World Jewish Congress

On January 17, discussing the appeal for a World Jewish Congress issued by the American Jewish Congress, I wrote as follows:

"It is quite clear that the present unpredecented crisis in Jewish life, brought on by Hit-ler's war on the Jews, calls for wise deliberations and heroic measures. It calls for the coordinated efforts of a united and representative Jewish leadership. The Jewish problem has been made an international problem. The anti-Semites of various lands have united. It is high time for the Jews to deal with this problem and with the tragic plight of Jewry in certain European countries fearlessly and openly. The truth and the right are on the side of the Jews. The enemies of Jewry are conducting their destructive work cunningly and thoroughly. The Jews must face this actuality.

"But if a World Jewish Con gress is to be called, it must be representative. It must include also the representative leaders of those Jewish organizations that believe in more conserva-tive methods of dealing with the problems of Jewish rightless-ness and Jewish distress. These leaders are just as deeply con-cerned with the Jewish tragedy.

"The unparalleled Jewish crisis must be dealt with by a united Jewry. There is no danger that the anti-Semites will renew their accusations that the Jews are united. The real danger lies in the fact that the anti-Semites are united, while the Jews are thus far divided. The civilized world will undoubtedly be sympathetic to the united Jewish efforts to devise ways and means of defending themselves against deeds of violence and organized, destructive and false propaganda, and of readjusting the awful situation of our people in Germany and other lands where they are subjected to unspeakable sufferings as a result of racial or economic discriminations. The world will understand an Assembly of the leadership of the various groups and factions in Jewish life if it will be responsible, dignified and courageous."

The World Jewish Congress is now scheduled to take place in August, 1935. While the con-ference that made the decision was not representative, we are faced with an accomplished fact. The situation of world Jewry is just as grave today as it was at the close of the World War, if not graver. At that time the leaders of the various groups in Jewry surmounted all obstacles and overlooked all differences in order to come before the peace conference as a united people, through the Committee of Jewish Delegations. Labor Need Ruins Trade Of Palestine

Export Business Falls, Factories Pressed to Meet Home Output

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, Aug. 26.—The entire Palestine industrial export trade, built up in recent years by Jewish Rule of Council immigrants, is at a standstill and Palestine Jewish industrialists are gradually losing their hard-won markets in Persia, Syria, Lebanon and the Near East as result of the labor shortage now existing in the Holy Land, it was revealed today in a semi-official report reaching

Due to the disastrous labor shortage, not only are Jewish factories unable to produce sufficient goods for the export market, but they are hardly able to meet the demands of the domestic market in Palestine, the report stated.

The report also disclosed that a minimum of 500 qualified foremen are required for the normal functioning of present Palestinian fac-tories, as well as thousands of un-qualified laborers. However, the Palestine government is deaf to the demands of the industrialists and refuses to grant immigration visas for the essential 500 qualified workers, let alone the unqualified workers necessary.

At the same time it was revealed that the Palestine government re-ceived over \$1,000,000 in 1933 merely for registering Jewish land deals, transacted chiefly among Jews themselves, since government restrictions have made it practi-cally impossible for Arabs to sell land to Jews.

Two-thirds of the workers on land owned by Jews are now Arabs and the few Jews workings on the land will soon be displaced owing to the scarcity of Jewish labor for agriculture, which is growing con-tinuously, the report states.

Jews Repudiate

Wauchope Report Shows Jews Far in Rear in Elections

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, Aug. 26.—How com-pletely the British and Arabs will dominate the proposed Palestine legislative council if it is based on the results of municipal election recently held in Palestine, may be seen in a report on the elections submitted to Colonial Secretary Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister by the Palestine High Commissioner.

Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope's report shows that 20,325 Arabs and 8,585 Jews are entitled to vote in municipal elections in Palestine. These figures exclude Tel Aviv, all-Jewish city of 70,000, where elections will be held in January The report also discloses that al-though the Jewish population of Jerusalem exceeds that of the Arabs, only 4,325 Jews have a right to vote as compared with 4,362 Arabs.

BERLIN, Aug. 26. - The gov ernment today was effecting several measures designed to prevent distribution in Germany proper of meat prepared in Upper Silesia according to the special ritual of the Mosaic law.

"Schechita," ritual preparation of meat, forbidden in Germany, was recently allowed in the Upper Silesia plebiscite area by Interior Minister Frick after several complaints had been forwarded to the League of Nations that Germany was infringing on the national minority rights of the Jews there.

The government, however, is taking measures to see that food prepared for the Silesian Jews should not leave that area for other parts of Germany.

Veterans of Latvian War for Freedom Given \$500 Grants

Miss Thompson, wife of Sinclair Lewis, the novelist, left Berlin last night for Paris after having been notified by the Gestapo, Goering's secret police, that she would be es-corted to the German frontier if she did not leave the country vol-untarily within twenty-four hours.

untarily within twenty-four hours. The American writer was expelled for having written a series of articles for the Jewish Telegraphic Agency last year in which she depicted the anti-Sentit terror then raging, and for having made an uncomplimentary reference to Chancellor Adolf Hitler.

In foreign diplomatic cirles here opinion was unanimous that the expulsion of Miss Thompson was the first shot fired in a new Nazi campaign in which the govern-ment expects to banish from Germany all foreign newspaper correspondents who do not accept the Nazi regime at its own face value and who are not prepared to become mere tools of the Propagands Ministry.

At the same time, it is under stood, the Nazis will exclude from the Third Reich all newspapers and periodicals that do not fulfil the requirements expected of cor-respondents.

A. E. C. Reports Activities for Past 2 Years: Aids Settlers

More than 5,000 people sought information about Palestine at the New York and Tel Aviv Bureaus of the American Economic Com-mittee for Palestine, the Committee reported yesterday after two years of activity.

The committee was organized by a group of leading Zionists in-cluding Judge Julian W. Mack, Israel B. Brodie and Robert Szold.

The committee's investigations over every economic phase of Palestine including agriculture, manufacturing, transport and banking. More than 175 of the inquirers at the committee's bureaus later established themselves in in-dustrial enterprises, the report

Since about seventy per cent of inquirers now are of German origin, the committee has published a namphlet in German giving ecoaomic information necessary to an immigrant desiring to establish himself in Palestine. A total of 1,359 mail inquiries from forty-five countries and covering more than 100 phases of Palestine economic activity were answered, the committee reported.

Since the committee's purpose is to accelerate the absorptive capaof Palestine through the creation of new industrial enterprises, it endeavors to guide the estab-lishment of those industries which can be put on a secure and perma nent basis, the report said. The committee acts as a clear-

ing house for methods of business organization and as a channel for introduction of new capital and

JERUSALEM.—No one writing or thinking in Palestine is regarded as objective or neutral. moment a writer says anything that, true though it might be, is in any way offensive to the susceptibilities of any particular faction, he is labeled as "partisan" in the interests of the other side, and milified

The only way to escape such treatment, I heard a wag say recently, is to act the same way that the Palestine Government does towards the Jews and Arabs, buffet them on alternate days, so that the real measure of neutrality may be gauged.

One cannot write of the inter-necine Jewish party strife today without rashly venturing into a without rashly venturing into a field of intricate polemics. It would be much more controversial to ap-portion the blame for this incessant hostility, which assumes physical violence at times, and which is serving only to injure Jewish prestige in the eyes of the Arabs, the British, and the outside world at large.

Adjusting Our Lives

By DR. HERMAN FRANK

Occupational Opportunities in a Changing World

Significant changes are taking place in the distribution of occu-pational opportunities. The relative oversupply of workers in many occupations has assumed tragic proportions. And yet, despite this



sad fact, it would be a rash statement indeed to assert that we live in a period marked with an excess production of occupational abilities the way the cotton, wheat or machinery market is overglutted. In the remote recesses of our social scene, plenty of budding opportunities for profitable work lurk in the dark

To get a true picture one has, instead of merely deploring the present situation, to look back over long-term trends and forward toward the prospects of the future.

Little surplus of occupational talent need be expected if the changing trends of opportunity are properly understood, if full information

regarding them is disseminated, and the right sort of training and education is provided, so that young people are guided toward the promising fields of work.

Changes in Professional Service of In the past six decades, it is interesting to note, there was a vast increase of teachers; from about 120 000 in 1870 to 1 100 000 in 1930. Further, we find a still more rapid rise in the proportions of technical engineers, nurses, draftsmen, mu-sicians, artists, actors, chemists,

writers and librarians, Noticeable is the falling out of use and date of the veterinarian the relative decline in the traditional learned professions, such as medicine, the ministry and law. Apparently some of the work formerly done by the physihas been handed over trained nurses; by clergymen, to teachers and social workers; and by lawyers, to clerks or to business specialists.

Again, the "blotting paper occupations, sales and commercial service, have absorbed many of the displaced workers, the victima of technological progress. Fewer and fewer, year by year, are engaged in farming, mining and manufacturing, and more and more in sales and service.

Trends in Distributive Trades

Now, experts in vocational re-habilitation feel that, no matter what happens industrially, with the machine keeping on displacing men, distribution of goods will come to play a major part in the sconomic process of tomorrow. It training to develop proficiency in is immaterial whether this distribution will be effected by gov-ling together. ernment bureaus or by semi-public agencies or by industry itself, but distribution will have to be en-gaged in on a much larger scale, and in other ways, than in our own gloomy day.

Of course, white collar workers will have to have a goodly share in it. Hours will undoubtedly be shorter and wage scales rearsnorter and wage scales rearranged, but re-employment of the involuntarily idle commercial workers, now in a bitter plight, must follow.

. Technological developments, no doubt, occurred in these fields as well as in the purely mechanical jobs. Accordingly the unemployed, or the employed, office worker can meet the new industrial needs by mastering the business machines that are displacing the book-Reeper, the billing clerk, the sten-ographer, and many others.

Truth to tell, the future is al-ways a fairyland to the hopeful, while the present is painful, but

vocational rehabilitation is a long-term process and not an immediemergency procedure

Ministering to Personal Needs The worker has less hard labor today, since the machine is there to do all the dull and dirty work. To compensate for this advantage, however, in factory, office and store, he works at an increased tempo, which in itself brings a very definite strain. This trend toward more efficient and exhausting work will continue.

Beards are prohibited. Those who want to keep them must possess a special permit. In one week those persons wearing beards without having obtained permit to do so will be forcibly shaved and fined."

The regulation has created consternation among members of the orthodox Jewish population who, by Mosaic law, are not allowed to cut their beards.

Cyprus Seeks Revisionist Leaders Settlement by Reich Refugees

British Will Extend Aid to Immigrants; Jews Hold 70,000 Dunams

LONDON, Aug. 26.—The British administration of Cyprus, island possession in the Mediterranean Sea, yesterday announced its readiness to extend important facilities for Jewish immigration and settlement on the island.

The administration will require of each prospective immigra possession of £50 (\$250) or guarantee of this sum by one al-ready settled in Cyprus. British citizenship will be given the immi-grants after two years' residence.

Jews, chiefly from Germany, have already acquired 70,000 dunams of land in Cyprus, mainly for fruit groves, and two German Jewish colonies, with two hundred inhabitants, have been established near Larnaca and Famagusta on the east coast of the island. The new settlers are gladly welcomed by the local Greek population.



and that dissatisfaction with the present regime has been completely suppressed are under a false impression.

Dissatisfaction in the country is growing daily among all classes. There is great dissat faction with the recent mass murders of the Storm Troop leaders. There is dissatisfaction with the isolation politics which the present government is carrying on. There is also growing displeasure with the forced anti-Semitism.

The German people—the great German masses—are far from the anti-Semitism their press and propaganda agencies attempt to im-pose upon them. The average German woman even today wants to shop at Jewish stores and to patronize Jewish doctors. The average Ger-

Distrust Grows

But the people of Germany are beginning to have their own attibeginning to have their own atti-tude towards things. The people of Germany no longer wish to be led blindly. They have no desire to be fooled, and even tend to distrust Hitler himself.

Therefore, when the Nazi press uses the scarcity of potatoes as a pretext for placing blame upon the Jews, one hears here and there the voice of the average German citizen, who can no longer be per-suaded that the Jews are to blame. One can even hear the opinion ex-pressed that "if the Jews were permitted to deal in potatoes, there would be enough potatoes in Ger-

would not have ration. Industry would perhaps have revived. Ger-many would certainly have been able to obtain credit abroad. Such "revolutionary" opinions Such "revolutionary" opinions from the average German are of no small importance in Germany. They are the expression not only of confidence in Jews, but—and much more important-of lack of faith in the government as well. They show that the people are weary of hearing tales about the guilt in everything. The "The Jews are to blame for all of Germany's troubles" is beall of Germany's troubles" is be-ginning to lose its popularity with the German people. They don't believe it any more, nor do they believe the government.

I was present at a great Naz mass-meeting at the Berlin Sport Palace, where Goebbels delivered raiace, where Goenbeis delivered a sharp attack upon the "traitors of the people" who grouped them-selves around the assassinated Captain Roehm, and against "en-emies" both within and without.

It would be wrong to assume that just because the German people are losing faith in Hitler and are more sober about the Jews the Jewish population of Germany no

longer has anything to fear.

Just the opposite is the case. Because things are getting worse for the Nazi regime, and because Hitler has no good excuse to offer his people just now, it may be-expected that the anti-Semitic campaign in the press and other public media will in the next few months assume a much sharner character in Germany than they have previously shown, and will be much more bitter than in all the duration of the Hitler rule

No one in Germany today doubts that in the Nazi press the blame that in the Nazi press the blame for the increasingly unfavorable conditions in Germany will be placed upon the Jews. All indi-cations are that the Jews of Germany are facing a hard winter of bitter anti-Jewish propaganda and perhaps of serious physical

True, the German people no longer believe the anti-Semitic newspapers so implicitly, but the an government now alternative except that of pressing anti-Semitism. Having no other butt, it must make the Jew the one who is to blame.

When a government has the direct intention of furthering anti-Semitism, the will of the people plays a very insignificant part. The government will always have enough ways and means at its command for making the life of command for making the life of the Jewish population bitter, if sary to carry out here there a little pogrom, and to stage the whole affair as being due to the "will of the people."

The Jews of Germany are well aware of all this. They are not nursing any false illusions. But the Jews abroad should also know the truth about the situation. The present superficial calm in Germany must not be overestimated. The Jews of England and of America must still be on the watch. more so now than ever.

2 Jews Liberated After -10 Months in Jail for 'Attack on Reich'

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, Aug. 26.—Dr. Ernst Rechnitz, administrative director of the Breslau Jewish community and editor of the community news paper, Breslau Gemeindeblatt, and Albert Rosenthal author of an Albert Rosenthal, author of an article which appeared in that paper on July 10, 1933, were free today after ten months' imprisonment under the general amnesty announced by Chancellor Hitler.

The two men were convicted after several months in a concenrtation camp, because of an article, "Seeking My Brothers," by Rosen-thal, which Dr. Rechnitz had pub-lished in the community paper. The article was an appeal to German Jews to give employment to Jewish workers.

The prosecution claimed that mublication of the article had impugned "Germany's honor" in that it implied that the German governand German justice derelict in their duty because they did not protect German Jews.

Dr. Rechnitz is a war veteran who had twice volunteered dangerous duty and had once been seriously wounded during the World War. In a moving appeal in his own behalf before the Breslau special court which had sentenced him, he declared that his forefa-thers had lived in Upper Silesia for two hundred years and that he did not care for how long he was imprisoned so long as his honor was not violated.

Congress Leaders Criticized August 24, 1934.

o the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin: Allow me, as a German refugee who for a year has been living in the United States, to address this letter to you, since you are the only available forum known to me which has space and interest for all Jewish problems without discrimination as to political opinion. I was deeply shocked when I read in yesterday's evening papers that Dr. Stephen S. Wise has clared a "fight to the finish" on

the American Jewish Committee. Until now I was of the opinion that Dr. Wise had found his life's work within the last year, in fighting and crushing Nazism-a task which is greater than the powers of the strongest fighter. And now suddenly, he turns from this worthy cause to declare war on American Jewish Committee and, through it, on all the American Jews connected with it.

Why Dr. Wise has chosen the American Jewish Committee as the butt of his attack is quite beyond my understanding. In ac-cordance with the information which I gathered while I was still ny about the two previous world conferences, representative Jewish organizations all over the world, including the Zionist Organization, have been against the ideas of Dr. Wise. Dr. Heinrich Stern chairman of the meeting of representatives of the Berlin Jew ish community, a man who is highly respected and acknowledged equally by all Jews, Zionist and non-Zionist, Orthodox and Liberal (can Dr. Wise understand such a state at all?), stated publicly on the occasion of the second World community, a man who is

Conference that Dr. Wise conduct ed himself in Jewish politics like "an elephant in a china shop." Dr. Wise is most energetically repudiated by all but very few and in-significant groups of Europe as the representative of world Jewry. He is generally not considered suitable to conduct such delicate and difficult negotiations because lacks every essential qualification. It is said among the Jews in Ger-many that there is hardly another Jew in all the world who has done as much harm to the Jewish cause as the hot-headed, always on the offensive, publicity - seeking Dr.

At a time when the enemies of Jewry are making a heavy attack upon us, when a malicious, shrewd, and ruthless enemy is directing his forces against us all over world, we do, indeed, need un world, we do, indeed, need unity— but not the kind of unity that means the super-imposition of one man's will upon all others. Behold Dr. Wise! with one posture he ap-peals tearfully for unity; with another, he shakes his fist at the American Jewish Committee and similar organizations abroad that disagree with him—all presumably in the name of "unity."

One more word about his most intimate aides. Dr. Nahum Goldmann, whose development and ac-tivities we German Jews naturally know most thoroughly, should really understand more of the psychology of the German than Dr. Wise, since he gave up his Polish citizenship many years ago and became a naturalized German. Services Held Fears Rothschild Inn Incident May Set Example for Others

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
LONDON, Aug. 10.—"A story that appeared in the papers yes-terday must have stirred many to indignation," Candidus (Herbert Sidebotham) writes in an editorial in today's Daily Sketch. "It appears that a young man who called with some friends recently at a road house for food was ap-proached by the manager and asked whether he was a Jew. The young man said he was. The manager replied that in that case he could not serve him and asked him to leave, which the young man did. It has now come out that the young man in question was Victor Rothschild, heir to the baronetcy.

"Mr. Rothschild made no fuss about his treatment at the roadhouse, and the words between him and the manager were perfectly polite. Nor has he sought pubpolite. Nor has he sought publicity for his grievance, but he has made the comment: 'We live in an age of chains.' But it does sound rather like Nazi Germany, doesn't it?' It is abominably like, and it is the duty of those who value the liberties of our country to jump on this example of anti-Semitism. I believe in combating the begin-nings of this, as of other diseases. Must Serve All

"It is easy to do so in this ca Mr. Sidebotham continues. "It is the legal duty of every innkeeper to supply reasonable refreshments to callers, and that is the condi-tion of his license. He cannot pick and choose whom he will serve and say that he will supply the needs of men with black or brown hair but not of men who have red hair, or whose ties he dislikes, or whose religion or pedigree he does not approve of. It would be different if the application were for some special club privileges.

"The Carlton Club may reasonably blackball Liberals from mem-bership; and I suppose that if anyone were silly enough to form Aryan clubs they could exclude Semites from membership of form a room in a roadhouse, or any-where else in which they were holding a meeting. But there is no suggestion of a club or its no suggestion or a club or its special privileges in this case. Mr. Rothschild and his party were, on the facts set forth, asking for no more than their rights as members

of the British public.

"You could go on to exclude people whose views, complexion, or grandparents you disliked from the use of the parks, from public-conveyances, even from houses whose letting you and your friends might control, forcing every variation from your own orthodoxy to live in separate Ghettos. If the principles of the road house manager were generally extended the unity of the state would be completely broken up, for without tol-erance no real unity is possible. Thus the principle at stake is about as comprehensive as any-political or social principle could well be. Some early opportunity be taken to assert it officially."

While Arthur Garfield Hays and his brethren go around paraphras-ing Voltaire, proclaiming that "we detest your views but we will defend to the death your right to express them," the objects of their tolerance have put into effect a more succinct rule of thumb. It runs something like this:

"Salaam-or scram"

in my shoe-maker!" he roars to his personal maid. "Have him build me twenty pairs of new shoes, with the Frenchiest heels or the market! Nobody can call ME a little man and get away with it! "Let's see. What else can I do
to get even? Well, I'll speak to
Goebbels. He has a better head
for such things."

"A pleasant young man in ci-vilian clothes," says Miss Thomp-son, handed her the official document which informed her she was persona non grata in the Reich.

There is a certain elemtn of mystery in this statement. Where was anyone able to find a full suit of civilian clothes in Nazi Ger-many? Here is something which deserves more thorough investiga-tion. No recent photo emanating from Hitlerland has given any evidence whatsoever that such a thing exists there

Perhaps the "pleasant young man" was being allowed to wear civilian clothes as a reward for his signal service to the state—someing like the situation in the Czarist Russian army, in which wags insisted it was a real distinction to be a private.

Another interesting phase of the incident is the reaction of Miss Thompson's colleagues of the for-eign press. Frederick T. Birchall, in the New York Times, describes if as follows:

Brazilian Theatre Founder Dies at 50

Isaac Daitch Passes Away in Rio de Janeiro; Was Russian-Born

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
RIO DE JANEIRO, Aug. 26.--Isaac Daitch, well-known Jewish actor and founder of the Yiddish theatre in Brazil, died here Friday, was 50 years old.

He was born in Tolchin, the Ukraine, December 18, 1884. His father was a Hebrew teacher and the boy was educated in his echool

Trained for a locksmith, Daitch left home while still a youth and worked at various occupations. Later he became a choir singer and, becoming deeply interested in and, becoming deeply interested in the theatre, played minor roles in Czernowitz, Rumania, and other Jewish centers. Not until he came to Vienna and had achieved considerable success in the gen-eral theatre did he become interested in the Yiddish stage. In 1920 he organized a Yiddish troupe in Vienna, which achieved great,

After a successful tour through Rumania, Daitch went to Paris and later toured Argentina and Brazil with his troupe. Since 1930 be made his home in Rio de

Originally he was named Solo-meinok, but owing to his father's reputation for scholarship, the family was called Daitch.

om Page One) a nationwide hookup to every part of Germany. As is customary, the Propaganda Ministry made arrangements to insure that the speech would reach the widest possible audience. Loud speakers were installed in all cities, towns and villages and the owners of and villages and the owners of radios were told to permit their less fortunate neighbors to listen to the "keynote" speech in the Saar election campaign.

Hundreds of special trains, thou-sands of automobiles and numberless bicycles poured multitudes of Germans into the Rhine valley region around Coblenz, which was once occupied by American troops. At the same time over 100,000 ath-letes in a spectacular demonstration came running in, bringing messages of solidarity with the Saar valley inhabitants from every city in Germany.

Wants Saar Badly

The Saar valley, rich industrial region taken away from Germany by the Treaty of Versailles, will vote on January 13, 1935, whether to return to Germany, be annexed to France or to continue under the rule of the League of Nations commission, now exercising ruling powers in the Saar.

Since the Nazis came into power every effort has been exerted to swing the Saar inhabi-tants into line and the Nazi government announced that it would never relinquish the Saar. Vice-Chancellor Franz von Papen, now German Minister to Austria, has been Nazi Commissioner for the

Jews Will Be "Protected" Up to the time of the June 30 "purge" a German victory in the Saar was held to be inevitable, changed appreciably and the Nazis have redoubled their efforts to make sure of victors. make sure of victory.

The Saar is overwhelmingly Catholic and has a strong Socialist and radical movement. In addition there are close to 10,000 Jews in the Saar Valley. The Hitler government has even made an at-tempt to reach the Jews. Late last year von Papen declared in a speech that Saar Jews would be protected in case Germany won out in the plebiscite.

The edict was issued because of recent incidents in which for-eigners were insulted by Nazi storm troopers who mistook them for Jews, it was said. At the same time Berlin school

authorities were given special in-structions to see to it that Nazi students showed proper respect for foreigners.

Last week, Professor Albert Lapowsky of the University of Chicago was struck in the face by a Berlin Nazi storm trooper who stepped out of the ranks and assaulted him when he failed to raise his arm in the Hitler salute during a parade.

The Nazi government has made very effort to attract foreigners. every error to attract foreigners, tourists and students to Germany, declaring that foreign Jews are welcome in both capacities. It was made clear, however, that this welcome does not apply to German Jews.

The Hitler regime also has been The Hitter regime also has been entangled in a number of diplomatic incidents involving assaults by Nazi zealots on foreigners, particularly those who appeared to be Jews.
