EDITORIAL NOTES HERMAN BERNSTFIN

A Timely Warning

THE following interesting and timely note comes from Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, vicepresident of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League:

"The Tewish press has in the last two or three weeks been filled with over-optimism about the imminent collapse of the Hitler regime. I wish it were so. But I am afraid that in this case the wish is father to the thought. A cool survey must lead one to the conclusion that while the Nazi regime is in serious difficulties it does not face immediate collapse. It has still considerable financial resources to draw upon and while there may be con-siderable criticism or grumblings within Germany, it has such a complete stranglehold upon the situation that its grip will not be readily broken.

"In the meantime the Jewish people may be lulled into a false sense of optimism and relax sense of optimism and relax their intensive boycott activities. That would be disastrous. The cumulative effects of the boy-cott are just now beginning to tell forcibly. If the boycott could be intensified throughout the world in the next six months the forces of resistance against Hitlerism in Germany will be strengthened and the doom of Hitlerism may be sealed. At the present moment the battle is far from being won. There has been absolutely no change in the offi-cial Nazi attitude toward the Jews in Germany."

Several days ago I stated edi-torially that, while the hand-writing on the wall is unmis-takable and that all symptoms point to the approaching down-fall of Hitler, all efforts to resist the Hitler menace morally and economically must be continued in order that Hitleriam may be disarmed.

The Jews everywhere, as well as right-thinking and liberty-loving non-Jews, welcome the heartening news of the evidences of Nazi disintegration and the or Nazi disintegration and the mearing Hitler breakdown. But there must be no relaxation in the efforts to isolate the Nazi pest and to free the world from the Hitler scourge.



Sarnaki, after repeated assaults on Jews smashing windows and destroying property, resisted police finally were compelled to fire shots over the heads of the rioters to disperse them. A number of arrests were made.

In the neighboring village of Kranica Nara-inspired mobs of peasants forced the Jewish popu-lation to fiee in mad haste, leavpeasants forced the Jewish population to flee in mad haste, leaving all their possessions. One of the Jewish families thus ousted had resided in the village for over

fifty years.

# Stop Boycott, No Dissolution

#### Labor Heads Arrested: Fuehrer Acts to Avert Showdown as Vets Defy Attackers

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, June 27. — Chancellor Adolf Hitler acted today to avert precipitating the crisis tion by calling off Nazi storm troop attacks on the conservative, monarchistic Steel Helmet organization which, inspired by the von Papen Marburg speech and subsequent expressions of hostility to the Nazi regime, had openly leaned on the side of the conservative opponents of the radical Nazi wing.

Hitler assured Minister of Labor Seldte, who delivered the Stahl-heim to Hitler's leadership when he joined the Hitler cabinet, that he joined the Hitler cabinet, that the organization would not be dis-solved but would be permitted to continue as part of the National Socialist structure. The Stahlhelm, technically, has been incorporated in the storm troop army, but ac-tually for the most part has remained distinctly apart and more or less hostile to Nazi command.

Hitler's assurances to Seldte came only after the Stahlhelm had openly defied the Nazi leaders, whose sentiments were expressed yesterday in the Voelkischer Beobachter, Hitler's own newspaper. The paper denounced the Stahlhelm as traitors to the Nazi movement and described the stabbing affray in Pomerania in (Continued on Page Eight)

#### Former Schacht Aide De clares They Alone Can End Boycott

The first task of the Junker military dictatorship which will replace the Nazi regime in Germany will be to restore German credit abroad and this step will necessitate concession for the credit abroad and this step will necessitate concession for the German Jews, who, "alone are able to stop the boycott," Johannes Steel, former secretary of Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, president of the Reichsbank, and exile from Nazi Germany, declared in his third article on the decline of Hitter

Mr. Steel predicts that the desperate plight of the Jews will be alleviated by "liberal interpreta-tions of the 'Aryan Paragraph' and finally by restoration of the political rights."

The German finance official also predicts restoration of the Russo German alliance; currency infla-tion in Germany; restoration of the freedom of the churches, and the release of the less radical prisoners from the concentra camps.

#### Describes Hitler Exit

The writer sees the personal fate of Hitler as "going out of power just like he got in power—through the back door."

Once the military dictatorship which will succeed the Nazi dictatorship, is established," Mr. Steel writes, it will pursue the following aims:

"First of all, it will try to

"This attempt at regaining her foreign trade will be followed by a policy of open inflation, which, apart from enabling Germany to rid herself cheaply of her internal debt and apart from putting fantasti profits into the hands of the big fantastic industrialists, will increase Ger-many's competitive capacity

"This again will be followed by a reorientation in Germany's for-

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Steel Predicts eign policy. A more moderate course will be pursued. The attempts to usurp Austria will be To Reich Favor relations which existed between the pre-Nazi Germany and Soviet Russia will be attempted.

"In this connection it is neces sary to remember that during the ten years preceding Hitler's rule a great friendship and close co-operation of the respective General Staffs had developed between the Red Army and the Reichs-wehr. They have always held each other and still hold each other in a mutually high esteem.

"In order to restore some of "In order to restore some or Germany's former prestige and with the hope of convincing world opinion that Germany has not completely reverted to the bar-barism of its ancestors, the new Government will attempt to recon-Government will attempt to recon-cile the churches by restoring their freedom and also permit a relative freedom of the press and the expression of opinions.

"Possibly, also, 30,000 or 40,000 of the less radical prisoners will be released from the concentration camps and the lot of the moderately liberal intellectuals will be made somewhat lighter.

#### Uprising Possible

"While these are the definite aims, objectives and plans of the Hindenburgs (father and worthy son), Von Papen, Schacht, Thys-sen and Reichswehr opposition and, while it is already certain that this group will soon dominate German affairs, there is an eventuality which may seriously impair the plans of this group as well as of those who are now nominally still in power.

"This eventuality is the possi-bility of a violent uprising of the underground united front of the Left, which includes today Com-munists, Socialists and many liberals

One of the pamphlets purports to be an expose of the "Invisible Government," composed exclu-sively of Jews and Gentiles ac-ing under Jewish orders. The ing under Jewish orders. WASHINGTON, June another of his frequent attacks on Jews Representative Louis T. McFadden of Pennsylvania charges an effort to overthrow government of the United States for the establishment of "a form of government other than the Constitutional government."

Claiming that "an increasing number of Jews occupy high key positions in all departments "of the United States government," McFadden by way of contrast says the overthrow of the German government, the United States and the Company of the German government. ernment by the Hitler movement "was caused by the preponderance of Jews in the German govern-

Mentions Dr. Olgin

Representative McFadden's charges are contained in a discussion of Communistic propaganda activities in the United ganda activities in the United States which he had published in the Congressional Record of June 25. He charges that "Russian propaganda is freely circulating in the United States," and gives the impression that Jews are sponsible for its dissemination.

Particular mention is made of Dr. M. J. Despite brutal suppression and staggering penalties imposed for disobedience, the new law has evoked a storm of bitter protest, German workers justly apprais-ing it as a law of complete en-slavement and abrogation of the rights won at such a terrific sac rifice over a period of many gen erations.

At a meeting summoned by the Nazified shop council in the huge Siemens machine works, one of the largest plants of its kind in Germany, workers had the cour-age to demand an open discussion of the labor law from the floor. Unable to regain control of the meeting, the "leaders" hastily ad-journed it. This is but one examnle of reports seening through from all corners of Naziland.

difficulties arisen in a variety of other coordinated sectors of Germany. The result is that during the past week or two, irreproachable authorities, German and otherwise, have deluged public prints with statements on the impending downfall of Hitler. Not a day passes now with-out an economist, a journalist, a student of labor affairs, or some-one equally responsible, making an emphatic prediction of the inevit-able overthrow of Hitlerism.

Of course, opinions differ on what is to succeed the bloody Nazi regime, but there is startling unanimity on the imminence of its

overthrow. Also significant is the resistance developed in the ranks of Germany's unemployed, as contrasted with that of the workers with jobs. Illustrative of the expanding spirit of discontent and rebellion among millions of jobless, is that not a single one of the 18,000 Bremen unemployed stepped forward to answer the call for "volunteers" to camps. Apparently the unemployed prefer their present pathetic status to the blessings of the coordinated camps.

We feel an immense joy in having the oppor-tunity to participate in this work."

## The Human Touch By HARRY SALPETER

WAS sitting in the shade of an old apple tree, or maybe it

private chapel It was all very J. P. Morgan's right behind me. right benind me. It was all very pleasant and I could have re-mained on that bench for hours, reading of the strange fates of the strange and timeless people in the book before me, but as I continued reading I became aware of a knife-like snarl in the pleasant hum of sound, a human snarl, coming from a middle-aged man two persons to the left of me: in fact, the snarl had something of a Nazi accent running through it.

There were words to the snarl and they were addressed to, or at, the man who sat between us, one who did not attempt to keep the conversation going even by saying as little as "Yes" or "No." He maintained an embarrassed smile, as if not to commit himself to agreement and at the same time not to run the risk of showing hostility. But the man who snarled was too full of the virulence of his own ideas to need encourage ment or to be halted by anyone's clination to enter into talk with him.

#### Object of the Snarl

The objective of the snarl, so to speak, was a woman seated on a bench diagonal to ours, a woman bench diagonal to ours, a woman who was talking with good-nat-ured, and maybe offensive, loud-ness about something or other, or songeone or other. She was a large woman, weighing in the neighborhood of two hundred pounds, and she was middle-aged. She was a mother, at least once, for I caught a reference to a daughter. hter. By her appearance, es and manner, she put herself down as poor and vulgar, but, also, she looked like a woman whom it would be difficult to disonce she had made up her like, once she he mind to be liked.

mind to be liked.

It was at her that the thin,
weazened, bitter-tongued man was
angry. They were perfect strangers, but that made no difference gers, but that made no difference in his hostility. He was a re-pressed Nazi, who had to let it out in words, for the present, but who was itching to do something about it. And it wasn't because this woman was Jewish; she was more likely Irish or German. This woman, who had reached the age of consent in many, many things was giving this stranger-man ofwas giving this stranger-man of-fense because—she was smoking a cigarette! He was saying many things which, being directed to a masculine audience, could not be reproduced in a family newsbe reproduced in a family news-paper, but he used one phrase which had a familiar ring. He was saying, word for word: "There ought to be a law!" He meant a to prevent women from smoking, at least in public. And then he went on to rant about fifteenhe went on to rant about fifteen-and sixteen-year-old girls who smoked and who ought to have their faces slapped, not to men-tion a more humiliating part of the anatomy. But that was only the jumping-

off place for his volunteered dis-course, and the absence of "Hear, hear!" neither discomfided nor discouraged him. He pleaded with the government and with High Com-missioner Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope to do everything pos-sible to avoid serious economic sible to avoid serious economic trouble which, he said would "disastrously affect the prosperity now enjoyed by all Palestine."

Lord Melchett ridicules theories that the prosperity of the Holy Land would diminish rapidly and declared that Palestine, being on the eve of its greatest develop-ment needed a larger immigration for the immense work to be done

Lord Harewood asked the gov-ernment to give assurances that the Arabs would not be disposses-sed from the land.

#### Will Carry Out Mandate

Lord Plymouth, Under Secretary for Colonies, who replied for the government, said that the Mac-Donald government intended to carry out the mandate, combining the Passfield declaration with the the Passneld declaration with the MacDonald letter, and had no in-tention of departing from this policy. They bitterly assailed storm troop leaders demanding that the Stahlhelm be dissolved.

Hitler's compromise in and avoid-ance of a "show-down" with the conservatives was believed here tonight to avert, for a while at least, the open alignment of war-ring factions. It is not considered, however, that by his action the Nazi leader has done more than obtain a temporary respite before the inevitable break in the curious consolidation of forces which now permit him to rule.

#### Warns of Civil War

Vernon Bartlett, who recently returned from London, writing in the News Chronicle, warned yes-terday that "next year the German people may be engaged in a civil war."

Describing the latest develop-ments, Bartlett declared that the Garman crisis has commenced but German crisis has commenced but it is unwise to believe that Nazism is collapsing "even though Berlin is full of rumors of a Reichswehr coup d'etat which probably will be attempted within the next few months unless the more extreme Nazis are cleared out."

Vacation for Storm Troopers

Although the Nazi regime pub-liely denies that the brown-shirted storm troop army on which Hitler rode to power is to be disbanded, the troops yesterday were ordered to store their uniforms for a month during a "vacation" and not to wear them except on orders from their superiors.

It has been generally conceded that the storm troop army has not only constituted a difficulty for Germany in her foreign relations but has become a potent menace to the Nazi regime because of the extent to which the troops are under the influence of the Nazi radical leaders. Their commander, radical leaders. Their commander, Captain Ernst Rochm, repeatedly warned the government that dis-solution of the troops, or suspen-sion of the pay of the storm troopers would have serious con-
