### Communism and Pogroms

Former Ambassador James W. Gerard is quoted in the New York Times as having said in an address before the forum of a temple in East Orange, N. J., as follows: "As a friend of the Jewish people I want to state that if the American nation ever gets the idea that the Jewish race and communism are synonymous there is a possibility of a pogrom in the United States that will make those of the Tsar's era in Russia look like a small parade. The Jewish race is noted for its ability to build up culture and nations, and the members of the race have nothing in common with communism, which seeks to tear down culture and government."

Stating that his remarks were based on his personal observations of a Communist gathering at Union Square, where a large majority of the participants were Jews, he added:

"I believe it is the duty of the responsible Jews of the country to devise some means of keeping the people of the United States from obtaining the idea that the Jews and the Communists are the same people by discouraging members of the race from embracing communism."

Former Ambassador Gerard is a friend of the Jewish people. He has displayed his friendship on various occasions, and has combated all forms of bigotry in this country as well as in foreign lands. He attacked the Ku Klux Klan years ago when the organization was menacing American institutions. He has fought these anti-American destructive forces not for the sake of his friendship for the Jews but rather for the sake of the welfare of this country.

Mr. Gerard has an effective way of saying things that attracts much attention in the press. His latest utterance, warning the Jews of America with regard to Communism in this country and pointing to the possibility of a pogrom that would make the Tsarist pogroms look like a small parade, may be misconstrued.

First of all, the Communist movement in America, like the belated movement in Russia, could not under any circumstances be regarded as a Jewish movement. Just as Lenin and the leadership of Leninism were not regarded as Christians, so Trotsky and Kameney, of Jewish origin, could not be regarded as Jews. The movement in Russia was a Christian movement merely because the leadership of Lenin and Stalin and other non-Jewish Communist leaders. Much less could it truthfully be styled as Jewish. ## Soviet Gives Clergy Full Rights Again

### Decree Grants Better Status to Many Jews and Christians

MOSCOW, Oct. 9.—A Soviet decree, published today, restored the full civic rights to Jewish clergymen, cantors, sextons and individual artisans formerly deprived of all rights as enemies of the government. The rights of Christian clergymen were also restored.

By virtue of the decree, the declassified Jews will be able to obtain bread cards, vote in Soviet elections and will be enabled to send their children to high schools and universities.

Thousands of declassified Jews will be affected by the decree, which means an improved living standard and better conditions for them. In addition, the stigma of belonging to the "former people" will be removed and the doors to a higher education opened to the children of the declassified.

The decree is believed to mark the end of the harsh treatment accorded officials of religious groups in the Soviet Union. It indicates that the Soviet government now feels itself so firmly established that it can lenient with those not sympathetic to the regime.

Millions of Russians, disfranchised as enemies of the regime have, in recent months, been granted amnesty and had their citizenship rights restored.

Some 65,000 Russian Jews have in recent years been rehabilitated through the efforts of the People's ORT Federation. It was said here yesterday. Over 25,000 Jews are at present in cooperative agricultural colonies under ORT supervision while 40,000 have been absorbed into Soviet industry, after preliminary training in ORT workshops. The organization estimates that the number of declassified still left at approximately 75,000.

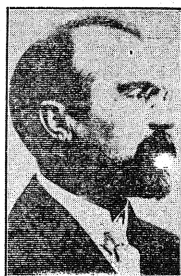

### Hitler Admits Boycott Hurts Nazi Germany

BERLIN, Oct. 9.—For the first time since the world-wide anti-German boycott began, Reichsfuehrer Adolf Hitler, in a speech delivered today in the Kroll Opera House, admitted publicly that Nazi Germany is suffering severely from the effects of the boycott.

In opening the campaign for winter relief, Hitler, admitting that Germany was facing a severe winter, bitterly attacked the "devilish Jewish international campaign, which is attempting, with the aid of international finance, to break

### Zahne, Other Hitlerites Back Ex-Mayor for Governor

Any possible share of doubt that Judge John F. Hyman will have the official support of the Nazi element in his campaign, on an independent ticket, for the governorship was dispelled yesterday when New York's foremost friends of Hitlerism gave public utterance to statements endorsing him.

Championed Minorities Cause

Particularly in the case of M. Barthou, Jewry has lost a champion of international influence and power. His fight in the interests of minorities carried out on the floor the League of Nations assembly brought him the admiration not only of the world's liberals, but of Jews the world over. His efforts in behalf of the minorities both of the Near East and Poland, where they were being endangered respectively by the imminence of German rule and repudiation of minority treaties, (Continued on Page Eight)

# Foes of Nazis Name Richards As Secretary

## Intermyer Men Pick Ex-Journalist for Post

Appointment of Bernard G. Richards as Executive Secretary of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League of which Samuel Untermyer is president was announced yesterday at the League offices, 729 Seventh avenue.

Richards is one of the founders of the American Jewish Congress and for sixteen years was its executive secretary. He also served as secretary of the American Jewish Delegation of the Versailles Peace Conference, which obtained minority rights for the Jews of many of the Eastern European nations. Judge Julian W. Mack was chairman of that committee.

"The necessity not only for pressing the boycott against Nazis but also for combating their propaganda in this country along non-sectarian lines," Richards declared in his first public statement as the League's secretary, "is once more demonstrated by the Nazi attack at the recent Madison Square Garden meeting on the gubernatorial candidates of the two parties in New York State, not because they believed them unfit for the high office but because they are Jews."

### Should Fight Bigotry

"It is not the purpose of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League to enter into or become involved in any political campaign, but the League feels duty-bound to point out that foreign bigotry and tyranny are being transplanted to this country by foreign propagandists and it feels that it is the duty of every American to fight such activities."

"The principles and the spirit of the Constitution are being violated by these breeders of racial hatred who are attempting to elect our public officials not according to their ability and integrity but according to religious belief."

Richards has had a long career as a journalist. He was associated with the Boston Post, the Boston Journal, the Boston Evening Transcript and the New York Globe, since merged with the Sun. At various times he has been associated with such writers as Mark Sullivan, Richard Washburn Child, Walter P. Eaton, John J. Leahy Jr., and Michael Williams, editor of the Commonwealth.

He was editor of the Chronicle, the Era Magazine, the Jewish World, and the Macabean, predecessor of the New Palestine. He has also lectured extensively on phases of Jewish life and is the author of "Discourses of Kabbalah," a book of humorous essays.

Long identified with the Zionist movement, Richards is a member of the administrative and executive committees of the Zionist Organization of America.

organization of America. He is also a member of the administrative committee of the American Jewish Congress and chairman of the Jewish Council of Greater New York, one of the first organizations to join the anti-Nazi boycott movement.

Richards gave up journalism in Boston thirty years ago to come to New York as secretary of the Jewish Community of New York City, with which Dr. Judah L. Magnes, the late Jacob H. Schiff, the late Louis Marshall, Cyrus L. Sulzberger, and Nathan Bijur were identified.

# Poultry Dealers Gird for Fight On Supervision

## Aim to Block Execution of Rosalsky's Decision

Poultry dealers were preparing yesterday for a fight to the finish to prevent execution of Judge Otto A. Rosalsky's decision establishing rabbinical supervision of poultry markets.

At a meeting late Monday night at the Great Central Palace, 90 Clinton street, rabbinical supervision was denounced as a "superstructure" and speakers protested that the levy of one cent per fowl which the settlement entails would victimize the Jewish public.

Among the speakers were: Jacob Schatz, Saul Obrentz, William Augenbaum and Nathan Gordon. The speakers urged the 100 poultry dealers present to combat the settlement.

Judge Rosalsky's settlement, handed down in mediation of a threatened shochet strike, places the Kashruth Association of Greater New York in control of rabbinical supervision, provides for tagging chickens to certify that they have been slaughtered according to the Jewish ritual, and provides a minimum wage and maximum production for slaughterers.

## \$5,000 for Federation Under Lorsch Will

Five thousand dollars is left to the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies under the terms of the will of Edwin S. Lorsch, who died October 4.

The will, dated last year, estimated that it is "formally estimated at more than \$10,000."

Ethel Kent of Essex House is bequeathed \$50,000 and the proceeds of insurance policies, a niece and nephew receive \$5,000 each and the residue goes to two brothers, Henry, of 115 East Fifty-sixth street, and Arthur, of the Sherry-Netherlands Hotel. The latter are named executors.

# Western Units Form All-Time Welfare Body

## Plains-States Conference Established on New Basis at Omaha

(Special to the J.D.B.) OMAHA, Oct. 9.—The Plains-States Regional Conference of Jewish Community Centers and Welfare Funds is now organized into a permanent body as a result of action taken here at sessions attended by 200 delegates.

Robert Lappen and Mrs. Max Mayer, both of Des Moines, were named chairman and secretary, respectively, of the conference. The conferences will meet annually convening again in October, 1935, at Des Moines.

Themes discussed at the Omaha conference included community organization and community leadership, Jewish welfare work, aims and objectives of Jewish education, and the opportunities of the Jewish centers, and the present crisis in Jewish life.

By resolution the conference continued its affiliation with the National Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds. Expressions of concern over the welfare of the nation here and abroad were extended that competent field service be made available to small communities, that Jewish education serve all elements of Jewish population and be included as part of the community program, and that private social agencies in family welfare and child care be continued.

Speakers at the conference included Dr. Philip L. Sman, executive director of the Jewish People's Institute of Chicago; George W. Rabbinowitz, executive director of the National Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds; Mrs. G. J. Gordon, of Minneapolis; Dr. Blanche J. Bonard, of St. Louis; Gilbert Harry and St. Louis and Ferdinand M. Isserman, Philip M. Klutnick and Jacob S. Pearlstein of Omaha were chairman and secretary of the session.

Jewish movement because of Trotsky, Kamenev and a few other Communist leaders of Jewish origin. The Jews among the Communists were as much opposed to Judaism as the non-Jews among the Communists were and are opposed to Christianity. They are combating religion in every form. Nevertheless, the Russian White Guards, monarchists and anti-Semites, endeavored to circulate all sort of false stories about the predominant role of Jews in the Russian Communist ranks, and they branded Communism in Russia as a Jewish movement. They distorted the facts and included Gentiles in the "Jewish" list of Communist leaders.

American Jews, who are in the vast majority devoted to the ideals of America and who love this country for the opportunities of liberty and equality as deeply as those who trace their ancestry to the immigrants that came here on the Mayflower, cannot be held responsible for some of the Jews who have joined the communist movement.

Responsible Jewish leaders cannot influence these communists as they cannot influence American Jews to change their Democratic or Republican political affiliations. The number of communists who happen to be of Jewish origin in this country is comparatively small. In Union Square, in the densely populated East side, a communist meeting would naturally be attended by a considerable number of "Jewish" communists. In other parts of the country, communist meetings are attended by larger groups of "Christian" communists. Communism in this country, as elsewhere, outside of Germany, has been considerably helped not only by the prolonged economic depression and unemployment but also by the outrages of Hitlerism. In this country, communism cannot hope for any success as long as America adheres to the American ideals that have made this country so great and powerful. To offset any of the movements of the extreme Right, such as Fascism, and of the extreme Left, such as Communism, America should practice genuine democracy and true social justice.

The warning about the possibility of a pogrom in this country is unfortunate. Anti-Semites have and should be undoubtedly use Mr. Gerard's warning for their own purposes, distorting the meaning of his words and using them to behave in a friendly warning. Pogroms can take place only in backward and uncivilized countries and even there they occur only when the governments or local authorities either organize, instigate or sanction such massacres. In this country genuine savage forms of barbarism are inconceivable.

## The Bulletin's Day Book

There's a dizzy little ditty a vaudeville friend of ours used to go around the country singing behind the footlights. It had many silly stanzas and if the memory cells haven't been atrophied by too much Day Book, here's one of them:

"Oh, this world is full of many funny things"

A chair has got a back,  
But it doesn't wear a coat;  
A bottle's got a neck,  
But it hasn't got a throat;

Yes, this world is full of many funny things."

That was many years ago. The world is still full of comedy. Backs and coats, necks and throats may not be the theme song, but there are a few good substitutes available. Take the carapace of your auricles and listen:

In Landsberg, Germany, a chap by the name of Reichsfuehrer Hitler makes a holy pilgrimage. He to the jail cell has been sent in that old Bavarian town ten years ago, in company with some of his cutthroat cronies. The cell is now a national shrine—a shrine of shame. The temptation arises to call it and some day the Germans themselves will probably call it that.

Prisoners no longer occupy it. It is the lair with fresh flowers, probably roses, carnations, lilies and maybe even buttercups and daisies and forget-me-nots. The roses for the blood he spilled since he left that cell, the carnations for the purity of his "Aryan" soul, the lilies for the peace he brought to seventy-seven million of his former friends, the buttercups and daisies signify his innocence and the forget-me-nots are just a sentimental flourish that is not much significance in Hitler's case; if anybody else ever forget him. My, that cell must smell sweetly!

If you'll smell the ear lugs off, cup your hands behind your ears and listen to this one:

From Berlin we hear that all Germans (and it isn't specified whether this includes the "guest" Jews or not) are to be compelled in the future to carry racial cards. These racial cards must certify the bearer's ancestral origin. They'll be called, colloquially perhaps, "spinnenblat". The new order was announced by Minister of the Interior Wilhelm Frick, in an address to 500 civil register officers. These officers, it was explained, will be obliged to gather minute details of every German's race, tracing it through ancestry and kinship, in order to keep the race pure from foreign blemishes.

To the poor, rule-bogged German who has to carry around with them a multitude of cards, this will be the straw that breaks the camel's back. Every pocket in the average German suit—Hitler still allows him to wear a suit with pockets because they might conceal weapons—is bulging with cards of one sort and another. Dole cards, work cards, bread cards, traveling cards, sickness cards, insurance cards, police cards, health cards, party membership cards, and now, good grief, racial cards. Henceforth, every German will be required to purchase a dog-cart to follow him around with his load of government-required cards.

Incidentally, the Day Book pauses to wonder whether any of the racial ancestry "spinnenblat" will tell the truth. For if they do they'll have to go a bit further back than Adam and Eve and tell about great-great-great-grandpappy and grandmammy

## Reich Sought Polish Aid in Boycott War

### French Press Reports It as Chief Aim of Pact Talks

(French Telegram Agency)  
PARIS, Oct. 9.—Germany's chief request of Poland at the recent conference between the Foreign Ministers of the two countries was to crush the Polish Jewish boycott movement directed against Germany, the French press reported today in dispatches from Warsaw.

Negotiations between the two governments are proceeding satisfactorily, the French papers said, adding that an embassy of Propaganda Minister Goebbels is participating in the sittings.

According to London newspapers a Polish-German agreement has been reached for mutual protection against unfriendly attacks in the press, books and on the radio.

The London Daily Mail said that an agreement had also been reached providing for the suppression of any news against either government. The Daily Mail pointed out that in practice this would mean the complete suppression of anti-German news in Poland, while the Polish press would open its columns to propaganda favorable to Hitlerism.

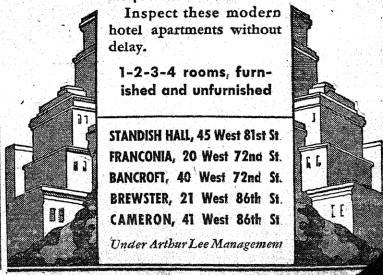

### Challenges Boycott: Figures

To the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin: Mr. Untermeyer was, I believe, nearer the truth when in his letter to the Secretary of State Hull he challenged the latter's statement that for every dollar's worth of goods kept out of the United States by the boycott five dollars in exports to Germany are lost.

On whatever grounds Secretary Hull may have based his pronouncement, the facts are that there has never been in the history of our commercial relations with Germany (before and during the boycott) a five to one ratio between our imports from and exports to Germany. Nor is there any evidence that any such penalty has been imposed by Germany for decreases in our imports. Indeed, since 1932, our exports to Germany have declined proportionately less than our imports from Germany.

For the first five months of 1934, for every dollar's worth of goods imported from Germany we shipped them \$1.98 in exports. This is considerably higher than the corresponding figures of \$1.75 in 1933 and \$1.80 in 1932. American exports to Germany have in value increased from an average of \$11,000,000 per month in 1932 to \$8.6 per cent to \$12,500,000 as an average for the first months of 1934. In addition, during this period the value of the dollar in relation to the mark fell approximately forty per cent; therefore, there would seem to be actually an increase of considerable amount in our exports to Germany in total quantity. This should dispense of Secretary Hull's assumption that for every dollar's decline in American imports from Germany five dollars would be lost in export trade to that country. Had he merely said that on the basis of the ratio between our exports and imports Germany would have a resultant monetary loss greater than that she would suffer from our refusal to buy, he would have been correct.

On the other hand, there is little actual foundation for Mr. Untermeyer's extravagant claim as to the effectiveness of the boycott on American exports from Germany. The great decline in our imports from Germany came in the years 1929-32, when there was over a sixty per cent decrease within the space of three years. This was not due to Hitlerism, Samuel Untermeyer, or the boycott. In fact, the figures show that during the first five months of 1934, despite the boycott, the monthly average of our purchases has increased slightly as compared with 1932. For example, in 1929, our imports from Germany averaged \$21,200,000 per month; in 1932, before the Hitler regime, the monthly figure had fallen to \$6,100,000; and, for the first five months of 1934, while the boycott was at its heights, the monthly average of our imports from Germany remained practically the same as in 1932—\$6,900,000. Furthermore, this actually represented an increase in the quantity of goods imported, since the dollar had meanwhile fallen in value.

### Warns of Trade Treaty

To the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin: May I call to your attention the Trade Treaty that was recently signed between Germany and England, and the recent suggestion made by Secretary Hull that this country's trade with Germany should be increased. It may be that that suggestion of the Secretary is a forerunner to negotiations for a Trade Treaty between Germany and this country.

Such a Trade Treaty is undesirable, not only because of the natural revision of a great body of the American people to trade with

Germany during the duration of the Nazi regime, but also because such a Trade Treaty would probably result in flooding the American market with lower priced German merchandise and, therefore, would redound to the disadvantage of American trade and industry. I believe the American people are averse to such a treaty. I therefore suggest that you arouse the American people to the danger of such a treaty, and that you urge your readers through your columns by circulating a petition, or by urging them to write independently letters of protest to the Secretary against the consummation of such an agreement, and I urge that that be done immediately before it is a fait accompli when protest will be of no avail.

The purpose of the conference is to adopt the strongest possible defense measures in the interests of the Danzig Jewish community.

### Yiddish Paper for Palestine

JERUSALEM, Sept. 30.—A permit to publish a bi-monthly newspaper in Yiddish has been granted by the government to Dr. N. Rafalkes, Yiddish writer and proponent of that language in Palestine, a report in the Hebrew daily Haaretz reveals.

The publication will be called *Die Neue Zeit* and will be edited by Dr. Rafalkes.

NEW YORK.—The American Jewish Committee announced that Judge Benjamin N. Cardozo, Lieutenant Governor Herbert H. Lehman and Felix M. Warburg, for many years members of its General Committee, had been elected to membership on the Executive Committee of the American Jewish Committee.

## Polish Courts Issue Ruling on Anti-Semitism

### Hold It Is No Crime; Editor Freed on Charge

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, Oct. 9.—In two cases, in widely separated parts of Poland, Polish Courts today ruled that anti-Semitism is not a crime. In each case the anti-Semites were freed.

In Poznan, near the German border, a court acquitted the editor of a scurrilous anti-Semitic sheet, *Wielka Polska*, whom the government prosecutor accused of inciting the Polish population to attack and kill Jews.

A Wilno court also acquitted three Polish Nazi leaders, although one of them openly admitted incitement against the Jews. The three men left the court room after giving the Hitler salute.

At the same time, the Warsaw Lawyers' Association unanimously adopted a resolution condemning in strongest terms the anti-Semitic Polish lawyer, Nowodowski, for issuing an appeal to the public to boycott Jewish attorneys.

As president of the National Democratic Union of Lawyers, Nowodowski issued a circular urging a boycott of Polish Jewish attorneys and calling upon Polish institutions to dismiss Jewish lawyers. He threatened to "expose" in the *Gazeta Warszawska*, *Endek* organ, all those who retained Jewish advocates, threatening to file with the president of the Warsaw bar.

## Sir Herbert Samuel Taken Suddenly Ill

### Noted Statesman Resting Comfortably After Appendix Attack

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Oct. 9.—Sir Herbert Samuel, noted Anglo-Jewish statesman, who was taken ill suddenly while visiting Glasgow, is resting comfortably in a hospital here. It was announced today that it would be necessary to operate on Sir Herbert for appendicitis, now believe that he will recover without an operation.

Sir Herbert, who is sixty-four, was the first High Commissioner for Palestine. He has had a distinguished career in British politics as a member of the Liberal party.

## Leidesdorf Warns Federation Realty Group Of Deficit Consequences

A luncheon meeting of the Real Estate Club of the Business Men's Council, the fund raising unit of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, was held yesterday afternoon at the Hotel Commodore.

Samuel D. Leidesdorf, treasurer of the club and chairman of the Federation Business Men's Council, described the danger to the ninety-one institutions affiliated with Federation in the \$200,000 deficit confronting Federation for the current year's operations.

G. Richard Davis, chairman of the club's executive committee, led discussion on completion of campaign plans of the management and the building trades division of the club.

# ANTS ON SPORS

## Art Laszky, a Game Guy and a Good Sport

Bleeding, groggy, and completely numbskull from the terrific pasting Art Laszky had delivered to him, Steve Hamas is the self-styled Nitwiton, staggered to his corner last Friday night as the bell marked the end of the tenth and last round.

Art Laszky, the Jewish youngster from Minneapolis and more recently California, seemed to him as cool as a cucumber and as steady as a calendar. He was still feeling chipper and fresher than any daisy we've seen plucked.

A crowd of 12,000 was on its feet shouting, yelling and stamping as a result of the last round. It had been Hamas' fighting heart that kept him from sprawling on the floor and weathering the pin-melings of Laszky's left jab and right hooks. Both men had stood in the middle of the ring and traded blows until the referee, weakening under the terrible punishment he received. And now, the crowd was especially awaiting the decision.

Humphries stepped to the center of the resined ring and belated through the microphone, "The Judges have disagreed." . . . "I don't protest," said the announcement. Humphries raised his hands and the crowd, including the Colar boys way up in the rafters, roared with protest and applause.

Bledam broke loose. The crowd yelled a decision with the usual gusto and relish that greets a tight Garden verdict. It was completely unsatisfactory because the better man had been robbed of a victory.

Art Laszky heard the news without the slightest apparent emotion. He congratulated Hamas as the latter's manager was pouring bucketsful of water over the head of the Penn State Pride to bring him out of his trance.

Laszky then climbed through the ropes and walked down the aisle to his dressing room with head high and shoulders back. Not a trace of the despair and anguish he must have felt on his face.

The crowd, which had come as rooters of Steve Hamas and not hating this splendid demonstration of good sportsmanship with a burst of cheers that shook the Garden arena.

## Lost by Unintentional Punch

Laszky, the fourth, room's Laszky unintentionally side-swiped Hamas' face in a backward slap. This, my friends, was the referee's reason for awarding the fight to Hamas. He said he would have voted for Laszky but the latter had infringed upon the rules and lost that round which, he said, is why this second round would have seen Frank Merrillville Hamas biting the resin.

Then again, it claimed that the victor's superior feat in the early stages of the fight offset the late drive of Laszky. Hamas outboxed Laszky in the first two rounds but ART toyed with his rival as a cat with a mouse after that.

## Thumbnail Sketch Of Fighting Jew

Laszky is no stranger to readers of this column. He has figured prominently on this page and because he is an up and coming fighter he will be featured here time and again. However, we feel that it would be the best for boxing fans to brush up a bit on the Laszky background.

Art is an orthodox Jew. At present he is a resident of Los Angeles. He lives with his mother and sister and a younger brother, Bill. He is investing his ring earnings in a string of gas stations. He is twenty-five years old and first saw the light of day at Grassville, Minn. Stands six feet two and one half inches. Fighting weight, 128 pounds. His parents emigrated from Russia in 1904 after a program in their town.

Did not train during the high holidays. Originally he worked as a farm hand on a Minnesota potato farm. It was brother Maurice who induced him to go into the fight business after Art walloped the daylight out of him in the first of his historic kid ring bouts.

Laszky has had forty-five bouts, scoring thirty-three knockouts. He has never been knocked off his feet either in the gym or in the ring. Wears a size fourteen shoe, the same size as Carnera but the brogans are not as large in width as Primo's. "Mine are canoes and Carnera's are rowboats," explains Art.

Laszky fought his first battle on May 21, 1930 at Waterloo, Iowa. He knocked out Percy Campbell in two rounds. "Funny Napoleon was stopped at Waterloo by Wellington," interrupted brother Maurice, who as his sister's school teacher, "and Art began his victorious career at Waterloo."

It was Laszky who practically ended the fistic trail of "Beating Lemmy" kneed brother, "Beating Laszky."

## Asks Return Bout With Hamas

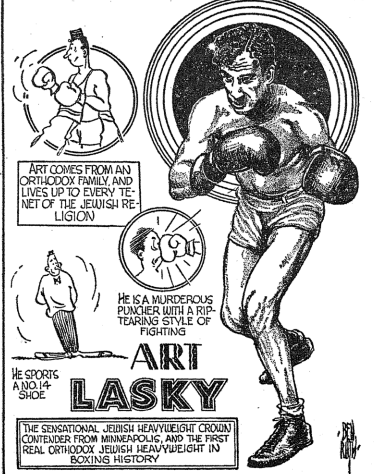
General John J. Phelan, maestro of that most august body known as the State Boxing Commission, has advised that while nothing can be done about the decision that was awarded to Steve Hamas on Friday the commission would consider Laszky's protest against Hamas' fight being accepted as recognized challenger for the heavyweight title.

Maurice Laszky and Gig Rooney, co-pilots of the Jewish fighter, appeared before the commission yesterday afternoon armed with notes and photographs of the particular round in question—the fourth. The stills, especially, showed the disputed blow from the moment Laszky started swinging to the follow through. At no time did the backhand slap strike Hamas' head.

"When we saw it was no go as far as the decision was concerned," said Art yesterday, "we made a protest against Steve Hamas being awarded the fight on the strength of his decision over me as No. 1 challenger for the title."

Your sports scribe asked him what argument he had presented Phelan and the boy from the West Coast replied: "It was our contention that any contest fought for prize money and the right to tender for the heavyweight crown should be over the fifteen-round round. Otherwise how could the commission be satisfied that a prospective challenger could get that distance? We had signed for the Hamas match on the condition

that the fight should be over the championship distance."

## Extremes of Hitlerism Warning to Other Lands, Dr. Miller Declares

Jews should be grateful for the timely lesson in the results of Fascism afforded the world by Hitler's extremes in Germany, since they have served as a warning to England and the United States, Dr. Clyde R. Miller, director of the Bureau of Educational Service at Teachers' College, Columbia University, declared yesterday.

Three phobias beset Hitler, according to American correspondents who have known Hitler for years, he said. They are: hatred of Jews, of Russians, and a desire for union with Austria.

"Germany is coming to grief as a result of all these," Dr. Miller stated. "The widespread persecution of the Jews has resulted in shocking civilized and un-civilized people everywhere, and has resulted in boycotts that are making German prosperity impossible."

"Economic disaster in Germany might well be the thing that could bring about Hitler's overthrow and bring about a military dictatorship in Germany."

## Women Urged to Help Laborites

Hadassah Hears Rabbi Eisenstein Praise Labor Zionism as Ideal

"Hadassah can and must swing the power of its tremendous influence in favor of Labor Zionism which embodies the Messianic ideal," Rabbi Iza Eisenstein warned yesterday, speaking at a meeting at the Hotel Bolivar of the West End group of the Hadassah on "The Present Crisis in Judaism."

"The Zionist ideal, he maintained, "is being threatened today by ambitious and visionless Revisionists who have lost the Messianic spirit which always animates the builder of Zion. It was a vision of a new world order, once called the Messianic Age, now called the cooperative commonwealth, based upon social justice. That new social order outlaws capitalist greed, militarism and hysterical nationalism."

Rabbi Eisenstein expressed his belief that, while Jewish women have done splendid health work in Palestine, it is the time when they "realize their enormous power for good in another direction."

Mrs. Herbert H. Lehman, wife of the Governor, yesterday afternoon gave a tea at her New York home in connection with the Emergency Campaign of the Women's Division of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies. Mrs. Lehman, Mrs. Sklney C. Borg, chairman of the Women's Division, and other women division members received the guests. Mrs. Richard J. Bernhard, chairman of the committee for tea and niece of Governor Lehman presided and introduced the speakers.

## B'klyn Congress Women In First Session Tonight

The Brooklyn chapter of the women's division of the American Jewish Congress will hold its first full meeting this evening at Temple Petach Tikvah, Rochester avenue, Brooklyn, where participation of Brooklyn Jewish women in the forthcoming elections for the American Jewish Congress and the World Jewish Congress will be planned.

Plans for launching a membership drive will also be formulated. Speakers at the meeting this evening will be Dr. Erlich Mosse, German Jewish refugee, Mrs. Chasid J. Turow, chairman of the Brooklyn division, and Rabbi Nathan Rosen of Temple Petach Tikvah.

## Conservatives Will Observe 'United Month'

### Moss Announces Plan for November Events

The month of November will be observed by conservative congregations throughout the country as "United Synagogue Month" according to an announcement yesterday by Louis J. Moss of Brooklyn, president of the United Synagogue of America.

The purpose of the observance, Moss said, will be to intensify the work of the United Synagogue among its affiliated congregations.

Preliminary plans for the observance were outlined at a meeting of the executive council of the organization last week. The first Sabbath in November will be dedicated to the Jewish home, with nation-wide participation by sisterhoods and congregations.

During the month the rabbis will also devote one Sabbath to a discussion from their pulpits of the work and ideals of the United Synagogue. The committees of conservative congregations will, in addition, present to the boards of their congregations a report of the work of the national organization and will discuss suggestions for improving it.

There will be a general election during this month of United Synagogue Committees in congregations which have not already appointed these committees. The United Synagogue Committees in each synagogue acts as the connecting link between the national organization and the individual congregation.

During November, every regional branch of the United Synagogue throughout the country will hold its annual convention and will emphasize the work of intensifying the activities of the organization. The plans also include the sending out of United Synagogue speakers to affiliated congregations throughout the country as well as to unaffiliated synagogues to explain the work of the organization.

#### Cooperate in Health Drive

Dr. J. Lewis Amster, chairman of the Committee on Public Health of the Bronx Board of Trade, announced yesterday that a recommendation will be laid before the next meeting of the Board of Directors of the trade body that it cooperate with the Bronx County Medical Society and the Bronx Tuberculosis and Health Committee in a study of the facilities provided by the clinics in the borough's public hospitals.

#### Jamaica Center Nominee

Samuel Beck has been nominated for the presidency of the Jamaica Jewish Community Center, Assistant District Attorney Mordecai Kanowitz, present chairman, has announced. Election of the center's new officers is scheduled to take place at a meeting October 15.

"Germany is the key to the situation," Mr. Citrine declared, "and the boycott should be extended and strengthened by every means possible. Labor in Germany has been enslaved by Nazism," the British labor leader stated.
