Jewish Black Sheep

The League of National German Jews, a small Jewish organization in Germany, which has licked the Nazi boots that kicked the Jewish people in Germany, has now issued an appeal to all German Jews to vote for Hitler. The League even justifies the anti-Jewish persecutions by declaring that the sufferings of the Jews in Germany were necessary in order to clear away the damage done by "un-German elements."

The appeal reads, in part, as follows:

"We members of the League of National German Jews, founded in 1919, have always in war or peace placed the good of the German people and the German Fatherland above our own good. Accordingly, we greeted the national uprising of January, 1933, although it brought rigors for us, for we saw it as the only means to clear away the damage done in fourteen unhappy years by un-German elements. . . . We urge all Jews who feel themselves Germans to vote 'Yes' on August 19."

These Jewish Nazis deserve the contempt of all Jews. Their cringing, cowardly and humiliating attitude cannot fail to disgust even the most hardened "Aryan" Nazis. These Nazi Jews, who are betraying German Jewry by insinuating that it was disloyal to Germany, are "the destroyers within Israel" whom the prophets of old characterized as the most dangerous.

Fortunately, the membership of the Nazi German Jewish Black Sheep organization is very small.

The Blood Libel

The attack on President Masaryk in Julius Streicher's Der Stuermer was made because Masaryk, as a young professor, defended a Jew who had been accused and convicted of ritual murder in old Austria. The Hitlerite ritual murder organ, published in Nuremberg, was confiscated for two weeks on the ground that the attack on Ma-

French Back Jews' Fight For Rights

World Will Hear Voice,
Says Barthou in Note
to Conference

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
GENEVA, Aug. 19.—The French government today officially expressed its solidarity with the world-wide Jewish fight for the maintenance of political and economic rights in a special message sent by Foreign Minister Louis Barthou to the World Jewish Conference which opens here tomorrow in the presence of ninety delegates from twenty-five countries.

Emphasizing that the "world's heart will hear the voice of the Jewish people," Minister Barthou's message declared that "the Jewish world is gathering for the highly important task of proclaiming the human and legal equality of all religions and races. 'It is deplorable to be compelled to reproclaim this when the French revolution carried out this emancipation a long time ago,' the message continued. 'However, new events necessitate the rescue of civilization from the dangers of reactionary movements.'"

Senator Justin Godart, French statesman and president of the French Palestine Committee, in a message to the conference, ap-

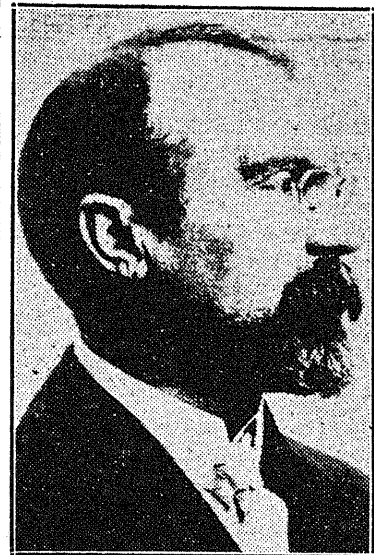

WARSAW, Aug. 19.—Police arrested a number of Naras, members of the anti-government, anti-Semitic National Radical party, Friday night at Radosz, near this city, it was announced today, on charges of illegal activities.

The prisoners were accused also of distributing the Stafeta, Nara newspaper which had been suppressed by the authorities during the disorders incidental to the murder of Col. Pieracki, Minister of the Interior. The paper, which had been secretly printed, was not only distributed throughout Radosz, but also had been tacked up on walls in public places.

Nazi Threats and Propaganda Fall Short as Citizens Stay Away From Polls or Deface Ballots in Startling Numbers

LONDON, Aug. 20 (Monday).—More than 5,000,000 German men and women, despite all efforts at intimidation, voted against Adolf Hitler's seizure of the Reich president's office and his merger of it with the Chancellorship in yesterday's plebiscite, late returns received here indicated early today.

Yorkville Emits Great Big Yawn Over 'Election'

Local Nazis Unconcerned
Over Results; 'Antis'
Heartened by Nays

Even Nazi Yorkville showed yesterday that it is getting tired of Hitler's in-the-bag elections. The district really did not awaken until headlines in the early editions of the morning papers startled the section into an unpleasant awareness of the waning glory of the Fuehrer in the fatherland.

No radio facilities broadcast the election returns. Consequently the little knots of persons that usually jam Yorkville streets when Hitler speaks or when he has himself "elected" did not turn out. There were no rallies in any of the usual meeting places of the Nazis.

Casual conversation during the afternoon did not concern itself with the German plebiscite. The talk overheard in Yorkville cafes seldom turned to political subjects, and when it did there appeared to be little doubt in the speakers' minds that Hitler would meet with no opposition.

The spirit of Nazi Yorkville appeared to conform pretty much with the editorial anticipations of the Deutsche Zeitung, local Nazi organ. In a typical made-to-order

This was the strongest expression of opposition to the Nazi regime since it entrenched itself in the Reich.

Out of almost 46,000,000 ballots cast in the referendum on Hitler's action following the death of the late President Paul von Hindenburg, only 38,000,000, in round numbers, were "Ja," while more than 5,000,000 were against, and millions either stayed away from the polls in open defiance or spoiled their ballots.

Catholics, Jews Vote "Nay"
Reports received here said that in districts thickly populated by Catholics and workers the vote against Hitler was increasing as the ballots were counted, and a strong percentage of disapproval was recorded in Wilmersdorf, Berlin suburb in which hundreds of Jews reside.

That so large a negative vote should be cast, despite terrific pressure exerted by the Nazi Propaganda Ministry and constant threats that anyone who voted "No" would be marked a traitor, was considered in well-informed circles here as clear evidence that the Nazi chieftain is losing ground. The same view was expressed in the local newspapers. The Daily Herald called the vote "the biggest yet against Hitler."

Hitler himself had declared the plebiscite the real test of his regime.

Many for Thaelmann
One of the most popular methods of spoiling ballots in this odd "election," in which the electorate had no one to vote for except Der Fuehrer, was to mark the name of Ernst Thaelmann, Communist leader now in prison.

The turnout against Hitler would have been even greater, some observers contended, but for a widespread rumor that the Nazis had erected specially built ballot boxes capable of detecting "No" votes.

The Morning Post characterizes as "most pathetic" the appeal last Friday of the League of National German Jews, in which all Jews "who feel themselves Germans" were admonished to vote for Hitler.

9,000 Striking Goods Workers Return Today

Win Partial Victory as Union Ratifies Tentative Settlement

Under a tentative settlement ratified Saturday morning, two-thirds of the 14,000 striking members of the Knit Goods Workers Union, branch of the International Ladies Garment Workers Union, were to return to work this morning after a two weeks' strike.

The ratification by the union of the temporary agreement came on the heels of a meeting between representatives of the union and of the employers' group, the Metropolitan Knitted Textile Association, which was presided over by Brooklyn Borough President Raymond V. Ingersoll, whom Mayor LaGuardia named as mediator on Friday.

Approximately one-third of the members of the industry are employed by individual proprietors who have not as yet settled with the union. It is expected, however, that settlements will be effected soon and all strikers return to work.

The tentative agreement calls for a thirty-six hour week for the first year and a thirty-five hour week thereafter. The strikers originally demanded a thirty-five hour week, a reduction of two and a half hours weekly from the present scale.

It also provides for wage scales according to the classification of workers. All other problems are to be arbitrated by Mr. Ingersoll, who is to render final decisions by Thursday.

Newark Reich Veterans Refuse to Submit to Hitler Flag Dictum

NEWARK, N. J., Aug. 19.—The reaction of local German war veterans to the order reported from Berlin that all Nazis must cease displaying the old black, white and red flag, was swiftly condemned and defied, in keeping with the recent determination of the ex-servicemen to prohibit all Hitler propaganda from their ranks.

In announcing plans for a Hindenburg memorial in Irvington, under the auspices of the local post of the German and Austrian War Veterans, Richard H. Krueger, commander, declared that they would "stick to the black, white and red flag of the old empire, under which they fought in the World War. They will not recognize the swastika which Mr. Hitler himself has termed a 'symbol of anti-Semitism'."

Mizrachi Will Censure Rabbi On Vaad Leumi

Ostrowsky Scored for Stand After Orthodox Unit's Withdrawal

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LWOW, Aug. 19.—The standing committee of the world council of the Mizrachi, orthodox Zionists, which opened its sessions here today, immediately adopted a resolution declaring that Rabbi M. Ostrowsky of Palestine does not represent the Mizrachi organization on the Vaad Leumi, the Jewish National Council of Palestine. Rabbi Ostrowsky was sharply criticized in the resolution for having remained in the Vaad Leumi after the Mizrachi had withdrawn and his breach of organizational discipline was handed over to a Mizrachi court of honor for consideration.

The meeting of the world council of the Mizrachi was to have opened here on Friday, but was postponed until today owing to the fact that the organization had neglected to obtain permission from Polish authorities to hold the meeting.

The standing committee also adopted resolutions criticizing the Emigzeirot, Jewish youth colonization organizations, and also the Vaad Leumi, for having "failed to protect the Chief Rabbi of Palestine, Rabbi A. I. HaCohen Kook, against the attacks made on him by left wing elements in Palestine."

The conference proclaimed the month of Nissan (April 4-May 4, 1935), as a month of anniversary in memory of the Rambam, Rabbi Moses Maimonides, great Jewish physician, philosopher and biblical commentator; the month of Elul (August 30-September 30, 1935), to celebrate the seventieth birthday of Rabbi Kook, and the month of Kislev (November 8-December 8, 1934), to celebrate the sixtieth birthday of Rabbi Meier Berlin, world president of the Mizrachi organization.

3 Jewish Councillors Re-elected at Safad

SAFAD, Palestine, July 26.—Four Moslems and three Jewish councillors were re-elected at municipal elections here yesterday. The Mufti family came out of the electoral feud with a significant victory, having placed two relatives in office. Warburg Asks Synagogue Aid For Reich Jews

Says United Jewish Appeal Has Raised Over \$1,660,000

Over 2,000 synagogues in every part of the country affiliated with the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, the United Synagogues of America and the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America, are being called upon to make the plight of German Jewry their first thought during the coming Holy Days, Felix M. Warburg, chairman of the United Jewish Appeal, declared yesterday.

An appeal to the officers and spiritual leaders of these congregations, endorsed by Ludwig Vogelstein, president of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, with which the Reform Jewish congregations of this country are affiliated; by Louis J. Moss, president of the United Synagogues of America, comprising the conservative congregations, and William Weiss, president of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations, has been made by Mr. Warburg.

In his plea to American Jewry to make the advent of the New Year "less black and dreary for our fellow-Jews in Germany," Mr. Warburg detailed what has been accomplished with the approximately \$1,660,000 thus far raised by the United Jewish Appeal.

"Thousands of Jews have been helped to retrain for new vocations; their elementary relief needs have to be furnished; their fundamental cultural and educational institutions have been maintained; orderly immigration to other countries has been facilitated," Mr. Warburg stated.

"Systematic provision for the thousands of refugees outside Germany has also been made possible through funds furnished by the United Jewish Appeal. To Palestine have come thousands of refugees outside of Germany was made possible through funds furnished by the United Jewish Appeal. To Palestine have come thousands of German Jews, finding new opportunities for a free and morally healthful life," he added, and pointed out that as the principal instrument of American Jewry to cope with the problems arising out of the German Jewish situation, "the United Jewish Appeal needs the maximum co-operation if its purposes are to be adequately fulfilled."

saryk was a "libel against the head of a State."

The vicious assault on President Masaryk by the Nazi arch Jew-baiter was called forth by the recent publication of a book entitled "The Struggle of Polna, The Story of a Martyr," by Bruno Walter, describing the notorious Polna "ritual murder" case, Masaryk's defense of Leopold Hilsner and his denunciation of the "ritual murder" myth.

The Stuermer said:

"The martyr is the Polna Jew who killed two Christian girls, whose blood was misused by the Polna Jewish Community for ritual purposes. Hilsner was condemned to death by a Law Court. . . . It was only when Jewry succeeded in buying the then Deputy Masaryk, this half-Jew herosage who is today President of Czechoslovakia, and who knew how to bribe the authorities in Vienna, that the death sentence was changed to one of penal servitude for life. When Czechoslovakia was created, Masaryk naturally got his friend out of jail, appointed him Rabbi in a little Czech town, and compensated him with about a million Czech kronen. . . ."

These and other absurdities and falsehoods, mild in comparison with its usual attacks on the Jews, appeared in the confiscated issue of Der Stuermer, which is now resuming publication.

Recently there appeared abroad a highly interesting book, "President Masaryk Tells His Story," recounted by Karel Capek, the famous Czech author of R.U.R. and other important plays and novels. That volume contains President Masaryk's life story—his struggles, his philosophy and his achievements. There is also his brief and simple account of the Hilsner affair.

In an explanatory note, Mr. Capek writes:

"Hilsner was a young Jew who was accused in 1899 of murdering two girls near the town of Polna and using their blood for rites connected with the Jewish religion. He was tried and convicted, and the trial let loose a storm of anti-Semitic feeling. Masaryk was convinced, from a study of the evidence, that Hilsner was innocent, and flung himself into the campaign to prove it."

And this is President Masaryk's own version of the affair:

"The campaign over the Hilsner affair was a bad business, in which I had to struggle with the superstition about ritual murder. At first I took no interest in the case, but a former student of mine, the Moravian writer Sigmund Muentz, came from Vienna to see me and prevailed upon me to take part. I knew the books of the Berlin theologian Starck describing the origin and history of the ritual superstition. I gave Muentz my opinion of the matter, and he published it in the Neue Freie Presse. That landed me in the thick of the fray. The Viennese anti-Semites incited the Czech nationalist and clerical press to attack me. Naturally I had to defend myself; having taken the first step I had to go on. To do this I had to study criminology and physiology, on both of which I published detailed articles. I travelled to Polna to inspect the

scene of the crime and its surroundings. And then they said that I had been paid to do it by the Jews. Students and non-students came to my University lectures to shout me down. When they did that I chalked up a protest on the blackboard against the absurd calumny, and challenged my hearers to come to my house and substantiate it, giving reasons for their demonstration; one single student arrived that afternoon to answer my challenge, a slim, pleasant-faced young man who later became known as the poet Otakar Theer. So that my detractors might not imagine that I was afraid of them, I went the rounds of the whole lecture hall and challenged each to argument, but none of them dared. And what do you think? The University, instead of taking a strong stand and restoring order, actually suspended my lectures for a fortnight! That evening the crowd came to my house; I was in bed with a chill, so my wife went out to them, and told them that I was lying down but that if they wanted to speak to me they could send a deputation. No one came. I suffered much through this campaign, not because I was attacked, but because the level of the attacks was so low."

President Masaryk concludes with the remarks that during the war he saw how useful his defense of Hilsner and his denunciation of ritual murder had been. He writes that the Jews, especially those in control of the press, knew him from the Hilsner case, and repaid him for what he had done for them, by writing favorably about the cause of Czechoslovakia. And he adds:

"That helped us a great deal politically."

Thus Czechoslovakia was helped by Jewish public opinion during and after the war in appreciation of what Professor Masaryk had done years before as a fact-finder and as a courageous champion of the truth.

It is this that the Jew-baiting Nazis cannot forgive President Masaryk and the Jews.

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Adjusting Our Lives

Jewish Neighborhoods in New York

By far the most striking trait that differentiates the present-day Jewish communities in the great American cities from those of forty or thirty years ago is the decentralization and the dispersion of the Jewish population over various metropolitan areas. The new Jewish neighborhoods are widely scattered over the big cities wherein the bulk of American Jewry resides.

The more modern and fashionable a new Jewish city-section is, the remoter is it from the old immigrant ghetto which, after all, has little changed since it was first settled by the Jews.

Exodus From Old Settlement Areas

Within the last fifteen years, the old Jewish sections of New York have lost from one-third to one-half of their Jewish population. From the densest Jewish sections, such as the lower East Side, Harlem, and Williamsburgh, over thirty per cent. of the Jewish residents have moved away since 1916. The aggregate decrease in population amounts to 250,000.

The natural desire to improve one's standard of life, to live in more attractive, and comfortable homes, is one of the main driving forces of the population movements in the cities. Again, the influx of the Negroes from the South has supplied an additional impetus for the white people to look for newer residential sections.

Thus, there arise new purely-Jewish sections, as it were, diluted ghettos, called by sociologists "areas of second settlement," such as Second avenue around Fourteenth street, the South Bronx, and East New York. Applying this term to still newer developments, we may call the Grand Concourse, Eastern parkway and Flatbush "areas of third settlement."

Accordingly, the common notion that Jewish areas are located only on the lower East Side, or in other poor districts, is unfounded. In fact, the percentage of Jews for the lower East Side is now only 49.5; whereas other sections of Greater New York have a much denser Jewish population, up to ninety-five per cent. of the total number of residents.

Population Movements in Brooklyn

The method of Jewish population trends is best revealed by the circumstances accompanying the growth of the greatest Jewish borough—Brooklyn. For years, of course, a migration has taken place from Manhattan into the old and new sections of Brooklyn, such as New Lots, Borough Park, and Flatbush. In 1916 the whole Jewish population of Brooklyn hardly reached 600,000, yet by 1930 it verged upon 900,000, an increase of fifty per cent.

But within Brooklyn, too, Jewish families from eastern sections (Brownsville) have moved westward, into Flatbush, Midwood, and so on. At the same time, the immigrant-residents from the northern sections (Williamsburgh and Willoughby) have been in an unbroken procession moving southward, that is into Bay Ridge, Bensonhurst, and Coney Island.

The rapid growth of the Jewish community in Coney Island is particularly noticeable. There about 65,000 Jews, or ninety-six per cent. of the total population, reside.

Now, the Brooklyn movement has all been away from the old type dwellings and into one-family, two-family and apartment house sections. Originally, settlements in the new Jewish area, it has been observed, were made in sections where one-family houses prevailed. But the next wave from the older ghetto moved largely into two-family houses.

The third and final wave consisted mainly of an apartment house population, because the rise in land values made the construction of smaller dwellings, in point of cost, prohibitive. In North Flatbush, Eastern Parkway, and Borough Park, to name but a few sections, no more small structures are likely to be erected. These regions, that is to say, are bound to remain what they are today—pre-

eminently upper middle class sections.

On the other hand, Eastern Flatbush, attracting as it does large parts of the population moving out from East New York, is at the point of becoming the newest center of the lower middle class Jewish population in Brooklyn.

Economic Status

The Federal Census of 1930 records present a distribution of home values and rentals for each of the 300 "health areas" which make up the metropolitan territory. A recent special study by a Jewish sociologist, Dr. J. B. Maller, covered fifteen of these areas with an estimated percentage of Jews ranging from eighty-six to ninety-nine, with an average of ninety-three per cent.

These Jewish areas were located as follows: one in Manhattan, four in the Bronx, and ten in Brooklyn. The total population in these areas was 497,223.

Now, the average monthly rental for the Jewish areas was \$43. This is practically the same as the average monthly rental for the city as a whole. By and large, therefore, in economic status the Jewish neighborhoods are identical with the rest of New York.

This study of Jewish neighborhoods is to be continued so as to provide data on occupations, unemployment, recreational facilities, and the like.

Traits of Jewish Areas

The study has revealed that the Jewish population is relatively younger than the total population in New York. The younger age groups had higher proportions in Jewish areas, while in the remainder of Greater New York the older age groups formed a large part of the population than in Jewish areas. Naturally, in the Jewish sections of the city there was a larger proportion of foreign-born and children of the foreign-born.

The Jewish areas have a slightly lower birth rate, and a definitely lower death rate and infant mortality rate, as compared with data for the total city. The death rate among Jews is lower for all causes of death except diabetes.

The school population in Jewish sections shows a smaller percentage of the more common physical defects, except vision. The pupils in these schools have a higher average of attendance and a higher rate of school progress.

Many Hearts Ache as Rome Excavates an Ancient Cemetery

Jews Watch Sadly as Fascists Dig Up Two-Century-Old Graves on Aventine Hill for Removal to Verona

The volumes date back to the days when printing was invented. The most precious copies are to be preserved, while the rest were reburied with a solemn ceremony.

ROME, Aug. 14.—On the 28th of October of this year, the thirteenth after the Fascist revolution and Mussolini's march on Rome, a beautiful promenade stretching along the historic Aventine Hill and the neighborhood of the famous Circus Maximus, where in the ancient Roman imperial days the gruesome gladiatorial games were held, will be formally opened.

In order to carry out the project, which is part of Mussolini's plan to beautify the city of the Caesars and to show the world the colossal monuments of ancient Rome in all their glory, the ancient Jewish cemetery of this archaeological area is being destroyed.

When the visitor to Rome surveys the panorama of the city from the Palatine or the Forum Romanum he notices at once, at the foot of the Aventine Hill, the many white tombstones and the fragrant cypress trees of the old Jewish burial ground which is known as the Orto Delli Evrei—the Garden of the Jews.

Where Roman Jews Lie

For several hundred years, until 1894, the bones of Roman Jews had rested there. And the tombstones bear the tale of the ambitions and the sorrows of the most beautiful figures in Italian Jewry which for hundreds of years languished in the crowded stone buildings of the ghetto.

The tombstones on the Jewish cemetery near the Aventine Hill—and many of them are of distinct artistic value—have been standing there since the year 1846, which marked the beginning of the more liberal epoch of Pope Pius IX. Up to that time the Papal government had not permitted the sculpting of names over the graves of Jewish dead except in the case of prominent rabbis or other learned men.

The appearance of the old Jewish Aventine cemetery which, within a short time, will have been completely dug up becomes still more impressive as one slowly climbs along the Via Santa Sabina of the Aventine Hill. As one regards the neighborhood, with the Forum nearby, the quietly flowing Tiber and the tall cypresses, one involuntarily recalls that our Roman brethren, who were forced to suffer so many privations in the ghetto and so much debasement as the result of special laws, now rest in one of the most impressive of surroundings, not far from the old patrician villas and the ruins of the days of the emperors.

Dead Move to Verona

Now these bones, which have lain here for more than two hundred years, are being transferred to the Jewish cemetery of Verona, which has existed since 1894.

The Jewish community of Rome did everything in its power to preserve the old Aventine cemetery. In 1909, when for some other reason it was being planned to remove the cemetery, the Jewish community succeeded in blocking the proposal. A similar attempt was made twelve years ago, when on the Aventine—one of the Seven Hills upon which Rome stands—a monument to Mazzini, one of the great fighters for Italy's liberation, was to be erected.

Now, however, it appears that all efforts to keep the cemetery intact were in vain. The construction of the new road is an integral part of Mussolini's program for making the appearance of the Eternal City more beautiful and more impressive.

The city administration of Rome, it must be acknowledged,

promised to do everything possible to compensate the Jewish community and took upon itself the task, difficult and expensive, of moving the graves and bones of the dead to the cemetery at Verona.

City Compensates for Loss

In addition it was decided that the Roman city government give to the Jewish community an area of 2,800 square meters, upon which the building of the new Jewish public school will be erected.

In the meantime, the work of excavation is in full swing, and goes along at a truly "Fascist" tempo. Several hundred workers are engaged in excavating the graves, collecting the bones and moving them in locked chests to the Verona cemetery.

Despite the great heat of this summer, little groups of relatives of the dead stand about the open graves and with endless sorrow in their eyes gaze upon what is left of their dearest relatives, their mothers and their fathers, and feel the tragedy of their present wandering, after years of death, to find a new resting place.

In the course of the past few weeks I have seen many painful scenes I shall not soon forget. My Italian friend who led me about among the opened graves gazed with silent glance all about him.

A few weeks more and the old Orto Delli Evrei—the Jewish Garden—will no more lie at the foot of the Aventine. The cypresses will remain, but they will no longer speak to the hearts of the Roman Jews and will no longer shade the old graves of our Roman brethren.

The panorama of the white Jewish monuments will disappear from the old Aventine burying-ground which spoke to the emotions and the imagination of every Jewish visitor to the Eternal City.

Registration for Aliens Urged by Steubenites To Weed Out 'Foes'

(Special to the J.D.B.)

MILWAUKEE, Aug. 19.—Registration by the government of all aliens, so as to weed out "undesirables," was urged here by Jacob Beuscher, leader in the Steuben society and other German organizations, in an address to the Republican club.

Beuscher demanded that the government deport aliens whose records show them to be "enemies of this country." Beuscher is known as a member of the highly conservative faction of Germans here.

Nazis in U. S. Move to Subsidize Return of Saarlanders for Vote

(Special to the J.D.B.)
MILWAUKEE, Aug. 19.—Nazi forces in this country will conduct an intensive nation-wide campaign to raise funds to provide free trips to the Saar for citizens of that region now residing in the United States, so that they may vote in the January plebiscite to decide whether the Saar will be returned to Germany.
Plans for this drive came to light during an address before the Milwaukee chapter of the Friends of New Germany by Karl Sauter of Chicago, a member of the Saarlander-Verein fuer Chicago und den Mittelwesten (the Saarlanders' Association for Chicago and the Middle West).
Sauter told the "Friends" that the League of Nations governing body has given residents of other countries who have retained their Saar citizenship the right to vote in the plebiscite. He prophesied that thousands of Saarlanders throughout the world will return to the region to cast their ballots. They will make the trip either with their own money or with the aid of contributions, he said.
The Chicagoan denied that the Hitler government has allocated funds for the purpose of financing this project.
He bitterly assailed France for attempting to retain the Saar. "Seven-eighths of the Saar residents will vote to unite with the Reich," he asserted. "The Socialists are in complete dissolution. They will vote with the common front for return to Germany." The French and the Communists will be the only dissenters, he declared.
Copies of the forged and discredited Protocols of the Elders of Zion were sold at the meeting for \$1 each. They were the brand of the Patriotic Publishing Company, Inc., of Chicago. Other anti-Semitic literature also was on sale.
Sauter appealed to all Saar citizens who were present to apply for membership in the Saarlander-Verein. He received several responses.

Prussia Restricts Trade School Entry

Minister of Education Rust Limits Jewish Admission; Foreigners Unaffected

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN, Aug. 19.—A numerus clausus for German Jewish students applying for admission to Prussian trade schools was announced today by Bernhardt Rust, Prussian Minister of Education. According to the terms of the order only one and one-half per cent of the total enrollment in the trade schools may be Jewish.
This limitation does not, however, apply to foreign Jewish students, it was announced. Recently the Nazi government and various Nazi agencies made efforts to encourage foreign Jews to come to Germany as tourists, students and also to the German health and vacation resorts. In every case it was made plain, however, that restrictions against German Jews would not be relaxed and they are not welcome, although foreign Jews were.

3,000 Textile Strikers Still Out in Poland

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LODZ, Aug. 19.—Over 3,000 Lodz textile workers, the majority of whom are Jewish, are still out on strike demanding an increase of wages. The strike began officially on August 16.

Jews of Salonica In Serious Straits

Community President Reveals \$57,600 Debt in Face of Emergency

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
SALONICA, Aug. 19.—As a result of the general economic situation which has hit Greek Jews with especial force, the Salonica Jewish community organization is in a serious situation, facing an indebtedness of 6,000,000 drachma (about \$57,600 at current exchange), Leon Carnaty, president of the community, revealed here at a press conference.
The financial plight of the community organization, Carnaty said, is especially serious in view of the general poverty of the Jewish community and the heavy burden of emergency relief put upon it.

Wants Name of Ullstein Taken From Berlin Firm

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
BERLIN, Aug. 7.—It is not enough that the Ullstein Jews have been cleared out of the Ullstein Publishing concern, and that it has been brought under complete Aryan control, but the name Ullstein, too, must be removed, says the Deutsche Zukunft. "The name Ullstein is associated with the old Liberal-Jewish order with which Nazi Germany has nothing in common, and for the sake of 'Germany's future' the name must be changed."

Mr. Hersch has been invited by Mr. Landau to serve on the board of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in London and of the Palestine Telegraphic Agency in Jerusalem. He will proceed with Mr. Landau in the early autumn to Palestine.

Hapoel Members Honor Grave of Ephraim Chizik, Slain in Colony Defense

HULDA, Palestine, Aug. 4.—The grave of Ephraim Chizik, who was killed in the August 1929 riots as he helped defend this colony, was visited last night by 800 members of the Hapoel.

Laborites from all parts of Palestine paid tribute at the tomb of the young man, whose sister Sara was killed while defending Tel Hai with Joseph Trumpeldor in 1920.

Photographs of Chizik, Arlosoroff and Herzl, with black-draped Hapoel red flags, provided the background for the memorial ceremony.

Stamford to Open Campaign

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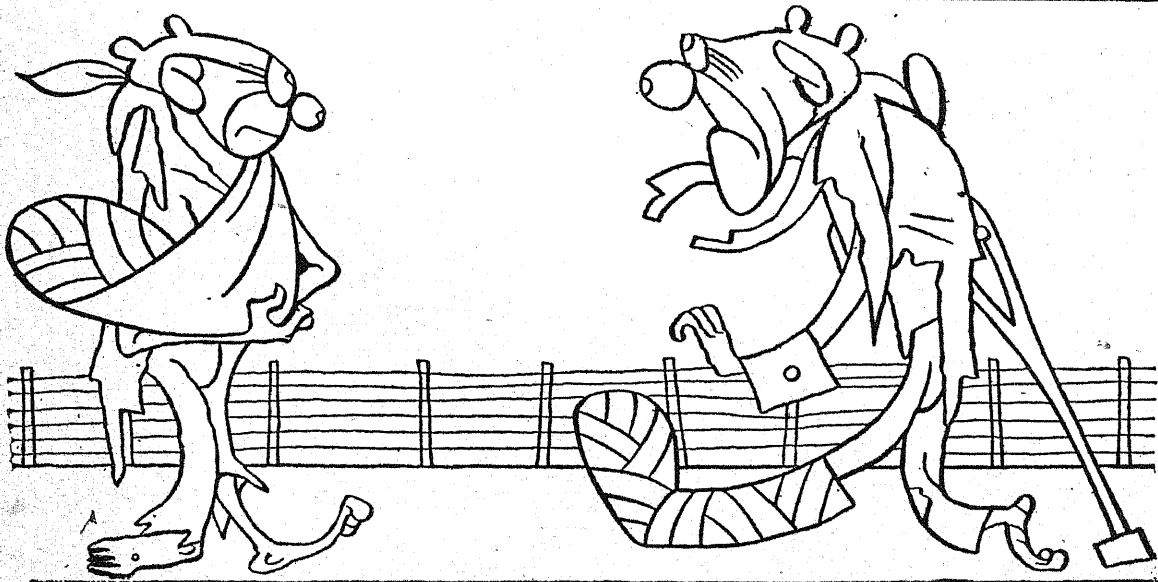

Illegal Entry, Elections Vex Palestine

4 Arrested as Arab Is Injured In Clash Over Illegal Entry Issue

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JERUSALEM, Aug. 19.—The Arab scout who was wounded at Nathania on Thursday when a clash took place between Jewish colonists and Arabs dressed as scouts who passed through the village on the way to seashore to prevent Jewish immigrants from entering the country illegally, is recovering, it was learned today. His condition was originally reported as serious. London newspapers had reported his death.

Infuriated Jews of the colony fell upon the Arabs, who were voluntarily serving with other Arabs as guards to prevent Jews from entering Palestine illegally and to turn over to the police those who succeeded in getting into the country.

A temporary police post set up by detachments of police sped to the scene and arrested four settlers yesterday in connection with the attack, but their release was expected momentarily today after the Arabs had failed to identify them.

Fears that the disorders would spread were allayed when Tulkarm, Nablus and Jaffa yesterday failed to echo with new clashes and the rest of the countryside reported all quiet.

Issue is Sore Spot
Al Falastin, Arab nationalist daily, dissatisfied with the promises of the government that illegal immigration into the country would be suppressed, protested that this had been promised many times in the past. The only effective measure, it declared, would be the complete stoppage of all Jewish immigration.

The question of illegal immigration has been one of the sore spots in the administration of Palestine. A major problem because of the

large number of Jews desirous of entering the country and the difficulties in entering legally, it is fought not only by the government and by Arabs opposed to all Jewish settlement in the country, but also by the Jewish Agency for Palestine, which distributes the immigration certificates allotted to Jews by the government.

The Jewish Agency is attempting to select immigrants on the basis of their capabilities and adaptability to the immediate needs of the country. Illegal entry by Jews not only deprives the Agency of the opportunity to do so but also limits the number of certificates available to it since the government has made a practice of limiting the number granted to a figure lower than it would otherwise give because of the number of illegal entrants.

Measures Promised
Recently the country has been agitated by the practice of Arabs in acting as scouts for the police in detaining Jews whom they suspected of being illegally in the country, and resentment at the practice has resulted in a score of minor clashes. The Arabs recently recruited Bedouin tribesmen as a volunteer frontier force to watch for would-be settlers seeking to enter the country over its land borders.

In an official communique this week, High Commissioner Wauchope, while promising that measures would be taken to prevent illegal immigration, scored the volunteer activities of the Arabs which, he said, embarrassed the authorities and tended to promote breaches of the peace. He warned that unless these ceased, the persons responsible would be liable to prosecution under the criminal code.

Noted Russian Cantor To Sing in Brooklyn

Cantor Ben-Zion Kapov-Kagan, cantor of the Broder Synagogue in Odessa, Russia, has been engaged by the Ocean Parkway Jewish Center in Brooklyn, it was announced yesterday.

Kapov-Kagan has come to the United States for a six-months concert tour. He will be supported at the Brooklyn synagogue by a double choir of twelve voices under the direction of Oscar Julius.

Gevirtz Named Cantor

(Special to the J.D.B.)
WOODMERE, L. I., Aug. 18.—Charles Haskell Gevirtz, recently elected cantor of the Congregation Sons of Israel of Woodmere, will officiate at High Holy Days services in the new building at Irving place, it was announced today.

The new synagogue and community center will serve the Jews of Woodmere and Hewlett.

'Jim Crow' Cars Appear In Poland for Jews

WARSAW, Aug. 19.—"Jim Crow" coaches for "non-Aryans" made their first appearance in the Polish Republic when the Liga Morska Kolonialna, an organization campaigning for colonial possessions for Poland, arranged an excursion to the new port of Gdynia, the Polish Jewish newspaper, Chwila, reported.

Jews joining the excursion were segregated in different coaches and had to pass through twenty-six coaches reserved for "Aryans," the paper charged, in order to reach their dining-car.

Refugee Town To Be Erected Near Haifa Bay

Cornerstone Is Laid for Kiryath Bialik, With 100 Homes

The cornerstone for a community of 100 homes for German Jewish refugee families in the vicinity of Haifa Bay in Palestine, which is to be known as the Kiryath Bialik in memory of the poet laureate of the Jewish people, was laid in July, according to a report just received here by the United Jewish Appeal.

Adjoining the Kiryath Chaim (named for the late Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff), it is the first large-scale undertaking for the permanent settlement of refugees in the Holy Land under the auspices of the Hitachduth Olej Germania, which from the beginning of the influx of Jews from the Reich has been devoting itself to the solution of their problems.

The project was aided by the Jewish National Fund, which placed at the disposal of the Hitachduth Olej Germania 600 dunams of land, 200 to be used for a suburban development and the balance for an adjoining agricultural settlement. For those desiring to settle on a suburban basis, leases were issued for a two-third dunam on which to build a stone house and to cultivate a kitchen garden. On the 400 dunams assigned for agricultural development, twenty agricultural settlers are to be established.

Kiryath Bialik, plans for which were laid out by Professor Abercrombie, noted town-planner, is modeled along the same lines as the suburban settlements dotting the country through the efforts of the Jewish Workers' Organization of Palestine. It was projected by the Hitachduth Olej Germania as soon as the first refugees arrived in Palestine, it being realized by this organization that, in order that the largest number of German Jews might be economically absorbed, speed was essential. A survey of conditions convinced the Olej Germania that Haifa Bay presented better possibilities under present conditions and in view of the large number expected there than in any other part of the land. A survey of rental costs on the Hadar Carmel developed the interesting fact that the leasing of a two-room apartment would amount to about sixty per cent of the cost of a house in a self-contained suburban settlement, and that the balance of the construction cost could be paid in small installments over a period of years. At the same time it was ascertained that the General Mortgage Bank was ready to advance a loan, as a first mortgage, of fifty per cent of the construction cost of each house.

In addition to the dwellings, which are expected to be completed in about a year (including fifteen farm houses for the agricultural settlement), a water supply must be developed, schools, kindergartens and a community center will have to be provided, and roadways constructed for this new settlement, which is the second largest Jewish suburb established at Haifa Bay, where, it is expected, a number of additional suburbs will be developed in the near future.

The Central Bureau for the Settlement of German Jews in Palestine has granted substantial, long-term second mortgages on these houses for settlers in straitened circumstances.

Arabs See Legislative Council For Holy Land Despite Protests

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
JERUSALEM, Aug. 5. — That the High Commissioner has already completed plans to introduce a legislative council, which will be preceded by elections, within the coming year, is a statement made in the local Arabic paper, Falastin, which adds that British Colonial Office approval has been secured for the move. The authorities are awaiting only the completion of elections to the Jerusalem and Haifa municipalities this month to take the first step of drawing up the voting lists, which is to be about the beginning of September.

"The council will be established whether or not the Jews want it," says the paper. It gives the rumors published in the Hebrew press that David Ben-Gurion, member of the political department of the Jewish Agency executive, had discussed the legislative council constitution with High Commissioner Wauchope during a recent overnight stay at Government House.

May Appoint Members
If Jews refuse to elect members to the council, then the government will appoint these members out of hand, the paper believes.

Eight Moslems, four Jews, two Christians, and six senior British

officials will comprise the membership.

Disavowals of previous objections to Jewish and Arab voters made respectively by Arab Christians and Jews have now made possible the completion of the election lists for the Jerusalem municipality, and there are to be six Jewish, four Moslem and two Christian councillors, it is learned.

Max Seligman, British subject, and foremost Tel Aviv lawyer, has filed an objection with the electoral committee demanding the right of suffrage which is denied to British subjects. Unless he is given the franchise, he says, he will appeal to the High Court to abrogate the entire Municipal Corporations Law as prejudicing the rights of a section of the population and consequently contrary to the stipulations of the Mandate.

Britons May Get Rights
Though a British subject is regarded as a "foreigner" in Palestine, he may secure an endorsement of his passport to the effect that while in Palestine he must be treated as a Palestinian and enjoy all rights given by law to local citizens. He retains his passport upon the termination of which he reverts to full British rights while in England and elsewhere outside Palestine.

Writer Gives Eyewitness Story Of How Herbert Shapiro Died

JERUSALEM, Aug. 9. — This country has given its sacrifices for the great Jewish cause: the shomrim, the colony watchmen, of a generation and two generations ago, died as Trojans when the need arose to defend their people with their lives, and others have fallen in the same cause. To these must now be added the name of Herbert Shapiro, 19-year old Brooklyn, New York, student at the Hebrew University, who has typified the saying, "Greater love hath no man than this, that he gave his life for a friend."

Shapiro was one of many University and high school students in Palestine who volunteered to go to one of the Jewish settlements to fill the dearth caused by labor restriction. He was drafted to Herzlia, American Jewish settlers' paradise, whose deep-green foliage of grove and field offers a glorious background with the winking blue of the Mediterranean.

It was during a lull in the work that Shapiro and three others, sporting on the beach but not going into the water owing to the heavy swell, saw a foolhardy Yemenite boy venturing beyond his depth. In a trice the dark-skinned Jew was in difficulty. The four of them raced into the sea to save the child.

Story of Eye-Witness
I tell the story as it was given by an eye-witness: Herbert and his young friend and tentmate, "Doc," together with Reznick and Lanzet, both of Tel Aviv, rushed into the turbulent surf and struggled against the mighty breakers. They succeeded somehow in pushing the Yemenite boy to safety and then began their own desperate fight against the sea.

"For almost an hour they battled those waves, which were taking them out as they were valiantly swimming in," writes my friend, "until finally one of them, the golden-haired strapping youth 'Doc,' managed to get on his feet, and in a flash he extended his

hand to Herbert, still struggling near him.

"Had Shapiro taken his hand, it would have meant a hard and perhaps vain struggle for both of them; but he heroically refused, and let his comrade be carried in alone, as he was carried out with Reznick and Lanzet. There was no lifeline on shore to throw to them and a motor-boat that started out from Tel Aviv to the rescue had to turn back because of the heavy sea."

Body Found Two Days Later
They watched for Shapiro's body to be thrown up for two days and nights. Finally it came to rest, corroded by the sea water and defaced, near Nathania up the coast.

His 16-year old brother, friends and others, American boys who were at school with him, started to dig his grave in the early hours of the morning. Overhead the full moon was shining down upon them at their labors, some of them weeping as they turned up the loose soil. At three o'clock in the morning they buried him, while his young brother said "Kaddish."

Though not a full student at the Hebrew University, Shapiro had become in a few months a well-known figure on its campus. His friends are considering the possibility of erecting for him a memorial at the place where he was wont to stroll with the Jewish youth drawn from the four corners of the globe. No more fitting tribute to his memory could be paid.

Orphans' Home Will Hold Annual County Fair Sunday

Bulldog Drummond Returns

About a decade ago the first "Bulldog Drummond" novel appeared. It came from the type-writer of an Englishman named H. C. McNeillie; its success was instantaneous and the moving pictures always on the lookout for good film material, allowed it to lay untouched until just a few seasons back when Ronald Colman was employed to bring the dashing Captain Drummond character to the screen. The picture was one of the most profitable ventures undertaken and now Twentieth Century has engaged Mr. Colman and made "Bulldog Drummond Strikes Back," which is playing at the Rivoli, much to the delight of all lovers of the melodrama.

Drummond, as he is portrayed on the screen is the ideal Englishman, gallant, brave, trustworthy and ready for adventure at any time. His penchant is running down unspeakably cruel and ruthless crooks and he manages to get this man or men regardless of the odds stacked against him. In "Bulldog Drummond Strikes Back" the excitement occurs during one hectic night. Briefly it concerns the horrifying experiences of a young girl (Loretta Young) who with her aunt has registered at a small London hotel. She leaves her aunt for a few hours and returns to find that no one will admit that either her aunt or herself ever stayed at the hotel. Of course it is all a plot and has something to do with a dreaded disease and the schemes of the crooks who—but then I really can't tell you—it would spoil all the fun, needless to say the plot moves along with speed and dispatch. There are the usual quota of murders, kidnappings and other felonious acts but in addition, and that is what lifts this picture far above the ordinary, a humorous subplot which shows the agonizing antics of Drummond's pal Algy who, on the night all the excitement is happening, got married, and cannot get back to his wife because Drummond needs him.

The cast from Ronald Colman down act in a breezy and delightful manner. The dialogue is bright and the directing intelligent. All in all "Drummond Strikes Back" is Class double A entertainment. It is one of those pictures that you simply cannot find fault with.

Dames

Warner Brothers latest musical "Dames" with an extensive cast including Ruby Keeler, Joan Blondell, Dick Powell and Zasu Pitts is another Warner Brothers musical and by that I am not disparaging. The musical films of this company rank high and "Dames" is easily up to average. The tunes are unusually catching, you'll be hearing them over the radio, the dancing lively and clever and the cast willing and able. There is a plot but it is unimportant and has little if anything to do with the enjoyment of the film. Sufficient to know it is based on the whims of a multi-millionaire character who hates singing, dancing and other pleasures. The Bulletin's Day Book

The scene is laid in a polling place in Nuremberg, Germany. The time is yesterday, anywhere between 8 a. m. and 6 p. m. by the Central European clock.

As the curtain rises a confused noise, as of sheep marching blissfully to slaughter, pervades the air. It sounds something like this: "Ba-a-a-a-a, ba-a-a-a-a-a."

No, that's wrong. Closer attention reveals that the sound is actually "Ja-a-a-a-a, ja-a-a-a-a." This bleat is issuing from the throats of thousands of Nuremberg citizens, who are practicing what constitutes almost the only remaining word in their vocabulary as they file woodenly into the polling place.

The room in which the balloting is taking place is cluttered with storm troopers, in various stages of drunken hilarity. Suddenly there is a stir in the doorway. In walks a trembling little man, his face ashen with pallor, his upper lip covered with beads of perspiration. Behind him are two storm troopers.

"Remember," one of them says, poking a pistol meaningfully into the little man's ribs, "this is a free plebiscite. Now get in there and vote just as you please, so long as you vote 'yes!'"

"Wait a minute," says the second trooper, fingering the rubber truncheon which hangs at his belt with caressing affection. "This guy looks as though his circulation isn't too good. Maybe we ought to give him a few setting-up exercises before we let him vote. I distinctly heard him say 'Nein' when I was passing by his house."

The little man is seized with a palsy of trembling.

"But gentlemen!" he pleads. "I already explained to you! My little son was studying his lesson in English and he asked me what number comes after 'eight,' so I told him 'nine,' I didn't mean anything by it!"

The storm troopers sneer. "English!" snarls the first. "Yiddish, you mean! Isn't it true that your wife's grand-uncle was once engaged to a Jewess?"

"Yes," says the second, "and how about that silk tie you're wearing? It looks to me as though it was made by the Japanese-Jewish silk trust."

Faced with these damning accusations, the little man tries to

cower into a protecting corner, but a well-placed kick from one of the storm troopers' boots sends him reeling into a voting booth.

"Now get in there and cast your ballot!" the righteously indignant trooper shouts. "And see that you're quick about it, or we'll find a way to speed you up."

* * *

The polls are closed. The votes have been counted. The results are gratifying in the extreme. Julius Streicher, overlord of Franconia, is sitting in the room, contentedly picking his teeth, his chair tipped back against the wall.

"It just goes to show you, boys," he says, "these filthy foreigners have been saying we aren't solid. It takes a free plebiscite like this to show them. Solidarity is the outstanding characteristic of the German people."

"Yes," says one of his lieutenants with an ingratiating smile, "the German people certainly are solid—from their heads down."

Asks Pinchot to Relieve Registrars From Duty On Eve of Yom Kippur

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 19. — William B. Leaf, president of the Philadelphia council of the American Jewish Congress, has addressed a letter to Governor Pinchot calling his attention to the fact that registrars of the Jewish faith will be prevented from observing the tenets of their religion since Kol Nidre—one of the most sacred prayers in the Jewish calendar—is recited on the evening of September 18, the second day of registration.

"I am wondering," Mr. Leaf wrote in his letter to the Governor, "whether something could not be done to relieve these registrars from duty on that evening so as to permit them to observe the tenets of their faith."

It is estimated that about one thousand men and women will be affected by the present ruling.

Savants Take Simon to Task For 'Aryanism'

Designation Applies to Language, Not Race, Trio Write

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

LONDON, Aug. 12.—The Times of London publishes the following letter, signed by three English savants renowned for their researches in the field of ethnology in which Foreign Secretary Sir John Simon is taken to task for his use of the word "Aryan" in his now famous letter regarding his ancestry:

"Sir, the use of the word 'Aryan' in the letter of Sir John Simon which appeared in your issue of Aug. 4 could have gone without comment if the word had not been written by a minister of the Crown.

"Anthropologists have recognized that while it is permissible to speak of Aryan languages, it is incorrect to use this word to designate a Western European race. As a matter of fact, it was only a few days ago that Sir Grafton Elliot Smith, in his welcome address to the International Congress of Ethnological and Anthropological Sciences treated on this question with great eloquence.

"Although the use of the term 'Aryan peoples' must be attributed to Professor Max Muller, one must not forget the fact that before making answer to the severe critics, one must admit that 'an ethnologist who speaks of the Aryan race, Aryan blood, Aryan eyes and hair is as great a sinner as the linguist who speaks of the dolichocephalic dictionary or the brachycephalic grammar.

"We do not question the appropriateness of the fact that the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs corrected an error as to his ancestry. Nevertheless, we regret his erroneous use of a scientific term in a sense which has created such great political damage in Germany.

"It is against the illegitimate use of the word that we protest."

The letter bore the signatures of A. C. Haddon, F. Gowland Hopkins and J. B. S. Haldane.

This letter brought a rejoinder from Sir Arthur Keith, in which he wrote:

"When Max Muller put forward his theory in 1861 he naturally supposed that the Aryan mother tongue was spoken by actual men and women, and these, at first, he spoke of as Aryans. Under Huxley's attack he recanted. As a matter of fact Max Muller was right and should have withstood Huxley. He should have said to him:

"If I do not know who the original Aryan speakers were I do know what they were not. They were not Arabs, nor Jews, nor Egyptians, nor Negroes, nor Chinamen, nor American Indians. 'It is in this explicit sense that Sir John Simon uses the term Aryan, and he is perfectly right in doing so. What other term could he have used to cover the meaning he wished to express?'"

Goldstein Tells Junior Hadassah Speculation Endangers Palestine

"The Jewish position in Palestine is and will continue to be endangered by the lack of adequate nationally-owned resources for Jewish settlement," declared Dr. Israel Goldstein, president of the Jewish National Fund, in an address before 1,000 delegates to the eleventh annual convention of Junior Hadassah at the Hotel New Yorker yesterday.

Deploing the widespread land speculation in Palestine today which, he said, "does not in any way strengthen the Jewish position," Dr. Goldstein urged increased support of the Jewish National Fund.

"There is the danger," Dr. Goldstein warned, "that we may build up in Palestine a new economic Ghetto in which a disproportionately large middle class and overcrowded professions will dominate the scene. If agriculture is the foundation of every nation's economy, it is especially so in the case of Palestine. The Jewish people collectively, no more than the Jew individually, can be permitted in Palestine to become a 'luftmenschen'."

Fund a Safeguard

"The Jewish National Fund is a safeguard against speculation excesses which, if unchecked, will lead to an unsound economy and unsound political status. Once the Jewish National Fund acquires land, it remains forever Jewish land. The JNF is at the very essence of Jewish achievement in Palestine."

Dr. Goldstein pointed out that while industrial development in the Holy Land has gone on apace, there has not been one new agricultural colony established during the past year.

is the more significant because of the fact that, of necessity, the only figures available are those made public by the Nazis themselves.

In one Bavarian district, 1,113 voted "Yes," while 132 voted against. The number of invalidated ballots was not revealed. In a district in Hanover 6,740 Germans voted for the regime, while 1,130 voted "No." In seven hospitals near Halle, the vote was 1,390 for, forty against and ten ballots invalid.

'Yes' Vote Blow at Jews, Nuremberg Nazis' Slogan

BERLIN, Aug. 19.—Voting in the plebiscite passed off quietly in the provinces, according to reports reaching here late today. In Nuremberg, home of Julius Streicher, notorious anti-Semite and editor of Der Stuermer, voters went to the polls with huge slogans staring at them reading, "A yes vote means to combat all Juda."

Nazi Vote Blackjack Levelled Against Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN, Aug. 19.—Although the people of Germany had no alternative but to register an emphatic "yes" to the policies of Chancellor Hitler in today's plebiscite, the Nazis took no chance that the affirmation they desired would be less than they intended it to be. Consequently, they turned toward the half million Jews remaining in Germany with a stern demand that they, too, voice approval of Hitler's assumption of supreme power.

Speaking at Nuremberg Saturday, Julius Streicher, overlord of Franconia and the most notorious anti-Semitic agitator in Germany, demanded that every Jew vote "yes."

Says Jews Planned to Skip
Charging that some Jews had registered for voting but intended to board trains today in order to avoid casting their ballots under the pretext that they were voting in another city, Streicher warned the Jews of Nuremberg that they had to vote in Nuremberg under the watchful eye of the local Nazi machine.

While leaving the city might make it possible for Jews in other communities to avoid voting, this method of escaping a distasteful action would not be tolerated in Nuremberg, Streicher declared.

Propaganda Minister Goebbels, addressing a huge gathering of "yes" voters Friday at the Sports Palast in Berlin, denounced the Jews once again.

"There are only two kinds of persons who change their names," he asserted, "Jews and criminals."

Premier Klagges of Braunschweig, addressing the gathering, declared that the Bible revealed that the "Jews had invented a racialism so cruel that it cannot be compared to ours."

Voters Closely Checked

That the Jews would go to the polls in large numbers appeared definite in view of the minute check of all persons eligible to vote taken by Nazi campaigners and the threats freely voiced against those eligible to cast ballots but failing to do so.

The proclamation of the Union of National German Jews, calling upon all German Jews to voice approval of Hitler in the plebiscite was lightly regarded, since the union, headed by Dr. Max Naumann, veteran anti-Zionist and fanatical German nationalist, has few members and little or no influence. The followers of Naumann, even before Hitler came to power, were in favor of the Nazi program with the exception of clauses barring native German Jews. Permeated with the nationalist spirit, they have continually tried to find some way of aligning themselves with the Nazi party.

Did Goebbels Take Funds to Italian Bank?

Reports Buzz That He Did So on Secret Trip July 25

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
LONDON, Aug. 8.—Whether or not the diminutive Dr. Goebbels went to Italy on June 25 to transfer his personal funds along with the savings of his Fuehrer and other Nazi leaders is a question that is bruited about throughout Europe.

A confidential news agency, confirming many reports that the little man, after having deposited his big bank account, entrained at the Bellinzona station in Italy on June 25, offers evidence to verify the reports.

According to the news agency, Propaganda Minister Goebbels was identified by an Italian secret service agent who had been assigned by "higher ups" to go to the Bellinzona station in the early morning hours to wait for "anything unusual."

Everything was as usual until shortly before three o'clock, when a great gray coat enveloping a small figure, which the secret service man avers was Dr. Goebbels, was escorted from a Lancia car. Coat, Goebbels and all were bundled aboard the northbound train and rested in the Berlin coach. The Lancia drove back to the south.

The secret service man, according to the news agency, was later lodged in the Milan jail because he "talked and knew too much."

Reports say that there is no public record of Goebbels' movements on June 25. The prime propagandist did not appear much in the limelight again until five days later, when Hitler "purged" his Germany.

Zionist leaders forming a body representative of all Jewry to deal with the League of Nations and Great Britain, the mandatory power for Palestine, on questions affecting the latter country.

According to plans agreed on at the conference, members of the non-Zionist section will seek to organize non-Zionist assistance for Palestine work in the various countries along lines best adapted to their respective lands.

Among those taking part in the conference were Dr. Cyrus Adler, of Philadelphia; Dr. Maurice B. Hexter, Samuel C. Lamport, Dr. Maurice Karpf, Edward Warburg, son of Felix, and Zionist leaders including Dr. Chaim Weizmann, head of the commission for refugee settlement in Palestine; M. M. Ussishkin, head of the Jewish National Fund, and Professor Selig Brodetsky and Berl Locker, members of the Jewish Agency executive body.

Dr. Hexter, reporting on the financial situation, emphasized that the Jewish Agency and the Keren Hayesod (the Palestine Foundation Fund), had decreased their indebtedness during the past year by £75,000 (approximately \$375,000). He also declared that the Jewish Agency budget for Palestine would be fully covered.

GRIGGSTOWN, N. J., Aug. 19.—With the shadow of a Board of Health padlock still hovering over Camp Wille und Macht, the local encampment for young Nazi goosesteppers, some 500 parents of the campers today swooped down on the tent colony to take part in a "Parents' Day" celebration.

Seemingly unperturbed by the report that the camp had been condemned by health inspectors as in a "very filthy and unsanitary condition," the parents spent the day in watching the boys execute military maneuvers and in defeating the heat by consuming plentiful quantities of beer. It was noted that the American flag was today considerably more in evidence than it was when the camp opened two weeks ago. Swastikas were less frequently seen than before.

According to the Jewish Daily Bulletin's informant, Camp Wille und Macht was given until August 17 to rectify the conditions complained of by the health authorities.

Smaller headlines over the same article read:

"Germany Stands By Its Leader!"

"The people's election on Sunday will give the world a picture of a United People."

The body of the article incorporated a few verses which has become commonplace in pre-election Germany. They are translated as follows:

"From the masses of the people
"To the position of Reichs leader.
"We all say yes!"

"Born of the people
"Chosen as the leader.
"We all say yes!"

"In the unceasing work of the Leader

"Must be your faith. Your yes.
"Millions cry out: Yes."

Not quite all said yes, as election returns indicated. There were more than five million voted "no." This gave the yes-men of Yorkville something to think about. And think they did, soberly.

The elation with which Hitler's elections are usually greeted was not to be found in the many beer parlors, but there was an apparent rise in the spirits of the Nazi opposition. News vendors in the territory reported heavy sales of the early editions of morning papers.

With the Arab conquest of Morocco, the Jews were reduced to the lowest status, compelled to live in ghettos and wear distinctive clothes, and were exposed to the fury of the Mohammedan populace from time to time.

Tax on Income Declared Out For Palestine

British Experts Decide That Levy Would Not Succeed There

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
JERUSALEM, Aug. 2.—The Palestine government has decided that the Holy Land is not a field for the introduction of an income tax, Mr. Shelley, president of the Jerusalem Chamber of Commerce, declared at a meeting of the organization.

"In fulfillment of the High Commissioner's promise that every opportunity would be given to discuss the question of an income tax thoroughly, an income tax expert of the British Treasury was called to Palestine in order to study local conditions," Mr. Shelley said.

"We congratulate the Palestine government on the way every facility was granted to those desirous of presenting their views and we desire to express our appreciation of the courtesy and patience shown by Mr. Huntington to all who gave him the benefit of their opinion."

"We have been given to understand that it has been decided that Palestine is not a field for such financial taxation as the inherent anti-tax faculties, which normally resist taxation of any sort, would be particularly vicious in their resistance to the introduction of a new problem of how to evade taxation in this special direction. We congratulate the government for the discretion and tact with which this matter has been dealt with," Mr. Shelley said.

Stuermer Asks Reopening of 'Ritual' Inquiry

Suspension Up, Streicher's Sheet Flies to Attack Against Jews

BERLIN, Aug. 19.—Der Stuermer, anti-Semitic weekly published by Julius Streicher, reappeared yesterday following its suspension for eighteen days because of its attack on President Masaryk of Czechoslovakia.

The new issue revealed no moderation of the paper's anti-Semitic Program, for it featured a demand for the state's attorney at Breslau to reopen the inquiry into the murder of two children in Breslau in 1926. The paper asserted that the death of the two children was a ritual murder perpetrated by Jews.

The issue of Der Stuermer, which brought Chancellor Hitler's displeasure down upon it, also contained a vicious attack upon President Roosevelt.

U.S. Committee to Open Nazi Probe in Chicago; Will Inspect N. J. Camps
