Communism and Pogroms

Former Ambassador James W. Gerard is quoted in the New York Times as naving said in an address before the forum of a temple in East Orange, N. J., as follows:

"As a friend of the Jewish people I want to state that if the American nation ever gets the idea that the Jewish race and communism are synony-mous there is a possibility of a pogrom in the United States that will make those of the Tsar's era in Russia look like a small parade. The Jewish race is noted for its ability to build up culture and nations, and the members of the race have nothing in common with communism, which seeks to tear down culture and government '

Stating that his remarks were based on his personal ob-servations of a Communist gathering at Union Square, where a large majority of the participant were Iews, he

"I believe it is the duty of the responsible Jews of the country to devise some means of keeping the people of the United States from obtaining the idea that the Jews and the Communists are the same people by discouraging members of the race from embracing communism.'

Former Ambassador Gerard is a friend of the Jewish people, He has displayed his friendship on various occasions, and has combatted all forms of bigotry in this country as well as in foreign lands. He attacked the Ku Klux Klan years ago when that organization was menacing American in stitutions. He has fought these anti-American derought these anti-American de-structive forces not for the sake of his friendship for the Jews but rather for the sake of the welfare of this country.

Mr. Gerard has an effective way of saying things that atway of saying things that at-tracts much attention in the press. His latest utterance, warning the Jews of America with regard to Communism in this country and pointing to the possibility of a pogrom that would make the Tsarist pogroms "look like a small parade," may be misconstrued.

First of all, the Communist

movement in America, like the bolshevist movement in Russia, could not under any circumstances be regarded as a Jewish movement. Just as Lenin and Stalin, Gentiles, were not regarded as Christians, so Trotzregarded as Christians, so Trotz-ky and Kamenev, of Jewish or-igin, could not be regarded as Jews in the sense that they rep-resented the Jewish people. Boi-shevism in Russia was not a Christian movement merely be-cause of the leadership of Lenin and Stalin and other non-Jewish communist leaders. Soviet Gives Clergy Full Rights Again

Decree Grants Better Status to Many Jews and Christians

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency

MOSCOW, Oct. 9.—A Soviet de-cree, published today, restored the full civic rights of Jewish clergy-men, cantors, sextons and individual artisans formerly deprived of all rights as enemies of the government. The rights of Christian clergymen were also restored

By virtue of the decree, the declassed Jews will be able to obtain bread cards, vote in Soviet elec-tions, and will be enabled to send their children to high schools and

Thousands of declassed Jews will be affected by the decree, which means an improved living standard and better conditions for them. In addition, the stigma of belonging to the "former people" will be removed and the doors to a higher education opened to the children of the declassed.

The decree is believed to mark the end of the harsh treatment accorded officials of religious groups in the Soviet Union and indicates that the Soviet government now feels itself so firmly established that it can be lenient with those not sympathetic to the

Millions of Russians, disfran Millions of russians, distrac-chised as enemies of the regime have, in recent months, been granted amnesty and had their citizenship rights restored.

Some 65,000 Russian Jews have in recent years been rehabilitated through the efforts of the People's ORT Federation, it was said here yesterday. Over 25,000 Jews are at present in cooperative agricul-tural colonies under ORT supervision while 40,000 have been absorbed into Soviet industry, after preliminary training in Ort workshops. The organization estimates the number of declassed still left at approximately 75,000.

Foes of Nazis Name Richards As Secretary

Untermyer Men Pick Ex-Journalist for Post

Appointment of Bernard G. Richards as Executive Secretary of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League of which Samuel Untermyer is president was announced yesterday at the League offices, 729 Seventh avenue.

Richards is one of the founders of the American Jewish Congress and for sixteen years was its exeand for sixteen years was its exe-cutive secretary. He also served as secretary of the American Jewish Delegation of the Versailles Peace Conference, which obtained minority rights for the Jews of many of the Eastern European nations. Judge Julian W. Mack was chairman of that committee.

"The necessity not only for pressing the boycott against Nazi goods but also for combatting Nazi propaganda in this country along non-sectarian lines," Richards declared in his first public statement clared in his first public statement as the League's secretary, "is once more demonstrated by the Nazi attack at the recent Madison Square Garden meeting on the gubernatorial candidates of the two major parties in New York State, not because they believed the metal of the control of the con them unfit for the high office but because they are Jews.

Should Fight Bigotry

"It is not the purpose of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League to enter into or become involved in any political campaign, but the League feels duty-bound to point out that foreign bigotry and tyranny are being transplanted to this country by foreign propagand-ists and it feels that it is the duty of every American to fight such

"The principles and the spirit of the Constitution are being violated by these breeders of racial hatred who are attempting to elect our public officials not according to

public officials not according to their ability and integrity but ac-cording to religious belief." Richards has had a long career as a journalist. He was associated with the Boston Post, the Boston Journal, the Boston Evening Tran-counts and the New York Globe. script and the New York Globe, since merged with the Sun. At various times he has been associated with such writers as Mark Sullivan, Richard Washburn Child, Walter P. Eaton, John J. Leary Jr., and Michael Williams, editor

of the Commonweal. He was editor of the Chronicler, the New Era Magazine, the Jewish World, and the Maccabean, pre-decessor of the New Palestine. He decessor of the New Palestine. He has also lectured extensively on phases of Jewish life and is the author of "Discourses of Keidan-sky," a book of humorous essays.

Long identified with the Zionist movement, Richards is a member of the administrative and execu-tive committees of the Zionist Or-

Plains-States Conference Established on New Basis at Omaha

OMAHA, Oct. 9.—The PlainsStates Regional Conference of
Jewish Community Centers and Welfare Funds is now organized into a permanent body as a result of action taken here at sessions attended by 200 delegates.

Nevertheless, the Russian White Guarda monarchists and anti-Semites, en-deavored to circulate all sort of false stories about the predomi-nance of Jews in the Russian Communist ranks, and they branded Communism in Russia as a Jewish movement. They dis-torted the facts and included Gentiles in the "Jewish" list of Communist leaders.

American Jews, who are in the vast majority devoted to the ideals of America and who love this country for the opportunities of liberty and equality as deeply as those who trace their ancestry to the immigrants that came here on the Mayflower, cannot be held responsible for some of the Jews who have some of the Jews who have joined the communist ranks. Responsible Jewish leaders

cannot influence these commu-nists as they cannot influence American Jews to change their Democratic or Republican political affiliations. The number of communists who happen to be of Jewish origin in this country is comparatively small. In Union Square, in the densely populated East side, a communist meeting would naturally be attended by a considerable number of "Jewish" communists. In other parts of the country, communist meet-ings are attended by larger

groups of "Christian" commu-nists. Communism in this counnists. Communism in this country, as elsewhere, outside of Germany, has been considerably helped not only by the prolonged economic depression and unemployment but also by the outrages of Hitlerism. In this country, communism cannot hope for any success as long as America adheres to the American ideals that have made this country so great and powerful. To offset any of the movements of the extreme Right, such as Fascism, and of the extreme Left, such as Communism, America should practice genuine democracy and true social justice.

The warning about the possibility of a pogrom in this coun-try is unfortunate. Anti-Semites here and abroad will undoubtedly use Mr. Gerard's warning for iy use Mr. Gerard's warning for their own purposes, distorting the meaning of his words and the motive behind his friendly warning. Pogroms can take place only in backward and uncivilized countries and even there they occur only when the governments or local authorities either organize, instigate or sanction such massacres. In this country such savage forms of barbarism are inconceivable.

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The Soviet Way

By LUDWIG LEWISOHN

To many of our young men and women the Soviet way seems a way out of our intolerable dilemmas. They embrace Marxist materialism from more or less Jewish motives. For sooner or later they emphasize the position of the Jews in Soviet Russia. Let us examine that position quite

objectively and impartially.



Anti-Semitism is a crime in Russia. Jewish workers are precisely on a par with other workers; in the machinery of the Russian government Jews, probably on account of their high literacy in an illiterate country, occupy a disproportionately large number of positions.

Furthermore: the Soviets admit the principle of cultural nationalism and number the Jews among the distinct nationalities that live

in the united republics. What precisely does the application of that in the united republics. What precisely does the application of that principle mean? It means the permission to use the Yiddish language. But all that is written and spoken and thought and decreed in that language must conform to Marxian ideology and to the purposes of the party. Is the Emess, although written and printed in Yiddish, in any sense a Jewish paper? Logically enough, Hebrew is forbidden and Zionist activity is outlawed. Both are non-Marxian and hence counter-revolutionary. Is this a fair statement of the case?

WE hear on unimpeachable authority that very many thousands The near on unimpeachable authority that very many thousands of Jews are thoroughly contented and passionately devoted to the regime that has liberated them and given them equal rights. We hear furthermore that these happy Soviet Jews frantically cut the spiritual bonds that bind them to their people and its historic past, that they cut even familial bonds, that inter-narriage flourishes and that they ask nothing better than to be clitzens of the United Sovjet Socialist Remublics of the Burssian wonla Soviet Socialist Republics of the Russian people.

I believe all that. I believe furthermore that the Russian invitation to the Jewish people to assimilate is the sincerest that has ever been issued. But I believe all that because it has all happened before. All

IN the late eighteenth and early nineteenth century society expanded and the great era of industrialization set in and it was obvious that in this expanding order there was a place, intellectual and financial and industrial, for the Jewish people. And the ghettos were opened and the Jews were told, first by Napoleon, next in the course of the years by the Prussians and the Austrians and by others that if they would put from them all their Jewishness except some academic reli would put from them all their Jewishness except some academic religious practices (like the academic use of Yiddish in Russia today) and become wholly like the people of the land and embrace the national ideologies, that then they would be free and equal and happy. And the dazzled Jews rushed out of the ghetica and there were perfect epidemics of both baptism and inter-marige, so that great communities were more than decinated and the Jews did all they could (even as in Russia) to cut themselves off from people and kin and faith and they became more French than the French and more Prussian than the Prussians and more Austrian than the Austrians, even as today in the only expanding society in the world they are more Marxist than the Marxians and more Russian than Stalin. And if the Soviets were to go to war Jews would fight and die in the Red armies even as my kinsmen fought and died in the armies of Prussia and someone else's kinsmen fought and died for the liberation of Poland. It has all happened before-all!

O, my young Communist friends would say, no—it's the real thing this time. The Jews will disappear and merge in Russis and become free human beings in a free society. May I be forgiven for doubting that? The witness of all history is against it and the witness of the spirit. I was invited to go to Russis too. But I did not go, for I made it clear to the emissarie s in question (1) that I did not want to see factories. If the Japanese could build Factories. ot want to see factories. If the Japanese could build factories, so an the Russians. I made it clear (2) that I didn't want to see Russo-Marxist assimilation, because I was sick to the soul with German and French and American assimilationists and had met, heaven help and French and American assimilationists and had met, heaven help ne, even Poles of the Mossic faith. I wanted to see free Fews—Tews who, as such, were permitted to cooperate in the so-called building of a new society. The gentlemen in question said that the revolution was still embattled and needed to preserve itself by stringent dis-cipline and defense against counter-revolutionary activities and could grant rights only to those who were for and with it. Yes, I said, that was precisely the point of view of William II. When the fatherland (or the revolution) is in danger Jews, too, may live and die for it. Yes. The gentlemen departed.

MANY Jews in Russia are abandoning their people and their religion even as as many Jews did in France and Prussia and other countries at a certain time. So a periphery will crumble. Will not the core remain? Jews may abandon folk and Torah. It is the eternal witness of history that folk and Torah de not abandon them, for both are constantly spontaneously recreated out of the very substance of their being. Must we, instructed by history and nature, be forever tied to this self-same wheel? That is the question.

Funeral services will be held in Scranton, Pa., today for Myer Davidow, sixty-two, well known for his philanthropies in that city. Mr. Davidow died here at Post-Graduate Hospital Monday morning of endocarditis. He had been ill several months.

A generous contributor to the charitable organizations of his home town, Mr. Davidow was particularly interested in the Y. M. H. A. and the Federation of Jewish Charities. A community play-ground, largely the result of his contributions, was named after him. He also built a home for Scranton Jewish charities.

Challenges Boycot: Figures

To the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin:
Mr. Untermyer was, I believe,
nearer the truth when in his letter to Secretary of State Hull he chal-lenged the latter's statement that for every dollar's worth of goods kept out of the United States by the boycott five dollars in exports to Germany are lost

On whatever grounds Secretary Hull may have based his pro-nouncement, the facts are that there has never been in the his tory of our commercial relations with Germany (before and during the boycott) a five to one ratio between our imports from and exports to Germany. Nor is there any ports to Germany. Not is there any evidence that any such penalty has been imposed by Germany for de-creases in our imports. Indeed, since 1932, our exports to Gerhave declined proportionmany ately less than our imports from Germany.

For the first five months of 1934, for every dollar's worth of goods imported from Germany we shipped them \$1.98 in exports. This is considerably higher than the cor responding figures of \$1.78 in 1933 and \$1.80 in 1982. American ex-ports to Germany have in value increased from an average of \$11,-000,000 per month in 1932 by 8.8 per cent to \$12,500,000 as an average for the first months of 1934. In addition, during this period the value of the dollar in relation to the mark fell approximately forty per cent; therefore, there would seem to be actually an increase of considerable amount in our exports to Germany in total quantity. This should dispose of Secre tary Hull's assumption that for tary Hull's assumption that for every dollar's decline in American imports from Germany five dollars would be lost in export trade to that country. Had he merely said that on the basis of the ratio be-tween our exports and imports Germany would have a resultant monetary loss greater than that she would suffer from our refusal to buy, he would have been correct.

On the other hand, there is little actual foundation for Mr. Unter-myer's extravagant claim as to the effectiveness of the boycott on American imports from Germany. The great decline in our imports from Germany came in the years 1929-32, when there was over a sixty per cent decrease within the space of three years. This was not due to Hitlerism, Samuel Unter-myer, or the boycott. In fact, the figures show that during the first months of 1934, despite the boycott, the monthly average of our purchases has increased slightly as compared with 1932. For example, in 1929, our imports from Ger in 1929, our imports from Germany averaged \$21,200,000 per month; in 1932, before the Hitler regime, the monthly figure had dropped to \$6,100,000; and, for the first five months of 1934, while the boycott was at its heights, the monthly average of our imports from Germany remained practically the same as in 1932—\$6,200,000 Furthermore, this actually repre sented an increase in the quantity of goods imported, since the dollar had meanwhile fallen in value, "VERTTAS"

I believe the American people are averse to such a treaty, I therefore suggest that you arouse the American people to the danger of such a treaty, and that you urge your readers through your columns your readers through your columns by circulating a petition, or by urging them to write indepen-dently letters of protest to the Secretary against the consummation of such an agreement, and 1 urge that that be done immediately before it is a fait accompli when protest will be of no avail. Asks Return Bout With Hamas



Assassins Cost Jews Two Friends

Barthou Long Advocate of Jewish Causes

Alexander Accorded Equality, Respect to All Subjects

The large Jewish communities of France and Yugoslavia as well as Jews throughout the world yesterday lost two sterling friends when an assassin's bullets laid low Foreign Minister Louis Barthou and King Alexander in Marseilles.

Both M. Barthou and King Al-

exander on innumerable occasions had demonstrated their friendship for the Jews, at times when they were being bitterly attacked.

As recently as August 19, M. Barthou expressed his warm regard for the Jewish race in a special message addressed to the World Jewish Conference at Genmessage addressed to the

The following report of the Barthou letter appeared in the Jew-ish Daily Bulletin of August 20:

'The French government today officially expressed its solidarity with the world-wide Jewish fight ed its solidarity the maintenance of political for the maintenance or political and economic rights in a special message sent by Foreign Minister Louis Barthou to the World Jewish Conference which opens here

sish Conference which opens here tomorrow..." Emphasizing that the 'world's heart will hear the voice of the Jewish people, Minister Barthou's message declared that 'the Jewish world is gathering for the highly important task of proclaiming the human and legal equality of all religions and races.

It is deplorable to be com pelled to reproclaim this when the French revolution carried out this emancipation a long time ago,' the message continued, 'However, new events necessitate the rescue of civilization from the dangers of reactionary movements."

Always Figured Prominently

In every situation of interna-tional import, where the fate of Jews and other national minorities Jews and other national minorities was intimately involved, the sev-enty-two-year-old diplomat figured prominently on the side of liberal-ism. When recently Poland reism. When recently Poland re-pudiated supervision by the League of Nations on her minorities' treaties, Mr. Barthou was in the forefront of the battle to force Poland to recant on her stand, a Poland to recant on her stand, a stand which boded no good to the large and already hard-pressed Jewish population of Poland. In the matter of the Saar Bas-

in, also, Mr. Barthou has been ex-tremely active in trying to get the tremely active in trying to get the League of Nations to exact pledges from Germany that, if she suc-ceeded in regaining possession of the Saar as a result of the January plebiscite, she will protect the rights of minorities in that territory. There are approximately 10,000 Jews in the Saar. Through M. Barthou, France already has pledged full rights to minorities peoples in the territory if she is returned the victor in the plebi-

As a result of these frequent professions of friendship for the Jews and his actions supporting these professions, the small robust, bearded Jean Louis Barthou, to give him his full name, was eas-ily one of the most popular French statesmen with the Jewish com-munities of France.

Held in High Esteem

Similarly, the younger King Alexander—he was forty-five years old at the time of his assassination—was also held in high esteem

himself absolute dictator of the land, abolishing all political parties, was to enact a law giving the Jews of his domain religious equality. In the law he promulgated in December of that year, it was specified that Judaism was to be placed on an equal-footing with the Orthodox Greek Catholic Church, the predominating religion in Yugoslavia.

From the time he was crowned king in 1921 until the present day, Alexander I on frequent occasions indicated his high regard for the Jewish subjects of his kingdom. Recently, on an important occa-sion of state, he was quoted as de-ploring the fact that there are only 70,000 Jews in Yugoslavia. He said that the Jews make good, law-abiding citizens and expressed the wish that his kingdom could have more of them.

Aided Jewish Activities

It is not recorded whether or not Alexander ever made that particular donation to the Zagreb synagogue. He had, however, made financial contributions to Jewish financial contributions to Jewish undertakings on many occasions. In 1930, the king accepted patronage over the Jewish National Fund hazaar which the Jews of Zagreb had organized. In connection with this he made a personal donation to the King Peter Forest which the Jewish National Fund was planting in Palestine.

proved to be unfounded. Shortly after it was circulated, Jacques Altarac, New York correspondent of the Jugoslovenska Posta of Sarajevo, returned to his post here and made the following statement:

"I left my country of birth-Yugoslavia-only three weeks ago I came to this country several days ago for the purpose of making s study of the economic situation here. Being a newspaperman and a Jew, I consider it my duty to correct the impression that might have been created here, as reports of this kind are liable to give an incorrect interpretation of the position of Jews in Yugoslavia.

"It is true that objections had been raised in the Yugoslav Senate to the immigration of great numbers of persecuted Jews from Germany, but the interpellation in question had nothing anti-Semitic about it; its purpose consisted only in controlling labor immigration which might be to the detriment of the Yugoslav labor market.

Enjoy Equal Rights

"Jews in Yugoslavia, who are living up to all the legal require-ments all Yugoslav citizens are subject to, represent an element of the population enjoying full rights and playing an important role in all branches of Yugoslav economic and political life. Furthermore, Yugoslav Jews are participating unimpeded in the Zionist move-ment, are promoting the welfare of Jewish communities and adhering strictly to the dictates of their

"As an expression of his great love for Jews, a sentiment he has for all Yugoslav citizens of other denominations, King Alexander has granted full autonomy to Jewish religious communities as provided for in the Yugoslav Jewish Con-gregations Act, and has appointed the chief rabbi of all Yugoslav Jews, Dr. Alkalay, a member of the Yugoslav Senate. The mon-arch was wounded mortally with the first few shots. M. Barthou tried to shield his royal companion and himself went down under the hail of bullets from the assassin's revolver.

The assassin was Kalem Petrus, a youth of Croatian origin, and a member of a secret political society pledged to slay the King. It had at first been reported that Communists were responsible for the assassination.

Petrus was almost immediately slain by the sabers of the police guarding the royal visitor.

Excitement Prevailing The assassin's bullets claimed a third victim, General Alphonse Joseph Georges of the French Su-perior War Council, a member of the escorting party. the escorting party. Admiral Berthelot, the French Maritime Prefect at Toulon, was critically wounded.
