King Alexander and the Jews

The assassination of King Alexander of Yugo-Slavia has removed a ruler who paid with his life for his ambition to be a dictator. Alexander could have been a popular king of the Serbs, Croations and Slovenes if the militarists among the Serbs had not won him over to their side and if he had not attempted to impose the lower culture of the Serbs upon the Croations whose cultural level is higher. The Serbs had lived long under the Turkish yoke, while the Croations were dominated by the old Austrian Empire.

During the past few years he followed the lead of the father of the Little Entente, Edouard Benes, in international matters. His orientation until the last few months was in line with France who had helped Yugo-Slavia financially for years. Recently, after the break between France and Hitler, the Yugo-Slav government was falling under Nazi influence, chiefly for the reason that, under existing conditions, no Yugo-Slav would side with any nation of nations opposed to Mussolini. King Alexander's visit to France and the promise of military aid in the event of a new European war.

In internal affairs, King Alexander did not follow the advice of his ally, Czechoslovakia. It is known on good authority that Dr. Benes, the Czechoslovak Foreign Minister, had urged King Alexander to give up the dictatorship and to establish a constitutional form of government. He also warned him of the dangerous consequences of his dictatorship.

Personally, King Alexander was regarded by those who knew him as broad and broadminded. As far as the Jews of Yugo-Slavia are concerned, the late King displayed on all occasions the fairest toward them, the subjects of the Jewish faith. He was also very sympathetic to the cause of the Jewish rebuilding of Palestine.

The Jews of Yugo-Slavia really had no Jewish problem during his regime. The Jews were treated, upon terms of equality and many of them had elevated to high positions in the government and in public life. The Chief Rabbi was chosen by the King as a member of the Senate. Jews have occupied important positions in the cultural and commercial life of the country, and the number of Jews have distinguished themselves in the army. There has been no discrimination whatever against the Jews in Yugo-Slavia. This was all the more remarkable since a vast number of the Russian White Guard officers of

Hyman Files His Petition As Candidate

Gulden to Run for Seat In Congress; Ingles Is Unsuccessful

Former Mayor John F. Hyman, whom the Nazi element in this city has endorsed, filed his nominating petition as a candidate for the Congress on the "Recovery Party" ticket. It was revealed yesterday.

Royal Scott Gulden, leader and organizer of the anti-Semitic Order of 78, also succeeded in obtaining sufficient names on his petition to permit him to run for Congress in the Eighteenth District.

William Ingles, Gulden's lieutenant, who also had Congressional aspirations, fell by the wayside when he was unable to procure enough signatures in the Seventeenth District.

Gulden was still pulling strings last night in an effort to convince Louis Zoline and other Nazi leaders to come into the open with an endorsement of his candidacy. Nazi approval of Gulden appeared less certain yesterday than it had earlier this week.

Another development in political circles was the withdrawal of Charles Overwager from the Congressional race as a candidate in the same district in which Gulden will run, despite the fact that his nominating petition had been filed on the preceding day.

Overwager, a former active participant in German-American society activities here, and a member of the Steuben Society, gave no reason for his decision except to state he is "too busy" with other matters.

It was generally believed that Overwager was unwilling to buck the Nazi group in his district. Files partly taken in New York.

Hyman continued yesterday to doze making a direct statement on the racial issue. Significance was lent Nazi endorsement of him, however, when it was learned that his first campaign speech was to be delivered at Steuben House, 85-11 Thirty-ninth avenue, Woodside, headquarters of the Steuben Society in that section.

Gulden is the "Independent Party" candidate for Congress in his district. The "Independent Party," he says, is Royal Scott Gulden.

Hold 20 Cuban Jews For Military Courts

HAVANA, Cuba, Oct. 10.—Twenty Jews were arrested today and will face a military tribunal for having kept their factories and stores closed during the general strike. The government ordered all businesses to remain open during the strike.

Factories and stores owned by the arrested men have been sealed on orders from the central government and the group turned over to the military authorities.

An attempt made by the Jewish Juridical Committee to intervene on behalf of the men failed. Military officials declared that they must now be tried by military courts.

Zionists Report Good Progress In Peace Move

Extend London Parleys Between Opposing Factions

LONDON, Oct. 10.—Negotiations between the Executive body of the World Zionist Organization and the representatives of the Zionist Revisionist party are proceeding satisfactorily, the Executive informed today, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today.

The meeting, which is designed to achieve peace among the various factions in the Zionist movement, began yesterday and was to have been ended today, but, according to the Executive, both groups decided that further meetings are necessary.

Officials of the Zionist Executive plan to hold separate conferences with the representatives of each group, and a basis for action, and then call a general conference of all the groups together.

Peace among the various factions in the Zionist movement is held to be essential, since the present disunity is hurting Jewish interests in Palestine.

David Ben Gurion, Laborite member of the Executive, and Fredrick Selig Rubinsky, head of the political department of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, represent the Executive in the peace conferences.

Jewish Policemen Win Merit Awards

Mayor LaGuardia yesterday awarded medals of honor to three Jewish policemen who were among eleven to be honored at a ceremony on the steps of City Hall.

The three are: Wolf H. Silverstein, of the Sixty-ninth Precinct Manhattan; Edward C. Bloom, of the 108th Precinct, Queens; and Harry Kroll, of the Thirtieth Precinct, Manhattan.

Silverstein was awarded the department medal of honor "for outstanding valor and determined conduct in personal combat at imminent risk of his life." Bloom was given the police combat cross "for extraordinary heroism," while Kroll was awarded the Walter Scott medal "for distinguished bravery in performance of duty."

Fear New Rule May Cut Down On Their Rights

Plan Monument to His Memory; Drape All Temples in Black

BELGRADE, Oct. 10.—The entire Jewish community of Yugo-Slavia was plunged in deepest sorrow today by the assassination of King Alexander I, who had long been regarded as one of the world's rulers most friendly to the Jews. All synagogues in Belgrade and throughout the country were draped in black and a month of mourning proclaimed with special prayers in the monarch's memory.

Plans were also being made today for the erection in Belgrade and Jerusalem of monuments immortalizing Alexander's deep interest in the fate of the Jewish people and in the movement to make of Palestine a Jewish national home.

Mixed with the sorrow at Alexander's sudden death was a feeling of deep concern over the future. Alexander, despite his friendship with Germany, had resolutely opposed Nazi propagandists and other anti-Semites to stir up feeling against the Jews in Yugo-Slavia.

In the years of his rule he had protected Jewish rights against attacks such as had been made in other Balkan countries and had secured the Jews full equality before the law.

Paris Denies Reports Assassin Was Jew

PARIS, Oct. 10.—Reports carried in the New York Evening Journal today describing Petrus Kalemien, slayer of King Alexander of Yugo-Slavia and Foreign Minister Louis Barthou, as a Jew, were denied here.

Kalemien, it was officially stated, was a member of the IMRO, revolutionary Macedonian organization, which not only bars Jews from membership but has frequently adopted a most hostile stand toward them.

Tattooed on Kalemien's arm were the skull and crossbones of the IMRO insignia as well as the initials of the organization's name.

Meat Workers To List Claims Against Dealers

Union Plans Complete Registration of Its Members

Preparation for its fight for higher salaries will be made by the Hebrew Butcher Workers' Union this Sunday when a complete registration of its entire membership will take place at its office, 221 East Fourteenth street, from 10 in the morning until 6

Questionnaires will be distributed to the several thousand butcher workmen who will call at union headquarters. They will be asked a series of questions about the shops in which they are employed. Members who believe they are entitled to increases in salaries will state their cases on questionnaire cards, which will be submitted to the settlement committee for action and consideration.

Renewal of agreements with shop keepers starts the following Sunday for all Bronx and West Side Store owners. Brooklyn and East Side storekeepers will go through a similar procedure one week later, on October 28. The workers' demands will be submitted to the board of arbitration.

Workers' demands will be submitted to the employers when they call at the union's office to renew their agreements.

Union officials report that the independent store keepers will readily renew their agreements and the chief fight will be centered against the chain store proprietors. It is in these shops, the union contends, that workers have a considerable number of grievances.

Aides for Bklyn Federation Fete Are Announced

350 Are Named to Committee for Annual Ball

Three hundred and fifty Brooklyn Jewish leaders were mobilized in the campaign for the annual \$100 dinner and ball to be held by the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities at the Hotel St. Regis, Sunday evening, November 18.

Announcement of the full list of committee members, vice-chairmen, and division chairmen for the dinner campaign was made last night at a dinner at the Unity Club by Harry Zeitz, president of that club and chairman of the Federation affair. The dinner and ball, outstanding Brooklyn Jewish social event of the year, is to furnish the major share of funds for the support of the Federation's twenty-five constituent agencies during the late fall and early winter months.

The meeting last night was the first at which the full membership of the dinner and ball "army" was gathered. Supreme Court Justice Mitchell May, president of the Federation, introduced Zeitz, who heads the dinner and ball campaign for the second successive year.

Dr. Joseph J. Schwartz, executive director of the Federation, warned the large committee that the support of the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities to its twenty-five constituent agencies may have to be reduced, or in some instances totally curtailed for the remainder of this year, if the dinner and ball proceeds do not reach at least the figure attained at last year's affair. The dinner and ball at the Federal Hotel, August 9, resulted in proceeds of \$64,426, and it is hoped to bring that figure up to \$75,000 this year, he declared.

Sovatkin, a director of the Federation, were selected by Mr. Zeitz as associate chairmen for the dinner and ball. Morris W. Haft heads the special Manhattan division; Alderman W. Nazis Don't Molest Junk Men Or Bankers, Fred Kelly Finds

Nazis Are Sorely Needed, While Later Are Too Powerful, 'Today' Correspondent Writes—Sees Berlin as 'City of Gloom'

Jewish junk dealers share with Jewish bankers immunity from Nazi molestation.

Berlin is full of talk that Hitler would be willing enough to "let up on the Jews," but that Dr. Goebbels, Minister of Propaganda, wants it continued.

A strong anti-Nazi movement is progressing in German universities which, in the early days of the Hitler regime, were Nazi hotbeds.

And Berlin is a city of gloom. A city where there are more unhappy looking people on city streets than Fred C. Kelly, who makes the above statements in the current issue of Today, ever recalls having seen.

Second of a Series

The article from which the above summaries are taken is the second of a series on Germany by Dr. Goebbels, magazine's traveling correspondent. It is called, "Berlin: City of Gloom."

Excerpts from the article follow:

"I am constantly surprised by the number of Jews in Berlin, who, despite the Jewish persecutions, appear to be getting along rather well. One group, I discovered, is treated with great courtesy and consideration. These are the junk dealers—I mean the dealers in such items as old iron and copper, who operate on a big scale. The business takes on great importance in these times of shortage of all kinds of goods; and it is a kind of business that only Jews understand."

Bankers Left Alone

"Nobody else has had the necessary training in collecting junk and determining values. Likewise, Jewish bankers have been molested. They are too important in the business world. To drive them out of their powerful places in finance might upset banking in Germany more than the most ardent supporter of Hitler is willing to do."

"An American friend living in Berlin asked me to walk along and visit with him, while he went to call on his family physician regarding a slight ailment. This physician turned out to be a Jew, and his outer office was well filled with patients. They went to him, my friend explained, because he happened to be an extraordinary good doctor."

"I asked him how other doctors of his race were making out."

Private Doctors O. K.

"Oh, those who were established in private practice are getting along well enough," he said. "But those connected with hospitals, with insurance companies, or in any kind of state jobs are not. They are far better off than Jewish lawyers are. No one likes to go to a Jewish lawyer here to day, because he is known they have no influence in the courts, and, in fact, would instantly prejudice a German court."

"Many brilliant Jewish lawyers are employed now in important firms, where they work behind the scenes, preparing briefs, while gentiles must meet the public or appear in court."

"One hears much talk that Hitler would be willing enough, now, to let up on the Jews. The real source of whatever anti-Jewish fight still continued evidently in Dr. Goebbels, Minister of Propaganda, commonly looked upon as the Megalothiephos of the Administration."

"I talked with a little American girl, daughter of a friend, who is attending private school in Berlin. She said that half the pupils are Jewish children, and that they are treated without the slightest discrimination. It is not

an expensive school—only \$25 tuition for a year.

"Total attendance of German universities is limited to 30,000, on the theory that there is no use educating more than the number of places can be found for all university graduates now. They only make unfair competition against those who ordinarily would be obtaining humble clerical positions or offices. Of this 30,000, only one per cent may be Jews, since that is the percentage of Jews in the population."

Jew or not, a student cannot enter Heidelberg, Bonn or any other university these days without first putting in six months at a labor camp. Such a plan in America would mean one couldn't enter, say, Harvard until after he had done his six months in a CCC camp. One in a German university, a student must spend his first six months in a club where he is constantly subjected to Nazi lectures and political discussions. There isn't much time for actual college studies. Even a man wishing to study law must go through a camp and much 'monkey business' before he can enter."

"When Hitler came into power, the universities were hotbeds of Nazi enthusiasm. Now, there is a different feeling. One is being along in the universities—likewise because youth persists in attempting to be contrary, to take the unpopular side. It has become a college sport to try to bait a professor into making a daring statement or remark that may get him into trouble."

A permanent Palestine seminar has been organized this year by the New York branch of the Hechalutz Organization of America. It holds sessions every Sunday between 2:30 and 6 p. m. at Hechalutz headquarters, 323 East Thirtieth street.

Courses are given in the history and theory of Zionism by A. Revutsky, journalist and Palestinian economic authority, and in Palestinian economic and geographical by R. Margolin, former educational director of Histadrut. Classes in the study of the spoken Hebrew language and in Palestinian current events are also held.

Wise to Talk on 'Power'

Rabbi Stephen S. Wise will use the film "Power," now playing at Radio City Music Hall, as the theme of his Sunday morning sermon at Temple Emanu-El this week. Spreading on the broad implications of the title, the rabbi of the Free Synagogue entitles his sermon: "Power—Does the Jew Seek Power and Why?"

Assails Sending Austrian Labor Leader to Jail

Anti-Hitler Group Here Intercedes for Dr. Karl Seitz

The Labor Conference to Combat Hitlerism, of which David Dubinsky is chairman and B. C. Vindick is treasurer, wrote to the Austrian Consul General here in protest against sending Dr. Karl Seitz, "the venerable burghmaster of Vienna and the idol of the Austrian working masses," back to jail unless sufficient funds for his physical care in a private sanatorium are raised by his family.

Charging that such an action "reels of extortion and is truly of medieval and brutal character," the letter signed by Bela Low, secretary, states that the Labor Conference will "ease the plight" of Dr. Seitz provided that proper physical care is given him "and that labor closely follow him moved from the threatening shadows of jail and of physical and mental torture to which this man of the people . . . is constantly exposed."

The consul is asked to inform his government of this protest and of the fact that American organizers are petitioning the Austrian government in Austria and holds its rulers responsible "for all that may befall the staunch fighter of Austrian labor and Socialism."

Pick Roemer, Siegler to Committee Leadership

(Special to the J.D.B.) NEWARK, N. J., Oct. 10.—Charles Kramer of Newark, president of the New Jersey B'nai B'rith Council, today made public the appointment of Charles Roemer as vice-chairman of the Jersey B'nai B'rith Membership Campaign Committee and Judge Joseph Siegler of Newark as chairman of a committee arranging the formation of new lodges throughout the state. Fred Jay of Newark, past president of District No. 3, will serve as vice-chairman of Judge Siegler's committee.

These appointments were made to facilitate New Jersey's membership campaign, part of the drive to gain 15,000 new members for B'nai B'rith on the occasion of the seventy-fifth birthday of the president of the order, Alfred M. Cohen of Cincinnati, which will be celebrated on October 19.

The New Jersey State Committee is to cooperate with the District No. 3 Membership Campaign Council (comprising the states of New Jersey, Delaware, Pennsylvania and West Virginia) of which Dr. Louis Greenfield of Philadelphia is chairman.

U. S. Senator Thomas Denounces Hitler's Role

(Special to the J.D.B.) SAULT LAKE CITY, Oct. 10.—United States Senator Edward D. Thomas of Utah, a former professor of the University of Utah, denounced Adolf Hitler in an address here.

Senator Thomas' address given under the auspices of the extension division of the University of Utah, summarized his investigations gathered on a recent extensive tour of Europe. He referred to the German dictator as "Hitler, the demagogue and fanatic," and declared that conditions in Germany will not permit the building of a lasting government.

Sees Three Dimensions To Jewish History

Criticizes Boycott Policy

To the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin: In the September issue of The Jewish Times, there was an interview with Mr. Samuel Untermeyer, President of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League to Champion Jewish Rights, in which he challenged the Secretary of State Cordell Hull's "ill-considered and short-sighted opinion on the economic soundness of the boycott of the boycott." He goes on to say: "It is not the first time that mild-mannered gentleman has unceremoniously surrendered to the pressure of the propagandist who masquerades as an Ambassador." Since the appearance of this interview, Mr. Untermeyer has presented an official protest to the Secretary of State upon the subject of the latter's attitude toward the boycott.

It appears to me that Mr. Untermeyer does the Secretary of State an injustice, particularly when one recalls that Mr. Hull in the face of such an official representation of the policy of the State Department, it is a most extraordinary thing to accuse Mr. Untermeyer of surrendering to the pressure of the propagandist who is masquerading as an Ambassador.

It is unfortunate that one who has boycotted the Jewish religion all of his life, should attempt to exploit the sufferings of his people in the interest of his own undi-

guised and exaggerated passion for publicity. His attempt to mass the Jews in a blockade of the German people, and in an economic war against the Nazis, does not have the support of many religiously-minded in Israel. His constant proclamation from the housetops that the American people should boycott the Nazis, is an undemocratic and un-American attempt to trespass upon the liberty of the individual. It is the right of the individual to boycott German commodities, and that right is being wisely and dignifiedly used by a great many people who thus silently protest against the insane policies of the Nazi government. But the individual is not attempting to mass the American people into such a boycott, nor is he exerting pressure on the liberty of other individuals or of commercial organizations. It is his belief, in consonance with the dictates of the Jewish religion, that if we shall pray for and assist with dignity and with peaceful methods, in the elimination of wrong, the wrongdoer will quit his evil deeds of his own free will. It is high time that those who believe in the religion of Israel should protest against the Jewish-secting of the boycott who all his life-long has boycotted the Jewish religion, and who if he were not a stranger to the history of Jewish thinking, would be much more interested in its dignity, than he apparently is in his own self-dramatization.

Dr. Rubinow, of Washington, accompanied by Senator Alfred M. Cohen, international president of B'nai B'rith, of Cincinnati, came here in the interests of a campaign being conducted by the local council.

Briton Finds Poland Very Poor, Yet Determined to Play Big Role

London Newspaper Correspondent Writes Pilsudski Land Is Weak Relation of Great Powers of Europe; Marshal Reported Jerking Strings

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

LONDON, Sept. 27.—Poland is a country of extreme poverty coupled with a fierce national pride and a determination to play a leading role in European affairs, a special correspondent of the London News-Chronicle declared after a tour of the country.

"After an extensive tour of the country I find the Poles more united than at any time in the last fifteen years on a policy of semi-political and wholly spiritual isolation from the rest of Europe," the correspondent wrote.

A high official of the Polish Foreign Ministry summed up the Polish foreign policy by telling me "we have no intention of being isolated that we might frighten the hearts of Lords Beaverbrook and Rothemann."

"My friend in the Foreign Ministry declared it is an absolute determination not to become entangled in a foreign alliance." And in this connection it is interesting to note that opinion in Poland is rapidly stiffening against French influence.

"Poland is no longer content to be the outcast of French statesmanship. She aims to rank as one of the Great Powers. One of the innumerable causes of friction between Poland and France was the complaint that inferior war material was sold to the Polish army. The latest source of friction is the Eastern Locarno pact."

Fear "Unlucky Spark"
"This does not imply, however, that intelligent Poles are not conscious of the dangerous position of their country, lying as it does between Germany and Soviet Russia. They know very well that, even if she is not the powder-bomb of Europe, Poland is sufficiently surrounded by dry tinder to make her fear the unluckiest spark."

"Hence the growing interest displayed by all classes in Polish diplomacy and above all, the increased support for the age-old policy of maintaining peace by preparing for war."

"In an exhibition now being shown in Warsaw, Polish prosperity is depicted as resting on four pillars, financial stability, independent foreign policy, permanent peace and a large standing army. The guardian of the four pillars is Marshal John Pilsudski, Polish leader and virtual dictator. In name Poland is governed by a national bloc, but from behind, Pilsudski pulls the strings."

Dictator Seldom Seen
"He is almost the mystery stranger of a mystery thriller, seldom seen, seldom heard. I have seen Marshal Pilsudski only twice in the course of five years, a foreign diplomat stationed in Warsaw told me. Poland's military dictatorship is thus well disguised, but it is none the less very real and active."

"One becomes conscious here of the almost pathetic anxiety to believe in the German-Polish pact. Before the signing of the treaty Germans and Poles would hardly speak to one another. Now they slap each other on the back," a Polish industrialist told me.

"But your countryman wonder continuously whether the slap on the back may not suddenly become a blow," I replied. "If it does Poland will be ready," he answered tersely.

"The recent demonstrations in

Warsaw and elsewhere in favor of Poland's gesture to the League of Nations have no doubt been astutely engineered. But they indicate only too clearly the temper of the people and the strength of Marshal Pilsudski's following.

"A visit to Poland is intensely illuminating. In this newly created state can be seen all the qualities and the defects of nationalism. Among all classes is displayed a fierce national pride. Even an hotel porter told me with a touch of fine arrogance that Poland has supplied coal to Great Britain during the general strike."

"Recently there has been held the first congress of Poles from all parts of the world and patriotic celebrations have taken place in Warsaw and Cracow."

Powers' Poor Relation

"At the moment Poland is the poor relation of the great powers. She is suffering from an inferiority complex which is sometimes manifested in an appearance of over-weening self-confidence. Her roads are amongst the worst in Europe and she has no means to improve them. But inquiring the way as we motored we were invariably told that the road was good in Poland but with a shake of the head—in Lithuania it is bad."

"The nation is poor but it has the will to succeed. Last year it was decided to raise an internal loan of \$5,000,000 by means which closely resembled a capital levy. The road was the splendid total of \$15,000,000. Yet even in Warsaw the people buy their cigarettes in ones or two because they cannot afford a package."

"The sympathy and understanding of all nations must go out to Poland. She has her defects but she compels admiration. For a century and a half the country has been under foreign domination. During the whole of that time the Polish patriots worked to regain their independence. They rebelled and were brutally crushed."

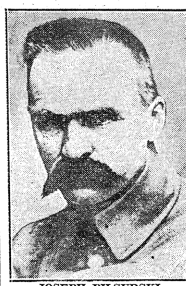

Artist Seeks Share Of Rabbi's Estate

Guterman Institutes Action; Radzimin Cleric's Cousin Files Suit in Poland

WARSHAW, Oct. 10.—Abraham Guterman, Jewish artist, has instituted court proceedings against the heirs of Menachem Mendel Guterman, the rebbe of Radzimin, who died August 20. 'Patience' Tonight

Tonight at the rosy Martin Beck Theatre where, since the advent of the D'Oyly Carte Opera Company, high hats, topknots, and dress clothes have become as common as broken shoes in a municipal lodging house, the English troupe will play "Patience." This Gilbert and Sullivan operetta was not included in the schedule originally announced but has been added by request.

Mark A. Lusscher, who handles Jews, is fondly called the "press relations" for the great British company, has the following to say about "Patience":

"So far as the Savoyards are concerned there is a great deal of sentiment regarding 'Patience.' This, the fourth collaboration of Sir W. S. Gilbert and Sir Arthur Sullivan, was the opera which dedicated the Savoy Theatre in London when that playhouse was erected as the permanent home of these classic works in 1881.

"In the performance here, Miss D'Oyly Carte will play the title role 'Patience,' a daisy; and the Rapturous Maidens will be played by Marjorie Byrne, Maïe Baxter, Kathleen Frances, and Dorothy Gill. Martyn Green appears as 'Bunthorne,' Leslie Haines as 'Archibald Grosvenor,' Darrell Fancourt as 'Colonel Calverley,' John Dean as 'The Duke of Dumfries,' Frank Stewart as 'Major Murgatroyd' and W. F. Hodgins as 'Mr. Bunthorne's Solicitor.'

"So far as England, had, at the time 'Patience' was written, been suffering from an epidemic of hybrid aestheticism. Under the apostleship of Oscar Wilde, 'a passion for the 'Pinkie' had gripped the conventional Englishman's love of the rose. The adherents to primitive colors and natural attitudes looked upon as antiquated and uncommunicated from society. Few survivors of that bilious, unbawdy age, would dare in these days confess to ever having decided to 'go in for the '80's'; for sorely were those preposterous, ape-like beings smitten by the scourge of ridicule. First of all, the 'Pinkie' was a fashion against the mock aestheticism was 'Punch' in which Burnand and Du Maurier, by their memorable caricatures of 'The Pinkie' and 'The Cimbabue Browns,' led the attack in the London Charivari. These first awakened the town to the absurdity of the half-forgotten fashion set by the Oscar Wilde tribe. At the Prince of Wales Theatre, in Tottenham Court Road, London, Burnand, in his comedy, 'The Pinkie,' further lauded the wit with the whip of scorn. But it was not likely that W. S. Gilbert would let such a scope for justifiable satire go unexploited. Although his idea of a slit upon the aesthetic craze may have been anticipated by a rival humorist, Gilbert, in the earliest days of the 'Pinkie,' had set to work to dispense cure of the evil. It was about six months after it was written that it was produced by Richard D'Oyly Carte."

Cinema and Stage Notes

Those theatres which show nothing but newswires having proven successful, a company which calls itself Cartoon Publishers, Inc., has been in the city for some time, and yesterday started a policy of showing nothing but animated cartoons. Among the staunchest friends of the Haskins and the McLaughlins and the Ingles are the what-ho-ness-is-it-of-mine Jews, who haven't felt the squeeze themselves yet, or at least aren't conscious of it.

These Jews yawn with smug self-satisfaction when they hear or read of various incidents which don't seem to them to come close enough to home to make any difference to them as individuals.

But this Day Book is degenerating into an editorial, which it never was intended to be. Let's examine the case of Royal Scott, the fourth little blackbird, who sits perched on the fence smiling contentedly at the way things have been going for him.

Guiden, as you all probably know by now, is the organizer and leader of the Order of '76, which pretends to be a "patriotic" American organization but which actually partakes of all the worst characteristics of the Ku Klux Klan and other mystic appeals to ignorance and bigotry.

Meanwhile the mustard manufacturers have felt the unfair responsibility of an irresponsible gabber's idea of humor.

One of the incidental laughs in the situation is that some of the Nazi leaders who have half-promised Guiden their support have been under the impression that he is "in the money."

"In" is true, one of them asked yesterday if he is a member of a very wealthy family?"

Whatever the financial position of Guiden's family may be, this is not the point. The fact that Guiden himself is stony broke and is in the anti-Semitic business for what he can get out of it.

At any event, it is about time to question the claims of anti-Semitism, or the business of anti-Semitism, as something to be snickered at. These boys must be warned off the fence. Even if someone takes them seriously.

Hungarian Anti-Semites Are Plagiarists as Well

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
BUDAPEST, Sept. 28.—Two Hungarian anti-Semites were sentenced today to six weeks' imprisonment each, and four others to four weeks' imprisonment each for publishing anti-Jewish articles in a local Nazi weekly, inciting the population against the Jews. They were all charged with spreading race hatred.

During the court proceedings it was learned that all the "Nazi" nationalists had hardly had an elementary school education. Some of them copied their articles from old anti-Semitic works.

Young Chicagoans In Anti-Nazi Parley

Non-Jewish Groups Accept Invitation to Participate October 21

(Special to the J.D.B.)
CHICAGO, Oct. 10.—Indications today were that representatives of many non-Jewish youth organizations of the city will attend the conference of the Chicago Committee for the Defense of Human Rights against Nazism to be held here October 21 under the auspices of the committee's youth division.

It was announced yesterday that more than 800 youth groups, more than 450 of them being Christian, today were that representatives of the meeting. Among the delegates already named are many representatives Christian church groups, university organizations, various types of young peoples' organizations and colored youth groups.

Speakers will include the Rev. Raymond Bragg, Unitarian minister, who will talk on "Nazism and the Second Stage," and Max M. Korschak, chairman of the administrative body of the Chicago committee. Other speakers listed are Joseph M. Krause, vice chairman of the committee, and Rabbi Israel H. Weisfeld, chairman of the youth division.

The Bulletin's Day Book

It's about time to quit fooling around with some of these boys and give them the works.

Take the case of Royal Scott Guiden, for instance. Take his associate, William Ingles. Take the Negro, Sufi Abdul Hamid, who gloats over seeing himself referred to in print as the "Black Hitler."

What kind of people are the ones who are so ready to take such irresponsible as these to stick their necks up above the surface of the mud?

Two of the above-mentioned individuals were being called to account for their sins in court of justice yesterday. McLaughlin was attempting to justify his introduction of the racial issue into a printed attack, couched in guttering language, on a Jewish lawyer. Hamid was being prosecuted for some amazingly disgusting street corner exhortations he had delivered up in Harlem.

Ingles, over the telephone, mustily admitted that his attempt to gather together the required number of names on a petition nominating him as a Congressional candidate had fallen short of the mark.

To paraphrase a nursery rhyme, "Four little blackbirds looking for some fun. Along came a horse laugh, and there was one."

Not that Hamid, McLaughlin and Ingles are through, by any means. Whatever the outcome of the two court cases, the Negro agitator and the Irish-Catholic Nazi menacery will be back again—sorry representatives of two races which in general are staunchly aligned with the Jews in a battle against bigotry. Ingles will continue to be active in the anti-Semitic campaign of the so-called Order of '76, which acknowledges him as one of its leaders.

A curious point in each of these cases, and in the many similar ones, is that all these fellows invariably say, "Some of my best friends are Jews."

Oddly enough, what they say is true. Some of their best friends are Jews—cringing Jews who are rotten enough at core to snicker with self-conscious pleasure when they hear someone else make the same thing says to them, "Oh, I don't mean you. I mean those other fellows—those typical Jews that were down here, there and everywhere."

But there is a hidden connotation in that statement. "Some of

Three Testify Hamd Spoke No Ill of Jews

'Never Even Mentioned Them,' Negroes Say on Stand

Three Negro witnesses were placed on the stand yesterday by the defense to testify that But Abdul Hamid, self-styled "black Hitler of Harlem," did not verbally attack Jews at a street meeting on September 15.

Abdul Hamid has been hauled into court on a charge of disorderly conduct, preferred by Edgar H. Bureau, head of the Anti-Nazi Minute Men of America.

Robert O. Jordan, auto painter; Ross B. Brown, "lecturer" on Hamid's staff and Josephine Beckton were the witnesses.

Brown admitted that he was a lecturer on Hamid's staff and spoke at Hamid's meetings. He and the other two witnesses insisted that not only had Hamid never spoken against the Jews, but that they had never heard Hamid mention the Jews at any of his meetings.

Innocent of Complaint
Assistant District Attorney William Mangione, in charge of the prosecution hammered at the credibility of the witnesses emphasizing that Brown had volunteered to appear at Hamid's meetings without knowing the nature of the complaint against him.

"Do you mean to say that you volunteered to appear in court without knowing what you were going to testify about?" Brown was asked.

"I didn't know what I was going to testify until the testimony was developed," Brown replied.

Jordan then took the stand and evaded the question as to whether or not he had been subjected to cross-examination by the prosecution that he had listened to the same speech by Hamid for several consecutive meetings because "I was interested."

A contradiction appeared in Jordan's testimony when he declared that he volunteered to testify about Hamid's meeting on September 15, and the prosecution demonstrated that Jordan could not possibly have known that the complaint referred to the September 15 meeting, since that particular meeting.

Before presentation of testimony favorable to Hamid, defense attorney John Boles complained to the court that over 200 of the three of Hamid's witnesses had been intimidated by a police sergeant, ejected from the court room, and that one witness had been hurled violently down a flight of stairs. Judge Harris refused to take any action on the complaint.

After the V. Lyon opened for them J. Kane, chairman of the defense, presided at the formal opening ceremonies.

Exempted Doctors To Seek Protection

May Ask for Reich Order Such as Covers Pharmacists

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
BERLIN, Sept. 28.—Jewish doctors and lawyers who, in accordance with the "Aryan paragraph," are permitted to continue their practice in Germany, will start a campaign for legislation similar to that proclaimed recently by the Reich Minister of the Interior for Jewish pharmacists. It is predicted today in the Wahreheit.

The order by the Minister of the Interior to which the Wahreheit refers provides that no discrimination should be practiced by municipal and state institutions against Jewish pharmacists who have had their licenses renewed under the Hitler regime. Orders from state and municipal hospitals as well as from sick funds can be placed with such Jewish pharmacists who are not to be boycotted, the regulations emphasize.

The order is now causing great dissatisfaction among the Nazi party offices. A sharp difference is evident between the order issued recently by Rurlof Hess to boycott the Jews in every walk of life, and that given by Minister Frick which warns against boycotting Jewish pharmacists.

Greek Jewish School To Be Sold for Debts

ATHENS, Sept. 28.—The only Jewish school in Xanthi, belonging to the Jewish community there, will be sold by auction on November 4 because the "community is unable to meet its obligation. It is officially announced today that the synagogue must also be sold by auction in the near future if the community cannot find sufficient means to redeem its mortgages and the synagogue, it is stated.

The Jewish community in Xanthi is ruined financially, and the Jewish population there is hardly in a position to collect the funds required to pay off the debts incurred by the Jewish communal institutions.

Geoghan, who appeared personally demanded that McLaughlin be held for trial in his \$100,000 bond, on which the court agreed. No indictment was returned against three other defendants in the case. The D-Z Publishing Corporation, Walter Kappe, editor of the German portion of the Deutsche Zeitung, and Carl Voelcker, president of the corporation, and McLaughlin's father-in-law.

According to the complaint, the Nazi newspaper, in its English supplement, printed in Berlin last July 7 demanding the disbarment of former Magistrate Joseph Goldstein and accusing him of perjury while conducting investigations of three Jewish youths accused of a statutory offense.

Goldstein subsequently filed criminal charges and the case was heard in Magistrate's Courts in July, August and September, when the defendants finally were held for trial in the Municipal Court.

Although no date has been set for McLaughlin's trial, Geoghan said yesterday it probably will take place late this month or early next month.

He had a "big head" yesterday, he said, as a result of the "celebration" the night before, after he had filed his petition.

"No Connection With Concern"
"I have no connection with the Guiden mustard business, and I never have had," he admitted to a Jewish Daily Bulletin reporter yesterday. "Your story in yesterday's paper was absolutely correct."

Asked about his purported residence address, which is given as 375 Park avenue in his petition, he further admitted that Johann Georg Stein, alias German whose name came in for record scrutiny by the Congressional committee to investigate Nazi and other un-American activities in the United States, lives at 375 Park.

"Stein is an old friend of mine," he said. "He has a salvage company. Mr. Dickstein knows all about that."

He described Stein as "a liberal entertainer" whose home is a sort of dropping-in place for persons who are around and chat.

"I don't know anything about politics," he said. "I'm just doing this for the fun of it. If I were in Congress, that's all. In any event, all this is good experience. I wish I'd started it many years ago."

"I don't know what you're talking about," he said. "I will promise the voters."

"After I recover from the celebration a little," he said, "maybe I'll be able to think up some kind of a platform."

Although he fervently hopes Zahne will come out in his support, he said he would not whether he'll get the Nazi Chieftain's backing.

"If I do support me, I'm all set," he said. "Naturally I want him to endorse me."

As for what his expectations are of being elected, he said, "I'm seriously talking this any too seriously."

On the general subject of anti-Semitism his views are somewhat unusual, if a little difficult to decipher.

"If the situation should get to the point where it would be hard to control," he said, "I figure it might be better to have a fellow like Royal Scott Guiden around, who could handle matters in hand, than some of these other boys."

In this respect, he feels, the Jews ought to feel friendly toward me, he said, "because I've come in this country, on a refund basis."

Bar Cologne Jews At Pawnshop Sales

BERLIN, Sept. 28.—Jew in Cologne can participate in auction sales arranged by the Municipal pawnshops, it is announced today by the Cologne city authorities. The paper declares that all Jews, with the exception of those who can prove active war service, have the right to buy and sell property in these sales by order of the municipality.

Jewish front fighters are admitted by the city, can prove that they are paying their taxes regularly.
