The Fist

At Baircuth, during the Wagner festival, amidst a mass of brown-shirted storm troops, a Monument of the Nazi move ment has been unveiled. The Monument represents a huge fist of bronze in the act of throttling snakes. And the inscription on the pedestal refers to the "sound of storm bells, thunders of vengeance and the dire fate of a people ensnared by dreams."

Whatever may be said of the Nazis, it must be admitted that they have the "courage" of their crimes. No critic of the Nazi movement could better characterize them than they themselves have done it in their monument of the Bronze Fist—with storm bells, with thunders of vengeance, and their salvation of the German

their salvation of the German from being "ensnared by dreams."

It is a Monument to brute force, to paganism, to barbarism, to war-madness. This is Hitler's contribution to Germany representation to Germany. many, perpetuated in bronze, which should be preserved as the symbol of disgrace and de-gradation imposed by him upon the German people.

#### A Costly Vice

Fifty Jewish physicians have een forced out of their posibeen forced out of their posi-tions in municipal hospitals in Vienna, as a result of the Ger-man-Christian policy of the new city administration. Notnew city administration. Not-withstanding all the promises made by the Dollfuss govern-ment that there will be no anti-Jewish discriminations, the VIenna authorities are emulating the ways of the German Nazis.

As we pointed out at the time the new Austrian Constitution was proclaimed, it is a document that contains vague clauswhich could easily be given es which count easily be given any interpretations the author-ities desire. And now the au-thorities have already resorted to tricky subterfuges for the purpose of eliminating Jews from civil service.

The little dictator, who is defying Hitler, is borrowing some of his methods. No nation can afford the costly vice of religious and racial hate and discrimination. Austria can afford it least of all.

Spectators, court attendants and attorneys for both sides were taken completely by surprise when Inch approached the bench and declared at he would like to withdraw from the case.

In explanation of his unusual request, which is interpreted as a

clear admission of guilt, Inch admitted that the entire Grey Shirt movement was based on "hot air." Presiding Justice Graham flatly refused to consider the withdrawal saying that it was impossible. To

this Inch replied that he was leav-ing the matter entirely in the hands of the court and then walked out of the courtroom without look-ing at his co-defendants.

Complete collapse of the defense vas further indicated when Moltke, referring to the letter allegedly written by a well known Jew in which Jewish domination of the entire world is predicted, admitted that he must have by the document which he claims was planted on him.

### Shochtim Stick Rosenfeld Sues To Demands as YorkvillePaper DeadlockHolds|For \$100.000

for Lack of Kashruth Supervision

The deadlock between whole-salers and slaughterers in the poul-try industry continued yesterday, with counsel for each faction reemphasizing their respective de-mands and neither side willing to concede any, at the second con-ference called by Judge Otto Rosalsky, the Mayor's mediator, in the judge's chambers in the Criminal Courts Building.

"The Jew," said Judge Rosalsky at the opening of the conference, "is willing to pay more for kosher-slaughtered poultry if he knows that it is kosher. I was dumbfounded to hear that many whole-salers have no supervision."

Samuel Weiner, one of the lead-ers of the wholesalers' delegation ers of the wholesaters' delegation, contradicted Judge Rosalsky. "If you think the Jewish public is willing to pay the excess," he said, "then you don't know the Jewish public".

Louis J. Gribetz, counsel to the shochtim, presented their demands in the form of an agreement which has been nominally in force until recently, although, as both sides agreed, the agreement had not been carried through in many re-

### Judge Hits Wholesalers Reich Exile Starts Libel Action Against Nazi 'Deutsche Zeitung'

Another libel action has been lodged against the Deutsche Zeilished here, it was learned yester-day. Dr. Kurt Rosenfeld, former Prussian Minister of Justice who has been a refugee from Hitler's administration, calims damages of \$100,000.

The plaintiff, who served the defendant corporation with a sum-mons last Friday, will have as his counsel Arthur Garfield Hays, noted for his activities in Nazi affairs as counsel for the American Civil Liberties Union. The defendant company has been given twenty days in which to answer the summons in Supreme Court.

Hitler's Papers Publish New Anti-Semitic Articles

BERLIN, July 23.—The Nazi
campaign against the Jews continues on all fronts in Germany with an ever-increasing tempo and bitterness. Leading Nazi papers led by the Voelkischer Beobachter, Der Angriff and Julius Streicher's Stuermer are filled with inciting articles against the Jews of Ger-many and other countries.

The bare announcement in today's Nazi papers of the confisca-tion of the ancient synagogue of Sulzbach in Bavaria and its im-On Kosher Unit

On Kosher Unit Under the pretext that the Jew

ish community was no longer able ish community was no longer able to maintain the synagogue, Sulzbach authorities announced the confiscation, and revealed that since the Nazi regime has been in power, the 170 Jewish families of the town have been reduced to eight persons, one man and seven women. No indication is given in the official announcement as to what has happened to the flour-ishing Jewish community in the eighteen months of Nazi power.

Will Destroy Jewish Traces

The Sulzbach announcement emphasized the fact that the Ark, which formerly contained the scrolls of the law, the sculptured Ten Commandments, and everything that is reminiscent of Ju-daism, would be completely destroyed.

### BieleyIsBuried At Mt. Lebanon: Died in Jersey

### Was a Representative of Yiddish Papers in Western States

Funeral services were held yes-terday afternoon for Solomon Bieley, former representative of several Jewish newspapers in the Western States, at the Neiberg Memorial Chapel, 141 Ludlow street. Rabid AF, Newman of-ficiated and Cantor Mordenal Sha-nity charact the research piro chanted the memorial.

Lebanon Cemetery. Bieley died Sunday afternoon at his home in Dover, New Jer-sey. He was eighty years old.

The deceased, born in Ukrania was a scholar and practiced the traditional laws of the Jewish peo-ple. His family, Hassidim, dur-ing the Russo-Turkish war mi-grated from Austria to Russia.

One of Bieley's ancestors on his father's side was Rabbi Judah Leh father's side was rabbi Judan Leb Bernstein, the first land rabbi of Austria, while on his mother's side he was descended from the fam-ily of Baron Eskeles, financial adviser of Carl the Sixth.

When the Bieleys arrived in Russia their family name was Ba-bad, but since in Russia at that time there were no family names they adopted the name Bieley adopted some time afterwards.

In that country Bieley was a tobacco merchant. He attempted to organize tobacco dealers, but the Czarist government termed this socialism and forbade it. He lost his fortune during the pogroms of 1905 and emigrated here, at the age of 52. He at first en-tered the tobacco business but later became the traveling agent of orthodox Jewish papers.

Surviving him are his widow, Bessie, three sons, Louis, circula-tion manager of the Jewish Morning Journal, Paul and Boris, and two married daughters, Mrs. Na-than Kleinman and Mrs. Aaron



(Continued from Page One) funds have been made available for industrial and economic recovery but no such help is avail-able for church and characterbuilding agencies.

Cites Aid to Government The committee cites the invalu-able aid that churches in times of crises have given to the National Government and suggests that Government and suggests that "while adhering unalterably to the principle of separation of Church and State, church and private organizations may, with propriety, ask the moral support of the Gov-ernment and the financial support of the public in retrieving the losses that have been sustained dur-

ing the past four years."

The program is cooperative and educational without the creation of new organizations. "Emphasis or new organizations. Emphasis is to be placed throughout upon the efficiency of existing Church and welfare enterprises, without any attempt to create a super-or-ganization or federation," the ganization or statement says.

Among the special dates in the recovery calendar are:

#### Seeks Fellowship

October 1—Fellowship Monday, when it is suggested that all pastors, priests and rabbis, together with leading church laymen of each city or community, arrange for a fellowship luncheon or dinner, fol-lowed by a conference to decide on cooperation in attaining moral, social and welfare objectives in which all are interested.

October 1-6—Mobilization Week, when all character-building agencies of the community, including schools, religious associations and business and social organizations will be aked to cooperate in mobi-lizing the religious and social ser-

October 7 — Loyalty Sunday, when effort will be made to secure the presence of every citizen in a house of worship—church, synagogue or home. For Jews Saturday may be observed instead of Sunday. For church resmare. of Sunday. For church members the slogan suggested is, "Every

member present or accounted for." A Pastors Advisory Committee has been formed to prepare suggestions that may be adapted to the needs and policies of participating organizations.

There have been twenty-six pre-

liminary meetings of various committees, leading up to the re-cent meeting of the National Committee in Washington, where the call and program was formally approved. President Roosevelt sent greetings and commendation to this meeting through Secretary Roper of the Department of Com-merce, who closed his speech with the statement that "the church in some form is the organization on which the Federal Government and society generally is dependent for the needed spiritual stimulus to the needed spiritual stimulus to meet and solve existing social problems. You cannot afford to permit us to be disappointed in this hope for constructive help."

### Editor Upholds Catholic Stand

Father Gillis Declares German Jews and Catholics Are Persecuted

The Catholic defense of the Jews suffering from persecution under Hitler is upheld by Father James M. Gillis, editor of the Catholic World.

Asserting that the Jews are not Asserting that the Jews are not the only victims of Nazi interdic-tion and that Catholics also are marked for persecution. Father Gillis condemns Catholics who express surprise and resentment at the Catholics' defense of the Jews

"If Catholics are scandalized when we defend the Jews, it is Pharisaic scandal," Father Gillis writes. "As far back as March, 1928, the Pope condemned Jewish persecution in Germany. Of course he was reviled for so doing by Nazis of the fiercer type. . . . But the Pope is hardened to abuse. But be it noticed that the Holy Father did not wait until Catholics came under Nazi persecution before he protested against persecution of the Jews. If he had done so, he would have been accused -- and with some semblance of cause of speaking one word for the Jews but two for the Catholics. It was appropriate that a non-Jew should speak out for the Jews.'

Father Gillis also takes to task Catholics who place the onus for certain evils, such as publishing nasty plays and books, on the shoulders of Jews and goes on to show that Christians are also responsible for these evils.

### Tri-FaithBoard **BacksGoldstein** Clean Film Plan

### Takes Favorable Vote on Proposal for National Body

Continuing the drive for clean movies, the Inter-faith Committee yesterday voted to support a proyesterday voted to support a pro-posed national joint board con-sisting of members of the minis-try, the public and the motion pic-ture industry. The committee, whose members represent the three major faiths of the city, met at the Holy Cross Rectory, 327 West Forty-second street, in an attempt to formulate a policy for construc-tive action. Rabbi Sidney E. Goldstein, committee member and spon-sor of the proposed board, was present.

Father Joseph A. McCaffrey, chairman of the committee, an-nounced that although the group is concentrating on the films, is concentrating on the films, nevertheless, "we have our eyes on the taxi dance halls, and any irregularities will be reported to Mayor LaGuardia." Decrying the over-emphasis of

sex in the movies, Father McCaf-frey declared that if the producers will not accept the idea of a joint board they will be forced to submit to government censorship, which he termed was dangerous and undesirable.

After the meeting Father Me-Caffrey showed a letter from the Intercollegiate Democratic League giving its whole-hearted support to the Inter-faith Committee. Previously Robert I. Broder, organizer of the Association for the Preservation of Screen and Stage, had declared he had the support of this same group. Although the league lists its headquarters as being at the Hotel Astor, it was not known there.

### Biblical Facts Are Laid Bare By Holy Land Archaeologists

### Hebrew Union Professor Recounts New Finds Near Petra

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
JERUSALEM, July 5.—Modern
archaeological discoveries are gradually revealing verification of the age-dimmed geographical and historical data of Biblical times, Through one particular discovery in the field of archaeology this year, modern Biblical students have been able to establish quite accurately that the Exodus of the Israelites through southern Trans-Jordan could not have taken place before the thirteenth century B.C.

The checking up of this specific
Biblical fact has been recomplished
through the combined efforts of
the second 1934 expedition of the
American School of Oriental Research of Bagdad, the Trans-Jordan Department of Antiquities, the
Hebrew Union College of Cincin. Hebrew Union College of Cincin-nati, and the American Council of Learned Societies which finished its findings last May.

In an article printed in the Pal-In an article printed in the Fal-estine Post of June 20th, the leader of the expedition Dr. Nelson Glueck, Bible and Semitic Lan-guages professor at the Hebreu Union College, tells of the accom-plishments of the expedition in

ancient Edomite territory. "Immediately outside of Petra, etween Elji and the Sik leading into Petra, the expedition discovinto Petra, the expedition discov-ered the long sought Edomite site, called Tawilan, which is covered with masses of extraordinarily in-teresting Edomite pottery. There was a subsequent Nabataean and mediaeval Arabic occupation on was a subsequent Naciated and mediaeval Arabic occupation on the site. The Edomite pottery may be dated between the thirteenth and the eighth centuries B.C."

### Find Nabataean Sites

The article points out that the expedition also discovered numerous Nabataean sites. Dr. Glueck declares that, "it may be accepted as axiomatic that wherever an Edomite site is located, a Nabataean settlement is certain to be found. The closest relationship has now been established between Edomite and Nabataean pottery. The Nabataeans were the immediate successors of the Edomites, whom they displaced and absorbed, and whose culture they adopted and transmuted into the marvelous

"With the exception of Feinan," the article continues, "no Bronze Age sites have been found in Edom. Certainly between the nineteenth and the thirteenth centuries B.C., in Edom, as in Moab, there were no settled communities. The period between these centuries represents an historical blank.

"As a result of the discoveries of the expedition into Edom and Moab, it follows that the Exodus of the Israelites through southern Trans-Jordan could not have taken place before the thirteenth cen-tury B.C. It is recalled that, according to the Biblical account in Numbers 20, the Israelites had to beg the Edomites for permission to traverse their territory on the way to Promised Land. It was refused them

"Had the Exodus taken place before the thirteenth century B.C., the Israelites would have found neither Edomites nor Moabites who could have given or withheld

permission. The article concludes that "be-cause the Edomites and the Moscause the mountes and the Moa-bites had not occupied their re-spective territories before the thirteenth century B.C., the Is-realites would probably have occu-pied all of southern Trans-Jordan themselves had they arrived there before the thirteenth century B.C. and left the Promised Land for late comers.

When Christians began plucking the strings of Economic Liberty he discovered that all sorts of discordant minor keys emanated from his music box. The most resonant note he has attained thus far is that of anti-Semitism, a pitch he had never anticipated. His task at present appears to be to har-



monize the divergent notes of all anti-Semitic organizations into one blood-curdling scream which will throw all Jews into panic and attract into his fold the "Aryan" majority of the nation. Those who do not respond to the sweet allure of being persecutors of a minority race he will seek to drive into line, employing much the same factics as were used by Hitler. He will probably class them as the "Juden-Genossen" the "Jewish spirited," and thereby shame many "Aryans" into coming to a defense of their kind.

Perhaps one of the most widespread and potentially influential anti-Semitic organizations in the United States and the world is the "Anti-e of the World." Its southern national head-

Communist League of the World." quarters are in Houston, over which territory Major Luther I. Powell presides. Powell has been an active aide of "Silver Shirt" Pelley and appears to be willing to rent, for specified fees, his anti-Semitic influence to all comers.

The League's first communication to Christians came in the form of a request that he join. Christians has since been striving to align the various departments of the League with his group. The League has been inactive, except through exchange of correspond-ence; purchase of each other's books; and some slight cooperation in other fields of minor activity. Christians, it is calculated can bend all these departments into a strong, active group, using cudgels as well as words. Each member officer of the league controls an organization which is ac-tive locally or nationally. Just how many organizations comprise the League has not been revealed, but it is safe to assume that there

#### are scores. Ideals of League

The ideals of the League are set forth in the following commu-nication from General Henri C. Fletcher of Salt Lake City, who, as the League Universal Vice-Chairman, serves the organization from Washington, D. C. In the national capitol the League maintains only a Post Office address. It is Box 1826. The letter follows:

There are many other communications in Christians' files. The one, for instance, from Frank W. Clark, commander-in-chief of the League of War Veteran Guardsmen, which maintains National Headquarters at 16 Trinity ave-

nue, East Lynn, Mass. On April 28, 1934, Clark wrote, in part, to Christians: "Should any of our forefathers come back at this time they would immediately gather an army, comprising a majority, and overthrow those who have perverted our government, and they would do this without any hesitation.

#### Urges Revolution

"Every move of these capitalists now clearly indicates that there must be some form of a revolumust be some form of a revolu-tion, and such revolution be per-formed by a majority of the masses, and without the aid of the lewyer, judge, banker, and cheap politician. Such revolution is the only method that will ever again bring real happiness to the masses of producing labor. "Will advise you that I am in constant touch with key leader-

ships of various organizations throughout the country."

Sensing the worth of this man his organization, Christians to his organization, Christians promptly turned the matter over to Charles F. Davis of the Ohio Brokerage Company, Middleport, Ohio, who appears to be another White Shirt cabinet officer. ### Magistrate Brill to Ask Probe of 'Barbaric' Methods

Magistrate Jeanette G. Brill Joined with Magistrate David Maljoined with Magistrate David Mat-bin yesterday in criticizing police treatment of peddlers arrested in Coney Island.

She announced from the bench in Coney Island Court that she would ask Police Commissioner
O'Ryan to conduct an investigation immediately into the alleged
mistreatment of peddlers.

She declared that she would in-Mayor LaGuardia of the form Mayor Laguarda of the "barbaric, un-American treatment of children by police." On Sunday the same situation was the subject of a scathing attack by Magistrate Malbin. He found a small room under the boardwalk where peddlers were detained for several hours before being taken to the station house

"Wild animals in the zoo are better treated than the peddlers.' asserted Magistrate Brill yester-

John L. Schoenfeld, State Com John L. Schoenfeld, State Com-missioner of Correction, sat on the bench as a guest while Magistrate Brill suspended the sentences of eighty-two peddlers. Fifteen of she took into her chambers had coffee and sandwiches brought for them, and suggested that they dictate statements to a stenog-rapher describing their treatment at the hands of the police. She will forward these affidavits to the police commissioner.

One of the youths stated that when he had asked for a drink of water, a police officer told him, "If you yell for water again, I'll give you the end of a rubber hose."

Several of the peddlers stated that they were not permitted to communicate with worried parents and relatives.

Magistrate Brill asked the ar resitng officers why they did not serve summonses rather than make arrests. The officers replied that the peddlers could not provide identification. However, several of the peddlers produced chauffeur and food-handling licenses which, Mag-istrate Brill said, were first rate identification.

Complaints have been received

that an analogous situation exists in the North Bronx. Peddlers are arrested, sometimes early in the arrested, sometimes early in the morning, it was alleged, held for several hours in a police signal station, transported to a station house, held all day without being provided with food or drink, and then taken to night court.

Police say that magistrates refuse to fine peddlers, and this is the only way they can discourage illegal peddling.

> (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) SALONICA, July 23.— The po-groms and the reign of terror experienced by the Turkish Jews in Thrace were vividly described here today for the Jewish Telegraphic Agency by a Turkish Jewish refusucceeded in escaping from Adrianople with his family. For some weeks rumors had been For some weeks rumors had been current in Adrianople that attacks were being prepared against the Jews. The Jewish community paid no attention to the rumors, the

> refugee declared.
> On July 2 a mob of Turkish nationalists descended on the Jewish quarter in Adrianople, attacking the inhabitants, pillaging, burning and murdering the helpless Jews of the district. The attack had evidently been well prepared for it took the Jews by surprise.

Panic Pervades Quarter An indescribable panic reigned the Jewish quarter, with the moans of the dying mingled with yells of the nationalist Turks as they looted the Jewish shops and homes. For days the district was in the hands of the pogrom bands. who combed the town looking for

Jewish survivors.

The Jews fled from Adrianople as best they could. Those who had money were permitted to take trains to Istanbul, while the vast mass of poverty-stricken Jews mass of poverty-stricken Jews were compelled to camp in the open fields and make their way towards Istanbul and the Greek frontier.

Similar scenes of murder and looting took place in every town in Thrace with Jewish communities. At Kirklisse the barbarism of the nationalist pogrom bands sur-passed anything that took place passed anything that took place elsewhere. Jewish women and young girls were violated by the pogromists. Young girls were forc-

ibly separated from their parents Indescribable scenes of horror were enacted. Within a few hours a single Jew remained in Kirklisse

The few Jews who remained in Adrianople hid where they could and lived in a state of continual terror. Food-dealers of all kinds received orders from the nation-alist pogrom bands not to sell food to the Jews under pain of severe reprisals. Bakers refused to bread to Jews. Some Jewish families were able to procure bread only by paying five Turkish pounds

Premier Orders Halt Many days later orders arrived from Premier Ismet Pasha to halt the persecutions, but the fright-

ened Jews continued to leave Thrace. The Turkish government sent troops into Thrace and halted the pogroms, but the panic-stricken Jews continued to leave, on foot and in carts, traveling secretly at night to avoid the pogrom bands.

A detailed account of the pogroms in Thrace was published by the Salonica newspaper, Action. The story, which was written by a special correspondent, ended with the following declaration: "It is generally believed that these at-tacks were carried out with the full knowledge of the Turkish gov-ernment, otherwise how was it pos-sible for Turkish soldiers from so many surrounding villages to arrive in Adrianople to participate

in the pogroms?
"The order issued by the Turkish government at Angora to halt the attacks came when everything was over, and though the aggres-sions, the violations and the looting have ceased, fear is so deep in the hearts of the Jews who re-main in Thrace that no one wishes to expose his life or the honor of his wife and daughters."

### 3 Arlosoroff Defendants 'Cleansed in Blood,' Says Ginsburg

Condemnation of the Histadruth, Palestine labor organization, was the keynote of a Zionist Revisionist mass meeting at the Hotel Pennsylvania last night.

Elias Ginsburg, chairman of the Central Executive Committee of the Revisionist Organization, laid the blame for "provocative propa-ganda disrupting Jewry" at the door of the Histadruth. "Stavsky, Rosenblatt and Achi-

meier, three courageous Palestinian Revisionists," he declared, "have been cleansed in a blood bath." Ginsburg praised Achimeier for

daring to contravene the Palestine government in the interests of the Jewish people.

Hearty applause greeted the name of Rabbi Abraham HaCohen Kook, chief rabbi of Palestine, who has been active in the defense of Stavsky.

Ginsburg praised the Jewish
Daily Bulletin and Herman Bernstein, editor, for impartial news
reports of the Stavsky case. He
delivered a scathing attack on
Jacob Fishman, editor of the Jewsh Morning Journal and challenged him to a public dehate on
Revistonism. Revisionism.

Aaron Propes, head of the Po-sh Revisionists, expressed his Revisionists, expressed his gratification at the vindication of Stavsky.

"When Stavsky was freed in Palestine," said Mordecai Danzis of the Revisionist executive committee, "many of us hoped for a rapprochement between the Rerapprochement between the Re-visionists and the Histadruth. But the Histadruth actions of the last few days, such as attacks on Stavsky by its press and stoning of a synagogue where he was worshipping, have shown us that the Histadruth remains the same. They have no willingness for peace."

Danzis pointed out that the Stavsky acquittal proves the effi-cacy of organized protest. If not for a petition in Stavsky's behalf, Danzis declared, he have been acquitted.

B. Epstein praised Rabbi Kook for his work in Stavsky's behalf. He blamed the Histadrath for the case and demanded that the Histadruth leaders retire from polit-
