A Timely Warning

THE following interesting and timely note comes from Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, vice-president of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League:

"The Jewish press in the last two or three weeks been filled with over-optimism about the imminent collapse of the Hitler regime. I wish it were so. But I am afraid that in this case the wish is father to the thought. A cool survey must lead one to the conclusion that while the Nazi regime is in serious difficulties it does not face immediate collapse. It has still considerable financial resources to draw upon and while there may be considerable criticism or grumblings within Germany, it has such a complete stranglehold upon the situation that its grip will not be readily broken.

"The headlines the Jewish people may be lulled into a false sense of optimism and relax their intensive boycott activities. That would be disastrous. The executive officers of the boycott are just now beginning to tell forcibly. If the boycott could be intensified throughout the world in the next six months the force of resistance against Hitlerism in Germany will be strengthened and the doom of Hitlerism may be sealed. At the present moment the battle is far from being won. There has been absolutely no change in the official Nazi attitude toward the Jewish community.

"Several days I stated editorially that, while the handwriting on the wall is unmistakable and that all symptoms point to the approaching downfall of Hitler, all efforts to resist the Hitler menace morally and economically must be continued, in order that Hitlerism may be delayed.

"The Jews everywhere, as well as right-thinking and liberty-loving non-Jews, welcome the heartening news and the encouragement of Nazi disintegration and the nearing Hitler breakdown. But there must be no relaxation in the efforts to isolate the Nazi regime, free the world from the Hitler scourge.

"Those who advocated the economic boycott against Nazi Germany have been so busy in their denunciations of the anti-Jewish boycott in Germany and against the other outrageous crimes perpetrated by the Nazi regime against civilization, that they have lost sight of their judgment. And now Germany is beginning to realize that the economic anti-German boycott has thus far produced such a devastating effect upon the economic situation of Germany not merely because the Jews had organized and carried on its boycott. The boycott has been successful because other nations, particularly those that understand the gravity of the Hitler regime, have joined in it."

Untermyer Says College Is Disgraced by the Presence of 'Putzy'

PHILADELPHIA, June 27.—After launching a savage attack on Ernest F. S. "Putzy" Hanfstaengl as "a gin-worshipping, official Jew-baiting, propaganda apostle of race hatred and bigotry" who is now abusing his privileges as a guest of this country, Samuel Untermyer, president of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League, delivered a report on the effectiveness of the anti-Nazi boycott in an address here this evening at the Metropolitan Opera House.

The speech was delivered under the joint auspices of the Pennsylvania State Federation of Labor, Central Labor Union, American Legion, World War Veterans, and other civic bodies. The speech was broadcast over a national network of the Columbia Broadcasting System.

Says 'Putzy' Used Whip on Marxists

Writer Describes Trip With Hitler and Seeing Aids

BALTIMORE, June 27.—How Ernest F. S. Hanfstaengl, now at Harvard, used a whip in German "Marxist" waters, was told by S. Miles Bouton, newspaper correspondent, in a lecture delivered before 1,600 persons in the Mount Vernon Place Methodist Episcopal Church here last night.

Describing a three-day trip he made with Hitler about a year ago, the writer declared: "There were a large number of storm-politicians with us, the Jews armed with huge, black, snake-like whips."

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Quiz Occult Pelley On 'Shirt' Bankruptcy

ASHFORD, N. C., June 27.—William Dudley Pelley, occult communicant with the supernatural and leader of the Silver Shirts, went into communication with government authorities today on a more pressing matter than the moral and political destiny of the country.

The leader of the anti-Semitic and anti-administration organization was called to account for the bankruptcy of his business by George Gregh, who is serving as referee. Pelley has been examined frequently since his return to Asheville to determine whether he is fit to be a Legion and the Foundation for Christian Economics should be brought under a receiver as in the case of George Gregh Press, all of Pelley's interests.

A decision is expected Saturday when hearings will be resumed.

Reading Warns Labor Shortage Hurts Palestine

Acrid Debate on Policy Follows Query in House of Lords

LONDON, June 27.—A vigorous debate on British policy in Palestine was precipitated today in the House of Lords when Lord Templeton, who is outspokenly pro-Arab, asked if the government was prepared to follow the declaration on Arab national rights made by Lord Passfield when the latter was Colonial Secretary in the MacDonald Labor cabinet.

Lord Snell, Laborite, who declared that he was speaking for himself and not officially for the Labor party, stated that he had the highest regard for the Arabs, but said that they had no real grievance as Lord Templeton suggested.

Hitler Calls Off Stanheim Fight

Stop Boycott, No Dissolution Of Monarchist Troop, He Says

Labor Heads Arrested; Fuehrer Acts to Avert Showdown as Vets Defy Attackers

WARSAW, June 27.—A heated dispute over continuation of the boycott of Nazi Germany in Poland and unexpectedly cropped up today when the Polish chamber of commerce summoned all chairmen of trades guilds to a conference here today and announced to them that the time had come to cease the boycott.

The chairman of the Jewish guilds, speaking for their membership, replied categorically that "no force in the world will coerce us to desert the boycott ranks representing all the Jews of the Polish Republic."

As reports of arrests of leaders of the Bund, Jewish Socialist party, continued to reach Warsaw from provincial centers, National Radical gangs resumed their attacks on the Jews in many villages.

The Nara mobs in the village of Sarnaki, after repeated assaults on Jews, smashing windows and destroying property, related police efforts to restore order. Police finally were compelled to fire shots over the heads of the rioters to subvert them. A number of arrests were made.

In the neighboring village of Kranica Nara-inspired mobs of peasants forced the Jewish population to flee in mad haste, leaving all their possessions. One of the Jewish families thus ousted had resided in the village for over fifty years.

According to reports from Polish provincial centers received by the Bundist organ, Folkzeitung, a series of arrests and subsequent releases of Jewish Bundist leaders have been carried out by Polish authorities.

In Pinsk former Alderman Schickman was arrested; in Domaczewa, Pesach Veritvitzky, president of the local Bundist group, was apprehended; in Pruzany, Freuszman, secretary of the Bundist group, was arrested.

LONDON, June 27.—Chancellor Adolf Hitler acted today to avert precipitating the crisis expected in the German situation by calling off Nazi storm troops attacks on the conservative, monarchistic Steel Helmet organization which, inspired by the von Papen Marburg speech and subsequent expressions of hostility to the Nazi regime, had openly leaned on the side of the conservative opponents of the radical Nazi wing.

Hitler's assured Minister of Labor, Heinrich Brüning, who delivered the Stahlhelm to Hitler's leadership when he joined the Hitler cabinet, that the organization would not be dissolved but would be permitted to continue as part of the National Socialist structure. The Stahlhelm, technically, has been incorporated in the storm troop army, but actually for the most part has remained distinctly apart and more or less hostile to Nazi command.

Hitler's assurances to Brüning came only after the Stahlhelm had openly defied the Nazi leaders, whose sentiments were expressed yesterday in the Volkischer Beobachter, Hitler's own newspaper. The paper denounced the Stahlhelm as traitors to the Nazi movement and described the stabling affray in Pomerania.

Warn Stavsky Plea Is Court Contempt

Palestine Chief Rabbis Cautioned by Official at Jerusalem

JERUSALEM, June 27.—Chief Rabbis of Palestine were today being taken the line in the world-wide appeal in behalf of Abraham Stavsky, now under sentence of death in the Arkosev murder case, were warned today that their appeal involves contempt of court "with all its consequences."

The warning was given today by the Jerusalem District Commissioner, J. B. F. Campbell, who invited the two rabbis to a conference.

Rep. McFadden Waves Red Flag In Renewed Attacks on Jews

Blames Former 'Semite Regime' in Germany for Hitler Rise

WASHINGTON, June 27.—In another of his frequent attacks on the Jews Representative Louis T. McFadden of Pennsylvania charges an effort to overthrow the government of the United States for the establishment of "a form of government other than the Constitutional government."

Claiming that "an increasing number of Jews occupy high key positions in all departments of the United States," McFadden says by way of contrast says the overthrow of the German government by the Hitler movement "was caused by the preponderance of Jews in the German government."

Mentions Dr. Olgin
Representative McFadden's charges are contained in a discussion of Communist propaganda activities in the United States which he had published in the Congressional Record on June 25. He charges that "Russian propaganda is freely circulating in the United States," and gives the impression that Jews are responsible for its dissemination.

Particular mention is made of Dr. M. J. Olgin, whom Representative McFadden terms a "Russian-born Jew, who has a long history of revolutionary activities in the United States." McFadden quotes freely from a recent booklet entitled "Why Communism," written recently by Dr. Olgin. This booklet, McFadden says, is a document, only one of many now being freely circulated in the United States, which violates the agreement entered into by the Russian Ambassador, Maxim Litvinoff, and President Franklin D. Roosevelt, as evidenced by the treaty which was used as the basis to secure ratification by the United States of the Soviet Russian Government."

Cites OGPU in 1930
Pointing out that there is a "preponderance of Jews in the Russian government," McFadden says, "Students of radicalism know that the present Soviet government is controlled by the hands of aliens and usurpers and not representatives of the thoughts and ideals of the 150,000,000 citizens of Russia." He also points out that "the controlling body OGPU in 1930 in Russia" consisted of two Georgians, one Pole, one Russian, two Russian Jews, and one Polish Jew. In 1934, he said, the Soviet government was composed of 555 persons, of which 469 were Jews.

"Note the preponderance of Jews in the Russian government," McFadden says. "It is significant to note," he continues, "that the recent overthrow of the German government by the Hitler movement was caused by the preponderance of Jews in the German government, in the universities, lawyers, as physicians, as bankers, complete domination of all exchanges, in commerce, in the theatre, moving picture industry, in politics. And now in the present United States government it is significant that an increasing number of Jews occupy high key positions in all departments."

Compares Russia, U. S.
McFadden continues: "I want to remind loyal Americans that it is important to remember the burning, from within tactics pursued by these alien usurpers who pursued tactics in Soviet Russia which have been the kind of alien usurpation and set up the present Communist-Jewish control government which is now in operation in Russia, and to point out that the same kind of alien usurpation is now at work in the United States to establish a form

of government other than the constitutional government, and in order to do this they are seeking to paralyze industry, to destroy patriotism, and, finally, to secure the overthrow of government itself in the United States."

Mr. Greenfield is survived by his widow, Rose; a brother, Sam; his sister, Esther Kohn, and five sons.

Mayor Extends City's Greetings To Rothschild

Quiet Ceremony Marks Key Bestowal as Notables Watch

Baron Maurice de Rothschild, French Senator for the Department of Haute Alps and member of an internationally renowned and powerful family, who has been in New York City since last Friday, was yesterday officially received by Mayor LaGuardia at City Hall.

In a ceremony of the fanfare there were similar occasions in the Walker-Whelan days, just as rich in flow of complimentary language, the Mayor bestowed upon the Baron the freedom of the city.

The tall, distinguished visitor from France, who came to New York after paying his respects to official Washington, was accompanied by the French Consul General Ch. de Ferry de Fontaineau, Congressman Samuel Dickstein and attaches of the French consulate. The party was received in the Mayor's office, where greetings were extended both by the Mayor and Aldermanic President Bernard S. Deutsch.

Mayor Expresses Delight

In the key-bestowal ceremonies, which were held in the main reception room, the Mayor expressed his deep pleasure at the privilege of welcoming "so distinguished a son of France."

"I hope that the city," the Mayor said, "may some day have the opportunity of making you one of its own."

The Baron in expressing his gratitude for the "honors bestowed upon me," paid high tribute to both President Roosevelt and the Mayor himself. He declared that Roosevelt was "perhaps the greatest President since Washington and Lincoln." In praising the Mayor, the Baron revealed himself cognizant of the city's financial dilemma, by complimenting him

upon "the wonderful results accomplished by your administration in restoring the financial credit of the city."

After the ceremonies, the party posed for photographers. The Baron refused the request of reporters to amplify his remarks made in Washington recently on the brutality of the Nazi regime and its early doom. He promised a formal interview for ten-thirty o'clock this morning at his apartment in the Waldorf-Astoria.

CHICAGO, June 27.—A vigorous pace has been set by the Chicago Committee for the Defense of Human Rights against Nazism in organizing boycott activity among non-Jews in many communities of the Middle West.

Dr. James M. Yard, secretary, addressed "letters of challenge" to this work and emphasized the fact that the many Protestant church groups of this country have an opportunity to succeed in exerting the final pressure "which will force Germany through the use of this powerful economic lever to change the governmental attitude toward minority groups."

Pastors to Get Letter
Through the efforts of the organization every Christian pastor in the United States will receive a copy of the now well-known letter, "Nazism, a Vital Challenge to Us," written by Dr. Paul M. Hutchinson, managing editor of the Christian Century, who is president of the Chicago Committee.

30,000 Copies to be Mailed
Some 30,000 copies of this appeal to non-Jews to take active part in the boycott against Nazi-made goods in order to preserve their own religious freedom are being placed in the mails for distribution in this country and Canada.

Dr. Yard himself is distributing the pamphlet is undoubtedly the high point to date in the boycott activities of the Chicago Committee for the Defense of Human Rights against Nazism in Oak Park and neighboring communities active groups of non-Jews are working with the committee.

Youth Campaign
Among recent accomplishments of the Chicago Committee are an active campaign of the Protestant youth group, contact with more than 500 stores concerning the decision to purchase Nazi-made goods, organization of a women's division and a Negro group.

There is no intention to slacken efforts, Dr. Yard announced, "until the Nazi crisis has turned out the Nazis."

Lecturer Sees Trade as Key To Hitler Fall

Survival Dependent on Party Enthusiasm Also, He Says

(Special to the J.D.B.)
EVANSTON, Ill., June 27.—"The survival of the Hitler regime depends seemingly on the answer to the conundrum, how long can party enthusiasm withstand economic forces?" declared Clarence E. Pickett, section chief of the federal substance nonsectarian division who is here as lecturer and leader of the Mid-West Institute of International Relations, which opened at the Harris Hall of Northwestern University.

Just back from Europe, in his capacity of executive secretary of the American Friends Service Committee, which is aiding 8,000 non-Fascist families in Austria and some 2,000 refugees in France, Mr. Pickett said:

"I did not find one German of any party who thought Hitler would not remain in power for some time to come. The Nazis are enthusiastic and their opponents discouraged. Some important foreign observers in Germany, however, give Hitler only seven months."

As for the boycott, it "has been felt, but is only part of the Nazis' troubles; foreign tariffs, the loss of an important customer in Russia, governmental spending far beyond income and credit and the control of governmental responsibilities on loyal party men who don't know much about running a government have piled up financial difficulties."

Bohemian Girl Goes Modern

The 1934 theatrical season will go down in history as "The Year of Revivals." Gilbert & Sullivan, Victor Herbert and Oscar Straus were but three of the oldtimers whose works were resurrected for Broadway presentation. In addition, there was a series of revivals of musical comedies of the past ten years and now, as the last theatrical offering until August first, when the new season commences, Dillard Ostrov offers at the Lyric Theatre a modernized version of Balfe's light opera, "The Bohemian Girl," under the title of "Gypsy Blonde."

Unlike other revivals which were merely new productions of old favorites, "The Bohemian Girl" has become "Gypsy Blonde," and although most of the original tunes, such as "I Dream I Dwell in Marble Halls" and "You'll Remember Me" have been retained, new melodies, new lyrics and a different book have been written. Balfe's version Baron Arline was a foreign nobleman whose daughter Arline had been kidnapped by gypsies many years before an American millionaire with a flashy Westchester home and his daughter is portrayed as a headstrong flapper who runs off with a gypsy band with no other thought than having a good time and being with her lover, who turns out to be an escaped convict who had been mixed in some police case. You also give me to understand that Arline was fleeing from the attentions of her fiancé, a typical musical comedy Englishman.

If you are one of those persons hopelessly enamored of the original edition you will find the proceedings at the Lyric very queer indeed, especially when the strains of Balfe's music reach your ears. In a scantily-dressed chorus bounces out on the stage and begins the gyrations that accompany a tune

of that type. Another element of strangeness is the use of words and phrases in the dialogue which are pertinent only to current happenings. If you can forget your memories of "The Bohemian Girl" this present version is not without its merits. Belle Dildah does several solo dances that are thoroughly enjoyable, the chorus sings and dances well, and although George Trabert as the lover does not take his work too seriously and is inclined to smile a bit, he has a pleasant voice and is personable. Isaac Henderson, as Arline, plays and sings her role with confidence and some skill, but she too does not get into the spirit of the thing. Her rendition of some numbers reminds one of a cabaret singer who was told she had a grand opera voice.

"Gypsy Blonde" is a motion picture producer's idea of how to make "The Bohemian Girl" palatable for mass consumption.

Regulations of a convict colony for life sound like a cheery New Chapter in comparison with Hitler's National Labor Law. No wonder labor in America and the world over is up in arms against Nazism.

Despite brutal suppression and staggering penalties imposed for disobedience, the new law has evoked a storm of bitter protest. German workers justly appraise it as a law of complete enslavement and abrogation of the rights won at such a terrific sacrifice over a period of many generations.

At a meeting summoned by the Naziized shop council in the huge Siemens machine works, one of the largest plants of its kind in Germany, workers had the courage to demand an open discussion of the labor law from the floor. Unable to regain control of the meeting, the "leaders" hastily adjourned it. This but one example of reports seeping through from all corners of Naziiland.

Analogous difficulties have arisen in a variety of other coordinated sectors of Germany. The result is that during the past week or two, irreproachable authorities, German and otherwise, have demanded public private with statements on the impending downfall of Hitler. Not a day passes now without an economist, a journalist, a student of labor affairs, or someone equally responsible, making an emphatic prediction of the inevitable overthrow of Hitlerism.

Of course, opinions differ on as to how the bloody Nazi regime, but there is startling unanimity on the imminence of its overthrow.

Also significant is the resistance developed in the ranks of Germany's unemployed, as contrasted with that of the workers with jobs. Illustrative of the expanding spirit of discontent and rebellion among millions of jobless is the not single one of the 18,000 Bremen unemployed stepped forward to answer the call for "volunteers" to enroll in the Agricultural Labor Camp. Apparently they unemployed prefer their present pathetic status to the blessings of the coordinated camps.

These camps, incidentally, are one of the methods of the Fascist

Soviet Praised For Liberalism Toward Jews

American Jewish Aggro-Joint Says Russia Is Helping Them

(U.S.A. Special Correspondence)
MOSCOW, May 28.—The directorate and personnel of the American Jewish Aggro-Joint which has been working in the Soviet during the past twelve years in agricultural and artistic development, has issued a statement in the press hailing the government's stand on the Jewish question.

"The Soviet government," says the statement, "is giving effect not only to the de jure but also to the de facto equality of the Jews in law, economic life, culture, etc. Almost the entire Jewish population, approximately 80 per cent of it, has been brought into productive work. Hundreds of thousands of Jews are working in the factories and works, about a quarter of a million Jews are engaged in agriculture and branches.

"Working for twelve years in the field of settlement, the Aggro-Joint is in a position to observe at close quarters the attention given by the Soviet authorities to the migration of the Jews, the large tracts of land and funds allocated by the government for migration work, the credits, inventory, exemptions, and privileges granted them, etc.

"The measures taken by the Soviet government for the economic and cultural revival of the Jewish population evoke great sympathy on the part of the Jewish and non-Jewish circles also beyond the Russian border. We feel an immense joy in having the opportunity to participate in this work."

Non-Jewish Fur Record Bars Advertisements From German Firms

(U.S.A. Special Correspondence)
LONDON, June 15.—Owned by non-Jews and managed by a Zolofman, W. F. Purvis, the Fur Record has issued an announcement of its refusal to accept German advertisements "until the German government agrees to treat British Jewish representatives with courtesy."

The action of this publication, which has a strong position in Germany, follows the refusal of the German embassy to receive a group of Britishers who called to voice protest against the "ritual murder" stories issued in Germany.

Mixed Palestine Parliament Seen As Blow to Jews in Holy Land

(U.S.A. Special Correspondence)
JERUSALEM, June 10.—The High Commissioner of Palestine, Sir Herbert Peel, is inclined to establish the much-talked-of Legislative Council (Mixed Parliament for Palestine), even though the Jews should refuse to take part in such a council, it is learned here on good authority.

The High Commissioner is understood to be of the opinion that in the end the Jews will participate in the parliament. Cohen and not they would like to. The disinclination of the Jewish population to endorse the council, which will probably be proclaimed immediately after the country-wide municipal elections have been completed,

is based on the fear that the council may serve the government as a means of evading certain of the conditions of the Palestine mandate.

The distribution of Jewish and Arab votes and seats in the council is not yet known. It appears, however, that the combined English and Arab votes will outweigh the Jewish, so that with Arab support laws unfavorable to Jewish interests might be put through.

Moreover, the existence of the council will raise the possibility of any appeal to the League of Nations, since the English government will no longer be the agent chiefly responsible for the passage of laws.

Nazis Destroy Family Life, Says, Refugee

Anti-Nazi Body Hears Hans Baer Tell of Brutalities

How German Fascism is breaking up the family through arrests, murders, concentration camps and other means, was traced by Hans Baer, speaker at last night's delegates' convention of the Anti-Nazi Federation of New York, at the New School for Social Research, last Twelfth street.

Treatment of victims in concentration camps, with attendant tortures and persecution, according to various classifications, was also described by Baer. The speaker emphasized the absolute suppression of all freedom, particularly that of speech.

Pauline Rogers, secretary, in connection with her report to some 500 delegates from 370 local organizations, declared that with the developing breakdown of the Nazi regime it is important to intensify efforts to aid the German masses in overthrowing Hitlerism. She particularly urged further political struggle against "Nazi ideological campaign."

Political prisoners and the newly-established People's Court in Germany were discussed from the lawyer's point of view by Dr. Kurt Rosenfeld, former Minister of Justice for Prussia. Mrs. Anabel Ellis, British-Journalist, spoke of the status of women in Nazi Germany. Frank Wedel presided.

The Hitler system cannot last, he held, "not only because of Germany's tottering economic structure, but because the masses want the most rabid Nazis are beginning to weaken in their beliefs."

"An honest election today would give the Nazi government only about forty per cent of the vote. The Nazis now are holding their position only by terrorism and ignorance."

Plans for Distribution Of Palestinian Wine Are Announced Here

In response to a large demand throughout the country, Jacques Shapiro, manager of the Wine Growers Cooperative of Palestine, yesterday announced plans have been completed for the distribution and sale of Palestine wine in America on an elaborate scale. Mr. Shapiro, who recently left for Europe after a visit of two weeks in the United States, represents the interests of Baron Rothschild, who has been actively instrumental in developing the wine industry in the Holy Land.

Distribution in America will be under the supervision of Harry Mottman, executive vice-president of the Distillers and Brewers Corporation of America.

Among those who cooperated in the distribution of Palestine wine were Robert Soid, Nathan Straus, Jr., Israel B. Brodie, Morris Rothberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America.

The world's statistics concluded that the Jews were a nation which should be united in Palestine, going there by right and not by suzerainty, Lord Snell declared, meaning that it was incorrect to say that the Arab economic position was bad, since it had improved immeasurably since the Jewish invasion. Lord Snell said, had enriched and not impoverished the Palestinian Arabs, who were better off than all the other peoples of the world.

If it had not been for the Zionists, Lord Snell concluded, the position of the Arabs during the depression would have been desperate.

The Marquis of Reading, noted Anglo-Jewish statesman, who followed Lord Snell, pointed out that the shortage of labor in Palestine was causing serious economic disturbances and affecting both Jews and Arabs. He pleaded with the government and with High Commissioner MacDonald to do everything possible to avoid serious economic trouble which, he said would "disastrously affect the prosperity now enjoyed by all Palestine."

Lord Melchett ridiculed theories that the prosperity of the Holy Land would diminish rapidly and demand an enormous expenditure of the eve of its greatest development needed a large immigration for the immense work to be done there.

Lord Harwood asked the government to give assurances that the Arabs would not be disposed of from the land.

Lord Plymouth, Under Secretary for Colonies, who replied for the government, said that the MacDonald government intended to carry out an enormous legislative council. He said, however, that the government intended to proceed along carefully worked out lines, and that the matter was before the High Commissioner and with representatives of all the Palestinian groups.

At the same time in the House of Commons, Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, Colonial Secretary, was answering Vice Admiral E. A. Taylor, Conservative, who demanded that the government return to Palestine be cut drastically because of unemployment among the Arabs.

Sir Philip informed the House of Commons that there were 14,000 unemployed Arabs in Palestine at the end of April.

spectacle" of the visit of Hans Zerkow to Harvard was labeled "a disgrace to the University and an insult to everyone of thousands of its distinguished Jewish and other graduates." Mr. Untermeyer devoted himself to the correction of certain willful misrepresentations that have been spread broadcast as to the purpose, character and extent of the boy's visit to its dispassionate justification as a purely defensive weapon, and to a recital of its progress and impending ultimate success and what was expected to accomplish in a constructive way.

Boycott Is Effective

Mr. Untermeyer stated that the boycott is proving an effective, peaceful weapon with which to combat the threatening worldwide catastrophe of Hitlerism. "The world must wait," he said, "till its back upon the government that has seized power in a country, which has cut it loose from all the safeguards that advancing civilization has thrown around the civil and religious liberties and the democracy of its people, and has literally thrown it to the wolves."

"If there is any other weapon with which to combat the evil inflicted upon humanity, it would be interesting to know what it is. Common justice and a constructive spirit alike demand that when civilization is given up, some alternative be offered. I have heard none suggested."

Attacks the Cowardly

The speaker then launched an attack against the "well meaning timid, and if I may say so, cowardly, do-nothing leadership of a small section of our own people who have shown themselves to be the cause of this vicious, anti-Jewish, race-hatred. The crisis is so acute that we owe it to this great cause to speak out, even at the cost of offending a handful of self-righteous, self-righteous, and with the aid but in spite of them."

"It is fortunate for the cause of humanity that the great rank and file of the Jewish people and the great rank and file of the German people refused to be influenced by them and have disregarded their short-sighted counsel of despair."

A Defensive Measure

After stating that the boycott is a "purely defensive measure" against the boycott of terror instituted by the Hitler regime, he stated that the boycott is a defensive measure which that authority these officials hold back their open and active support of the boycott, when they must at last realize, however blind they may be, that the boycott is only a remedy, that the instinct of their brethren has been true and that 99 per cent of those whom they pretend to represent, but grossly neglect, are in favor of the boycott, and when they themselves—very mother's son of them—are practicing it."

German Will Fail

Claiming credit for the boycott as an agency in the creation of the present German crisis, Mr. Untermeyer predicted the fall of the Hitler regime.

"Thundering fists on desks and fantastic predictions for foreign propaganda consumption of what is going to happen in Germany for 1934, and the coming year, would change the inevitable laws of justice and retribution. Germany is not any longer going to be deprived of the freedom and democratic government which it has enjoyed or be enslaved under the iron heel of despotism to 1,000 years or 1,000 days. Hitler is not the first who blundered, while Rome was burning." Nor is he the first humpty dumpty who had a great fall."

which a Nazi storm trooper allegedly was stabbed by a Stahlhelm leader as "a stab in the back."

Emblazoned by the ordered dissolution of the Stahlhelm organization in the Arnberg district, the Steel Helmet leaders today reminded the Nazis that the continuance of the organization has been guaranteed by an agreement bearing the names of President von Hindenburg, Hitler, Selts and Captain Roehm, storm troop chief. They bitterly assailed storm troop leaders demanding that the Stahlhelm be dissolved.

Hitler Calls Off Stahlhelm Fight

Hitler's compromise in and avoidance of the issue of the conservatives was believed here tonight to avert, for a while at least, the open alignment of warring factions. It is considered, however, that by his action the Nazi leader has done more than obtain a temporary respite before the inevitable break in the curious coalition of forces which now permit him to rule.

Warns of Civil War

Vernon Bartlett, who recently returned from London, writing in the News Chronicle, warned yesterday that "next year the German people may be engaged in a civil war."

Describing the latest developments, Bartlett declared that the German crisis has commenced but it is unwise to believe that Nazism is collapsing "even though Berlin is full of rumors of a Reichswehr coup d'etat, which probably will be attempted within the next few months unless the more extreme Nazis are cleared out."

Vacation for Storm Troopers

Although the Nazi regime publicly denies that the brown-shirted storm troop army on which Hitler rode to power is to be disbanded, the troops yesterday were ordered to store their uniforms for a month during a "vacation" and not to wear them except on orders from their superiors.

It has been generally conceded that the storm troop army has not only constituted a difficulty for Germany in her foreign relations but has become a problem to the Nazi regime because of the extent to which the troops are under the influence of the Nazi radical leaders. Their continued existence is a problem to the government, that the dissolution of the troops, or suspension of the pay of the storm troops would have serious consequences.

Labor Palestine Leader Urges Youth to Join

Rabbi Warns National Convention Against Scattered Work

(Special to the J.D.B.)

CHICAGO, June 27.—To avoid the scattering of energies, as well as the waste of time in grilling the values of ballyhoo and much thunder and too little light, was the counsel of Rabbi Samuel Wohl, national president of the League for Labor Palestine, who tonight addressed the convention of the National Council of the Poale Zion-Zionist League here.

He urged the youth to the work of the party as he observed it in Palestine and in this country, Rabbi Wohl declared: "It has been my feeling that one of the weaknesses of the party has been the scattering of its energies on so many fronts. The financial strength behind the party is, with some naturally and temperamentally incapable of effective work, the few are too often loaded with too much work."

Sees Need for New Blood

"If you will stop for a moment and enumerate the agencies, the institutions, the organizations, to which the party debts, you yourselves will be astounded. It is but natural that over a period of years many active workers become tired and weary and when the party not augmented by new power in its leadership and its constituency, I fear that results and activities tend to decrease. It would be well to consider the need and the necessity of bringing in men and women who intellectually and emotionally are ready to give of themselves in a selfless and earnest and interest, but who have not had the experience of your veterans."

He said it is of utmost importance for the future of the Histadruth and of Palestine to bring into the party the most courageous and energetic of our youth from the universities and the shops and the offices, though they can be reached only through the medium of the English language.

"Purge the Party of the Weak." "I know that the party cannot and perhaps ought not become too large and unwieldy. Perhaps even the party must be purged of those for it is my belief that the party ought to consist of men and women disciplined, vigorous, and loyal."

After referring to the recent New York conference, and characterizing it as "eventful and intelligent," Rabbi Wohl declared: "We shall insist to work modestly, but effectively. We shall try by campaigns. We shall try to bring knowledge and information to the masses of the Jewish and conscious membership."

Chicago Convention

CHICAGO, June 27.—The entire membership of the Chicago Division of the American Jewish Congress, which was held at a meeting on July 2 at the Covenant Club. Reports will be rendered and plans for summer work will be discussed.

Louis Segal, of New York City, executive secretary of the Jewish National Workers Alliance, will be in charge of gathering in Chicago for the convention with the Poale-Zion convention, and the American Jewish Congress will use the opportunity to establish connections with the Palestine Committee. F. Purvin will preside at the evening July 2 meeting.

Does Work Suspended
