Chief Rabbi Kook

Governor Campbell of Jer-usalem warned Chief Rabbis Kook and Meir for making an appeal in behalf of Abraham appeal in behalf of Abraham Stavsky, sentenced to death in the Arlosoroff murder case. The Governor notified the Rabbis that their appeals involved contempt of court "with all its consequences.

Chief Rabbi Kook explained that he had no intention of re-flecting on the court that sen-tenced Stavsky, but that he was appealing for a new trial for an innocent man who was condemned to death.

Chief Rabbi Kook's plea to the Archbishop of Canterbury reads as follows:

"Ahraham Stavsky, who is in-"Abraham Stavsky, who is in-nocent, was sentenced to death. I beg you to exert all your ef-forts for the sake of the sanc-tity of truth and justice and the honor of England which is very dear to me."

JERUSALEM, June 28.—Serious anti-Jewish legislation may be ex-pected in Palestine in the near future, reports reaching the Arab Executive from London declare.
According to the reports a legis-According to the reports a legis-lative assembly for Palestine is to be proclaimed shortly, despite the bitter opposition of the Jews, and immigration and purchase of land by Jews are to be sharply curtailed.

A sensational feature of the re ports is an alleged statement said to have been made to Emir Ab-dullah of Transjordania who is at present visiting London, by the Pritish Colonial Office that strict laws would soon be introduced in Palestine in regard to Jewish immigration and the sale of land to Jews. Over Austria False Reports

Nazis Believed Behind Americans Asked Not to Blasts as Barthou Is Endangered

VIENNA, June 28.—A series of
bomb explosions which caused
considerable damage and killed a policeman broke out in Austria to-Government officials claimed day. Government officials claimed that Austrian Nazis were bent upon destruction. A rumor persisted that the life of Louis Barthou, French Foreign Minister, who had been on a journey through Eastern Europe, was sought.

The explosion caused suspension of railway traffic at Voecklabruck, or railway train; at Voechiabruck, upper Austria, at Judenburg and at Bruck, in Styria, and at several places in the Tyrol. Headquarters of the Catholic League at Inns-bruck and the salt works at Muchlau were bombed.

He has suppressed Nara attacks on Jews ruthlessly. As mayor of Warsaw he issued an appeal to the population asking them not to be misled by Nara propaganda.

He is regarded as a staunch supporter of Marshal Pilsudski.

Married to Jewess

The new Minister of the Interior is married to a Jewish woman, the former Regina Wollach of Bialystok, the daughter of a Jewish druggist. When his father-in-law died in 1931, and was to be buried in the Warsaw cemetery, Koscial-

Rabbi Cautions Misunderstood Over Youth to Avoid Mob Hysteria

Must Think Through Problems, Newman **Tells Graduates**

"American youth must avoid surrendering to mob hysteria," said Rabbi Louis I. Newman of Temple Rodeph Sholom, speaking at the graduation exercises of the Thomas Jefferson High School at the Brooklyn Academy of Music

yesterday. "The young men of Europe have shown themselves in the past to be mere 'canon fodder' or gullible tools in the hands of selfish con-spirators against the common good. American youth must think through the problems of economic, social and political readjustment. They must not become the victims of catch-phrases; they must not adopt absurd panaceas; they must not be diverted by the preachment of racial hate: they must not be notized by agitators and propa-

"They must instead bring to bear the best intelligence of which they are capable in the endeavor to are capable in the endeavor to solve the vexing problems of con-temporary American life. They must find inspiration in the con-tributions of the Brain Trust' to a new technique wherewith meet America's difficulties. T must so discipline and fortify themselves that they will be prepared when the summons comes to them for enlistment in the battalions of recovery.

"The danger in America is that the present Brain Trust' will ex-haust its originality of thought and policy. Fresh recruits must then step forward to shoulder responsibility. Just because young people are young does not make them infallible. The chief virtue of youth is optimism, but this can be speedily replaced by despair if problems prove too complex. The world in which young people are rising to maturity is vastly more taxing and unfriendly than here tofore; it behooves them, there-fore, to train themselves so thoroughly and effectively that in the struggle for the prizes of life, in the accentuated competition of the times, the same rewards may go to excellence that excellence has won in the past."

Oldest Practicing Lawyer in City Dies of Pneumonia at Age of 78

Sidney Tedesche Union Temple and Rabbi Simon R. Cohen, rabbi emeritus of Union Temple, will officiate at the funeral services this afternoon for Michael Furst, former president of the Brooklyn Bar Association, at the Temple, 17 Eastern parkway.

Mr. Furst, credited with being the oldest practicing lawyer in New York, died of pneumonia at his home, 115 Prosp ect Park west at the age of seventy-eight. Born in Brooklyn of Germa

Doctor Cyrus Adler, president of the Jewish Theological Semin-ary of America, announces that with the assistance of the Emergency Committee in, Aid of Dis-placed German Scholars and the Rockefeller Foundation, the sem-inary has been enabled to invite inary has been enabled to invite two eminent German scholars as visiting professors for the coming year. They are Professor Julius Lewy, formerly of the University of Glessen, and Dr. Alexander Sperber, formerly of the Univer-sity of Bonn.

Professor Lewy has been invited by the Johns Hopkins University to lecture there for the first half of the academic year 1934-35 and will come to the seminary for the second semester. He is a foremost second semester. He is a foremost, Assyriologist. His lectures at the seminary will concern themselves with the archaeological back-ground of the Bible.

Dr. A. Sperber is a leading au thority on Bible versions, especial-ly the Septuagint and the Targum, on which he worked with Professor Kahle of Bonn. He will lecture at the seminary during the first semester of 1934-1935, and at Dropsic College during the second ester

Lawyers Club Of Federation

Brooklyn Attorney Succeeds H. S. Bacharach -Was Born in Canada

Murry C. Becker is the new president of the Lawyers Club of the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities, succeeding Herman S. Bachrach, who has resigned, it was announced last night at Federation headquarters, 94 Clinton street,

Mr. Bachrach, who was elected last December for his fifth con-secutive term, had hoped to com-plete the year, but the pressure of plete the year, but the pressure of other affairs intervened, and "it was therefore necessary that I re-linquish the Lawyers Club presi-dency, as much as I regretted do-ing so," he said.

Mr. Becker has been affiliated with the Lawyers Club since its organization in 1926 and for the past year has served as first vice-president,

Mr. Becker was born at Ham-ton, Ontario, in 1895. He was educated in Brooklyn public schools and at New York University, receiving his LL. B. in 1916. He is assistant treasurer of the Brook-Ivn Federation of Jewish Charities and a director of the Brooklyn Y. M. H. A., a Federation affiliate. He is a member of the American ar Association and the New York County Lawyers Association. He was social director of the Williamsburg Y. M. H. A., another Federation constituent, from 1913 to 1916. His home is at Lawrence, L. I.

The Lawyers Club is one of the most important organizations in the Federation and has a membership of approximately 1,000. The club last year raised nearly \$40,000 in the Federation campaign, and is expected to obtain an equal amount in the present twenty-fifth anniversary drive, \$25,000 having been secured already.

"In Vienna I learned on the highest authority that the Jewish community was forced to pay \$40,000 to the Heimwehr upon threat of violence," he related

"In France there are 40,000 Jewish refugees from the Hitler regime, half of whom France is now trying to deport because there is no work for these pitiful people without a country."

Polish Jews, Silver said, "are taxed to death," but the govern-ment is not anti-Semitic. In Austria they can be found in the breadlines by the thousands, he declared.

Becker Heads Heads Lawyers' Drive Nazism Threatens 15,000 Jews In Mexico, Dr. Billikoff Finds

(Special to the J.D.B.)
PHILADELPHIA, June 28.—
Mexico, which contains approximately 15,000 Jews, has not escaped the menace of Hitlerism re-ports Dr. Jacob Billikopf, executive director of the Federation of Jew-ish Charities, who returned last week from a month's stay in that

German propagandists from Ber-German propagandists from Ber-lin are engaged in infecting the country with the virus of Nazism, declares Dr. Billikopf, who finds harmful results already discernible. The Federation director departed

yesterday for Marshall Camp in the Adirondacks to complete his recuperation in preparation for re-suming his work here in September. He left Philadelphia a month ago upon the advice of his physicians, who ordered a complete rest for him. Although he spent most of his time in Mexico in outdoor exercise. he also availed himself of the opportunity of examining the status of Jews in the southern

republic.

Describes Influx Prior to the World War, he points out, there were not more than seventy-five Jewish families in Mexico, most of them from the United States, a few from Australia. Germany and Alsace-Lorraine There also were a handful of Lev-antine Jews, attracted to the country by language ties.

The total number of Jews in the

country has greatly increased since 1914, Dr. Billikopf explained. A heavy influx of East European Jews began in 1921, bringing the total Jewish population up to the present figure, he said. He pointed out that of the 15,000 Jews now in Mexico, from 8,000 to 9,000 reside in the capital.
"Discussing the status of the

"Discussing the status of the Jew in Mexico with a number of leading citizens," he declared, "I find that anywhere from three to five per cent belong to what might be called the proletariat; ten per cent, the white-collar; from forty to fifty per cent, the small dealers' group; fifteen per cent represent installment merchants; twenty per cent, manufacturers, and ten per cent, capitalists.

Control Apparel Trade
"Less than ten per cent are de-pendent on charity. The East European immigrants are virtually in pean immigrants are virtually in control of the entire wearing ap-parel industry, particularly wo-men's wear, hosiery and knit goods. I think I am safe in making the statement that the 13,000 Jews who have settled in Mexico since 1921 are decidedly better off materially than they would have been in the United States.

"During the past year or so there have been some nasty mani-festations on the part of what is known as the Comite pro-Raza y Accion Revolucionaria Mexicanista,

whose members have been spreading vile reports of the Jews and plastering walls and telephone poles with filers containing such comments as, "The Jew is the leper of civilization."

"Undoubtedly these groups have been instigated to such activity by German and other merchants, especially propagandists emanating from Berlin. While there is some anxiety among the newer immigrants, the older settlers do not attach much importance to these outbreaks.

Government Friendly

"When I discussed the matter with the rector of the National University, he assured me that the government was friendly to the Jewish colony; that the activities of the Comite pro-Raza and kindred groups are an expression of commercial resentment on the part of industrialists and storeke who have felt the encroachment by the immigrant Jew. The rector dismissed it as a commercial warfare not abetted by the govern-ment."

Rabbi Stern of Montreal, Enroute to London Parley, Says Tie Caused Many Dominion Catholics to Turn on Jewish Population

The strike of French-Canadian internes in Montreal hospitals as a protest against the appointment Catholic Notre Dame Hospital and the recurrence of "Jews Not Wanted" sentiment at a Toronto su-burb have focused attention on the Jewish situation in Canada.

Stopping over between conven-tions—the Rabbi had just come from the Central Conference Convention in Wernersville and was on his way to Montreal, from where, this Saturday, he will leave for London to attend the sessions of the World Conference for Judaism-Rabbi Stern was only to happy to discuss the background of the Canadian anti-Semitic situation with a reporter for the Jewish Daily Bulletin.

Americans Can't Understand a prelude to all questions the Rabbi informed the reporter that unfortunately, Americans didn't understand the Canadian situaunderstand the Canadian situa-tion, especially, in the province of Quebec, scene of the recent hos-pital furor. He said that efforts to develop good will between Jews their non-Jewish neighbors had developed rapidly and that his personal relations with the Catho-lic episcopacy and the Protestant clergy had been "very friendly." In this respect he pointed to the fact that as the only Jewish member of the E. A., an association of Montreal clergymen, he has for the past three years been chairn of the group.
Differences between the Jew

"Differences between the Jew and his Canadian neighbor," he said, "revolve about a historic condition peculiar to French Can-ada and anti-Semitism today is predicated on an economic basis and on a growing nationalism that has lately arisen that is fearful of the loss of the French language and culture in Quebec.

Explains School System
"This difference," the Rabbi continued, "as most apparent in our school problems. In 1867 when the Canadian Confederacy was ratified, the French Canadians inranned, the French Canadians in-sisted upon the maintainance of their own schools under the di-rection of the Catholic church. The Protestants, the English speaking residents of the province set up another school system. Both systems were supported by

noun systems were supported by government funds.

"At that time, there were few Jews and the educational prob-lem of the group was taken care of by the Shearith Israel Synagogue, a Sephardic congregation.
As the Jewish population devel-As the Jewish population developed, the educational problem grew. The government offered the Jews a separate school but this was rejected by Jewish leaders who feared segregation. It was settled only a few years ago with a pact made with the Protes. with a pact made with the Protestant group that calls for the ed-ucation of Jewish children in their school system for the next fifteen years. There is a free mingling of the children under this arrange ment, no segregation at all as had been the case before the pact was arranged.

Jews and Protestants

Rabbi Stern uses this story to illustrate the fact that the Jews gravitated toward an association with Protestants in the Province of Quebec. The progressiveness of the English and the language made for a more natural inter-course between the Jews and the English Protestants than between the Jews and the French Catho-And this to the background of

present anti-Semitic feeling. For many years the English minority and the French majority fought bitterly; by now they have gr used to each other or at least have become convinced of the futility of open strife. But with the association of Jews with the English minority a wing of the French na tionalists opened warfare against Jewry, which is thus placed in the unfortunate position of being the butt of the nationalists' wrath

In speaking of the latest mamfestation, the internes' strike, Rab-

bi Stern said: "The finer and official element of the French Catholics oppose anti-Semitism. This is proven by the fact that Dr. Rabinovitch was appointed to so important a post in the Notre Dame Hospital. The strike of the internes was un-doubtedly the result of agitation of a group of nationalists. The administration's standing by its appointment is further evidence of a better feeling among Catholic officialdom, both of the church and province.

Papers Favorable

"As a matter of fact, since the accession of Cardinal Villeneuve to the Quebec diocese every effort has been made to promote better understanding. I have had most pleasant dealings with the Car-dinal. Another point to be con-sidered is that the most influensidered is that the most innuen-tial French language daily, Le Canada, has been an outspoken friend of Jewry. Sevoir, once anti-Semitic, is now quite friendly to the Jews. Only one publication, Le Patriot, has been a steadfast opponent of Jewry and this week-ly, we understand, is supported by interests outside of Canada. A new weekly, L'Ordre, has lately come into being and has proven itself a friend of the Jews and an enemy of an anti-Semitic publica tion such as Le Patriot. The Eng-lish press in Montreal, has always extremely friendly to the Optimistic on Relations

When asked about the future of Jewish-Gentile relation in Quebec Rabbi Stern was very optimistic. He felt that what really counted was the feeling of the better element in the French population. The nationalists he saw as of passing moment, a movement that would die with the coming of better times. It was apparent that he saw the anti-Semitic movement as a nationalist manifestation of the unprogressive French elements against the more modern and unagainst the more modern and the successful English population. And Jewry, as has happened many times before in its long history, was in the unfortunate position a buffer.

Elsewhere in Canada the situ-ation is vastly different. In English Toronto anti-Semitism is so cial and professional in very m the same manner as it is in the United States. This, Rabbi Stern said could be counteracted only by education and the creation good will through fellowship in Canada. In Western Canada, where there is a large foreign population, there is a distinct anti-Semitic movement that is quite Nazi in form. It is represented by a publication called "The Na-

Lauds Canadian-Jewish Body

To combat anti - Semitism throughout Canada there has re-cently been established a Canad-ian Jewish Congress. The Con-gress has made amazing strides in its less than a year of activity. It was responsible for the recently passed Hyman bill that makes radefamation libelous and punishable as such. It has an active anti-defamation and boycott committee.

Recently the B'nai B'rith made

an effort to establish a branch of its anti-defamation group in Can-ada but this has met with opposition from Canadian Jewry.

Congress Cooperates
The Canadian Jewish Congress

attempting to become analogous in Canada to the Board of Jewish Deputies in England, offers itation to other Jewish organizations on its board but is not desirous of the formation of a joint council such as is now operating in the United States composed of the American Jewish Congress, the American Jewish Committee and B'nai B'rith, said the Rabbi.

"We," he continued, "are desir-ous of avoiding the mistakes made in the United States that couldn't be helped because of conflicting organizations. We hope through unity to achieve strength.

You understand, this arrangement is not advertised or official; it is just understood. It is not a matter of religious preju-dice. It is based on race, not

dice. It is based on race, not religion. I think such an arrange-ment is good because if you did not have a tacit understanding of this sort, the universities like Harvard would be all-Jewish, as in the case at the College of the City

The charge, according to Dickstein, grew out of an investi-gation he made recently into Communist activities in connection with the Congressional committee probe into Nazi propaganda in the United

This afternoon, the Congress-man, as a member of the special House body, resumes his one-man hearings of Nazi subversive activities. The session, to be held at the Bar Association Building, 42 West Forty-fourth street, will be secret. Mr. Dickstein refused to reveal the witnesses he expects to examine

On the subject of the Commu-nists getting CWA jobs he was more voluble.

"My investigators have discov-ered," he said, "that within the past few weeks Communists have obtained between twenty and 150 jobs with the CWA. These jobs they got through influence wielded by some member of the Henry Street Settlement. I'm going to make it my business to find out how it is that hoodlums who spend their time parading through the streets and waving red flags get these jobs where more ditizens fail to get them. ore deserving

Duane V. Ramsey, assistant to Helen Hall, director of the Henry Street Settlement, when apprised of the charge, characterized it as "entirely without basis." He said there was no one in the settlement who was working with the Com-munist organization in the manner charged.

Fascism's Foes Launch Attack On Nazi Courts

Aid Body Asks Protest by Conference of Jews, Christians

That the National Conference of Jews and Christians take a stand against the Nazi "People's Courts" which start operations on July 2 is the request made by the Na-tional Committee to Aid Victims of German Fascism, it was announced yesterday by Alfred Wa-genknecht, executive secretary of the committee The appeal was sent to the con

ference on the eve of its two weeks convention at the Univer-sity of Virginia, Charlottesville, which convenes Sunday to discuss Protestant, Catholic and Jewish relations in America.

According to the letter, prison-ers who are now held in concentration camps will come up for trial under the newly decreed Volksgericht (People's Court), Ernst Thaelmann is the first per-son scheduled to be tried under its provisions. Objections to the People's Courta

based on the following ads, according to Wagenare are based on the following grounds, according to Wagen-knecht: 1) Judges are persons having special experience in the field of combatting treasonable activities—that is to say, storm troopers. 2) The victim may be tried, sentenced and executed within twenty-four hours. 3) No appeal may be taken from the ver-dict. 4) All usual trial procedure is swept aside. 5) Death sentence is decreed for printing or distri-buting printed matter, maintaining tres sonable organizations, conspiring to high treason, using ra

dio for treasonable purposes."

Protests against the courts, the appeal suggests, may be made by letter to Chancellor Adolf Hitler, to the German Embassy at Washington and to all German consulates in the cities where they exist.
