Bialik the Immortal

CHAIM NACHMAN BIALIK, the foremost Jewish poet since the time of the great medieval Hebrew poet Jehudah Halevi, has suddenly passed away. Last year the Jews throughout the world celebrated Bialik's sixtieth birthday. In Palestine, Bialik's home for the past ten years, his sixtieth birthday was a Jewish national festival. Now his premature death will be mourned by all Israel as an irreparable national loss.

Bialik belongs to the small group of immortal Hebrew prophets and singers who have enriched the world by their passion for righteousness, by their love of justice and truth, by their fiery zeal in fighting for the eternal Jewish ideals.

Bialik was the outstanding symbol and exponent of Jewish culture in the land of the ancient Hebrew prophets, in the new regenerated Palestine which he loved with all his heart and soul.

Bialik wrote in Hebrew, in Yiddish and in Russian, but whatever language he used as his medium, his words expressed the soul and the conscience of Israel, like the Hebrew prophets of old, with boundless courage and sympathy and love.

The intellectual, spiritual giant of Israel has fallen. But his memory and his inspiration will live on as long as the Jewish people live, as long as the great humanitarian prophets and sages and singers in Israel are remembered.

The Positive Attitude

At the thirty-fourth annual convention of the Rabbinical Assembly of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, at Tannersville, N. Y., Hittlerism, the economic boycott and Jewish unity were discussed.

Rabbi J. Max Weiss, of the American Jewish Committee, read a paper by Morris D. Waldman, secretary of the American Jewish Committee, who is in Europe just now. Rabbi Weiss, in a supplementary statement to Mr. Waldman's paper, said in part as follows:

"There was a considerable portion of the people in the United States and elsewhere who had gained the impression that only Jews and Communists were killed and tortured. The slaying of Kurt von Schleicher and the leader of the Catholic Action party will arouse millions of conservative groups in various lands and not merely Tannersville, N. Y., Hittlerism.

Bialik's Body Lies in State; Jews' Expulsion From Thracian Jewry Mourns

Body Will Be Sent to Palestine for Burial

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, July 5.—The body of Chaim Nachman Bialik, Hebrew poet laureate, who died here last night of a sudden heart attack, is today lying in state in the ceremonial hall of the Central Jewish Cemetery surrounded by an honor guard of Jewish students from the University of Vienna.

From every corner of the Diaspora came expressions of sorrow over his death. Jewish organizations in every country sent their messages of condolence to Bialik's widow and hurriedly directed meetings to pay tribute to the dead poet laureate.

Bialik, who some time ago underwent a serious operation here, had been recovering, and his sudden and unexpected death came as a shock.

Mayor Mayer Dizengoff of Tel Aviv, where the poet made his home, telegraphed today asking that the body be transferred to Tel Aviv for burial.

Funeral ceremonies for the dead writer will be held in Vienna on

Turks Disavow Jews' Expulsion From Thracian Jewry Mourns

Government Will Punish Officials Responsible for the Action

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

ISTANBUL, July 5.—The Turkish government today disavowed the expulsion of the Jews from the Dardanelles region and promised legal redress to hundreds of Jews made homeless by the expulsion edict.

The National Assembly discussed the expulsions at length today. During the course of the debate, the Prime Minister announced that the government will severely punish the officials responsible for driving hundreds of Turkish Jews out of their homes to become penniless refugees.

An official communique of the government stated that the expulsions have been due to a misinterpretation of the new edict whereby Turkey has been divided into "residence zones."

Meanwhile, hundreds of victims of this misinterpretation are in desperate straits here, in other Turkish cities and in Greece, since they have hurriedly disposed of all their possessions in order to comply with the eviction order.

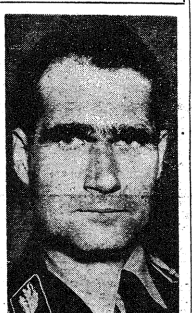

FRAGUE, July 5.—Otto Strasser, whose brother, Gregor Strasser, was shot in Chancellor Hitler's week-end "housecleaning," disclosed tonight that Gregor received a letter from Hitler ten days ago in which the Chancellor offered him the positions held by Hermann Wilhelm Goerring, Premier of Prussia and Minister of Aviation.

Otto Strasser said Goerring had Hitler's telephone wires tapped and had succeeded in thwarting the Chancellor's plan to eliminate Goering in favor of Gregor Strasser, who was one of the original Nazi leaders.

Investigation Fails to Substantiate Pogrom Report in Silesia

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, July 5.—Berlin, city of rumors as a result of the rigid censorship clamped down everywhere, hummed today with reports of a new pogrom against the Jews in the Silesia area. A definite campaign of agitation against the Jews was, however, under way here.

A new program of incitement against the Jews tonight took the form of blaming them for the French-von Schleicher "conspiracy." Jews were accused of fomenting the "plot" and a certain well known German-Jewish journalist in Paris is charged with having been the go-between for General von Schleicher and the French government.

This story is being widely circulated despite the emphatic denial of the French embassy that the French government was in any way involved in any conspiracy.

The sole basis for reports of a pogrom in Silesia apparently was official word that three men and a woman had been slain "for attempting to escape" while in custody in Silesia. The names of the victims were not made public and there was no indication given as to whether the victims had been Jewish.

Investigation Under Way

Diligent investigation by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency failed to reveal any further information substantiating the belief that a pogrom was under way. The strict censorship and the grave difficulty in communicating with the provinces, however, makes it impossible to state definitely what the exact situation is.

(The Jewish Telegraphic Agency reported that the German authorities had patches to the press there refer to the victims only as Germans.

Nazi Vandals Smash 96 Tombstones in a Jewish Cemetery

HAMBURG, July 5.—Ninety-six tombstones were smashed last night in the Hamburg Jewish cemetery by unknown hoodlars. Last week nineteen tombstones in the same cemetery were desecrated. The Hamburg Jewish community has offered a reward for the apprehension of the criminals.

At the same time fifty-four headstones in the Jewish cemetery at Fiedersloh were destroyed by vandals. The head mayor of Fiedersloh characterized the affair as "a shocking crime."

New Straw Men Take 'Control' Of 'Friends' at L.I. Fest

Guest of Honor

NOW -

Early yesterday national control of the League of Friends of New Germany was nominally turned over to Hubert Schuch, former state university instructor. The old guard, headed by Reinhold Walter, went out without so much as a peep, after its doom had been sealed during a three-day conference of cell leaders representing the forty-four Ortsgruppen (units) of the organization. The new officers were welcomed into power with great enthusiasm by approximately 5,000 members of the Friends of New Germany and their sympathizers, who gathered Wednesday at the Platte deutsche Volkstafel Park in Franklin Square, Long Island. Beer kegs and orators supplied, storm troops paraded, the Helldivision chorus went on unrelentingly, and swastikas were found everywhere, swastika Japanese lanterns in the trees and the balcony was covered with swastikas, garlands draped with swastikas, swastikas on ties, coat lapels, armbands and even in the hair.

Follows Reich
The surrender of power followed much the same lines as that which occurred in the Reich, Germany, except that the deposed lived to tell the tale. The old crowd, headed by the "Big Three", Reinhold Walter, Kappe and Joseph Schuster (all non-citizens) are more firmly in the saddle than ever.

Waskul, who has fostered the development of the Friends of New Germany since its inception stage, here, virtually told the McCormack Congressional Committee investigating Nazi Activities that he continued to hold power after his "resignation" last March. He told the committee that he had "let Hitler go" and that he would be replaced by a Gissibai man, named at the time as Hubert Schuch.

All this has come to pass, Schuch, "elected" Sunday, promptly appointed Gissibai head of the Mid-West District of the Friends of New Germany. Joseph Schuster, No. Two Man of the "Big Three" and head of the local storm troops, appointed as head of the Eastern District. Joseph Schwin, another Gissibai supporter, remains head of the Western District.

Waskul was done to death politically with a vote of four out of a total of forty-four. His supporters, some authorities have it, may find themselves replaced in the near future.

200 Children Present
Walter Kappe, editor of the Deutschzeitung and a member of the "Big Three", is a member of the National Committee of the Friends of New Germany. The other two members are Joseph Haegle, Louis Zahne, Henry Weis, Dr. Griesinger and Dr. Hugo Haas. The latter is the head of the Sturmarm, which cooperates with the storm troops.

Wednesday's affair was bright-

ened by the presence of some 200 children, all in uniforms corresponding to that of the Hitler Jugend in Germany. The male of the species numbering 100, were called in the manner of their brothers, the storm troops, or "Ordnungsdienst," as they prefer to be called in this country. They wore black trousers, white shirts, and black armbands, and carried those of the Schutz Staffel in Germany, high black boots, brown shirts, black neckerchiefs and swastika armbands.

The 100 young girls were gowned in blue cotton dresses after the fashion of Hitler maidens in Germany.

Spasmodically throughout the day the storm troops and their young comrades would snap to attention and march the length of the park, while their German sympathizers cheered, saluted in the Nazi manner and shouted, "Heil Hitler!"

Formal Speeches
Formal speeches included those of Henry Beerman, president of the Platte deutsche Volkstafel Verein, who voiced his society's approval of the new officers; George Schneider, president of the Swabian Singing Society; Captain John Rossen of the Brooklyn National Corps; Fred Harms, president of the Breckenridge Club, and Joseph Schuster of the Friends of New Germany, who declared that the German societies unite with his group for a "United Germanland here and in the Fatherland."

Unofficial speeches were myriad during the course of the day, and they invariably lauded Hitler and various aspects of Hitlerism.

Reinhold Walter, who admitted before the McCormack Committee that he had been merely a "straw man" behind whom Gissibai, Schuch and Schuster were hidden, was not present. Walter is to be let down easily. He will conduct a tour to Germany within the next few days, and on his return will find himself without power. He said in Nazi circles. He is an American citizen. So is Schuch, his successor.

Fraternize with Negro

Wednesday's celebration included one interesting incident. Along about the time when they began carrying away empty beer barrels, Walter, Schuch and Schuster, who they embraced a Negro minstrel who wandered into their park. He sang German songs and sang them excellently. Under the mellowing influence of beer, a number of the Nazis invited him to their tables, plied him with wine and beer, and induced him to sing German and Negro airs, thereby committing two cardinal sins according to the Nazi code of conduct: (1) mingling with the inferior to the "Aryan," and (2) listening to the music of "American Negro civilization."

Their racial indiscretions the Nazis made up in part, however. At target practise with 22 calibre rifles, in which hundreds of rounds of ammunition were expended on calling the bull's eye "Israel" and there was great to-do when direct hits were made. A number of youngsters stood around in silver shirt trappings and they somewhat compensated for Nazi rowdiness. They looked abashed at the revelry and on occasion, collared a Nazi who had maled sober enough to stand or too well gone to resist and acted him on necessity for action against Jews.

35 Men and Women to Spend 6 Months to Year in Stockton

The training farm sponsored by the Mizrahi Union of America at Stockton, N. J., to give thirty-five Jewish and thirty-five Arab, necessary agricultural training which they need before they leave for colonization in Palestine is now operating in full swing after the inaugural ceremonies which were held on July 4.

More than 300 persons attended the opening of the farm. Coming from all parts of the Eastern seaboard, they heard of the purposes and hopes of the enterprise from Isidore Epstein, national chairman of the Mizrahi Union of America, Rabbi Seymour Zambrowski, executive director of the Mizrahi Union of America, and Rabbi Z. Hirsch Manischewitz.

Yeshiva Official Lauds Palestine

Impressed With Development of Country; Talks of Jerusalem Hospital

Mendel Gottesman, president of the Credit Union Banking Corporation of New York and treasurer of the Yeshiva College, who has just returned from Palestine, yesterday said he was deeply impressed with the active industrial and agricultural development of the country and the apparent contentment among the people.

Mr. Gottesman, who is seventy-five years old, revealed while he was in Jerusalem he became ill and was taken to the Hadassah-Rothschild Hospital for treatment. Mr. Gottesman's recovery was due to the work of the hospital staff and its personnel, declaring that the service and attention given despite crowded conditions caused by inadequate facilities was "marvelous." He pointed out he was particularly pleased to find that strict observance of kashruth prevailed at the institution.

Was it necessary to wait for the murder of von Schleicher and the leader of the Catholic Action party in order that "those who have been indifferent now take a most positive attitude toward the brutal spirit of Hitlerism." Was it not enough that all German Jewry was persecuted, tortured in concentration camps, driven from their posts, reduced to starvation, that the noblest products of the greatest minds in Germany were burnt, that Jews and Catholics and non-Nazi Protestants, and liberals and radicals and pacifists were hounded and tortured and killed?

What positive attitude does this Rabbi of the American Jewish Committee expect the indifferent to take now that Hitler has murdered also General von Schleicher and a number of his own Nazi comrades who had tried to power and whom he suspected of conspiring against him?

The positive attitude toward the brutal spirit of Hitlerism was adopted long ago by the respecting, liberty-loving Jews and non-Jews. And it was that positive attitude that helped to pose the German morality and economically. And the Jews and the non-Jewish liberals everywhere outside Germany who instinctively and naturally adopted that positive attitude toward Hitlerism spoke for the conscience of mankind. If the Jews had failed to adopt such a positive attitude long ago, in the face of the worst degradation and persecution to which they would have been subjected, they would have proved themselves unworthy of assistance or even sympathy from other quarters. The Hitlerite racial and religious war was waged not against the Jews alone. But the Jews have been and are still the worst victims. There would have been no excuse whatever if they had merely waited for others to fight for their human rights which had been trampled upon. The positive attitude adopted by the Jewish masses everywhere was based on moral grounds and on the first law—that of self-preservation.

And the secretary of the American Jewish Committee, Mr. Waldman, said in his paper that was read at the convention: "We must not permit Hitlerite agitation to throw us back into the Jewish Ghetto, and healthy Jew-conscience and of estrangement from our non-

Jewish neighbors. We must be wary, kind, of translating self-analysis into self-betrayal."

Mr. Waldman also warned Jews against the "hysterical cry for united action," saying:

"The tendency is already apparent among certain types of Jewish leaders to exploit this for their own purposes. They join in the Jewish cry for united action, but always with the understanding that it is to be their kind of action, which must prevail. The subterfuge, while it is clear to those who examine the statements made, yet holds out a lure to the uninitiated.

"Unfortunately, it is a common weakness to confuse mere action with wise action."

It would be well for Mr. Waldman, writing as secretary of the American Jewish Committee, to realize that it is a common weakness to imagine that mere inaction is a sensible policy.

By a policy of indifference and inaction, by merely relying on others to do for us what we must also do ourselves, what we must first of all do ourselves, we would, indeed, throw the Jewish people back into a moral Ghetto and would merit neither the sympathy nor the cooperation, but the contempt of our non-Jewish neighbors.

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Jewish Youth Faces A Changing World

Among the six million educated young Americans who are unemployed, tens of thousands are Jewish boys and girls. Hardly a Jewish family over the destitute level does not maintain, or expects to do so, at least one child through college. Now, of the 2,000,000 graduates a year from colleges and high schools since 1930, only half have found positions.

The problem of educated youth without both hopeful work and fearless rest of mind in this world of plentiful abundance is a troublesome social question. Its extent is appalling. In Norwood, Mass., the Committee on Leisure Time recently made a survey of all graduates during the past five years. Of 750 high school graduates, 500 were found who had no jobs and no prospects of jobs. Syracuse, N. Y., found by census that, of about 30,000 persons between the ages of sixteen and twenty-four, over 14,900 were neither in school nor regularly employed.

New Deal Hasn't Aided Yet.
The New Deal has far less proved unavailing, as did other efforts to meet the problem. Employers are inclined to hire experienced persons and usually refuse to employ those whom they have laid off. As they must pay minimum wages under the codes, they prefer to have trained people and not novices.

Of the educated youth who obtained places since the depression set in, it is estimated that only fifteen per cent did so through family influence or by entering the businesses of relatives. This avenue to a job, once a beaten track to employment, is in a time when business languishes a rather narrow lane.

Creating New Occupations by
Our youth, first of all, has to have a clearer view of the new economic conditions and plan better their campaign. Young people of that way of thinking have, more than ever, a chance to find jobs through personal initiative and activity.

They see, for instance, that the idea of producing commodities was a bit overdone and that an effort to sell goods when there are more than enough merchants is beside the right way. There are people in this country, however, still willing to add money to their own services that to spend money for convenience and save them trouble. The resourceful youth, then, originates some new type of service.

Here are a few facts reported by a close student of the problem: One young graduate, after being assigned factories and stores for employment, established a window-cleaning business for residences in the suburban community in which he lived. Another contrived to furnish clothes lines and poles for the yards and to keep in order the suburban homes in which he lived. He had been trained as an engineer, but nobody would hire him, so he started an enterprise which filled a long-felt want.

Another started a dog-washing service in a community where there were many dogs of high pedigrees, and soon found that he had a profitable job, and one which kept him constantly active. These examples illustrate the line along which new occupations are being found.

The Value of "Self-Definition"
Students of the problem of help for educated unemployed believe that the colleges might well have lectures on the value of "self-definition" as an aid in securing the right job for students after their graduations.

As a road to the all-essential job, such lectures could be given by men in industry and business who had had a varied and successful experience in making their careers. The difficulties of adjustment to a shifting scene in the Machine Age could be pointed out as well as the need for original and intensive thinking in

Arab Riot Leader Gets 6 Months More For Refusing Bond

JERUSALEM, July 5.—Sheik Abdul Kader Muzza Fann, member of the Arab Executive and leader of the Arab riots of last October in Jerusalem and Jaffa, refused today to sign a peace bond in lieu of imprisonment when his case was heard in district court.

The court thereupon sentenced him to be imprisoned for six months and to be under police surveillance for one year.

Fourteen other Arab leaders arrested for participation in the riots signed the peace bond required and were released.

The death of Chaim Nachman Bialik, Hebrew poet laureate and an outstanding Zionist, will be marked with memorial exercises on Thursday, July 12 in every city of the country. It was announced yesterday by the Zionist organization. All Zionist districts in the United States will pay tribute to the leader of the modern Jewish Renaissance. New York City Jewry will pay its respects to the departed Jewish leader with services on Thursday at Carnegie Hall.

The Zionist offices at New York were closed yesterday. The condolences of the Jews of America were expressed in a cablegram sent yesterday by the Zionist organization to the Jewish National Council in Palestine, where the late poet maintained his residence.

Oldest American Synagogue

The first synagogue building erected in North America was that of Congregation Shearith Israel, built in 1730 on what is now South William street in New York City. Funds for the building came from all over the world—London, Surinam, Dutch Curacao and the Barbadoes.

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Yehuda Halevi Street Renamed For Father of Militant Rebbe

WARSAW, July 5.—The chassidic rebbe of Munkasz and his followers today are celebrating a victory the rebbe has just won over Yehuda Halevi, Hebrew poet, philosopher and physician who has been dead nine hundred years.

Today Yehuda Halevi street, the principal thoroughfare of the Czechoslovakian town, is to be renamed Darke Tchuva Strasse (Roads of Penitence street) in memory of the Munkasz Rebbe's dead father and his contribution to chassidic thought.

The Munkasz won his victory very simply. He merely ordered his devotees not to frequent the "unclean street." The chassidim left the street, the authorities conceded the victory to the rebbe, and the rebbe issued an order to his chassidim, directing them to join with him in jubilation.

Whereas the name of the Munkasz's father is comparatively unknown outside the world of chassidism, the fame of Yehuda Halevi, who has been called the "father of all poets," has endured throughout the centuries and throughout the world. His principal poetic renown rests in his Song of Songs, which has become the traditional chant in all synagogues on Friday, the day of the destruction of the temple at Jerusalem, and his hundreds of hymns celebrating the glories of Zion.

Impelled by his yearning for a sight of the Jewish land, Halevi at the age of 30 forsook his medical practice, his one dearly beloved daughter and his birthplace, Toledo, and started on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. No one knows definitely, but legend has it that he was killed by an Arab as he knelt outside the gates of Jerusalem to kiss the soil.

Palestine Mourns Death
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JERUSALEM, July 5.—Wide-spread sorrow was expressed today by all Jewish Palestine over the death in Vienna of Chaim Nachman Bialik, noted Hebrew poet. All Jewish institutions are closed today in nationwide mourning. Black flags are flying everywhere in Palestine.

Tel Aviv, all-Jewish city in which the poet made his home for the last ten years and in which he was a familiar figure on the street and at every event of Jewish importance, was stunned by the news of Bialik's sudden and unexpected death.

A moving tribute to the Hebrew poet was paid this afternoon at a packed meeting in the courtyard of the new Jewish Agency building. Dr. Elimelech Levin, veteran Zionist leader, who delivered the chief memorial address, spoke as the oldest friend of the poet.

Thousands of Jewish school children mourned the death of Bialik, who was their great hero.

Informed of the death of Bialik, Sir Arthur Balfour, British Foreign Secretary, issued the following statement: "I wish to express my deep sympathy over the bereavement suffered by the Jewish people in the untimely death of Bialik, the eminent Hebrew poet whose genius so largely contributed to the revival of Hebrew in modern times."

According to plans formulated today, the poet will be buried near the Hebrew Academy in Tel Aviv. It was learned today that Bialik bequeathed his home on Rindlerstrasse to the community on the death of his wife.

Fellow Jews Pay Tribute

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
WARSAW, July 5.—The Jewish Telegraphic Agency report of the death in Vienna of Chaim Nachman Bialik, noted Hebrew poet, in Jewish circles. All Jewish meetings were immediately halted in tribute to the memory of the poet. All entertainments were stopped and music silenced.

Special editions of all Jewish newspapers were immediately issued carrying wide black borders and carrying articles on the career of Bialik.

Under the auspices of the Tarbut organization, which deals with Hebrew education in Poland, a memorial meeting was organized with the participation of all Zionist organizations and all Jewish national groups. Flags were at half mast on all Jewish institutions and a thirty-day mourning period was proclaimed. Messages of condolence were sent Bialik's family and to the Vaad Leumi, the Jewish National Council of Palestine.

The Warsaw Yiddish Literary Association, the Yiddish Pen Club, the Synagogue of Journalists, the Hebrew Literary Association and the Hebrew Pen Club held special memorial meetings for Bialik.

Joseph Opatoshu, Jewish novelist, who recently returned from a trip to Palestine, participated in the meeting called by the Yiddish Pen Club. The meeting instructed A. M. Fuchs, Jewish writer now in Palestine, to deliver the funeral exercises to be held for Bialik.

The Tarbut group also decided to name all Hebrew high schools in Poland in honor of the dead poet.

A joint Bialik committee hurriedly organized and, composed of representatives of practically every Jewish group, decided that the day of the funeral shall be observed by all Polish Jews as a day of mourning.

Brodetsky Wires Grief
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, July 5.—Professor Selig Brodetsky, member of the political department of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, today sent a message to the widow of Bialik, in the name of the World Zionist Executive, mourning the death of the poet and hailing Bialik as the "national poet and the harbinger of the Hebrew renaissance." He declared that Bialik's name "would remain forever in the history of the nation as symbol of the prophetic conscience of Israel."

The Zionist Federation of London today issued a call for a Bialik memorial meeting to be held Wednesday. Dr. Chaim Weizmann, veteran Zionist leader, will deliver the memorial address.

Dr. Wise Pays Tribute

Dr. Stephen S. Wise, rabbi of the Free Synagogue and president of the Jewish Institute of Religion, yesterday made the following statement concerning the passing of Bialik:

"Bialik's death will be a great sorrow to Jews throughout the world. He was not only one of our greatest but also one of our best, a noble son and singer of his people. At the first annual Commencement of the Jewish Institute of Religion in 1928, he was the distinction of presenting the honorary degree of Doctor of Hebrew Letters to him. In awarding the degree to him I spoke of him as a person of great gifts and hopes and wisdom; fearless builder of his people's life; revealer truly fine understanding and tireless industry of the literary treasures of his people; a poet in virtue of his divine gifts as poet which make of him a link in the golden chain including the names of Job, David, Isaiah, and the outstanding figure in the world of Jewish letters."

Hadassah Honors Memory

Dr. Samuel W. Halperin, national president of Hadassah, said of Bialik's death yesterday: "Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, is deeply shocked at the sudden death of the Jewish poet laureate, Chaim Nachman Bialik. He was the embodiment of Jewish life. He felt and expressed the tragedy and suffering of the Jews in the Diaspora and the joy of the Jewish renaissance in Palestine. He sang of the past and the great romantic tradition. His gift was an apotheosis of Jewish creative life. He penned the folk lore of the Jews and his longing for his own land. His poems were an inspiration as his poetry was lyric. He was a man of action as well as a poet, and had a tremendous following among Jewish youth in Palestine and elsewhere. He was an irreparable loss to Palestine and to his hundreds of colleagues and friends who worked with him in the rebuilding of the Jewish homeland."

Nevada Has Least Jews

The State of Nevada has the fewest Jews of any State in the Union, there being only 264. The State with the smallest proportion of Jew is South Dakota, with Jew numbering one-ninth of one per cent of the total population.

Three German Jewish Savants

Take Brazil University Posts

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

SAO PAULO, Brazil, July 5.—Three German Jewish professors, Dr. Felix Ravitcher, formerly professor of botany at Freiburg University, Dr. Elimelech Breslau, formerly professor of zoology at Cologne, and Dr. Heinrich Rumboldt, who lectured in chemistry at Bonn, arrived here yesterday to assume posts as lecturers at the newly created University of Sao Paulo.

The scientists were to have arrived at Santos harbor on July 27, but landed three weeks ahead of schedule. Newspapers and scientific circles here are emphasizing the importance of the work of the three men and call their presence in Brazil an asset to the cultural development of the country. Brazilian Jews feel that the visitors augment its prestige.

Reich Approves Contracts

Drs. Ravitcher, Breslau and Rumboldt are here largely as a result of the efforts of Dr. Theodor Ramos, who went to Germany as a representative of the University of Sao Paulo and engaged the professors. The contracts were approved by the German government, which granted the scientists permission to leave the country.

In a special interview with a Jewish Telegraphic Agency representative Dr. Ramos described his impressions of Germany and of the plight of Jewish savants there. In the course of the talk he showed the correspondent a list of the names of more than 100 well known Jewish scientists who had declined invitations to take posts in Brazil. From this list, however, Dr. Ramos was free to choose only three.

Can't Understand Action

Dr. Ramos spoke with sympathy of the German Jews and their learned men, whose position, he said, is unbearable. He pointed out that he could not understand the reason for Germany's failure to spare at least those Jewish scientists without whom she will suffer greatly and whom she has continued to seek a haven abroad.

"One can perhaps understand why Germany into the arms of Hitler," Dr. Ramos said, implying that he in no sense approved of that circumstance, "but I cannot, for the life of me understand the sense of destroying the tremendous scientific institutions which Jewish scientists have developed for Germany. Germany has done herself great harm."

An elective course in Hebrew may shortly be established at the University of Sao Paulo, Dr. Ramos indicated.

Remington Closing German Branches

Population Disillusioned, Future Not Rosy, Writer Reports to London

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, July 5.—The U. S. Remington Company is liquidating its branches in Germany in company with many other foreign firms doing business there because of the difficulty in securing foreign exchange for imports, the News Chronicle reported.

There is a growing disillusionment in Germany, the paper reported from Berlin, pointing out that revelations of the moral corruption of brown army leaders had shocked hundreds of thousands. Middle-class families, it reported, are withdrawing their sons and daughters from Hitler youth organizations.

Nearly everyone in Germany now admits that the outlook for the future is not rosy, while a good many people are convinced that the Hitler regime will not be able to survive its difficulties through the winter, the Berlin correspondent of the London Morning Post declared, after talks with scores of people who, in the last elections, had voted for the Nazis, but now express themselves "sick of the whole gang."

Firmer British Control of Oil In Zion Urged

House of Lords Told Policy Safeguards Development

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, July 5.—No substantial oil resources have been proven to exist in Palestine, the Earl of Plymouth, Under Secretary of State for Colonies, told Viscount Templewood, pro-Arab peer, who urged the government to institute strict control over Palestinian and Transjordanian oil deposits.

Lord Plymouth informed the House of Lords that the government was following a policy of allowing private development of natural resources with adequate safeguards embodied in the mining legislation, in addition to carefully watching events.

He declared that the government controlled all developments since no one could prospect for oil without a government license and anyone finding oil was compelled to pay a royalty to the government.

According to Lord Plymouth, the British government intends to study the question of how oil resources in Palestine and Transjordan might in an emergency be used in the interest of the territories under its control.

In the House of Commons a sharp verbal exchange took place between Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister and Colonel Joseph Wedgwood, in regard to the question of oil. The latter asked the Colonial Secretary for the exact number of Jews convicted of murdering other Jews in Palestine in the last ten years.

Unhappy to Furnish Figures

Mr. Cunliffe-Lister was unable to furnish the figures, since Palestine crime statistics do not specify race, and he doubted the desirability of doing so.

Colonel Wedgwood declared that in view of the Stavisky case, in which the young Revisionist Zionist was convicted of killing Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, it was essential to make it clear that no Jew ever occurred in Palestine as between Jews.

Sir Philip rebuked Colonel Wedgwood for his statement, claiming his remarks constituted an improper attempt to prejudice a case now before an appeal court. Mr. Cunliffe-Lister, a Conservative, asked whether the Palestine tourist business had been adversely affected by the sixty-pound deposit required of all tourists before they receive a visa. He asked the Colonial Secretary if the government had any intention of revising tourist regulations.

Deserter of Family Marries in Chile, Faces Bigamy Charge

(U. S. Special Correspondent)

SANTIAGO, Chile, June 19.—Hershel Weinsapel, a young Polish Jew, has been arrested here and charged with bigamy.

He is a young man and children behind when he emigrated from Poland, and married a young Chilean woman here. Recently his family arrived in Chile, but Weinsapel would take no notice of them, whereupon the first Mrs. Weinsapel brought charges against her husband, who was then arrested. He faces a five-year prison term.

Battle Against Anti-Semitism Is Parley Issue

B'nai B'rith Considers Steps to Combat Hatred at Vancouver Session

(Special to the J.D.B.)
VANCOUVER, B. C., July 5.—The growth of anti-Semitism in America and measures that the B'nai B'rith should take to combat it constitute the principal issue before the seventy-first annual convention of District Grand Lodge No. 4, which is being attended here by more than 1,000 men and women from forty-two lodges and twenty-nine auxiliaries in seven Western States and British Columbia.

David Blumberg, of Los Angeles, thirty-third degree Mason, is expected to be elected president. P. Allen Rickles, of Seattle, now second vice-president, is likely to be made first vice-president, which would put him in line for the grand lodge presidency in 1935.

One of the largest contingents at the convention is that from the Seattle lodge, numbering over two hundred members and their wives, and headed by president Ben A. Maslan.

Richard E. Gutstadt, past president, came from Chicago to deliver the keynote speech on Tuesday. Judge I. M. Golden, just named to the Superior court in San Francisco and a strong proponent of boycott against German-made goods and shipping, is among the speakers.

Rickles Attacks Nazi Policy
Past B'nai B'rith officer in the State of Washington and Seattle Jewish leader, assailed the Nazi policy of relegating women to the background before several hundred delegates to the Women's Grand Lodge, District No. 4.

Mrs. Bevela Levine, Mrs. Juliet Rickles and Mrs. Rose Elkan, re-elected assistant secretary of the Women's Grand Lodge, were delegates from Seattle.

United Religious Rites To Be Held at Fair

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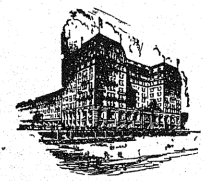

The Bulletin's Day Book

Ten or twelve years ago Dr. Haima Roudland Angeli, president of Yale University and ordinarily a very dignified gentleman, stood up before an assembly of the entire student body and told a story about "two Jews, Abey and They," in his conception of Yiddish dialect.

The story was not very funny. It went something like this (without names):

Abey and They were standing on a Sixth avenue corner in New York City, discussing what means of transportation they would use to reach their destination, some distance away.

"Let's take the Sixth avenue elevated," Abey suggested. "They" walk down Sixth avenue instead and save a nickel," Abey said.

"Oh, well," Abey replied, "since you want to save money, let's go uptown and walk down Fifth avenue. Then we'll be saving a dime."

Obviously the undergraduates laughed. After all, it was their university president's story and they couldn't very well let him down.

But after the assembly was dismissed, little groups of Jewish students gathered outside on the campus and discussed with long faces this "evidence of anti-Semitism" on the part of one so high in academic circles.

One of the boys suggested that Dr. Angeli's attempt at humor was perhaps in poor taste, particularly in view of the fact that he was by no means an adept Yiddish dialectician. His story did not necessarily indicate a feeling of ill will toward the Jews.

"After all," this callous youth pointed out, "the story might just as easily have been told in English dialect, with the names 'Angus' and 'Sandy' substituted for 'Abey' and 'They.' I don't wonder why any of the boys present at the assembly thought the university would have taken offense if that had happened."

The apologist's ill-timed remarks were promptly cried down. Most of the boys had come to Yale expecting to find prejudice, and here, in their opinions, was a first-class example of it.

Nothing further ever came of the incident, but it did live in the memories of the Jewish undergraduates who had been present at the assembly. These columns undoubtedly will serve to revive it in the recollections of those readers who received degrees at Yale anywhere from seven to ten years ago.

Wednesday's issue of The Jewish Daily Bulletin carried a story from Detroit, which told how Compton's Pictured Encyclopedia had agreed to delete from its pages the article on the Jews. It was a certain phrase which Jews had found offensive. The sentence containing this purported affront read as follows:

"The dignified fathers of Israel in GREASY PUB-LINED GABARDINE rub elbows with killed trappers in tight white trousers and gaudy hats, or booted Montenegris with hanging sleeves."

The editor of the encyclopedia stated that he would make the promise to correct the above sentence.

"However true this statement may be to the personal observation of the article, nevertheless it is a generalization which can hardly be defended," he apologizes.

And it is at this point that today's Day Book contributor inserts himself into the picture to ask, "But why?"

Has none of us ever seen a dignified father of Israel in a greasy gabardine? Or if not that, at any event a less dignified son of Israel with a greasy vest?

Why does the entire Jewish peo-

ple rise up in arms over such things as this?

Anyone with a grain of sense can see with half an eye that no slightest generality is intended here. If one were to say, "The fat, sloppy, greasy-jacketed Heywood Brown rubs elbows with the dapper, pouchy-eyed Westbrook Pegler," do you suppose for a minute that the endless army of colonialists would demand an apology?

The fact of the matter is, Jews are annoying, to put it mildly, when they go into these petty poses of outraged nobility.

"The king can do no wrong," declares the old truism which pretends to assert the divine right of royalty. Your superior editor's paraphrases this with, "The Jew can do no wrong."

When the day arrives on which the Jew refuses to call out a battery of anti-harass guns to mow down a flea, he will have achieved true dignity, both in his own eyes and in those of his neighbors.

Men, after all, retain much of the psychology of the school boys when they were mischievous school boys. They enjoy "ribbing" anyone who "can't take it."

Brazilian Nazis Launch Attack On Jews' Paper

Charge Ignorance of Tongue—Editor Is State Examiner

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

RIO DE JANEIRO, July 5.—A sharp attack on the Jewish-Polish newspaper, *Opiniao*, has been made here editorially by the local Fascist newspaper *A Offensiva* which charges that *Opiniao* lacks an adequate grasp of the language of the land.

A Offensiva, Integralist Nazi organ, charges that in reporting an interview with the Integralist leader, the paper misquoted his theories on race and religion. *A Offensiva* declares that the "mistake" occurred because *Opiniao*'s editorial staff is deficient in its knowledge of Portuguese.

How ludicrous such a charge is may be gathered from the fact that the editors of *Opiniao*, a Jewish-Polish newspaper, are, respectively, a prominent scholar and journalist and one of the leading intellectual figures in the land, but is also one of the best-known professors here and official state examiner for Latin in the city of Campinas. In the course of his career, Dr. Oswaldo Cruz frequently defended the Jews against attacks of anti-Semites.

A short time ago *A Offensiva* started an editorial attack upon the Jewish *Telegraphica Agency* and its local correspondent, who had reported steps taken by the government to curb Nazism and anti-Semitism. *A Offensiva* reports were "falsehoods," *Opiniao* stated, without however, troubling to point out wherein the stories were false. *A Offensiva* was alarmed because the true extent of Nazi activities here has been exposed. The Nazi newspaper demanded that the *Telegraphica* correspondent be sent out of the country. Fortunately, no much stock is placed in *A Offensiva* here.

Camp Ta-a-noog Opens

In Golden Splendor

Billy Rose, who makes up of his small stature with a display of dynamic energy that leaves most of his friends and followers writhing with trying to keep up with him, has added another venture to his growing list of amusement projects. Last week he opened his new place, The Music Temple, Broadway between Fifty-third and Fifty-fourth street, and as these lines go pressward it is running along merrily and noisily.

You can't afford to miss one night at this combined vaudeville, movie, eating, drinking and dancing establishment. I say one night, because chances are you will never go back again, but you simply must try it once. For sheer bad taste and garishness Billy Rose's place has few equals. An old house rented the old Hammerstein Theatre, removed the seats and put in tables and chairs. In the basement he built a barroom and thickly laid out a Barbary Coast atmosphere.

The idea is that you go in, sit down at one of the tables which are about as large as a checker board, and order, at very moderate prices, a dinner. In front of you is a stage, upon which a line of girls dance, vaudeville acts do their turn, and news reels and animated cartoons flash. In the stage the entertainment is between the girls and the price reasonable. Drinks, however, come a little high and it is best to have at least three before you swish into the very hot and sweltering reception room. In favor of the Music Hall I recommend the air-cooled atmosphere which permits a cool alcoholic beverage without necessitating the immediate removal of your collar and shirt. Also to be praised is the piano where the boys who bang out tunes on a midget piano in the middle of the barroom.

The Music Hall has other advantages— you will probably never meet any of your friends here. Most of the crowd looked as though it just got over the ferry boat from "Hoboken" or Hoboken or left the dishes at the end and went off for a big evening. Rose feels that the boys and girls not in the

"bucks," as the boys in Harlem say, should have a place to go that will fill their eyes, ears and stomachs, and in the rubber they will not have to leave the cushion on their bankrolls, too.

Billy Rose's Music Hall is very elegant. It is the answer to that constant refrain request, "Loudness and Funner."

Arrest 2 Naras For Incitement In Polish Port

Warsaw Raid Uncovers Huge Mill Printing Banned Szafeta

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, July 5.—Two National Radical students, members of the literary anti-Semitic book gang group, were arrested today at the Polish port of Gdynia on the Baltic Sea as they were distributing anti-Semitic leaflets inciting the Polish people to "rid themselves of the Jews."

The leaflets were discovered by police to have been printed a few days ago at the presses of the Szafeta, anti-Semitic Warsaw daily, which was shut down a week ago by Polish authorities.

Further revelations came to light as a result of the police raid which uncovered a huge mill in an optician's establishment here for printing and distributing the anti-Semitic government-banning the Nazis organ or the dissemination of anti-Semitism.

The newspaper was being given out on the streets of Warsaw by men with long receding hair, police learned. They arrested two such distributors, Czeslaw Domak, convicted on fifteen occasions of thefts of the press, and Jan Rusin, sentenced to prison three times for crimes committed in 1931.

More arrests of men of similar character, engaged in inciting non-Jews to anti-Semitic outrages, were promised.

Police also found in their custody the proprietor of the optician's establishment, one Lenczynski.

In addition to being accused of harboring the distributors, the proprietor of the newspaper itself and other equally incriminating printed matter, the optician is charged with having disseminated the leaflets for his Naras comrades, to be used as disguises in illegal sallies into Jewish quarters.

Bands of long, dark hoodlums were being equipped with these glasses, police say, so that they could hide their identities when they were engaged in attacking the Jews of the city, many of whom have suffered severe injury in recent riots.

Of course, this mistake made us fast friends for life and Kramer, the son of City College, very condescendingly said, "Forget it, fellow. I would have done as much for anybody."

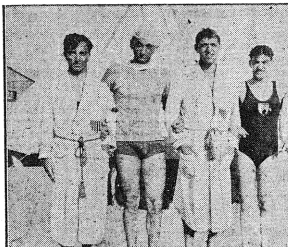

Then our relay team was first place. It was a grand time and I'd like to go again next year." "I'll be glad to see you at the Macabadi Games and likely prospect for 1936 Olympics."

We recalled that we had seen Kramer practicing for his events in the St. George pool some time ago and remembered that his time for the 400-meter free style event was excellent.

We doubt very much if there is another Jewish swimmer in the United States today to equal Kramer's record for this event. In our estimation he is a certain winner at the next Macabadi and a very likely prospect for this distance at the 1936 Olympic games.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency was, however, informed by the Warsaw Palestine office that the reports were incorrect and that the order issued by the Palestine government would effect a few dozen individuals at most.

The reports had aroused the hopes of hundreds of Polish Jewish women, whose husbands had emigrated to Palestine. Just now they would be allowed to settle in the Holy Land.

Jerusalem 'Y' Official Upheld By Secretary

Harmon Concurs in Resolve to Ban Nazi Papers

A firm resolve not to permit Hitler's Volkischer Beobachter or any other race hate newspaper in the reading room of the Jerusalem YMCA was expressed yesterday by Francis S. Harmon, general secretary of the International Young Men's Christian Association, in an exclusive interview with the Bulletin.

Waldo Heinrichs, general secretary of the Jerusalem "Y," when asked for comment on the Jewish Telegraphic Agency dispatch stating he had resigned because the Board of Directors had insisted on keeping the Hitler-controlled newspaper in the files of the Y, voiced bitter condemnation of Hitler's anti-Jewish decrees and said that the J.T.A. dispatch was "substantially correct."

Fought for Ailich—Although born in Prussia, Heinrichs told a Bulletin reporter how he had fought in the French, British and American air services and had been shot down behind German lines and imprisoned in a German camp for the last two months of the war.

Fearing to embroil the International "Y" by an inadvertent statement, Heinrichs introduced the reporter to Harmon, who, recently returned from Germany, showed copies of over a hundred speeches vilifying the Hitler anti-Semitic campaign.

"I could not live up to my speeches against race prejudice," Harmon said, "if I did not oppose the introduction of such hate-spreading paper into the Jerusalem 'Y.'"

A negotiating committee of "Y" has been sent to Jerusalem to clear up the matter with the local board of directors. Meanwhile, Harmon said, Heinrichs' resignation has not been accepted, and he is on a six months' leave of absence. He will leave for Honolulu in the near future to spend the summer with his wife.

Insistent on Ban—The result of the negotiations, Harmon said, is that the Volkischer Beobachter must come out of the reading room no matter what sentence is reached by the committee. The committee consists of F. W. Ramsay and V. F. Slack.

This committee is negotiating with a subcommittee appointed by the local board, and no decision has been reached as yet regarding the anti-Semitic newspaper or the retention of Heinrichs as secretary of the Jerusalem "Y."

"I am opposed to animosity be-

tween races," Harmon stated. "The primary object of our world program is to bridge chasms of ill-will between races, religions and nationalities and to turn hot spots of hatred into centers of cooperation."

"Several months ago we made representations to the Jerusalem board of directors, requesting it to modify a resolution giving any group of fifty members the right to name one paper in the reading room, because this tended to divide the membership of the Association into its national groups."

"When the Board adopted the resolution, a national group asked it to order the Volkischer Beobachter, our representative properly opposed this move. When the board was overruled, we arranged for a special committee to go to Jerusalem to resolve this difficulty in conformity with our international, inter-racial and inter-religious program."

"A cable just received from our special representatives brings the news that 'a procedure has been agreed upon which we believe assures a satisfactory conclusion to the matter with no harm to our principles.'"

The board of directors of the Jerusalem "Y" includes sixteen Arabs, seven Britons and one American.

Four-Story Cemeteries

eral speakers for the theories of a resolution was adopted, which Soviet Russia was lauded for "out-lawing anti-Semitism."

Oppose Dictatorships

Liberal opinion prevailed when a resolution was adopted opposing dictatorships of any kind, and re-affirming faith in democracy in the rebuilding of the social order. The resolutions were mildly astonished by the denunciations and idealization of industry included in the report.

"We believe that man can remain free by the process of education and peaceful reform," the adopted statement declares. The report supports the spirit of NRA "in so far as it represents a step through the channels of democracy toward a planned economy and toward the social control of industry," but deprecates a step through the channels toward the further entrenchment of capitalistic monopolies and the tendency which it exhibits at present in broadening profits rather than ensuring distribution of wealth.

An "individualistic, profit-seeking economy" is society cannot be in "direct contact with the ideals of religion." "We maintain that our present system, based as it is on acquisitiveness and selfish competition, is put on a defective basis of brotherhood," the report states.

Social Use of Wealth

On the social use of wealth, the report calls for the socialization of instruments of banking and credit, the transportation and communication systems, and such public utilities as water, education, gas and electricity. "Although we regard all private ownership of natural resources and the machine tools of production as involving injustice," the report states, "we recognize the impracticability of an immediate transition of property from private to public ownership. But there are some social enterprises that are so completely essential to all economic activity that society cannot content itself with efforts to regulate them. It must actually own them. We call for their socialization."

The report upholds the right of labor to organize and strike and opposes the reorganization of company unions.

A resolution was passed during the day's session—requesting the executive council of the Assembly to take "decisive" measures to organize a campaign of education and enlightenment among American Israel for the purpose of creating a single permanent and democratic representative body of the present constituted American organizations, for the defense of Jewish rights.

Amalgamation cooperation was offered in another resolution to Chief Rabbi A. I. HaCohen Kook, of Palestine, and his committee to the end that adequate legal protection be afforded in the Slavsky case.

The Assembly also voted the approval of the present campaign undertaken jointly by the rabbis, students, Jews, and Catholics to clean the motion pictures.

Continued support was pledged to the Jewish National Fund and thanks were tendered to the movement, led by the Histradrut for its work in the rebuilding of Palestine.

Approval of the work of the National Jewish Education Association at Denver was voiced in a resolution. It was recommended that membership be given to give to this organization from the funds at their disposal.

Upon hearing of the death of Chaim Nauman, Director of the resolution was carried unanimously expressing the regrets of the Assembly. The resolution seeking to endorse in principle birth control was

referred by the convention to the incoming executive council.

The following officers of the assembly were elected: president, Morris of the Assembly, Dr. Elias Margolis, of Mount Vernon, N. Y.; vice-president, Rabbi Eugene Schuch, of Bayonne, N. J.; treasurer, Rabbi Louis Schwedler, of New Rochelle, N. Y.; corresponding secretary, Dr. Robert Gordis, of Rockaway Park, N. Y.; and recording secretary, Henry Fisher of Arverne, N. Y.

The new executive council consists of Rabbi Alexander Basel of the Bronx, Milton Steinberg, of New York City, Dr. A. Goldstein, of Omaha, Lewis Grossman of Corona, N. Y., Henry Halpern, of Brooklyn and C. David Matt, of Philadelphia.

The convention adopted an outline for the nation-wide observance next spring of the eight hundredth anniversary of Maimonides.

Poultry Strike Called in War On Racketeers

Cartage, Coop Charges Under Assault by Kosher Dealers

The possibility of New York City minus its customary supply of kosher poultry loomed yesterday as the wholesale and retail slaughterers went "on strike" against the racket of exorbitant cartage and coop charges. At a late hour yesterday the seventeen kosher slaughterers of the city and street yards of the New York Central railroad with live poultry stock untouched, and the strikers showed no slackening of their demand.

Both Commissioner of Public Market William Feltowes Morgan Jr., and Leroy Peterson, code supervisor for the live poultry industry, at a press conference in the Department of Public Markets, voiced their approval of the strike, which, it was hoped, would break up the monopoly of those who have been receiving exorbitant prices by high charges, and loosen the hold which labor and other racketeers have been exerting.

Urges No Quarter

In a message which the commissioner sent through the press, Commissioner Alexander Hamilton to the wholesale and retail slaughter house men, at their meeting in the Broadway Central Market on July 6, he was declared: "Fight these issues in a way you see fit and I will back you up. He also pleaded that no compromise be made with the three principals who were aggravating the situation as Commissioner Morgan sees it, are:

1. "Exceedingly high wages paid to union labor," and he specifically mentioned that the \$65 paid to the poultrymen is more than the industry can stand."
2. "Extra handling charges and duplication of operations."
3. "Unnecessary tolls and exactions levied on industry through racketeering methods."

S. A. Leaders Flee Germany To Switzerland Via Austria

Congress Body Renews Secret Nazi Hearings

McCormack Calls Five To Testify at First Session Here

Representative John W. McCormack, chairman of the Congressional Committee on Education and other un-American activities, yesterday interviewed five unidentified persons in the Bar Association building, who he will hold secret hearings daily in the coming days. Hearings are called in the same building—Monday.

In response to questions following McCormack's session, McCormack declared that "he was satisfied with the results of his committee's findings thus far."

"Our Washington hearings," said the Congressman, "have clearly shown that certain German consuls in this country have been dispensing money to array Americans against Americans because of their race."

"In addition to spending money," he continued, "which is in direct violation of international law, it has been shown that the Nazi party in Germany and the present Minister of Labor have issued direct instructions to persons in the United States to conspire, at least, the Friends of New Germany paid the expenses of Fritz Gissel, their leader, to go to Germany to try to influence officials of the Nazi party to change certain orders operative here."

McCormack expressed pleasure at the fact that "all evidence received to date tends to show that no person of German birth born in America has taken an active part in the leadership of Nazi party activities here."

"We have a pretty nice citizenry here," observed the Congressman. "Everyone can and should speak his mind, but we want no movements successfully conducted which will take away the human rights of others."

He issued an invitation to all persons to give the committee any evidence against Fascism and Communism here, but added: "It must be evidence, not mere speeches, well-meaning as the speakers may be."

Storm Troopers Agitate for Boycott Against Reich Jewry

None of them describe any of the victims as being Jews).

The storm trooper agitation against the Jewish population was under way today, however, in Berlin and the provinces. An inundation of anti-Semitic leaflets denouncing the Jews, was being distributed in Berlin and several of the provincial centers. They urged a renewed, vigorous boycott of Jews in the Reich.

"The Jews are boycotting German exports abroad," the leaflet stated, "yet Germans are buying from Jews and are thus supporting the Jews against Germany and against Hitler."

"Whoever buys from a Jew is a traitor"

On the Jews was the main issue in the storm trooper agitation. Streicher, organizer of the Nazi anti-Jewish boycott, Nazi overlord of Franconia and editor of the notorious weekly, Der Stuermer, stated that the storm trooper agency has been responsible for the renewal of anti-Jewish activities in Bavaria and throughout the country. Streicher, who was received by the Hitler government and an official card was placed at his disposal for the tenure of his visit.

Much speculation was aroused, once Streicher's visit became known publicly, whether his connection with the government had signified the intention of aiding him in a new onslaught on the Jews. This was considered highly unlikely, in view of the popularity of anti-Semitism in the storm trooper and the desire of the government to keep them pacified by giving them their way in matters not affecting general government policy.

Schmitt Opposes Drive

Strongest opposition to the anti-Jewish boycott has always come from the right. President Paul von Schmitt on the grounds that the boycott has created considerable harm to the German economic position, and that the Jews, with the increasing seriousness of Germany's economic plight, some heed had been given to his words. But von Dr. Schmitt in ill and his resignation from the cabinet has been deferred only by pressure put upon him by Chancellor Hitler.

It is felt that if sufficient demand for a boycott is made, the campaign is made now there will be little opposition to it, and it will be approved by the governing regime.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency is enabled to present further evidence of the anti-Jewish program followed by the rebel storm troop leaders, and the Jewish government by making it act as protectors of the Jews against the general population.

A Jewish representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency secured an admission card to secret S. A. meetings at which it was reported that the Jews had submitted and prevented a German victory at the battle of the Marne; how the Jews have succeeded in business by ruining the German middle class, and in the past, vigorous boycotting of the Jews.

The group of S. A. leaders who fell in the Hitler "housecleaning," and the Jewish representative of the pogrom on the Jews, chiefly with the purpose of embarrassing the government. with the established fact that approximately 2,000 refugees, most of whom were said to be Catholics, fled from the Reich, and the German Upper Silesia, last night into Poland, gave credence to reports that the Catholics, rather than the Jews, were the objects of a campaign of violence in Silesia.

A government official asked tonight concerning reports of the detention of Cardinal Faulhaber, either to deny or confirm the prelate has been imprisoned.

The spokesman said, however, that the Catholic press, the Catholic Faulhaber was in custody was not to be taken as indicating that something has happened to him. The statement was given in answer to inquiries by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent and representatives of an American newspaper and of Reuters' (British) news agency.

The exodus of Catholics followed a violent tirade against Catholic priests delivered by Governor of Silesia, who was reported the slaying of a still undetermined number of Catholic leaders, including Herr Erich Klausener, Father Minister of the Catholic "Action" movement in Munich; the former Bavarian Minister of the Interior, Herr Stuetz; von Seis, Minister of the Munich Interior at the time of Hitler's abortive "beer putsch," and Herr von Kahr, Bavarian Premier at that time.

(The list of casualties was confirmed by the London Times, which reported that many arrests had been made in high Bavarian Catholic circles, including Prince Ysenburg, personal adjutant of General von Epp).

the temporary arrest and proffered resignation of a second, Col. von Papen, who has not been settled by the retention of von Papen as vice chancellor.

Von Papen's resignation was not accepted by Chancellor Hitler at the order of President Paul von Hindenburg, who still holds the balance of power by virtue of his control of the Reichswehr. It was understood that von Papen would soon be deprived of his post but would be permitted to continue as Commissioner for the Saar.

It is understood now that von Papen has no desire to remain in the government, withdrawing his resignation only at the request of the President. He is, however, a representative in the government he is.

Slated to succeed von Papen now is Rudolf Hess, Hitler's deputy in the leadership of the party, and one of his closest advisers. Hess is a minister without portfolio in the cabinet.

SALONICA, July 6.—A pitiful sight was revealed today in Jewish refugees who were forcibly removed from Turkish frontier zones by virtue of a law forbidding all but "purely Turkish" elements to remain in the country. They reached the Greek station of Orestida on the way to Istanbul, where they are being taken.

They were traveling on foot, while the women and children were in four wagons and two cars.
