Bialik the Immortal

CHAIM NACHMAN BIALIK, the foremost Jewish poet since the time of the great medieval Hebrew poet Jehudah Halevi, has suddenly passed away. Last year the Jews throughout the world celebrated Bialik's sixtieth birthday. In Palestine, Bia-lik's home for the past ten years, his sixtieth birthday was a Jewish national festival. Now his premature death will be mourned by all Israel as an irreparable national loss.

Bialik belongs to the small group of immortal Hebrew prophets and singers who have enriched the world by their passion for nighteousness, by their love of justice and truth, by their fiery zeal in fighting for the eternal Jewish ideals.

Balik was the outstanding symbol and exponent of Jewish culture in the land of the ancient Hebrew prophets, in the new regenerated Palestine which he loved with all his heart and soul.

Bialik wrote in Hebrew, in Yiddish and in Russian, but whatever language he used as his medium, he always expressed the soul and the conscience of Israel, like the Hebrew prophets of old, with boundess courage and sympathy and love.

The intellectual, spiritual giant of Israel has fallen. But his memory and his inspiration will live on as long as the Jewish people lives, as long as the great humanitarian prophets and sages and singers in Israel are remem-

It is believed that the shots may have been intended for Arno, who has been active in the fight against

Nazism in this state.

Nazis is expected to break out following the recent series of riots between these two factions, the most serious of which occurred in Irvington, where twenty Nazis were sent to a hospital when their meeting was raided.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) ISTANBUL, July 5 .- The Turkish government today disayowed the expulsion of the Jews from the Dardanelles region and promised legal redress to hundreds of Jews made homeless by the expulsion edict

The National Assembly discuss ed the expulsions at length today. During the course of the debate, Prime Minister announced that the government will severely punish the officials responsible for driving hundreds of Turkish Jews out of their homes to become penniless refugees.

An official communique of the government stated that the expulsions have been due to a misinterpretation of the new edict whereby Turkey has been divided into "residence zones."

Meanwhile, hundreds of victims of this misinterpretation are in desperate straits here, in other Turkish cities and in Greece, since they have hurriedly disposed of all their possessions in order to com-ply with the eviction order.

Otto Strasser said Goering had Hitler's telephone wires tapped and had succeeded in thwarting the Chancellor's plan to eliminate Goering in favor of Gregor Stras-ser, who was one of the original Nazi leaders.

A new program of incitement against the Jews tonight took the form of blaming them for the French-von Schleicher "conspiracy." Jews were accused of fomenting the "plot" and a certain well known German-Jewish journalist now in Paris is charged with having been the go-between for General von Schleicher and the French government.

This story is being widely circulated despite the emphatic denial of the French embassy that the French government was in any

way involved in any conspiracy.

The sole basis for reports of s pogrom in Silesia apparently was official word that three men and a woman had been slain "for at-tempting to escape" while in cus-tody in Silesia. The names of the victims were not made public and there was no indication given as to whether the victims had been

Jewish.

Investigation Under Way
Diligent investigation by the
Jewish Telegraphic Agency falled
to reveal any further information
substantiating the belief that a
pogrom was under vay. The strict
censorship and the grave difficulty in communicating with the prov-inces, however, makes it impos-sible to state definitely what the exact situation is.

Germany was nominally turned over to Hubert Schnuch, former Yale University instructor. #### Formal Speeches

Formal speeches included those of Henry Beerman, president of the Plattdeutsche Volksfest Verein, who voiced his society's friendship with the Friends of New Germany; George Schneider, president of the Swides Circuit president of the Swabian Sing-ing Society; Captain John Rossen of the Brooklyn Safety Corps Fred Harms, president of the Bed erskesa'er Club, and Joseph Schuster of the Friends of New Germany, who demanded that all German societies unite with his group for a "United Germandom here and in the Fatherland."

Unofficial speeches were myriad during the course of the evening and they invariably lauded Hitler and various aspects of Hit-

Reinhold Walter, who admitted before the McCormack Committee that he had been merely a "straw man" benind whom Gissibl, Kappe and Schuster operated, was not present. Walter is to be let down easily. He will conduct a tour to Germany within the next few days, and on his return will find himself without power, it is said in Nazi circles. He is an American citizen. So is Schnuch, his successor as "dummy."

#### Fraternize with Negro

Wednesday's celebration included one interesting incident. Along about the time when they began carrying away empty beer bar-rels, Nazis mellowed to such ex-tent that they embraced a Negro minstrel who wandered into their park. He sang German songs and sang them excellently. Under the mellowing influence of beer, a number of the Nazis invited him to their tables, plied him with good Bavarian brew and induced him to sing German and Negro airs, thereby committing two cardinal sins according to the Nazi code: (1) Mingling with a race inferior to the "Aryan," and (2) listening to the music of "America's Negro civilization."

Was it necessary to wait for the murder of von Schleicher and the leader of the Catholic Ac-tion party in order that "those who have been indifferent now take a most positive attitude toward the brutal spirit of Hitler-ism." Was it not enough that all German Jewry was persecuted, tortured in concentration camps, driven from their posts, reduced to starvation, that the noblest products of the greatest minds in Germany were burnt, that Jews and Catholics and non-Nazi Protestants, and liberals and radicals and pacifists were hounded and tortured and What positive attitude does

this Rabbi of the American Jev ish Committee expect the indifferent to take now that Hitler has murdered also General von Schleicher and a number of his own Nazi comrades who had helped him to power and whom he suspected of conspiring against him? The positive attitude toward

the brutal spirit of Hitlerism was adopted long ago by self-respecting, liberty-loving Jews and non-Jews. And it was that positive attitude that helped to isolate Nazi Germany morally and economically. And the Jews and the non-Jewish liberals everywhere outside Germany instinctively and naturally adopted that positive attitude toward Hitlerism spoke for the conscience of mankind. If the Jews had failed to adopt such a posi-tive attitude long ago, in the face of the worst degradation and persecution to which they had ever been subjected, they would have proved themselves unworthy of assistance or even sympathy from other quarters. The Hitlerite racial and religious war was waged not against the Jews alone. But the Jews have been and are still the worst victims. There would have been no excuse whatever if they had merely waited for others to fight for their human rights which had been trampled upon. The positive attitude adopted by the Jewish masses everywhere was based on moral grounds and on the first law—that of self-preservation.

And the secretary of the American Jewish Committee, Mr. Waldman, said in his paper which was read at the convention:

"We must not permit Hitler-ite agitation to throw us back into a moral Ghetto of an un-healthy Jew-consciousness and of estrangement from our non-

Jewish neighbors. We must be

Jewish neignbors. We must be wary, too, of translating self-analysis into self-betrayal."

Mr. Waldman also warned Jews against the "hysterical cry for united action," saying:

"The tendency is already ap-parent among certain types of (ewish leaders to exploit this for their own purposes. They join in the hue and cry for united action, but always with the un-derstanding that it is to be their kind of action, which must pre-vail. The subterfuge, while it is clear to those who examine the statements made, yet holds out a lure to the uninitiated.

"Unfortunately it is a com-mon weakness to confuse mere action with wise action." It would be well for Mr. Wald-

writing as secretary of the American Jewish Committee, to realize that if it is a common weakness to imagine that mere inaction is a sensible policy.

By a policy of indifference and

inaction, by merely relying on others to do for us what we must also do ourselves, what we must first of all do ourselves, we would indeed, throw the Jewish people back into a moral Chetto and would merit neither the sympa-thy nor the cooperation, but the contempt of our non-Jewish neighbors.

# Jewish Youth Faces A Changing World

Among the six million educated young Americans who are un-employed, tens of thousands are Jewish boys and girls. Hardly a Jewish family over the destitute level does not maintain, or expects

to do so, at least one child through college. Now. of the 2,000,000 graduates a year from colleges and high schools since 1930, only half have found positions.

The problem of educated youth without both hopeful work and fearless rest of mind in this world of plentiful abundance is a troublesome social question. Its extent is appalling. In Norwood, Mass., the Committee on Leisure Norwood, Mass., the Committee on Leisure Time recently made a survey of all graduates furing the past five years. Of 750 high school graduates, 500 were found who had no jobs and no prospects of jobs. Synause, N. V., found by census that, of about 30,000 persons between the ages of sixteen and twenty-four, over 14,900 were neither in

school nor regularly employed.

New Deal Hasn't Aided Yet The New Deal thus far has proved unavailing, as did other efforts to meet the problems. Employers are inclined to hire expeployers are inclined to hire experienced persons and usually re-employ those whom they have laid off. As they must pay min-imum wages under the codes, they prefer to have trained people and

not novices.

Of the educated youth who obtained places since the depression set in, it is estimated that only fifteen per cent did so through family influence or by entering the businesses of relatives. This avenue to a job, once a beaten track to employment, is in a time when business languishes a rath er narrow lane.

Creating New Occupations of Ingenuity
Our youth, first of all, has to have a clearer view of the new economic conditions and plan better their campaign to find work.

\*\*hat way of onomic conditions and plan better their campaign to find work. Young people of that way of thinking have, more than ever, a chance to find jobs through per-sonal initiative and ingenuity. They see, for instance, that the idea of producing commodities was

a bit overdone and that an effort to sell goods when there are more than enough merchants is beside the right way. There are record the right way. There are people in this country, however, still willing and able to spend money for services that add to their own convenience and save them trou-ble. The resourceful youth, then, originates some new type of ser-

Here are a few facts reported by a close student of the problem: One young graduate, after besieging factories and stores for employment, established a windowcleaning business for residences in the suburban community in which he lived. Another contract-ed to furnish clothes lines and poles for the yards and to keep them in order. He had been trained as an engineer, but no-body would hire him, so he started an enterprise which filled a long felt want.

felt want.

Another started a dog-washing service in a community where there were many dogs of high pedigree, and soon found that he had a profitable job, and one which kept him constantly active. These examples illustrate the line along which new occupations

are developing.

The Value of "Self-Deflation Students of the problem of help or educated unemployed believe that the colleges might well have lectures on the value of "self-de-flation" as an aid in securing the

order to put the new principles into practice.

Now, the college student is not to be blamed for getting an in-flated idea of himself. This has been in tune with the spirit of the piping times of our post-war pros-perity. The professors and alumni piping times of our post-war pros-perity. The professors and alumni gave him an exaggerated idea of the "cash value" of education and of the "social value" of his association with this or that academic

The college publications abound, even now, in the "success" stories even now, in the "success" stories of men who have won very great wealth and high position. But they do not feature those persons who have done fairly well and have steadily rendered service of one sort or another to the community.

For the young Jew the problem of adjustment to the new economic conditions is still more difficult. After all, his chance to be given a job in a corporation, at a time of severe discrimination, is very meagre. And yet the corporate form of business is spreading by leaps and bounds.

With the majority of educated people becoming salaried persons, the field of original service-occupations calls for energetic and re-sourceful men and women. It may easily become the most promising

field for Jewish youth.

A young Jew, therefore, to attain the goal of a satisfying career, has to strive to recognize his peculiar oportunities. Let him face his own problems, make his own deci-sions, and meet all change in the field of occupations with a flexible and inventive mind.

WARSAW, July 5.—The chassidic rebbe of Munkasz and his followers today are celebrating a victory the rebbe has just won over Yehuda Halevi, Hebrew poet, phil-osopher and physician who has been dead nine hundred years.

Today Yehuda Halevi street, the Today Yehuda Halevi street, the principal thoroughfare of the Czechoslovakian town, is to be renamed Darke Tchuva Strasse (Roads of Penitence street) in memory of the Munkaszer Rebbes' dead father and his contribution to chassidic thought.

aassidic thought.
The Munkaszer won his victory The Munkaszer won his victory very simply. He merely ordered his devotees not to frequent the "unclean street." The chassidim left the street, the authorities conceded the victory to the rebbe, and the rebbe issued an order to his chassidim, directing them to join with him in jubilation

Whereas the name of the Munkaszer's father is comparatively unknown outside the world of chassidism, the fame of Yehuda Halevi, who has been called the "father of all poets," has endured throughout the centuries and throughout the world. His principal poetic renown rests in his Song of Zion, which has become the tra-ditional chant in all synagogues on Tisha B'ab, day of the destruction of the temple at Jerusalem, and his hundreds of hymns celebrating the glory of Zion

Informed of the death of Bialit, High Commissioner Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, in a statement issued to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, declared: "I wish Telegraphic Agency, declared: "I wish to express my deep sympathy when the breavement suffered by the Jawish people in the unitually death of Bialits, the eminent Herow poet whose genius so largely brew poet whose genius so largely contributed to the revival of Hebrew in modern times.

According to plans formulated today, the poet will be buried near the grave of Achad Haam, noted the grave of Achad Haam, noted Hebrew thinker, who is buried in Tel Aviv. It was learned today that Bialik bequeathed his home on Bialik street to the community on the death of his wife.

#### Polish Jews Pay Tribute

# Three German Jewish Savants Take Brazil University Posts

Three German Jewish professors, Dr. Felix, Raivitcher, formerly professor of botany at Freiburg University; Dr. Ernst Breslau, formerly professor of zoology at Cologne, and Dr. Heinrich Rumboldt, who lectured in chemistry at Bonn, arrived here vesterday to assume posts as lecturers at the newly created University of Sao Paulo

The scientists were to have rived at Santos harbor on July 27, but landed three weeks ahead of schedule. Newspapers and scien-tific circles here are emphasizing the importance of the work of the e men and call their pres in Brazil an asset to the cultural development of the country. Braz-ilian Jewry feels that the visitors augment its prestige.

Rumboldt are here largely as a
result of the efforts of Dr. Theodor Ramos, who went to Germany as a representative of the University of Sao Paulo and en-gaged the professors. The contracts were approved by the Ger-man government, which granted the scientists permission to leave the country.

In a special interview with a Jewish Telegraphic Agency repre-

sewish telegrapm Agency repre-sentative Dr. Ramos described his impressions of Germany and of the plight of Jewish savants there. In the course of the talk he showed the correspondent a list of the names of more than 100 well known Jewish scientists who had declared their readiness to take posts in Brazil. From this list, however, Dr. Ramos was free to choose only three.

#### Can't Understand Action

Dr. Ramos spoke with sym-pathy of the German Jews and their learned men, whose position, he said, is unbearable. He pointed out that he could not understand the reason for some the state of sparse at least those Jewish scientists without whom she has suffer greatly and whom she has condemned to seek a haven the state of the state of the seek a haven the seek the reason for Germany's failure

"One can perhaps understand what drove Germany into the arms of Hitler," Dr. Ramos said, implying that he in no sense ap-proved of that circumstance, "but cannot for the life of me understand the sense of destroying the stand the sense of destroying the tremendous scientific institutions which Jewish scientists have de-veloped for Germany. Germany has done herself great harm."

# Firmer British Control of Oil In Zion Urged

#### House of Lords Told Policy Safeguards Development

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, July 5.—No substantial oil resources have been proven to exist in Palestine, the Earl of Plymouth, Under Secretary of State for Colonies, told Viscount Templetown, pro-Arab peer, who urged the government to institute strict control over Palestinian and Transjordanian oil deposits.

Lord Plymouth informed the House of Lords that the government was following a policy of al-lowing private development of natural resources with adequate safeguards embodied in the mining legislation, in addition to carefully watching events.

He declared that the govern-ment controlled all developments since no one could prospect for oil without a government license and anyone finding oil was com-pelled to pay a royalty to the government.

According to Lord Plymouth, the British government intends to study the question of how oil re-sources in Palestine and Transjordania might in an emergency be used in the interest of the terrorists concerned.

In the House of Commons s sharp verbal exchange took place between Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister and Colonel Josiah Wedgwood, in-dependent member, when the latter asked the Colonial Secretary for the exact number of Jews convicted of murdering other Jews in Palestine in the last ten years.

Unable to Furnish Figures

Sir Philip declared he was unsir Fmin declared he was un-able to furnish the figures, since Palestine crime statistics do not specify race, and he doubted the desirability of doing so.

Colonel Wedgwood declared that in view of the Stavsky case, in which the young Revisionist Zion-ist was convicted of killing Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, it was essential to make it clear that murders never occurred in Palestine as be-

never occurred in Palestine as be-tween Jews.

RIO DE JANEIRO, July 5.—A
sharp attack on the Jewish-Portuguese newspaper Civilization has been made here editorially by local Fascist newspaper A Offensiva which charges that Civilization lacks an adequate grasp of the language of the land.

A Offensiva, Integralist Nazi organ, charges that in reporting an interview with the Integralist leader, the paper misquoted his theories on race and religion. A Offensiva declares that the "mistake" occurred because Civiliza-tion's editorial staff is deficient in its knowledge of Portuguese

How ludicrous such a charge is may be gathered from the fact that one of the editors of Civilia zation, Dr. Silveira Bueno, is not only a prominent scholar and journalist and one of the leading tellectual figures in the land, but is also one of the best-known pro-fessors here and official state ex-aminer for Latin in the city of Campinas. In the course of his journalistic career Dr. Bueno has frequently defended the Jews against attacks of anti-Semites.

A short time ago A Offensiva printed an editorial attack upon the Jewish Telegraphic Agency the Jewish Telegraphic Agency and its local correspondent, who had reported steps taken by the government to curb Nazism and anti-Semitism. The J.T.A. reanti-Semitism. The J.T.A. re-ports were "falsehoods," Offensiva stated, without however, troubling to point out wherein the stories were not to be believed. Visibly alarmed because the true extent of Nazi activities here has been exposed, the Nazi newspaper demanded that the J.T.A. corres-pondent be sent out of the country. Fortunately, not much stock placed in A Offensiva here.

Billy Rose, who makes up for his small stature with a display of dynamic energy that leaves most of his friends and followers wilted with trying to keep up with him, has added another venture to his growing list of amusement projects. Last week he opened his new place, The Music Hall, on Broadway between Fifty-third and Fifty-fourth street, and as these lines go pressward it is running along merrily and noisily. You can't afford to miss one visit

to this combined vaudeville, movie, eating, drinking and dancing establishment. I say one visit, be-cause chances are you will never go back again, but you simply must try it once. For sheer bad taste and garishness Billy Rose's place has few equals. As a base Rose rented the old Hammerstein Theatre, removed the seats and put in tables and chairs. In the basement he built a barroom and thickly laid on a Barbary Coast atmosphere.

The idea is that you go in, sit at one of the tables which are about as large as a checker board, and order, at very mod-erate prices, a dinner. In front of you is a stage, upon which a line of girls dance, vaudeville acts do their turn, and news reels and animated cartoons flash. tween the entertainment the stage is cleared and the audience is invited to dance to the tunes of one of two loud but hot orchestras. themselves upon the stage and sing old favorites, barroom ditties, airs that are calculated to give you s. nostalgic for the alleged good old days. If this sort of thing begins to pall you may ad-journ to the downstairs bar and indulge

only stayed at the Music Hall for four hours, so I am not posi-tive I saw all there was to be seen, but I do know that the food is very ordinary, the entertainment fairly good and the prices reasonable. Drinks, however, come a little high and it is best to have at least three before you swish into the very red and golden re-ception room. In favor of the Music Hall I recommend the sircooled atmosphere which permits you to sip alcoholic beverages with-out necessitating the immediate removal of your collar and shirt. Also to be praised is the piano player who bangs out tunes on a midget piano in the middle of the

The Music Hall has other advantages-you will probably never meet any of your friends there. Most of the crowd looked as though it just got over the ferry boat from Weehawken or Hoboken or left the dishes in the sink and went out for a big evening. Rose feels that the boys and girls not in the

Billy Rose's Music Hall is very elegant. It is the answer to that constantly shouted request, "Louder and Funnier."

# Arrest 2 Naras For Incitement In Polish Port

#### Warsaw Raid Uncovers Huge Mill Printing Banned Sztafeta

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
WARSAW, July 5.—Two National Radical students, members
of the bitterly anti-Semitic hooligan group, were arrested today at the Polish port of Gdynia on the Baltic Sea as they were distribut-ing anti-Semitic leaflets inciting Baltic Sea as they were distribut-ing anti-Semitic leaflets inciting the Polish people to "rid them-selves of the Jews."

The leaflets were discovered by police to have been printed a few days ago on the presses of the Sztafeta, anti-Semitic Warsaw daily, which was shut down week ago by Polish authorities.

Further revelations came to light as a result of the police raid Ight as a result of the police raid which uncovered a huge mill in an optician's establishment here for printing and distributing the Sztafeta, the government-banned Nara organ for the dissemina-tion of anti-Semitism. The newspaper was being given

out on the streets of Warsaw by men with long criminal records, police learned. They arrested two such distributors, Czeslav Domisuch distributors, Czeslav Domi-lak, convicted on fifteen occasions of thefts of varying magnitude, and Jan Rusin, sentenced to prison three times for crimes comin this city. More arrests of men of similar

character, engaged in inciting non-Jews to anti-Semitic outrages. were promised.

Police also had in their custody

Police also had in their custory the proprietor of the optician's establishment, one Lenczynski. In addition to being accused of harboring the presses, the copies of the newspaper itself and other equally inflaming printed matter, the optical is charged with havthe optician is charged with having manufactured smoked glasses for his Nara comrades, to be used as disguises in illegal sallies into Jewish quarters.

Bands of Nara hoodlums were being equipped with these glasses. police say, so that they could hide their identities when they were they were engaged in attacking the Jews of the city, many of whom have suf-fered severe injury in recent riots.

#### Harmon Concurs in Resolve to Ban Nazi Papers

A firm resolve not to permit Hitler's Voelkischer Beobachter or any other race hate newspaper in the reading room of the Jerusalem YMCA was expressed yesterday by Francis S. Harmon, general secretary of the International Young Men's Christian Association, in an exclusive interview with the Bulletin.

Waldo Heinrichs, general secretary of the Jerusalem "Y," when asked for comment on the Jewish Telegraphic Agency dispatch stat-ing he had resigned because the Board of Directors had insisted on keeping the Hitler-controlled newspaper in the files of the "Y," voiced bitter condemnation of Hitler's anti-Jewish decrees and said that the J.T.A. dispatch was "sub-stantially correct."

Fought for Allies Although born in Prussia, Hein-

richs told a Bulletin reporter how he had fought in the French, British and American air services and had been shot down behind German lines and imprisoned in a German camp for the last two months of the war.

Fearing to embroil the Interna-ional "Y" by an inadvertent statement. Heinrichs introduced the reporter to Harmon, who, recently returned from Germany, showed copies of over a hundred speeches attacking the Hitler anti-Semitic campaign.

could not live up to my "I could not live up to my speeches against race prejudice," Harmon said, "if I did not oppose the introduction of such hate-spreading paper into the Jerusa-lem "Y"."

"Several months ago we made representations to the Jerusalem board of directors, requesting it to modify a resolution giving any group of fifty members the right to name one paper in the reading room, because this tended to divide the membership of the Association into its national groups.

"When the Board adopted the resolution, a national group asked it to order the Voelkischer Beobachter, our representative prop-erly opposed this move. When the was ordered anyway, we arranged for a special committee to go to Jerusalem to resolve this dif-ficulty in conformity with our international, inter-racial and interreligious program.

"A cable just received from our special representatives brings the Lews that 'a procedure has been agreed upon which we believe assure a satisfactory conclusion to the matter with no harm to our principles!" principles'.'

The board of directors of the Jerusalem "Y" includes sixteen Arabs, seven Britons and one American.

# Rabbis Demand Radical Change In Society, Denounce Dictators

#### Oppose Dictatorships

Liberal opinion prevailed when a resolution was adopted opposing dictatorships of any kind and re-affirming faith in democracy in the rebuilding of the social order Spectators were mildly aston-ished by the demand for the socialization of industry included in

the report. "We believe that man can remake his society by the process of education and peaceful reform," the adopted statement declares.

The report supports the spirit of NRA "in so far as it represents a step through the channels of a step through the channels of democracy toward a planned eco-nomy and toward the social con-trol of industry." but deprecates "those aspects of it which point toward the further entranchment toward the further entremental of capitalistic monopolies and the tendency which it exhibits at present of guaranteeing profits rather than ensuring a broader distribution of wealth.

An "individualistic, profit-in-spired economy" is declared to be in "direct conflict" with the ideals of religion. "We maintain that of religion. "We maintain - that our present system, based as it is on acquisitiveness and selfish competition, is in practice a denial of human brotherhood," the report

#### Social Use of Wealth

On the social use of wealth, the report calls for the socialization of instruments of banking and credit, the transportation and communication systems, and such munication systems, and such public utilities as water, coal, oil, gas and electricity. "Although we regard all private ownership of natural resources and the machinery of large-scale production as involving injustice," the report involving injustice," the report states, "we recognize the imprac-ticability of an immediate trans-fer of all capital from private to public ownership. But there are some social enterprises that are so completely essential to all eco-nomic activity that society cannot content itself with efforts to regu-late them. It must actually own them. We call for their socializa-tion."

The report upholds the right of labor to organize and strike and oppose the reorganization of company unions. A resolution was passed during

the day's session-requesting the executive council of the Assembly to take "decisive" measures to or ganize a campaign of education and enlightenment among American Israel for the purpose of creating a single permanent and demo cratic organization to replace the present constituted American organizations, for the defense of Jewish rights. Unanimous cooperation was

offered in another resolution to Chief Rabbi A. I. HaCohen Kook of Palestine, and his committee to the end that adequate legal protection be afforded in the Stavsky

# Called in War On Racketeers

#### Cartage, Coop Charges Under Assault by Kosher Dealers

The possibility of New York City minus its customary supply of kosher poultry loomed yesterday as the wholesale and retail slaughter houses went "on strike" against the racket of exorbitant cartage and coop charges. At a late hour vesterday the seventeer cars which came into the Sixtieth street yards of the New York Cen-tral railroad with live poultry stood untouched, and the strikers showed no slackening of their determination

Both Commissioner of Public William Fellowes Morgan Jr., and Leroy Peterson, code su-pervisor for the live poultry in-dustry, at a press conference in the Department of Public Markets. voiced their approval of the strike, which, it was hoped, would break up the monopoly of those who have been enforcing the excessive ly high charges, and loosen the hold which labor and other racketeers have been exerting.

#### Cabinet Crisis Still Continues

the temporary arrest and profferred resignation of a second, Col. Franz von Papen, has not been settled by the retention of von vice chancellor.

Von Papen's resignation was not accepted by Chancellor Hitler at the order of President Paul von Hindenburg, who still holds the balance of power by virtue of his control of the Reichswehr. It was indicated in Nazi circles today, however, that von Papen would soon be deprived of his post but would be permitted to continue as Commissioner for the Saar.

It is understood now that you Papen has no desire to remain in the government, withdrawing his resignation only at the request of von Hindenburg, whose personal representative in the government

Slated to succeed von Papen nov is Rudolf Hess, Hitler's deputy in the leadership of the Nazi party and one of his closest advisers. Hess is a minister without port-folio in the cabinet.
