Nazi Day in New York

The United German Societies of Greater New York celebrated German Day, commemorating the landing in the United States of the first German immigrants in 1683. The mass meeting in Madison Square Garden was presided over by Dr. Ignatz T. Griebel, the former president of the "Friends of the New Germany" and intimate collaborator with Heinz Spanknoebel, the notorious Nazi propagandist who fled this country upon learning that he had been indicted and that the Federal Government was trying to have him arrested. The German Day celebration was in every detail a tribute to Adolf Hitler and his despotic dictatorship.

The German Consul General in New York, Dr. Hans Borchers, addressing the audience in Madison Square Garden, said that "never has Germany had such a government of the people, for the people and by the people as Adolf Hitler's."

The chairman of the meeting declared:

"We shall demand adequate representation in city, country, State and Federal governments. Representatives of the existing political machines might as well realize once and for all that we shall make these demands. The time has now come for all German Americans to demand representation in the government."

And then he exclaimed:

"Those who fight us must perish—socially as well as economically—because of our determination to destroy our enemies completely and without any consideration whatever."

One of the speakers, Louis Zahne, chairman of the German-American Independent Voters' League, said that the Germans looked with hope to the day when "a President of German blood and German ideals shall occupy the President's chair in the White House."

A letter from President Roosevelt, addressed to Carl Nicolai, president of the German societies, was read. Among other things, the President wrote:

"I am very happy to have the opportunity to send a message of greeting and good wishes to those participating in the celebration of German Day."

"The contributions made by persons of German blood to the upbuilding of this country has been an important one. . . .

"The qualities and accomplishments of these elements in our history have become a valued part of the common heritage of the American people."

After the reading of President Roosevelt's letter, the chairman called for three "heils" for "the

British Zionists Act to Halt Adoption of Palestine Council

LONDON, Oct. 7.—An impressive demonstration against the intention of the British administration to create in Palestine a legislative council on the basis of the present population status was staged here today by the Zionist Federation of Great Britain and Ireland.

Meeting in a special conference at the First Avenue Hotel, the Federation adopted a series of resolutions strongly opposing the legislative council, requesting re-

vision of the Palestine immigration laws, demanding investigation by the British government of restrictions imposed on Palestine Jews and asking annulment of a projected law prohibiting Jewish immigrant doctors and lawyers from practicing their professions in Palestine.

The resolution on the council called for resistance to its organization "as long as no agreement has been reached between the Arabs and the Jews protecting the rights of the Jewish National

Hamid Is Given Chance to Air Views in Court As Nazis' Chief Views in Court At German Day

Anti-Nazis Slap Summons on Harlem Ver-sion of Hitler

Sufi Abdul Hamid will appear before Magistrate Michael A. Ford in Sixth District Court, 121st street and Sylvan place, today in answer to a complaint charging disorderly conduct, sworn out by Edgar Burman, national commander of the anti-Nazi Minute Men.

The summons was served yesterday afternoon by Burman and Detective Thomas Tunney at the office of Hamid's Negro Industrial Clerical Alliance, 205 West 135th street.

Burman charges Hamid acted in a disorderly manner at 125th street and Seventh avenue while speaking outdoors one night last month by inciting his auditors against the Jewish race.

Hamid has been trying to force Harlem Jewish merchants to employ members of the N. I. C. A. The Harlem Liberator, Negro weekly, reported yesterday that two Bronx garages have discharged more than twenty-five Negro taxi drivers in retaliation against Hamid's coercive policies.

Lithuania Strikes Blow at Education

KAUNAS, Lithuania, Oct. 7.—The virtual exclusion of Jews from the University of Lithuania has aroused much alarm here and apprehension that it means sharp limitation of opportunities offered to Jewish students to secure an education.

The Jewish press today comments at length on the fact that not one Jewish student was admitted to the medical school at the university this year and that only a handful of Jews were allowed to matriculate in other departments.

DAWA Will Give Full Week To Its National Convention

CHICAGO, Oct. 7.—The national convention of DAWA, anti-Jewish boycott organization, originally scheduled to be held at the Stevens Hotel here from October 21 to 23, has been extended to cover a full week. The new convention dates are October 20 to 25.

Zahne Emerges As Nazis' Chief At German Day

Madison Square Garden Looks Like Germany for One Night

With Hitlerism and anti-Semitism as their dual spearhead, speakers at the German Day celebration fomented an audience of 18,000 into a seething frenzy of hysteria in Madison Square Garden Saturday night.

Two important developments characterized the swastika-bedecked rally, which culminated many weeks of effort on the part of Greater New York's Nazi element to present at least the semblance of a united German-American front in this area.

First was the emergence into the public eye of Louis Zahne, chairman of the German-American Independent Voters League and directing genius of the Friends of New Germany, as the dominating figure in America's Nazidom.

Second was a clear indication of the future policies of the political committee of the German-American Conference, a group whose avowed purpose will be to order its adherents how to vote and at whose helm Zahne will hold sway as dictator.

Addressing the rally in German, the suave, American-born Zahne made little effort to veil his intention to wage war on all men in public life who are Jewish in faith or origin.

Former Mayor John F. Hylan, an independent candidate for the governorship of New York State, will be among the committee's first endorsees, Zahne indicated.

As for the other candidates, he said, it is strange they are "all of the same type."

Austrian Ghetto Law Pleases Orthodox Group, Paper Claims

Hitler Ponders Admitting Jews Into Next War

His Cabinet Clashes on Issue and Puts It Up to Adolf

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
SAARBRUECKEN, Saar, Oct. 7.—Following a sharp disagreement in the Nazi cabinet over the admission of Jews into the German army during the next war, the entire problem was placed in the hands of Reichsfuehrer Adolf Hitler for a final decision, it was reported here yesterday.

General Werner von Blomberg, Nazi Minister of War and head of the Reichswehr, the regular German army, raised the question at a cabinet meeting. The Reichswehr head pointed out that German Jewry could contribute at least 50,000 soldiers in the next war. He also called attention to the record of Jews during the World War, declaring they had made excellent soldiers and had lost 12,000 men in the war.

Stuermer Is Emulated By New Austrian Paper

VIENNA, Oct. 7.—The first anti-Semitic paper since suppression of the legal Nazi movement in Austria appeared yesterday. It is called Arische Rundschau and is a replica of Julius Streicher's anti-Semitic weekly, Der Stuermer, which is under a ban in Austria.

A. J. C. Body Names Date For Election

Selects April 28, 1935, as Day for Holding National Polls

At a stormy session marked by frequent clashes on the floor, the national executive committee of the American Jewish Congress, meeting yesterday afternoon at the Hotel Commodore, endorsed the stand of the American delegation at the Geneva conference, affirmed the decision taken there to hold a World Jewish Congress in Geneva in 1935, and held out an olive branch to the American Jewish Committee.

The congress executive committee also decided to launch a campaign for the organization of national democratic elections throughout the United States on April 28, 1935, for an enlarged American Jewish Congress and delegates to the World Jewish Congress.

Appealing to the American Jewish Committee and the B'nai B'rith to join in dealing with the crisis in world Jewish affairs, Bernard S. Deutsch, president of the Congress, made a sharp attack on Morris D. Waldman, secretary of the American Jewish Committee, for having issued a statement repudiating the world conference in Geneva.

Condemn Nazi Politics

At the same time, the executive committee adopted resolutions approving the report of the American delegation at Geneva, called for a mass Jewish enrollment in the American Jewish Congress, and strongly condemned the attempt being made by Nazis to inject the racial issue into American politics. The resolution, which specifically named the political committee of the German-American Conference, calling on American public opinion forcefully to repudiate the Nazis, but opposing attempts to suppress the movement by governmental action, was referred to the administration for "editing and action."

Formal ratification of the plans for democratic elections in the United States followed presentation of reports on the Geneva conference by Dr. Stephen S. Wise, honorary president of the Congress; Professor Horace M. Kalen and David Wertheim. Dr. Samuel Margoshes, vice-president of the Congress described the rise of anti-Semitism in the United States and the grave situation created by the anti-Semitic movement for American Jewry.

Latvians Ask for Right To Rebuild Youth Group

RIGA, Oct. 7.—Latvian Jewish leaders yesterday petitioned the government to permit creation of a new organization for training Jewish youth for work in Palestine under the name "Hechalutz Olim." The old Hechalutz organization was recently suppressed by the Latvian authorities.

1,000 Hear Labor Leaders Pay Tribute to Morris Hillquit

Prominent Socialist and labor leaders eulogized Morris Hillquit, Socialist leader who died last October, at a memorial meeting in Town Hall yesterday afternoon. About 1,000 persons were present.

Among the speakers were: Abraham Cahan, editor of the Jewish Daily Forward; Julius Hochman, vice-president of the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union; Sol Polakoff of the United Hebrew Trades; Harry W. Laidler, president of the League for Industrial Democracy; former Municipal Court Justice Jacob Panken; and Lena Morrow Lewis, California Socialist leader. Algernon Lee, president of the Rand School, presided.

A bronze bust of Hillquit by Sergei Konikov, the gift of "300 anonymous admirers" to the Rand School, was unveiled.

Was "Brain of Party"

Mr. Cahan described Hillquit as a man "who brought order out of chaos, the brain of the Socialist party for many years."

"The contribution of Morris Hillquit to the trade union movement and especially to immigrant workers is not fully appreciated," said Mr. Hochman, who characterized him as "the leader of the leaders of our unions."

Mr. Polakoff voiced the pledge of the United Hebrew Trades to "carry on his ideals until Socialism has freed the world forever."

"The generations that will follow," said Mr. Panken, "will constantly draw upon the heritage he has left. The physical lips that were his are sealed in eternity; his thoughts, his ideas thunder down the ages."

"His life was heroic. A poor immigrant boy, chained by economic forces to the shop, he rose to be a leader in our country."

S. D. Silverman Fatally Injured

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Oct. 7.—Simon D. Silverman, 62, associate cantor of the Agudath Achim Congregation which he had served for twenty-three years, was struck by an automobile and injured fatally last night.

A native of Slonen, Russia, he had served congregations in Canada, Newburgh and Utica, N. Y., Meriden, Conn., Trenton, N. J., and Boston, Mass.

Among the survivors are a daughter, Mrs. Herman Halperin, wife of a Pittsburgh rabbi; a son, Rabbi Morris Silverman of Hartford, Conn., and two brothers, Rabbi Jacob Silverman of Detroit, and Samuel Silverman of Rochester, N. Y.

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Sees Battle to Death In Reich Church Fight

CHICAGO, Oct. 7. — "The present open conflict between Hitler's Reichsbishop and the religious opposition in both Catholic and Protestant circles is a battle to the death," the Rev. Theodore C. Hume, pastor of the New England Congregation and one of Chicago's outstanding Protestant clergymen, declared. He has just returned from Germany, where as a member of a group of observers piloted by Sherwood Eddy he studied the German religious conflict.

"In the end this conflict may be the downfall of Hitler," he declared.

Dedicate New Hospital Wing In Brooklyn

McGoldrick Speaks at
Opening of Blumberg
Pavilion

Comptroller Joseph P. McGoldrick, representing Mayor LaGuardia, was the principal speaker at the dedication exercises yesterday afternoon of the new Max Blumberg Pavilion, six-story addition to the Jewish Sanitarium for Incurables, East Forty-ninth street and Rutland road, Brooklyn.

Recalling the promise made to Peter Stuyvesant by the original Jewish settlers of New York that the Jews would always care for their own, Mr. McGoldrick said:

"That promise has been fulfilled and the dedication of this institution is another example of it."

With the new building added to the old four-story building, the institution will be able to care for 525 patients when it is completely equipped. About 2,500 persons attended the dedicatory exercise. Max Blumberg, president of the hospital, presided. His son, State Senator George Blumberg, introduced Mr. McGoldrick. Lawton Brown, representing Borough President Raymond V. Ingersoll, attended the ceremonies. A telegram was received from Governor Herbert H. Lehman.

To Serve as Judge In Good Will Court

Germans, Without Swastika, Quit Ranks of Marchers In Parade of Nations

BALTIMORE, Oct. 7. — A conflict over the use of the swastika emblem resulted in the withdrawal of the German delegation which had planned to march during the Parade of Nations at the Tercentenary Pageant at the Baltimore Stadium. Originally scheduled to open Friday night, the pageant was postponed owing to rain.

The German delegation of five men and five women was withdrawn by Acting Consul Frederick P. Schneider after Dr. Matthew Page Andrews, chairman of the Maryland Tercentenary Commission of Baltimore had requested the swastika not be displayed.

LONDON—A world conference of Jews to discuss the German-Jewish situation was called for October 29 in London to meet in the building of the Jewish Board of Deputies.

CHICAGO—The American Legion, meeting in Chicago, passed a resolution condemning Nazi propaganda activities in the United States.

WASHINGTON—Three resolutions urging the American Federation of Labor to join in the anti-Nazi boycott were presented to the resolutions committee. Meanwhile the Federation heard James Rowan, one of the two delegates representing British labor, delivered a scathing attack on Germany's persecution of Jews and labor.

Leader, Adolf Hitler" and also for the President of the United States.

The German Day celebration was a typical Nazi mass meeting, with swastikas, and "heils" for Hitler, and banners urging the Germans in America to awaken.

President Roosevelt praised the "contributions made by persons of German blood to the upbuilding of this country," but he referred to the past, not to the present; to those German-Americans who had fled from Germany and had become Americans, who participated in the upbuilding of America as Americans, not as Germans. Those splendid Americans of German origin would have had nothing in common with the bigoted despotism that is crushing and degrading the German people today.

There may come a time when

an American of German origin will occupy "the President's chair in the White House," but he will have to be a President of American ideals, and not of "German ideals."

The German Consul General's attempt to liken Hitler to Lincoln is both an insult to Americans and a libel on the German people who are now ruled by violence and who have been robbed of all their liberties under the Nazi regime.

The demand of the so-called German-Americans for political representation in American life as Germans will undoubtedly be resented by Americans. No other element in the United States has demanded political representation here on the basis of its allegiance to a foreign nation and its despotic rulers. Such representation is absolutely incompatible with American ideals and institutions.

German Jews Are Apprehensive Of New Outbreaks, Deuel Says

Meeting of Nazi Veterans, Streicher Influence, Renewed Incitement Stir Fear of Another 'Red Herring' Drive

Fear stalks in the home of Jews of Germany—fear that a new storm of terror is about to break over their heads.

Weymouth Hogue and Wallace R. Deuel, correspondents of The Chicago Tribune and Chicago Daily News, respectively, report this to their newspapers.

"The assembling of a large number of veteran Nazis in Dresden has aroused especially grave apprehensions among the Jews," Deuel's dispatch says.

"The meeting is officially described as a purely sentimental one arranged for several months ago but postponed by the death of President von Hindenburg. Jews, however, note the presence of Julius Streicher, most rabid Jew-baiter of the third Reich after Reichsfuehrer Hitler himself, and wonder what his presence may signify.

"Others scheduled to attend the meeting include Rudolf Hess, deputy leader of the Nazi party; Dr. Joseph Goebbels, minister of propaganda and people's enlightenment; Robert Ley, head of the Nazi labor organization; Victor Lutze, new chief of the storm troops; Baldur von Schirach of the Hitler Jugend (youth); Constantine Hierl, chief of the labor service, and Dr. Hans Frank, minister of justice.

Other Indications of New Terror

"Other indications also point to the possibility of a new reign of terror. One of these is the increase in the number and bitterness of references to Jews by Hitler and other party leaders in public speeches. Another is the favor which der fuehrer has recently shown to Streicher.

"Third is a series of new orders designed to ruin various categories of Jews economically—Jewish lawyers are the latest to suffer in this connection. Also the so-called 'Aryan clause' is being applied with more severity in several walks of life.

Economic Crisis Is Factor

"One of the general reasons for the rising tide of fear among the Jews is the steady deteriorating of the economic situation. As times get harder and harder, it is thought likely that public sentiment will become more and more exasperated and more ready to burst out in a new terror against the Jews—which der Fuehrer has recently as the cause of many of the country's troubles.

Even should no new outbursts of violence against the Jews develop, the steady, remorseless campaign to destroy them continues. Even in cases where the law leaves them relatively free, private revenge and unofficial terror exert merciless pressure. Incitements to persecution by leaders, from Hitler down, make this inevitable.

Smaller Towns Are Worst

"Persecution is worst of all in the smaller towns," Deuel reports. Jewish business men are bankrupted. They are attacked in the street. Their children are beaten by their playmates. Their women are insulted.

"An undetermined number have preferred suicide to a life which the Nazis have made virtually impossible for them, especially since even those who are able to leave the country usually find it impossible to take their savings with them.

"The threat of a new anti-Semitic campaign is part and parcel of the general activity within the party which has been going on ever since ten percent of the voters opposed Hitler in the last plebiscite. The Nazi leaders are convinced that they must do something about these and others who 'give theregion.'

goat laugh.' What they will do apparently has not yet been decided upon, but one of the most obvious things they may do is to take it out on 'the Jews.'"

Hogue, the Tribune's representative, tells of the boycott of Jewish shops in Nuremberg during the recent Nazi party congress there.

"Minister of the Interior Frick issued decrees forbidding Nazi interference with Jewish shops," Hogue cabled Luxembourg.

"He threatened dire punishments for those who violated the decrees. Yet Jewish shops were picketed and boycotted in Nuremberg and Frick did not take one single step to enforce his laws. Crowds applauded the pickets.

Mobs Threaten Customers

"Heavy-boned, big-fisted youths stood guard in the doorways of Jewish shops on Nuremberg's main street. I walked into several of these shops despite the threats of mobs. The pickets only said 'Jewish shop,' but the way they said it gave me gooseflesh. They glared and plunked down their feet encased in kneehigh boots with a thud.

"Packs of civilians, who evidently had been lying in ambush, gathered around as if by a prearranged signal and jabbered menacingly. In most places women were the ringleaders.

"In all my six ventures to enter Jewish shops I noticed that the people who ganged together to threaten me were well dressed. Before their fists came down upon me I said just one word—'foreigner'—and looked squarely, and I am afraid not respectfully, at the would-be assailants. They drew back. They had been ordered to avoid clashes with foreigners.

Shopkeeper Is Fearful

"As I stepped into one shop a tiny man of about sixty hurried forward from behind a door to which he seemed to have been clinging. He appeared to be trembling with fear. His little pointed mustache wobbled. Two emaciated women followed him. When they saw their lone, undeniably Nordic customer they bustled forward. "I spoke loudly to enable the gang outside to hear every word I said. The shopkeepers did likewise, lest later the mob accuse them of having made 'treasonable statements.'

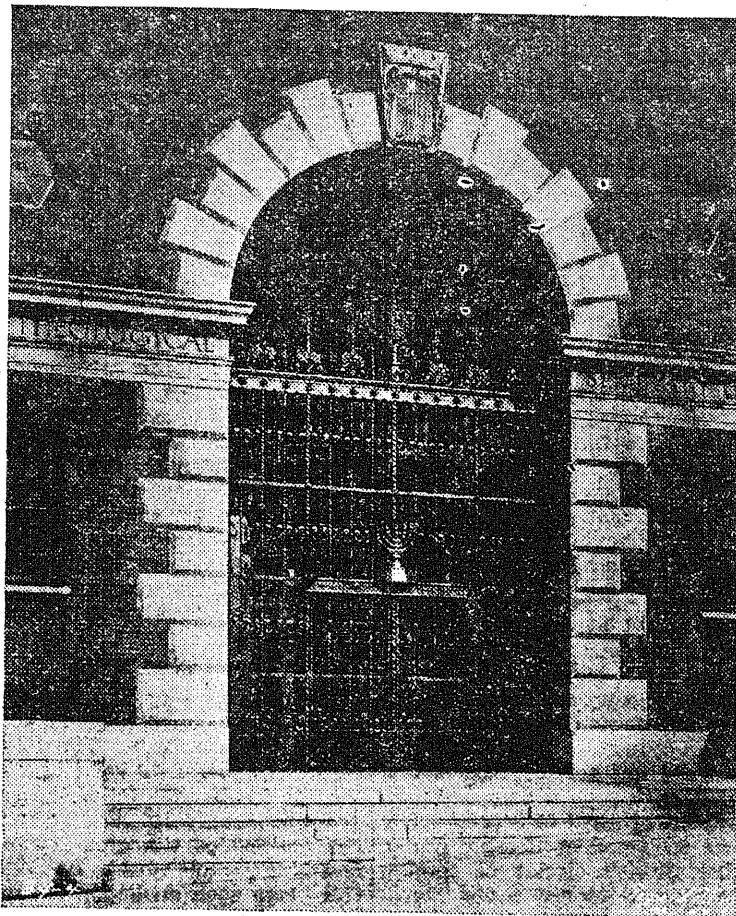
"Near by a Woolworth store, decked out in Nazi flags and garlands, was doing a thriving business despite occasional attempts of Nazi Storm Troopers to start raids. Small squads of these Nazis would rush in and 'pick on' some man. The manager would then step up and tell the Nazi ringleader how loyal his store was to the Nazi cause, that Woolworth was not boycotting German goods. The Nazis would then retreat after verbally assailing 'American boycott of German goods.'"

Revisionists Ask League To Protect Saar Jews

A cable requesting the League of Nations to demand written guarantees of safety for Jews of the Saar after the plebiscite has been sent to Geneva by the Zionist-Revisionist Organization of America, following a meeting of the Revisionists at the Hotel Pennsylvania.

Addressed to the Council of the League of Nations, the cable asks that all governments "in whose hands the administration of the Saar may be placed after the impending plebiscite" be required to give written guarantees "that each of them will fully protect the rights of the Jews residing in the

Austria Pushes Silent, Efficient Campaign to Destroy Jewry

Catholic-Fascist Regime's Anti-Semitic Drive, Minus Bluster and Threats, Seen as More Effective Than That of Nazi Germany

By MORRIS WOOD

(J.T.A. Staff Correspondent)

VIENNA, Sept. 27.—When the Catholic-Fascist political course took power in Austria the Vienna Jewish parties lost their own political orientation. The February revolution and the great distance Austria moved away from a democratic constitution towards dictatorship hit the Jewish population like a sinister cloudburst.

None of the leading Jewish parties had a program, regarding the Jewish policies to be followed under the new distribution of power. Not one responsible Jewish political leader felt himself in a position to lead the way during the ensuing weeks or days. It was taken for granted that very bitter times were approaching for the Austrian Jews, if the Catholic-Fascist government front intended to push through only a small part of its anti-Semitic program which had been propounded for several years in the press and at mass-meetings.

Trusted Catholics

In the meantime the Jews depended upon the statements made by several cabinet members, that, firstly, Austria with its old Catholic culture was not the barbarian Nazi-Germany; secondly, that the new Fascist Austria was confronted with so many difficult and pressing problems and sorrows that there was no possibility for the government to busy itself also with the Jewish problem. Dazed and frightened, the Jewish parties let themselves drift down a sinister stormy stream, organizations were made to side with the government, to support it here and abroad, in order to prevent the Nazis from acquiring power.

Such are the explanations which have been given to me by competent Jewish circles about the attitude taken by the Jewish parties during that time. There was absolutely no choice of a different way. The country engulfed in open and secret civil war, hundreds of arrests daily—including many Jews—for the slightest connections with the Social-Democratic party or their communal institutions. The Nazis threw bombs and destroyed all safety and all possibilities of livelihood in Austria; they intended to gain power within the government by a widespread campaign of terrorism. They gained in power and number, being replenished nicely by the defeated, and forbidden socialistic parties.

On top of all this the Austrian Jews had their own internal dissensions. Suddenly a group of alleged Jews, whose names have never been revealed, attached themselves to certain cabinet members, intending to play the role of Austrian super-patriots, agreeing to all the government was doing and intended to do regarding the Austrian Jewish problem. The group, in a communiqué addressed to the government, demanded that all foreign Jews who came to Austria to watch the Jewish situation in order to publish reports in foreign papers, or to inform certain Jewish organizations, in America, England and France should be expelled or even be arrested at the frontier.

A very influential part of the government-front even had shown the intention to come to an agreement with a part of the orthodox Jews by which they would abandon emancipation of Jewry if the government would grant them legal leadership and the right to force Jews into a mediocre way of living.

gram would be executed speedily and this would be explained abroad by a pious Jewish group, which allegedly maintains Jewish and non-Jewish connections in foreign countries. But the government did not act, because it was afraid, with such a dangerous experiment at hand to depend solely upon so small a Jewish group. Other Jewish circles in foreign countries, moreover, made known to the government that such a policy would force the great majority of the Jewish world to an open campaign against Austria. Fortunately, one part of the orthodox Jews declined to participate in such a policy, as they felt that the government did not intend to do the Jews a favor but merely intended to introduce a special Austrian renewal of the mediaeval ghetto.

Third Revolt Near

This was the situation of the Jews during the whole Summer, when one bloody revolution was followed by another and a third is to be expected within a few months. The government itself prepares the nation for such eventualities, as it reckons with a new insurrection within a short time. Among the people it is quite openly said that the next will be the bloodiest civil war of all, because a majority of the police and even of the army will support the rising against the government or may even start it all by themselves.

X-Ray Experts Meet In Palestine Soon

Holy Land Expected to Lead Cancer Research; Refugees Will Participate

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

HAIFA, Sept. 17.—German-Jewish scientists now living in Palestine will take part in a Roentgenograph convention to be held here shortly. Theories of X-ray and radium treatment of cancer as well as diagnosis of abdominal diseases will occupy the attention of the delegates.

Palestine is expected to take the forefront in cancer research and treatment of diseases by X-ray and radium, as a result of the presence here of distinguished researchers, such as Professor Ludwig Halberstaedter, formerly of Berlin and now attached to the Hadassah Hospital in Palestine.

Halberstaedter is counted among the first handful of men in the world who have advanced research into cancer cure.

There is now about half a gram of radium in this country, and it is expected that further gifts will bring the quantity up to about a gram.

ity of Vienna not to take away the livelihood from the Jews. The leaders of the Vienna Jewish community are doing everything in order to save the last stand the Jews are occupying in Austria's commercial and industrial life. But all interventions and all bitter efforts have failed to avail.

Sometimes the government makes some trifling promise, or it puts on a pious face as if it were totally ignorant of this economic, social and political distinction of the whole Jewish population of Austria.

Everything is done quietly; none of the cabinet-members makes any inciting anti-Semitic speeches for foreign countries, official communications are issued, filled with phrases upholding fairness and equality of rights. Only a few annoying "ifs and buts" smacking of the old Austrian and Roman-Catholic diplomacy are inserted, and in all quietness the course of eliminating Jews from all professions in the country is steadily followed.

Worse Than Reich

The situation of the Austrian Jews is much more difficult than of the German Jews. The whole world has raised its voice against the maltreatment of the German Jews, because it fits very well into the policies of the great powers and of the whole world. But Austria plays such an important role in the international chess-game that the same powers easily close their eyes and ears, as long as Austria executes its anti-Semitic policy quietly, without proclamations by cabinet-members in Austria and without excited Jewish protest actions abroad.

Now, suddenly the mask has been taken off. When the government saw that everything it so far had done against the Jews had worked out well, and after the Chancellor Schuschnigg left Geneva, flattered by all members of the League of Nations and having had a "friendly" interview with the presidents of the international Jewish organizations it was decided to strike a collective and deciding blow against Austrian Jewry. Hitherto, individual Austrian Jews had been hit, but now all Jewish children have been flung into a school-ghetto by decree.

Now the world abroad must open its eyes, for this cannot be kept secret or be explained away. A public casting-back into the ghetto had not taken place even in Germany.

Now All Seek Aid

Now all Austrian Jews are crying for help. They see already quite distinctly the road the government is following regarding the Jewish question. All Jewish pupils feel deeply hurt. Children attending primary schools and students of middle schools and colleges are coming home with head lowered low. All Jewish pupils have been placed back into the mediaeval "Jew school." In order to aggravate the insult, baptized Jewish children and agnostic Jews have been placed in the same classes.

Austria acts more radically than Germany. It has invented a ghetto combined with the Aryan paragraph. If only Jewish teachers and professors had been installed in these new ghetto-schools! But no, not this. Christian teachers with Christian educational material will retain their functions as supervisors and pedagogues in the Jewish ghetto-school!

Soon a semi-official explanation was forthcoming: The organ of Dr. Schuschnigg's storm-detachments (Sturmscharen) published an official article entitled "Better Anti-Semitism." This article states clearly: "We Austrians do it better and more efficiently than the Nazis in Germany. They talk and flatter themselves, but we do the real work. We do not mean all Jews. The several thousands of pious, religious Jews will enjoy our religious protection. The others, the assimilated Jews, the impious and non-orthodox Jews will

Palestine Town Will Be Raised To 'City' Status

Petach-Tikvah, 'Mother of Colonies,' Has Population of 16,000

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

PETAH-TIKVAH, PALESTINE, Sept. 17.—The colony council of Petah-Tikvah, founded in 1878 and known as "the mother of the Colonies," is to be turned into a municipality. There are now some 16,000 inhabitants in this colony, and the total area of its orange-groves and plantations is about 45,000 dunams (roughly 11,000 acres).

This decision was communicated to the Petah-Tikvah Colony Council by the District Commissioner for Southern Palestine, and formed the subject of a discussion at a meeting of the Council this evening. The members adopted a resolution stating that "prior to deciding upon a transition to municipal status, we specifically declare that our decision in this matter cannot be interpreted as contrary to the resolution of the Elected Assembly of Palestine Jewry that the Jewish community in entirety opposes the creation of a Legislative Council in Palestine, and we once more affirm our solidarity with that resolution."

The question of Petah-Tikvah's change from local to civic status has long been under consideration, and its merits have been pressed upon the Government for a considerable time. It has always pointed out as anomalous that Petah-Tikvah, with a large and growing population, should continue to be relegated to local council status with limited powers, at a time when such towns as Khan Yunis or Mejdal or Beit Jallah, in reality large Arab villages, and others with but half the population, planted and settled area, and civic interests, should be municipalities having their own mayors. The authorities have now realized the justice of the demand.

Palestine Government To Supervise Cities

JERUSALEM, Sept. 27.—Supervision over the municipalities of Palestine will be established by the government, the Jewish Telegraph Agency learned here today, when a Briton will be appointed as town clerk in Jerusalem who will be responsible for municipal control.

have to leave Austria with bag and baggage and go into a "national home" by means of international co-operation."

News Writers Assailed Anew By Ley's Paper

Der Deutsche Attacks Correspondents, Lauds Book

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

BERLIN, Sept. 24.—A new attack on the foreign correspondents in Germany as being the hirelings of the world wide Jewish press was made in today's Der Deutsche, organ of Dr. Robert Ley, head of the Labor Front.

This slur was made in connection with an announcement of a book just published by a Greek woman journalist, a Dr. Karaiskakis, in which she praises the Nazi regime, devoting two chapters to the Jewish question and justifying the Nazi tactics in regard to Jews.

It is interesting to note that this journalist is pointed out by Dr. Ley's paper as an example of reliable journalism against the horde of other correspondents who dare to take opposing views to Nazism.

Tsaldaris Made Denial

Only recently a categorical denial by Premier Tsaldaris of Greece of an interview he was alleged to have given the woman journalist in regard to the Greek attitude on Soviet entrance into the League had to be published.

Premier Tsaldaris declared that Dr. Karaiskakis not only distorted what he actually said but went so far as to invent essential parts of the interview.

Another anti-Semitic publication is announced in today's Der Angriff, that of "Signale der Neuen Zeit" by Dr. Paul Joseph Goebbels. A paragraph in the announcement, headed "Jewish Insolence," cites quotations in Dr. Goebbels's book, taken from the works of Gumbel, Theodor Lessing, Ernst Toller and Arnold Zweig, to illustrate so-called insolent remarks made by these literary personages with regard to German culture.

"Therefore," Dr. Goebbels adds, "it is no wonder that the German revolution had to free itself of this spiritual yoke."

The reinforced anti-Jewish propaganda which manifests itself through announcements of books, such as these, proves that the Jewish question has not been relegated into the background by the economic problems facing the Reich.

This is also to be seen from the continuance of racial exhibitions in many towns of the Reich, where the "inferiority of the Jewish race" is emphasized in various ways and means. A new exhibition of this type was opened today in the Citadel in Mainz, which is scheduled to last until January.

Labor Training Camps Report on Membership

TEL AVIV, Sept. 17.—At a meeting of the secretariat of forty-three members of the Kibbutz Meuchad (United Group), or training camps of the Labor Party in Palestine, held at Naz'neh, it was stated that the total membership is now 3,400 men and women, of whom 600 are hired laborers (400 or 60 per cent. paid agricultural hands and 200 in urban building activity). Organization matters and the question of fusion with another group were discussed at the rally, as well as the need for augmented immigration and land expansion.

Prof. Perelman Has Devoted 35 Years to Study

Russian Scientist Has Written Over 30 Popular Books

Leningrad, Sept. 22.—Completion of thirty-five years of scientific activity by Professor Jakob Perelman, professor of physics and mathematics at the University of Leningrad, was celebrated by the scientific world today.

Professor Perelman is the author of more than thirty popular scientific works which have reached a two million circulation mark. A hundred thousand copies of his physics and mathematics textbooks also have been distributed. His volume entitled "A Trip in the Inter-Planetary Realm" has been described by Ziolkovski, Russian scholar, and other European writers as one of the best examples of popular scientific literature.

In 1899, when he was still a student at the Gdodno gymnasium, Perelman began his scientific career with the publication in a local newspaper of an article entitled "Rain of Fire." The article made sport of the popular fear that the end of the world would come with a stellar shower due that year.

Holy Day Closing Gets Nazis Upset

Wax Wroth When Jew-Purged Cattle Market Doesn't Open Yom Kippur

DORTMUND, Sept. 25.—The Nazi paper "Westfaelische Landeszeitung" is first indignant about the cattle market opening having been postponed for one day, owing to Yom Kippur. The paper states that it asked the director of the municipal slaughter-house for information regarding this postponement and was told that next year a change would take place. The present calendar for cattle markets was compiled two years ago, but the new one will not take the Jewish holidays into consideration, the paper also told.

The same paper which succeeded in forcing Jewish department store advertising from Dortmund cinema screens, continues its campaign against these stores. Now it reprints part of the formerly leading Catholic paper Tremonia, featuring an advertisement by the firm Gebr. Kaufmann A. G. Dortmund. The paper attacks personally the publisher of the Tremonia, who today is still a member of the Dortmund Municipal Council, for accepting an advertisement from Jewish business houses.

In another issue the same paper maintains that, if those who still buy in Jewish stores were to show the necessary judgment, the Jewish problem in Germany would be solved very soon.

Old H. W. went to a football game the other day. It was raining — pitchforks, you might say, with a couple of cats and dogs tossed in for good measure. But your Day Booker wasn't the only lunatic in the stadium watching the footballers frolic in the mud. There were some 30,000 other weak-minded mortals absorbing the worst punishment that Jude Pluvius could hand out. And most of them had paid for the privilege of sitting out in the rain to watch twenty-two brawny young brutes juggle a pigskin.

Lest the reader imagine that this is the beginning of a sports column and that he has by some deplorable accident found himself mired in Morris Weiner's bailiwick over on page seven, I hasten to set his fears at rest. The football game at which I courted pneumonia was something more than just a football game.

This football game was the beginning of a stupendous idea that involves the welfare of nothing less than world Jewry.

Recently, Bill Ziff loaded his machine gun, trained its sights on the pages of the Jewish Daily Bulletin and peppered the columns with a stinging barrage of words. The design those words traced across our pages read like a call to arms. About face! Jewry, those word-bullets spelled out. Stop belly-aching, stop squawking, stop breast-beating. Stop wailing and start fighting. Aux armes, citoyens!

Ziff's call was for action. But the call was unaccompanied by a specific plan. And just think what a gorgeous spectacle it would be for the huge crowd that had paid anywhere from \$1.10 to \$4.40 (including tax) to see the game, if they could see old number 77 (Stevy's number) having such sterling interference on the touchdown run as quarterback Barney Deutsch, half-back Morris Rothenberg and half-back Morris Margulies could provide.

The question I asked myself was merely rhetorical. It needed no response. The answer was obvious. The thing would be a sensation.

There are many Jewish organizations. Many commentators on Jewish affairs, probably including Bill Ziff, think there are too many. There is, as a result, considerable dissension among Jews who, when faced with an obviously common problem, waste time in useless argument among themselves on, first, whether there is a problem at all and, second, if there is one, what the best method is of solving it. And while they are coming to blows about it, the enemy sneaks up from the rear and annihilates the whole kaboodle of them.

Now, H. W. isn't one of those guys who believes in regimenting opinion. Difference of opinion, like love, is what makes the world go round. Sometimes, like love again, it makes the world reel.

around in the manner of a drunk. Nevertheless, H. W. doesn't want one uniform sentiment, or one sentiment dressed up in uniform, or even one army. What he does want is that this difference of opinion be dramatized. He wants these differences of opinion to dress up like football teams.

There are many Jewish organizations. Let each organize a football team. Let them do what the colleges do if necessary. Go out and buy up a good coach and let the coach go out and buy up the best football players available. Dress the eleven men appropriately, teach them tricky shifts, spinners, triple reverses, a dazzling forward passing attack. Let each Jewish organization start a band, a cheering squad. Then let them organize a Jewish Organizations Football Conference patterned after the Western football conferences. Schedules can then be arranged. On one Saturday the American Jewish Congress eleven will meet the eleven representing the American Jewish Committee. On another, the World Zionist Organization will meet the World Revisionist-Zionist Organization. The Mizrahi can tangle with the Agudath Israel. And so on ad infinitum.

Each game will be played to settle some specific argument. The American Jewish Congress can argue the necessity for a World Jewish Congress with the American Jewish Committee. Or they can battle it out on the gridiron with the boycott as the bone of contention.

People are tired of debates. But give them slashing, dazzling football games and they'll turn out by the thousands, pay their money, cheer and make hoopla even in the rain.

Think how the money will roll in. The football conference will be able in a very short time to usurp the place of all the Jewish money collecting agencies. There will be more than enough in a jiffy to take care of the Reich refugees, the German-bound victims of the Nazi terror; enough to buy up all Palestine and settle millions of Jews in a national home there; plenty left over for our charities right here.

Personally, I'd pick the American Jewish Congress football squad as the winners of the Conference title. That is, if they had their redoubtable Four Horsemen in every game: quarterback Barney Deutsch, fullback Stevey Wise, left half-back Morris Rothenberg, right half-back Morris Margulies.

And wouldn't Samuel Untermyer make a swell Judge Landis for the Conference?

Yes, sir, boys, let's take the men off the dusty debating platforms, put them in football uniforms and plunk them down on a gridiron to fight it out for the salvation of world Jewry.

PREACHED IN CITY PULPITS

Permanent Horizon of Ideals

RABBI LOUIS I. NEWMAN, Temple Rodeph Shalom, 7 West 83rd street:

The quest for a "permanent horizon" of moral idealism is worthy of modern men and women in their new endeavor to gain adjustment. We are eager for an "ultimate reality" to answer the moral disquietude and "malaise" of our times, and we must welcome the works of writers like Ludwig Lewisohn who are seeking to give us a glimpse of the "unchanging shore of human thought." It is important that we appreciate the contribution of the bourgeoisie when it is liberal, tolerant, and cultivated; that we understand aright the fundamental quality of human nature whatever the environment playing upon it; that we encourage the pilgrimage towards religion which is now engaging the attention of multitudes. Ludwig Lewisohn is seeking to give literary expression to the learnings of this age for the old truths newly interpreted, and he is succeeding in portraying the world of the classical and permanent values upon which we must rebuild our shattered life.

The emphasis upon solidarity in marriage, excluding all other love objects, and the statement that love at its highest draws with it the deepest emotions of man and woman can help substantially in giving to young people an appreciation of the worth-whileness of traditional marriage principles. Ludwig Lewisohn has exposed the fallacies inherent in the half-truths uttered by Bertrand Russell and his followers, and has given new dignity and security to the marriage ideal. He has also displayed the workings of the dynamic soul of modern man, as a choosing, religious person, and thereby he has reaffirmed the triumph of humanity over the legalistic, mechanistic and naturalistic views which have sought to describe man either as a creature of laws, a machine, or an animal. It is now time for man to recover not only his moral dignity, but his power of reconstruction and achievement as a man.

Harvard's Liberal Spirit

RABBI ISRAEL GOLDSTEIN, Temple B'nai Jeshurun, 257 West 88th street: Harvard University, in refusing Hanfstaengl's gift, has performed a service of the first magnitude to the causes of the humanities. It has struck a blow in behalf of intellectual freedom which redounds to the credit not alone of Harvard, but of all American universities. It strengthens the respect of all Americans for their institutions of learning.

Hitler's Third Reich has desecrated and befouled the highest values of the human spirit. It has banned intellectual freedom, it has made a mockery of human brotherhood, it has exalted the sword, and it has cancelled the gains of a generation in the sphere of woman's rights.

From such a government or any of its champions no civilized institution can afford to accept a gift.

Harvard has acted in accord with its best traditions.

Making the Best of This World RABBI WILLIAM F. ROSENBLUM, Temple Israel, 210 West 91st street: There have been no startling pronouncements during the past year as to the manner in which the world came into being or how the world is destined to end. The theory of the earth as an explosive offshoot from the sun's surface was forecast by Pythagoras and enlarged upon by Kant and Laplace before it became part of current scientific speculation. The recent utterance of Professor Millikan with regard to the concomitant processes of annihilation and generation of matter which he sees as a result of more recent studies of the cos-

mic ray, has been anticipated by an eighteenth century rabbi who looked upon creation as diurnally recurrent. There was "bereshith," beginning every day, he contended, and without the evercontinuing creativeness of nature life and the world could not go on. However, this passion of man for an answer to two questions which it seems impossible to answer with any degree of scientific definiteness—exactly when and how the world began and just when and how the universe will suffer dissolution—should not blind him to the necessity of making his present world one in which it is satisfactory to live. The aim of the intelligent man should be to keep the world good. The Creator looked out upon the universe he had fashioned for mankind and beheld it was good. And man, made in his image, especially the Jew who proclaims himself the shotef or partner of God in the conduct of the universe, should learn to practice those virtues of peace, of love, of justice, of modesty and piety; as well as those habits of health and cleanliness which will make life happier for him and better for his neighbors. Such a program of living is not hard for the average person to put into effect and whether the universe is 5695 years old or 100,000,000 million years old; whether it is to run down like a clock, as some scientists would have us believe, or be an ever active universe in which annihilation will be accompanied by concomitant regeneration—all this will be comparatively immaterial. The Book of Deuteronomy has long since laid down a principle that mankind should take to heart. The hidden things belong to God. There are certain limits beyond which man can neither explain the past nor look beyond the immediate future. He can be happy if he is not over curious.

Cultivating Spiritual Values

It is unfortunate indeed when parents overcome by an anxious desire for the material success of their children seek only the aesthetic developments of their offspring. Fighting His Greatest Battle

In more than a dozen years in the ring Joe Tiplitz, of Williamsburgh, never has come out of his corner at the gong to meet a more formidable opponent than the one he now faces.

He is fighting a losing battle.

Left hooks and right crosses are no good to him in this fight. The winner will be blindness—or Joe. And, Joe is fighting harder than he ever did in the ring to keep from going blind.

Joe's eyes started to go bad several months ago. Injuries to his head received when he lost his balance and fell on the road-bed of the subway made his condition worse.

The only chance he has for a draw with inevitable blindness is an operation. And, although Joe's eyes are failing him his friends have stuck with him. They staged a benefit dinner for him last week. The entire proceeds will be used to pay for an operation.

For several years Joe was a newsboy at Williamsburgh Bridge Plaza in Brooklyn. In those days right was might in the newsboy business. In order to protect his interests, Joe had to do his convincing with his fists and he got in plenty of practice.

His ability in the manly art of self defense attracted the attention of sporting men who induced him to enter the ring as a professional.

Joe's fighting career was a success from the outset. He began his ring career as a bantamweight, but ended it as a welterweight. In the years he fought in the ring he traded punches with Richie Mitchell, Lou Tendler, Johnny and Joe Dundee. The much touted K. O. Chaney came to town and Tiplitz knocked him out with dispatch. He also kayoed Happy Mahoney and several other promising welterweights.

Today Joe Tiplitz is waging a fight with the odds greater than any battle he ever had.

All-America Court Star New City Coach

Moe Spahn, the Jewish lad from Astoria who made every all-American basketball quintet chosen by the experts in 1932, has been appointed assistant basketball coach at City College.

Spahn was captain of the Lavender team in 1932-'33 and was a brilliant player there for three years. He began his basketball career in Bryant High School where he was an all-scholastic guard and led his team to a city championship. He entered City as a freshman in 1929 and was the outstanding member of the jayvee team. In the middle of the season he was promoted to the varsity and immediately won a starting berth. 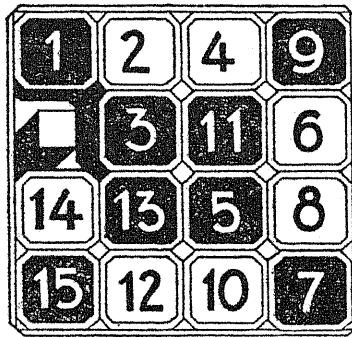
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Rabbi to Deliver Lecture At Methodist Church

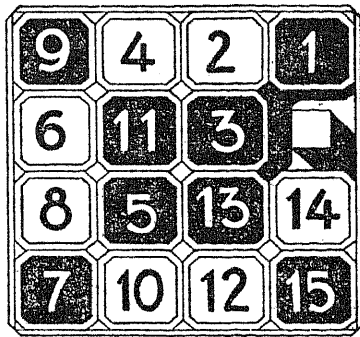

Those 'Bad' Jews! They've Got Poor Mr. Pelley Upset Again

The latest issue of The Silver-shirt Weekly of which William Dudley Pelley is editor-in-chief, charges that in the United States there exists "an ugly preponderance" of "bad" Jews.

They are described as "strictly materialistic-minded Hebrews who want to see Israel come back into a position of world domination, not so much because they love their own blood or religion as because they aspire to the power that will accrue to them under such arrangements personally."

The Silver-shirts, another article in the same issue says, "are the only organization in the United States—or for that matter, in the world—whose true leaders cannot be bought, controlled or subverted by Judan strategies in any form, whose members are trenchantly awakened to the true aims and purposes of Jewry and who refuse to be hoodwinked."

A letter from a Ralph Bowerman praises Pelley, who is chief of the Silver-shirts, as having been directly responsible for what is called "the rise of anti-Jewish-control sentiment."

The leading article, headed "Does the Jew Face Disaster?" reads in part as follows:

"These are the days when the Jews among us are beginning to fear for themselves with a fear that is gigantic."

"This fear ever seeks for expression in self-assurances about security. A people who do not fear for themselves are unmindful about security. They do not think about it the clock around."

Under the heading "What You Must Know About the Emptiness of Israel," the Silver-shirt Weekly declares:

"The people whom some exorcise as Jews today are of course not quite so terrible as their enemies would like to think, neither are they responsible for all the woes of society; that is a vicious, unbalanced view for anyone to take, and a view that can only lead to worse confusions within our own spirits of Christhood."

"What we must learn is this: The Jews have this in common with us as mortals, and with every other mortal, that they do worship an ideal."

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Set World Radio Broadcast For Zionist Parley

Magnes Will Speak From Jerusalem to Women at Washington

(Special to the J.D.B.)

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7.—An international radio hookup of the National Broadcasting Company to link Jerusalem with this city and all parts of the United States will be a feature of the twentieth annual convention of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, to be held at the Wardman Park Hotel here from Oct. 14 to 16. The radio program, which is scheduled for 9:30 o'clock in the morning of the final day of the meeting, will relay ceremonies in connection with the cornerstone laying of Palestine's first medical center on Mt. Scopus in Jerusalem. Mrs. Alexander Lampport, chairman of the convention committee, has announced that Miss Henriette.

Dr. Judah L. Magnes, chancellor of the Hebrew University, and J. Hathorn Hall, chief secretary of the Palestine government, will take part in the overseas broadcast. Mr. Hall will represent Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchoppe, High Commissioner now in London. The coast-to-coast network of the National Broadcasting Company will carry the program throughout the United States.

Opens New Health Phase

Mrs. Lampport said that the cornerstone ceremonies in Jerusalem will inaugurate for the Hadassah organization a new phase in the medical and public health work which it has conducted in Palestine for twenty-two years. The medical center, which is being built by Hadassah and the American Jewish Physicians' Committee, will also include a graduate school of medicine to be connected with the Hebrew University. It will be the first institution of its kind in the Near East, Mrs. Lampport asserted, and will have on its hospital research and teaching staff outstanding German scientists who left Germany during the past year.

An audience of more than 1,500 delegates and visitors at the convention will hear the broadcast and celebrate the Jerusalem event at the same time that it is being celebrated in the Palestinian capital.

Another nationwide hookup of the National Broadcasting Company will take place from the convention hall on Oct. 14, the opening day of the convention, at 4:30 o'clock in the afternoon during a session to be devoted to a discussion of the plans for the new medical center. Has Revolutionary Plan

Goldstein Urges One Court for Family Clashes

Would Completely Alter Domestic Relations Machinery

A plea that family difficulties be ironed out in one all-embracing court rather than in the many unrelated courts, as is the present practice, was made last night by Judge Jonah J. Goldstein at Temple Emanu-El.

Discussing "The Family in Court," Judge Goldstein declared that the most practical method of effecting the needed change lies in changing the point of view with which family troubles are regarded.

"In short," he said, "courtrooms should be replaced by conference rooms; family problems should be diagnosed and treated on a clinical basis instead of, as at present, tried in and by a court."

"A family court does not need the traditional furnishings of the usual court room; these are really a detriment. Those who come there are not criminals; the customary legal procedure, its rules of evidence, its insistence on answers of 'yes' and 'no' have no place here. The principal object is adjustment of family disputes and the reconciliation, if possible, of husbands and wives who are often both partially at fault."

Percentage of Jews in Prison Is Small, J. F. Fishman Finds

Jewish prisoners are as a rule similar to all others confined in penal institutions and vary in few respects from those of other faiths, Joseph Fulling Fishman, American authority on prisons and penal methods, declared in an interview with the Jewish Daily Bulletin.

"In my twenty-six years in this field I have talked with many hundreds of Jewish prisoners," Mr. Fishman said. "I don't believe that they vary in many respects from other prisoners. Except in New York, few Jews are imprisoned for crimes of violence."

"During my first years in prison work, penitentiary officials, knowing that I was Jewish, would comment on the exceedingly small number of Jews among the prisoners. But in the last few years I have noticed that the number of Jewish prisoners appears to be on the increase. They are usually model prisoners and seldom are a disciplinary problem to officials."

"It is, however, amazing, how much lower the percentage of Jewish prisoners is as compared to prisoners professing other religions. Even according to population percentages, Jews still have fewer prisoners. This is true even in New York, where the Jewish population is so large."

England Forges Ahead

English and continental prison systems are far in advance of American methods, Mr. Fishman, who has just returned from a four-month inspection of European prisons, which took him to Italy, Belgium, France and Holland, said.

Mr. Fishman, who was Inspector of Prisons for the Federal government for eleven years, and Deputy Commissioner of Corrections in New York City for two and one-half years, went abroad to make a prison survey for the Guggenheim Foundation.

"While in this country we have kept abreast in prison methods as far as our large institutions are concerned, it must be remembered that we have in the United States 3,500 county jails, which are literally indescribable," Mr. Fishman said.

"In England, and particularly in Belgium, I found, however, that the smaller institutions, which are invariably criminal training schools for first offenders, have been closed down and attention concentrated on first offenders."

"The English system is exemplary. The personnel, both as to guards and wardens is much superior to ours. I don't think ours would even rate second. They have a fine method of choosing and training their guards, so that they have superior men as prison guards. The men have a sense of dignity and pride in their work."

Work Is Started On New Hospital

Broadway and 196th Street Building to Be Ready by Next May

With a view to having the structure ready by May 1, 1935, workmen have begun construction of the new Jewish Memorial Hospital, at Broadway and 196th street.

The hospital was ordered by Park Commissioner Moses to vacate its property in order that the city's plan for an extension of Riverside Drive and Inwood Hill Park may be carried out. An extension of time is expected to be granted, however.

The new hospital, including the land and equipment, will represent an investment of about \$1,250,000. Of this sum \$350,000 is being advanced in the form of a PWA loan.

which is sadly missing in our men.

"One thing this trip proved to me and that is that the argument frequently heard in the United States that it is impossible to find good men for guards and prison officials is nonsense. Good men can be obtained."

"I was very much impressed by the fine relations between prisoners and guards in the English prisons. There is no bullying by the guards and the prisoners respect prison officials. Over there assaults on guards are unheard of, while on Welfare Island alone I remember four such assaults in one week."

"There is no such thing as political pull in obtaining jobs as guards in England. The men are carefully chosen and have a sense of dignity in their work which impressed me highly. As a result they have a good influence on the prisoners and are able to help them in a way that would be impossible in the United States."

Mr. Fishman was also very warm in his praise of the Belgian penal system.

"About twenty-five years ago," he said, "a young Belgian psychiatrist became interested in prison problems. After fighting for reforms for fifteen years, he finally managed to institute a scientific system there. There prisoners are handled as individuals. A complete study is made of every prisoner immediately after his arrest with the object of rehabilitating them. A trained psychiatrist is attached to every prison."

French Silence Rule

"The French system," Mr. Fishman said, "cannot be compared to ours. Why, they still have the rule of silence there, prisoners being forbidden to talk with each other or with officials for the first two years. A French prison official took me into one of the large prisons and said proudly, 'see how quiet, not a sound.' He was actually proud of it. Even in chapel the prisoners sit in enclosed boxes so that they can see the chaplain and he can see the prisoners, but they cannot see each other. We dropped the rule of silence twenty-five years ago."

Italy, the prison authority declared, was "an armed camp" and a land of starvation, with every third man wearing a uniform and lifting his hand continuously in the Fascist salute. Despite the fact that Mr. Fishman carried letters of recommendation from Secretary of State Cordell Hull and other noted Americans, Italian officials hampered him in many ways and were by no means willing to let him see the working of the Italian penal system.

"About all I can say for the Italian prisons is that they were reasonably clean," he stated. They feed their prisoners only once a day, macaroni soup and black bread at noon and the next meal is twenty-four hours later. The menu is repeated for 365 days in the year."

"Has there been much progress in American methods of handling prisoners?" Mr. Fishman was asked.

"In the large institutions, yes," he answered, "but the county jails, where first offenders are trained in crime, are still horrible. There has been little or no progress in that direction. Cleaning up the large prisons is useless, for by the time a first offender gets to a penitentiary, he is already a finished criminal product."

Mr. Fishman declared that he expects to spend some time writing another book concerning prisons and one outside his field. He is the author of "Crucibles of Crime" and of the highly controversial "Sex In Prison," which appeared recently.

Farm School's Harvest Yields Hit New Peak

Temple University Head Addresses 37th Annual Fete

DOYLESTOWN, Pa., Oct. 7.—The thirty-seventh annual harvest festival at the National Farm School here was held today, with Dr. Charles E. Beury, president of Temple University of Philadelphia, as guest speaker.

Herbert D. Allman, president of the school, submitted his annual message and announced that the harvest yields from the 1,200-acre farm at the school have established a new record. He attributed this to the intensive work of faculty and students.

A feature of the exercises today was the award of certificates to a special class of handicapped students. These men, sponsored by state and federal governments, under a rehabilitation program for handicapped persons, have completed a one-year, specially arranged course in some of the lighter branches of the farm industry, designed to rehabilitate them for productive work. A second class is now enrolled.

Plot to Kidnap Rebbe Revealed in Warsaw

WARSAW, Sept. 25.—A plot to kidnap the rebbe of Ger in the hope of obtaining ransom money was revealed here in the course of a trial involving several prominent wrestlers.

Theodor Stecker, a wrestling instructor, was charged with having organized an attack upon a Jewish wrestling umpire named I. Tressler-Bransky. During testimony a third athlete named Miazio admitted that he had said it would be a "good idea" to kidnap the holy man of Ger. He declared, however, that he was only joking.

Although a number of witnesses were called, Stecker was freed on the ground of insufficient evidence.

Keep Jewish Heroes Out, Papers Warned

BERLIN, Sept. 27.—Newspapers of Hesse must not publish notices about dead Jewish heroes, according to an article which appeared today in the Kurhessische Landeszeitung in Kassel.

The paper reprimands certain German newspapers in the district for republishing a funeral notice of sixty years ago about Noah Gans, who distinguished himself during the Franco-German War. The funeral notice described the high military honors the Jewish hero received at his funeral.

Nazi party authorities are urged by the Landeszeitung to take adequate measures against the newspapers.
