STAVSKY REVERSED COURT APPEAL

NOW— EDITORIAL NOTES By HERMAN BERNSTEIN

Tisha B'Ab

On this, the ninth day of Ab, Jews are observing the Fast of Tisha B'Ab, in commemoration of the destruction of the First and Second Temples. Israel's glorious past as a nation, in its own land, is recalled, and Jeremiah's stirring Lamentations are chanted.

The enemies of Israel succeeded in humbling and defeating the Jewish people, in burning down their Temples, and driving them into exile, chiefly because of the internal dissension within Israel. But Israel's spirit and its devotion to the immortal ideals that have justified its existence throughout the ages and that have enabled it to cope with all the unspeakable sufferings, still live on.

Palestine, the ancient homeland of the Jewish people, is being rebuilt by Jewish pioneers and idealists.

The position of Israel among the nations—in the United States, in England, in France, in Soviet Russia, in Czechoslovakia—is a position of equals who are contributing their share to the upbuilding of the lands in which they live, fulfilling their obligations and enjoying their rights as citizens of those countries. In Poland, too, they have now been restored to an equal political status, though their economic plight there is still tragic.

The storm center of Jewish righteousness and humiliation is now in Nazi Germany. Though they are the worst sufferers, they are not alone in their martyrdom. The Hitler government has imposed a reign of bloody terror upon all right-thinking and peace-loving people, and has, for a time, eliminated Germany from the family of civilized nations.

The anniversary of the destruction of the Temples serves to remind us that internal strife and dissension, which caused our tragedies in the past, must not be avoided, in Palestine as well as in other lands wherever Jews live. Only deep and sincere international unity is to the anti-Semitic International.

Vindicated

Abraham Stavsky has been acquitted by the Court of Appeals. It is a real triumph of justice. A close study of the preliminary examination and the testimony presented at the trial could not fail to convince any

Nazi Paper Apologetic in Race Stand

Hitler Organ Says Reich
Is Misunderstood
on Policies

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN, July 20.—What may be regarded as a defensive and somewhat apologetic editorial on the Jewish question is featured in today's issue of the *Voelkischer Beobachter*, Adolf Hitler's own newspaper.

"Germany," the editorial says in effect, "doesn't worry as to how the Jews interpret the racial policy of the National Socialist party. However, Germany wouldn't like other races to think it discriminated against them."

The *Beobachter* then points out that racial animosity exists in England, where it is directed against its colonials, and also in America, where its object is the Negroes. Nevertheless, the writer complains, nobody misunderstands these countries, while with respect to Germany the race question is used as an issue.

The *Beobachter* concludes its editorial with assurances that other races are being fully respected in Germany, but carefully avoids saying the same for the Jews.

Appeals Court Reverses Death Verdict, Jabotinsky Hails Freeing of Revisionist

Vindicates British
Justice, Leader
States

LONDON, July 20.—Vladimir Jabotinsky, president of the World Union of the Zionist Revisionists, today issued a statement hailing the acquittal of Abraham Stavsky in Jerusalem, thanking the court for its judgment and urging Palestinian authorities to continue their hunt for the real murderer of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff.

"The court may be sincerely congratulated for having acquitted an innocent man, thus vindicating the fair fame of British justice," Mr. Jabotinsky said.

"We are glad to see in the verdict of the court a promise that whatever controversy may be pending or will further arise between Zionists and the mandatory power will be confined to issues of purely political and administrative character and will not involve apprehension as to the basic character of the social order and impartial justice.

See Hope for Achmeier
"We now confidently expect that the higher courts will take a further step in the same direction and revise the sentences imposed on Alva Achmeier and others accused in the British Habryimron trial.

"We also hope that all efforts will be made to discover the murderer of Dr. Arlosoroff and no track which is now at the disposal of the authorities will be neglected.

"We trust that now the Palestine administration, guided by the advice of the imperial government, will be enabled to quietly readjust criminal investigation practices in Palestine in order to bring it up to the British standard.

"The Jewish people will ever gratefully remember all who gallantly fought for Jewish honor and the cause of justice, including Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff."

ABRAHAM STAVSKY

Local Zionists Laud Stavsky Court Ruling

Leaders Are Unanimous
in Gratification
at Verdict

Unanimous gratification at the setting aside Friday by the Palestine Court of Appeals of the conviction of murder against Abraham Stavsky was expressed by Zionist and Jewish communal leaders of the metropolitan area when they were asked by the Jewish Daily Bulletin for their reaction to the news flashed from Jerusalem. Some representative opinions followed by these personages are as follows:

MORRIS ROTENBERG, President, the Zionist Organization of America: The news of Stavsky's acquittal is most gratifying. It ends the grave doubt which was left in the minds of many as to the correctness of the conclusion of the trial court, and it removed the stain of guilt of the foul murder of Dr. Arlosoroff from the hands of a Jew. The decision of the Court of Appeals is another evidence of the fairness and high-mindedness of British courts of justice.

ELIAS GINSBURG, Chairman of the Central Executive Committee of the Zionist-Revisionist Organization of America: We are, of course, happy that an innocent man has been acquitted and that the sinister shadow of the gallows that loomed over him threatening Zionism and the future of the Jews in Palestine has been removed.

The labored motivation of the Palestine Court of Appeals must be interpreted as an effort to save

Huge Throng Goes
Wild With Joy
at News

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JERUSALEM, July 20.—Abraham Stavsky, convicted of the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff by the Criminal Court of Assizes, was acquitted today by the Palestine Court of Appeals, which set aside the verdict of the lower court and ordered the immediate discharge of Stavsky from custody. More than a year of imprisonment Stavsky stepped out of the courtroom a free man.

There was a hush in the courtroom as the red-robed, be-wigged judges entered and solemnly took their place. Amid a strained, anxious silence Chief Justice Sir Michael Francis Joseph McDonnell began to read the verdict which freed Stavsky of the onus of having killed Dr. Arlosoroff.

The Judgment
"I cannot agree that the failure of the lower court to set out detailed findings vitiated their judgment, although it is unfortunate that no details were given," the Chief Justice declared.

"I cannot agree that Mrs. Arlosoroff's identification of Stavsky was supported by Captain Stafford's testimony, though this was also unfortunate."

"With all respect to the dissenting judgment in the Assize Court (a reference to Judge Moeshe Valero, who wanted to acquit Stavsky) I take the view that a sexual motive for the crime is pure hypothesis."

"In England Mrs. Arlosoroff's evidence alone would have been sufficient, but here corroborative evidence is necessary, which was not forthcoming. The evidence given by the trackers was unsatisfactory, while the evidence of the scratch on Stavsky's hand falls with that of the trackers. The evidence given by Weiser is inconsistent and unsatisfactory as corroboration."

"I cannot agree that a fleeting glimpse of Stavsky after three weeks is enough to corroborate the testimony of Mrs. Arlosoroff. Therefore as no corroborative evidence is available, the conviction is capable of being set aside."

"The appeal is therefore allowed and the accused is discharged." Justices Baker and de Freitas concurred in the decision delivered by the Chief Justice.

With the announcement of the verdict pandemonium broke loose in the crowded courtroom. Stavsky's family and many others wept with joy, while Stavsky himself

Pertinent and Impertinent

The following letter which the Woman's page received a short while ago seems to me so worthwhile that I am including it in this column:

My dear Mrs. Guggenheimer:

While recently in Washington I had tea with a very delightful Japanese lady. You must imagine her as an English University graduate (Oxon.), clever, vivacious, well-informed on artistic and literary as well as economic and political topics, and groomed to perfection in a dream of a French satin gown with white organdie collars and cuffs. We talked about everything in God's world from proteins to paintings, from Fascism to frocks. And of course I admired her toilette. "You are always wearing European clothes!" I asked. "Not always," she confessed. "I am an expert at home and wear them without any self-consciousness, but once a week I make it a point to wear traditional Japanese costume, with my obi tied in the approved butterfly-fashion. I do it to keep up the contact with my native civilization, my own race. Were I not doing it I should lose something vital and important, something that would make me less acceptable to my European friends. We always have to keep in contact with the soil we sprung from. If that contact is entirely broken we perish, just as the giant Antaeus perished when he could no longer touch his Mother Earth from which he derived all his strength."

These words seemed to me so true and so significant that, as a constant reader of your column, I want to hand them on to you and your audience. For I do feel that the modern Jewess is too apt to forget in the acceptance of Western civilization the roots that bind her to her own people and its distinctive traditions. The modern Jewess becomes easily *deracinee* and loses thus one vital power. Do not think for a moment that I advocate a return to the restricted formalism of orthodox life. By no means. But every Jewish woman should, I feel, do at least once a week some beautiful and definite thing that will remind her that she is the daughter of an ancient race with an age-old culture. The mere lighting of a candle on Sabbath eve, even without any prayer or formula, is a gesture which would be enough. But to ban everything that is typically Jewish from our life seems to me a grave mistake that tends to de-vitalize the race.

I should be glad to have your and your readers' reactions to this suggestion.

It seems to me that the traditions of our race should be an integral part of our family lives. Not only for the sake of our children, but for the sake of sentiment, this should be. We ought not become so practical-minded that the lovely, old sentiments of the past have no place in our world.

Civilization Without Tolerance Is Impossible, She Says

The great Belgian poet-philosopher, Maurice Maeterlinck, once wrote that every great sorrow brings us unexpected gifts to enrich our life. Only the majority of us, however, are too stupid to receive these gifts, and our sorrows leave us bereft and impoverished.

It is, therefore, a special privilege to present today to our readers a woman who was suddenly thrust from the heights of wealth, position and world grandeur to the very depths of poverty, destitution, and who yet refused to despair. She was one of the few among us ready to receive the unexpected gifts her sorrow brought her, and with the help of them she has built for herself a new life, a life of creative work, of rich human contacts, of usefulness and happiness.

This woman is Princess Catherine Radziwill. Her moving and fascinating story can be read in her interesting book "It Could Have Happened," a human story full of power and sincerity. Beautiful, rich, fated, a member of the greatest Russian princely family, she found herself through the fortunes of war and revolution penniless in the slums of New York. Yet, with a rare contact with the indomitable power of her personality, she carved out for herself a career as writer and lecturer, and today she has won back the dead peace of resignation but the living peace of immortality.

The Gift of Talk

One meets her in her cozy apartment, full of books, flowers, pictures, on the hearth her house-dog, a delightful white porcelain rabbit that sits there with a mien of occult wisdom and to whom Princess Radziwill talks as to a dear friend. And if anyone possesses the gift of talk, then it is surely she. With charm, grace, vivacity and real insight, she touches on the most varied subjects, shedding on each a brilliant and often surprising light. European politics are interesting here, but the following is even more so, with profound understanding. Conditions in Germany are moving her deeply, and she is relentless in her condemnation.

"That Germans can accept and

endure the Hitler-regime," she declares, "proves once and for all that they have never been really civilized. They were learned, yes, I grant that, but mere learning and mere technical knowledge does not constitute civilization. Without tolerance, civilization is impossible."

And with the brilliant vivacity so characteristic of her she adds: "For the Jews, who know, Hitler is a blessing. For there are people—I do not speak of professional anti-Semites; they are beyond the pale—who do not know Jews and have an slavistic distrust and dislike of anything strange. But seeing to what moral depth and degradation a regime of intolerance can lead, they will be ashamed of their distrust and dislike and test it out of their very heart as a dangerous and poisonous growth. The sympathy of the entire world is that the gift that Hitler has given to the Jews."

Then she speaks of her work. She is preparing for Fall publication a biography of Empress Frederick—a woman, Princess Radziwill says smilingly—as misundestood, defamed and hated as the Jews, as unjustly insulted and persecuted. And finally she praises America which has taught her that true happiness is only to be found in personal effort, in constant endeavor, in living with and for one's fellow-men.

And when one leaves her, one takes away a deep and lasting impression. The impression of one who was once a great princess and enjoyed life, and who is now a great woman who has mastered life.

N.Y. Library Does Not Apologize For Nazi Monthly on Shelves

The New York Public Library wants all the Jewish and anti-Jewish publications it can get. A reason for this, according to K. D. Metcalf, chief of the reference department of the library, is because of New York's huge Jewish population and the consequent interest aroused in Jewish problems. At present, Metcalf is on the lookout for anti-Nazi periodicals from this country and abroad to complete the assortment of view already on display in the periodical room there.

This librarian started yesterday, after having been queried as to the reason for the library's maintenance of Der Welt Kampf, an anti-Semitic monthly formerly published in Munich by Alfred Rosenberg, anti-Semitic aide to Hitler.

Interested in All Sides

"We have no apologies to make for the fact that this periodical is on our shelves," said Metcalf. "We are particularly interested in having literature dealing with all sides of the Jewish question, because so many Jews and those interested in Jews patronize the New York Public Library."

"We have been trying to get all available material on the Protocols of the Learned Elders of Zion, because this document, authentic or fabricated, appears to have much to do with history as it is being made," Metcalf concluded.

Cincinnati Honors Dr. Rubinow On Publication of New Book

Says America Cannot Follow Patterns of Overseas

CINCINNATI, July 20.—America cannot follow foreign patterns, declared Dr. I. M. Rubinow, international secretary of B'nai B'rith, in an address at a testimonial luncheon given in his honor by a civic, non-sectarian committee, in recognition of the appearance of his newest book on the social order, "The Quest for Security."

Dr. Rubinow expressed satisfaction at having seen his ideas, despised as recently as twenty years ago, become popular.

Rabbi Samuel Wohl presided, and there were eulogies by City Manager Clarence A. Dykstra, Fred K. Hoehler, Director of Public Safety, Alfred M. Cohen, president of B'nai B'rith, and Miss Frances Whitney of Columbus, assistant director of unemployment relief for Ohio.

Rabbi Wohl summarized the eulogies in these words:

"Among the distinguished names of the century, the name of Dr. Rubinow is of a very significant one. His achievements are his finest testimonial, for he is the teacher who has raised a generation of disciples. It was twenty years ago that Dr. Rubinow first brought to the attention of the country the social security of his day. His first book, 'Social Insurance,' became the text for a generation of sociologists and economists.

His second, in collecting the appearance of a splendid contribution that sums up vividly and with a great deal of experience the social problems of the day. The new volume of Dr. Rubinow, 'The Quest for Security,' I hope, will become another milestone in the social and social development of the country.

"It would be difficult to enumer-

ate or to even pause for a moment at each and everyone of the activities Dr. Rubinow has been engaged in. As the executive head of the largest international Jewish order in the world he occupies a position of great authority in Jewish life. He has served on commissions in Ohio, notably the Governor's Unemployment Insurance Commission, and is now advising on the administration of the Old Age Pension Law. He has time and again been called by Federal Boards and congressional commissions for expert testimony. His writings in particular would in themselves constitute a number of volumes over a period of years.

"To us in Cincinnati he has been a great asset. He has given of himself unsparingly to the civic welfare. We rejoice that he lives here, and we are proud to have in our deep affection and friendship at this occasion."

Knopf Will Give Fund for Students

Provides Free Scholarships for Needy Jewish Collegians

PHILADELPHIA, July 19.—Isador Knopf, in a will filed for probate yesterday devised a large portion of his estate to a fund for the benefit of Jewish students.

The fund, to be known as the Isador and Flora Memorial Scholarship Fund, will provide "free scholarships to any college or university for deserving young men and young women of Jewish faith who shall find themselves financially unable to pay tuition for their education."

Several paragraphs of Knopf's will explain why he bequeathed nothing to various relatives whom he had not seen since childhood.

He left \$300 to his attorney, A. Alfred Wasserman, who is to be one of the trustees of the scholarship fund, and \$500 each to a niece and nephew, Hattie Littlefield and Joseph Davidson.

Knopf also created a \$2,000 trust fund for the benefit of his daughter, Dr. Rita K. Braven, of Philadelphia, until she is 45. At that time she is to receive one-half of the principal outright and the other half is to revert to the residuary estate.

All the rest of the estate is to be included in the scholarship fund, which is to be operated by Wasserman, Cyrus Heller, president of Dropsie College, and Judge Horace Steiner, principal judge of Common Pleas Court No. 2, of this city.

Princeton Man Sheds Light on Bible Mystery

Writes on Origin of Pentateuch in Jewish Quarterly Review

"The Torah Shrine in the Ashburnham Pentateuch at Dropsie College. C. Sloane Jr. of Princeton University is the leading article in the July issue of the Jewish Quarterly Review, publication of the Dropsie College for Hebrew and Cognate Learning, edited by Dr. Cyrus A. Adler. Other contributors to the present number include Prof. Solomon Zeitlin of Dropsie College, Prof. Louis Finkelstein and Paul Chertoff of the Jewish Theological Seminary, D. S. Blondheim and Prof. Bernard Heller of Budapest.

In view of the recent discoveries of a fresco in the antique synagogue at Dura Europos, which sheds the light on the mystery surrounding the origin of the Ashburnham Pentateuch which now reposes in the Paris Bibliothéque Nationale. With illustrations and finely drawn schematic relationships the writer evolves a theory regarding the date of the manuscript which has long puzzled students of medieval literature and iconography.

Among the critical notices in the new issue there are discussions of an attempted systematization of rabbinic theology; an exposition of the history of Halakic literature; Jules Bauer's "Book of Rabbis and Rabbinites" with a foreword by Israel Levi, Chief Rabbi of France; an analysis of Joseph Peltier's effort to trace the origin of Christianity to the Jews; a history of the Jews through the reign of Hadrian and a hearty commendation of Ginsberg's "Legend of the Jews" as a step toward the establishment of the relationship between the Aggadah and Hellenism and the Church.

Greek Jews Swindled Of Large Sums by Man Who Posed as 'Rabbi'

SALONICA, July 4.—The Jewish community of this city was swindled of 2,000 drachmas, and Chief Rabbi Dr. S. Koretz of another 1,000, by a man who claimed that he was "Rabbi Friedman" and that he had been authorized to collect funds for a new synagogue in Barcelona.

The supposed rabbi said he had received 1,000 Egyptian pounds in Egypt and proposed to visit a number of Jewish communities in Central and Eastern Europe.

On investigation it was found that all of "Friedman's" claims were false, that he had forged certificates from the Barcelona community, as well as recommendations from several prominent Rabbis in Palestine.

Palestine Prosperity Lures Arab Capital From Syria

JERUSALEM, July 1.—The flight of Arab capital and industry from Syria to Palestine is growing larger and there are increasing signs that the Syrian merchants are taking a great interest in this country whose popularity, compared to the backward condition of their own country, has attracted the attention of the entire Near East.

Twenty Syrian merchants have left Damascus for Palestine within the past week. A famous Damascus candy manufacturer has shifted his machinery to Palestine. The local press in Damascus is clamoring for a high tax on those seeking permits for a transfer of place of business.

WASHINGTON—Ballyhoo and excuses of governmental leaders and party substitutes with which hungry masses may fill their empty stomachs. Hungry people are a threat to the stability of any government. And when hunger is nation-wide, something is bound to happen.

On top of all her current difficulties resulting mainly from the self-centered policies of the Nazi regime, a severe threat of a food shortage this winter is confronting Germany. New perils have fallen on the shoulders of the Hitler power.

Official reports received in Washington show that the situation in Germany is becoming more and more acute each day. For some time now, that country has been in the throes of financial, political and social difficulties. All of these are menacing Hitler's hold on the German government. But now comes the most serious menace of all—a scarcity of food. When people are hungry, they become desperate. No appeal from officials in power can be made strong enough to appease a wrath which has been brewing up the world and which will find expression under hunger pangs.

What makes the situation more troublesome to the Hitler government is the fact that the lack of a food shortage is not confined to Germany alone. All of Central and Eastern Europe is suffering from drought. In Poland, a severe drought which was broken some times only by a few scant rains.

Reports received here from D. F. Christy, assistant agricultural attaché at Berlin, indicate that crops of berries, indigo, grains and feed-grains have been reduced in Germany, and unfavorable prospects, due to drought, are also reported in Poland, Austria, Czechoslovakia and Russia.

Previously a party of five, attired in the traditional costumes of cultured Moslem women, including the black veils, were apprehended when police saw through their disguises. They could not answer questions put to them in Arabic.

Used Mail to Gain Entry

JERUSALEM, July 5.—Three Jews who tried to enter Palestine in the overland desert from Baghdad via Amman, in Transjordan, while sewn up in mail bags, were arrested at the frontier.

LaFarge Tells Catholics to Curb Fascism

Writer in Magazine Urges Action Now Against Menace

American Catholics are advised to act promptly against the dangers of Fascism by John LaFarge, S.J., in an article entitled "The Danger of Fascism," appearing in the current issue of the Catholic weekly, America.

Not only does the writer urge steps against Fascism, he believes is a sharp menace in the United States at the present time, but he recommends action without delay, holding that the opportunity to combat Fascism is here now, but will presently vanish.

In America, LaFarge writes, Fascism can mean at least seven things, which he lists as:

1. The regime in the saddle in Italy.
2. Any kind of totalitarian state.
3. The corporative state.
4. A state in which the military captures the government.
5. Anything that annoys Communists or favors militarism.
6. Anything opposed to the Jews, or manifesting anti-Semitic or other racial intolerance.
7. Primary reliance upon strong-arm methods for obtaining general political and civil security.

"Whether Silver Shirts, Red Shirts, Brown Shirts or Silk Shirts makes little difference," LaFarge contends. "It is not the shirts nor the boots nor the pistols that are the menace, but the wrong philosophy of life that they represent; the philosophy that has abandoned the head for the hip, because the heart has gone astray."

Reformers vs. Reformers

It did seem strange that there
 was so little organized opposition
 to the attempt of the Jewish,
 Catholic and Protestant church-
 groups to impose a censorship on
 moving pictures. There and there
 the voice of some liberal was
 raised against this movement, but
 little was heard except the ideas
 of those demanding a film clean-
 up; and apologies and promises

This past week, however, things

Thyssen, Real Power Behind Hitler

"HITLER Over Europe" would be an astonishing piece of work if it were pure fiction. Coming to us as the statement of a situation, it has the characteristic of nightmare; it is, in effect, a fantasia of fact. Whoever the author, Ernst Henri, may be, his painfully annotated statement reduces all the novels that have been written around Hitlerism to so many mounds of cold beans. This is the truth that out-fictions fiction.

The publisher of the American edition, Simon & Schuster, had planned to bring out "Hitler Over Europe" some time in August. Hitler's blood-purge of the left elements among the Brown Shirts put forward the publication date.

In the light of that blood-purge, this book reads like prophecy already fulfilled, at least in part. The world believes, and even Germany believes, that the Hitler revolution is the upsurge of the lower middle classes. Ernst Henri tells us that the power behind the throne of Hitler is none other than Fritz Thyssen, the coal master and iron-monger of the Ruhr, the heir of the Rhine. He is the man who furnished Hitler with his sinews of power, with his election funds—earned by a rise in the price of coal throughout Germany—and with much intermediaries of intrigue as Hugenberg and von Papen. It is Fritz Thyssen, more than any other individual, or group, who is getting his in return for favors granted, getting his against rival groups of bankers and industrialists, Jews and Catholics mainly; getting his against the lower middle class which now must pay vastly more for its subsistence requirements; getting his against his army of laborers who are being made into helots and whose labor union safeguards have long been scrapped; getting his also in international trade, through Rosenberg's foreign

infiation, in order to devaluate the debts of big industry (a repetition of the astute transaction invented by Stinnes in 1923); and finally "6. To initiate a pronouncedly aggressive imperialist tendency in foreign affairs in order to appease the powerful urge for expansion in Ruhr capital."

Unorthodox Enlightenment

There is more data in this book than can easily be summarized in a review of thrice the space. Mr. Henri says that "All these points have been fulfilled already by the Hitler government." With the exception of the fifth point, that dealing with inflation, I think that the Thyssen program has become fulfilled, but even if it hasn't, there is no doubt that the steel master has been more than amply rewarded by the degradation of the status of labor which Hitler has achieved.

There are many reasons for buying and for reading this book, but if you read only the section entitled "The Transformation of the Working Class Into a Sub-Human Race," you will have acquired more enlightenment on the German situation than the Minister for Propaganda and Enlightenment must have—largely for.

For this section tells you how Hitler is "solving" the unemployment problem. He is solving it by reducing to acknowledge the existence of several millions of unemployed who are Socialists, or Communists, vagabonds or Jews, human beings who have no official existence, are entitled neither to work, or unemployment relief.

He is solving it by making an unemployed man, and a worker together, take less than either received, by wage or dole. He is solving it by creating a slave-army which toils for starvation rations, and a pitifully nominal wage, and have nothing to say as to where they shall work, or for whom, or how long; who have no leisure hours and no freedom of choice.

In any respect, in brief, the man

who works today earns less than was received by the man who got a dole yesterday. The benefactors of this new system have been the Thyssens and, in harvest times, the Junker land owners who have got their harvest help so cheaply that they have been able to wipe out their debts with the sweat of their labor.

Wages Lower, Prices Higher

The Thyssens, great and small, have benefited also from the Hitler revolution through the steady rise in prices of every necessity. The New York Times of last Monday, on its front page, eloquently verified this, and brought it up to date. In short, not only is German labor's wage the lowest on the Continent, but the prices it pays are the highest. Mr. Henri gives us eloquent statistics showing in how many ways the wages of the working class and the lower middle class are being bombarded.

Mr. Henri tells us also, in detail, the program and the policy of the Nazi International, how the push for power beyond the boundaries of the Third Reich is responsible for the creation of Nazi groups in more than a dozen countries and how imperative it is for the fruition of these plans that Austria shall succumb, whatever promises Hitler may make to Mussolini. There is also a revealing section, and it seems logical, although a little harder to verify, revealing the inner schism between the Napoleonic Goering and the (comparatively) conservative Hitler.

"Hitler Over Europe" is one of the most astonishing revelations of German madness that has been published.

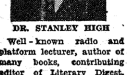

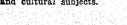

Jewish Vote Starts Quarrel In Brooklyn

Politicians in Row Over Race Tolerance as Party Plank

The July 20 issue of the Kings County News appeared Friday with a leading article in which it was reported candidates for Democratic leadership for the Second Assembly District have begun setting forth their records of tolerance toward Jews as campaign planks.

According to the article: "At a meeting of the Brighton Beach Democratic Captains Organization on Wednesday night, Assemblyman Albert D. Schaner, Harry L. Rabin, Clerk of the Supreme Court, and Ben Freedman, Deputy Internal Revenue Collector, three of Thomas G. Ryan's principals, publicly assailed the 'empire' in the opposition and declared that any attempt on the part of the Marcus group to characterize their leader as intolerant was 'an outrageous lie.'"

The article says this of Ryan: "Ryan asserted that his associates did not inform him of their intention to attack the Brighton Beach Club, and added that he personally wished to keep the racial issue out of the fight and never started it. He challenged any one to compare his record with that of the others, and pointed as evidence of an unprejudiced mind to his charitable activities and the fact that his last two appointments were to Jews."

Of Marcus, the article says: "Bernard Marcus, the chief opponent of the present leader, laid the responsibility for bringing the racial issue into the Brighton Beach door of the Ryan elements and heatedly asserted that at no time had he or his associates ever made capital out of race."

"Many of my confederates are not of my faith," Marcus said, "My attitude and associations are definitely liberal and non-religious. The conduct of my opposition is a despicable attempt to ward off the powerful opposition they see impending against their incompetent leadership. It is deplorable that members of my own race should stoop to such tactics."

Find 4,500 Germans Ready to Emigrate

League of Nations Committee Discusses Reich Situation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LOMBARD, July 20.—A committee of experts attached to the League of Nations German refugee body, met in London yesterday to discuss the present situation. High Commissioner James G. McDonald informed the press today.

The experts found, the High Commissioner said, that 4,500 of the refugees are fitted for immediate emigration. Their transfer overseas with maintenance until funds are absorbed in the economic life of the countries to which they are going will come to fifty pounds per individual or a total of \$750,000. This sum would enable the refugees commission to liquidate the bulk of the present refugee problem, High Commissioner McDonald declared.

The committee urged the organization of banks of commerce and industry in the countries to which the refugees are going in order to further the work of refugee rehabilitation.

The High Commissioner was instructed to obtain the large capital funds needed, for which public contributions are necessary, beside the main burden, which will fall on private organizations.

Stringent Film Ban Impends, Goldstein Says

Following Friday's conference Dr. Goldstein declared, "If the motion picture industry will not accept the plan, I am sure the Government will accept something very much worse—government censorship."

Jews Heaviest Contributors to Reich Unemployed Funds

BERLIN, July 20.—Der Angriff, the Goebbels organ, has made the revelation that the "Aryans" of the Jews of Germany are more generous donors to Nazi unemployment funds than "Aryans."

In a featured article today, the result of an investigation by Der Angriff's star reporter, the information is revealed that Jews are contributing between ten and fifteen percent of the "Aryans" towards the unemployment welfare funds organized by the Nazi regime. The investigation was conducted in Berlin's highly fashionable "Aryans."

Non-Jews Refuse

Fourteen homes of wealthy commercial leaders were visited by the reporter to establish their contributions to the above funds. Of these fourteen, the reporter discovered to his surprise, a large number of the "Aryans" refused to contribute to the Nazi relief funds, but even went so far as to refuse to permit the Nazi collectors to enter their homes.

He found that a few of them contribute only a monthly average of one or two marks. The only one contributing more than fifty marks monthly is a Jew. "This Jew," Der Angriff's reporter adds, "is not only paying

an average of fifteen marks a month towards the Nazi unemployment fund, but also is capable by Nazi collectors for other contributions as well."

Jews Increase Ill-Feeling To Nazis

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN, July 20.—The Jews of Great Britain as well as those of other countries are accused in the latest issue of the Jewish World of increasing the world's ill feeling toward Germany.

In an article on England and the Jewish problem, the Berliner Weekly Ring declares that Jews have without a doubt contributed greatly towards the antagonism now prevailing in England against Germany.

A long article in the Dresdener Anzeiger charges that Jewish influence in France is preventing that country from adopting an anti-Nazi line.

The Deutscherfront of Saarbrücken affirms that the strained relations that have recently developed between Germany and the Scandinavian countries, where recent events in the Reich are unanimously condemned by the entire Scandinavian press, especially Sweden, are attributable directly to the Jews, "who understand how cleverly to stimulate public opinion against the new Germany."

An article in the Konigsberger Allgemeine Zeitung assumes that Dollfuss sold himself to the Inter-Allies, while the Jews, therefore now fighting anti-Semitism in Austria more eagerly than hitherto.

The Eidenburgische Staatszeitung establishes that the highly increased anti-German attitude in Rumania, which is causing suppression of German Nazi groups and is directed against the Berlin "by Jewish correspondents of Rumanian newspapers." The newspaper demands the deportation of Jewish correspondents who are Jews.

Toronto Strike To End Monday, Success Seen

Majority of 2,000 to Go Back to Work, Few Still Out

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
TORONTO, Ont., July 20.—Early success is expected to crown the efforts of the local branch of the International Ladies Garment Workers Union to enforce decent pay levels and working conditions among employees of jobbers and contractors.

A majority of the 2,000 union members who walked out of the city's cloak factories are expected to go back to work Monday. Only few will carry on the stoppage that was declared until a completely successful outcome can be announced.

Among those who will continue on strike, however, are members of the important Furriers' Union who, for the first time in the history of this city, took part in a strike when they walked out of cloak factories in sympathy with the cloakmakers. The furriers have announced that they will not return until the jobbers and contractors have been forced to observe union conditions in their shops.

The stoppage, while it affected all cloak factories in the city, was directed against jobbers and contractors rather than against factories, a majority of which adhere to union agreements.

Only employees in those factories that job out their work to the contractors will remain out on strike. Union officials, Dr. Friedman and Langner pointed out that the contractors are paying as little as \$10 a week to a family man for a fifty-four hour week.

Hundreds With Marital Woes Find New Way to Cure Them

Hundreds of families plagued with marital problems are receiving a new deal at the Court of Domestic Relations in New York through an experiment which may shortly be extended to similar courts throughout the city. It was announced by the Welfare Council of New York. The experiment was started by the Welfare Council committee headed by Dr. John S. Watson, of the Welfare Council, Bureau, and Dr. John S. Watson, of the Jewish Board of Guardians.

It is an experiment in settling acute family troubles out of court—on a social work rather than on a legal basis. Since it was instituted last December by the Welfare Council's Domestic Relations Court Committee, this unofficial arm of the Family Court has directed more than 100 families to privately financed welfare agencies for solution of their problems instead of involving them in the costly action of the courts. Families already involved in various stages of court procedure have been referred to private family counselors for help, ranging from relief to adjustment of the marital situation. The work was initiated in close cooperation with Judge Edward J. Boyle, presiding justice of the Domestic Relations Court and has had his hearty cooperation.

"People come to the Domestic Relations Court in moments of anger, jealousy or despair to seek legal aid," said Judge Boyle, Secretary of the Domestic Relations Court Committee of the City of New York. "We believe that many of these people served best by court treatment of the situation, and by the alleviation of acute problems, such as unemployment, financial difficulties, physical and mental illness, and conflicts in the family group, rather than by method through legal action. The most common reason the court may be permanent, harmful to the marital situation, rather than helpful to it."

Under the terms of this belief, held by many legal authorities as well as by social workers, a trained case worker, Miss Helen Thomas, was named by the Brooklyn Bureau of Charities last December to work in cooperation with the Brooklyn Family Court in behalf of the private family agency of Brooklyn, the Catholic Charities, the United Jewish Aid Society and the Brooklyn A. I. C. P. and the Brooklyn Bureau of Charities and with the hearty approval of the borough division of the Emergency Home Relief Bureau. A letter to the effect was sent out in the Borough of Queens through an arrangement sponsored by the Catholic Charities and the Brooklyn Bureau of Charities.

Families whose marital tangles could not very well be aired in open court were interviewed, often very discreetly of the family meeting Miss Thomas privately to point out his troubles to her. Cases have been referred to her by the brokers and by the judges of the court.

Has Heard 500 Cases
Last week Miss Thomas interviewed her 500th troubled case. The Jewish trust in her was a bedraggled mother whose three young children clung to her.

"My husband has a CWA job and we won't get out of bed and go to work," she said. "Today when I was out my landlady locked the door. We have no place to go."

Miss Thomas pleaded through the picture. The man disliked his CWA job; he had never done that kind of work and he was restless. But before he lost his job two years ago he had been always a good provider.

A lecture on domestic relations, typical of scores of cases which have come to her in these last months, was estimated, one in every

four complaints that has reached her desk has come from families in which the husband or father is a CWA worker.

Although Miss Thomas' position is an unofficial one, a position created by the courtesy of Judge Boyle, social workers agree that how the experiment may lead to the appointment eventually of social worker referees for all Domestic Relations Court officials who would offer consultative service to those coming to the family courts of the city to make their petition.

The poet was described by Rabbi Isaac M. Blumenfeld, who presided, as one honored by the Jewish people and who spoke as the old prophet spoke. Bielik's poems were sung by the Hebrew Choral Society. David H. Hirsch, member of the Hahinab Players, read Bielik's poems. A memorial scroll was read in behalf of Chicago Monday night in the Jewish Community Center in memory of the late Chaim Nachman Bielik. Cantor Gedalia Schenken of Beth Shalom Synagogue, Philadelphia, will officiate.

"The Order Sons of Zion from its very existence has been concerned with the order's family spiritual rebuilding of the Jewish homeland. I shall further investigate its potentialities, particularly that of Zionism, to which our Order has already subscribed \$20,000, and report back to our membership upon my return."

Mrs. I. Kahn, P. Dworsky, Two Jewish Pioneers Of Minneapolis, Die

MINNEAPOLIS, July 19.—Two pioneers of the Minneapolis Jewish community died here this week. Peter Dworsky, 64, a resident of this city for the past fifty years, died at the home of a daughter, Mrs. Gustave Frankel, while Mrs. Ida Kahn, 70, a Minneapolis resident for twenty years, succumbed at her home. Both had been extremely interested in numerous Jewish affairs in the city.

In addition to his daughter Mrs. Frankel, Mr. Dworsky is survived by another daughter, Beatrice, and three sons, Bernard, Zola and Dr. Samuel Dworsky. Mrs. Kahn is survived by five sons, Samuel, Benjamin, Frank, Max and Abe, and three daughters, Mrs. Israel Barron and Elie Kahn, all of Minneapolis, and Mrs. Herman Katz, Little Falls, Minn.

Congregations Boy Protests Sept. 10 Opening of Schools

Following the protests made early this month by the Jewish Sabbath Alliance of America against the scheduled opening of schools on the Jewish New Year, September 10, the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America on Friday announced that it has also filed protests with the Board of Education. The congregations fully support the Alliance, that the date of opening would not be deferred.

Last Monday Assemblyman Albert D. Sawyer, on a suggestion from the Jewish Sabbath Alliance, offered for introduction to the Assembly a resolution memorializing the board and the city of New York to amend the by-laws of the Board of Education so as to permit a postponement.

Fate of Spain Predicted For Reich by Speaker

Discussing in her weekly broadcast on Station WFLA the fate of the Jews in Spain, the erstwhile Weiss Rosmarin, director of the School of the Jewish Woman, predicted that Germany will under the same economic and cultural decline that befell Spain after the persecution and expulsion of its Jewish population. A nation which isolates the most numerous human law of individual freedom and security is "bound to perish," Dr. Rosmarin said.

Doctor Stops, Starts Hearts By Nerve Action

Demonstrates Methods Before Minneapolis Medical Parley

(J.D.B. Special Correspondence)
MINNEAPOLIS, July 19.—By stopping and starting again the heart movements of several of his patients, Dr. M. H. Nathanson of this city presented one of the most widely discussed demonstrations before physicians attending the Minnesota State Medical association's annual meeting in Duluth which ended yesterday.

Using an amplifying device to carry the sound of the heartbeat to his patients, stopping their heartbeats for several seconds. After applying several drugs, including adrenalin, he caused the resumption of the heart movement.

In outlining his demonstration Dr. Nathanson pointed out that work on this particular experiment had been prompted by an analysis of 142 autopsies on coronary disease terminating in sudden death. In only seven per cent of these cases, he said, was a heart condition found in the heart of the victim. This being true, he set about to determine if certain drugs might not be used at least to postpone cardiac pectoris. His experiments, he said, proved this possible.

At the same gathering another Minneapolis physician, Dr. M. J. Shapiro, gave an address on juvenile Rheumatism. Youngsters between six and seven years old are most often the victims, he said, usually in the fall or spring, in cases studied here. He drew a sharp distinction between so-called "growing pains" and rheumatic fever. No effective specific treatment has been discovered, Dr. Shapiro added.

leaped to his feet and shouted "Long live Jabotinsky."

Stavsky and his friends immediately left the courtroom for the home of Dr. Avniet, a Revisionist Zionist attorney.

The news of the verdict spread like wildfire through the crowds which had surrounded the courthouse since dawn. A heavy police cordon had been placed around the court, but the crowd was peaceful and orderly. When the news of Stavsky's acquittal became known the crowd went wild with joy. There were scenes of wild jubilation as the immense throng cheered itself until hoarse. Utter strangers embraced each other out of sheer joy. Many wept.

A crowd gathered immediately outside the home of Dr. Avniet and demanded that Stavsky speak. The young Revisionist came out on the balcony of the house and addressed the crowd briefly.

Thanks J.T.A. for Reports

Stavsky greeted the Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondents warmly and issued the following exclusive statement through the Jewish Telegraphic Agency:

"Just as I was released today so will the Jewish people ultimately be emancipated. I thank the Jews of the world for their sympathy and support during my ordeal. I am too overcome to speak, but I thank the Jewish Telegraphic Agency for its excellent reports on the trial."

Horace Samuel, who defended Stavsky and who was standing near, smiled his assent to Stavsky's statement.

A continual procession of callers streamed into Dr. Avniet's house to congratulate Stavsky on his acquittal. The city of Jerusalem was excited by the verdict. Hebrew newspapers were on the streets with extras soon after the verdict. The news vendors were almost mobbed by the crowds, who literally tore the papers from their hands.

Famous German Singer Exiles Self in America

Before Conviction Was Braced

Reversal of Stavsky Conviction Ends Stirring Cause Celebre

Stavsky Said He Was in Jerusalem at Time of Crime

The acquittal by the Palestine appeals court of Abraham Stavsky on the charge of having murdered Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, head of the political department of the Jewish Agency for Palestine and outstanding Laborite leader in Palestine, brings to a close a cause celebre which has stirred the Jewish world to its very foundations and caused great bitterness between various Zionist factions all over the world.

One June 16, 1933, late in the evening as Dr. and Mrs. Sima Arlosoroff were walking along the seashore near Tel Aviv, the thirty-five year old labor leader was shot and fatally wounded by two men who had been following the couple. One of the killers asked for the time in Hebrew and when Dr. Arlosoroff answered a light was flashed in his face and the second of the two shot twice at the Zionist leader. Several hours later Dr. Arlosoroff died in a Tel Aviv hospital.

A round-up of suspects followed by the Palestine police. Several days after the murder Mrs. Arlosoroff selected the picture of Abraham Stavsky from a group of photographs shown her by the police declaring that he resembled the taller of the two men who took part in the murder of her husband.

Later, Zvi Rosenblatt, another young Revisionist Zionist, was identified by the wife of the murdered man as the second of the two killers. Aba Achmeier, leader of the Palestinian Revisionists, was arrested by the police and charged with having inspired the murder of Dr. Arlosoroff.

Mejld Enters Case

A sensational turn in the case came when the court handed down its verdict. Stavsky was found guilty of the murder of Dr. Arlosoroff and sentenced to hang. Zvi Rosenblatt was acquitted.

enblatt, who had urged him to do so and promised him £1,000 and assistance if he would shoulder the blame for the killing. Stavsky and Rosenblatt indignantly repudiated the confession and denied having anything to do with the convict save an exchange of greetings in the jail courtyard.

Hit Identifications

During the entire trial the defense hammered at the identification of Stavsky and Rosenblatt pointing to the faultiness of the identifications. Attorney Samuel insisted that his clients were innocent declaring that he would prove that Abdul Mejld and Issa Darwish killed Dr. Arlosoroff. He made a passionate summation declaring that the murder was non-political and demanding full exoneration for his clients.

On June 8, 1934, the court handed down its verdict. Stavsky was found guilty of the murder of Dr. Arlosoroff and sentenced to hang. Zvi Rosenblatt was acquitted.

"A majority of the court finds," the text of the verdict declared, "that in Tel Aviv on the night of June 16 and 17, with premeditated intent to kill Stavsky did take part

in the premeditated killing of Arlosoroff by following him, waiting for him, stopping him and directing an electric torch upon him and by being close during the commission of an offense contrary to the law."

"The accused Stavsky will suffer death according to the law."

"Not Guilty," Stavsky Shouts

As soon as the verdict was read Stavsky sprang to his feet with a shout: "I am not guilty."

Stavsky's mother who had come from Poland to be near her son during his trial burst into tears, shouting: "He is innocent! He is innocent!"

Given an opportunity to make a final statement to the court Stavsky declared: "I know nothing of the murder. I was sleeping during the murder at the Turgeman Hotel in Jerusalem."

"This is a provocation by the Jewish Labor party and the Palestine government against me. I am totally innocent."

"You judges will be responsible for my life and for the lives of my parents. Those who have sworn falsely here will have to bear a guilty conscience. I believe British justice in England will not teach how to sentence innocents."

"You have convicted here the honor of an entire nation—not mine—because I am innocent."

Stavsky concluded his statement amidst a deep silence broken only by the sobbing of his mother. As police guards moved forward to remove him, his mother rushed and clung to him, sobbing hysterically. Police were able to separate her from her son only with the greatest effort of difficulty.

The verdict created a deep impression in Palestine and all over the Jewish world. The verdict was greeted with indignation everywhere.

A movement was set on foot immediately to secure a review of the case by the Palestine Appeals

Brazilian Nazis Worsted in Tiff On Flag Display

Banners Are Torn Down in Sao Paulo and Santos

SAO PAULO, Brazil, July 20.—Brushes between Brazilian Nazis and the Brazilian Liberal Youth organization resulted in the pro-Fascists coming off second best both here and in Santos.

The skirmishes developed over display by German business and banking firms of Nazi flags alongside of Brazilian flags on the occasion of proclamation of the new constitution. Led by the Liberal Youth factions, crowds rushed by police guarding the banks and commercial houses and tore the Nazi banners down.

Another vigorous anti-Nazi demonstration was staged before the Cinema Odéon here where the Nazi propaganda film "Heroic Youth" was being shown.

At Aplaihy, a railroad center near Rio de Janeiro, bloodshed was narrowly averted by police intervention in conflicts between the Integralists (Brazilian Fascists) and Socialists.

Zionist Parley Arranged At Camp Livingstone

A special conference of New York Zionists will be held July 27-29 at Camp Livingstone, Livingstone Manor, N. Y., to prepare for activities to be launched by the Atlantic City convention.

Among the national leaders expected to be present are Morris Rosenthal, Louis Lipasky, Abraham Goldberg, Morris Margulies and Carl Sherman.

On July 16, before a court composed of Chief Justice Sir Michael Francis Joseph McDonnell, and Justices Francis Howard Baker and Julian Mignon de Freitas, defense counsel Samuel began his argument hinged on the identification of Stavsky by police witnesses and the fact that no corroborative evidence to support the identification of Stavsky by Dr. Arlosoroff had been offered by the prosecution.

A sensation was added to the appeal when Dr. Eliash, Jewish attorney who is defending Abdul Mejld on a murder charge (Mejld and Issa Darwish are accused of having killed an Arab barber, Lufti), swore to an affidavit saying that Mejld had once more confessed that his friend Issa had killed Dr. Arlosoroff and that he had accompanied him on the night of the murder. Samuel asked the court to take cognizance of the confession, but the court refused, dismissing the confession as unreliable and incapable of affecting the case.
