Spreading Hate Abroad

The arrest of Dr. Friedrich Chwatal, a Nazi agent agitating against the Jews in Prague, disclosed a direct contact between the Nazi agitator and Dr. Goebbels, Nazi Minister of Propaganda and Enlighten-Correspondence seized in Chwatal's home revealed that Goebbels was planning to start an anti-Jewish boycott in Czechoslovakia September 15. The boycott or-der was to be broadcast from German stations to Germans abroad, and German students had been assigned to act as propagandists and to distribute anti-Jewish circulars printed secretly in Prague. A number of Chwatal's accomplices were also arrested, and will be tried for conspiracy to disturb public order.

The Goebbels propaganda ma chine is being used by the Nazi government to create disturb-ances in Czechoslovakia by inances in Czechoslovakia by inciting anti-Jewish disorders in that country. The Nazi government of Germany is particularly irritated by her neighbor's attitude toward the Jews and toward the anti-German boycott. The enlightened government of Czechoslovakia, headed by Pres-ident Masaryk, with Edward Benes as Minister of Foreign Affairs, has treated the Jews of country upon terms of ity. Czechoslovakia has equality. also accorded sympathetic aid to German Jewish victims of Nazi terror and persecution.

But the Hitler government is even more infuriated at Czechoslovakia for the reason that that country is benefiting most as a result of the anti-German boyresult of the and-German boy-cott. The democratic, efficient and enterprising people of Czechoslovakia have organized and perfected industries previ-ously controlled by Germany and are supplying foreign marwith manufactured products formerly supplied by Ger-man merchants and industrial-

WARSAW, Oct. 11.—Polish opposition newspapers, including organs of the Socialists, Endek antiSemites and the Christian Democrats, today openly expressed their hostility to the agreement between Poland and Germany to guard against attacks on either country. The full text of the agreement was officially released today.

Rabbis Proclaim Poultry Ban To Take Effect Next Tuesday

Twenty-two of New York's oldest and leading orthodox rabbis have proclaimed a chicken prohi-bition, to take effect next Tuesday in the event poultry whole-salers and retailers refuse to abide by the Judge Rosalsky rab-binical supervision decree, it was announced yesterday by the Kash-ruth Association of New York.

The prohibition, or "issur" as it called in Hebrew, was decided upon Wednesday night, it was dis-closed by Rabbi Nachman H. Ebin, chairman of the association.

If carried into effect, it will mean a crippling blow to the re-

tries. It is predicted that the thousands of orthodox Jews, who comprise the bulk of kosher poultry consumers in Greater New York, will obey the prohibition of the Kashruth Association religi-

When apprised of the association's decree, which had been pre-dicted in the Jewish Daily Bulletin a week ago, representatives of both retail and wholesale poultry slaughterers reiterated their intention not to accept Judge Rosal-sky's edict. Their decision is to

Zionist Majority Joins Opposition Against Schuschnigg

the government of Dr. Kurt Schuschnigg seemed assured when it was announced th today. that the Zionist majority had united with the Austro-Jewish union to form a united front in opposition to the government.

The two groups will share the The two groups will share the offices in the Vienna Jewish community. Parity of Zionist and non-Zionist groups on the important political committees of the Jewish community is one of the conditions on which the united Jewish front was organized.

Austrian Jewry has been greatly aroused by the segregation of Jewish children in special ghetto schools, by continual and increasschools, by continuat and increas-ing dismissal of Jewish workers in industry and the government services and also by continual in-citement against the Jews. Even the children of Jews con-

event the children of Jews converted to Christianity were segre-gated in the all-Jewish schools. The government made it clear that it intended to set up a sharp distinction between "Aryans" and "non-Aryans" in the most approved Nagi fashion "non-Aryans" in the proved Nazi fashion.

The Austrian press has made very effort to split Jewish opposition to the government measures. The Reichspost, official government organ, triumphantly printed an announcement from the Agudath Israel, ultra - orthodox Jewish group, praising the gov-ernment for creating the separate Jewish schools

The Joint Consultative Council is composed of representatives of the American Jewish Committee, the American Jewish Congress and the American Jewish Congress and B'nai B'rith. Its purpose is to provide for concerted action by the three organizations in matters affecting all the Jews.

Mr. Medalie is a member of the Mr. Medalie is a member of the B'nai B'rith Henry Jones-Leban-on Lodge No. 79 in New York and of the B'nai B'rith wider scope committee. He was former United committee. He was former United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York and was the Republican candidate for the Republican candidate for United States Senate in 1932.

He was born in New York City in 1883. After his graduation from Columbia University he be gan the practice of law in 1907. He served as assistant district at-torney of New York County from 1910 to 1915.

Nazi Paper Threatens Disastrous Results for Conductors

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) DORTMUND, Sept. 9.—A warning that anti-German boycott ac-tivities in Holland will end disastrously for those who are carrying on is sounded today in the

Westfaelische Landeszeitung. For some time, the newspaper savs. along with the Jewish emigrants, have been inciting masses of the have been inciting masses of the Dutch people systematically against a state and its subjects whom Holland is not only bound by ties of blood but also by trade politics." The cutting of these bonds would result in an irreparable loss to both countries the newspaper declares.

It further charges that certain forces are carrying on underground propaganda to bring this about, haing hindared to do so openly by the rise of Fascism and anti-Semitism in Holland.

"By the most refined methods "By the most renned methods the lower strata of the people are being propagandized, and woe unto the German artisan or business man who has his shop in the workers' quarters," where some "open opposition still appears occasion-

Every Dutchman of insight is against such tactics, says the Nazi newspaper and warns of revenge.

Rahhi Enelow's library, which was bequeathed to the Library of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, was valued at \$13,778.
Other volumes left to the Jewish Publication Society of America, in Philadelphia, were valued at \$25.

Four relatives and friends of Dr. Enelow received \$1,100 in small bequests. His secretary, Bertha Toplon of 235 West Seventy-sixth Topion, or 235 West Seventy-sixth street, received \$3,000. Dr. Ene-low's sister, Mrs. Ler. Mann, of San Diego, Cal., and a brother, Ben Enelow, of Chicago, received \$1.500 each.

Another brother, Max, of Chi-cago, received the residue of the estate, valued at \$2,052. Max Enc-low and the Fifth Avenue Bank were named executors of the

Christopher Columbus a Jew? New Evidence Supports Theory

Documents Say His Name Really Was Cristobal Colon and He Was Born in Spanish Province, Son of Jewish Parents Forced to Embrace Christianity

Millions of Italians will parade to Columbus statues throughout the country and the world today, at the statues they will place expensive wreaths. Then they will make flowery speeches on the daring and the brilliance of the man they know as Christopher Columbus, the man they bell will be a supported by the columbus of the man they know as Christopher Columbus, the man they know as Christopher Supported to the columbus of the c

And when the fanfare and the oratory and the toasts are done with, it will be very difficult to convince even one Italian that the man to whom they have paid reverent homage is not the man they believe him to be.

For Christopher Columbus is not Christopher Columbus at all. Rightfully, by documentary evidence unearthed as early as 1898 and as recently as 1929, the man is, Cristobal Colon, with an "acute" accent over the second "o" in the last name

Rightfully, according to the same documents which were discovered after eight years of exserved agreement by the noted scholar and statesman Don Celso Garcia de la Riega, the man was born in Pontavedro. And Pontaved of the Celson of the Celson in Foland, incidentally. This one is a province in the northwestern tip of Spain.

Rightfully, his parents were not humble weavers. They were makers and sellers of nautical maps. Parents Were Maranos

And the parents, named Domingo de Colon and Suzana de Fonterosa, were Maranos, Jews who were forced to embrace Christianity to save their lives in that day of the Inquisition terror.

And now Christopher Columbus, or Christoforo Columbo as the Italians think of him, emerges in his true light—a Spanish Jew. But how, the skeptical reader

But how, the skeptical reader will ask, does it happen that history has recorded him as an Italian, born in Genoa of weaver parents if actually he was a Spaniard born in Pontavedro of map-making parents, and a Jew to boot?

both in Pontavedro or map-maring parents, and a Jew to boot? The answer may, more accurately than historian may be willing to admit, lie in the difference in the Spanish and Italian heritage.

Italians have always set great store by history. Spaniards have somehow lagged in this tedious pursuit. Witness the fact that there is no outstanding Spanish historian that can be compared with the Roman Tacitus.

This may possibly account for the fact that it was an Italian historian, an obscure person with neither the talent nor literary ability of Tacitus, who got the jump on the Spaniards by claiming for the first time in a history book that Colon was a Genoese Italian.

This historian, Casoni, wrote in the eighteenth century, the first time incidentally that the name Columbus appears in print anywhere, that Columbus was born in Genoa. Casoni based his claim on the rather skimpy evidence that there were several Colombos in Genoa and, therefore, the navigator must have been one of them. Another basis for the Casonian theory is supposed to be a statement by Colon himself that he was a Genose by birth. That statement, however, has been heavily discounted by evidence since discovered. Mosley, 'Midst Catcalls, Boos, Emerges as 100% Anti-Semite

Audience at Manchester Rally, Intended to Show How Fascism Prospers in England, Takes 'Unfortunate Attitude,' but Sir Oswald Is Nothing Daunted

MANCHESTER, Sept. 30.—Last
night in the spacious halls of
Belle Vue Gardens here there was
enacted the final scene of a comeddy entitled, "The Strange Metamorphosis of Sir Oswald Mosley—
or, From Pain Faccist to Engrey or From Plain Fascist to Fancy Anti-Semite."

The final scene was acted to the accompaniment of a few cheers that were effectively drowned out by the catcalls, boos and jeers of a large audience comprising more enemies than friends of the doughty leader of the Blackshirts.

Despite the unfortunate attiof the audience, gathered in what was to have been a monster Fascist rally to show England how the Fascist cause was prospering, the star of the show managed to effect his metamorphosis.

100% Anti-Semitism

For the first time since he rounded up his ragged army of followers, he emerged a full-fledged, 100 per cent anti-Semite of the most virulent type.

Incensed by the persistent boo-ing, Sir Oswald flung into the teeth of the crowd the charge that his opponents in the audience were
"from the sweepings of Continental ghettos, financed by Jewish fi-nanciers." Further, they were "an alien gang brought from the ghet-tos to Britain by Jewish money."

During those parts of his speech that were audible above the din, Mosley was heard to say that every evil affecting Great Britain could be attributed to the "inter-national trade racket," in which he saw both Conservatives and Socialists playing willingly into the hands of "Jewish international financiers."

Mosley also charged that Walter Citrine, in America to attend the American Federation of La-bor convention, and the British Trades Union Council, are ly working with Jewish international parties to destroy the great movement which dares challenge the corrupt power of international finance."

Following this, Sir Oswald once more returned to the attack with following:

"This highly organized attempt to prevent free speech," he said, "has justified me in taking steps reat city I have been in, there have been organized attempts to prevent free speech by alien Jewish mobs. . . . No Pure Race Now, Lord Raglan Declares

few people in the world who can
be of pure race, according to Lord

"There is no such thing as a Latin race," Lord Raglan said. "Latins were people of Central Italy, and when they conquered half the world they took their language with them. There is no such thing as the Jewish race. The such thing as the Jewish race. The Jews are, racially, very mixed. Statistics show that only about a quarter of them have the so-called Jewish nose. Rosenberg Assails Jewish Art Dealers

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) BERLIN, Sept. 28. — Jewish art dealers in Germany were severely attacked by Alfred Ro-senberg, the Nazi Commissar for Culture, in an address which he delivered yesterday before the Nazi Cultural Assembly in the Sport Palace, the largest hall in Berlin

"Art," Herr Rosenberg de-clared, "has so far been not the property of the German nation but the property of the Jewish art dealer. Masterpleces were treated by the Jews just like papers of exchange. Every five years a new 'ism' was pro-claimed not as a healthy symp-tom of progress in art, but for the sake of sensation, publicity. version and foreign propa ganda. These cosmonolitan Jewish-controlled art concerns not only captured the intellectuals in Germany, but made efforts to gain influence on workers and peasants as well."

Sees Rumania Units In Palestine Prosperous

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) BUCHAREST, Sept. 29.—Praise for the colonies established in Palestine by Rumanian Jews was expressed here by Marcu Beza, Ru-manian Consul General in Jerusa-

Beza, now on leave here, clared that like most of the other Jewish colonies those settled by Rumanian emigrants were prospering. At the same time, he said, these colonists continued to have an astonishing attachment for Ru-mania. Trade relations between Rumania and Palestine are grow-ing steadily, the consul declared.

Prof. Murray Rises to Defense Of Pacts Affecting Minorities

LONDON, Sept. 28.—A defense of the minorities treaties and a declaration that the generalization of the treaties to include all memof the treaties to include all mem-bers of the League was entirely practical, although admittedly dif-ficult, was made here by Profes-sor Gilbert Murray, Liberal statesman and noted as a Hellenist and translator of Greek, in a letter to The Times

"After Sir John Simon's masterly speech on the threatened rebellion of Poland against her treaties, one hesitates to add a word," Professor Murray wrote, "But, sooner or later, there will have to be some consideration of the demand, so long and earnestly the demand, so long and earnesup pressed by many nations, for the generalization or equalization of the obligations of the Minority Treaties. I venture to think that such generalization, though difficult, is not so impracticable as generally supposed

"When I had the honor of pro-posing in the Assembly of 1922 the compromise rules now in force the great Powers consented to the expression of a unanimous "hope" by the Assembly that the nations not bound by the treaties "would not bound by the treaties "would nevertheless observe in the treat-ment of their own minorities a standard at least as high" as the treaties required. The intention of this clause was to give to any del-egate the right, if cases of oppression arose, to rise in the Assembly and ask the Government responsible why it was not fulfilling the sible why it was not fulfilling the "hope" expressed by all members of the League, including itself. This right would be, I think, a fairly formidable weapon, but it has never been used.

"There was, however, another line of approach to the generaliza-tion of the treaties which was then in our minds and which still remains open. The object of the treaties, it must be remembered, was not mines be remembered, was not primarily humanitarian; it was pacific. They were intended to obviate a particular danger to the peace of the world arising from the transfers of territory, affecting fully 30,000,000 people, which took place in Europe at the end of the Great War. The Allied and Associated Powers, when making these transfers and putting these millions to a great tent in the power of their old ene-mies, took precautions against the occurrence of such wide and deep exasperation as might lead to another war. "Thus a generalization of the

treaties would by rights only imply an acceptance of minority ob-ligations by all Governments in respect of any territories which respect of any territories which they have acquired in consequence of the War. This would be a com-paratively small matter. Most of such territories are already under Mandate, which carries with it a far more stringent responsibility than is imposed by the Minority Treaties. There would only remain a few districts. like Alsace-Lorraine—which has no grievances— and the Alto Adige—whose grievances seem at least to be greatly diminished. Great Britain, unfortunately, has no such non-man-dated territory, or she might well set an example to the other

"I do not say it would be easy to obtain a settlement on these lines. It would involve, no doubt, some combinations of the existing Minority Treaties into one coher-ent document and a special agreement affecting the Jews.

"But at least there need he no fear that generalization would involve appeals to the League by the Welsh, the Canadian Doukhobors, the Bhils and Khonds, or the 109 the Bnis and Khonds, or the 109
ethnic groups which exist inside
the Soviet Union; or indeed any
general interference by foreign
tribunals with the right divine of dictators or Parliaments to govern their own people wrong.

(Continued from Page One) months and a virtual wave of anti-Jewish feeling has engulfed the country.

In July, the government passed a law forbidding Jews to live in certain specified frontier zones. The law was used as a pretext to carry on pogroms against the Jews in Turkish Thrace. Violent outbreaks against the Jews occurred in Adrianople and Kirlisse. Thousands of Jews were forced to abandon their property and leave hurriedly for Istanbul, Salonica and other points.

Officials responsible for the po-grom were placed on trial by the government, but were acquitted.

The Turkish government, which is headed by Mustapha Kemal Pasha and is dictatorial in nature, at first denied the truth of the pogroms, but later attributed the excesses to overzealous officials.

A half dozen violently anti-Semitic newspapers have been founded in the last year to call for a boycott against the Jews and to advocate adoption of the full Hitler program in regard to the Jews here.

In Adrianople, the schools were nn Adrianopie, the schools were prohibited from accepting Jewish children. Pickets were posted out-side the Jewish stores, in typical Nazi fashion, and customers told not to buy from Jews under pain of punishment.

During the visit of Nazi Propa ganda Minister Goebbels in War-saw, Yiddish newspapers frequently appeared with gaping holes in their pages, where the press cen-sor had insisted on the removal of anti-Goebbels articles or stories.
