The Peacemaker

It is understood that Rabbi Kook will soon also arrange a conference between the Laborites and the Revisionists for the purpose ofbringing about an end to the tense political conflicts between these organizations.

It is fortunate that the Jews of Palestine have in Rabbi Kook a man of great moral strength, endowed with the wisdom of the Hebrew sages of old, with a fine sense of responsibility and dignity. Genresponsibility and dignity. Cenuine in his piety, he is broad-minded and big-hearted. He understands that the rebuild-ing of Zion cannot be brought about by faith alone. Humble and simple, as the truly great have ever been humble and simple, he inspires respect and confidence even among those who differ from his religious views. They know his sincerity and his devotion to Tewish ideals.

Rabbi Kook understands that the greatest threat to Jewish Palestine is internal conflict and

he is therefore working whole-heartedly for peace and harmony in Palestinian Jewry. Chief Rabbi Kook is one of the foremost spiritual pioneers among the rebuilders of Zion.

Coupons and Principles

Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, president of the German Reichsbank and Hitler's Minister of Economics, in the leading article in the current issue of Foreign Affairs, makes several strange and strong statements about present Germany.

Thus he writes:

"For four and a half years Germany waged war against al-most the entire world, and in the end lost."

This is an unexpected admission on the part of Hitler's apologist. The Germans, especially the Nazis, have always maintained that the whole world had waged war against Ger-many, and that Germany was only defending herself.
Dr. Schacht says further:

"How can anybody be sur-prised that Germany has lost all confidence in the justice of a world opinion dominated by the victorious powers? How can anybody still be surprised that Ger-many should concentrate all her energies on regaining that posi-tion which, as one of the oldest and greatest of civilized nations, she has occupied through more than a thousand years of his-(Continued on Page Eight)

Vienna Apes Germany in **School Edict**

Forces Even Children of Converts to Attend Special Schools

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
VIENNA, Sept. 24.—The Austrian government moved a step further today in its declared purpose of segregating Jewish pupils in special schools, when the children of Jews who were con-verted to Christianity were ordered to register in the special ghetto schols for Jews. Thus the Austrian government emulates the Nazi regime which classes as Jews all those who have any Jewish blood in them within the last three generations.

A number of central Jewish or-ganizations in various countries, alarmed at the reports of the new ghetto schools, telegraphed the gnetto schools, telegraphed the Austrian government to ask whether such a law had been is-sued and for details of the law, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency

The full text of the law, which was passed at a secret session of the Austrian cabinet on July 4, was made public today. All the Austrian newspapers carried the decree in full.

Protests of Jewish organiza-tions which although not officially informed of the law, discussed current rumors on the subject with Chancellor Kurt Schuschnigg, proved unavailing. Jewish leaders left the Chancellor with the impression that the whole matter would be dropped.

The coalition government now ruling Austria has been consist-ently anti-Jewish. The Christian ently anti-Jewish. The Christian Socialist party, leading member in the coalition has insisted all along on numerus clausus against the Jews in the schools and professions, separate schools for Jews and the elimination of the Jews from public and professional

More than 1 000 members of the union approved the contract read to them in detail by Louis Waldman, their attorney, and voted

empower the executive board to call a strike if necessary.

The contract to be offered the employers provides among other things: complete unionization of the industry, reduction of working hours to a maximum of fortynours to a maximum or forty-eight, a minimum pay of \$8 a day, no discharge without due cause, and an equal division of work among unemployed Jewish butch-ers to be controlled entirely by the union.

Noted Philanthropist, 63, Died Sunday of Pneumonia

Rabbi Samuel H. Golden-son will officiate. Interment will take place in Salem Fields Ceme-tery, Brooklyn.

Death came suddenly to Mr. Vogelstein, who appeared to be in good health last Wednesday, when he attended Yom Kippur services at Temple Emanu-El. On the following day he contracted a severe cold and went to the hospital cold and went to the hospital where he developed pneumonia on

Headed Metal Firm

Mr. Vogelstein, who was chair-man of the board of the American man or the board or the American Metal Company, Ltd., resided at 270 Park avenue. He was unmar-ried. His survivors are two brothers, the Rev. Dr. Hermann Vogelstein of Breslau, Germany, and Dr. Theodore Vogelstein of London, England; a sister-in-law, Mrs. Julia Braun-Vogelstein of Berlin; and three nephews and a

Born on February 3, 1871, in Pilsen, now part of Czechoslovakia but then in Austria-Hungary, he but then in Austria-Hungary, he was educated in primary schools there and later at a gymnasium in Stettin, Prussia. His parents were the Rev. Dr. Heinemann Vogelstein and Rosa Kobrak Vogelstein. He received his early training in the metal trade with the firm of Aron Hirsch & Sons of Halberstadt, for whom he worked prior to coming to this country in 1896.

Frowned on Zionism Long an outstanding figure in Jewish activities in this country, he seldom gave voice to public utterances. Zionism never was utterances. Zionism never was able to enlist his sympathy, since he insisted that the Jew should be a loyal citizen of the country in which he resides.

Hitlerism evoked a protest from him, but his expressed disapproval of the excesses of the Nazi re-gime never was vigorous or cal-culated to give offense to anyone. He refused repeated invitations of other Jewish leaders, who entreat-ed him to join them in outspoken denunciation of the policies of the Third Reich.

Emanu-El Trust

At the time of his death he was a trustee and chairman of the finance committee of Temple Emanu-El, positions he assumed when that congregation was consolidated with Temple Beth-El, of which he had for many years been president and trustee

He was associated prominently with many other American-Jewish projects. For the last nine years he was chairman of the

Built Huge Refinery Vogelstein had a part in construction of the largest copper refining plant in Canada in 1929 the \$5,000,000 refinery at Copper Cliff, Ont., built by the American Metal Company, Ltd., and the In-

ternational Nickel Company. Among his other industrial affili ations were chairmanship of the board and a directorate in the United States Metal Refining Company; a directorate in the Ameri-can Zinc and Chemical Company; vice-presidency and a directorate in the Climax Molybdenum Company; vice-presidency of Copper Exporters, Inc., and a directorate in the Copper Institute of New York City. He also was a trustee of the Central Savings Bank here and a member of the American Arbitration Association.

Among his clubs were Har-monie, City Midday, Bankers, American, Royal Automobile of American, koyai Automobile of London, National Republican, Cen-tury Country, New York Bridge Whist and the Metropolitan Opera.

Advocated Liberalism Addressing the council of the Union of American Hebrew Con-gregations in San Francisco in

1929, he said: "Bear in mind that we liberals

Since the Arabs reject the very basis on which the Palestine constitution and Palestine rest, they would obviously utilize the legislative body as an instrument to prevent the carrying out of the main object of the Palestine constitution—the set-bulkyment of constitution-the establishment of the Jewish National Home. Unless the intention is to enable the 'Arabs to violate provisions of the Palestine Mandate, which is inconceivable, the result can only be a permanent deadlock, a continuous struggle with obstruction. Surely, no section of the population can possibly benefit from such an experiment in 'self-governexperiment in 'self-govern-accompanied, as it ineviment, accompanied, as it inevi-tably would be, by endless wrang-ling and sectional maneuvering. It is clear to us that under present conditions a legislative council ent conditions a legislative council
in Palestine has no reasonable
hope of success. The Jewish
people and the issue concerns the
whole of Jewry and not only the Jews in Palestine can hardly be expected to assist in the erection of an altar for the sacrifice of their national rights in the Na-tional Home. It may be set up without their cooperation, but it is difficult to see how this can be done without infringing the pro-visions of the Mandate."

To this is to be added a last comment furnished by The Times, comment furnished by The Times, directly from Jerusalem, which maintains that the Jews are opposing a legislative council because it would mean abolition of the Jewish Agency. Its place would be taken by the few members of this Palestine Parliament, who would then act as the legal representatives of Palestine Jewry with the Palestine government.

This is a murderous attack upon
the meaning and task of the Mandate which would signify a complete stoppage of further Jewish development in Palestine. It would in fact also mean the submission of Palestine to Arab domination with the single restriction England would supervise the Ara-England would supervise the Ara-bian government and administra-tion of Palestine. And this edict declares: A parliament will be established, whether the Zionists agree to it or not.

United Fight Required

One can believe with certainty that the Zionist Organization and the Jewish Agency will use all their powers to save what can be saved. But as the attack can have a devastating effect upon all the hopes and possibilities of the Jewish people, it would amount to national self-destruction if the Zionist organization alone were to be left to fight a quiet, secret and even desperate battle behind the closed doors of diplomatic cabinets. Upon the result of this fight de-

national aspirations of the Jewish people. The whole Jewish people must participate in this battle. All Jewish strength must be mobil-ized with friendly elements in England and other civilized countries to ward off the danger. Such a desperate battle of a desperate people must be understood in Eng-land and must help this country to repulse the strong pressure ex-ercised by its mixed colonial body of officials and their high-placed protectors in some parts of the British Empire.

LONDON, Sept. 17.—Returning from a prolonged continental tour in the interest of Zionist affairs, Professor Selig Brodetsky, a mem-ber of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, reported on progress he had made in Latvia, where permission was won from the government to on Zionist work in behalf of Palestine. Professor Brodetsky reached the Latvian government through the agency of the Latvian Minister to London, who happened to be visiting Riga at the time.

While in Riga the Professor conferred with local Zionist leaders and addressed a large circle of Zionist representatives. He told this assemblage, which was gathered by personal invitation (political public meetings are not allowed the country), of the general Zionist position.

Professor Brodetsky also visited Paris, Zurich, Vienna, Warsaw, Berlin and Cracow. In Paris he attended a meeting of the Board of Governors of Hebrew University, conferred with heads of Jewish institutions, and participated in sessions of the Jewish Agency

In Vienna he met leading Zion ists, with whom he discussed the Zionist and general Jewish situation in Austria. In Warsaw he addressed a press conference on the Zionist political situation, besides participating in the eleventh annual conference of the Polish Zionists and addressing a Bialik memorial meeting under the aus-pices of Tarbuth. In Cracow the professor addressed a large public meeting and participated in the conference of General Zionists, at which he formulated certain prin-ciples as the basis for their unifi-

While in Berlin Professor Brodetsky conferred with leading Zionists and addressed a public meeting on Zionism. He also visit-ed the Hachsharah farm and witnessed a display of the Maccabi

|Dr. Brodetsky|'Aryan Paragraph' Has Placed Cost of Policing Fascist Rally Makes Report 90,000 on Relief Rolls in Reich

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
BERLIN, Sept. 7.—A report issued by the Central Committee for Jewish Aid and Reconstruction on Jewish And and Reconstruction on the eve of the New Year, made public today, says that about 15,000° families of Jewish profes-sionals have been affected by the "Aryan paragraph" since the Na-zis came into power.

Not less than 90,000 Jews in Germany have applied through va-rious Jewish institutions supported by the Central Committee for relief and advice during the preceding twelve months, the report

It establishes that 2,000 Jew who were in State and Government employment have been forced out their positions and have lost their livelihood.

4,000 Lawyers Out

Similarly, 4,000 Jewish lawyers and judges are no longer in a po-sition to practise. Four thousand Jewish doctors have been dismissed from the sick funds, in-cluding 1,000 who lost their positions in hospitals and kindred in-stitutions. Two thousand of these doctors are in great distress, as their savings cannot last much

Of 800 "non-Arvan" university professors who lost their positions, eighty-five per cent are Jews. Three hundred and fifty university professors were deprived of their pensions on October, 1933. About 1,200 Jewish newspaper men have been dismissed on account of the new press law. Two thousand Jewish actors, stage directors, musi-cal conductors have found themselves suddenly without work on account of the "Aryan paragraph." 35,000 Jobless in Berlin

For all those affected by the "Aryan paragraph" the various economic branches of the Central Committee provided relief, and wherever possible also employ-ment. In Berlin alone work was found for 200 unemployed Jewish artists. The task of finding workfor unemployed Jews has been carried out by the Joint Central Office the Jewish Labor Exchange which has twenty regional labor exchanges, approved by the Government.

Unemployed, totaling 35,511 Jews. have asked for assistance in Berlin Jewish Labor Bureau alone during the last three months of 1933. Experts have worked out

Under Mr. Kellman's direction approximately \$900,000 was raised for all Palestine causes, exclusive of private investments in

Committee how to adjust the Jews new professions. At present for new professions. At present 6,059 Jews are being readjusted to new work; fifty per cent are trained as artisans, twenty-seven per cent are trained as farmers, and sixteen per cent as gardeners Loans for Artisans

During the year in question the educational department of the Reichsvertretung der deutschen Juden has set up a number of new schools and expanded the activities of the existing Jewish educational institutions. About one-third of all German Jewish chil-dren—18,500 out of a total of 60,000—are at present attending Jewish schools. There are today in Germany ten Jewish secondary schools, five of which prepare their pupils for entering later. universities

Special efforts have been made to uphold the economic security and independence of the Jewish artisans. Jewish loan banks have been created with the assistance of the American Joint Reconstruction Fund and the American Joint Distribution Committee. The capital of these loan banks reaches now 1,125,000 marks.

Seek Advice on Emigration

The report establishes that no less than 60,000 Jews have applied to the Hilfsverein der deutschen Juden for advice on emigration un to the end of 1933. In Berlin alone to the end or 1933. In Bernin atome about 30,000 people asked for ad-vice how to leave Germany. The Hillsverein has repatriated 18,694 Jews from Germany to their native countries and has also given financial assistance to 5,490 ish families who emigrated to European countries.

If this proposed organization is forthright and courageous, and not merely another mask for the old customary servile timidity, it will have a magnet-like attraction for the Jewish young men

and women in this country who have made up their minds that they are not going to stand for the European brand of anti-Semitism here.

Far from the purpose of a mere fraternal organization, it should aim to reconstruct Jewish life in conformity with the best Jewish tra-dition. Its stand on all things that affect our honor as men must be rigid and uncomoromising.

It should be deeply rooted in fanatic sup-t of its individual members, for whom it should represent the sanctuary of strength. It should leave non-resistance and other bovine ideas to the Hindus. It should be at pains to inculcate the brave, free spirit of the old

Jewish prophets and warriors. It should treat all passive, cringing Jews, the Naumanns who lick the boots of their Hitlerite oppressors, as outcasts. It should recognize that no one who claims to treat us as human beings with pride, rights, culture and sensibilities is doing us any special favor.

Learn to Hate the Noxious

As for all others, they should be hated with a violent endless dislike. We should cultivate hate of the noxious as a direct asset. as we cultivate love for those who are our friends.

It is poor intelligence to forgive a scoundrel like the French anti-Semite Coty for the unforgivable harm he has done. To take him effusively into our arms after he changes his tactics is an insult to character and marks us as a slavish people. Identically in the case of Henry Ford, who lent his millions and his name to this form of cowardly attack, only a servile, futile people can forgive and pa-tronize him later when he has detronize him later when he has de-cided for his own purposes to change his mind.

When these anti-Semites realize while these anti-semites realize that it is not quite such a simple, profitable business and that once dedicated to it they will have earned at least our personal hatred, they will contemplate their irresponsible acts with more thoughtfulness. thoughtfulness.

When it comes to an act which means suffering to us and degradation to our children, if we men we can neither forgive nor forget.

Disown Whiners

We will have to immediately deal with those scurvy individuals who will rub their soft fingers to-gether and whine: "But what will

while but what will the Goyim say about it?"

We will give these snivelingsouled apologists something to souled apologists something to think about on their own account. They are Jewry's soft bottom, our worst menace, since they contribute to the decay of our courage. We should disown and despise them as vermin, and teach our people to hate them above all others: they would let the growmind and spirit of sensitive little children be tortured with the foul smell of anti-Semitism. They would let Jews be dishonored, ostracized and torn for the sole reason of being Jews, while they find corners to hide their shivering bodies.

We should propagandize own people from day to night to build a strong, resistant society, which will uncompromisingly

ize their own colleges? Have they not their own youth movements? Do not both labor and capital organize to cement their defenses when under danger? Above all, are not Nazis and anti-Semites organizing as rapidly as they can get adherents to their twisted

Suggests Youth Groups

One part of our activity should be the formation of youth groups with athletic societies, comparable to the German "turn vereins" and the Bohemian "sokols." In these athletic exercises all should be encouraged to join to further cement the common ground between us. There is no reason why we cannot hold boxing tournaments, ten-nis and golf tournaments, etc., as well as general mass calisthenics.

Since, whether we will admit it or not, we are largely shut off from the community life of non-Jews, we should be at pains to organize a proper and spiritually sustained community life in our own circles. Lectures, debating societies and cultural activities of all kinds should form part of one unified plan. The contributions of Judea to the history, arts and sciences of the world should be taught the young to furbish their pride. It should be dinned into them continuously that they come from a great race, that they have nothing to be ashamed of, that their manhood is unimpeachable. They should be taught to meet slander of all kinds with vigorous and

Stress Simple Virtues

heroic gesture.

All the simple virtues of loyalty, courage, resistance and hardihood should be burned into their consciousness.

We should make the blue and white Mogen Dovid our symbol and wear it proudly as the Jewish boxers do on their fighting trunks.

We should encourage the study of Hebrew as a cultural language, since from Hebrews we have sprung, and in its richness find inspiration and power.

We should encourage the formation of strong, compact communi-ties as rich sources of Jewish cultural life. We should encourage the virtues of simple labor and teach the desirability of fresh, clean air and the smell of newturned earth.

Open Warfare Hitler Leaders

London Herald Reports Goering, Himmler in Feud

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
LONDON, Sept. 14.—The London Daily Herald today published a report from its Berlin correspondent stating that a long smoldering rivalry between General Goering, Premier of Prussia, and Herr Heinrich Himmler, Hitler's leader of the "Black Guards" and controller of the Reich Secret Police, is on the verge of flaming into open war.

"Himmler," the correspondent writes, "has for months past been one of the powers behind the scenes with the result that General Goering has become bitterly jealous.'

"Now the row between the two is at its peak following an allega-tion by General Goering that for weeks past the Secret Police— "Gestapo"—have shadowed him wherever he went.

Himmler's answer to the charge was that he was responsible for the General's safety, but this did not satisfy the vain-glorious Prussian.

Report on Girl Friends

"It is understood that the Secret Police, who have watched Goering, have been reporting fully to their own chief full details of the General's financial affairs and also all available information regarding his women friends.

When the General was injured in a car smash recently there was a woman with him, although her name was kept a close secret from Germany.

"The girl was Fraulein von Shirach, the German opera star and sister of Baldur von Shirach, leader of the Hitler Youth Movement.

"The General has been out with her many times since each outing has been the subject of a "Gestapo" report.

"The Secret Police have also

recorded all meeting between Goering and Emmy Sonnemann, one of the leading actresses at the Berlin State Theatre.

Germans Sour on Hitler Rule. Says Cahan, Back From Trip

Hitlerism has lost much sup-their masters choose to give them port in Germany itself, but there "So the primary task of these is not the slightest hope of any immediate change in that unhappy country, declared Abraham Cahan the veteran Jewish writer and editor of the Forward, who returned from an eleven-week trip which took him to Italy, Switzerland, France and England.

The noted editor, whose entire trip was devoted to a survey of the underground Socialist move-ment in Germany, stated that he had established the widest contacts with the underground move-ment and that the information given him on German conditions was the best available.

"My impression is," Mr. Cahan aid. "that the fascination which Hitlerism exercised over the German people is gone, but the strength of the regime is not entirely gone.

"There are many elements out-side the German working class now opposed to Hitlerism, but now opposed to Hitlerism, but they want to hang on to the present regime. They are afraid of the future—of chaos, of revolution. of Communism — so they support the regime.

No Longer Convincing

"But the striking thing to me is that Hitlerism, as a regime, no longer seems tangible or convincing to the German people," Mr.

About the position of the German Jews, the Socialist editor expressed deep pessimism

"Morally," he declared, "the po-sition of the Jews is worse than ever. They are suppressed, hu-miliated and reduced to an abject position, even where the lives and property are safe, which is not always the case.

"The noisy anti-Semitic pogrom days are over, but a quiet, cold, relentless pogrom continues. There is no letup. But even here the Na-zis overreached themselves." Mr. Cahan said.

Gave Tip on Boycott "The Germans did not know that

there was a world-wide boycott against them, but Goebbels and his satellites yelled so much about the boycott that the German people began asking themselves who responsible for such a boycott.

"From reliable information in
my possession, I know that the

Germans blaming each other for the part they played in the anti-Semitic movement

"The mass of the German people are not anti-Semites and they respect the Jews for their honesty and courage. I know for a fact and courage. I know for a fact that many of the Nazi officials do business with Jews in foreign countries, because the Jews are the only ones they would trust.

Fear Nazi Displeasure "The people are favorable to-ward the Jews, but the fear of the

Nazi regime keeps them from showing any sympathy for the Jews. Thus the widely heralded 'ritual murder' issue of Streicher's paper was widely discounted by the Germans, many of whom in-formed their Jewish friends that they understood that the charges were mere nonsense.

Mr. Cahan praised the young German Socialist workers who were risking their lives to carry on the work of enlightenment in Germany.

"They are not visionaries," he said, "but practical people, and their work is concrete. The mass German people are absolutely without information save what

Book to the Soil

RABBI ISRAEL GOLDSTEIN Congregation Bnai Jeshurun:— Succoth, the Harvest Festival in the Jewish calendar, leads the thought of the Jew back to the agricultural civilization which formed the setting for the Old Testament period of Israel's his-

The Jewish people today would be in a happier situation if greater numbers were living on the soil. The concentration of Jewish populations in the cities, and the overcrowding of businesses and professions, is responsible not only for a large part of economic mis-for a large part of economic mis-ery among Jewry, but also for a large part of anti-Semitism among

The movement back to the soil has taken on increasing proportions in nearly all the countries as a partial solution of general economic maladies. For the Jew

it is doubly urgent.

Thanks to the Jewish agricultural readjustment of the Jew to agriculture. In Russia too, large numbers of Jews have with the cooperation of the government, transplanted themselves from congested cities to the soil. Even in America, there is a Jewish farm population of 100,000. In Pales-tine, however, there has developed not only a physical adjustment to agriculture, but a renascent culture and a great spiritual creativeness has sprung up on these new physical foundations.

Secretary RABBI IS Hull Rebuffed

RABBI ISRAEL HERBERT LEVINTHAL, Brooklyn Jewish Center:—According to the ancient rabbis, the Esrog or citron fruit, which forms the symbolic ceremonial of this Succoth festival, re-sembles the human heart. On Succoth when the Tew took stock of his ingathering of the products the field, he was enjoined to take the Harog or citron fruit, to bring home to him the truth that there is something more vital in life than material wealth,—that the human heart must predominate as our most priceless possession if we are worthy to be termed children

Today, however, a new gospel rules the affairs of the world. The human heart has no place in men's thoughts or acts when dollars and cents are concerned. Here we see a racial and religious group of 500,000 men and women literally crushed to death in Nazi Germany. The only weapon that an outraged humanity has that might fo these modern devotees of a bestial paganism to relent, is the boycott

And yet, the Secretary of State of our own great government has the effrontery to denounce this weapon, because, forsooth as he claims, it costs us five times as much as it costs the government against whom the boycott is aimed!

The correctness of this a tion has been sufficiently challenged by expert economists. But I am not interested in that phase alone. Assuming, for arguments sake, that he is correct in his figures, shall we let the human heart be stifled and think only of dollars and cents?

When a war is waged, because we believe that we are fighting for a principle, does the Secretary of State think of the cost of human lives that the war entails?

And are dollars and cents more vital than human lives? It is this dollar diplomacy instead of heart diplomacy that is at the root of all the political and social evils that have come upon the world.

create friendly communities where their children their children can receive Jewish education and marry within the

Jewish group.

It is difficult for Jews to live constantly in the minority, and while there is no place in the world where the Jew is in the majority, nevertheless, it is more agreeable to live among members of one's own family group than to be constantly surrounded by suspicion and misunderstanding.

Jews are said to be without interest in agriculture, but we know that in Palestine and other lands thousands of Jews have proved themselves to be farmers, themselves to de farmers, grow-ers, and peasants of the highest quality. It is said that the peas-antry of the Holy Land is the most educated and art-loving in growthe world.

Musicians who return from Palestine describe the enthusiasm of the farmer-audiences which come to hear their concerts. But agriculture must be practiced under congenial conditions, and the Halutzim, or Pioneers, in Palestine are conscious of their service to the cause of the upbuilding of the historic homeland of Israel.

In Poland, Roumania, and parts of this country, nothing would be more beneficial than the distribu-tion of thousands of Jewish families among the provinces, to labor close to the soil. But the drift to the cities is due in large measure to the finer cultural opportunities offered there, to which Jews are vigorously responsive. The Jewish problem may be alleviated by the settlement of many Jews on the land but it would be a mistake to imagine that this would eliminate the question of prejudice, of reli-gious and racial misunderstandgious ing.

In Germany Jews are attacked for their activity in the profes-sions, but when scattered in the farming districts, they have made to suffer grievously at the hands of propaganda-driven na-tives. Moreover the agriculturists of Germany hedge Jewish farmers about with every conceivable restriction and discrimination

While the Jewish community can become less urbanized in number it wishes to remain urbanized and urbane in thought and policy. Too often the members of outlying dis-tricts of the country have little conception of the severities and stresses of life in the industrial centers. Jews are organizers of social justice programs, because they are in sympathy with the struggles of the masses in the cities

They realize, too, that the chief centers of influence are in the met-ropolitan areas, and they wish to share in the building of the common life for good and benediction at the most strategic points. It is an error, therefore, to attempt to dragoon whole communities inadoption of a single program; Jews should be allowed in peace to work out their individual and collective programs, whether it be in the city or the country.

The necessities of the econon and social order can be trusted to mould their policies aright.

To allay any misapprehension, I wish to emphasize that there is nothing of the kind anywhere in the book, and that the reviewer has he sole copyright to the above 'wisecrack.'

Dr. Schacht is apparently seeking to justify and bolster up Hitler's mad boast of a thousand years of Hitlerism by pointing to the position that Germany "occupied through more than a thousand years of history," as a thousand years of history," as one of the oldest and greatest of civilized nations. And he enumerates the blessings be-stowed upon the whole world by the present German government—that it is desirous only of peace, that it has restored national unity and has thrown it-self in the struggle against bolshevism and unemployment.
That Germany under Hitler is

working only for peace has been demonstrated by her rapid re-armament and by her attempts to impose her own brand of dic-tatorship upon another country, which almost precipitated a nev European war.

That Germany under Hitler That Germany under Hitler has restored national unity is demonstrated by the fact that all Germany has been trans-formed into a huge concentration camp where thinking people have no right to express their thoughts, where the press and the church and the schools are Nazified - muzzled and terrorrazined—interior and terror-ized. The unemployment prob-lem in Germany has been solved to some extent by the engage-ment of many of the unemployed in munitions shops.

As for Naziland's struggle against bolshevism, it can hardly be described, as Dr. Schacht de-scribes it, as an "absolutely astounding success." As a matter of fact, the reverse is true. Bolshevism has gained immensely by the compar Nazi dictatorship. arison with the

Dr. Schacht then proceeds to lecture America as follows: "It seems to me unworthy of the American people to oppose the new Weltanschauung which has been built in Germany to-day, the more so as this new conception of life rests upon the noblest human sentiments: fidelity to duty, national unity without differences of class, contempt for all privileges of birth, rank and position, but recognition of personal achievement. This con-ception of life cannot be altered by reason of any possible mate-

disadvantages. But the American people, as the people of other civilized lands, cannot help wondering about the Nazi interpretation of the noblest human sentiments' of which Dr. Schachat writes.
"National unity without differences of class," with the exception of Jews, Catholics, Protestants, labor unions, intellectuals and advocates of peace. "Recog-nition of personal achievement," excepting those discriminated against on racial, religious or political grounds. But Dr. Schacht's eulogy of

the Nazi regime in Foreign Affairs is mere window-dressing for the things he wants to sell to the American public. And that is presented in the following sentence:

It is quite natural that the American idealist who uttered these sentiments should be despised by the Nazis. But the sentiments expressed by Woodrow Wilson, as Governor, were afterward expressed also by the entire American people when, by a joint resolution of Congress. commercial treaty with Russia was abrogated.
