The Polish Nazis Curbed

VIENNA, July 11.—Chancellor Engelbert Dolfuss today concentrated supreme civil and military power in his own hands through the reconstruction of his cabinet. In the new cabinet Chancellor Dolfuss assumes the Ministries of Foreign Affairs, Defense and Agriculture.
The new orientation in Austrian politics indicates that an attempt will be made for rapprochement with Nazi Germany. Stephen Tauschnitz, Austrian Ambassador in Berlin, and who is regarded as the outstanding exponent of Pan-Germanism, has been recalled to Vienna to assume the post of

Under Secretary for Foreign Affairs.
Following a clash, which is said to have occurred between the regular Austrian army and the Fascist Heimwehr commanded by Prince von Starhemberg in Graz, Prince von Schoenberg-Hartenstein, Minister of Defense in the Dolfuss cabinet, resigned. Chancellor Dolfuss immediately pressed the resignation of his cabinet to President Miklas.
The new cabinet failed to include Ministers Kerber, Glass, Prince Schoenberg-Hartenstein and Engel.

Door to Wailing Wall, Cause of Arab Strife, Closed by Commissioner

JERUSALEM, July 11.—District Commissioner James Campbell today ordered closed the door leading to the Wailing Wall enclosure, because of many Arab-Jewish disputes in recent years.
The closing order was accompanied by a statement that the door's opening by the Moslems during the previous six months should not have been permitted because it was an infringement of the status quo.
Jews have wept at the Wailing Wall for centuries. In 1929 it was the cause of violent Arab-Jewish rioting.

Market Workers Return on Temporary Agreement

The lockout against poultry commission merchants by a number of markets in Brooklyn which involved the laying-off of 200 slaughterers and 350 market workers was temporarily called off yesterday according to Abraham Franzel, president of the Live Poultry Market Association and moving figure in the lockout, who told the Bulletin that a temporary settlement with the commission merchants had been effected gaining for the market men most of their demands.
More than 150 members of Shootin' Union Local 440, the organization of poultry slaughterers, met last night at the Bialystoker Auditorium, East Broadway and Clinton street, and voted acceptance of a temporary agreement with the market men under which they will return to work tomorrow in most markets.
Fear was expressed that certain market owners are trying to stop the slaughterers from forcing them to slaughter more fowl or receive lower wages than the union agreement calls for.
A new agreement is expected to go into effect next Monday whereby slaughterers will be paid fifty-five dollars per week and will slaughter fifty coops of fowl per week.

Furnished Data On Armaments, Quiz Reveals Got \$25,000 Per Year From Trust for Propaganda

Ivy Lee and his high-powered firm of publicity experts stood self-revealed yesterday as advisors to the German government on rearmament and as the prime propagandists for the Hitler terror.
Although Lee himself did not appear before yesterday's open hearing of the Congressional Committee to Investigate Nazi and Other Subversive Propaganda in the United States, his partner, Burnham Carter, admitted on the stand that his firm has furnished the Reich with detailed advice relative to armaments.
Further revelations were contained in testimony which Lee himself gave at closed sessions of the committee several weeks ago and which were read into the record yesterday.
Burnham's admissions and Lee's statement, as heads of an organization which does publicity for the Rockefeller interests, the Pennsylvania Railroad and a myriad other giant enterprises of national and international stature, contained the following revelations:
1) That Lee receives \$25,000 a year as a retainer from the Industrial Gesellschaft Farben (the German dye trust) for his advice on how to improve the German-American trade relations.
2) That he paid his 28-year-old son, James Lee 2nd, who did contact work for him in Berlin, over \$33,000 in 1932, which was \$8,000 more than he himself received as

Terror Grips Reich; S.S. Wound Vets

At Least 2 More Dead, 1 Missing, Many Injured

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN, July 11.—To the long list of attacks on the Jews in Germany since the Roehm revolt, which included the slaying of nine Jews, the beating up of scores more and the arrests of numerous others, a survey conducted by special investigators of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today adds cases of at least two more deaths, several more victims of attacks and a number of additional arrests.
It also disclosed that the Berlin state police had promised to protect the lives of the last five Jewish leaders under arrest at Hirschberg, Silesia, and had guaranteed them just treatment.
S. S. Wreak Havoc
A sporadic wave of anti-Jewish terrorism in many parts of the country was revealed by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency investigation. In Hesse province, it was learned, a group of black-shirted S. S. men broke into Jewish homes, and shooting wildly in one, had wounded four Jews. One of those shot was reported to be critically

Reich Issues Warrant For Otto Klemperer

BERLIN, July 11.—It was reported today that the Reich Ministry of Finance has issued a warrant for the "temporary" arrest of Otto Klemperer, Jewish former musical director-general of the State Opera who is now conductor of the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra and a guest conductor of the New York Philharmonic Society.
The charge against Klemperer is tax evasion. Announcement of the warrant was made in the ministry's official gazette, which ordered Germans not to repay private debts due the musician. His property will be confiscated. Klemperer was dismissed from the State Opera because of his race.
Klemperer left Los Angeles last April, according to the Bulletin's San Francisco correspondent, and is believed to be somewhere in Europe at the present time.

Deutsche Zeitung Fights Suit

Criminal Libel Suit Is Denied Nazi Editor

Sam L. McLaughlin Will Face Court on Goldstein Court

Sam L. McLaughlin, vice-president of the D. Z. Publishing Co., which publishes the *Deutsche Zeitung*, and editor of its sheet's English section, is not guilty before Magistrate Ellipstein in the Downtown Court, Brooklyn, yesterday, of criminal libel instituted by former Magistrate Joseph Goldstein. McLaughlin was in the custody of his attorney and further hearing next Wednesday.

Also named as defendants in the complaint are the publishing corporation, Walter Kappé, editor of the paper, John Doe, printer, and Richard Roe, distributor. Edward B. Bathon, attorney, appeared in behalf of the corporation and McLaughlin. Summonses returnable on the adjourned date, were issued for the three others.

According to Goldstein, the *Deutsche Zeitung*, in a comment which it printed last Saturday under the heading, "Joseph Goldstein Should Be Disbarred," characterized him as a "seamy and unscrupulous prostitute before the bar" who "tried to seduce and intimidate an American court through perjury."

The comment further referred to him, Goldstein declares in his affidavit, as "a lying criminal lawyer," as "the filthy Goldstein," as "a professional liar of the lowest possible sort," and concluded with, "New York City must be rid of such dirty, contemptible fellows as Joseph Goldstein."

The case referred to in the article dates back to June 20 last, when County Judge Fitzgerald in the Kings County Court sentenced three high school youths to jail after they had pleaded guilty to third degree assault for attacking a seventeen-year-old girl who was a pupil in the same high school which they attended.

Charged Persecution

After sentence was passed, Goldstein moved to set it aside, declaring that District Attorney Geoghan and Assistant District Attorney John Kean, who prosecuted the case, had led him to believe the boys would not be sent to jail.

He charged, at the time, that there had been a deliberate persecution of the boys because they, as Jews, had attacked a girl who was not Jewish.

Rites for Bialik Next Monday At Town Hall

All Zionist Factions Are United in Sorrow Over Death

By arrangement with Mayor Meier Dizengoff of Tel Aviv, Palestine, the memorial services for Chaim Bialik, Hebrew poet laureate and leader of the Hebrew Renaissance, will be held at Carnegie Hall on Monday, July 16 instead of tonight as scheduled, in order that the services may coincide with the funeral, it was announced yesterday by the Zionist Organization of America.

The body of the foremost Hebrew poet of many centuries is now on its way from Vienna, where he died last week, to his home in Tel Aviv. Mayor Dizengoff cabled the Zionist Organization of the date of the funeral and indicated that American Jewry's tribute to the departed writer and leader might more appropriately be voiced next Monday.

In their united sorrow at the passing of Bialik, all parties in American Zionism are forgetting their differences and are joining to sponsor the memorial meeting on Monday. In addition to representatives of the Zionist Organization of America, speakers will represent the Mizrahi, Revisionist Union, Order Sons of Zion, Hadassah and Poale Zion.

Services in Philadelphia

A memorial meeting to honor the memory of Chaim Nachman Bialik will be held at Bnai Bishalom tomorrow night.

Dr. Handelman, Rabbi Solomon M. Barsel and other speakers will address the assembly. Several of Bialik's poems will be read by the pupils of the Bnai Bishalom Hebrew School. Cantors Borenstein and Sheinfeld will chant appropriate hymns.

Rabbi Barsel will preside.

Englishman Praises Palestine Development

William H. Boulton of London, England, president of the South London branch of the Christadelphians, a Christian organization interested in the development of Palestine, said yesterday that Palestine is "the most impressive country in the world today because of the unusual industrial and agricultural activity, total employment and light taxation."

Mr. and Mrs. Boulton are here after a visit to the Holy Land. He spoke before the national board of Hadassah at the home of Mrs. Israel Brodie, 210 Riverside Drive.

Another speaker was Ben Z. Loefer, who discussed the problem of immigration in Palestine.

Film Censorship Campaign Opposed by Dr. Trippy

Catholic, Protestant and Jewish groups here which are now engaged in a campaign to end the production of indecent films and stage shows continued yesterday to elaborate their plans for the clean-up.

At the same time opposition to a severe censorship began to develop among various groups. The Rev. Dr. Worth M. Tippy, who declared that he was speaking for the National Council of Protestant Churches said that he was against censorship, but urged the motion picture producers to put their own house in order.

Calls Nazi Terror Proof Of New Crisis in Reich

Terror, minorities and the suppression of violence are characteristic measures taken by governments which are desperately trying to save the existing system during an economic crisis, according to Norman H. Tallentire, secretary of the New York City Central Committee of the American League against War and Fascism.

Alliance 'Baffled' by Fine Of Alleged Sunday Offender

A "novel and surprising decision" was the comment made yesterday by the Jewish Sabbath Alliance in reference to the judgment passed Tuesday on Charles Horowitz, 3 Mott street, by Magistrate William A. Farrell in Tombs Court. Horowitz was found guilty of selling merchandise on Sunday, despite his plea that he remained closed Saturdays. He was fined \$10.

This is the first time such a severe penalty has been imposed on a first offender, according to the Alliance whose counsel, Herman Koenigsberg, defended Horowitz in court.

N. Y. U. Jewish Students Praised for Scholarship

One hundred and ten Jewish students are among the one hundred and fifty who have been commended for high scholarship during the second semester of the 1934 academic year at the Washington Square College of New York University, according to an announcement today by Assistant Dean Palmer H. Graham.

Bronx Women To Rush Appeal This Summer

Mrs. Austin Lauds Unit Heads for Efforts in Drive

Fund-raising efforts for the United Jewish Appeal drive for German Jewish relief will be continued through the summer by the Bronx women's division, it was announced yesterday by Mrs. Benjamin Antin, in reporting on activities conducted to date for the campaign.

Pointing out that virtually every Jewish organization in the Bronx has allied itself with the efforts Mrs. Antin lauded leaders of the various groups who, regardless of their organizational responsibilities, have nevertheless actively cooperated to insure the success of the drive in the Bronx.

Conference of Parties and Organizations Ends in Fiasco

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
WARSAW, July 11.—The conference of all Polish Jewish parties and organizations, which was held here today and which was called for the purpose of forming a united Polish Jewish front, ended in a fiasco.

The failure to achieve unity came despite the fact that every speaker at the conference emphasized the dangerous situation in which Polish Jews find themselves today. Speaker after speaker pointed out that not only is Polish Jewry threatened with economic ruin, but that even elemental rights enjoyed by citizens everywhere are being denied.

The Agudath Israel, ultra-orthodox group, rejected the People's Party, the Zionist Revisionists, Jewish economic organizations, and the Judenstaat Party, formerly the Grossmanner Revisionists, agreed to join an all-Jewish representative body without laying down any conditions. However, the central committee of the Polish Zionists insisted that only politically independent organizations be allowed to join the new group, hinting that since the Agudath Israel is affiliated with the Polish government majority, it would be impossible for it wholeheartedly to defend Jewish interests if non-Jewish forces were involved.

Agudath Israel representatives contended that in internal Jewish affairs their organization is completely independent, but refused to agree to the withdrawal of the Agudath deputies in the Sejm from the government club.

At the same time the Agudath group rejected a motion made by the Revisionists and the Judenstaat party to form an all-Jewish group without the participation of the Polish Zionists. Speakers for the Agudath contended that the only value in an all-Jewish body would lie in the fact that all Jewish organizations would be represented and that without the Zionists it would be of no use.

Therias Police Arrest 36 Jews on Illegal Entry

JERUSALEM, July 11.—Therias police today arrested thirty-six Jewish women and children on the charge that they entered Palestine illegally. Information leading to the arrests was furnished the police by an Arab chauffeur of Therias. The entire group was jailed pending deportation.

Jewish World Conference Postponed Until August 20

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
GENEVA, July 11.—The Jewish world conference scheduled to have been held here on August 6, has been postponed until August 20. The Committee of Jewish Delegations informed the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that the postponement was due to the special demand of the American delegates that the conference be postponed to enable all Jewish groups to participate.

First U. S. Jewish Settler

Jacob Barsimon, who arrived in New Amsterdam from Holland in 1654, is reputed to be the first Jew to settle within the territorial limits of the United States.

Security of the Regime Brings Order—New Body Is Formed

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
MOSCOW, July 11.—The Soviet secret police, the GPU, were abolished today by order of the Tzlk, the Central Executive Committee of the Soviet Republic, and all GPU members transferred to the newly-created People's Commissariat of Internal Affairs.

Henry G. Yagoda, head of the GPU, was appointed Commissar of Internal Affairs, and his assistant, Yakov Saulovich Agrazov, was named vice-commissar. Both are Jews. George Prokofiev was appointed head of the commissariat.

The Tzlk decree also ordered that the judicial functions exercised by the GPU be turned over to the regular courts, which will be enlarged. The GPU has its own police force, courts and prisons and also had the power of sentencing prisoners to death. Hated and feared by opponents of the Soviet regime, it was regarded by the Communists as one of the most important departments of the government.

However, the growing security of the Soviet regime has brought open demands for the abolition of the GPU. Recently the Soviet Attorney General, in a speech at a Soviet congress, demanded the end of the secret police on the ground that its duty was only to punish and it was unable to operate in the fashion that courts could.

The newly-established commissariat will have many of the investigating powers formerly vested in the GPU, but in all cases evidence will be turned over to the regular courts, where judgments will be tried by regular judges.

The GPU was in charge of combating all counter-revolutionary activity in the Soviet Union. Abolition at this time would indicate that the Soviet regime is no longer afraid of internal enemies.

Yagoda, head of the GPU and now commissar of Internal Affairs, is regarded as one of the most efficient officials of the Soviet regime. He was in direct charge of digging the White Sea-Baltic Sea canal with workers, most of them disaffected peasant prisoners of the GPU. Not only was the canal finished in less than the scheduled time, but the prisoners cheered their GPU chief and praised him highly. Thousands of the prisoners were freed and their citizenship restored as a result of their good work on the canal.

'Aryans' Dip for Facts Of Reich Executions Into the Yiddish Press

PRAGUE, July 11.—Propaganda Minister Goebbels' strict censorship of the German press has resulted in a circulation room for foreign Yiddish newspapers among German "Aryans."

Germany's pure "Aryans" are turning to the Yiddish press to learn what is happening in their native land, particularly the Warsaw Yiddish papers. With most of the foreign press banned from German distribution, a few Yiddish newspapers, particularly the Warsaw Hain, are enjoying a wide sale in the Reich.

Berlin newstamps are being besieged by "Aryans" snatching up the Yiddish papers. Once they get the papers, they run to find a Jewish acquaintance to read and translate the contents for them.

Curiously, most of the lesser German officials, considering the Hebrew characters as some outlandish alphabet—Chinese some think similar—have not interfered with the sale of the papers.

British Mayor Slaps at Myth Of 'Little Hugh'

Denounces Ancient Libel as Lincoln Welcomes Jewish Visitors

LINCOLN, England, June 29.—The "Little Hugh" libel, circulated for the last seven centuries, was officially denounced here by the Mayor of Lincoln in his welcome to the members of the Jewish Historical Society who came to this city on a sight-seeing visit.

"This is perhaps the first occasion," declared the Mayor, "on which the Municipality of Lincoln has been in contact with any Jewish body since the Middle Ages. Our city is, of course bound up in history with the story of 'Little Saint Hugh,' said to have been taken to death by Jews for ritual purposes in 1255.

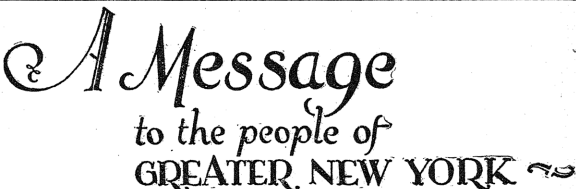
"That 'Little St. Hugh' existed," he continued, "and that his dead body was discovered, there is, I presume, little doubt. But that he

was done to death by the Jews for ritual purposes cannot be other than a libel, based upon the prejudice and ignorance of an unenlightened age. You will be glad to know that the Corporation have made this clear in the new guide book of the City which they have recently published."

Speaking at the Shrine of "Little St. Hugh," Canon J. H. Srawley, Chancellor of the Cathedral of Lincoln pointed out that the accusation against the Jews for ritual murder has lingered on since the Middle Ages. He was ashamed to say that these charges have been repeated in Germany during modern times.

Morgenstern Dies at 61; Was Internal Revenue Collector

Spectacular Rise of Ormandy Brings His Baton to Stadium

For the fortnight beginning Tuesday, July 17, Eugene Ormandy will conduct the Stadium concerts, receiving the baton from Joseph Hurbi. This engagement follows the young Hungarian's appearances with the Philadelphia Orchestra. Ormandy will conduct the opening of the summer season beginning July 15. And at midnight after his last performance in this city, he will sail for Europe to visit his birthplace and vacation before returning to his post as permanent conductor of the Minnesota Symphony Orchestra.

Ormandy's rise from the position of violinist in the last chair of the string section of the Capital Theatre Orchestra to his present position is one of the greatest symphony units in the country these years later is as spectacular as the genius that enabled him, Eugene Ormandy, to conduct a group composed of ninety entirely different programs, entirely by heart and without a score.

Thirty-six years ago in Budapest Ormandy's senior christened his infant son Jeno Hubay, and determined that the boy would become as great as his namesake. The result eclipsed even his hopes. Eighteen months later the babe Eugene could identify more than fifty pieces of music, and was hesitating to only the first notes.

At the age of three and one-half years his father had a special one-eighth size violin made for him, and he began his musical studies. Entering the Royal Hungarian Academy of Music at five, he made

his public debut two years later, and soon became the pupil of Hugo Beny, who later was graduated from the Academy, and three years later received his degree as Professor of Music, by special permission, because of his youth, from the Minister of Education.

Continental tours and command performances ensued, until he came to America in 1921 with a concert season. He was engaged providing for an extensive tour. Upon his arrival here, finding that the impresario's wealth consisted in a promise to give him a shift for his promise. The Capital Orchestra was the starting point. Thence his career has been a steady ascent. Through the "concert" union, the Judson Radio Program Corporation, the New York and Philadelphia Philharmonic Orchestras, culminating with the offer from Minneapolis where he has built up a symphony orchestra that ranks with the greatest in the musical world.

Anti-Nazi Put Hitler on Trial Here Monday

American Inquiry Group To Testify Against Him as Murderer

A mass trial of the Hitler regime in Germany, with witnesses of the American Inquiry Commission testifying, will take place Monday at 2 P.M. at the St. Nicholas Arena, 69 West 60th street, New York City, under the auspices of the Anti-Nazi Federation of New York. The Mass Trial at which the audience will give its verdict on the Nazi regime takes place on the day when Ernst Thaelmann is supposed to come to trial before the "People's Court," which has been condemned by the American Inquiry Commission as an instrument of legalized murder.

The witnesses at the trial will include Dr. Kurt Rosenfeld, former Minister of Justice in the Prussian Cabinet, former member of the Reichstag; Auerin Bevan, member of the English Parliament for the Labor Party; Frank Hoelzer, member of the German Reichstag; Maria Halberstadt, German high school teacher who was a witness at the American Inquiry Commission; and others who have participated in the American Inquiry Commission will be the prosecutor.

Rabbis Hit Fare Tax for City Relief

Wise and Goldstein Argue Against Method of Aiding Jobless

Elloquent pleas to avoid any tax measure for unemployment relief purposes which places additional burdens on the poor and needy have been voiced today by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise and Rabbi Sidney E. Goldstein.

Both rabbis appeared at City Hall before the joint committee of the Board of Estimate and the Board of Aldermen at the second of a series of hearings on proposals for financing the city's relief program.

Ridiculing the proponents of proposals to place a two or three cent tax on subway fares, Rabbi Wise, who appeared as a representative of the Board of Estimate, said these were people who "lay awake nights devising means of relieving the needy and poor" and then, as he issued, proposed a tax on the subway fare—a burden which would fall far more on the poor rather than on those who can best afford to pay.

"What about a plan for municipal lotteries, Rabbi?" asked Borough President James J. Lyons. Rabbi Wise, who has vigorously advocated lotteries as a means of raising adequate relief revenue.

Such a proposal is fantastic, childish and unworkable, he declared the Rabbi. "The plan is nothing but a swindle. It is adventurous and not worthy of the consideration of any thoughtful person."

Death Marches in Germany

S. S. Bands Invade Homes, Shoot Jews; War Vets Wounded in Raid

wounded and little hope was held out for his recovery. Two others received comparatively minor wounds.

The same S. S. gang broke into another home and arrested all the members of the family who had been playing cards, on the grounds that they were holding an illegal secret meeting.

There was a clash between the local police and the gang of S. S. men when the police made a belated appearance and tried to arrest the raiders.

In the Tempelhof area of Berlin, non-uniformed storm troops raided a social gathering of Jewish war veterans and started a violent fight. The raiders, armed with knives and daggers, wounded many of the war veterans and their friends. A few moments after he affray the president of the local chapter of the Jewish war veterans, Herr Sternberg, dropped dead of a heart attack as a result of the excitement caused by the assault on his home.

Doctor Believed Killed

In Glogau, Silesia, Dr. Linderman, well known figure in the local Jewish community, was arrested while playing tennis in his garden and was taken away by storm troops. It is assumed he is the one on whose identification available regarding his fate is that when Frau Linderman asked storm troops officials at their headquarters what she might do with her husband a coat suit he had been taken away without one. She was told: "Nothing is needed, we have found him."

In Dresden Dr. Melzer, the Jewish physician who refused to give the Hitler salute in a courtroom case, has been ordered to stand a new fraud trial because of his refusal. The president of the bar association of Saxony decided to submit the Melzer case to the superior court and sue him to prohibit Melzer from further practice of his profession.

In one of the Wuerttemberg districts, where Jews for a long time have been prohibited from appearing on the streets after nine o'clock in the evening, they were ordered to remain in the streets for three full days during the S. S. invasion of the district.

State Seeks Order

So far it is known the state authorities are doing everything in their power to restore order, especially in Silesia, former domain of the late Edmund Heise, who while the executive power which had been transferred from the police to the S. S. during the bloody week-end in March, had ordered Hitler's attack on his erstwhile lieutenants, has now reverted to the police.

Silesian Nazi papers have strenuously denounced the occurrences of the week at Hirschberg, where at least six Jews are known to have been killed. The Hirschberg attack is expected to result disastrously on Hirschberg's summer tourist business.

At the seat of the most violent anti-Semitic disturbances since Hitler came to power, chiefly because it is the center of activities for Julius Streicher, notorious anti-Semite who organizes the anti-Jewish boycott and has repeatedly incited anti-Jewish attacks through Der Stuermer, anti-Semitic weekly, the city is in a quiet state of eradication of the most violent elements among the storm troops.

Streicher Cools Down

Jews in Nuremberg have noticed, with hope, that Streicher now walks the streets of the city without carrying the heavy whip in his hand which had been almost his

badge of office.

Der Angriff, newspaper owned by Propaganda Minister Goebbels has renewed its anti-Jewish drive with a violent attack against the American film, "Roman Scandals," starring the American-Jewish comedian, Charlie Chan. The film, asserts Dr. Angriff, "illustrates the Jewish seditious which prevails in American films."

The Volkischer Beobachter, in a long article, demonstrates how "Jewish influence" has brought about the demoralization of Poland. The paper, owned by Hitler himself, repeats programs at being the "product of some nations' temperament which demands blood for expression. But the reaction to German peoples' attitudes, is simply for the separation and expulsion of the Jews from the most important functions."

From this it is inferred a new pogrom method has been devised for Germany, without bloodshed, without clamor, but terribly effective—much more so than ordinary pogroms.

Boycott is Disguised

The boycott of Jewish business men and professionals is continuing unabated, although it is disguised in many of its manifestations. A curious manifestation of this was the publication today in the Deutscher Mittelstand, official organ of the organization of artisans and professional men of the Rhine-Main district, of a list of all Jewish firms, lawyers and doctors still remaining in Frankfurt. The list is published without comment. The organization sponsoring the publication is recognized by the government.

Developments adversely affecting the Jewish economic position were feared today in the summary dismissal of Philip Kessler, who was considered friendly to the Jews, as director of German industry. Herr Kessler, who had urged economic equality for the Jews, was replaced by a well-spoken anti-Semite, Dr. von der Goltz.

Playwright Muehsam Suicide In Concentration Camp Cell

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, July 12.—An official statement today revealed that the Jewish playwright, Erich Muehsam, who was imprisoned in a Berlin concentration camp immediately after the Reichstag fire, committed suicide in his cell.

Ilse Einstein, Wife Of Exiled Journalist, Dies After Illness

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) PARIS, July 12.—Ilse Einstein, wife of the German Jewish journalist Rudolf Kayser, now in exile, died in Paris yesterday. Mrs. Kayser, who is a daughter of Max after the Reichstag fire, committed suicide in his cell.

a return. That his firm of Ivy & T. J. Ross, of which he is senior partner, has been making suggestions to officials of the German spy trust on how to procure favorable reaction abroad.

4) That these suggestions, along with advice on German rearmament, are forwarded to the Nazi government.

5) That Lee himself conferred with Hitler, Goebbels and von Papen during trips to Berlin early this year last year. He modified this admission, however, with the claim that "these meetings were confined to discussion of 'how to improve German-American relations.'"

6) That he privately had warned German officials against continuance of the policy of anti-Semitism on the ground: "America would always resent the treatment of Jews of Germany."

Lee in Europe

Lee, who is now in Europe, was given permission by the committee to go abroad on the understanding that he would return immediately after an inspection scheduled to make in London on July 3, unless the committee called him that he would not be required to testify.

That the committee ordered the publisher's office to cable him to return to New York by July 12 or 13, Lee has remained in Europe, the German "Duessel" newspaper, a bookkeeper for the firm, were called instead.

After about an hour of severe grilling by McCormack and Dickstein, during which Schmitz was asked about propaganda efforts of the German Tourist Agency in this country and during which he discussed free trips given by German officials to American tourists, the lecturer, and Karl R. Kitchen, writer, in return for favorable publicity for Germany, the witness then left the room into an uproar when he was released.

"I understand that the chairman of the House Immigration Committee sought similar favors from me."

Dickstein's face reddened.

"What?" he demanded. Schmitz repeated his assertion. "We won't mind yours," Dickstein said then. "I am the chairman of the House Immigration

Committee, and when I went to Germany in 1932 you socked me exactly \$350, and I want to tell you the service was rotten. I have never sought favors from German or any other steamship lines."

Schmitz replied, "I learned that you did from (John) Schroeder of the North German Lloyd Line."

Dickstein Explains

In response to accusations made by George Sylvester Viereck during the trial, Dickstein yesterday session stating that he considered the Jewish Daily Bulletin and the Philadelphia Record as having gained access to records of the private hearings of the committee. Congressman Dickstein said later in the day that the particular testimony to which he referred had been taken by a non-governmental reporter from Washington. Both he and Congressman McCormack assured the public that they would bring the matter to the attention of authorities and demand that the proper action be taken with regard to the reporter of the proceedings.

To spread good-will and a better understanding between ourselves and the American people, we opposed as enemies in the trenches, and as the aim and purpose of our national organization and its local posts, the withdrawal of these delegations from the Federation followed a declaration of the German and Austrian Veterans that 'the Swastika is an American symbol that constitutes an insult to the Jewish comrades within our ranks' after it repulsed efforts of certain members of that body to align with the Friends of the New Germany."
