The Lindbergh Case and the Nazi Press

When the first reports of the arrest of Bruno Richard Hauptmann in connection with the tragic Lindbergh kidnaping reached Germany, the Nazi press immediately insinuated that Hauptmann was a Jew by stating that he was arrested in "a Jewish district," referring to the Bronx. But now that Hauptmann's record has been established, his criminal record at Kamenz, Germany, as well as German Army ancestry, the Nazi newspapers are singing a different tune. Thus the West German Beobachter, the leading Nazi newspaper in Western Germany, writes as follows:

"That the kidnaping of the Liergh child has been found after two years is not exactly a great accomplishment, but that does not matter to American propagandists. . . . The fact that the criminal comes from Germany is being utilized by the German press in an campaign of vast proportions. The fact of the foreign press hostile to us nobly competes with the emigré press, especially in the Saar territory, in constantly emphasizing through big banner headlines that the perpetrator is German. Here again the saying holds that 'Of course every German will regret that a member of the German people is guilty of the deed. But the German people will not consider it insane to make the whole people responsible for the crime of a single depraved person.

"Suppose the criminal had been a Jew. Would that have been considered 'too much'? Certainly not. For in that case all the psychoanalysts and philanthropists in the world would have united to make of the criminal an honorable man. But, since he is German, the occasion is welcomed to hang something on the German people in an externally harmless form. This reasoning is typical of the stupidity and arrogance of the Nazis. No one in the German people in connection with Bruno Richard Hauptmann. No one would be justified in blaming the German people in an externally harmless form.

The strange thing about the Nazis is not that their first impulse was to blame the Jews but that they are contemplating of the very methods which they and other anti-Semites have been in the habit of applying to the Jews. 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Nazis Meet To Endorse Ballot Slate

Late yesterday the group was still undecided as to where the closed session would be held. Dr. Ewald declared, however, that he would willingly disclose the names of those aspirants who had received the committee's endorsement, after the session was over. "Is it likely that you'll approve any Jewish candidates?" he was asked.

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Land Ho! Nazis Spy Palestine As Pioneer Spot

Goebbels' Ace Lookout Reports in Series for 'Angriß'

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, Sept. 26.—The Nazis have discovered Palestine, it was revealed here today.

"A sudden curious interest in the Jewish Nation's home in the Holy Land, and speculation on the possibility of Jewish success in the Near East, led Propaganda Minister Goebbels to publish the best writer on the staff of Der Angriß to Palestine.

As a result of the Nazi correspondence investigation, the first of a series of articles on Jewish Palestine, appeared today in Dr. Goebbels' paper. The conclusion of the first article is that not the Jews and not the Arabs, but England, is holding Palestine; which the writer characterizes as "the most dangerous corner in the East."

Displaying an excellent knowledge of Palestinian affairs and of the Zionist movement as a whole, the opening article revealed the activities of the young Jews who go to Palestine to work on the land and at hard physical labor.

The investigation, however, derided Toti Aviv and the cafes crowded with ladies "emulating the Kurfürstendam" (chief Jewish street in Berlin). "Is she anxious?"

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Greece Grants Exiles Haven While Deciding Their Future

'Storm Over Austria' Urges Radical Anti-Semitic Laws

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) VIENNA, Sept. 26.—Radical and through-going legislation against the Jews of Austria is urged today by Storm Over Austria, Chancellor Kurt Schuschnigg's own paper and the official organ of the Catholic storm troop organization which he heads.

The paper demands that the government differentiate between religious and non-religious types of Jews. The first class should be granted religious rights, while the second group must be treated as "unwanted elements" and shipped to Palestine through world-wide cooperation, Storm Over Austria proposes.

It also became known today that Austrian authorities had granted permission for two huge anti-Semitic mass meetings in the last two days, despite the fact that all political meetings are strictly forbidden in Austria.

The mass meetings, which were entirely devoted to denunciation of the Jews and proposals for depriving them of citizenship rights and public and professional posts, were held under the auspices of the German Austrian Protective Anti-Semitic Union, headed by Jews Beck.

This action by Austrian authorities is held to be highly significant, since the prohibition against political mass meetings has been rigidly enforced with all the power of the Austrian state.

Jewish leaders here expressed the opinion that permission for the meetings was granted because influential circles in Austria deem it necessary to stress anti-Semitism as a means of showing the Jews that Chancellor Schuschnigg's declaration in Geneva about equality of treatment for all citizens must not be taken seriously.

Wallace Announces New Inspection Service Under NRA

(Special to the J.D.A.) WASHINGTON, Sept. 23.—Secretary of Agriculture Wallace today announced that inspection of all live poultry, a service recently abandoned by the New York City Health Department, had been placed under the authority of the NRA, code for the New York live poultry industry.

This action follows a recent hearing in New York on code amendments called by Undersecretary of Agriculture Tugwell.

A licensed inspector of the Department of Agriculture will resume the inspection work abandoned by the city.

Under the code amendment, selling of uninspected or diseased poultry in the New York market is made a Federal offense.

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Set to Enforce Safety Pledge After Plebiscite

Council Will Concentrate on Problem at Special Session

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) GENEVA, Sept. 26.—Germany will have to guarantee protection to the Jews of the Saar if she is to take possession of that region in the event of the January plebiscite favors her, it was revealed here today in connection with the extraordinary session of the Council of the League of Nations summoned for November to deal with the Saar question.

Should Germany fail to pledge respect for Jewish rights and should her answer be considered unsatisfactory, it is learned, the League of Nations will then adopt a special resolution concerning the rights of the Saarland Jews with the added proviso that if Germany refuses to accept this resolution, she will have to turn that she cannot be trusted with control and administration of the Saar.

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Democrats to Renominate Lehman

Smith Names Him Again Today At Buffalo; Choice Is Assured

(Special to the J.D.B.)

BUFFALO, Sept. 26.—Herbert H. Lehman will be renominated for the office of Governor of New York tomorrow. Former Governor Alfred E. Smith will make the address placing Governor Lehman's name before the Democratic State Convention, which began its sessions here today.

That the present incumbent of New York's first Jewish Governor, will again be chosen to head the Democratic state slate is regarded as a foregone conclusion.

Other names may be presented for the nomination, but no one who is up on his politics thought seriously for a minute here tonight that any rival to Lehman can prove formidable.

Farley Relected

An indication of the strength of Lehman at the convention came early when James A. Farley, Postmaster-General and national chairman, was reelected by unanimous vote as state chairman.

The Governor had requested him to continue despite Farley's previously expressed desire to resign.

"Our very distinguished Governor and the next Governor of New York has asked me to carry on and help during the present campaign," Farley said in explanation of his acceptance of reelection.

On all sides the view was expressed that Lehman's popularity throughout the state is as great if not greater than in 1932, when he polled a larger vote in New York than President Roosevelt.

New Deal Is Issued

United States Senator Robert F. Wagner, who delivered the keynote speech today, squarely put the "New Deal" issue before the convention.

"The single issue of this campaign, state and national, is the 'New Deal,'" he declared.

"Our gratitude goes out to Herbert H. Lehman," he continued, "the steady helmsman who has guided this state courageously and skillfully through these critical years whose statesmanship, sagacity and humanitarianism have won an everlasting place in the hearts of the people of New York."

"It has been of the utmost advantage that we have had a sympathetic relationship between Albany and Washington."

Hope Vanishes For Strike End In Pocketbooks

Employers Refuse to Accept Proposal to Settle

Prospects for an early settlement of the strike of more than 5,000 pocketbook workers in New York City, who have been out since September 20, vanished yesterday, when it was announced that the Council of Leather Goods Manufacturers, the employers' group, had rejected a settlement proposed by Ben Golden, executive secretary of the Regional Labor Board.

The general strike called by the International Pocketbook Workers Union will continue indefinitely, Charles I. Goldman, secretary-treasurer of the union, declared, adding that the strike was rapidly spreading to factories in Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

According to the union officials, another 3,000 workers outside of New York are expected to join the ranks of the strikers by the end of this week.

Decision Follows Talks

The general strike, Mr. Goldman said, was decided upon after repeated negotiations with the employers and attempts to raise wages in the entire industry through action at Washington broke down completely.

Among the chief demands made by the union are a ten per cent increase in wages, a reduction of working hours to thirty-six, a ten

Harlemites Pay Decoys to Fool 'Black Hitler'

Abdul Hamid's Efforts Foster New Type of Racket

Abdul Suft Hamid, Harlem's "Black Hitler" who isn't opposed to the Jews, but says at street meetings that he would like to "drive them out of Harlem" has the Negro section in a state of nervous excitement.

The latest development is a flourishing racket which has grown up as a direct result of Hamid's efforts to force Jewish business men to hire Negro members of his Negro Industrial Council Alliance.

For an agreed sum, Negroes who are not members of the Alliance will "protect" storekeepers against Hamid, it was learned. Since they are unemployed, they hang around the establishment, and when one of Hamid's investigators calls to find out whether the place is employing Negroes, the "protector" identifies himself as an employee.

One Jewish storekeeper, who asked that his name be withheld, yesterday admitted to the Jewish Daily Bulletin that he had availed himself of this protection. He said that many other storekeepers are doing the same.

per cent increase in factory staffs to give work to the unemployed, and union control over the contracting civil.

Conditions Get Worse

Since the depression began, Mr. Goldman declared, conditions in the industry have become progressively worse. Wages were cut drastically, in some cases more than fifty per cent, and many factories moved out of town, where they paid wages of no more than \$5 or \$10 a week.

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Interim Protests Olympics Plan

Advances Numerous Arguments Against Holding Games in Reich

by Tschammer von Osten, Nazi official designated by Hitler to represent Reich "hosted for job."

Before the meeting Brundage pointed out that the committee had two major questions to consider. One was whether political, social and religious conditions under Hitler are such that America should have no athletic relations with Germany and the other is whether the F.O.A. may be counted on to handle the games properly.

"Perhaps the first, being outside the realm of sports, should not be allowed to influence our decision," Brundage said. "The second certainly should, but judging by the excellent preparations being made for the Olympics, I am confident Germany is fully qualified for the job."

Brundage admitted that strong pressure from Jewish organizations had been exerted upon him through the efforts of the American non-participation by America in the 1936 games.

The National Executive meeting of the Avukah chapter delegates, representing Zionist student youths in more than forty colleges in the United States adopted a unanimous resolution expressing opposition to the 1936 Olympics to Natsiland. The resolution also favors non-participation by American athletes in the German sports exhibition.

Intermyer Letter
Samuel Intermyer, president of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League to Champion Human Rights, has written an open letter to Brundage yesterday afternoon on behalf of the organization against American participation in the Berlin Olympics.

"In these games in Germany in 1936," Mr. Intermyer writes, "would violate the economic boycott and cultural isolation which the civilized world has been formed to employ against the atrocities of the current regime in Germany. The abuses of Jewish, Catholic, Labor, and Liberal indignities and humiliations which have been the avowed policy of the Third Reich have been nowhere more exhaustive than in the realm of sports. The restrictions against Jewish athletes have not abated one jot in the fifteen months since the German government solemnly promised to eliminate such measures, but have on the contrary been extended with machine-like precision to include every field of sports which will come under the Olympic competition. The Olympic ideal of fair play and good sportsmanship irrespective of race and social condition, constitutes a criminal interference in Germany today for which large numbers of innocent citizens have been exiled, expropriated, tortured and slain. There is no reason for participating in these games in Berlin, for twenty-one nations have not agreed to compete there in any form. Congress can be readily aroused to select a site more harmonious with Olympic ideals. The anarchic character of the Third Reich, symbolized by the wholesale slaughter of June 30, makes it a grave responsibility to send thousands of people there. There is a serious moral problem involved in accepting the hospitality of a nation either so poor or so dishonest that it will not honor every just financial obligation. The people of the democratic and sport-loving American people will be deprived of participating in or visiting a Berlin Olympics, out of respect for solemn pledges they have made to

refrain from traffic of any sort with Germany.

Early Resolution
"Before entering upon a detailed statement of our reasons for urging you to refuse to participate in the games at Berlin in 1936 we beg herewith to submit a copy of the resolution that was unanimously adopted at the meeting of the first American Youth Congress, held at the New York University on August 15, 1934:

"We do oppose the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin and demand that the American Committee rescind their decision to send a team to the Olympic Games in Berlin;

"That American athletes boycott preparation for the Berlin Olympics."

"The organization that voted on this resolution represented 9,000 Jews, Catholics, Protestants, Catholics, Jews, creeds and political views. . . .
"In addition to the above, many non-Jewish organizations, including the American Federation of Labor, have endorsed the boycott of German goods and services and may thereby be fairly assumed to be in agreement with the action of our country in the Olympic Games to be held in Germany.

Asked Guarantee
"At the meeting of the International Olympic committee, held in London June 19, 1933, the president asked the German delegates if they would guarantee the observance of the articles in the charter dealing with the existing conditions and the rules of qualification, just as they had been guaranteed by the governments of countries where previous Olympic games had been organized, and that the application of the Olympic rules dealing with the committee of organization and the qualifications of participants would be scrupulously observed, even though certain limitations of our international rules should be in accordance with recent orders laid down in Germany."
"To that question His Excellency Dr. Theodor Lewald, then president of the German organization, had solemnly answered as having perpetrated the heinous crime of having had a Jewish grandfather, replied, with the consent of his government. . . .
"As a result of this answer, we shall not be excluded from German teams at the Games of the Eleventh Olympiad."

"After this declaration Mr. Carlisle, American representative to the National Olympic Committee, wished to have it known that the American Olympic Committee, who are the organizers of the United States sports represented at the next Olympic Games in Europe, would have had to give up participation altogether if German Jews athletes had not been assured the same terms as members of the same faith in other countries."

Resolutions Passed
"Subsequently, at a meeting of the American Athletic Union of the United States, at its annual convention, held in Pittsburgh on November 20, 1933, resolutions on this subject were passed. . . .
"I cannot here begin to recapitulate or describe the number or extent of the insults and humiliations which the German Jews have been and are being subjected in connection with this subject. Suffice it to say that it will be impossible for any self-respecting Jew from any part of the world to enter Germany or to subject himself to the degradation that would be involved in his participating in the Olympics of 1936 in

that country, either as a contestant or an observer.

"The application of the 'Aryan paragraph' of the German law would also exclude the participation of Negroes, such as Metcalf, who are connected with American athletes of the same race. It would also exclude American Indians, Asiatics and teams from nations whose dominant blood-strains are not Jewish, and grotesque definition of 'Aryan' as evolved by the German government, which is the laughing-stock and subject of contemptuous derision of the entire civilized world."

Cites Labor Question

"Permit me also to call attention to the essential fact that your authority to investigate conditions in Germany applied only to the Jewish situation and that it did not take into account the discriminating and destructive action against Jews and organizers, the confiscation of their property on account of which almost every labor organization in the civilized world has actually boycotted German merchandise; nor did it take into account the action taken against the Catholic youth groups which, it seems to me, must necessarily prevent those elements from participating in the International Olympic Games if held in Germany.

"The pledges given you by Herr Tschammer von Osten, the special Olympics minister, you yourself termed 'very peculiar' when you have now decreed that you will be made public in Germany. You will not be surprised therefore, to learn that you had scarcely taken ship when a new decree had been promulgated (September 23) categorically forbidding Jews to take sports or exercises in a body. Your own intimacy with the German athletic activity will acquaint you with the paralyzing effect of such a prohibition on sports of every

sort; this final measure stands down every prospect, even a verbal one, of just treatment for a single Jew with the prospective of complete helplessness, with which the German government has ensouled the athletes of fifteen months ago, officially given to the International Olympic Committee, what weight is to be attached to give sotto voce and sub rosa.

Points to Self-Respect

"The unsportsmanlike and humiliating condition now imposed is in and of itself so grave an affront to the Jewish athletes that it automatically bars every self-respecting Jew from participation.

"How any fair-minded representative of your organization could permit himself, by voting for this resolution, to become a party to any such insult to his fellow-members is inconceivable.

"Frankly, I was surprised and shocked at the argument put forth by you in favor of holding these Games in Berlin, as reported in this morning's Herald Tribune."
"As I see it, there is not the remotest analogy between your suppositions case of Japan in 1940 and the situation that confronts American participation in the Berlin Olympics. If in 1940 it should appear that the Japanese government had deprived its own citizens of their Japanese rights of citizenship and had heaped upon them every conceivable torture

and form of persecution merely and solely because they were white, and excluded them from participating in sports, I doubt whether we would hesitate long about refusing to take part in meeting in Japan.

"How any impartial person who has not been thoroughly indoctrinated by the poisonous virus of anti-Semitism can for a moment expect Jews to participate in these Games, in the face of this record, is impossible to imagine."
"The decision to participate in these Games would necessarily mar, if not destroy, the harmony and freedom from race prejudice dignities that have heretofore marked the career of American sports-to-life. Nothing more than the performance of this kind of awards has ever been known in sports circles.

Nothing "Political"
"There is nothing either 'internal' or 'political' about the grave problems of equality, Americanism and decent sportsmanship that are the basis of this organization. The unprovoked massacre and persecution by a government of a country that was once civilized, of its innocent minorities merely because of their race or creed, has never been recalled by the world as an (Continued on Page Eight)

Jewry Must About Face!

This is the fifth of a series of six articles, which we present in the belief that the viewpoint of the younger American Jew, with his roots in this country, is of vital importance at this time. The writer, born in Chicago, now residing in New York, is thirty-six years old. He is married and has three children. He studied art, but had scarcely finished school when the country entered the World War and he volunteered in the fighting forces. After the war he went into publishing and advertising and has been successful in both. He puts out several popular magazines and is a national advertiser for the circulation of 100 newspapers. This international conference should elect an authoritative leadership which will deal with Jewish difficulties in all countries where Jews do not have full and equal protection under the law.

Every Christian nation in the world has succeeded for the Americans, but when German Jewry, one of the most sensitive and intellectual groups which ever existed on this earth, the very flower of pre-ent-day humanity, was slaughtered, maimed and tortured, all it received in the way of help was a few meetings.

Efforts to sustain even the refugees have been badly bungled. In the denouement the soundlessly fanstagnant could still come to America and drag his overladen feet into the drawing rooms of the very cream of American society.

The British, who express the most anxious sympathy and revulsion, actually did nothing at all about it. As a matter of fact, they deliberately kept these stricken unfortunates out of their homes in favor of a lot of ignorant, murderous Arabs. They soon afterwards took the side of Germany in the councils of the nations and were it not for Hitler's high-handed dishonesty in Germany's attempt to cancel its debts, as well as the vicious attempt to rape Austria, England would still be found in the line-up as Germany's friend and rescuer from dilemma.

Here's How It Would Work

United we could make the most powerful representations to all countries where Jews are deprived of their basic rights. Our members everywhere would use their influence in the face of every outrage, to lobby with their Catholic and Protestant friends, so that our voice would be heard more effectively. What a dignified and happy contrast this would be to the wailings, loud oratory and mass meetings with which we now seek to solve our problem!

In dealing with an international menace like Nazism we could make alliances with the Liberals, Catholics, Orthodox Lutherans and others who also have reason to fear the further rise of this monster.

In short, the Jews of the various nations would continue to place their citizenship in these nations first, and might logically, in fact, be the bitterest enemies in everything else—communes, political parties, etc.—but when Jews anywhere are attacked merely because they are Jews, when a world conspiracy exists with Berlin and its headquarters aiming to degrade and destroy us, we have a common ground from which no forces can deter us.

Certainly if the Catholics of the world can fight to aid the Catholics

with their children to remain Jews instead of plotting their escape to some other haven.

If we consider that our children will be fairly selective in these marriages, we can fairly assume that the additions to our group will be worthwhile and that we will have no cause to be ashamed of them. In many cases that have come under my personal notice this result has transpired. The great Rothschild family of Europe has consistently intermarried while still retaining its Jewish identity. If we are not well knitted into a compact group, this might prove a dangerous policy, as it has indeed been traditionally, but as is obvious, conditions alter cases. The present Hitler phobia, which is being secretly plotted and propagandized all over the country and which makes the man who marries a woman who had a Jewish grand-mother suffer all the stigma and disability of Jews, should make a policy of this sort not only possible but logical.

Jewish Life Reviewed in Latest Cables and Letters

Biblical Days Live Again at London Exhibit

Archaeological Group Displays Discoveries of Three Years

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
 LONDON, Sept. 26.—The Bible came to life here yesterday with the opening of an exhibition of finds made recently by the Palestine Exploration Fund.
 On display are articles dug up from Herod's Temple of Augustus, which is revealed as a building that makes Pousani's Biblical and melodramatic imaginings seem understatements. Other exhibits include the brilliant discoveries made among the walls of the ancient Israelitish capital of the ninth and eighth centuries B. C., where Omri, Ahab and Jezebel, Jehu and Jeroboam reigned.
 The explorers, digging for three years in Samaria under the sponsorship of the Fund, Harvard University, the British School of Archaeology in Jerusalem and Hebrew University, have discovered what is claimed to be part of Ahab's "House of Ivory."

Many originals and photographs of ivory carvings found in this building, which is mentioned in the Book of Kings, are included in the exhibition. Among the objects displayed are carvings of Egyptian gods, of the Cherubim, human-faced sphinxes with wings, of palms and of lilies. These were used generally as inlay for furniture and wainscoting. This show of luxury inspired the Prophet Amos in Jeroboam II's reign to inveigh against the people of Samaria who lol on ivory couches.
 Here beside them are the common things such as Israelite mould, with green and blue paint stains in some of the reservoirs. In another place are what the authorized version of the Bible is describing Solomon's Temple, called "lily chapters." Archaeologists call them "proto-Tonic capitals," quite evidently the first precursors of the Ionic order. Indeed, the appointments of Samaria and its Israelitish buildings are in all sorts of ways reminiscent of Solomon's Temple specifications. So extensive has been the digging that the photographs and plans are even more interesting than the objects they unite in a clear picture of Samaria when the Kings of Israel reigned.

Palestine Boats Booked Solid

 WASHINGTON, Sept. 26.—All steamers which carry Jewish immigrants from Constanza, Rumania, and Trieste, Italy, are completely booked until the end of October, the shipping companies announced officially today. The majority of the tickets were purchased by Polish Jews emigrating to Palestine, it was said.

Talmud Torah Fights Deficit

 MINNEAPOLIS, Sept. 26.—Seeking to wipe out an accumulated deficit of \$25,000, directors of the Minneapolis Talmud Torah have appointed L. B. Klugman to head the Finance Committee. Work out the financing plan. The newly appointed group will report back to the board within thirty days.

42 Naras Held, Stzafeta Issue Is Confiscated

Anti-Semitic Activities Are Continuing Despite Ban

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
 WARSAW, Sept. 26.—Naras anti-Semitic activities are continuing all over Poland despite the outlawing of the party, police revealed today when they announced the arrest of forty-two Naras, including the editors, printers and vendors of the illegal Naras organ, Stzafeta.

Police also confiscated 8,000 copies of the latest issue of the anti-Semitic paper and a list of 33,000 subscribers. The minute search of the illegal printing plant operated by the Naras was carried out by the police.

The Naras party, National Radicals who split off from the older Endek anti-Semitic party, saying that the latter were not active enough against the Jews, was outlawed after the murder of minister of the Interior Colonel Piersack.

Before they were outlawed, the Naras managed to carry out a series of nation-wide attacks against the Jews, killing many and wounding hundreds.

During the height of the Naras attacks, Jews fled to the villages out of their homes after dark. When the Naras found that open attacks were being met with stout resistance by the Jews, they resorted to analogous parties of Jews returning from work.

Orphan Asylum Head

Louis Scheibel became superintendent of the Hebrew Orphan Asylum here in 1869. He was an extensive contributor to Jewish papers.

Ben-Gurion Outlines Attitude Of Executive on Problems

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
 LONDON, Sept. 17.—David Ben-Gurion, member of the Jewish Agency Executive, who is now in London, outlined today, in an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, the attitude of the Executive of the Jewish Agency toward a number of internal Zionist problems, as well as the problems concerning the attitude of the Jewish Agency toward the Arabs and the British Government.

"We have come to London," Ben-Gurion stated, "to consult the members of our London Executive on a number of important questions which have now become actual problems of the Agency.
 "One of these is to consider certain measures how to consolidate the Zionist movement.
 "We are now working on a plan how to consolidate the constructive forces and to strengthen the internal unity in the Zionist ranks and how to activate the Zionist ranks."
 "There are also a number of problems concerning the relations with the mandatory power and with the British Government, which I shall discuss now at the Executive session during my stay in London," he said.

"The Executive is making great efforts to find an understanding with the Arabs. We are, however, convinced that a true and long-lasting understanding can be built only when the needs, the aims and the rights of the Jewish people in Palestine will be recognized to their full extent.

Children of French Immigrants Forging Ahead in Many Fields

PARIS, Sept. 18.—The beginning of the school year again arouses the expectation, always fulfilled, that at its close a new group of outstanding Jewish pupils will have come to the fore.
 France has many exemplary Jewish students who receive prizes and various other honors at the end of every school year, just before the Summer vacation begins. A large number of these children come from immigrant homes. Many have not been in the country more than a year when they are chosen the most promising in their classes.

To a large extent this ability of the Jewish pupils is given full scope only because of the friendly attitude of teachers and pupils toward foreigners, who are not differentiated from native Frenchmen in any way.

Treated as Equal
 This attitude was emphasized last Spring in a speech delivered in one of the Jewish quarters by a former parliamentary deputy, who declared that Jewish parents could rest assured their children would receive equal treatment with those of other nationalities, once they crossed the threshold of the school.

The children of yesterday's Jewish immigrants have already made careers for themselves in many fields of French culture. Moreover, they are considered by many the future leaders of French Jewry, having quickly thrown off their native and distinguishing qualities. Immigrant Jews are among the outstanding French writers of today, among the more popular actors and most prominent journalists. Some of the children of a Jewish tailor who came here from a small town in Poland are considered the most

promising of the younger members of the Comedie Francaise.

Many Grace Stage
 This is nothing new in France, where the children of immigrants from Poland, Rumania and the Russia of other days soon found their way to the stage. Suffice it to mention Ida Rubenstein, whom Sarah Bernhardt called her family success. Miss Rubenstein's family came here from Warsaw several decades ago.

There are also many prominent Jewish actors, industrialists and bankers in France.

The children of the German refugees, too, have already, in the space of one year, distinguished themselves in their classes and have shown a firm grasp of the French language.

Presented to President
 Every year, a number of the prize-winning pupils are presented to the President. At one of the recent presentations, a young successor boy asked whether he might write a message to the President. When his request was granted, he boy pleaded that his father be granted citizenship, that he might be a Frenchman along with his children, who were born in this country. The incident was the talk of the Jewish quarter for days.

Westphalia Lifts Ban on Butchers

Labor Front Administrator Orders Withdrawal of Job Prohibition

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
 BERLIN, Sept. 19.—An immediately effective order to withdraw a decree in the district of Westphalia prohibiting employment of Jewish butcher workers and apprentices has been issued in Muenster by the district administrator of the Labor Front.

The order cancels article 15 of the Westphalia decree, issued last February 20, which stated that all employees in the butcher trade in that district must be members of trade unions belonging to the German Labor Front, which does not accept Jews.

Cancellation of this ruling permits to return to work as journeyman butchers and apprentices. The first cattle market without Jewish workers in Frankfurt-on-Main, opened with elaborate ceremony, was hailed by the press.


The Bauern Zeitung of Frankfurt-on-Main wrote that formerly eighty per cent of the cattle dealers in that city were Jews, and declared that the experiment of organizing a "cattle market free of Jews" has proved a tremendous success.

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The Bulletin's Day Book

Yesterday was election day in Jerusalem. The voters went to the polls to do their duty as citizens, our Jerusalem correspondent informs us, but the story seemed to lack a little zest. In the color, the emotional impact of an election in New York, or even of a plebiscite in Berlin, was missing.

In a New York election we have the Tammany Tiger prowling up and down the streets, in and out of blind alleys. In some sections the tiger is strangely absent. In its ferocious stead there stalks a scowling elephant, the G.O.P., standard bearer with the big ears and the memory that never, never forgets. Even the Fusionists had a colorful animal yesterday—a hybrid double-elephant, captured by the political cartoonists as making a monkey out of the once terrible striped beast of Bengal.

Then there are the anti-slender campaign headquarters packed with jovial politicians, fat, balded, booming out greetings and passing cheap cigars. The excited rout of the hangers-on at the election returns come drifting in from one district after another. The torchlight parades. The street scene. The mud-slinging indulged in by candidates. Election officials patiently instructing women how to operate the lever of the mechanical vote, recording contraptions. Blaring headlines recording the vote. The congratulations, hypocritical or sincere, the kisses to the Mount Vernon or Canton or Podunk.

And in Berlin at a plebiscite. The reader can visualize the millions of sheep moving in and out of the polling places, vainly, fearfully doing what they're told to do. He can visualize, too, with a throbb, the supreme courage it took for those citizens of the Reich who voted "ja" in the face of all the terrific pressure the Hitler forces brought to bear upon them.

And if the result is never for a moment in doubt, there is still sufficient drama to stir the blood in the spectacle of thousands of persons doing the bidding of one man and in the spectacle of a comparative handful daring to defy him in the name of Heaven alone knows what punishment.

But what have we in Jerusalem? Maybe the election was colorful. Maybe it actually had its dramatic situations and tensions. Maybe there was something about the election that even appeared in the music and drum-combe and bombast of a local election. But one would scarcely suspect it from the report.

Now, this is not meant to be a criticism of the J.T.A. reporter who filed the story. After all, cable charges are high and color is a luxury when it comes at so much a word.

I'm merely trying to convey the impression that the Jerusalem election of yesterday lends me and my colleagues very cold. We wanted to know a few of the inconsequential details that make an election interesting over here. Jerusalem the ancient Jerusalem has the cradle of many religions,

Jerusalem the scene of many a bloody racial quarrel, Jerusalem the city of white buildings, blazing suns and rolling hills—what was it like on election day?

I was curious to know about these things. Was there a holiday for election day? Were there parades, torchlight processions, perhaps? How did the voters go about the business of voting. Did they ballot by hand or machine? How did the candidates electioneer? Was there mud-slinging? Was there much popular interest evinced in the election?

Do the candidates pass out cigars or go around holding babies and kissing them and shaking hands with proud parents? Do they make all sorts of promises to the voters that they never intend keeping? What use is made of the radio? What does an Arab speech sound like? And how does an Arabian politician compare with the Tammany variety?

There are probably a score of other questions I could think of that I'd like to have answered about a Jerusalem election. And I promise readers of the Day Book to Palestine I'll send back a Day Book on election day in Jerusalem that will supply all the answers to the above questions.

England Expels Streicher's Son For Activities

Found by Police Trying to Spread Father's Anti-Semitism

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Sept. 26.—A son of the notorious anti-Semite, Julius Streicher, editor of the Nuremberg anti-Jewish weekly, Der Sturmer, was ousted from England yesterday when police discovered he had been acting as a representative of his father. The London Daily Herald reported.

The junior Streicher, the police discovered, had been making contacts with British Fascist and Nazi organizations and attempting to extend his father's anti-Semitic propaganda to England.

Since the appearance of Streicher in England, copies of the "ritual murder" issue of Der Sturmer had begun to be circulated through the country. Even the Nazi government confiscated the entire issue and prohibited its export from Germany.

Drive on Nazi Reich Makes Him 'Sick to Death,' Brown Writes

Heywood Brown, columnist, writing yesterday in the World-Telegram, declared he was "sick to death of the sick world being made" upon Nazi Germany. "I hate Hitler as with fervent a hatred as anybody can muster," Brown wrote.

"I don't hate Hitler because he is a German, and, as a matter of fact, he is not. It is the system he represents which marshals me up to the point of my hatred."

Brown said that he had no faith in "Nordic nonsense." "Even if there were such a thing as a Nordic race, it would not be superior to the rest of mankind. But in his desperate straits I am moved to come to his rescue. He is just as good as you."

The column follows in part: "Now It Must Be Told" "Naturally most of us who had German ancestors said very little about the coming of the war. The agents of the Department of Justice visited the sins of the grandfathers onto the children into the third and fourth generations. To frank, my Germans are rather closer than the single thread of a lone grandfather. My mother is American now, but she is German by heart and as a child she invariably spoke German to my brother and sister and me. Her intent was that we should speak German. Unfortunately, after the manner of American kids, we always answered back in English. But when I was young, I had already have passed the entrance examination in elementary German, which I almost flunked ten years ago."

"Every Christmas I was trained to recite a little poem in German, and all the customs which were observed during the holiday season were German in their origin and tone. After all, the Germans have done more with Christmas than any other nation. They seem almost to attach a special regard to that festival."

"I am boasting today of my German blood because I am sick to death of the drive which is being made upon a great people and a great nation. I hate Hitler with as fervent a hatred as anybody can muster."

I am merely pleading for a clear understanding of the undeniable fact that guilt is a personal thing and that Edmund Burke was eternally right when he said it was impossible and outrageous to indict an entire nation."

Rabbis' Board Condemns City Lottery Plan

Dr. Mendes Reports Dis- covery of State Letter of Protest

A resolution condemning the proposed municipal lottery was adopted yesterday at a meeting of the Board of Jewish Ministers held at Congress House, 150 West Eighth street. The Board empowered its representative, Dr. David de Sola Pool, rabbi of the Spanish synagogue, to appear before the public hearing this Thursday and make known to Mayor F. H. LaGuardia the sentiments of the organization.

Dr. H. P. Mendes, rabbi emeritus of the Spanish and Portuguese Synagogue, reported that he had discovered a letter from the Secretary of State in President Martin Van Buren's administration in which the United States officially protested anti-Jewish demonstrations in Germany. This letter, for some unknown reason, has not appeared within the past year or so in discussions of past precedents when the United States government publicly made an appeal for the Jews.

The letter is considered especially significant today because the anti-Jewish riots were based on the ancient blood ritual and presents a situation in part analogous to the present day when Julius Streicher, through his Der Stuermer, is attempting to stir further anti-Jewish feeling in Germany through reiteration of these same falsehoods.

Stephan S. Wise, wife of the rabbi, appeared to the members of the Board to ask their congregations to support the work of Congress House in caring for the children of the victims whose parents are established. Congress House, she said, maintains a home in Katonah, Westchester, for this purpose.

Mrs. Vizman, executive secretary of Young Judeas, appealed to the rabbis to assist in the development of a club for the Young Judeas groups. The Board will take steps to cooperate.

Rosalsky Holds 'Big Stick' Over Kosher Dealers

Hints He'll Force Them to Accept Rabbinic as Overscers

Judge Otto A. Rosalsky indicated at a conference at City Hall yesterday that if the poultry market owners do not accept his demands for establishing "supervision of markets and better conditions for shochetim by October 5, it will go into effect on October 20, despite their opposition.

He was fortified with the declaration the previous night by the Kashertr Association at a conference at the Hotel Pennsylvania that the New York rabbinate will place a ban on all poultry if the market men do not accept the decision.

Judge Rosalsky, the Mayor's mediator in recent poultry market difficulties, has handed down a decision providing for rabbinical supervision of slaughter markets, payment of shochetim at the rate of one-half cent per pound, a maximum of 12,000 pounds per live poultry, and the use of optimum and attachment of tags to chickens to certify they have been killed according to the Jewish ritual.

Another Parley Set

Another conference will be held October 5 to hear the market owners' side of the case. He will announce acceptance of his settlement, Judge Rosalsky said, the effective date will be extended to October 20. In the meantime a committee of rabbis and market takers to acquaint the Jewish community public with the terms of the settlement and its implications. Judge Rosalsky presided jointly with Aldermanic President Bernard S. Deutsch at yesterday's meeting. Others present were Mayor LaGuardia, president of the Kashertr Association, Leroy Peterson, NRA poultry code supervisor; Louis Lande, chief examiner for the Board of Aldermen; and Dr. Max Danziger.

Mr. Deutsch denounced the present practice of kashertr in poultry markets as merely giving the appearance of supervision and kashertr.

The market men, backed by Mr. Peterson, have indicated they will not support the settlement, basing their opposition on the increased costs entailed in rabbinical supervision and payment of the shochetim which will control rabbinical supervision.

Dealers Against Tags

Speakers for the market owners declared that at a meeting, wholesalers had voted to support an anti-invoicing "waste" of time.

Mr. Simon urged the market men to give Judge Rosalsky's settlement a fair hearing. If it does not work out satisfactorily, it will be modified. Mr. Simon is director of the Kashertr Association, which will control rabbinical supervision.

Following the conference on October 5, Judge Rosalsky will report to the Mayor on the situation to Mayor LaGuardia.

Threatens Rabbinical Ban On Poultry if Dealers Balk

Supreme Court rabbinical market men will place a ban on all poultry if the market men do not accept the offered agreement, announced Judge Rosalsky today. This president of the Kashertr Association of Greater New York, at a meeting of the Association at the Hotel Pennsylvania Tuesday night, threatened a ban on all poultry if the market men do not want rabbinical supervision of poultry markets in New York.

Judge Rosalsky delivered a plea for unity among the rabbis and sounded a warning to "any rabbi that may falter."

The new code provision says no live poultry shall be unloaded from railroad cars, trucks or other vehicles of transportation or kept in a slaughter house or offered for sale or sold therein or by any member operating a slaughter house unless it has been inspected and passed as to crop and health and feather condition and as to sanitary conditions of the coops and crates."

Provision is made for tagging inspected coops of poultry and "the absence of an inspection tag on any coop, crate or basket of poultry for the poultry contained therein shall be prima facie evidence that such poultry has not been inspected as required."

Other amendments include requirements for filing and posting prices by slaughter house operators and a definition of trade buyers to include a commercial buyer distinguished from an ultimate consumer.

Another provision says "no member of the industry shall enter into any agreement, understanding, combination or conspiracy to fix or maintain price terms nor cause or attempt to cause any member of the industry to change price terms by the use of intimidation, coercion or any other influence inconsistent with the maintenance of the free and open market which it is the purpose of this section to create."

NRA Spokesman Here Lauds Wallace Move

A spokesman for the NRA Poultry Code Authority in New York City yesterday told the Jewish Daily Bulletin that "the legal action has finally been placed where it belongs."

"The industry always wanted Federal inspection, and it is happy that it now has it. This is a great thing for the poultry industry," he said.

Health Commissioner John L. Rice said:

"The Department of Health is interested in chickens from the health aspect and will continue inspecting poultry from that standpoint."

The determination of the League to obtain guarantee for the Jewish minority, while in line with the sentiments of most members of the Council and of public opinion as voiced here, is not entirely in line with the view of the League's committee. The latter has previously informed the committee of three charged with carrying out the Saar plebiscite that, owing to the fact that the League's minority protection provisions in the text of the Versailles Treaty dealing with the Saar, the Council has no right to impose such obligations.

May Not Recommend

The committee held that the Council can only make recommendations to this effect and it must be left to the State to decide whether it will undertake such obligations. The committee's decision was based on purely legal grounds, it was pointed out today, and does not exclude a recommendation made by the Council in the matter of guaranteeing minority rights.

In League circles here today it was felt that the League will demand of Germany a number of small minorities rights will be accorded the Jews in the Saar and their rights will not be abrogated or curtailed in the plebiscite laws effected in the Reich.

Dr. Eduard Benes, Czechoslovakian Foreign Minister and president of the League Council, received a delegation of Zionist Revisionists, headed by Dr. Segal of Paris, which came to ask protection for the Jews in the Saar. The delegation pointed out that if the territory should revert to Germany following the plebiscite, the Jews would be subject to the persecution which is the lot of the German Jews.

Dr. Benes assured the delegation that he and the Council would examine carefully the entire situation of the Saar and that the League would firmly adhere to its principles and obligations.

Baron Hloel also received the Revisionist delegation today and discussed the situation with them.

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Nazis Open Fire In Press Drive To Seize Saar

Beobachter 'Accuses Commission Writers as 'Jewish Agents'

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN, Sept. 26.—The opening gun in the Nazi press campaign to win the Saar plebiscite was fired yesterday with a blast in the Volkischer Beobachter, Hitler's own paper, in which practically everyone who had anything to do with the Saar problem was termed "an agent of Jewish atrocity propaganda."

Included in the Beobachter list of Jewish agents are: the members of the League of Nations Saar Commission; Dorothy Thompson, American writer recently expelled from Germany by the Nazis, and author of a series of articles on the Saar; Lord Marley, Labor peer and active in anti-Nazi activities; Hilmar Branding, Swedish journalist active in League Affairs and Count Michael Karoly, former premier of Hungary, now in exile.

On Sept. 16, the Saar population will vote whether to return to Germany, to be annexed to France, or continue under the rule of the League of Nations. League Reichsteuer Adolf Hitler and all Nazi orators have declared over and over again that Nazi Germany will not permit the return of the Saar.

The League is now being asked by various interested groups to secure guarantees that no matter what the result of the plebiscite, the Jewish minority and the political opponents of the Nazis will not be persecuted. France has agreed to furnish such guarantees, but the Nazi government refused.

"Certainly!" he responded with blurt heartiness. "We are not anti-Jewish in any way."

Baron Hloel also pointed out that Dr. Herbert Schmuech, national president of the Friends of New Germany and a notorious Nazi propagandist, is a member of the committee. Dr. Ewald replied:

"Schmuech represents the younger German American element. He is not a Jew. The rest of us are conservative men."

"But how about C. K. Froehlich?" he was asked. Froehlich, executive president of the German-American Conference—he was seated when the organization was notified last May—also is president of the "Friends of New Germany" counter-boycott movement.

"I don't believe Froehlich will vote," Ewald asserted. "He holds an ex-officio status with the committee, but he is not a member of the Conference. Of our eight members, six are strongly conservative men."

Sees Unity in Harmony

Questioned as to rumblings of pending strife between the Conference and the Steuben Society, Baron Hloel said he regarded itself as the political spokesman for German-Americans and which has indicated no little regard for the formation of the new committee.
