Germany's Moral and Financial Obligations

On the same day three significant events were reported from Berlin.

Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, president of the Reichsbank, now appointed by Hitler as financial and economic dictator, has arrogantly disavowed Germany's pledges on her loans and has hurled a defiant challenge to the United States and other

Nazi Reichsbishop Ludwig Mueller, Hitler's church dictator, has instituted an "inquisition" directed at the opponents of the official German Protestant Church, and many dissenting pastors are arrested by the secret police.

Dorothy Thompson, the special correspondent and magazine writer, who in private life is Mrs. Sinclair Lewis, wife of the famous American novelist, was practically expelled from Germany because of her articles on Hitler and the treatment of the Jews in Germany.

Thus Nazi Germany in one day was seen fighting on three fronts -against the outside world in the field of economics, against religious freedom, and against

the foreign press.

Dr. Schacht, who for years was regarded as Germany's ablest financial expert and guide, who was believed to be broadminded because of his constant relations with the e and bankers of other nations, has undergone a complete change and has become an ardent Hitlerite, singing the praises of his master and submissively obeying his commands.

Only seven years ago Dr. Schacht wrote that his mission was "to help strengthen the growth of mutual confidence between nations and the determination in future to avoid political catastrophes by the establishment of a community of intellectual and economic interests and reciprocal goodwill."

He also wrote at that time: Everywhere the war has brought the recognition of the fact that the nations must understand one another better, and that above all a process of moral education must be inaugurated if wars are to be avoided in the future. . . . No doubt

In Palestine **As Arabs Act**

Defy Wauchope's Order, Renew Search for Illegal' Entrants

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Aug. 27.—Feeling prevailed among the Jewish population in Palestine tonight that a behind-the-scenes Arab plot is brewing.

Open defiance of the recently issued order of High Commissioner Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope. forbidding civilians to constitute themselves self-appointed watchdogs against the influx of illegal Jewish immigrants, took shape on several portions of the Holy Land coastline and borders.

High tension prevailed as roving bands of lawless Arab youths flung themselves with renewed fury into the night hunts being carried on along the shore by official police for Jews attempting to smuggle themselves into the country.

A battery of airplane searchlights beat down with merciless brilliance all along the coast line in Nathania, flooding the beach with daylight illumination while coastal guards and their reckless and unlawful volunteer assistants combed every recess for concealed would-be entrants unequipped with

Police in Haifa and Tul Karem eluded the letter of Wauchope's edict by recruiting gangs of young Arab strong-arms into service and

Protest Firing Of Workers by Vienna Banks

Hundreds Reduced to Misery as Dismissals Continue

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
VIENNA, Aug. 27.—The presidium of the Vienna Jewish community today forwarded a strong protest to the Central Austrian Banking Association against the and growing dismis of Jewish bank employees.

The protest points out that hundreds of Jewish families are being reduced to poverty by the daily dismissals of Jewish bank emplovees, many of whom had been with the banks for long periods.

Several weeks ago eighty Jewish bank employees were dismissed at one time in what had every appearance of being a concerted action. The total has grown since.

Since the organization of Fascist government in Austria Jewish professionals and employees of state and municipal projects, banks and insurance companies have been ousted in ever-growing numbers. The Christian Socialist party, dominant factor in the coalition government, has come out openly for the elimination of Jews from public and professional life, without the brutality of the Nazi regime.

Salonica Exodus

Greek Under-Secretary Says Jews Are Essential in City's Development

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

from Salonica owing to the economic crisis and declaring that the Greek government was well disposed towards the Jews, Under-Secretary of State Rhodopolus in a press conference today termed the Salonica Jews necessary for the development of the city.

"I regret greatly that Jews are emigrating from Salonica owing to the economic crisis, but I hope that their departure will soon be discontinued," he declared.

"The Jews are a necessary and important factor in the development of Salonica and they have an interest in living there. The government is well disposed toward the Jews and is ready to hear their justified wishes. I personally am a sincere friend of the Jews, whom I know closely. I have no feeling save that of sympathy for them," the Greek official concluded.

Nazi Police **Hold Writer** For 4 Hours

Gestapo Grills Levitan, J. T. A. Man; Confiscates Dispatches

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Aug. 27.-Israel Albert Levitan, a correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in Berlin, was taken into custody by the Cestapo, the secret police, and conditionally released after a

four-hour grilling. Levitan, an American citizen who is also representing several American newspapers in Germany, was summoned to Gestapo headquarters at eight o'clock this morning. He was released on condition that he report again to the Gestapo on Wednesday. Meanwhile, members of the secret police escorted him home where they confiscated all his papers, including copies of cables dispatched and private letters.

During his detention, Levitan was closely questioned as to the nature of his work for the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

American diplomatic officials were notified of the incident since Levitan is an American citizen and representing an Americanowned news service. Consul General Raymond Geist, to whom the situation was reported, is taking a watchful attitude awaiting the outcome of Wednesday's developments.

The detention of Levitan follows closely the expulsion on Saturday of Miss Dorothy Thompson (Mrs. Sinclair Lewis), because of articles she wrote in 1932 and in 1933, following her return from Germany as a special investigator for the Jewish Telegraphic Agen-

More Expulsions May Follow

M. M. Marks, Once Borough President, Dies

Was an Active Worker in Civic Life and Philanthropy

Funeral services will be held at 3 o'clock this afternoon at Ethical Culture headquarters, 2 West Sixty-fourth street, for Marcus M. Marks, who was President of the Borough of Manhattan from 1913 to 1917. Dr. John Lovejoy Elliott of the Society will officiate. Burial will take place in Salem Fields, Brooklyn.

Mr. Marks died of euremia Sunday night in Doctors Hospital, East Eighty-seventh street and West End avenue. He had been in the hospital since his return from his camp near Blue Mountain Lake in the Adirondacks. His health had been failing for several months. He was seventy-six years

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Esther Friedman Marks; two sons, Erich H. and Warren L. Marks, and two daughters, Mrs. Bernice M. Stearns and Mrs. Doris M.

Founded Markets

Mr. Marks was active in civic and philanthropic affairs. In 1913 the City Fusion Party nominated him for Aldermanic President. He defeated his Democratic opponent, Dr. Thomas Darlington, by 129,269 votes to 104,140. While in office he founded the first three open markets in the city, was responsible for forming a new joint trial board for the trial of civil service employes and helped organize welfare work among municipal employes. In 1917 he ran for reelection but was defeated. While in office he started advocating the introduction of daylight saving time in New York State.

Mr. Marks also was interested in immigration. He devoted much time to the subject when Chief Justice Charles Evans Hughes, then Governor of New York State appointed him to the New York State Immigration Commission. He also organized the National Association of Clothiers and was its president for ten years. He helped arbitrate 125 strikes.

C. C. N. Y. Graduate


He was born in Schenectady, N. Y., on March 18, 1858, the son of David and Leontine Marks. He received all his education in New York City and was graduated from the College of the City of New York. Afterwards he joined his father's clothing firm. He retired at the age of forty-five.

Mr. Marks was founder and former vice-president of the Educational Alliance. He also helped found the Tuberculosis Preventorium for Children, now in Farmingdale, N. J. He was president of the institution for several years.

Dead at 76



M. M. MARKS

President Bernard S. Deutsch and for many years an associate of the former Manhattan Borough President in philanthropic and civic affairs, yesterday made the following statement:

"The East Side has lost a great man in the death of Mr. Marks. He was one of the first men to retire from business at an early age, to devote the rest of his life to works of education, philanthropy and reform in politics.

"He was one of the organizers of the Educational Alliance and of the Young Men's Hebrew Association. His main work, however, was in arbitrating industrial disputes. In 1913 he was appointed by President Wilson as one of the arbitrators to settle the great railroad strike in this country. Both Presidents Theodore Roosevelt and Taft offered to appoint him postmaster of New York City but he declined.

Helped Put Bill Through

"In 1907 he, together with myself, had a bill enacted into law for the protection of immigrants who sent their money abroad. In 1910 he was chairman of the Janitors Society of the East Side, the object of which was to improve conditions of East Side janitors, who were at that time poorly paid and badly treated, particularly as they were compelled to live in

"In 1913 he was elected the first Jewish Borough President of Manhattan and had a great deal to do with improving conditions on the East Side.

"He appointed a committee known as the East Side Commission, of which Miss Lillian D. Wald was chairman and of which I was secretary, whose object it was to press all needed improvements on the East Side to a conclusion.

"Mr. Marks had a host of friends and no enemies."

Charges Delay In Prosecution Of N. J. Nazis

Veteran of World War Claims They Beat Him and Kin

(Special to the J.D.B.)
PATERSON, N. J., Aug. 27.-Prosecution of fifteen Mountainview Nazis who two weeks ago attacked his brother-in-law, himself, and their wives, is being unduly delayed, William Neuenhaus, World War veteran, charges.

Although Neuenhaus and the three others lodged formal complaints immediately after the purported attack, which they say occurred in Mountainview, the case has not yet been sent to Paterson Criminal District Court, the veteran declares.

At a preliminary hearing before the Mountainview police recorder several of the defendants, under questioning by Robert F. McDermott Jr., counsel for the Neuhaus group, characterized themselves as members of the Nazi Party and admitted on the witness stand that they are not United States citizens.

Neuhaus claims his alleged assailants make their headquarters in a fort-like Mountainview house, whose windows are steel-barricaded and whose doorway is decorated with animal skulls.

"Germany will not pay those coupons to America because we haven't got the money available. And what is more, those special arrangements for payment to England, France and other countries won't do them any good. They just simply won't work... But the United States need have no fear, as far as Germany is concerned, in this matter of debt payments, for the United States will fare no differently at our hands than any other country. . . .

"Germany is the most democratic country in the world today. It is not a mere majority rule here in Germany today, such as obtains in the United States and other so-called democratic countries, but an overwhelming majority."

Then he added:

"Economic freedom is an abuse. . . . Hitler is conservative in all matters pertaining to economic questions. He believes in profits-we all do-as the one and only source of industrial prosperity. . . . We must make money, and the way to get it is by making private enterprise profitable. There is no other sane and sound way. It is the way Germany will pursue; make no mistake about it."

This is the new Schacht, the Nazified Schacht. His "moral education," his "ethical sense of duty" and the period of "reason, order and love" as the measure of his activities,-all these belong to the past.

Now Naziland is busy exterminating the ideas and ideals of intellectuals and liberals and pacifists, in stamping out freedom of conscience, freedom of the press and religious freedom. And Dr. Schacht is helping to undermine Germany's moral and financial credit in other lands.

Jewish Life Reviewed in Latest Cables and Letters

Social Character of Palestine Changes as Newcomers Settle

Arrival of Thousands Influences Appearance of Yishuv, Writer Finds—Children of the Land Embody the New Liberty

JERUSALEM, Aug. 12.though writers in Palestine, sending their contributions to the world Jewish and non-Jewish press, have abundantly pictured the outward effect of progress and mass settlement here—a process involving some fifty to sixty thousand newcomers a year, little has been written upon the social and psychological character of the Jewish populace. And many abroad must be wondering at the effect these newcomers have had upon the native-born Ashkenazi and Sephardi Jews and the long-standing residents into whose public life, and sometimes also home life, the newcomers have infiltrated.

Undoubtedly a metamorphosis is taking place. The turbulent arrival of thousands of people from Poland, Germany, Russia, Austria, England and Americahas placed its mark on the outward and inward appearances of the Yishuv.

To describe this metamorphosis in the social and home life of Zion's veteran residents is, in limited space, a difficult task; it is, in fact, a difficult situation to describe, and the Jews altogether, speaking as one of them, are a difficult people to write about.

Tel Aviv's Four Hundred

To start at the beginning, however, it is necessary to draw a dividing line between the social structures of the Yishuv in Jerusalem and Tel Aviv. Jerusalem is far more cosmopolitan in its appeal; personal tastes bind different sections of the populace, whether they be English, Jewish, Moslem or Christian, and there is frequently that overlap among social circles. Tel Aviv, on the other hand, is more of a closed area, confined to Jewish appeal, and a system of class distinctions has grown up there. There is even talk of a class of "patricians," the first-comers or settlers in the city, who view the recent invasions with disfavor and stick closely to their own kin, not allowing upstarts to climb the "social ladder." Aviv's "Four Hundred," in fact, are a much more exclusive and limited social register than was ever New York's.

You will find that in Jerusalem the Jewish residents as a rule are more polished and worldly in their attitude than in Tel Aviv, which for all its size and spread is still small-townish in demeanor and outward appearance. There is, it is true, the sturdy Jewish indewhich does not give a darn for who and what you are. I heard it rendered by one observer as a Jew saying to a non-Jew in that city, "Who are you? What are you? Why are you here? I'm me, damn you!"

Spirit of Ancient Israel

There is that same independent, or impudent, manner among the children. Free, untrammeled, not knowing the restrictions of Diaspora life or the fear of Christian reprisals, without that faint stigma of being a Jew that is inherent in every Jew, no matter what his lofty position, in other countries, the children of this land are growing up to be the embodiment of the new Jewish liberty. And, as it is said, here, don't they take liberties too!

There is no consciousness that. as in other countries, the Jews must be timid, afraid, self-effac- municipality and the government. fluence."

ing. There is the real spirit here of ancient Israel-indomitable will. proud temper, and stiff-necked attitude. They are unyielding. It is a colorful life, to be sure, and a symbol for the Diaspora. It is bred just as much out of resistance to an enervating climate, for which a special will-power is needed lest one falls into the sloth that has ruled Arabia for centuries, as from inner characteristics.

Passions Burst and Subside

It is into this atmosphere that the newcomers are arriving to set-They must face the same scorn as "greenhorns" in the lands of migration earlier this century. But they bring with them ideas, new outlooks, diligence, a bubbling energy. It is inevitable that they should leave their mark upon the social lives they enter. Some of them have already married locally, taking the proverbial beauties of Palestine as wives. That brings them closer into the new inter-Jewish assimiliation. Others strike up friendships based on mutual

They find their niche, and the homes are thrown open to them. They must not expect to find a polished civilization, a land of leisurely, unhurried reflection. It is either hot or cold here, but rarely lukewarm; passions burst and passions subside; you meet a man today and get on the best terms with him, quarrel with him in the evening and say goodbye for ever, and the next afternoon you are having tea with him quietly again at your favorite cafe, just like that. One thing after

Newcomers' Influence Marked


Talking of cafes, that is one of the places where social contacts are readily formed. In Tel Aviv, for example, life is just one cafe after another, and you can verify this from any of your friends living there. You eat, drink, and some sleep there. You can dance or play checkers, or just sip your aperitif and watch the passing show. It is almost but not nearly the same in Jerusalem. Certainly many of the new Germans frequent the old and new cafes, and that is where they meet.

The influence that these people are having on local life is tremendous. Much of it is cultural. They are bringing a new zest and a new energy into social affairs. Many of them are musical, and that is cultivating an entirely fresh love of the great art. Their manners, too, find a reflection, their mode of address. It may be that all these new elements will be welded into the general tradition of Jewish social life that is being formed in the towns-and I exclude from this article the effect on Jewish pre-war and post-war rural areas, where standards are differentand, as many think, create a more likable Jewish bourgeoisie in urban centers than some think have existed abroad.

Nazis 'Aryanize' 10 Commandments

Version Includes 'Maintenance of Racial Purity;' Old Pagan Gods Advocated

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, Aug. 27.—A new "Aryan" version of the Ten Commandments was issued today by Professor Hausner, leader of the Nazi Christians who reject the Old Testament because of its Jewish origin. The new fifth commandment orders the "maintenance of racial purity."

The movement headed by Professor Hausner is called the New German Faith Movement and advocates the scrapping of everything in Christianity that had its origin in Judaism.

The group also proposes the restoration of the old tribal Teutonic gods as objects of worship and the cleansing of the German religion of all "traces of Jewish in-

Jewish Team Tours Europe By Motorcycle

Palestinian Athletes Arrive in London for Labor Fete

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) LONDON, Aug. 14.—The Hapoel cycling team from Palestine, consisting of six cyclists, Alperovitch. Uzanovitch, Chusicza, Chanachovitz, Shlashz and Shreibman, has arrived in London to attend the Dorsetshire Laborers' Centenary at Dorchester, from August 30 till

The team took part in the recent labor Olympiad at Prague, where the Hapoel was also represented by its football and motorcycle teams. The cyclists have covered about 4,000 miles on their machines, journeying through Rumania, Czecho-Slovakia, Switzerland, Luxembourg and Belgium. They were received in many places en route, and carry with them a volume with messages inscribed by Zionist and labor leaders of the various towns they passed. These include messages from Emil Vandervelde, Senator de Brouckere and Walter Citrine, President of the International Federation of Trade

They will return to Palestine by way of France and Italy, taking ship at Brindisi for Beirut, from where they will cycle back to Palestine. They estimated that they will then have covered altogether about 7,000 miles on their cycles.

The Hapoel has a membership of about 6,000, a tenth of the total membership of the Histadruth, with special sections devoted to particular games and branches of athletics. The Hapoel football team holds the cup of the Palestine Football League, without a single game lost.





Goering Power Bodes Ill For Jews

Silent' Lord of Nazis Impervious other, in Berlin or somewhere in the provinces. Who will be blamed? The Jews, of course. To Public Opinion, Smolar Says

Hitler, a European, Amenable to Suasion; But Prussian Goering, Seeing 'Germany From Within,' Is Adamant on Jewish Policy

The following is the third of a series of four articles that paint an illuminating picture of what Germany and German Jews may expect in the immediate future. The series is based on close observations made by Mr. Smolar, chief European correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency over a period of several months. The closing article will be published tomorrow.

BERLIN.—It really makes very little difference to the Jews of Germany whether Hitler's influence upon the government is still as strong as heretofore, or whether the actual dictator in the government cabinet today is not Hitler, but Goering.

As far as the Jews are concerned, both are certainly bad. With respect to the Jewish question, differences between Hitler and Goering are

Nevertheless, the fact that Goering-and not Hitler—has now become the silent lord of the Nazi cabinet should not be taken lightly, because outside influences which can be exerted upon Hitler cannot be brought to bear upon Goering.

Hitler-with all his various demagogic faults is nevertheless a European, a person who has

some regard for the rest of the world, and to whom the opinion of the outside world means a great deal. He is a person who pays some attention to the press of the world.



Not so, however, Goering. Goering is Prussian. He is brutal and military. Foreign public opinion means nothing whatever to him. The attitude of the outside world does not effect him in the slightest. His chief interest is Germany from within. His line of action is: If Germany will but be strong and disciplined within, the world outside will of necessity be forced to change its attitude towards the present German government.

Goering's approach to the Jewish question is also in line with this policy. Goering has never been affected by the anti-German campaign carried on abroad, nor by the boycott against German goods. Certainly not by the opinions expressed by the press of the world concerning anti-Jewish activities in Germany. If he could have had his way, there would not be a single Jew in Germany today. He would have engineered an exodus of all Jews within twenty-four hours. He has declared that all Jews should be escorted to the border and expelled. He would certainly have carried out such a plan, whether or not it would have aroused the conscience of the world. To Goering, Germany is the world, Germany alone.

So far, however, Goering has not had a great deal of power. On the contrary: his power diminished from one month to the next. He was Minister of the Interior for Prussia. But his opponents in Nazi ranks saw to it that he a misted He was Chief of Do. lice, but he was supplanted by someone else. His closest friend, Herr Diels, was head of the secret police—(the German GPU)—but the post was taken from him.

'Purge' Was Goering's

Goering saw that he was becoming isolated. So what recently happened in German came to pass. He saw that an attempt was being made to push him into an obscure corner, leaving him with but the insignificant post of Minister of Aviation. So it was suddenly discovered that Roehm was a traitor. and that 74 important Nazi leaders-according to Hitler's figures -deserved death; that there was even reason not to place too much trust in Von Papen. Thus it came to pass that within twentyfour hours, hundreds of Nazi leaders were brutally shot, and that life of some government official er posite to what was expected."

Naturally, no one knows how long Goering can retain his power in the present cabinet. There are too many intrigues for power going on in Germany right now, too many personal disagreements. The scale of Goering's power has not yet been fully balanced. It wavers back and forth, and it is impossible to tell as yet to which side it will finally lean.

One thing, however, is certain. So long as Goering retains the power which is his at present, the Jews must not delude themselves by thinking that the condition of the Jews in Germany will be improved in the least. All that can happen under Goering is that the situation of the Jews will become There can be no improve-

Deaf to Foreign Opinion

Goering, as has been said, has little interest in foreign public opinion. In fact, he is deaf to it. It doesn't concern him in the least. Under Goering, the chances of exerting external pressure to alleviate the conditions of the Jews are slighter than ever before. The prospect that the German government will of its own accord show any tendency towards letting the Jews alone is now, under Goering, certainly very improbable.

The time is now coming when the play around the Jewish question can become much more dangerous for the Jews of Germany than it has been. A period of great internal dissatisfaction is approaching for Germany. It is quite possible that an attempt will be made to blame the Jew for this disquietude.

The several million disbanded Storm Troopers will go about disgruntled and unemployed. Upon whom will the blame for this be placed? Upon the Jew naturally. The German factories will have to close down because of an insufficiency of raw materials. Whose fault will that be? The Jew's, of course. Dissatisfied relatives of the assassinated Nazi leaders will seek revenge by an attempt on the

'Police Not for Jews'

The German Jews still recall with trembling the long speech which Goering delivered when he first came into power, and in which he declared openly and clearly that "the German police were not organized to protect the Jews." The German Jews remember that phrase very well.

Since the time that Goering uttered those words, much may have changed in Germany, but Goering's attitude towards the Jews has not Goering's opinion that the German police were not pledged to protect the Jewish inhabitants remains the same.

So long as Goering's opinion was not the determining one in the present German cabinet, so long as the tendency was to isolate Goering, what he thought of the German Jews did not constitue a direct danger for them. And that danger was considerably lessened, when Goering was suddenly removed from the office of chief of the whole police system.

Now, however, the wheel has turned. Now Goering has not only become authoritative, but the most authoritative person in the present cabinet. Now the Jews of Germany have much more reason to fear their fate than they have had before.

No one in Germany today can foresee how long Goering will retain his present power. Indeed, no one can foresee at all what is going to happen in Germany during the next few months. But one must not be optimistic and think that the condition of the German Jew is now about to be rormalized. In Germany proper there is no such optimism. Nor should it exist abroad, certainly not among Jewish leaders abroad.

With regard to German anti-Semitism, Sir John had this to say: "If the international congress of anthropòlogical and ethnological sciences was being held in Berlin instead of London—a farstretched assumption—many of the delegates would be incarcerated. Home of 'Aryans' in Sweden?

"But the scientists in London have done what they dared not on their lives do in Berlin; they have traced the 'Aryans' and the Semites back to a common origin; indeed the 'Aryan' Germans and the Jews had the same forebears. That is a terrible revelation; but not one word about it has appeared in the German press.

"Germans have their own anthropologists. Two of them had a theory that somewhere in Nordic Sweden they would find the one true home of the 'Aryan' race, the fair-haired type which above all others is honored by Germans. So they went to Dalecarlia and made thorough investigation. But the eyes of the people were brown and they had black hair. So their journey proved nothing except the op-

To Check Illegal Entry of Arabs

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) JERUSALEM, Aug. 12.—About six hundred athletic Jewish youths

have enrolled in a volunteer corps to prevent Arabs from Houran, Syria, from coming across the borders into Palestine to work. This is a counter-move against the Arab groups formed recently to trap Jewish illegal immigrants.

The intention is to have some eight hundred young Jews encamped in four sections of two hundred each along certain keypoint places on the north eastern frontiers. The task of these young men will be to watch for "illegal" Arab immigrants in their sectors, and to hand over suspects to the

Most of the young men are trained to the highest point of physical resistance, and say they are not afraid of consequences of their mission, although they realize it will result in personal encounters with the would-be Arab immigrants.

Most of the volunteers belong to the Maccabee, Socialist or Revisionist youth-training organiza-

Meanwhile, the labor dearth continues in Jerusalem, and two large

new government buildings, the general post office and the government printing works, are being erected without Jewish labor. Many of the laborers are, however, the cheaply-paid Hauranese Arabs. So great has their migration into Palestine become that Damascus Arab newspapermen write that whole villages in the Hauran province of Syria are being emptied of their male adults and only the women and children remain.

In Palestine, the man-hunt for illegal immigrants continues unabated, and many are sentenced to imprisonment and recommended for deportation. But the majority of these are Jews, and the authorities seem to be taking few measures against the thousands of Hauranese, Transjordanians, and Egyptians who are working here.

While bail, even in large amounts, is being refused the unfortunate Jewish newcomers, the Hauranese tribesmen when caught are allowed to go out on minor amounts, ten and fifteen pounds. and many of them skip bail and forfeit the bonds, which they consider a premium for the high wages they earn here.

New Translation Of Bible in German

Book Union Issues the First Volume—Marks Third Work in 1934

BERLIN, Aug. 15.—The first German transla tion of the Bible will be the third publication this year of the Jewish Book Union (Juedische Buch-Vereinigung) organized by the Reichsvertretung der Deutschen Juden, it was learned.

Special Correspondence) BERLIN, Aug. 18.—There are in Germany many Jewish youth organizations which may carry on their work today without hindrance, exactly in the same way as in the past, Karl Nabersberg, leader of Section 4 of the Reich Youth Leadership, which comprises the youth organizations, declared in an interview with the Deutsche Zeitung. Relief Group Head Reveal Aid Schemes for Jews After Soviet Tour

LONDON, Aug. 17.—A general scheme of relief for declassed Russian Jews was revealed by M. A., Kaizer, general secretary of the Jewish Relief Organizations, re⊲ turning from a tour of Russia.

On Olympic

To Direct Jewish Play; Golub and Maccabi Aide Also Here

Fresh from a triumphant tour of the capitals of Europe, Max Reinhardt, whom many students of the theatre have termed the outstanding director of his time, arrives in New York tonight aboard the steamship Olympic.

Professor Reinhardt, whose theatrical interests in Germany were liquidated by the Nazi regime last March because he is Jewish, despite the fact that world acclaim had greeted his twenty-five years at the head of the Deutsches Theatre as the most impressive contribution to the modern art of drama in the Reich, comes here to direct a "Jewish Morality Play" next February.

He will begin immediate preliminary arrangements for production of the pageant, which will be presented in a tabernacle seating 5,000 persons. The play's script has been written by Franz Werfel, another German exile. Kurt Weill, who composed the German version of "The Beggars' Opera," is writing the music.

Eventual construction of a permanent "Theatre in Exile" here, with Reinhardt at its helm, is said to be the ultimate aim of those who are fostering the morality

Another arrival in New York tonight is Dr. J. J. Golub, director of the Hospital for Joint Diseases, who is returning here aboard the Paris from Palestine, where he, together with a committee resident in the Holy Land, selected Mount Scopus as the site for the proposed Hadassah University Center and Graduate School of Medicine. While in Palestine Dr. Golub made a survey of medical work and health conditions there.

Also expected to arrive here today is Alec Matalon, honorary member of the Palestine Maccabi, who is coming to this country at his own expense to study the statue of Jews in the United States. While here he also will promote interest in the forthcoming Palestine Second Maccabiad, in which Jewish athletes from every part of the world will participate.

Protest 'Desecration' Of Sea of Galilee by **Electric Corporation**

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) TIBERIAS, Aug. 14.-Monks of the Italian and German monasteries at Tabgha near here, have received for signature a petition to the High Commissioner protesting against "desecration of the Sea of Galilee which is holy to Christendom" by the Palestine Electric Corporation (Rutenberg) expansion works.

The petitioners request the High Commissioner "in the name of millions of Christians throughout the world to whom the Sea of Galilee is sacred, "to ensure that the water level of the great lake shall not be decreased, alleging that 128 centimetres have already disappeared.

The petitioners further state that the hydro-electric works are adversely affecting the fishing industry. They demand the construction of a dam to restore the water already vanished.

Lipsky Sees Huge Migration of Jews

Holds Position in Europe Is Untenable With Exodus in Next Ten Years

Granting even a slight let-up in the political and economic conditions in Europe, the status of the Jews there is so untenable that during the next decade there will be a forced Jewish emigration of the magnitude of the Russian exodus of 1880, according to Louis Lipsky, national chairman of the American Palestine Campaign, and American member of the World Zionist Executive and of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, who returned yesterday on the Leviathan.

In his statement Mr. Lipsky said: "A survey of Jewish conditions abroad forces the conclusion that, granting even a slight let-up in the political and economic persecution of Jews in one or more countries, we shall undoubtedly have to face during the next decade a forced Jewish immigration of the magnitude of the Russian Jewish exodus beginning in 1880, but other than Palestine there is no country prepared or willing to open the door to any substantial Jewish settlement. In fact, all other doors are practically closed. The preparation of a national home for Jews is therefore an imperative immediate necessity."

Only eighteen of the forty-eight members were present at yesterday's meeting. A stormy debate took place behind closed doors. Jamal Husseini and Emil Ghory, editor of The Arab Federation, both supporters of the Jerusalem mufti, spoke long and bitterly on Arab political tactics.

A resolution was adopted stating that the existing Arab parties have no specified policy, and consequently the congress must be postponed for six months in order to prepare the ground for a new party with a more positive line of action.

This postponement is regarded as a Moslem Opposition victory. The Opposition members, of the Nashashibi faction, favor a legislative council or similar institution and do not want a Moslem congress to be held until that is put into effect, thus stifling objections by the Mufti's party, which is illorganized at present.

Findings Shed More Light on Hasmoneans

Ancient Writings Found Near Colony on Road to Dead Sea

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Aug. 27.-Jewish writings dating back to the period of the Hasmonean dynasty in Palestine have been discovered near Kfar Shiloah on the way to the Dead Sea, it was announced today. Dr. E. L. Sukenik, chief archaeologist of the Hebrew University, is in charge of the excava-

The Hasmonean dynasty came into power about 165-B. C. after Jehudah Maccabeus, great Jewish military leader, called by his soldiers "The Hammer," led a successful revolt against Antiochus Epiphanes, Syrian Greek ruler who had attempted to foist idolatry upon the Jews. The revolt lasted three years. In honor of the victory and to commemorate the cleansing of the Temple, Chanukah, or the Feast of Lights, was instituted.

The Hasmonean kings, at first powerful rulers for a time held undisputed sway over the Jews. Later the family degenerated and while members were engaged in internal squabbles the Romans assumed power. In 37 B. C. the last survivor of the Hasmoneans was executed by Herod, who then assumed the kingly power.

Decision not to attempt to call a strike before Rosh Hashonah, Belsky explained, was reached partly because of criticism to which the organization was subjected when it indicated that it might take that course of action and partly because of the fact that the above-mentioned contracts will not expire until after the holidays are over.

Shop owners who are negotiating with the union as to the terms of agreement renewals are in the main members of two employers' associations: The Federation of Kosher Shop Owners of Greater New York and the New Deal Kosher Butcher Shop Owners of Greater New York. Some 125 potential young Nazis were in the Teutonic bosoms of their families yesterday while a lone cow abstractedly munched the grass of erstwhile Camp Wille und Macht, Griggstown, N. J.

Clad in brown shirts and black trousers, campers gathered on a street corner in Yorkville yesterday afternoon deploring the fate which had wrenched them from their Hitlerite camping grounds.

A handful of New York youths piled into two fruit trucks and entered the city via the Holland tunnel. They made a brave sight as they cruised up Grand street emitting a short, defiant hoot as they passed under the windows of the Jewish Daily Bulletin offices.

The young Nazis were dressed in brown shirts and black trousers. On their sleeves were embroidered streaks of lightning. Black imitation leather scabbards containing camping knives hung from their belts.

In one of the trucks the Hitlerite juniors were inconvenienced by the presence of a pile of lumber. Yorkville was the last stop. The twenty-five youths clambered down, raised their arms in a parting "Heil Hitler," and wended their respective ways to their respective homes.

A new camp will be opened on a 200-acre tract in upstate New York, Hugo Haus, the leader, said. He denied that alleged Communist threats to bomb the camp were the cause of the disbanding.

In July reports were received from Germany that Dusterberg had been arrested by Hitler's picked guards and thrown into a concentration camp near Dachau.
