In a very few days patriotic Americans and even more patriotic Italian-Americans will be celebrating an event that is sup-posed to have occurred back in the days of 1492. Every Columbus from the rock-ribbed coast of Maine to the actor-laden hills of Hollywood will have its queue of orators and cluster of wreaths. Columbus discovered America and there seems to be a universal conspiracy on foot never to let us forget it.

A few days ago another discovery was made that some day may make the Columbus adventure seem by comparison a paltry little trip across a quiet suburban street.

Herr Doktor Paul Joseph Goebbels, panjandrum of propaganda for the Third Reich, discovered Palestine

The exact date on which the gabby one made his startling dis-covery is not certain. Some day it may offer a fertile field for historians and Ph.D. hunters to delve into. They will write long, arid theses explaining that they have uncovered absolute evidence that the daring young Nazi navigator, after ploughing through stormy, serpent-infested seas for many months on the stout ship Der Angriff, finally set foot on Palestine's wild shores at exactly ten minutes after three o'clock, Arabian Standard Time, on the afternoon of September 26, 1934.

But the historians and the Ph.D. seekers will have only the slim-mest of evidence on which to base their assertions. When pressed they will be forced to admit that the basis for their conclusion is that on that afternoon, at that very hour, the natives of Haifa were forced to flee for their lives. Now that's pretty strong evidence as far as the sense of smell is concerned, but only the most rabid anti-Nazis will contend that it is conclusive proof that the stout ship Der Angriff had landed and disgorged its fearless explorers on the sands of Haifa's shore.

But who are we to quibble about dates? The all-important facts are undisputed by anyone in his right senses. grin, landed in Falestine not long ago and wrote a glowing account of his trip of discovery.

Our old friend Hanfstaengl is first mate. Between the two of them, Der Stuermer-Mayflower will have no trouble getting through the dol-drums. When the vessel is becalmed. Hanfy and Fatso get be caimed, Hally and Fatso get be-hind the canvas, take deep breaths and start talking. The wind stirred up by their words speeds them to their destination faster than an honest ninety-mile gale Eventually, they land on what will be known to posterity as Strei-cher's Pilgrim's Rock.

But our imagination strikes a snag when we try to look beyond that point. The Pilgrims of American history were greeted, if our memory isn't playing tricks on us, with arrows that whizzed un-

comfortably close to Pilgrim ears.
It wouldn't do to have the Pales-It wouldn't do to have the Pales-tinian natives toss arrows at the Nazi pilgrims. They might escape the shower or if the arrows struck, they probably would simply crum-ble against the inordinately tough skulls of the invaders.

How would it be if the bold nilgrims were greeted with a bar-rage of the ritual murder issues rage of the ritual murder issues of Der Stuermer, tossed by them by any army of Palestinian boy scouts? To survive such a barrage, Hanfy and Streicher and their plucky band would have to be mighty good dodgers.

"Baer doesn't exactly deny his race but he ducks the thing whenever it comes up. He's what you call a trick Jew."

Lasky Looks Like

A Winner Aside from the fact that Lasky looks like a winner and much better than Steve Hamas, the pride of Pennsylvania, he also resembles Maxie in physical appearances.
Both are good looking, bearing
sharp Hebraic features. But like snarp Hebraic features. But like Dempsey and Schmeling, who. too, could be taken for twins, Art and Max are far apart from a race angle. Dempsey is an Irish-Scotch American, Schmeling, German. Lasky is a Russian-Jewish American and he claims that Baer is

only German American. As we learned from Maurice Lasky, brother of the Minneapolis mauler and co-manager of the fighter, Art is the first real Ortho-dox Jewish heavyweight in boxing history and the third promi-nent candidate for the big honors. His predecessors include Dan Mena Spanish Jew who ruled doza, a Spanish Jew who ruled with iron fists, so to speak, over the length and breadth of England back in 1795, and Joe Choynski, one of the two men to flatten the Negro, Jack Johnson.

This last feat was accomplished This last feat was accomplished by Joe back in 1901. Choynski never reached the dizzy heights of championship but old-timers agree that he was "a considerable heavyweight." It remained for an Englishman named Jackson to stop short Choynski's achievements. Lasky, during the last month,

has cut short practice on each of the six Holy Days despite the rav-

ings of manager Gig Rooney.

At present Art rules as favorite over the hard-hitting and clever Steve Hamas at the price of 6 to 5. Most of the boxing betting boys are ready to lay 1 to 2 that Hamas will not be there at the end of will not be there at the end of the tenth round. This, we believe, is the way it should be, because Art is the rip-tearing type of fighter who pleases the fans. He's the kind that never stops from the moment of the opening bell until he scores a knockout—or is carried out. Lasky is a murder-ous puncher who gives no quarter and asks no mercy.

"Ted's cyclonic type of fighting earned for him the sobriquet of the 'dashing, smashing, crashing Kid.' and it is true to say of him that his name will be a legend to those who follow him. Lewis fought many notable battles in American rings, where he was much admired. He met Jack Britton there for the welter title on several occasions and these two must surely hold the record for the number of times
—about twenty—they met each other, holding decisions one over the other.

"Lewis also fought the famous Benny Leonard when he was world's lightweight champion and Lewis was a welter champion. Al-though Lewis was in the heavier division, it was doubtful whether he was the heavier for this bout which was a six rounds no-decision

"There can be no quarrel with the result of the competition, which declared that Benny Leonard was entitled to be regarded as the great Jewish boxer of all as the great Jewish boxer of all time. But our correspondent gives it as his opinion that Lewis should have been considered in con-nection with the competition, which apparently he was not. Lewis also met the famous Welsh champion, Johnny Basham, with whom he fought memorable bouts on more than one occasion. The last contest, when he knocked out Basham in the nineteenth round, was, in the opinion of many critics, the finest and most thrilling bout ever seen in England."

Paul Joseph Goebbels, Minister of Propaganda and Enlightenment, opened the Thanksgiving program. He sounded the cue for Hitler when he told the massed thousands.

Farmers from all sections at-tended the huge Buckenburg meeting, which was featured by meeting, which was featured by military manoeuvres. Hundreds of thousands of Hitler's so-called "noblemen of labor" participated in the nation-wide thanksgiving ceremonies of this national har-vest festival, which came off as scheduled after two thorough rehearsals yesterday for organized groups, including Reichswehr troops, members of the S. A., and labor service units.

Harvest emblems and mottoes decorated every hamlet, town and city throughout the breadth of Germany, with local rites taking place in the more remote villages. The Propaganda Ministry's plans worked to perfection, slogans doing honor to agriculture were displayed everywhere.

"Wine, bread, love and fidelity" ran the inscription on millions of buttonhole miniatures on sale at all corners.

In a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mr. Goodman declared that the world executive body of the organization has the matter under consideration and will act only in accordance with general Jewish opinion, since the matter does not involve religious principles.

Palestine Jewish leaders are strongly opposed to the proposed legislative council, terming it a clear violation of the provisions of the Palestine Mandate. also point out that the Arab representatives together with the British will constitute a majority opposed to the Jews.

Anti-Nazi Session At Chicago Ends

Resolutions Assail Nazis, Fascism and War Plans

CHICAGO, Sept. 30.—The second United States Congress

sex problem in American prisons is in a large measure responsible for present prison unrest.

Mr. Fishman, as chairman of the jail committee of the Amerthe jail committee of the Amer-ican Prison Association and as inspector of prisons for the fed-eral government for a period of ten years,, has investigated every penal institution of importance. penal institution of importance. He reports that there is a flagrant sex degeneracy in American pris-ons and that prison authorities refuse to recognize existence of the evil or to take steps towards its eradication.

He advocates, as a means of curtailing sex perversions and abnormalities now rampant, the possibility of furloughs for prispossibility of furiougns for pris-oners of one day a month so that they may visit their wives and families, a solution used in many European countries, particularly

Soviet Russia. He laments the fact that prison He laments the fact that prison administrators do not face the problem squarely and states that there is a "conspiracy of silence" among them. He urges frank and open discussion of the problem at official meetings of the American Prison American Camerican Prison Association, something that so far they have been unwillsomething

ing to do, in his opinion.

Mr. Fishman condemns the enforced idleness and bad living conditions which characterize American prisons.

"In our prisons," he writes, "the two great topics of conversation are crime and sex. The enforced idleness, the lack of diversion, accentuate and contribute to the seriousness of the problem."

The author denounces the practice of placing two or more men in a cell which is in effect in so many American prisons.

isolating them. Austrian Jewish leaders de-nounced the attitude of the government and said that efforts to terrorize the Jewish community terrorize and throttle protests would be unavailing. Jewish leaders were warned Friday by the Reichspost, warned Friday by the Reichspost, official government newspaper, to end their protests against the school law, charging that such protests had been instigated by Marxist anti-government groups. Jewish circles pointed out that such an accusation is sheer non-

sense and that Austrian Jews are not Marxists.
