Costly Propaganda

Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, President of the Deutsche Reichsbank and economic dictator, is reported to have ordered the elimination of the Nazi propaganda abroad. According to Berlin representatives of the London press, Dr. Schacht in-formed Dr. Goebbels, Minis-ter of Propaganda and Public Enlightenment, that no more funds would be available for propaganda purposes in other lands. The amount spent by the Nazi propaganda depart-ment is believed to be in the neighborhood of 200,000,000 marks a year.

Dr. Schacht, as financial and economic dictator, realizes better than anyone else among the Nazi leaders the waste in money and loss in prestige resulting from the arrogant and stupid agitation conducted by Nazi agents in foreign lands. While Dr. Schacht himself has recently said and done things that have caused other nations to distrust Germany's integrity under the present re-gime more than ever before, he understands that the Goeb bels form of propaganda of hate makes it all the more difficult for him to negotiate his trade and loan agreements with other nations.

According to the National Zeitung of Basle, Switzerland, Dr. Schacht made a private statement to a diplomatic representative of one of the great powers that the economic catastrophe would start in Germany during the month of October. Dr. Schacht is said to have made that statement about two months ago. The Swiss newspaper remarks that since then nothing has changed in Germany either with regard to in-ternal or foreign affairs. Her unparalleled isolation in foreign affairs remain unchanged.

Nazi Germany is continuing to defy international goodwill and ordinary decency. While Dr. Schacht is trying to curb the Goebbel's propaganda abroad, Hitler is honoring Julius Strei-cher at the Nuremberg party demonstrations. Julius Streiber demonstrations. Julius Streicher is the notorious publisher of the Stuermer, the most vicious and filthy anti-Semitic organ in the world. The Stuermer is occasionally suppressed for a few days for publishing incendiary articles, inciting to pogroms, dis-seminating the ritual murder myth, but the publisher rides with Adolf Hitler through the streets of Nuremberg at the head of the Nazi procession. Hit-ler's demonstration of friendship for the arch enemy of the Jews is an indication that he has no intentions of modifying

his Jew-baiting policy.

Refuse to Give Pledge on Post-Plebiscite Minority Rights

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, Sept. 5.—The Nazi government today officially replied to the French memorandum mitted yesterday to the Council of the League of Nations asking for protection of minorities in the

The Nazi regime rejected all suggestions that the Saar region be treated as an international terretreated as an international ter-ritory after the plebiscite, if the territory votes to return to Ger-many, and also declined to discuss any reference to the present status of the Saar population.

"The people of the Saar know very well that their interests will be served best by their own na-tion," the German reply stated.

The French note to the League asked for complete protection for minority groups in the Saar after the plebiscite of January 16, no matter how the population voted. The French authorities declared that they were willing to grant full protection under the minority clauses of the Covenant of the League, if the territory voted to adhere to France.

Againet to France.

Nazi Germany is now in the midst of a heetic campaign designed to win the Saar voters to the Third Reich. In the recent mass demonstration at Coblenz, Reichsfuehrer Hitter declared that the Saar was German territory and that Nazi Germany would never surrender the area.

Saar voters will be offered three choices; adherence to Germany, inclusion in the French republic, or a continuation of the present rule under the League Saar Commis-

The League commission recently declared that the Saar police were being terrorized by the German secret police and asked for per-mission to recruit a force of 2,000 police outside the region.

Anti-Semites Attack Pedestrians in Lodz

LODZ, Sept. 5.—Jewish pedestrians in the Zgierz district of Lodz were attacked last night by anti-Semitic hooligans, who also smashed windows in Jewish shops and homes. Israel Malwerman and Isaac Temerson were injured by the attackers and taken to a hospital. Several of assailants, in-cluding the Endek leader of the group, were arrested.

Jewish Gem Merchant Murdered in Antwerp

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) ANTWERP, Sept. 5.—Max Hirschberg, Jewish diamond mer-chant of this city, was beaten to death in a street here by two men

who escaped.

Police believe the murderers to be Flemish diamond cutters who killed Hirschberg because he was having his stones polished in Ger-many instead of in Belgium.

Greek Official Pledges Help to Thrace Exiles

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) SALONICA, Sept. 5.—Govern-mental relief for 100 Turkish Jewisn Thrace, who were ousted when Turkish authorities forbade Jews to live within certain frontier areas, was promised here today by Greek Minister of the Interior Kvrkos.

A Jewish delegation visited the minister and asked for government help in caring for the refugees, who arrived in Salonica penniless. The Jewish community, he was in-formed, cannot provide food and shelter for the refugees.

Complete Plans To Bring 250 Children Here

German Jewish Aid Unit to Help Young Reich Emigrants

Arrangements have been completed for emigration to America of 250 German Jewish children, it was announced yesterday by Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, chairman of the German Jewish Children's Aid Incorporated. The first group of twenty will sail from Germany

Present plans provide that these children who range from six to fitteen years of age, will be placed in private homes in various parts of the country, under the superof the country, under the super-vision of professional social work-ers. They will be educated here and trained in vocations that will aid them in earning their livelihoods when they grow to man-hood and womanhood. The children, it was stressed, are not being brought here for legal adoption, as many of them have both of

their parents.

Hitler's 'Mein Kampf' Is Tells Nuremberg Parley Prohibited in Drive on Anti-Semitism

BUCHAREST, Sept. 5.—Importation and translation of antiSemitic literature from Nazi Germany, including Reichstuehrer
Adolf Hitler's biography, "Mein Kampf," was prohibited today by the Rumanian government. Rumanian authorities, realizing

the spread of Hitlerism among the large number of Germans living in Rumania, recently dissolved the Rumanian Nazi organizations and declared them illegal.

In certain sections of Rumania, Germans had instituted a com-plete boycott of Jews and were threatening Jewish residents with death if they did not leave. The Iron Guard, Rumanian

The Iron Guard, Rumanian anti-Semitic organization, has been accused of receiving funds from the German Nazis. Zeleya Codreanu, leader of the Iron Guard, declared that his organization was modelled entirely on Nazi principles Nazi principles.

Professor Alexander Cuza, no-torious Rumanian anti-Semite and leader of the anti-Jewish bloc in the Rumanian parliament, is at present visiting Berlin as a guest of Adolf Hitler.

Jewish stores in Nuremberg were closed and the Jews of the city kept off the streets at night, and even during the day, while the Brown Shirt armies were in Nuremberg. The city is complete-ly given over to the Nazis and to anti-Semitism.

Conversion Drive Is Launched By Catholic Group in Austria

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) VIENNA, Sept. 5.—The impov-erishment of Austrian Jewry is being used by Catholic missionaries for an intensive campaign to convert Jews to Catholicism, it was disclosed today.

A special association for the conversion of Jews has been formed in Vienna with the direct approval of Ralph Cardinal Innitzer. The group, known as "Pauluswerk," has its own paper which is filled with propaganda urging the mass conversion of Jews as the only way out of their misery. The entire movement is camou-flaged under a guise of relieving the terrible distress among the Jews of Austria. Relief, however, when actually given, is accompan-

ied by printed propaganda and personal contacts urging immedi-ate conversion to Catholicism.

At the same time the whole sale elimination of Jews from pub-lic and professional life in Vienna continues with an ever increasing tempo. The newest victim in the campaign, the Vienna Zionist pa-per, Stimme, revealed today is Dr. Rudolf Britcha, general secretary of the Vienna Merchants Association. Dr. Britcha was compelled to resign while he was on his annual holiday. He was replaced at once by an "Aryan." Hundreds of Jewish bank em-

Schacht 'Gangster Financier,' Declares London Newspaper

LONDON, Aug. 28.—Dr. Hjal-mar Schacht, virtual economic dictator of Germany, is accused of "gangster finance" in a long editorial in the Financial News

"It must be admitted," the edi-torial states, "that Dr. Schacht is torial states, "that Dr. Schacht is a ready Nazi apprentice. A penultimate recruit to the Hitler gang, he is proving himself more Nazi than the Nazis. The speech he delivered ast Sunday at the opening of the Leipzig Fair is a perfect example of Nazi morality ap-plied to finance. rears with her payments for for-

"The foreign exporter is not free of all blame if Germany is in arrears with her payments for foreign goods, said Dr. Schacht. 'Germany's foreign currency po-sition has never been a secret.'...

"This sort of logic has hitherto been the copyright of long-firm" operators-it has now become the commercial and financial code of the Nazis. It is the mug's lookout if he is bilked, said Al Capone. 'And so says all of us,' comes the ringing Nazi chorus.

"Dr. Schacht repeated for the hundredth time another favorite argument of his, namely that while wicked foreign creditors in-sisted upon being paid, they refused to accept goods in payment. The facts are that the German trade balance, which showed huge deficits between 1324 and 1930, produced huge surpluses between

1931 and the advent of the National Socialist Government. It is clear that those wicked foreign creditors were quite willing to take German goods in payment of interest throughout 1931 and 1932 and during the early part of 1933. There are several reasons for the decline in German exports under the Nazi regime. The first, though perhaps not the most important, is the reprisals of the Jews. When Hitler put on the mantle of Torquemada he appar-ently forgot that his exemplar only wished to torture Jews, and

Payments to U.I.A Relief Drive Åre in Arrears, Says Warburg To Hold Parley

Intensified Efforts to Collect on Pledges Is Urged InNewRochelle by Campaign Head to Assure Assistance for Victims of Nazi Persecution and Others

An urgent appeal for cash payments on account of pledges made Moines, Milwaukee, New Orleans to the United Jewish Appeal was issued yesterday by Felix M. Warburg, who announced that the pledges made to that fund-raising effort for the benefit of the Jews of Germany total \$1,675,000. The United Jewish Appeal, of which Mr. Warburg is chairman, is seeking to obtain \$3,000,000 from the Jews of America for the economic relief of the Jews of Germany and other lands and the settlement of

tribution Committee and the American Palestinc Campaign. Associated with Mr. Warburg as Associated with Mr. Warburg as co-chairmen of the drive are Paul Baerwald, Louis Lipsky, Morris Rothenberg and Rabbi Jonah B.

Achievement Called Spl-

The total of \$1,675,000 in pledges, Mr. Warburg stated, represents the response to the United Jewish Appeal by approximately 450 communities throughout the country, since the launching of the campaign last March.

"Taking into consideration the "Raking into consideration the unsettled economic conditions prevalent here, that is a splendid achievement, and indicates how strongly the Jews of America sympathize with their affilictor German bettern with their affilictor of the constraint of the control of and Canada will launch drives in behalf of the United Jewish Ap-peal, and I am convinced that the goal of \$3,000,000 will be achieved, or at least, be in sight, before many months have elapsed."

Cash Payments Fall Short

"Tinfortunately, however, cash payments thus far received from the various communities that participated in the United Jewish Appeal have not kept pace with the urgent need for ready cash to enable the participating organizations to meet their com-mitments, whether in Germany or in the refugee countries or in Pal-estine. Our records show that the cash received at our headquar-ters, 100 East Forty-second street, from these communities amounts to about one-half of the sum rep-

resented by the pledges.
"On the other hand, the Joint Distribution Committee which is cooperating with the leaders of German Jewry and local relief committees in the refugee coun-tries is about \$500,000 behind in its commitments; and the Ameri-can Palestine Campaign is behind commitments for the work of settling refugees from Germany and Jews from other countries in the Holy Land to an approximately equal amount.

Victims Depend on Aid
'It is clear that unless these
two bodies are speedily supplied
with funds to carry out their work on all the 'fronts' involved, great hardships will be visited upon the hundreds of thousands whose only hope for a better life depends on the aid they receive from their American brethren.

"I am therefore urging the local campaign committees throughout the country to intensify their collection efforts for the sake of those whom we are endeavoring to aid."

Mr. Warburg said, in conclu-sion, that about 100 local drives for the benefit of the United Jew ish Appeal will be held within the next two months.
