The statement made by Senator Alfred M. Cohen, president of the B'nai B'rith, in answer to the recent attack on the B'nai B'rith in Germany published in the Nazi press, will hardly convince the Nazis of the humanitarian and phi-lanthropic work of this Jewish organization. The Hitlerites know very well the scope and the purpose of the activities of the B'nai B'rith, but they are deliberately seeking to discredit this fraternal Jewish

"Against the charge made by a malicious or uninformed jour-nal that the B'nai B'rith is a 'secret order against Aryans,' it may not be inappropriate to di-rect attention to the very many eleemosynary, charitable, educational and patriotic undertakings which B'nai B'rith has supported in Germany, and which, unless interfered with by force, still continue as blessings not only for Jews, but for all peace lov-ing Germans," writes Mr. Cohen. ing Germans," writes Mr. Cohen,
"They include the Manheimer
Foundation, the Ahlem Agricultural School, the training
schools for nurses in Berlin, Frankfurt and Munich, the technical schools for instruction of boys in trades and mechanical handicrafts, employment bu-reaus, a sanitorium for poor Jewish children at Bad Nauheim, a German Jewish children's home at Dletz, numerous orph-anages, asylums and schools for backward children, and recrea-

Mr. Cohen points out that dur-ing the three-year period of 1928-1931, B'nai B'rith expended in Germany \$350,000 a year on these educational and charitable institutions.

Much Kosher Stavsky Appeal Poultry Bogus, Decision Is Set Hearing Told For Tomorrow

Simon Makes Disclosure as Shochtim Ask \$45-\$65 Pay

Much of the poultry that goes under the name of kosher in New York City is, in reality, not kosher, it was disclosed yesterday at the first hearing conducted by Judge Otto Rosalsky, newly appointed mediator of the poultry market difficulties, in his chambers in the Criminal Courts Building.

Arthur Simon, Health Department confidential investigator in charge of Kashruth and adviser to Judge Rosalsky, said, an investigation of New York City poultry markets revealed that in many markets fowl was being was being many markets fowl was being slaughtered so rapidly, under the sure of market ow ers, that it was not kosher.

Spokesmen for Shochtim Union Local 440, the organization of slaughterers, agreed with Simon's assertion.

Reich and Prussia. Dr. Frick issued an official order notifying all employes of the German government regardless of their position that they must without delay once again submit proof that they and their wives are "pure Aryans."

Dr. Frick's order was hailed by extremist anti-Jewish elements in extremist anti-Jewish elements in the Third Reich as evidence that the Nazi government had no in-tention of easing up in the cam-paign against the Jews.

Shortage of Labor In Palestine Admitted

LONDON, July 18.—Captain W. F. Strickland, Conservative, again raised the question of the tremendous shortage of labor in Palestine in the House of Commons today. Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, British Secretary of State for Colonies who answered for the government for the first time admitted that there is a shortage of labor, adding that the Palestine government had granted permission for 500 skilled building trades workers to enter the country in addition to the usual number of Jewish immigrants on the regular quota.

Nazi Editor Held in \$500 Bail As Goldstein Libel Suit Is Heard Stahlhelm Unit.

Magistrate Joseph Goldstein in his Magistrate Joseph Goldstein in his eriminal libel suit against the Deutsche Zeitung, Nazi organ published here, pleaded not guilty before Magistrate Gasper Liota in the Downtown Court, Brooklyn, vesterday.

Walter Kappe, editor of the Walter Kappe, editor of the German section of the pro-Nazi brgan, was held in \$500 bail and Carl Voelcker, president of the D. Z. Publishing Corporation, which publishes the paper, was placed in the custody of his attorney for further hearing August 20. Two codefendants, William L. McLaughlin, vice president of the corporation and editor of the Engsection of the sheet, and the D. Z. Publishing Corporation, who had pleaded not guilty to similar charges last week, were continued in the custody of their attorney. Walter G. Bathon.

The suit is based upon an edi-The suit is based upon an edi-torial published in the Deutsche Zeitung July 7th last, entitled "Joseph Goldstein Should Be Dis-Joseph Goldstein Should Be Dis-barred," accusing Goldstein of perjury in his defense of three high school students who were convicted of assault.

Sooks Associate Counsel

The request for an adjournment of about a month was made by Bathon, who explained to the of about a month was made by Bathon, who explained to the court that a delay was necessary to allow him to engage an associate and to interview County Judge John J. Fitzgerald of Kings County, District Attorney Geog-han and Assistant District Attornev John Kean, whose statements ording to the attorney, prompted the article in the Zeitung.

In the case referred to Judge Fitzgerald sentenced one of the youths to the New York County penitentiary for an indeterminate term and sentenced the other two to a year in city prison.

After sentence was passed Goldstein moved to set it aside, declaring that Geoghan and Kean, who prosecuted the case, had led him to believe that the boys would not be sent to fail.

Charged Deliberate Persecution He charged there had been a deliberate persecution of the boys dennerate persecution of the toys because they, Jews, had attacked a girl who was not Jewlsh. He said that a detective "named En-right" had offered "to fix the case for \$800."

"That story is a manufactured story," Judge Fitzgerald retorted at the time. "I don't believe it. You came to my chambers, but never made that disclosure to me You have the effrontery to stand up here and say that this case was not given full consideration by me. No other case has given me so much concern as this. No promise as to sentence was ever given to you, and you know it.'
Kean denied that he or Geogham had ever given assurance that there would be suspended sen-tences imposed.

"The old adage that it is an ill wind that blows nobody good seems to apply to the Jews in Germany in the matter of the recent clean-up. So busy are the Nazis with their own troubles that nobody is taking much no-tice of the "non-Aryans" and tice of the "non-Aryans" and they are being allowed to slip into the background. Certainly the flood of anti-Jewish items in

the newspapers has distinctly diminished." On the same day our own correspondent in Berlin, Boris Smolar, cables that there should he no illusions about any pos-

sible improvement in the Jewish position in Germany, and that the organ of Propaganda Mini-ster Goebbels, Der Angriff, supports this theory completely. The official organ of Propagand-The official organ of Propagand-ist Goebbels has just published a long article on "The Jews as Pacifists," containing a vicious attack on the Jews, quoting scripture in justification of anti-Jewish propaganda.

The "Ritual Murder" organ of Dr. Julius Streicher, close com-rade of Hitler and Governor of Franconia, is conting his Franconia, is continuing his blood-thirsty campaign against the Jews. His organ, Der Stuer-mer, in screaming headlines, inmer, in screaming neadines, in-cites the population by publish-ing such slogans as "The Jews are our worst enemies" and "Whoever buys from Jews is a traitor to the German nation."

Hitlerism is synonymous with anti-Semitism. Judophobia is the anti-Semitism. Judophobia is the major part of the Hitler pro-gram. No amelioration in the situation of German Jewry is possible as long as Hitler is in power, even if Hitler were to change suddenly his attitude to-ward the Jewa. First Hitlerism will be stamped out, and then will be stamped out, and them the German people may be cured of the rabid disease of anti-Semitism with which he has been infecting them for the past fourteen years.

Mr. Bernstein emphasized that Palestine is the only permanent solution for the dilemma in which expatriated German Jews find themselves."

"Palestine," he said, "is the only place in the world that actually clamors for additional Jewish im-migration. A feverish activity is seen in almost all lines of endeavor -building, planting, transportation and education."

Aided Many Refugee

HIAS, he added, through its participation with Emigdirect and Ica has been a pillar of light to stranded German Jews.

In Russia, the HIAS officials discussed with authorities the possibility of entry for certain classes of German and other Jews. They report that they were received with sympathetic interest and given indications of willingness to cooperate. In addition they have concluded an agreement with Torgsin to facilitate the aid which some Russians receive from Amer ican relatives.

Mr. Bernstein declared it was hard to recognize Russia, where he was born, due to the extraordinary changes wrought by Com

"But paradoxical as it may seem there is little or no Communism in Russia," Mr. Bernstein said. "There is Socialism, or perhaps, State Capitalism. There is private ownership of personal property and even of real estate sufficient for home and garden

"People in Russia lead a very hard life. Practically all of them are working—there is very little unemployment in Russia—but their wages are inadequate to provide them with the necessities of life, not to mention the comforts. The young bear this hardship with fortitude. They have faith that things will be better, as the Soviet be-comes a beacon light for the rest of the world. But the old are mis-

"Especially pathetic is the con-dition of the elderly Jews and Jewesses. They were engaged mostly in businesses. They had no land. They know no trade. They are not physically capable of doing rough work and they find it hard to fit themselves into the new scheme of things

Plight of Old Pathetic

"Many of them have children in America. They have apparently forgotten of their existence. Five dollars a month in the shape of an order on Torgsin would save se elderly folk from privation and give them a little sunshine in their declining days. We are sure that if the children or other relatives of these people would realize what good their few dollars would produce, they would come to the aid of these hapless beings." Back Boycott, Revive German Unions, Says Rosenberg on Radio

Pointing out that the destruc-tion of the labor unions in Ger-many by the Nazi regime was inspired by the great industrialists of that country who feared their power, I, Arthur Rosenberg, at-torney, in an address last night over radio station WARD, urged all laborers in the United States to rally to the support of German labor by joining in the anti-Nazi as the most effective boycott means of reviving its former pow-er. The broadcast was under the auspices of the American Jewish Congress.

"The labor unions in other European countries," Rosenberg said, "notably Czechoslovakia and France have joined in the boycott movement against Germany. It is the duty of every working per-son and of every broadminded human being to participate in the boycott of German products so that the present regime in Germany may be forced out and labor in Germany may again resume its humane activities and that labor throughout the world may be reassured that its hard-gained vic tories will not have been in vain."

Hungarian Jewry
To the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin:
May I take this opportunity to
correct the article which appeared in the Jewish Daily Bulletin on July 16, page 5, under the heading "Hungary Backs Move to Solve Problems of Three Jewish Sects," written by a Jewish Telegraphic correspondent, Mr.

It is my privilege to know the problems of the Hungarian Jews. problems of the Hungarian Jews, since I was, until recently, chief rabbi in one of the oldest Jewish communities in Hungary. I deem it a necessity to inform the readers of the Jewish Daily Bulletin about the true situation of the Jewish communities in Hungary.

About sixty-five years ago, on December 27, 1867, Hungarian Jewry won its emancipation, and in the following year, on December 10, 1868, the Hungarian government called together a congress ment called together a congress of delegates representing the Jews. With the approval of the majority of the delegates this Congress drew up a constitution which was not in harmony with the Jewish Code of Law, known under the name of "Shulchan Aruch." On June 14, 1869, Emperor Francis Joseph gave his sanction to this constitution.

Draws Own Code

However, Orthodox Jewry, However, Orthodox Jewry, re-fusing to submit to the constitu-tion, drew up one of its own, whose principles were in accord-ance with the Shulchan Aruch. After a hard and long fight the statutes of this latter Constitution were also officially accepted by the emperor. Having secured a con-stitution of their own, the Orthoemperor. Having secured a con-stitution of their own, the Ortho-dox Jews organized themselves throughout the entire country as a separate, independent, religious A third group, being dissatisfied

A third group, being dissatisfied with the splitting of Jewry into two organized bodies, declared their refusal to join either of these and organized themselves into a third party, called "Status-quo-ant," i.e. everything is to stay as it was before the meeting of the Congress, that every community remain independent and autonoremain independent and autono-mous, without a centralized or-ganization. To this latter party belonged well-known rabbis and eminent laymen, representing about sixty large communities.

Among them were numerous chassidic rabbis and talmudic scholars, who belonged solely because they would not submit to a centralized organization as long as there was dissension among the Hungarian Jews. Consequently, although the law recognizes only one Jewish community, there are in reality three factions.

Were Neolog Jews Those communities which cepted the statutes created by the Congress were the progres Neolog Jews, who refused to recognize the division of Jewry into three bodies. They used their political influence to cause the gov-ernment to call another Congress into session for the purpose of drawing up a new set of statutes which would satisfy all factions and would thereby preserve the unity of the Hungarian Jews. The Orthodox and the Status-Quo-Ante factions refused to participate in

the proposed Congress.

The progressive Jewish communities, the so-called Neolog Jews, would not convene without the Orthodox and Status-Quo-Ante groups, because by doing so they would be admitting the existence of three separate factions, and or three separate factions, and they would be denying the possi-bility that there can and will be a united Hungarian Jewry. Fierce arguments ensued. The Orthodox group stood firm in their own recognized independence. That, by no means, would bind themselves to any organization of progressive

The Neolog faction finally recognized that it was impossible to achieve their goal of uniting Hun-garian Jewry and they abandoned

it. With the permission of the government they called their own convention, to meet October 15 1934, for the purpose of complet-ing and modifying their obsolete and outworn constitution

Purpose of Congress

I want to state in opposition to your correspondent that according to a decree of June 2, 1934, issu by the Hungarian government, the purpose of the Congress will only be to modify the old constitution and to adjourn after this has been accomplished and not, as your correspondent has stated, to "become a permanent institution which will be regularly convened whenever Hungarian Jewry finds it necessary to decide momentous prob-lems of the day."

Also, as opposed to a statement made by Mr. Wiener, the fact is that the new Congress can only be called together by a decree of the government and not by the Jewish leaders alone.

In closing, I offer my final criticism which is that Mr. Wiener was wrong in stating that this Congress aims at a unification. It actually ratifies "tripartarianism." Despite the fact that the Hungarian law recognizes only one religious community, it is appar-ent that, by giving its consent to the new Congress, the government said in accepting the post, "have said in accepting the post, "have three independent divisions to govern their own religiou and so-cial life. Through this new de-velopment "tripartarianism" be-came stronger than ever in Hungarian Jewry.

Yours Very Truly-"

On February 7, 1934, Carter wrote: "Have received and ack-nowledged Fulliam's letter, which caused a distinct fluttering in the dove-cotes, but left me without doubt as to his sincerity. The only point is: How many people does he influence? How many people are prepared to follow him or you along Fascist lines? What methods do you propose to follow to gain your power? In other words, is he simply a 'nuisance value' for po-litical purposes or is there any real belief in your inner councils that Fascism, organized as a political movement will get to first base in

this country? "Now as a practical man, I don't care how we get economic liberty, whether through HR4747 or another device, whether through the Democratic party, the Communists,

or 'the American Fascists.' As a practical man, however, I believe that the shortest route to action lies through the man who has the power of initiative and political action, namely President Roose-velt, and all of my present activities are directed to making desirable action politically expedient, where you would make failure to take that action politically dangerous."

Denies He's a Crusader

On March 30, 1934, Carter again wrote: "Tell Higgins I immediately and formally contradicted his statement that I am a supporter of yours in the political sense. I am not and never have been. I am supporting Roosevelt and will continue to do so until further notice, as you very well know.

"Your financial plan for eco-nomic liberty is what I am interested in, but your political methested in, but your political meth-ods are entirely different to my own, and I want it perfectly clear that I am no more taking orders from you than you are from me. I have no more intention of wear-ing your livery than I have of coming out as a Fascist or Com-munist. I'll work with Rossevit so long as he is going my direction,

as he is now. Yours Christians was more than eager to surrender the above correspondence to me. I believe he may have pouted in this manner at Carte failure to join him wholeheartedly. It is possible that Christians had felt that a number of other persons whose confidential corres-pondence is exposed here had outlived their usefulness to him.

"I regret that I can not furnish

you with a list of our members for various reasons, the principal one being that we are under obligations not to reveal our membersations not to reveal our member-ship. We greatly appreciate the Senator's activities in tearing down and showing up the Wall Street racket and its henchmen. We have done a lot of this destructive work too.

"However we feel that the de-struction is about complete and that it is time to forcibly present our constructive program. We are starting this with a patriotic dem-onstration of the Crusaders for Economic Liberty on July 4th at Columbus, Georgia. We cordially invite the Senator to take part in the demonstration and feel sure that his own interests would be immensely benefitted by getting on the band wagon at the start."

Pressed for an explanation, as I sometimes was, I would refer to the heaps of current works into which I had to dip and write about for a living. Of course there were other reasons and one of them was the natural disinclination to perform a duty, a task pledged. Perhaps, had I taken my word more lightly would have read through book on some easygoing after-noon, or on a train ride, or on an insemniac night, but I took that nledge with such dead earnestness that I postponed the ta The Constant Item

With the passage of the years came the depression and things happened to our jobs and we happened to our jobs and we drifted apart, and saw each other y. Then I read that he had but the obligation weighed no less heavily upon my con-science. My collection of books was subjected to weeding after was subjected to weening after weeding, but the red-bound, gold-lettered gift of my friend re-mained untouched. My collection mained untouched. My collection of books has so steady a turnover that I have refrained for that reason from acquiring a bookplate. We moved from one part of the Bronx to another. My friend's book moved with us. We moved from the Bronx to downtown Manhattan. The book moved with us. Again we moved, a little to the northeast, and again packed and unpacked that volume. It wasn't that I didn't want to read it, it was that I had bound myself to read it and it was also, to be frank about it, that I might find that it wasn't worth the em-phasis which my friend had placed

'Jewish World Plot' at Grahamstown

JOHANNESBURG, South Afri-July 18.—Herr Moltke, Nazi ler of the Southwest African Grey Shirts, who is on trial to-gether with his colleagues Inch and Olivier before a Grahamstown court on a charge of having fab-ricated and disseminated documents tending to arouse the popu-lace against the Jews, today of-fered as a "defense" to prove the existence of a "Jewish world plot" as outlined in the notorious "Proto-cols of the Elders of Zion."

As his first witness the German Nazi leader called on Captain Beamish, editor of the anti-Semimeamsn, editor of the anti-Semi-tic Patriot of London and compiler of a scurrilous "Jewish Who's Who." Captain Beamish testified Captain Beamish testified Who." Captain Beamish testined that he had studied the Jewish question for thirty years; that he knew Hitler and other Nazi lead-ers personally, and that the Ger-man Nazis had consulted him on the Jewish problem because of his the Jewish protein occase of his friendship with the notorious The-odor Fritsch of Leipzig, publisher of anti-Semitic books and once convicted by a German court of having grossly libelled the German

Practically all the governments of the world are controlled by the Jews, while the Soviet government is ninety per cent. Jewish, the English anti-Semite stated, offering to prove to the court that the "Protocols" were true in every re-

Upholds "Protocols"

Herr Moltke then read various chapters of the "Protocols," the while Captain Beamish nodded asery plan outlined in the Beamish claimed that "Protoery plan outlined in the "Proto-cols" had come true. He backed his assertions by declaring that "practically all the landowners in England had been forced out of existence and forced to marry wealthy Jewesses."

"All political parties in the world are controlled by Jews," the captain declared, adding that an integral part of the "Jewish plot" was the "demoralization of the young Christians of the world by Jewish films, jazz music and the sculpture of Jacob Epstein."

The Jews are a menace," Beam-ish continued. "They have secured a hold on the English aristocracy, parliament and on other English institutions. I taught Henry Ford the meaning of the Jewish menace and I followed closely his utter-ances on the Jewish question," the captain boasted.

He also declared that the "in-ternational financiers are Jews and have a stranglehold on the entire world. Rothschild controls gold, the Guggenheimers control copper, and the Oppenheimers control all the diamonds. That is why the Hitler movement was found ed." Beamish said.

At an earlier session prosecu-At an earner session prosection witnesses testified to finding in the possession of the defendants a list of people who were to be executed if and when Germany regained her former colony, Southwest Africa, Every Jewish lawyer in the territory and a number of Christian Masons listed as "philo-Semitic" were included in the death list.

Dr. Nahum Sokolow, president of the World Zionist Organization, has already testified how he and Ward Price of the London Times had exposed the "Protocols" as a rank forgery based on a pamphlet directed against Napoleon III. "I know how complex is the shochet's work. I know that it takes time to kill a chicken in accordance with the kosher ritual. I am concerned not only with the labor but with the religious aspect of the problem, for the Jews of New York City must be guaranteed kosher poultry."

Two large New York banks have severed connections with the Dresdner Bank of Danzig, which is Nazi-controlled, as a result of a complaint lodged by the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi Ieague, it was announced by the League yester-

According to information re-ceived by the League from the Central Anti-Hitler Committee of Poland and the Central Assoc tion of Merchants of Warsaw, the two New York banks had been transmitting money from the United States to clients in Poland, many of them Jews, through the Nazi bank.

When the matter was brought to the attention of the American to the attention of the American banks by Ezekiel Rabinowitz, ex-ecutive secretary of the League, it was explained that the services of the Dresdner bank had to be used for some time after the Hitler regime came into power because of a contract, but that since the expiration of the contract the busi-ness has been turned over to American agencies and their Po-lish correspondent.

The New York banks in ques-tion are understood to be two of the largest in the city, but for business reasons have requested that their names be withheld.
