cost of living.

In the matter of socializing basic enterprises, the group found that it is not for society to leave the basic social enterprises in the control of private groups that operate these enterprises for private gain instead of for the service to the community."

Suggests 3-Point Reform

A three-point program for socializing basic enterprises was suggested for adoption by the government. These were: 1) Reorganization of the banking system, of which it declared that "no amount of capital poured into private banking organizations will filter down to those who need it most."

2) Taking over of the transportation and communications system by government, as recommended after careful study by the Federal Coordinator of Railroads.

3) The commission went on record as criticizing the NRA for its "many weaknesses and defects which if uncorrected will invalidate the program as a whole and make true recovery impossible." These defects were pointed out as follows: Working hours in the various cases were fixed with a choice of being limited to more than thirty hours per week. Minimum wages in almost every code are too low. Workers' right to organize and bargain collectively must be protected and enforced.

Warns Against Fascism

Warning was sounded by the commission against the danger of the American people falling into "the trap of thinking that the choice is either Communism or Fascism" when faced with a choice of three present trends of political organization, Communism on the extreme left, Fascism on the extreme right and a socialized democracy in the center. The body expressed the opinion that it is

not necessary to limit ourselves to two choices, Communism or Fascism. In the judgment of the members of the Conference there is only one way in which the American people can escape the dictatorship of Fascism or the other, and that is, by establishing a thoroughly socialized democracy. This change can be achieved, the members are convinced, without force and violence and catastrophes and through the orderly methods of democratic procedure."

Arms Makers Scored

Armament manufacturers were scored and compulsory military training in colleges and universities was condemned in the report to the conference by the Committee on International Peace, which was presented by Rabbi Max C. Currie, chairman, of Erie, Pa. The report urged, also, the right of the conscientious objector to war and to such training as an expression of the war spirit, to be excused from such training."

The committee recommended that the conference give, if requested, all possible assistance to the Congressional committee investigating Nazi intrigue in this country.

"Nazi organization and propaganda for the subversion of the present form of Government of the United States impedes the present friendly relations between our Government and that of the German Reich, and is, therefore, an impediment to the world peace movement," the report stated.

In his presidential message to the conference, Dr. Samuel H. Goldenson, of Temple Emanuel, New York City, urged upon rabbis and other Jewish leaders the necessity of analyzing and understanding the play of forces that make possible such a phenomenon as Hitlerism in the present-day world.

"We should not spend all our time in denouncing Hitlerism," he declared, "but reserve some of our strength and energy for the greater and more useful task of understanding the causes of its power, and seek to eradicate them."

Chauvinism, or perverted nationalism, the cause of the narrow racial culture in opposition to culture as broad and universal; and the demand for self-contained solidarity against a general unity based on loyalty to a common ideal, all-inclusive ideal were listed by Dr. Goldenson as some of the

contributing causes to Hitlerism.

To combat its menace, the New York rabbi declared it was the duty of "all of us to remove as far as we can the forces that threaten the stability of the social order."

In discussing the spread of intolerance all over the world, Dr. Goldenson cautioned that since "we Jews are always the first victims, it behooves us to be especially watchful of our own conduct and not commit the folly of believing that similar liberalisms may not develop among ourselves. If we should take proper counsel from the nature of the attacks upon us in Germany and if we study their origin and the way they are justified by our enemies, we would be especially on guard against the development in Jewish circles of narrow and trivial conceptions of culture, of chauvinistic nationalism and the advocacy of rigid and regimented solidarity."

Dr. Goldenson, ridiculing the claim of solidarity that Hitler dares to have behind him, urged upon Jews a solidarity of a diametrically opposed kind. He suggested a unity derived from "love for our heritage and the respect that each shall have for the other's right of making our heritage count in life."

The conference leader warned against the tendency to emphasize Jewish nationalism separately and apart from its unique religious and spiritual quality, and declared that this tendency in modern Jewish life, which is chiefly to ignorance of the distinctive quality of Jewish history, will ultimately lead to the disintegration of the Jewish people. The only justification, he said, for the separate existence of the Jew as a minority people lies in his conscious fulfillment of his self-imposed task of playing a special role in human life.

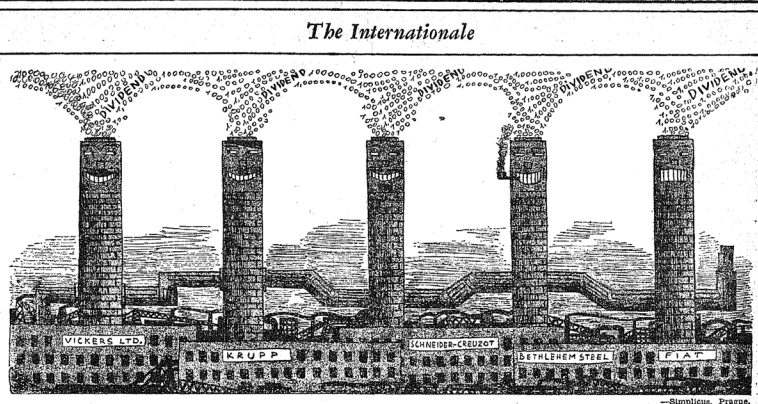

CAPITAL CONNECTION

BY NATHAN KOENIG

WASHINGTON. — When the House of Representatives voted the other day for an additional appropriation of \$20,000 to further the McCormack committee's investigation of subversive propaganda activities in the United States, the members of the House in effect gave the committee a vote of confidence.

This favorable action went through despite strong opposition from individual Congressmen, and despite a pro-Nazi lobby which has been flooding the offices of every member of Congress with letters and literature since the investigation was inaugurated by Representative Samuel Dickstein of New York, chairman of the Committee on Naturalization and Immigration.

Representative John W. McCormack of Massachusetts, chairman of the investigating committee, is astounded at the far-reaching mass of evidence uncovered by his committee since the investigation started.

"When I was appointed chairman of the committee, I never thought that the evidence which has been disclosed ever existed in the United States," he said. "I never thought that there would be anything discovered outside of individual activity, and that the activities engaged in were more or less confined to individuals in this country. I never thought that we would make a contact with a foreign government, or a political party in control of a foreign government, sending instructions into the United States to persons in the United States, a few citizens and most of them aliens, to engage in activities within our borders for the purpose of arraigning Americans against Americans because of their race. I consider the attempt to arraign Americans against Americans because of racial or religious differences subversive to our government and our people."

From the volume of evidence in hand, the Congressional committee is quite certain that Nazi propaganda activities are directed from Germany. This preliminary conclusion was reached as a result of secret investigations and from testimony and evidence gained at the recent public hearings in Washington. But, the committee does not intend to rely entirely on its own investigations. Before its final report will be made, the committee will take into consideration the results of investigations now under way by the Department of Justice, the State Department and the De-

partment of Labor. In the meantime, Nazi activities alone will not hold the committee's attention. The next step will be to look into Communist propaganda activities. Then, the committee intends to investigate propaganda of the Fascists.

All this talk about Russia having a paid propagandist in this country, amounts to nothing. At least, that is how it looks for the present.

George Sylvester Viereck, it will be remembered, charged that Ivy Lee was a propagandist in this country for the Russians. Viereck was summoned to appear before a sub-committee at a secret hearing in New York, to testify before Representative Dickstein on what he knew of Russian propaganda activities in this country.

While Representative Dickstein would not reveal the results of Viereck's appearance, it has been learned from reliable sources that Viereck's charges were groundless.

However, that did not leave Ivy Lee out of the picture. The McCormack committee has indications that while Ivy Lee, so far as is known, is not doing propaganda work for the Russians, he is said to be responsible for some of the Nazi propaganda activities in the United States. The committee is digging further into the facts.

In connection with the probe in general, Representative McCormack makes this attitude: "It is immaterial to me who may be involved by the facts that might be developed—if it is evidence and not mere opinion of some person it will be brought out into the public for the benefit of the American people, and for the use and benefit of the Congress for its future action."

Originally, the committee had an appropriation of \$10,000 with which to conduct the investigation. With the additional \$20,000 already voted, the committee will be in position to conduct its investigation on a more intensive basis.

Polish Minister is Assassinated; Naras Are Under Suspicion

thodon in Poland to support the Pilsudski government and against the Zionists and other groups in maintaining control of Jewish affairs.
He was also instrumental in pointing out the kehilla law regulating and defining the functions of Jewish community organizations.
In national politics, Col. Pilsudski was a leader of the Polish legions, who constitute Marshal Pilsudski's chief support.

Began Career in 1930
The assassinated Minister held the rank of colonel. He started his cabinet career as Under-Secretary in national politics. Col. Pilsudski was the Pilsudski cabinet and held that post from August to December, 1930. From December, 1930, to May, 1931, he was Minister With out Portfolio in the Siawok cabinet, becoming Minister of the Interior in the Prystorski cabinet in May, 1931.

Earlier this year he took up the cudgels against Polish anti-Semites who accused the government of permitting Jewish street demonstrations while at the same time it was prohibiting those of Polish national organizations. In answer to a violently anti-Semitic speech in the Polish Sejm last February the Endeck 2 equity Bielski, Pilsudski declared from the Sejm tribune.

Hits Terrorism
"Acts of terrorism and violence by individuals and collectives, irrespective of their motives and no matter against whom they are directed, will not be tolerated and the perpetrators will not escape severe punishment."

The Minister further announced: "In order to prevent all misunderstanding, allow me to state that we will not tolerate race and national conflicts because they are directed to the historical spirit of the Polish people."

"Poland's great power in the past was achieved only thanks to the capacity for living with the alien races inhabiting Poland. It will be perilous if we adopt foreign race theories which are serving political expansion purposes."

"The race theory transplanted to Poland has achieved no results and counteract Poland's material and spiritual ascent."

At the same time that he pointed out as the main principle of Polish policy the full equality to all citizens, Pilsudski warned the national minorities in his country against extreme nationalism which he said would hinder peaceful living with the Polish people.

When he concluded his reply to the Endeck, Deputy Pilsudski, a member of the government bloc, in another vigorous statement stated the Endeck allegation that the government favored the Jews and declared that the police must protect the Jews and not the Polish citizens, irrespective of their nationality and religion.

Assumes Protection
In the middle of May Col. Pilsudski once again gave assurance to the Polish government will stand by his declaration to protect every attempt to introduce racial conflicts in Poland. That was when Dr. Rosmarin and Vol. Bielski, Minister of the Sejm, called upon him to protect against the continued attacks upon the Jews by the National Republic and the Siawok cabinet.

He received a detailed memorandum from the Jewish deputies, who also provided him with affidavits and statements of witnesses regarding the Nazis' treatment. The list included Jews beaten up in the streets, attacks on homes and shops, the robbing of Jewish property, attacks on Jewish schools, and efforts at incendiarism directed against the Jews.

Polish Jews Express Regret of Killing

At a cabinet session Friday night by the Federation of Polish Jews in America and the American Jewish Congress expressed "deep regret" at the assassination of Col. Pilsudski. The statement said the attack on him with the series of attacks on Jews and with the presence in Poland of Dr. Goebbels. It expressed hope that the government would act vigorously to halt the attacks.

A resolution adopted at the convention of the Federation protesting against the excesses in Poland has been forwarded to the Polish government, according to word Friday from Dr. M. Marchlewski. Polish news agencies said that Marchlewski telegraphed the Federation from Washington that the protest had been forwarded, and declared that his indignity of perpetrating the outrages would be punished.

Socialists Place Faith in British In Stavsky Fix

Jewish Workers, Poale Zion-Zeire Zion Give Statements

A statement expressing faith in British justice in connection with the Stavsky verdict in Jerusalem was issued by the Central Committee of the Jewish Workers' Party, the Poale Zion-Zeire Zion, Friday.

"Our standpoint," the statement said in part, "has been and still is today that nothing could serve so well to clear the atmosphere in our political life as the truth, even though it be cruel and fearfully difficult to bear. We hoped all the time that the investigations would prove the suspicions unfounded and that none of the accused would be found guilty of murder. The foundations of British judicial institutions and the opportunities which the defense had for producing its evidence leaves us no ground for doubt as to the impartiality and legal regularity of the conduct of the trial."

U. S. Major Charges 'Putzy' Laughed at Wife's Torture

(Continued from Page One)
veteran and anti-Communist.

Less than a year ago, Pease charges, his wife suffered gross indignities at the hands of the accused while in Berlin. He tells a harrowing story of her experiences during her trip to Germany.

Laughed at Torture

A paragraph in his letter declares Hanfstaengl stood by and watched Mrs. Pease's appearance at the Amerika Institute in Berlin "in protest against having been brutally beaten, kicked, threatened, frightened, nearly dead, and was black and blue from head to foot at that very moment."

"She had been dragged from her hotel in her nightgown," the letter continues, "hung into a stone, ice-cold cell, her shoulder blade thrown out of joint, held in the cell for twenty-eight hours incommunicado, 'Bertiloned,' beaten, sneered at, threatened with sexual assault, witnessed the beating of dead of some poor Jew before her cell door, lost her voice through fright, . . . flung head first into a filthy bath tub in which the blade was plugged up with . . . broken teeth and the hair of previous victims, and on top of it all caught pleurisy, from which she nearly died. She was in the hospital for her back for two months and is still badly injured from it all."

"Hanfstaengl LAUGHED at this!"

Graduated as First Name
Mrs. Pease, her husband's letter explains, is a Radcliffe graduate in the class of 1909, the same year in which Hanfstaengl received his degree from Harvard.

She is a first cousin of Harvard's former president, Dr. Abbott Lawrence Lowell, a Mayflower descendant and a Daughter of the American Revolution, Major Pease says.

Here is his explanation of the more than a day of horror she suffered at the hands of Nazi torturers:

Another demonstration was planned by the 15,000 students who struck here against war on April 13. The joint committee of the Student League for Industrial Democracy and the National Student League, organizations responsible for the April strike, have called on the students to gather at the pier in protest against "Putzy" visit to this country.

"There is no place at Harvard for Hanfstaengl," the committee statement declares in part.

"To tolerate Hanfstaengl is to tolerate the barbarism he represents."

"The above outrage was perpetrated by the Brown Shirts for the purpose of attempting to frighten and squeeze out of my wife valuable securities she was supposed

by them to have with her—a plain attempt at robbery, such as is wholly characteristic of the Nazi party."

Many Protest

Major Pease's attack on Hanfstaengl was augmented by those of many other organizations and individuals.

The National Committee to Aid Victims of German Fascism announced that groups numbering more than 500 members, the affiliates were joining in protest against admission of the Hitler aide.

Among these it listed the International Workers Order, the Pilsudski Workers' Order, the International Labor Defense, the Trade Union Unity League, the Unemployed Councils and the National Committee for the Defense of Political Prisoners.

Perkins Gets Note

In every case, the announcement stated, telegrams were being sent to Secretary of Labor Frances Perkins and President James B. Conant of Harvard.

It repeated charges that Hanfstaengl, ostensibly coming here for the sole purpose of attending the twenty-fifth anniversary reunion of his Harvard class, is actually bent on promoting the Nazi cause in the United States.

Among the demonstrating groups scheduled to gather at Pier 86, West Forty-sixth street, where the Europa was to dock Sunday, were the members of the Anti-Nazi Federation of New York, which also sent telegrams of protest to President Roosevelt and Dr. Conant.

Representative Samuel Dickstein denied a report printed in Thursday's New York World-Telegram to the effect that Hanfstaengl will be subpoenaed by the Congressional committees investigating Nazi propaganda in the United States. The State Department in Washington also contradicted a story carried in the same newspaper, which declared "Putzy" will be asked to testify in the Black Tom explosion disaster of 1916.

'Has Done Nothing'

"In the eyes of the committee Hanfstaengl has done nothing," Dickstein declared. "So long as he attends to his own business the committee has no concern over him."

From Cambridge, Mass., came reports admiring the Harvard Crimson's suggestion that "Putzy" be awarded an honorary degree by his alma mater. Jerome Greene, New York banker, said Hanfstaengl is "a person not to be taken seriously either as a statesman or as a buffoon."
